This section allows you to start using your phone by activating your service, setting up your voice mail, contacting customer support, or getting an understanding of how this manual is put together.

Activating Your Phone

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a plug-in SIM card loaded with your subscription details, such as your PIN or any optional services available. To Install the SIM card, use the following instructions:

Installing the SIM Card

Note: The plug-in SIM card can be easily damaged by scratches or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting, or removing the card.

To install the SIM card:

- 1. If necessary, switch off the phone by holding down the key.
- Remove the battery. To do so: Slide the battery lock toward the top of the phone and hold it in that position. Lift the battery away as shown.



3. Slide the SIM card into the SIM card socket, as shown, so that the card locks into position.

Make sure the gold colored contacts of the card face into the phone.



4. To remove the SIM card, slide it upwards as shown.



5. Replace the battery so that the tabs on the end align with the slots at the bottom of the phone.



Press the battery down until it clicks into place. Make sure that the battery is properly installed before switching on the power.



Charging the Battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable Li-ion battery. A travel charger comes with your phone for charging the battery. Use only approved batteries and chargers. Ask your local Samsung dealer for further details.

The travel charger allows you to use the phone while the battery is charging, but this causes the phone to charge slowly.

Warning: Only use the charger provided with your device or a charger approved by Samsung for use with your device.

Note: You must fully charge the battery before using your phone for the first time. A discharged battery recharges fully in approximately 200 minutes.

To charge the battery:

 With the battery in position on the phone, plug the connector of the travel charger into the jack at the bottom of the phone.



2. Plug the adapter into a standard AC wall outlet.

Note: For connection to an electrical supply not located in the U.S., you must use an adaptor of the proper configuration for the power outlet. Use of the wrong adapter could damage your phone and void your warranty.

When charging is finished, unplug the charger from the power outlet then disconnect it from the phone by pressing the buttons on both sides of the connector and pulling the connector out.



Note: You must unplug the charger before removing the battery from the phone during charging, otherwise, the phone could be damaged.

Low Battery Indicator

When the battery is weak and only a few minutes of talk time remain, a warning tone sounds and a pop-up message repeats at regular intervals on the display. In this case, your phone will turn off the backlight to conserve the remaining battery power.

When the battery level is too low, the phone turns off automatically.

Turning on Your Phone

- 1. Press and hold the 🔨 key until the phone turns on.
- If the phone asks you to enter a password, enter a password and press the Confirm soft key or the X key.
- If the phone asks for a PIN, enter the PIN and press the Confirm soft key or the X key.

Turning off Your Phone

Press and hold the 🔨 key until the power-off image displays.

Setting Up Your Voice Mail

Dialing Your Voice Mail Box

To access your voice mail from your keypad, use the following steps:

1. In Idle mode, press and hold the ____ key.

2. Follow the voice mail prompts to access messages.

Accessing Your Voice Mail

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- 2. Highlight Recent Calls and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 3. Highlight Voice Mail and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Highlight Connect to Voice Mail and press the Select soft key or the X key.

Your phone dials the specified number of the voice mail center.

5. When connected, follow the voice prompts from the voice mail center.

Changing the Voice Mail Number

Your SIM card gives you a default service number for the voice mail center. However, you may need to change the number. Use the following procedures to change your voice mail number.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access the Menu mode.
- 2. Highlight Recent Calls and press the Select soft key or the 💢 key.
- 3. Highlight Voice Mail and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Highlight Voice Server Number and press the Select soft key or the X key
- Press and hold the key to clear the current number, enter a new number and press the Save soft key or the key.
- 6. When you are finished, press the key.

Understanding this User Manual

Also included is important safety information that you should know before using your phone. Most of this information is near the back of the guide, beginning on page 156.

This section outlines some key features of your phone. It also displays the screen and the icons that are displayed when the phone is in use.

Features of Your Phone

Your phone is lightweight, easy-to-use and offers many significant features. The following list outlines a few of the features included in your phone.

Open View of Your Phone



Keys

- 1. Camera key: Use the camera to take photos and record videos.
- Switch key: Allows you to switch between four preset menu items. See "Switch Key" on page 22 for more information.
- Headset Jack: Allows you to plug in an optional headset for convenient, hands-free conversations.
- Soft key (left): Performs the functions indicated by the screen text on the bottom of the display.
- Send key: Allows you to place or receive a call. In idle mode, press the key once to access the Call Log. Press again to dial the number.
- 6. Volume/Menu browse key: Allows you to adjust the ringer volume in idle mode (with the flip open) or adjust the voice volume during a call. The volume key can also be used to scroll up or down to navigate through menu options. To mute the ringer during an incoming call, press the volume key up or down. You can also control the volume of the Audio and Media player.
- 7. Voice Mail key: Press and hold to automatically dial your voice mail.
- Alphanumeric keypad: Use these keys to enter number, letters and characters.
- Shift/Asterisk key: Enters the asterisk character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to change the character input type.
- 10. Camera flash: When the camera is active, this key will enable or disable the camera flash.
- 11. Microphone: The microphone allows the other caller to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them. It is also used to record memo's and audio during a video recording.
- 12. Space/Pound/Silent mode key: Enters the [#] character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to enter a space. In idle mode, press and hold to activate Vibration mode feature.
- 13. Clear key: Deletes characters from the display when you are in text entry mode. When in a menu, press to return to the previous menu.
- 14. End key: Ends a call. Press and hold this key for a few seconds to turn your phone on or off. While in the main menu, it returns the phone to idle mode and cancels your input. When you receive an incoming call, press to reject the call.

- 15. Navigation key (Up/Down/Left/Right): This key allows you to scroll through the phone menu options and provides a shortcut to phone functions from idle mode.
- 16. Soft key (right): Performs the functions indicated by the screen text on the bottom of the display.
- 17. WAP browser/Menu confirm key: Press to launch WAP browser. Pressing the X key when navigating through a menu accepts the highlighted choice menu. Press in camera mode to take a photo.
- 18. Camera lens: aim the camera lens at the subject.
- 19. Display: The screen displays all the information needed to operate your phone.
- 20. Earpiece: The speaker allows you to hear the other caller and the different ring tones and sounds offered by your phone.

Front View of Your Phone




Keys

- 1. Antenna: Used to obtain reception.
- Flash: The flash sense will light when flash options Shoot Only or Permanent are selected
- 3. External LCD: indicates when you have an incoming call or a message.

- Charger/PC data link cable jack: This connector is used to plug in the charger accessories.
- MicroSD card slot: Allows you to insert a specialized memory card made especially for mobile phones.
- Profile key: Press and hold to view profiles. Use the Volume key on the left side of the phone to highlight your selection.

Display Layout

The display area has 3 areas. They are:



Icons

- Yill Shows the received signal strength. The greater the number of bars, the stronger the signal.
- **3G** Appears when you are in an area of the network that supports 3G/UMTS.
- Appears when you are connected to the 3G/UMTS network.
- Appears when you are in an area of the network that supports GPRS.
- Appears when you are connected to the GPRS network.

- Appears when a new text message has been received.
- Appears when a new voice mail has been received.
- Appears when a new multimedia message has been received.
- Appears when the MicroSD[™] memory card has been inserted.
- Appears when you set your phone to Vibration All.
- Appears when you set the alert profile to a Normal or Car.
- Appears when speaker phone is activated.
- Appears when speaker phone is turned off.
- Appears when a Bluetooth device is connected.
- Appears when there is a new push message received.
- Appears when there is a new email message received.
- Appears when your connected to a WAP service.
- Appears when you set an alarm to ring at a specified time.
- Appears when you are out of your service area.
- Appears when a call is in progress.
- Shows the level of your battery. The more bars you see, the more power you have remaining.
- Appears when the Call Forwarding feature is active.
- Appears when the Meeting profile is activated.
- Appears when the Outdoor profile is activated.


- Appears when the Silent profile is activated.
- Appears when the Car profile is activated.

Selecting Functions and Options

Your phone offers a set of functions that allow you to customize it. These functions are arranged in menus and sub-menus, accessed using the two soft keys. Each menu and sub-menu allows you to view and alter the settings of a particular function.

Soft Keys

The roles of the soft keys vary depending on the function you are currently using. The labels on the bottom line of the display just above each key indicate their current role. The following diagram shows the soft key role while in Idle mode.




Selecting Options

To view the various functions and options available and to select the one you want:

- 1. Press the appropriate soft key.
- 2. To select the function displayed or the option highlighted, press the **Select** soft key or the X key.
- To view the next function or highlight the next option on a list, press the Down Navigation key.
- To move back to the previous function or option on a list, press the Up Navigation key.

5.	To move back up one level in the menu structure, press the c key or
	the Back soft key.



In some functions, you may be asked for a password or PIN. Enter the code and press the **Confirm** soft key or the X key.

When you access a list of options, your phone highlights the currently active option. If, however, there are only two options, such as **On/Off** or **Enable/Disable**, your phone highlights the option that is not currently active, so that you can select it directly.

Command Keys

Functions for the soft keys are defined by what appears above each in the display. There are two soft keys, the left $(\fbox{\ }$) soft key and the right $(\fbox{\ }$) soft key.

Soft keys

The roles of the soft keys vary depending on the function you are currently using; the labels on the bottom line of the display just above each key indicate their current role.

Left Soft Key

Some functions of the **Left** () soft key are as follows.

- In the Idle screen, press the **Menu** () soft key to open the Menu screen.
- When in a menu mode the **Left** () soft key function is **Select**.

Right Soft Key

Some functions of the **Right** () soft key are as follows.

- In the idle screen, press the Options () soft key to open the Options Quick Reference menu.
- When in a menu mode the **Right** () soft key function is **Back**.

Clear Key

The **Clear** () key is used to erase or clear numbers, text, or symbols from the display. You can also use the key to return to a previous menu or to return to idle mode from any menu.

- If you enter an incorrect character, briefly press the Clear () key to backspace (and delete) the character.
 To erase the entire sentence, press and hold the Clear () key.

End Key

The **End** () key is used to turn on/off your phone, disconnect calls, and return to the idle mode

- Press and hold the **End** () key to turn on your phone.
- Briefly press the **End** () key once to disconnect a call.
- Press End () key to return to idle mode from any menu, or to cancel the last input.

Send Kev


The **Send** () key is used to answer calls, dial calls, and to recall the last number(s) dialed, received, or missed.

- Press the Send () key once to answer calls.
- Enter a number and briefly press the **Send** () key to make a call.
- Briefly press the Send () key in idle mode to display a list of recent calls to and from your phone.
- Press the Send () key twice in idle mode to call the most recent number.
- Press the Send () key to pick up a waiting call. Press the Send () key again to switch back to the other call.

Navigation Key

Use the directional keys on the navigation key to browse menus, sub menus, and lists. Press the up or down navigation when jumping to highlighted links on the web.

Each key also acts as a shortcut to launch applications. All navigation keys are setup as *User-Defined Shortcut Keys.



Switch Key

The **Switch** key allows you to select preset menu items.

1. Press the key.

Note: This key can be used in any menu.

- 2. The following menu items appear in the option bar:
- Call: select to access a blank call screen. Enter the number you want to call
 and press the key.
- Messaging: select to access the Messaging menu.
- MEdia Net: select to access MEdia Net Homepage.
- End All?: ends all operations and returns you to Idle mode.
- Use the Left or Right Navigation key to select an option and press the Select soft key or the X key.

Camera Key

In Idle mode, press the (18) key to turn on the camera. See "Section 9: Multimedia" on page 107, for more information.

Profile Key

The Profile key allows quick access to profiles associated with the volume settings and levels of your phone. Profiles are responsible for ringers, alarms, notifications, and system sounds. See "Profiles" on page 85 for more detailed information.

With the folder closed

 Press and hold the key on the upper right side of the zx20, to view profiles.

- 2. Use the **Volume** key on the left side of the phone to highlight a profile.
- **3.** Press the to apply the profile.

