Instruction Manual

Safety Information

Electrical safety

- The TV set should only be connected to a main power supply with voltage that matches the label at the rear of the product.
- To prevent overload, do not share the same power supply socket with too many other electronic components.
- Do not place any connecting wires where they may be stepped on or tripped over.
- Do not place heavy items on them, which may damage the leads.
- Hold the main plug, not the wires, when removing from a socket.
- During a thunderstorm or when not in using the television for long periods, turn off the power switch on the back of the television.
- Do not allow water or moisture to enter the TV or power adapter. Do NOT use in wet, moist areas, such as bathrooms, steamy kitchens or near swimming pools.
- Pull the plug out immediately, and seek professional help if the main plug or cable is damaged, liquid is spilt onto the set, if accidentally exposed to water or moisture, if anything accidentally penetrates the ventilation slots or if the set does not work normally.







SOURCE: Press to display the input source menu.


MENU: Press to display the OSD menu, press again to exit the menu.



Wall Mounting


The TV is provided with mounting holes for a VESA approved wall mounting bracket (NOT SUPPLIED). Remove the screws holding the base to the base bracket and lift the base away (do not remove the base mounting brackets). Mount the VESA bracket using $4 \times M5 \times 20$ isometric threaded screws (not supplied). Do not use screws longer than 20 mm; damage will occur to the internal parts.

Caution: Your new TV is heavy; please consult with a professional wallmount installer to perform this installation.

Connecting to external devices



Remote Control Key Functions



If there is light around the TV, the remote control may fail or work abnormally. If not using the remote for a long period of time, please remove the batteries. Remote control function keys to practice prevail.

Remote Control Key Functions

POWER: Power on/off button, press once to turn the TV on and press again to turn the TV off.

P.MODE: Setting the picture mode.

S.MODE: Setting the sound mode.

MTS: Press to select the audio channels.

- Make sure the TV has searched the channel and that there is a Analog Stereo / Dual Sound Signal shown on the program.
- Then press the MTS (Multichannel Television Sound) button to select STEREO, MONO and SAP.

SLEEP: Sleep button, setting TV power off time.

0,1-9: TV channel selection button.

-: Press this button to enter a program number for multiple program channel such as 2-1, etc.

: Previous channel button, return to the previous channel watched.

SOURCE: Signal source selection button (TV/AV1/AV2/S-VIDEO/YPBPR1/YPBPR2/VGA/HDMI1/HDMI2/HDMI3/USB)

MENU: OSD menu button, to enter the TV setup menu.

▲/▼(Up/Down): Up and down button of OSD menu. To change the OSD menu items.

√/► (Left/Right): Left and right button of the OSD menu. To select the OSD menu items.

OK: To confirm the choice with the highlighted menu item.

INFO: Press info button to view the current channel. Press again to remove channel information.

EXIT: Press the EXIT to exit operation.

VOL+/-: Volume adjusting button, to increase or decrease the volume.

CH▲/▼: Channel selection button, to increase or decrease channel.

MUTE: Mute button, press once to disable the audio and press again to enable the audio.

ASPECT: Select display mode:16:9/4:3/ZOOM/Panorama/AUTO (Only 16:9/4:3, up to 720p).

ADD/ERASE: Add or deleted Favorite channel.

FAV: Display favorite of program list.

TIME: Display timer for TV.

EPG: Electronic Program Guide function.

CC: Closed Caption select button CC1,CC2,CC3,CC4,TEXT1, TEXT2,TEXT3,TEXT4,OFF etc.

V-CHIP: Setting up parental contol.

CH.LIST: Display program list. **FREEZE:** Freeze picture for TV.

AUTO: Auto adjust(only use in the VGA source).

USB Operation

▶II: Press ▶II once to pause, Press ▶II again to return to normal play.

■: Press ■ to stop playback and clear the memory. Press ▶II button to resume play.

™: Press **™** to play the prev chapter.

◄ : Press ◀ button for quick rewind search. (Note: When playing music file, this key role required length by only)



Basic Operations Turning Your TV On and Off

TURN ON LCD TV


- 1. Connect to power with the main power cable, at this time the TV will enter STANDBY mode and the LED will be red.
- 2. From the STANDBY mode, use the POWER button either on the main unit or on the remote to turn your television on.


TURN OFF LCD TV

From ON mode, use the POWER button either on the main unit or on the remote to turn your television to STANDBY mode.

Note: If using your LCD TV for the first time, you should select the language which will be used for displaying menus and information boxes.






- · Press MENU to display the main menu.
- Press ▲/▼ repeatedly to select the SETUP (left picture), press OK or ▶ button to enter (picture right).
- Select OSD LANGUAGE.
- Press ◀/▶ button to select your desired language.
- When you are satisfied with your choice, press the MENU to exit.