With the folder open

- 1. Press the key on the upper right side of the zx20, to view profiles.
- To highlight a profile, use the Volume key on the left side of the phone or the Up or Down Navigation.
- 3. Press the X key to apply the profile.

Section 3: Call Functions

This section allows you to make or answer a call. It also includes the features and functionality associated with making or answering a call.

Making a Call

When the idle screen displays, enter the area code and phone number, and press the key.

Making an International Call

- 1. Press and hold the ost key. The + character appears.
- Enter the country code, area code, and phone number and press the key.

Making a Second Call

To make a call while you have a call in progress:

- Enter the phone number that you wish to dial or look it up in the Address Book.
- Press the key to dial the second call. The first call is automatically put on hold.

Alternatively,

1. Put the current call on hold by pressing the **Hold** soft key.

2. Make the second call in the normal way.

Making a Conference Call

A **Conference Call** is a network service that allows up to six people to take part simultaneously in a multi-party call.

For further details about subscribing to this service, contact your service provider.

Setting Up a Conference Call

- 1. Call the participant in the normal way.
 - Call the second participant in the normal way. The first call is automatically placed on hold.
- To join the first participant to the conference call, press the **Options** soft key.
 - Press the \mathbf{Up} or \mathbf{Down} Navigation key to highlight \mathbf{Join} and press the \mathbf{Select} soft key or the \mathbf{X} key.
- To add a new person to the conference call, call the new person in the normal way and then press the Options soft key.
 - Press the ${\bf Up}$ or ${\bf Down}$ Navigation key to highlight ${\bf Join}$ and press the ${\bf Select}$ soft key or the $\ref{thm:eq}$ key.
 - Repeat as required.

Having a Private Conversation with One Participant

During a conference call:

- 1. Press the Options soft kev.
 - Press the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key to highlight **Split** and press the **Select** soft key or the X key.
 - Press the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key to select the number you would like to separate from the conference call and press the **Split** soft key.
 - Now you can talk privately to that person. The other participants can continue to converse with each other.
- 2. To reioin the conference call, press the **Options** soft key.
 - Press the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Join and press the Select soft key or the X key.
 - All of the conference call participants can now hear each other.

Dropping One Participant

- 1. Press the Options soft key.
- Press the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Drop Call and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Press the Up or Down Navigation key to select the number of the caller to be dropped and press the X key.

A check mark appears beside the selected number.

4. Press the **Drop** soft key.

The call with that participant ends. You can continue to talk to the other participants on the conference call.

Correct the Number

- 1. To clear the last digit displayed, press the c key.
- To clear any other digit in the number, press the Left or Right Navigation key until the cursor is immediately to the right of the digit to be cleared. Press the key. You can also enter a missing digit.
- 3. To clear the whole display, press and hold the ckey.

Ending a Call

When you want to finish your call, briefly press the Key.

Redialing the Last Number

The phone stores the numbers of the calls you've dialed, received, or missed if the call recipient or caller is identified.

To recall any of these numbers:

Note: If you have typed characters on the display, press the $\sqrt{6}$ key to return to Idle mode.

- Press the key to display a list of the most recent numbers used in the order you dialed or received them.
- Use the Up and Down keys to scroll through the numbers until the number you want highlights.
- Before you dial the number, press the Options soft key. The following options appear in the display.
- Details: allow you to view details about the call. Such as the date and time
 of the call

- Voice Call: allows you to call the highlighted phone number.
- Use Number: allows you to paste the number in the display. Press the
 to dial the number or press the Options soft key for additional options.
- Save to Address Book: saves number to your Address Book.
- Send Message: allows you to send a multimedia message or text message to the highlighted phone number.
- Delete: allows you to delete the selected number or delete all the number in the call log.
- To dial the number, press the key.
 Alternatively, press the Options soft key, highlight Voice Call and press the Select soft key or the key.

Making a Call from the Address Book

You can store phone numbers that you use regularly on the SIM card or in the phone's memory. These entries are stored in the Address Book.

Once you have stored a number in the Address Book, you can dial it by pressing a few keys. You can also assign your most frequently-used numbers to number keys using the Speed Dial feature.

For further details about the Address Book feature, see "Section 6: Understanding Your Address Book" on page 47.

Adjusting the Call Volume

During a call, if you want to adjust the earpiece volume, use the Volume keys on the left side of the phone.

Press the key to increase the volume level and the key key to decrease the level. In Idle mode, you can also adjust the keypad tone volume using these keys.

Switching Off the Microphone (Mute)

You can temporarily switch off your phone microphone, so that the person on the phone cannot hear you.

To switch the microphone off temporarily:

Press the Mute soft key.

To switch the microphone back on:

Press the Unmute soft key.

Answering a Call

When someone calls you, the phone rings and displays the incoming call image.

The caller's phone number, or name if stored in Address Book, displays.

 If necessary, open the phone. Press the key or the Accept soft key to answer the incoming call.

If the **Open to Answer** option is activated, you can answer the call simply by opening the phone. For further details about the **Open to Answer** option, see "Open to Answer" on page 88.

If the **Anykey Answer** option is activated, you can press any key to answer a call except for the key and the **Reject** soft key. For further details about the **Anykey Answer** option, see "Anykey Answer" on page 88.

Note: Press the volume keys on the side of the phone to mute the ringer.

2. End the call by closing the phone or press the \infty key.

Note: You can answer a call while using a menu feature. After ending the call, the phone returns to the function screen you were using.

Answering a Waiting Call

You can answer an incoming call while you have a call in progress, if this service is supported by the network and you have set Call Waiting to Activate. You are notified of an incoming call by a call waiting tone.

To answer a call while you have a call in progress:

- Press the key or the Accept soft key.
- Select Accept and press the Select soft key Alternatively, select End Active Call to end the active call.
- To switch between the two calls, press the Options soft key.
 Press the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Swap and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- To end a call on hold, press the Options soft key, highlight Drop.
 Press the Select soft key or the X key.
 Press the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Drop Active Call and press the Select soft key or the X key.

Switching Between Two Calls

When you have an active call and a call on hold, you may switch between the two calls, changing the one on hold to active and placing the other on hold.

- 1. To switch between the two calls, press the Options soft key.
- Press the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Swap and press the Select soft key or the X key.

The current call is placed on hold and the call on hold is reactivated so that you can continue conversing with that person.

3. End each call normally by pressing the \infty key.

Using Speaker Phone

- Press the key or the Accept soft key to accept the call or enter the number you would like to call and press the key.
- Once the call is connected, press the X key.Press the Yes soft key to activate the speaker phone function.
- Use the Volume key on the left side of the phone to adjust the speaker volume
- To deactivate the speaker phone function, press the X key.
 Press the Yes soft key to activate the speaker phone function.

Missed Calls

When you are unable to answer a call for any reason, you can find out who was calling , if this service is available, so that you can call the person back.

The number of calls you have missed displays on the idle screen and the external display immediately after a call is missed.

Viewing Missed Calls

- 1. If the phone is closed, open the phone.
- 2. Press the View soft kev.

The number corresponding to the most recent missed call displays, if available.

- 3. To scroll through the missed calls, press the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key.
- 4. To call the number, press the \to key.
- To edit or delete a missed call number, highlight the number and press the Options soft key. See procedure below.

Alternatively,

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation keys to highlight Recent Calls and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Missed Calls is highlighted, press the Select soft key or the x key to view calls.
- 4. To scroll through the missed calls, press the Up or Down Navigation key.
- 5. To call the number, press the \to key.
- To edit or delete a missed call number, highlight the number and press the Options soft key. See procedure below.

Editing a Missed Call

To edit a missed call number:

- Press the Options soft key, highlight Use Number and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Edit the number and press the **Options** soft key. The following options appear in the display:
- Save to Address Book: allows you to save the number to the Address Book.
- Send Message: allows you to send a text message or multimedia message to the phone number.
- Address Book: allows you to access the Address Book, Contact List.
- Call Log: allows you to view the call log.
- Highlight Save to Address Book and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Highlight the memory location (SIM or Phone Memory) and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 5. Use the Up or Down Navigation key select an entry type.
 Select New for a new entry and press the Select soft key or the X key.
 Select Update to update an existing entry and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- If you saved the number to Phone, highlight a phone type and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 7. Enter new contact information.

- After you have entered the new contact information, press the Options soft key. The following options appear in the display:
- Save: allows you to save the contact.
- Special Options: allows you add distinctive call features.
- Add Item: allows you to add additional number types.
- 9. Highlight Save and press the Select soft key or the X key.

Deleting a Missed Call

- 1. Press the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key to highlight the number to delete.
- 2. Press the Options soft key.
- Press the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Delete and press the Select soft key or the X key.

To delete the highlighted number, highlight **Selected** and press the **Select** soft key or the \times key.

To delete all numbers in the Missed Call log, highlight **All** and press the **Select** soft key or the X key.

4. Press the Yes soft key to confirm deletion.

Call Log

The phone stores the numbers of the calls you've dialed, received, or missed. You can access these functions from Idle or Menu mode.

Accessing the Call Log in Idle Mode

- In Idle mode, press the key.
 A list of most recent numbers dialed, in the order they were dialed or received appears in the display.
- Press the key to dial the number.
 Alternatively, press the Options soft key, highlight Voice Call and press the Select soft key or the key.

Accessing the Call Log in Menu Mode

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Recent Calls and press the Select soft key or the X key.

Missed Calls

This menu lets you view the 30 most recent calls you received, but did not answer.

The number and name, if already stored in your Address Book, displays with the time and date the call was received.

Calls Made

This menu lets you view the 30 most recent calls you dialed.

The number and name, if already stored in your Address Book, displays with the time and date the call was made.

Calls Received

This menu lets you view the 30 most recent calls you received.

The number and name, if already stored in your Address Book, displays with the time and date the call was received.

Voice Mail

This menu allows you to connect to your voice mail number or edit your voice server number

Speed Dial List

This menu allows you to add or edit an existing speed dial entry.

To call a speed dial entry, use the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key to highlight the Speed Dial location associated with number you want to call and press the key.

Delete All

This menu allows you to delete all of the records in each call record separately, or you can delete all of your call records at one time.

Call Time

This menu lets you view the time log for last call made, and received.

Note: The actual time invoiced by your service provider may vary, depending on network features, rounding-off for billing purposes, and so on.

The following time logs are available:

- Last Call Time: shows the length of your last call.
- Total Sent: shows the total length of all calls you have made since the timer was last reset.

- Total Received: shows the total length of all calls you have received since the timer was last reset.
- Total Time: shows the total length of time for incoming and outgoing calls.
- Reset Timers: allows you to reset the call timers.

Data Volume

This menu lets you view recent Data Volume.

Note: The actual time invoiced by your service provider may vary, depending on network features, rounding-off for billing purposes, and so on.

The following data volume logs are available:

- Recent Volume: shows the recent amount of data in bytes
- Total Volume: shows the total amount of data in bytes.
- Reset Volume: allows you to reset the data volume logs.

Data Call Time

This menu lets you view recent Data Call Time.

Note: The actual time invoiced by your service provider may vary, depending on network features, rounding-off for billing purposes, and so on.

The following data call time logs are available:

- Recent Time: shows the length of your last data call.
- Total Time: shows the total amount data calls.
- Reset Timers: allows you to reset the data call timer.

Address Book

This menu allows you access the Address Book menu option. See "Section 6: Understanding Your Address Book" on page 47 for detailed information.

Ouiet Mode

Quiet mode is convenient when you wish to prevent the phone from making noise, in a theater for example.

In Idle mode, press and hold the see with the "Vibration All Activated" message and the Silent mode icon () display.

In Silent mode, instead of sounds, your phone will vibrate to inidicate activity, such an incoming call or message. It will also turn off the sound made when keys are pressed.

To exit and reactivate the previous sound settings, press and hold the \mathbb{A}^3 key again. The Silent mode icon (\mathbb{A}) no longer displays.

This section explains the menu navigation for your phone. It also includes an outline of all the available menus associated with your phone.

Menu Navigation

You can tailor the phone's range of functions to your needs using menus and submenus. Menus and sub-menus can be accessed by scrolling, using the Navigation keys or by using the shortcuts.

Accessing a Menu Function by Scrolling

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Scroll using the Navigation keys to reach a main menu, Settings for example. Press the Select soft key or the X key to enter the menu.
- If the menu contains sub-menus, Call for example, you can access them by pressing the Select soft key, the numeric key associated with the menu item, or the X key.
 - If the menu that you have selected contains further options, highlight the option and press the **Select** soft key or the X key.
- To scroll through the menus, press the Up or Down Navigation key or the Volume key located on the left side of the phone.
- 5. To confirm the chosen setting, press the **Select** soft key, or the X key.
- To return to the previous menu level, press the Back soft key or the key.
- 7. To exit the menu without changing the settings, press the 6 key.

Return to the previous menu

1. Press the **Back** (right) soft key to return to the previous menu.

2. If the Back soft key function does not appear in the display, press the key to return to the previous menu.

Navigating Using Shortcuts

Shortcut keys allow you to quickly access menu items, sub-menus and options. Each menu item and option is numbered and can be accessed quickly by pressing the numeric key associated with the menu item or option you would like to access.

Note: Numbers in this section may not match the menu number on the phone, depending on the services supported by your SIM card.

For example, accessing the Wallpaper menu.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the Menu (im) soft key to access Menu mode.
- 2. Press the 9 key for **Settings**.
- 3. Press the 2 key for **Display Settings**.
- 4. Press the 2 cc key for Wallpaper.
- Use the Left or Right Navigation key to select the folder containing the image file.
- Highlight the image file and press the Select soft key or the X to preview the image.
- 7. Press the **Set** soft key or the X to set the image as the wallpaper.

In Use Menu Outline

Your phone includes a standby menu and an In-Use Menu. The In-Use Menu is available when your on a call. Press the **Options** soft key while on a call to display the following:

- Hold: allows you to place a call on hold.
- Mute Key Tone: allows you to turn the key tones off or on. If the Mute Key Tone
 option is selected, your phone does not transmit the DTMF tone of the keys,
 which allows you to press keys without hearing annoying key tones during a call.
- New Call: allows you to make or accept another call.
- Send DTMF: DTMF tones are the tones used in phones for tone dialing. You can send DTMF tones as a group after entering the entire number you need to send or retrieving a number from Contacts. This feature is helpful for entering a password or an account number when you call an automated system, like a banking service.
- Address Book: allows you to access the Contact List.
- Messaging: allows you to send a SMS message to the caller or the person you called.
- Memo: allows you to create a memo.

This section outlines how to select the desired text input modes when entering characters into your phone. This section also describes how to use the T9 Predictive Text Entry System to reduce the amount of key strokes associated with entering text.

Changing the Text Input Mode

When you are in a field that allows characters to be entered, you will notice the text input mode indicator on the display.

For example, the following screen displays when writing a text message.



- To select and deselect T9 mode, press and hold the key until geab displays.
- 2. To select Alphabet mode, press the * key until Abc displays.
- 3. To select Number mode, press the key until 123 displays.
- 4. To select Symbol mode, press and hold the 🖼 key until SYM

Using T9 Mode

Entering a Word in T9 Mode

When you are in T9 mode, start entering a word by pressing the 2 to 9 keys.
 Press each key only once for each letter.

Example: To enter "Hello", press the 4,3,5,5, and 6 keys.:



The word you are typing appears in the display. It may change with each key that you press.

- 2. Enter the whole word before editing or deleting the keystrokes.
- 3. When the word displays correctly, go to step 4.

If the word doesn't display correctly, press the *\overline{\sigma} \text{ key to display alternative word choices. Continue to press *\overline{\sigma} \text{ key until the word appears in the display.}

For example, both "Of" and "Me" use the ___ and __ keys. The phone displays the most commonly used choice first.

If the word doesn't display press the we we until the **Spell** soft key appears in the display. Press the **Spell** soft and enter the word and press the **Add** soft key. The word is added to the T9 dictionary and becomes the first word for the associated key press series.

4. Insert a space by pressing the 🔊 key and start entering the next word.

Tips for Using T9 Mode

- To enter periods, hyphens, or apostrophes, press the <u>f</u> key. T9 mode applies grammar rules to ensure that correct punctuation is used.
- To shift case in T9 mode, use the key. There are three cases; Initial capital T9EAB, Capital lock T9EAB, and Lower case T9EAB.
- Once text had been entered you can move the cursor by using the Navigation keys. To delete letters, press the key. Press and hold the key to clear the display.

Entering Upper and Lower Case Letters

Alphabet mode allows you to enter letters by pressing the numeric key associated with the letter you want to enter. Press the key repeatedly until the letter you want appears in the display.

Entering a Word in Alphabet Mode

- 1. Press the key (1 to 0) labeled with the letter you want.
- 2. Repeat pressing the key until the letter you want appears in the display.
- 3. Select the other letters in the same way.

Note: When entering the same letter twice or a different letter on the same key, just wait for a few seconds for the cursor to move to the right automatically, and then select the next letter

Tips for Using Alphabet Mode

- To insert a space, press the #\$\mathbb{#}\$ kev.
- To shift case in Alphabet mode, use the key. There are three cases: Initial capital Abc., Capital lock ABO, and Lower case abc.
- Once text had been entered you can move the cursor by using the Navigation keys. To delete letters, press the key. Press and hold the key to clear the display.

Using Number Mode

Number mode allows you to enter numbers by pressing the key labeled with the number you want. When in a text message screen, press the *\times key to access the Number mode.

Using Symbol Mode

Symbol mode allows you to enter symbols by pressing the number key associated with the symbol you want.

When in a text message entry screen, press and hold the well key to access Symbol mode. The Symbol screen displays the available symbols for each key. Use the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key to cycle through all available symbols.

Press the number associated with the symbols you would like to enter. When finished, press the $\mathbf{0K}$ soft key or the \mathbf{X} key.

- 8. Enter the new contact information. Populate the following fields:
- First/Last Name: enter the first and last name of the contact.

- Email Home: enter a home e-mail address.
- Group: allows you to assign the contact to an existing group.
- Homepage: enter a URL.
- Birthdate: enter a birthdate.

- After you finished entering the contact information, press the Options soft key. The following options appear in the display.

- Email Home: enter a home e-mail address.

- More Information: enter additional information for the contact. Such as Job Title, Department, Company, Nickname, and Notes.
- 6. Press the **Options** soft key. Choose from the following options:
- Save: saves the entry.
- Special Options: allows you to add distinctive options that are specific to the contact.
 - Picture: allows you to assign a caller ID image to the number.
 - Ring Tone: allows you to assign a melody to the number.
 - Msg. Alert Tone: allows you to set the notification tone for incoming messages.

 - Mobile: assigns the number entered to the Mobile entry.

Storing a number in the SIM Memory

- Using the Up or Down Navigation key highlight Add New Contact and press the Select soft key or the X key.

- Select a Memory location, select SIM and press the Select soft key or the key.
- 5. Enter the following information for your contact:
- Name: enter the first and last name of the contact.
- Phone Number: enter the phone number of the contact.
- SIM Location: enter SIM location number.
- 6. Press the **Save** soft key or the X key to save contact.

Pauses

When you call automated systems (like banking services and voice mail) you are often required to enter a password or an account number. Instead of manually entering the numbers each time you can store the numbers in your Address Book along with special characters called pauses.

Enter the number you want to store, press and hold the velocities key to insert a two-second pause. A "P" appears in the display.

Note: You can enter multiple two-second pauses to extend the length of the pause. For example two consecutive pauses equates to a pause time of four seconds.

Dialing a Number from the Address Book

Once you have stored phone numbers in the Address Book, you can dial them easily and quickly by using the SIM location number that was assigned when the numbers was entered.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation keys to highlight Address Book and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Using the Up or Down Navigation key highlight Contact List and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 4. Enter the first few letters of the name that you want to find. The Address Book entries are listed, highlighting the entry that most closely matches your input.
- **5.** Once you have found the entry, press the \times key to dial the number.

Dialing a Number from the SIM Card

1. In Idle mode, enter the location number assigned to the contact entry you want to dial and press the web.

The entries in the SIM card appears, with the desired number highlighted.

Note: If you cannot remember a location number, you must go into the Contact List in the Address Book menu to search for the entry by name.

- 2. Press the Up or Down Navigation key to find other numbers on the list.
- 3. Press the Call soft key, the \times key, or the \times key when you have selected the number you want to call.

Finding an Address Book Entry

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation keys to highlight Address Book and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Using the Up or Down Navigation key highlight Contact List and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 4. Highlight a name from the Address Book list or enter the first few letters of the name of the contact
 - The Address Book entries are listed, starting with the first entry matching your input.
- **5.** To view the highlighted entry, press the X key.
- Press the key to dial the number, or press the Options soft key to access the Address Book entry options.

Using Address Book Entry Options

While viewing the Contact List, press the **Options** soft key to use the following options for the entry.

- Details: press to display the content of the contact.
- Edit: allows you to edit the contacts information.
- New: allows you to add a new Address Book entry.
- Delete: allows you to delete the entry. You are asked to confirm that you wish to
 delete the entry by pressing the Yes soft key or the X key.
- Search Groups: allows you to organize your Address Book entries in caller groups so that the phone alerts you in a specific way when a person from one of your groups calls you. Select one of the 10 groups available.

- Service Number (SIM Dependent): displays emergency numbers, directory
 inquiries and voice mail numbers. Press the Call soft key, or the
 key to call selected service number.
- Delete All: allows you to delete all entries from either the Phone and SIM, Phone, or SIM. You are asked to confirm that you wish to delete the entry by pressing the Yes soft key or the X key.

While viewing an Address Book entry, press the **Options** soft key to use the following options.

- Edit: allows you to edit the contacts information.
- Send Message: allows you to create and send a text message or multimedia message for the selected number.
- Special Options: displays special options that are specific to the contact.
- Add to Speed Dial: allows you to add the number to a speed dial location.
- Copy to SIM/Phone: allows you to copy the number to another location. You can select the memory location, either SIM or Phone, depending on the current memory location.
- Send Name Card via: allows you to send your Name Card via Text Message or Bluetooth.
- Use Number: allows you to paste the number into the normal dialing mode. Use
 this option to dial a number similar to one in the Address Book, such as a
 different extension in the same office.
 - Use the $\ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \$ key to change the number as required. When you are ready to dial, press the $\ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \$ key.
- Delete: allows you to delete the entry. You are asked to confirm that you wish to
 delete the entry by pressing the Yes soft key or the X key.

Editing an Existing Address Book Entry

Delete All

- Select the memory location you would like to delete and press the Select soft key or the X key. Choose from the following:
- Phone & SIM: deletes entries in the Phone and SIM memory at the same time.
- Phone: deletes entries from the Phone memory.

- SIM: deletes entries from the SIM memory.

Copy All

Own Number

Own Number is a memory aid which you can use to check your own phone number if you need to do so.

You can assign a name to each of your own phone numbers registered on your SIM card. You can also edit the names and numbers. Any changes made here do not affect the actual subscriber numbers on your SIM card.

- Enable: you can only call phone numbers stored in Phonebook.

You must enter your PIN2. You can obtain your PIN2 from your service provider.

Service Number (SIM Dependent)

Service Number allows you to view a list of service numbers assigned by your service provider. These numbers include emergency numbers, directory inquiries and voice mail numbers.

Settings

Settings allow you to customize how your Address Book displays entries and your Default Storage settings.

Memory Status

Memory Status allow you to check how many names and numbers are stored in the Address book, in both the SIM card and the phone memory. You can also see the capacity of both memory locations.

Using Instant Messenger (IM)

Instant Messenger (IM) is a way of sending short, simple messages that are delivered immediately to users online at the moment.

Before using this feature, you need to subscribe to a messenger service. For further details, contact your service provider.