Volume Adjustment

- 1. Press VOL +/- to adjust the volume
- 2. If you want to switch the sound off, press the MUTE X, Press again to resume.

Navigating the Onscreen Display

- Press the MENU button to display the main menu.
- Use ▲/▼ buttons to navigate and select the available menus.



Choosing a TV Channel

- 1. Use the CH▲/CH▼on the front panel or on the remote control.

 - Press CH▼ to decrease the channel.

2. Using **0-9** remote keys.

Enter the channel number with the 0-9 remote keys, then press "**OK**" to select the channel. For example:

- 1. Press 4, then press "OK" to select channel 4.
- 2. Press 4, then press 5, then press "OK" to select channel 45.
- 3. Press 1, then press 2, then press 1, finally press "OK" to select channel 121.


Selecting Input Source

You can display the input screen menu by pressing **SOURCE** on the remote control or **SOURCE** on the front panel, press \triangle/∇ button to select, press "**OK**" to confirm.



Video Menu Options

Press the **MENU** on the front panel or **MENU** on the remote control and then use \triangle/∇ to select the Video menu, press \triangleright or **OK** to enter (see picture below).



- 1. Use ▲/▼ to select what you want to adjust in the Video menu.
- 2. Press **OK** or **◄/**▶ to adjust (according to the hint below)
- 3. When you are satisfied with your adjustment, press **MENU** to exit.

Picture Mode

Select the type of picture which best corresponds to your viewing preferences by selecting Picture Mode in the **VIDEO** menu. You may select the picture mode directly by pressing the **P.MODE** button on the remote control.

Brightness

Press $\blacktriangle/ \blacktriangledown$ and then use $\blacktriangleleft/ \blacktriangleright$ to adjust the brightness of the picture.

Contrast

Press \triangle/∇ and then use $4/\triangleright$ to adjust the contrast of the picture.

Color

Press \triangle / ∇ and then use \bigcirc / \triangleright to adjust the color of the picture.

Sharpness

Press ▲/ ▼and then use ◀/ ▶ to adjust the sharpness of the picture.

Color Temperature

Press "OK" to enter the submenu for Color Temperature. Press ◀/▶ to select mode ----- User, Cool, Standard, Warm

Then press ▲/▼to select "R Gain, G Gain, B Gain" in "User" mode.

DNR

Press ▲ / ▼ and then use ◀ / ▶ to adjust the Digital Noise Reduction of the picture.



Audio Menu Options

Press **MENU** on the front panel or **MENU** on the remote control and then use **△**/▼ to select the **AUDIO** menu, press **▶** or **OK** to enter (see picture below).



- Use ▲/▼ to select the option you want to adjust in the Audio menu.
- 2. Press **OK** or **◄/** ▶ to adjust (according to the hints below)
- 3. When you are satisfied with your adjustment, press **MENU** to exit.

Audio Mode

You can select the type of sound which best corresponds to your listening requirements by selecting Sound in AUDIO menu.

Balance

Press $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ and then use $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$ to adjust the audio output between left and right speakers.

Bass

Press ▲/▼ and then use ◀/▶ increase or decrease the level of the lower-pitched sounds.

Treble

Press $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ and then use $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$ to increase or decrease the level of higher-pitched sounds

Sound Mode

Press **◄/** ▶ to select one of the modes options: Concert, Jazz, User, Voice

Surround Sound

Press **◄/** ▶ to switch Surround Sound On or Off

SPDIF

Press **◄/** ► to select between PCM, OFF or RAW

Auto Volume Control

Press ◀/▶ to switch auto volume control On or Off. This function allows volume to be controlled automatically.

TV Menu Options

Press the **MENU** on the front panel or **MENU** on the remote control and then use \triangle/∇ to select the TV menu, press \triangleright or **OK** to enter (see picture below).



- Use ▲/▼ to select the option you want to adjust in the TV menu.
- Press OK or ◀/ ▶ to enter the desired function.
- 3. When you are done, press **MENU** to exit.

Tuner Mode

Select the signal input mode: Antenna or Cable


Channel Scan

Select "Channel Scan"; press OK to start the channel scan. Press MENU to stop or continue until the scan is complete; Stopping in the middle of a scan will save the scanned channels up to the stop point.



Channel Skip

Select "Channel Skip"; press OK to enter the submenu. Press \triangle/∇ to select the desired channel, then press OK.



Setup Menu Options

Press the **MENU** on the front panel or **MENU** on the remote control and then use \triangle/∇ to select the Setup menu, press \triangleright or **OK** to enter (see picture below).



- Use ▲/▼ to select the option you want to adjust in the setup menu.
- Press OK or ◄/► to adjust (according to the hint below).
- When you are done with your adjustments, press MENU to exit.