Start your Messenger

Note: The zx20 supports the following Instant Messaging Applications: AIM, MSN, Yahoo! and ICQ.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation keys to highlight IM and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight your established IM provider and press the Select soft key or the X key. Choose from the following:
- AIM
- MSN
- Yahoo!
- ICQ
- 4. Select one of the following and press the **Select** soft key or the X key.
- Sign On for AIM
- Sign In for MSN
- Connect for ICQ
- Sign In for Yahoo!
- Enter your Screen Name (this field title will change to reflect the name used in each instant message application) and your Password and press the OK soft key.

- Input Method: allows to select text input mode.
- Input Language: allows you to change the language to be used in input mode.
- Insert: allows you to add precomposed message text from the Text Templates folder, add Contacts, or a URL address in the Favorites folder.
- Save to Drafts: save the message to the Drafts folder.

Multimedia Messages

- Play: plays audio file attached to your message.
- Send: sends the message.
- Edit Style: allows you to change the Page Duration, Font Color, and Font Style.
- Background Color: allows you to change the background color.
- Text & Image Order: allows you to change the location of the image and the text.
- Save to Drafts: save the message to the Drafts folder.

Email Inbox

Stores incoming Email.

Chat

Note: Additional charges may apply. Please refer to your subscription details for more information.

Chat allows logged-in users to have a typed, real-time, online conversation. Users may send private (one-to-one) messages.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation keys to highlight Messaging and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight Chat and press the Select soft key or the X key to connect to Chat.

Templates

Templates allow you to insert pre-composed phrases into the subject or the body of your message. You can edit the current message templates or create your own.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation keys to highlight Messaging and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight Templates and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Highlight Text Templates or MMS Templates and press the Select soft key or the X key.

Text Templates Options

Text Templates, are pre-composed phrases. Using the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key, highlight a template and press the **Options** soft key. Choose from the following options:

- Send: allows you to send the selected template via Text Message, Multimedia Message or Email.
- Edit: allows you to edit the selected template.

Broadcast (SIM Dependent)

This network service allows you to receive text messages on various topics, such as the weather or traffic. Cell Broadcast (CB) messages display as soon as they are received, provided that:

- the phone is in Idle mode.
- the Receive option is set to Enable.
- the message channel is currently active on the channel list.

Deleting Messages

- Email Gateway Address: connects two or more electronic mail systems (including dissimilar mail systems) and transfers messages between them.

Email Accounts allows you to configure up to 5 Email accounts using different service providers. The last account you accessed is automatically activated for sending or receiving Emails.

To select and edit an account:

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation key to highlight Messaging and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Settings and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Email and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight Email Accounts and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Highlight an Email account and press the X key. A check mark appears in the box.
- 7. Press the Options soft key.

The following options appear in the display:

- Save: allows you to save the highlighted Email account.
- Edit: allows you to edit the highlighted Email account.
- Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight Edit and press the Select soft key or the X key.

The following options appear in the display:

- Account Name: enter a name for the current account.
- SMTP Server: enter the server address.

- SMTP Port: enter the port number obtained from your email provider.
- Use SSL: press the X key to activate SSL.
- Retrieving Server Type: allows you to select an incoming message server type. Choose POP3 or IMAP 4.
- POP3 Server/IMAP4 Server: enter your server address.
- POP3 Port/IMAP4 Port: enter the port number obtained from your email provider.
- Use SSL: press the 💢 key to activate SSL.
- IMAP4 Retrieving Option: allows you to select what type of Email message will be retreived. Select All or New.
- Retrieving Option: allows you to select how the Email message appears in the display. Select Normal, Subject Only or Text Body.
- Keep In Server: press the X key to set whether or not your Emails are deleted from the server after retrieval. A check mark displays in the box.
- My Address: enter your email address
- User Name: enter your user ID.
- Password: enter your Email password.
- Use SMTP Authentication: press the
 \(\times \) key specify a protocol type for the server
- Same as POP3/IMAP4: press the X key if the POP3/IMAP4 Server address is the same.
- When you have finished editing the Email account, press the Save soft key or the X key to save your changes.

Voice Mail

Your SIM card gives you a default service number of the voice mail center. However, you may need to change the number. Use the following procedures to change your voice mail number.

From the Settings Menu:

- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Voice Mail and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 2. Press the Edit soft key.
- 3. Enter a Name.

 Press and hold the key to clear the current number, enter a new number and press the Save soft key or the key.

Note: You must obtain the Center Address number from your service provider.

5. When you are finished, press the K key.

Push Messages

Push Messages allows you to select whether your phone receives or rejects push messages from the WAP Server.

Use the ${\bf Up}$ or ${\bf Down}$ Navigation key to highlight one of the following options and press the ${\bf Select}$ soft key or the ${\bf X}$ key.

- Never: select to reject push messages from the WAP server.
- Always: select to accept push messages from the WAP server.

Broadcast (SIM Dependent)

This network service allows you to receive text messages on various topics, such as the weather or traffic.

Please contact your service provider for further details.

Memory Status

Memory Status allows you to check the amount of the memory being used and the available memory for Text messages, Multimedia messages, Email messages and Push Messages. Use the Left or Right Navigation key to select which message type you would like to view.

The display shows the total space including the used and free space. You can also view how much space is currently occupied by each message box.

This section explains the sound and phone settings for your phone. It includes display settings, security settings, and extra settings associated with your phone.

Time & Date

This menu allows you to change the time and date settings that appear in the display.

Note: Before setting the time, you must specify your time zone. See "World Time" on page 142.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the Menu () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation keys to highlight Settings and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation keys to highlight Time & Date and press the Select soft key or the X key. The following options are available.

- Time: allows you to enter the current time using your keypad. Press any numeric key to select AM or PM.
- Date: allows you to enter the current date using your keypad.
- Time Format: allows you to change the time format to 12 hours or 24 hours. Use the Left or Right Navigation key to select Time Format.
- Date Format: allow you to change the date format. Use the Left or Right Navigation key to select a Date Format.
- Auto Update: allows you to receive time information from your service provider's network. Use the Left or Right Navigation key to set Auto Update.
 - On: the phone automatically updates the time and date according to the current time zone.
 - Off: you need to manually set the time and date according to the current time zone.
 - Confirm First: a pop up appears in the display asking you to confirm Auto Update.
- 4. Press the **Save** soft key or the X to save your Time & Date settings.


Note: Automatic updates of time and date does not change the time you have set for alarm settings or calendar memos.

Profiles

A profile contains all the information associated with the volume settings and levels of your phone. It is responsible for ringers, alarms, notifications, and system sounds. There are five profiles that are included and have the ability to be edited to your desired settings. The profiles are as follows:

Normal: this profile is the default setting that is selected when you first power up the phone.

Meeting: this profile mutes the ringer. This profile is used for a meeting environment or quiet settings.



Silent: this profile is set up to silence all ringers or notification alerts associated with the phone.

Outdoor: this profile raises the ringer volume levels to maximum for loud or outdoor settings.

Editing a Profile

- 1. In Idle Mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation keys to highlight Settings and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 3. Use the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key to highlight **Profiles** and press the **Select** soft key or the **X** key.
- 4. Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight a profile, press the Options soft key, highlight Edit and press the Select soft key or the X key. Choose from the following options:
- Call Alert Type: allows you to specify how you are informed about incoming coming calls.
- Voice Call Ringtone: allows you to select a ringtone for incoming calls.
 This option is not available when editing Silent Mode.
- Tone Volume: allows you to set the tone volume. This option is not available when editing Silent Mode.
- Message Alert Type: allows you to select a the alert type that sounds when receiving a new Text messages, Multimedia messages, and Email.
- Message Alert Tone: allows you to select a the alert tone that sounds when receiving a new Text messages, Multimedia messages, and Email. This option is not available when editing Silent Mode.
- Message Alert Repetition: allows you to select how often the phone notifies you of a new message.
- Phone Sounds: allows you to select phone features that will sound when the operation is performed. Example, when you open or close your handset.
- Key Tones: allows you to select a tone that sounds when you press a key.
 This option is not available when editing Silent Mode.
- Key Tone Volume: allows you to adjust the key tone volume. This option is not available when editing Silent Mode.
- Edit the profile settings and press the Options soft key, highlight Save and press the Select soft key or press the X key.

Phone Settings

To customize the setting for your phone use the following steps:

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation keys to highlight Settings and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Phone Settings and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight an option and press the Select soft key or the X key.

Language

This options allows you to select a display language. When the language is set to **Automatic**, the language is automatically selected according to the language of the SIM card used.

Screen Text: allows you to select a display language.

Highlight Screen Text, use the ${\bf Left}$ or ${\bf Right}$ Navigation key to scroll through languages.

Once you have selected a language, press the Save soft key or the X key.

Input T9: allows you to select an input T9 language.

Highlight $\mbox{\bf Input~T9},$ use the $\mbox{\bf Left}$ or $\mbox{\bf Right}$ Navigation key to scroll through languages.

Once you have selected a language, press the **Save** soft key or the **X** key.

Short Cut

Short Cut, allow you to customize your Navigation key short cuts. In Idle mode the Navigation key allow you to access these menus directly.

- From the Phone Settings menu, use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Short Cut and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 2. Press the Navigation direction you would like to edit.
- 3. Press the **Options** soft key. Choose from the following options:
- Change: allows you to change the selected Navigation key direction menu option.
- **Remove**: removes the short cut from the selected Navigation key direction.
- Remove All: removes all short cuts from the Navigation key.

- Using the Up or Down Navigation key highlight Change and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to select the menu to be assigned to the key and press the Save soft key or the X key.

Note: Select the None option to deactivate a short cut key.

Open to Answer

When this option is set to **On**, you can simply open the phone to answer a call. When it is set to **Off**, you must open the phone and press a key to answer a call, depending on the setting of the Anykey answer option.

When this option is **Off**, you must press the key or **Accept** soft key to answer a call.

- To turn **On**, highlight **On** and press the **Save** soft key or the **X** key.
- To turn **Off**, highlight **Off** and press the **Save** soft key or the X key.

Anykey Answer

When this option is set to **On**, you can answer an incoming call by pressing any key, except the **O** key or the Reject soft key.

To reject the call, press the key or the Reject soft key.

- ullet To turn ${f On}$, highlight ${f On}$ and press the ${f Save}$ soft key or the $igstyle{\times}$ key.
- To turn Off, highlight Off and press the Save soft key or the X key.

Display Settings

To customize the settings for the display use the following steps:

- 1. In Idle mode, press the Menu () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation keys to highlight Settings and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 3. Use the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key to highlight **Display Settings** and press the **Select** soft key or the \times key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight an option and press the Select soft key or the X key.

Greeting Message

This menu allows you to customize your greeting displayed on the Main LCD and the Sub LCD.

- Main LCD: allows you to enter a greeting that briefly appears in the display when the phone is switched on. This greeting can contain up to 42 alpha-numeric character.
- Sub LCD: allows you to enter a greeting that appears in the external display at all
 times.

To change the greeting:

- Highlight Main LCD or Sub LCD and press the Select soft key or the key.
- 2. Press and hold the current greeting.
- Enter the new greeting using the keypad and press the Save soft key or the key.

Wallpaper

This menu allows you to select a background image to be displayed on the Idle screen

Use the **Left** or **Right** Navigation key to display the following options:

- Downloads: this option allows you to access the web site preset by your service provider to download images.
- Photos: this option allows you to select photos taken with your handset or allows you to take a photo with your handset to appear in your phone's display while in idle mode.
- Pictures: this option allows you to select pictures to appear in your phone's display while in idle mode.
- Sub LCD: this option allows you to select a graphic to appear in your phone's external display.

Selecting a Photo

 Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight an image and press the Select soft key or the X key.

Note: Press the Left or Right Navigation key to preview other images.

Press the **Set** soft key or the X key apply image.

 Alternatively, to take a photo you would like to use as your wallpaper, highlight Take Photo and press the Select soft key or the X key.
 Press the X key to take your photo. Press the **Options** soft key, use the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key to highlight **Set as** and press the **Select** soft key or the \times key.