- Font Size: press ◀/▶ to select Medium/Large or Small.
- Font Color: press ◀/▶ to select Red/Green/Blue/Yellow/Magenta/Cyan/Black or White.
- Font Opacity: press **4/**▶ to select Solid/Transparent or Translucent.
- Background Color: press ◀/▶ to select Black/White/Red/Green/Blue/Yellow/Magenta/ or Cyan.

Parental Menu Options

Parental Menu Options

Press the **MENU** on the front panel or remote control and then use \triangle/∇ to select the Parental menu, Press \triangleright or OK to enter (see picture below).



The factory default password code is **0000** to enter the parental menu.



Change Password: select "Change Password", press OK to enter the submenu, and change the password. Press MENU to cancel.

Clean All: Select "Clean All", Press OK and it will display "Are you sure", select "OK" to default to the factory settings.

Program Block





U.S. TV Ratings: Press OK to enter, and use \P / ▶ and \P / to select, and press OK to confirm. U.S. Movie Ratings: Press OK to enter, and use \P / ▼ to select, and press OK to confirm. Canadian English Ratings: Press OK to enter, and use \P / ▼ to select, and press OK to confirm. Canadian French Ratings: Press OK to enter, and use \P / ▼ to select, and press OK to confirm.

Open V-Chip

Select "V-Chip". Press OK to enter and you will see an item "Tumbolia region, alternate US". Press OK again to enter the V-Chip menu (picture below).



You can select any item, press OK to enter, use $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ to select, press OK to confirm.

Parental Menu Options

Parental Control

Press Enter to enter the sub-menu and then use the O-9 to enter the correct password: 0,0,0,0. If used, this option feature can "block" undesirable programming from appearing on the TV. Parental Control offers the user a wide variety of options and settings that restrict or "block" the programming that can appear on the TV. Parental Control allows the user the capability of defining which program rating they consider acceptable, to the younger more sensitive viewer. It can be preset and turned either on or off by the user who specifies the secret 4-number code, the password. The number of hours blocked are specified. General audiences and children blocks should be both programmed into the TV's memory. Viewer ratings are specified for both TV and the motion picture industry; both rating systems should be used, for complete coverage. The ratings are based on the ages of children.

Overview

To ensure complete coverage for all TV programs, (movies and regular TV shows) choose a rating for MPAA, from the selections below, as well as ratings from the TV Parental Guidelines Rating Systems below, using the Age Block option for General Audiences, and for children. In addition to those, you may wish to add additional restrictions from the content block menu, and submenus examples below.

Things to Consider before Setting up Parental Control

Determine which rating you consider acceptable to the viewer. (For example, if you choose TV-PG, more restrictive ratings will be automatically blocked; the viewer will not be able to see: TV-PG, TV-14, or TV-MA rated programming.) Do you want to block the auxiliary video source entirely? (Blocks the signal sent by the equipment, such as VCR, connected to the TV Audio/Video input jacks) Or leave unblocked, then choose allowable ratings. Block program "Content" based on individual parameters such as: Strong Dialog, Bad Language, Sex Scenes, Violence Scenes, or Fantasy. Violent Scenes; in Content Blk option. Select a secret password, in the Set Password option, using the numbers keys on the remote. Do not forget the password, it is the only way you can access the Parental Control menu and change rating selections, or turn Parental Control off. Do you want the Parental Control to be active at all times? If not, you can turn it on or off with the Lock On/Off option.

- · You can set different Parental Control viewing restrictions for general audiences and for children, both can be active at the same time.
- Simply specifying one content block such as Sex Scenes, will not automatically restrict the programming that appears from the video sources.
- Even if you choose to leave the AUX inputs unblocked, the ratings you specify will automatically restrict the programming that appears from the video sources.
- You can not disable Parental Control by disconnecting the TV from power. Block hours will be automatically reset to the original block time setting specified if power is disconnected.





If your television does not operate normally or does not turn on, please check the following troubleshooting questions. Remember to also check the other connected electronic devices, such as DVDs or Blu-ray players to pinpoint any problem. If the television still fails to operate normally, please contact technical support (refer to Warranty page).

Troubleshooting

Maintenance

Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the amount of time you will have with your new TV. Be sure to turn the power off and unplug the power cord before you begin any cleaning.

Cleaning the screen

- 1. A great tip to dust off your screen. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then use to wipe the screen.
- 2. Make sure the excess water is off the screen, then let air-dry before you turn on the TV.

Cleaning the Cabinet

To remove dirt or dust, wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth. Please be sure not to use a wet cloth.

Extended Absence



If you expect to leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), it is a good idea to unplug the power cord to protect against possible damages from lightning or power surges.