Highlight Wallpaper and press the Select soft key or the 💢 key.

Note: Press the Left or Right Navigation key to preview other photos.

Press the **Set** soft key to apply image.

Pictures: this option allows you to select a graphic to appear in your phone's display while in idle mode.

Selecting a Picture

 Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight a picture and press the Select soft key or the X key.

Note: Press the Left or Right Navigation key to preview other pictures.

2. Press the **Set** soft key or the **X** key to apply picture.

Sub LCD:

This option allows you to select a graphic to appear in your phone's external display.

Note: The Sub LCD graphic will only appear in the external display when the Wallpaper option has been selected in the Sub LCD menu. See "Sub LCD" on page 90.

Selecting a Sub LCD Image

 Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight an image and press the Select soft key or the X key.

Note: Press the Left or Right Navigation key to preview other images.

2. Press the **Set** soft key or the X key to apply image.

Sub LCD

This menu allows you to select a background image to be displayed in the external display.

Choose from the following options:

Clock: select this option to display a clock in your phone's external display.

- Sub Title: select this option to display a sub title that appears in your phone's external display at all times.
- Images: select this option to display an image in your phone's external display.

Selecting a Clock

- 1. Highlight Clock and press the X key.
- 2. Use the Left or Right Navigation key to scroll through clock images.
- 3. Select an image and press the **Save** soft key or the **X** key.
- Make sure Clock is highlighted and press the Change soft key to apply clock image to external display.

Creating a Sub Title

- 1. Highlight Sub Title and press the X kev.
- 2. Press and hold the \(\subseteq \) key to clear the current sub title.
- Enter the new greeting using the keypad and press the Save soft key or the key.
- Make sure Sub Title is highlighted and press the Change soft key to apply sub title to external display.

Images: this option allows you to apply the graphic selected in the **Sub LCD** menu to your phone's external display. See "Selecting a Sub LCD Image" on page 90.

Selecting and Applying Image to the External LCD

Your phone has an external display on the front of the phone. It indicates the time and when you have an incoming call or message. It also alerts you at a specified time when you have set an alarm. The backlight turns on and the corresponding icon appears on the external display.

You can change the display type for the external display in the Sub LCD menu.

Note: To apply the Sub LCD Images selected in the Images menu, simply highlight Images and press the Change soft key.

To change Images perform the following:

- 1. Highlight Images and press the X key.
- 2. Press the Change soft key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight an image and press the X key to view the image.

Alternatively, press the **Options** soft key, highlight **View** and press the **Select** soft key or the \times key.

Note: Press the Left or Right Navigation key to preview other images.

- 4. Select an image and press the **Select** soft key or the X key.
- Press the X key to save image.
 Alternatively press the Options soft key, select Set and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Make sure Images is highlighted and press the Change soft key to apply wallpaper.

LCD Brightness

You can adjust the display brightness for the Main LCD and the Front LCD to see it better in different lighting conditions.

Press the **Left** or **Right** Navigation key or press the Volume key to adjust the brightness.

Sub LCD Contrast

This menu allows you to adjust the sub LCD contrast.

Press the **Left** or **Right** Navigation key or press the **Volume** keys to adjust the contrast

Backlight

The **Backlight** illuminates the display and the keypad. When you press any key or open the phone, the backlight turns on. It goes off when no keys have been pressed within a given period of time, depending on the setting in the Backlight menu.

Use the Left or Right Navigation key to select a length time for the On or Dim options.

Dialing Display

This menu allows you to select numeric font color that appears in the display when making a call. Choose basic or rainbow.

Menu Style

This menu allows you to select the menu display style. You can choose either **List** or **Icon** menu style.

Show Caller Information

This menu allows you to turn on or off the Caller ID on both the Display and Sub LCD.

Call

See "Section 11: Network Services" on page 144.

Connectivity

You can customize the profiles containing the settings for connecting your phone to the network. These settings are used for the WAP browser or Instant Messenger, or sending Multimedia messages or Emails.

Note: Your phone is suited for connecting to the network by default. If you change the Multimedia settings without first checking with your service provider, the WAP, Multimedia and Email features may not work properly.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology capable of exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet without requiring a physical connection

Unlike infrared, you don't need to line up the devices to beam information with Bluetooth. If the devices are within a range of one another, you can exchange information between them, even if they are located in different rooms.

The Bluetooth wireless technology settings menu provides the ability to view and change the device name, show the visibility, and set the security for the device.

Activation

When the Bluetooth is turned on, you can use the Bluetooth features available. When the Bluetooth is turned off, you cannot send or receive information via Bluetooth. To save battery life or in situations where Bluetooth use is prohibited, such as airline traveling, you can turn off the Bluetooth wireless technology headset.

My Devices

This menu provides a list of Bluetooth wireless technology devices discovered by your handset.

- Highlight My Devices and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- To search for the Bluetooth device(s), highlight Search For New Device and press the Select soft key or the X key.

Connecting to a Bluetooth Device

From the My Devices list,

- 1. Highlight the device and press the **Select** soft key or the X key.
- 2. Enter the PIN for the device.

If connecting to a Bluetooth wireless device consult your Bluetooth device user manual for your assigned PIN.

If connecting to another handset, enter a user-defined four to eight digit PIN.

Note: The first time you try to pair with a handset, you and the owner of the other handset must enter the same PIN.

Once the handsets are paired, you will not need to use the PIN again.

- 3. Press the **OK** soft key or the X key.
- If you are unable to pair with the device a popup appears in the display. Press the Yes soft key to retry.

My Phone's Visibility

Allows other users to see your accessibility. Select **On** for other devices to see your device, or **Off** for no visibility.

My Phone's Name

Shows the handset name. You may change this name enter the text and press the χ key.

Secure Mode

Secure mode provides the ability to monitor data stored on the handset. If another person trys to connect to my phone and access my phone's data, using the "Secure mode", you can decide whether it is allowed. That is, if the Secure mode is set as On, whenever the other person trys to access my phone's data, the phone will always ask you to allow him, if the Secure mode is set as Off, he can access my phone's data without permission.

Bluetooth Services

Actually, the Bluetooth specification is a protocol that describes how the short-range wireless technology works, whereas individual profiles describe the services supported by individual devices. Profiles reduce the chance that different devices will not work together.

Your phone supports the following profile services:

- Headset: enables outgoing and incoming calls.
- Handsfree: the remote carkit enables outgoing and incoming calls.
- Dial up: the remote bluetooth device enables internet access through a phone modem.
- File Transfer: the remote bluetooth device enables users to transfer files from their handset to another.
- Object Push: the remote bluetooth device enables the transfer of personal data to other devices.

Connections

The **Connections** feature allows you to select and or edit the profile containing the setting for connecting your phone to the network. These settings are used for the WAP browser or Instant Messenger, and sending MMS messages or emails.

Note: Your phone connects to the network by default. If you change the MMS settings without first checking with your service provider, the WAP, MMS and Email features may not work properly.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation keys to highlight Settings and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Connectivity and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Connections and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 5. Use the **Up** or **Down** Navigation to highlight a profile.
- 6. Press the **Options** soft key. Depending on your profile choice, the following options appear in the display:
- Edit: allows you to edit the profile settings.
- View: allows you to view the profile settings
- New: allows you to create a new profile.
- **Delete**: allows you to delete the selected profile.
- Rename: allows you to rename the selected profile.
- Restore: allows you to restore the default settings for the highlighted profile.

- Password: enter the password required to connect to the network.
- **Protocol**: select a web page format. Select HTTP, Other or WAP.
- Home URL: enter the address of your startup homepage. When the default homepage displays, you can delete it by pressing and holding the ckey.
- Gateway Address/Proxy Address: enter the WAP Gateway IP Address or HTTP Proxy IP Address required to connect to the Internet.

Note: The Gateway Address field is determined by your Protocol selection.

- Secure Connection/Port: allows you to turn the secure connection type on or off.
- Linger Time (Sec.): enter a time that will disconnect the WAP browser if there is no activity.
- Advanced Settings: allows you to enable and enter a Static IP address, a Static DNS address or select a Traffic Class.
- 8. When you have finished, press the **Save** soft key or the **X** key.

Software Update

Software Update allows your wireless provider to automatically install high-priority updates on your handset.

Application Settings

You can customize various options for using the following applications.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation keys to highlight Settings and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Application Settings and press the Select soft key or the X key. The following options appear in the display:

Internet

- Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight Internet and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Use the Up or Down Navigation key highlight a profile and press the Options soft key to display the following options:
- Save: saves the profile.
- View: allows you to view the profile settings
- New: allows you to create a new profile.
- Restore: allows you to restore the default settings for the highlighted profile.
- **Delete**: allows you to delete the highlighted profile.
- Rename: allows you to rename the highlighted profile.

Edit: allows you to edit the profile.

Messaging

From the Applications Settings menu:

- Delivery Report: when this function is activated, the network informs you whether or not your message has been delivered.
- Add My Name Card: allows you to add a name card that display on the bottom
 of all outgoing messages. See "My Name Card" on page 59 for information about
 creating a name card.
- Add Signature: allows you to add a signature that displays on the bottom of all
 outgoing messages.
- Input Signature: allows you enter the signature you want displayed on the bottom of all outgoing messages.

Receiving Options

- Set Download Limit: allows you to set a size limit for file downloads.
- Auto Polling: when this function is activated your phone automatically checks the server for incoming messages.
- Polling Frequency: allows you to select how often the phone checks the server for incoming messages.
- Block Address: allows you to block email received from a specific email address
- Block Subject: allows you to block email received that are about a specific subject matter.
- Email Profiles: allows you to select a connection profile for sending and receiving Email. See "Email Profiles" on page 79 for more information.
- Email Accounts: allows you to configure up to 5 Email accounts using different service providers. The last account you accessed is automatically activated for

sending or receiving Emails. See "Email Accounts" on page 81 for more information.

Voice Mail

Your SIM card gives you a default service number of the voice mail center. However, you may need to change the number. Use the following procedures to change your voice mail number.

From the Application Settings menu:

- 1. Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Messaging and press the Select soft key or the X kev.
- 2. Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Voice Mail and press the **Select** soft key or the X key.
- 3. Press the Edit soft kev.
- 4. Enter a Name.
- 5. Press and hold the \(\subseteq \) key to clear the current number, enter a new number and press the **Save** soft key or the X key.

Note: You must obtain the Center Address number from your service provider.

6. When you are finished, press the key

Push Messages

Push Messages allows you to select whether your phone receives or rejects push messages from the WAP Server.

Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight one of the following options and press the **Select** soft key or the X key.

- Never: rejects push messages from the WAP server.
- Always: accepts push messages from the WAP server.

Broadcast (SIM Dependent)

This network service allows you to receive text messages on various topics, such as the weather or traffic.

Please contact your service provider for further details.

Address Book

1. Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight Address Book and press the **Select** soft key or the X key. Choose from the following options:

- Viewing Settings: allows you to set how Address Book entries appear in the display. Choose either By Last Name, or By First Name.
- Default Storage Settings: allows you to set the default storage setting for new Address Book entries. Choose either Optionally, SIM, or Phone.

Camera

You can change the default settings for the Camera.

From the Application Settings menu:

- Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight Camera and press the Select soft key or the X key. Choose from the following options:
- Size: allows you select the default size for photos.
- Photo Quality: allows you to select the photo quality.
- View Finder: allows you to select the view of the viewfinder.
- Spot Focus: allows you to select an exposure mode that sets the exposure based on the rectangle in the center of the viewfinder.
- White Balance: allows you select the white balance based on changing conditions. White Balance ensures that colors are captured accurately (without any color cast) whatever lighting used.
- ISO: allows you to set ISO to Auto,100,200,400 or 800. The ISO value is a number inditing the cameras sensitivity to light. In bright light, set the ISO value lower.
- Shutter Sound: allows you to select a tone that will sound when taking a
 picture.
- Zoom Sound: allows you to select a tone that will sound when zooming in or out on a subject.
- Brightness Sound: allows you to select a tone that will sound when adjusting the brightness.
- Save: allows you to set the phone to automatically save photos to a specified location.
- Multi Shot Speed: allows you to select the multi shot speed.
- **Default Name**: allows you to enter a default name for photos.

Video Recorder

You can change the default settings for the Video Recorder.

From the Application Settings menu:

1. Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight Video Recorder and press

the **Select** soft key or the **X** key. Choose from the following options:

- Default Name: allows you to enter a default name for video clips.
- Save: allows you to set the phone to automatically save video clips to a specified location.
- Quality: allows you to determine image quality.
- Recording Time: allows you to set the recording time.
- Size: allows you to set the image size.
- Audio Record: allows you to mute or unmute audio.

Record Audio

You can change the default settings for Record Audio.

- Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight Record Audio and press the Select soft key or the X key. Choose from the following options:
- Default Name: allows you to enter a default name for voice recordings.
- Recording Time: allows you to set the length of the default recording time.

Media Player

You can change the default settings for the Media Player.

From the Application Settings menu:

- Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight Media Player and press the Select soft key or the X key. Choose from the following options:
- Play Options: allows you to set how the Media player will play files. Choose Normal, Random, Repeat One, or Repeat All.
- Volume: allows you to set the sound volume.
- Audio Player Skin: allows you to select the look of the audio player.

Video On Demand (VOD)

You can change the default settings for VOD.

From the Application Settings menu:

- Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight VOD and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- Using the Up or Down Navigation key highlight a profile and press the Options soft key to display the following options:
- Save: saves the highlighted profile.
- Edit: allows you to edit the profile settings.

Security

The Security feature enables you to restrict to use of your phone by others and to restrict the types of calls.

Phone Lock

When the **Phone Lock** feature is enabled, the phone is locked and you must enter the 4-8 digit phone password each time the phone is switched on.

Once the correct password has been entered, you can use the phone until you switch it off

The following options are available:

- Enable: you are required to enter the phone password when you switch on the phone.
- Disable: you are not asked to enter the phone password when you switch on the phone.

SIM Lock

When the **SIM Lock** feature is enabled, your phone only works with the current SIM. You must enter the SIM lock code to unlock the SIM so you can use a different SIM card.

Once you have entered the lock code, you are asked to confirm your entry.

PIN Lock

When the **PIN Lock** feature is enabled, you must enter your PIN each time you switch on the phone. Consequently, any person does not have your PIN cannot use your phone without your approval.

Note: Before disabling the PIN Lock feature, you must enter your PIN.

The following options are available:

- **Enable**: you must enter the PIN each time the phone is switched on.
- Disable: the phone connects directly to the network when you switch it on.

Fixed Dialing Mode (SIM Dependent)

FDN (Fixed Dial Number) mode, if supported by your SIM card, allows you to restrict your outgoing calls to a limited set of phone numbers.

The following options are available:

- Enable: you can only call phone numbers stored in the Address Book. You must enter your PIN2.
- Disable: you can call any number

Note: Not all SIM cards have a PIN2. If your SIM card does not, this menu does not display.

Change Phone Password

The Change Phone Password feature allows you to change your current phone password to a new one. You must enter the current phone password before you can specify a new one.

Privacy Lock

Using this menu, you can lock your phone's contents requiring the phone's password to access the associated functions except placing a call.

Change PIN Code

This feature allows you to change your current PIN, provided that the PIN Lock feature is enabled. You must enter the current PIN before you can specify a new one.

Once you have entered a new PIN, you are asked to confirm it by entering it again.

Change PIN2 Code (SIM Dependent)

The Change PIN2 feature allows you to change your current PIN2 to a new one. You must enter the current PIN2 before you can specify a new one. Once you have entered a new PIN2, you are asked to confirm it by entering it again.

Memory Status

Memory Status allows you to check the amount of memory being used and available for Shared Memory, Memory Card, Text Message, Multimedia Message, Email, Push Message, My Stuff, Address Book, and Organizer. Use the Left or Right Navigation key to select a Memory tab.

Reset Settings

Resetting the phone performs a soft reset and restores all the factory defaults, including the ringer types and display settings. No data is erased on the device.

Phone Information

Phone Information, displays detail information about your phone. This feature is helpful in case you need to contact Customer Service. The following information is available:

- My Number
- Manufacturer
- Model
- Device ID
- Software Version
- Language
- Client Version

This section explains how to use multimedia files on your phone. You can take photos or record videos using the built-in camera. You can also enjoy listening to music files using the MP3 player application.

Using the Camera

Taking Photos

Note: When taking a photo in direct sunlight or in bright conditions, shadows may appear on the photo.

1. In Idle mode, press the key to turn on the camera.

Alternatively, in Idle mode, press the **Menu** (...) soft key to access Menu mode.

Use the **Navigation** keys to highlight **My Stuff** and press the **Select** soft key or the \times key.

Use the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key to highlight **Applications** and press the **Select** soft key or the X key.

Use the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key to highlight **Camera** and press the **Select** soft key or the \times key.

2. Adjust the image by aiming the camera at the subject.

- 3. Press the Options soft key to access camera options. See "Using Camera Options" on page 108 for more information. You can use the keypad to quickly change the camera options.
- 4. Press the X key to take the photo.

Note: Your camera produces photos in JPEG format.

5. Press the **Options** soft key to access camera options. See "Camera Options after a Photo is Taken" on page 111 for more information. You can use the keypad to quickly change the camera options.

Using Camera Options

In Capture mode, you can use various options for the camera by pressing the **Options** soft key. Highlight an option and press the **Select** soft key or the \times key. The following options are available:

- Record Video: allows you to switch from camera mode to video mode.
- Shooting Mode: allows you to take a photo in various modes. Once you change
 the mode, the corresponding indicator appears at the top right of the display.
 - Single Shot: allows you to take a photo in normal mode.
 - Multi Shot: allows you to take a series of action stills. Select the number of photos the camera will take. Choose 3 shot, 6 shots, 9 shots, or 12 shots.
 - Mosaic Shot: allows you to take 4 or 9 photos, and store them as one JPEG file.
- Effects: allows you to choose a custom color tone for your photo. Choose from the following Effects Mode.
 - Sepia: adds a sepia tint to the picture. This is the common orange tint that was
 popular in early photography.
 - Black & White: removes all color and display the picture as black and white.
 - Night: decrease black tint.
 - Normal: automatically adjust the picture for the best quality available.
- Frames: allows you to select a decorative frame overlay.
- Flash: allows you to choose the flash setting.
 - Off: deactivates the flash.
 - Shoot Only: activates the flash for one shot.
 - **Permanent**: activates the flash for all photos
- Timer: allows you to set a time delay before the camera takes the photo.
 - Off

- 3 sec.
- 5 sec.
- 10 sec
- Go to Photos: allows you to go directly to your Photo folder. The Photo folder contains the photos taken with your handset.
- Camera Settings: allows you to customize your camera settings. Choose the following options:
 - Size: allows you to set the image size. The icon for the selected image size appears on the capture screen
 - Photo Quality: allows you to select the picture quality setting.
 - Viewfinder: allows you to choose between Normal and Full screen view.
 - Spot Focus: allows you to select an exposure mode that sets the exposure based on the rectangle in the center of the viewfinder.
 - White Balance: allows you select the white balance based on changing conditions. White Balance ensures that colors are captured accurately (without any color cast) whatever lighting used.
 - ISO: allows you to set ISO to Auto, 100, 200, 400 or 800. The ISO value is a number inditing the cameras sensitivity to light. In bright light, set the ISO value
 - Shutter Sound: allows you to select a tone that will sound when taking a photo.
 - Zoom Sound: allow you to select a tone that will sound when zoom is used.
 - Brightness Sound: allow you to select a tone that will sound when the brightness is adjusted.
 - Save: allows you to set the default location for saved photos.
 - Multi Shot Speed: allows you to take a series of action stills. Select the capture speed, High Normal, or Low.
 - Default Name: allows you to enter a default name for photos.

Camera Shortcuts

Camera Options after a Photo is Taken

After you have taken a photo, you can use various options by pressing the Options soft key. Highlight an option and press the **Select** soft key or the X key. The following options are available:

- Take Another: launches the camera option and allows you to take another photo.
- Send via: allows you to send your photo as part of a Multimedia message, or Bluetooth device.
- Delete: deletes the photo.
- Set as: allows you to set the photo as your wallpaper or caller ID image for an Address Book entry.
- Rename: allows you to change the name of the photo.
- Go to Photos: allows you to go directly to your Photo folder. The Photo folder. contains the photos taken with your handset.
- Lock: allows you to protect the photo from being deleted.
- **Details**: shows the properties of the photo such as Size, Format, Date, Time, Resolution, and Forwarding.

Accessing the Photos Folder



Caller ID

You can prevent your phone number from being displayed on the phone of the person you are calling.

Note: Some networks do not allow you to change this setting.

- 2. Highlight **MEdia Net Home** and press the **Select** soft key or the X key. Your phone is connected to the network and loads the homepage of the Wireless Web service provider. The content of the start-up homepage depends on your Wireless Web service provider.
- 3. To scroll through the screen, use the Up and Down Navigation key.
- **4.** To exit the browser at any time, simply press the 60 kev.

Accessing a WAP Site

There are several ways to access a WAP site:

- Selecting a link on the browser.
- Using a bookmark item in the Favorites folder; use the Bookmarks option on the browser menu list or Favorites menu
- Entering a URL address manually; use the Go To URL option on the browser menu list or http:// menu.

Navigating the WAP Browser

- 1. To scroll through browser items, press the Up or Down Navigation key.
- To select a browser item, press the X key or press the Options soft key and choose Goto.

Note: To select a numbered item, press the corresponding numeric key.

- To return to the previous page, press the key, or press the Back soft key.
- 4. To access the browser Option list, press the **Option** soft key.
- To return to the start-up homepage, press and hold the key for more than two seconds, or press the **Options** soft key and select **Goto** Homepage and press the **Select** soft key or the key.

Entering Text in the WAP Browser

When you are prompted to enter text, the currently active text input mode is indicated on the screen in the upper right corner. To change the text input mode, press the velocities were less than the upper right corner.

The following modes are available:

- Upper-Case Alphabet Mode (A)
 allows you to enter upper-case characters.
- Lower-Case Alphabet Mode (a)
 allows you to enter lower-case characters.

Note: You can enter symbols in upper or lower case alphabet mode by pressing the key.

- T9 Mode (T9)

 allows you to enter characters by pressing one key per letter. In this mode, you can use only the ** key to display alternative words. To change case, press the ** key.
- Number Mode (1) allows you to enter numbers.

Selecting and Using Menu Options

Various menus are available when using the WAP Browser to navigate the Wireless Web.

To access menu options, press the **Options** soft key

The following options display:

- Go To: allows you to access the highlighted web link.
- Go: allows you to move forward or backward one page.
- Reload: reloads the current page.
- To Desktop View: allows you to change how the webpage is viewed in the display.
- Favorites: shows the bookmarks list. You can bookmark the current page or access previously book marked pages.
- Enter URL: allows you to manually enter the URL address of a web site. After entering the URL address, press the Go To soft key to access the site.
- Send URL via: allows you to send the URL as part of a Text message or Email.
- Save...: allows you to save an Image displayed on a web page or the Web Page.
- Saved Pages: stores web pages you have saved. Highlight a page and press the key to access the site. Press the **Options** soft key for additional options.
- History: stores URL of web pages you've visited. Highlight a URL address and press the X key to access the site. Press the Options soft key for additional options.
- Advanced: allows you to set additional WAP options.
 - Empty Cache: allows you empty the phone's temporary memory. The most recent WAP pages accessed are stored in Cache.
 - Empty Cookies: allows you to delete cookies.
 - Cookie Options: allows you to select to accept all cookies, reject all cookies, or you can select prompt to accept or reject cookies.
 - Preferences: allows you set WAP preferences.
 - Certificates: allows you to attach a security certificate to electronic messages.
 - Page Properties: displays details about the web page being viewed.
 - About Browser: displays details about the WAP browser.

Using Favorites

While navigating the WAP browser, you can bookmark the site to quickly and easily access it at a future time. The URL addresses of the book marked sites are stored in the Favorites folder, wherein you can use the 6-preset URL addresses and store your favorite URL addresses.

Accessing a WAP Site Using Favorites

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- 2. Highlight MEdia Net and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 3. Select Favorites.
- Select a bookmark item from the Favorite list and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 5. Select the option **Go**. You are accessed to the corresponding **WAP** site.

Storing a URL Address

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- 2. Highlight MEdia Net and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 3. Highlight Favorites and press the Select soft key or the 💢 key.
- 4. Press the Options soft key.
- Using the Up or Down Navigation key highlight Add Favorite and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 6. Enter a name for the bookmark and press the **Down** Navigation key.
- 7. Enter the URL address and press the Save soft key.
- 8. When you have finished, press the key.

Editing a Bookmark

- 1. From the Favorite list, select the bookmark you want to change.
- 2. Select Edit.
- 3. Change the address and the name, as you would when storing a new one.
- 4. When you have finished, press the key.

Deleting a Bookmark

- 1. From the Favorites list, select the bookmark you want to delete.
- 2. Select Delete.
- 3. Press the **Yes** soft key or the X key to confirm the deletion.
- 4. When you have finished, press the 🔨 key.

Downloading Multimedia Files

You can buy a variety of multimedia files, such as ringtones, graphics, applications, Multimedia contents, and so on from the WAP browser and download them to your phone's memory. Your phone has embedded links to the WAP site providing you with download services, preset by your service provider.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- 2. Cinqular Mall is highlighted, press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 3. Use the Up or Down Navigation key to highlight Shop Tones, Shop Games, Shop Graphics, Shop Multimedia, or Shop Applications, depending on the type of items you want to purchase.
 - To access the homepage of the online shopping mall, highlight **MEdia Net Home** and press the **Select** soft key or the X key.
- 4. Find the item you want to download and follow the instructions on the screen to complete your purchase.

Note: This content is delivered to you in Multimedia messages. You can retrieve the messages from the server and then save the items in your phone's memory, you cannot forward these messages to other people or add the saved items to a Multimedia message.

Clearing the Cache

The cache is the phone's temporary memory in which the most recently accessed WAP pages are stored. You can clear the cache at anytime.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access Menu mode.
- 2. Highlight MEdia Net and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 3. Using the **Up** or **Down** Navigation key highlight **Clear Cache** and press the **Select** soft key or the X key.
- 4. Press the **Yes** soft key or the **X** key to confirm deletion.
- 5. When you have finished, press the \infty key

Changing the WAP Profiles

You can set up 3 server profiles for the WAP browser.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** () soft key to access menu mode.
- 2. Use the Navigation keys to highlight MEdia Net and press the Select soft kev or the X kev.

- Using the Up or Down Navigation key scroll to Browser Profiles and press the Select soft key or the X key.
- 4. Highlight the profile you want and press the **Options** soft key. The following options appear in the display:
- Save: selects the highlighted profile.
- Edit: allows you to edit the highlighted profile.
- New: allows you to create a new profile.
- Rename: allows you to rename the highlighted profile.
- View: allows you to view the selected profile
- Delete: deletes the highlighted profile.
- Restore: restores the default settings of the profile.
- Using the Up or Down Navigation key, highlight Edit and press the Select soft key or the X key.
 - For each profile, the following options are available:
- Set Name: enter a name that you wish to assign to the HTTP or WAP proxy server.
- Access Name: enter the access server name.
- Auth Type: select a connection type.
- User ID: enter the User ID required to connect to the network.
- **Password**: enter the password required to connect to the network.
- **Protocol**: select a web page format. Select HTTP or WAP.
- Home URL: enter the address of your startup homepage. When the default homepage displays, you can delete it by pressing and holding the key.
- Proxy Address/Gateway Address: enter the WAP Gateway IP Address or HTTP Proxy IP Address required to connect to the Internet.

Note: The Proxy Address/Gateway Address field is determined by your Protocol selection.

- Secure Connection/Port: enter the Proxy port required to connect to the Internet.
- Linger Time (Sec.): allows you to enter a time that will disconnect the WAP browser when there is no activity.

 Advance Settings: allows you to enable and enter the server Static IP address, Static DNS address and select a Traffic Class.

Note: WAP settings may vary depending on the service provider.

6. When you have finished editing the profile, press the Save soft key or the 💢 key to save your changes.

Health and Safety Information

Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals

Certification Information (SAR)

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. government. These FCC exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations, the National Counsel on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless phones to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg). The FCC exposure limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value.

This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wirless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Before a new model phone is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the exposure limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model phone are performed in positions and locations (e.g. at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC. For body worn operation, this phone has been tested and meets FCC RF exposure guidelines when used with an accessory that contains no metal and that positions the handset a minimum of 1.8 cm from the body. Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this mobile phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. The maximum SAR values for this model phone as reported to the FCC are:

SAR information on this and other model phones can be viewed on-line at www.fcc.gov/oet/fccid. To find information that pertains to a particular model phone, this site uses the phone FCC ID number which is usually printed somewhere on the

case of the phone. Sometimes it may be necessary to remove the battery pack to find the number. Once you have the FCC ID number for a particular phone, follow the instructions on the website and it should provide values for typical or maximum SAR for a particular phone. Consumer Information on Wireless Phones

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published a series of Questions and Answers for consumers relating to radio frequency (RF) exposure from wireless phones. The FDA publication includes the following information:

What kinds of phones are the subject of this update?

The term wireless phone refers here to hand-held wireless phones with built-in antennas, often called "cell," "mobile," or "PCS" phones. These types of wireless phones can expose the user to measurable radio frequency energy (RF) because of the short distance between the phone and the user's head. These RF exposures are limited by Federal Communications Commission safety guidelines that were developed with the advice of FDA and other federal health and safety agencies. When the phone is located at greater distances from the user, the exposure to RF is drastically lower because a person's RF exposure decreases rapidly with increasing distance from the source. The so-called "cordless phones," which have a base unit connected to the telephone wiring in a house, typically operate at far lower power levels, and thus produce RF exposures well within the FCC's compliance limits.

Do wireless phones pose a health hazard?

The available scientific evidence does not show that any health problems are associated with using wireless phones. There is no proof, however, that wireless phones are absolutely safe. Wireless phones emit low levels of radio frequency energy (RF) in the microwave range while being used. They also emit very low levels of RF when in the stand-by mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects. Many studies of low level RF exposures have not found any biological effects. Some studies have suggested that some biological effects may occur, but such findings have not been confirmed by additional research. In some cases, other researchers have had difficulty in reproducing those studies, or in determining the reasons for inconsistent results.

What is FDA's role concerning the safety of wireless phones?

Under the law, FDA does not review the safety of radiation-emitting consumer products such as wireless phones before they can be sold, as it does with new drugs

or medical devices. However, the agency has authority to take action if wireless phones are shown to emit radio frequency energy (RF) at a level that is hazardous to the user. In such a case, FDA could require the manufacturers of wireless phones to notify users of the health hazard and to repair, replace or recall the phones so that the hazard no longer exists.

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, FDA has urged the wireless phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- "Support needed research into possible biological effects of RF of the type emitted by wireless phones;
- "Design wireless phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user that is not necessary for device function; and
- "Cooperate in providing users of wireless phones with the best possible information on possible effects of wireless phone use on human health.

FDA belongs to an interagency working group of the federal agencies that have responsibility for different aspects of RF safety to ensure coordinated efforts at the federal level. The following agencies belong to this working group:

- "National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health
- "Environmental Protection Agency
- "Federal Communications Commission
- "Occupational Safety and Health Administration
- "National Telecommunications and Information Administration.

The National Institutes of Health participates in some interagency working group activities, as well.

FDA shares regulatory responsibilities for wireless phones with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). All phones that are sold in the United States must comply with FCC safety guidelines that limit RF exposure. FCC relies on FDA and other health agencies for safety questions about wireless phones.

FCC also regulates the base stations that the wireless phone networks rely upon. While these base stations operate at higher power than do the wireless phones themselves, the RF exposures that people get from these base stations are typically thousands of times lower than those they can get from wireless phones. Base stations are thus not the primary subject of the safety questions discussed in this document.

What are the results of the research done already?

The research done thus far has produced conflicting results, and many studies have suffered from flaws in their research methods. Animal experiments investigating the effects of radio frequency energy (RF) exposures characteristic of wireless phones have yielded conflicting results that often cannot be repeated in other laboratories. A few animal studies, however, have suggested that low levels of RF could accelerate the development of cancer in laboratory animals. However, many of the studies that showed increased tumor development used animals that had been genetically engineered or treated with cancer-causing chemicals so as to be pre-disposed to develop cancer in absence of RF exposure. Other studies exposed the animals to RF for up to 22 hours per day. These conditions are not similar to the conditions under which people use wireless phones, so we don't know with certainty what the results of such studies mean for human health.

Three large epidemiology studies have been published since December 2000. Between them, the studies investigated any possible association between the use of wireless phones and primary brain cancer, glioma, meningioma, or acoustic neuroma, tumors of the brain or salivary gland, leukemia, or other cancers. None of the studies demonstrated the existence of any harmful health effects from wireless phones RF exposures. However, none of the studies can answer questions about long-term exposures, since the average period of phone use in these studies was around three years.

What research is needed to decide whether RF exposure from wireless phones poses a health risk?

A combination of laboratory studies and epidemiological studies of people actually using wireless phones would provide some of the data that are needed. Lifetime animal exposure studies could be completed in a few years. However, very large numbers of animals would be needed to provide reliable proof of a cancer promoting effect if one exists. Epidemiological studies can provide data that is directly applicable to human populations, but ten or more years' follow-up may be needed to provide answers about some health effects, such as cancer. This is because the interval between the time of exposure to a cancer-causing agent and the time tumors develop - if they do - may be many, many years. The interpretation of epidemiological studies is hampered by difficulties in measuring actual RF exposure during day-to-day use of wireless phones. Many factors affect this measurement, such as the angle at which the phone is held, or which model of phone is used.

What is FDA doing to find out more about the possible health effects of wireless phone RF?

FDA is working with the U.S. National Toxicology Program and with groups of investigators around the world to ensure that high priority animal studies are conducted to address important questions about the effects of exposure to radio frequency energy (RF).

FDA has been a leading participant in the World Health Organization international Electromagnetic Fields (EMF) Project since its inception in 1996. An influential result of this work has been the development of a detailed agenda of research needs that has driven the establishment of new research programs around the world. The Project has also helped develop a series of public information documents on EMF issues.

FDA and Cellular Telecommunications & Internet Association (CTIA) have a formal Cooperative Research and Development Agreement (CRADA) to do research on wireless phone safety. FDA provides the scientific oversight, obtaining input from experts in government, industry, and academic organizations. CTIA-funded research is conducted through contracts to independent investigators. The initial research will include both laboratory studies and studies of wireless phone users. The CRADA will also include a broad assessment of additional research needs in the context of the latest research developments around the world.

What steps can I take to reduce my exposure to radio frequency energy from my wireless phone?

If there is a risk from these products - and at this point we do not know that there is - it is probably very small. But if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your exposure to radio frequency energy (RF). Since time is a key factor in how much exposure a person receives, reducing the amount of time spent using a wireless phone will reduce RF exposure.

"If you must conduct extended conversations by wireless phone every day, you
could place more distance between your body and the source of the RF, since the
exposure level drops off dramatically with distance. For example, you could use a
headset and carry the wireless phone away from your body or use a wireless
phone connected to a remote antenna.

Again, the scientific data do not demonstrate that wireless phones are harmful. But if you are concerned about the RF exposure from these products, you can use measures like those described above to reduce your RF exposure from wireless phone use.

What about children using wireless phones?

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to users of wireless phones, including children and teenagers. If you want to take steps to lower exposure to radio frequency energy (RF), the measures described above would apply to children and teenagers using wireless phones. Reducing the time of wireless phone use and increasing the distance between the user and the RF source will reduce RF exposure.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using wireless phones at all. For example, the government in the United Kingdom distributed leaflets containing such a recommendation in December 2000. They noted that no evidence exists that using a wireless phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit wireless phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

Do hands-free kits for wireless phones reduce risks from exposure to RF emissions?

Since there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from wireless phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used with wireless phones for convenience and comfort. These systems reduce the absorption of RF energy in the head because the phone, which is the source of the RF emissions, will not be placed against the head. On the other hand, if the phone is mounted against the waist or other part of the body during use, then that part of the body will absorb more RF energy. Wireless phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet safety requirements regardless of whether they are used against the head or against the body. Either configuration should result in compliance with the safety limit.

Do wireless phone accessories that claim to shield the head from RF radiation work?

Since there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from wireless phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories that claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone. Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hand-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption. In February 2002, the Federal trade Commission (FTC) charged two companies that

sold devices that claimed to protect wireless phone users from radiation with making false and unsubstantiated claims. According to FTC, these defendants lacked a reasonable basis to substantiate their claim.

What about wireless phone interference with medical equipment?

Radio frequency energy (RF) from wireless phones can interact with some electronic devices. For this reason, FDA helped develop a detailed test method to measure electromagnetic interference (EMI) of implanted cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators from wireless telephones. This test method is now part of a standard sponsored by the Association for the Advancement of Medical instrumentation (AAMI). The final draft, a joint effort by FDA, medical device manufacturers, and many other groups, was completed in late 2000. This standard will allow manufacturers to ensure that cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators are safe from wireless phone EMI. FDA has tested wireless phones and helped develop a voluntary standard sponsored by the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE). This standard specifies test methods and performance requirements for hearing aids and wireless phones so that no interference occurs when a person uses a compatible phone and a compatible hearing aid at the same time. This standard was approved by the IEEE in 2000.

FDA continues to monitor the use of wireless phones for possible interactions with other medical devices. Should harmful interference be found to occur, FDA will conduct testing to assess the interference and work to resolve the problem.

Road Safety

Your wireless phone gives you the powerful ability to communicate by voice, almost anywhere, anytime. But an important responsibility accompanies the benefits of wireless phones, one that every user must uphold.

When driving a car, driving is your first responsibility. When using your wireless phone behind the wheel of a car, practice good common sense and remember the following tips:

- Get to know your wireless phone and its features, such as speed dial and redial. If available, these features help you to place your call without taking your attention off the road.
- When available, use a hands-free device. If possible, add an additional layer of convenience and safety to your wireless phone with one of the many hands free accessories available today.
- Position your wireless phone within easy reach. Be able to access your wireless phone without removing your eyes from the road. If you get an incoming call at an inconvenient time, let your voice mail answer it for you.
- 4. Let the person you are speaking with know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions. Rain, sleet, snow, ice and even heavy traffic can be hazardous.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving. Jotting down a "to do" list or flipping through your address book takes attention away from your primary responsibility, driving safely.
- 6. Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic. Try to plan calls when your car will be stationary. If you need to make a call while moving, dial only a few numbers, check the road and your mirrors, then continue.
- 7. Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting. Make people you are talking with aware you are driving and suspend conversations that have the potential to divert your attention from the road

- 8. Use your wireless phone to call for help. Dial 9-1-1 or other local emergency number in the case of fire, traffic accident or medical emergencies. Remember, it is a free call on your wireless phone!
- 9. Use your wireless phone to help others in emergencies. If you see an auto accident, crime in progress or other serious emergency where lives are in danger, call 9-1-1 or other local emergency number, as you would want others to do for you.
- 10. Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless assistance number when necessary. If you see a broken-down vehicle posing no serious hazard, a broken traffic signal, a minor traffic accident where no one appears injured, or a vehicle you know to be stolen, call roadside assistance or other special non-emergency number.

Operating Environment

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area and always switch your phone off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger. When connecting the phone or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

As with other mobile radio transmitting equipment, users are advised that for the satisfactory operation of the equipment and

for the safety of personnel, it is recommended that the equipment should only be used in the normal operating position (held to your ear with the antenna pointing over your shoulder).

Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless phone. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Pacemakers 1 4 1

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm (6 inches) be maintained between a wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker.

These recommendations are consistent with the independent research and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research.

Persons with pacemakers:

- should always keep the phone more than 15 cm (6 inches) from their pacemaker when the phone is switched on.
- should not carry the phone in a breast pocket.
- should use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize potential interference.

If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, switch your phone off immediately.

Hearing Aids

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may wish to consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical devices, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information. Switch your phone off in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding your vehicle. You should also consult the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Posted Facilities

Switch your phone off in any facility where posted notices require you to do so.

Potentially Explosive Environments

Switch your phone off when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.

Users are advised to switch the phone off while at a refueling point (service station). Users are reminded of the need to observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots

(fuel storage and distribution areas), chemical plants or where blasting operations are in progress.

Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often but not always clearly marked. They include below deck on boats, chemical transfer or storage facilities, vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane), areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust or metal powders, and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.

Emergency Calls

This phone, like any wireless phone, operates using radio signals, wireless and landline networks as well as user-programmed functions, which cannot quarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you should never rely solely on any wireless phone for essential communications (medical emergencies, for example).

Remember, to make or receive any calls the phone must be switched on and in a service area with adequate signal strength. Emergency calls may not be possible on all wireless phone networks or when certain network services and/or phone features are in use. Check with local service providers.

To make an emergency call:

- 1. If the phone is not on, switch it on.
- 2. Key in the emergency number for your present location (for example, 911 or other official emergency number). Emergency numbers vary by location.
- Press the \(\structure \) key.

If certain features are in use (call barring, for example), you may first need to deactivate those features before you can make an emergency call. Consult this document and your local cellular service provider.

When making an emergency call, remember to give all the necessary information as accurately as possible. Remember that your phone may be the only means of communication at the scene of an accident; do not cut off the call until given permission to do so.

Restricting Children's access to your Phone

Your phone is not a toy. Children should not be allowed to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone or make calls that increase your phone bill.

FCC Notice and Cautions

FCC Notice

The phone may cause TV or radio interference if used in close proximity to receiving equipment. The FCC can require you to stop using the phone if such interference cannot be eliminated.

Vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane) must comply with the National Fire Protection Standard (NFPA-58). For a copy of this standard, contact the National Fire Protection Association, One Batterymarch Park, Quincy, MA 02269. Attn.: Publication Sales Division.

Cautions

Any changes or modifications to your phone not expressly approved in this document could void your warranty for this equipment, and void your authority to operate this equipment. Only use approved batteries, antennas and chargers. The use of any unauthorized accessories may be dangerous and void the phone warranty if said accessories cause damage or a defect to the phone.

Although your phone is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending or sitting on it.

Other Important Safety Information

- Only qualified personnel should service the phone or install the phone in a vehicle. Faulty installation or service may be dangerous and may invalidate any warranty applicable to the device.
- Check regularly that all wireless phone equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating properly.
- Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts or accessories.
- For vehicles equipped with an air bag, remember that an air bag inflates with great force. Do not place objects, including both installed or portable wireless equipment in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.
- Switch your phone off before boarding an aircraft. The use of wireless phone in aircraft is illegal and may be dangerous to the aircraft's operation.
- Failure to observe these instructions may lead to the suspension or denial of telephone services to the offender, or legal action, or both.

Product Performance

Getting the Most Out of Your Signal Reception

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your phone informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal.

If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

Understanding the Power Save Feature

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. If your phone is active, it periodically rechecks service availability or you can check it yourself by pressing any key.

Anytime the Power Save feature is activated, a message displays on the screen. When a signal is found, your phone returns to standby mode.

Understanding How Your Phone Operates

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from 0.006 watts to 0.2 watts in digital mode.

Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

For the best care of your phone, only authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

There are several simple guidelines to operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- Hold the phone with the antenna raised, fully-extended and over your shoulder.
- Try not to hold, bend or twist the phone's antenna.
- Don't use the phone if the antenna is damaged.
- Speak directly into the phone's receiver.
- Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone
 does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it is
 inoperable, call Customer Care for service.

Availability of Various Features/Ring Tones

Many services and features are network dependent and may require additional subscription and/or usage charges. Not all features are available for purchase or use

in all areas. Downloadable Ring Tones may be available at an additional cost. Other conditions and restrictions may apply. See your service provider for additional information.

Battery Standby and Talk Time

Standby and talk times will vary depending on phone usage patterns and conditions. Battery power consumption depends on factors such as network configuration, signal strength, operating temperature, features selected, frequency of calls, and voice. data, and other application usage patterns.

Battery Precautions

- Avoid dropping the cell phone. Dropping it, especially on a hard surface, can
 potentially cause damage to the phone and battery. If you suspect damage to the
 phone or battery, take it to a service center for inspection.
- Never use any charger or battery that is damaged in any way.
- Use the battery only for its intended purpose.
- If you use the phone near the network's base station, it uses less power; talk and standby time are greatly affected by the signal strength on the cellular network and the parameters set by the network operator.
- Follow battery usage, storage and charging guidelines found in the user's guide.
- Battery charging time depends on the remaining battery charge and the type of battery and charger used. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will gradually wear out. When the operation time (talk time and standby time) is noticeably shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.
- If left unused, a fully charged battery will discharge itself over time.
- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and recharge your battery only with Samsung-approved chargers. When a charger is not in use, disconnect it from the power source. Do not leave the battery connected to a charger for more than a week, since overcharging may shorten its life.
- Do not use incompatible cell phone batteries and chargers. Some Web sites and second-hand dealers, not associated with reputable manufacturers and carriers, might be selling incompatible or even counterfeit batteries and chargers.
 Consumers should purchase manufacturer or carrier recommended products and accessories. If unsure about whether a replacement battery or charger is compatible, contact the manufacturer of the battery or charger.
- Extreme temperatures will affect the charging capacity of your battery: it may require cooling or warming first.
- Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a car in summer or winter conditions, as you will reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery.

Always try to keep the battery at room temperature. A phone with a hot or cold battery may temporarily not work, even when the battery is fully charged. Li-ion batteries are particularly affected by temperatures below 0 °C (32 °F).

- Do not place the phone in areas that may get very hot, such as on or near a cooking surface, cooking appliance, iron, or radiator.
- Do not get your phone or battery wet. Even though they will dry and appear to operate normally, the circuitry could slowly corrode and pose a safety hazard.
- Do not short-circuit the battery. Accidental short-circuiting can occur when a metallic object (coin, clip or pen) causes a direct connection between the + and terminals of the battery (metal strips on the battery), for example when you carry a spare battery in a pocket or bag. Short-circuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the object causing the short-circuiting.
- Do not permit a battery out of the phone to come in contact with metal objects, such as coins, keys or iewelry.
- Do not crush, puncture or put a high degree of pressure on the battery as this can cause an internal short-circuit, resulting in overheating.
- Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations. In some areas, the disposal of batteries in household or business trash may be prohibited. For safe disposal options for Li-lon batteries, contact your nearest Samsung authorized service center. Always recycle. Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.

Care and Maintenance

Your phone is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill any warranty obligations and allow you to enjoy this product for many years

- Keep the phone and all its parts and accessories out of the reach of small children's.
- Keep the phone dry. Precipitation, humidity and liquids contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits.
- Do not use the phone with a wet hand. Doing so may cause an electric shock to you or damage to the phone.
- Do not use or store the phone in dusty, dirty areas, as its moving parts may be damaged.
- Do not store the phone in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries, and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the phone in cold areas. When the phone warms up to its normal operating temperature, moisture can form inside the phone, which may damage the phone's electronic circuit boards.

- Do not drop, knock or shake the phone. Rough handling can break internal circuit hoards
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents or strong detergents to clean the phone. Wipe it with a soft cloth slightly dampened in a mild soap-and-water solution.
- Do not paint the phone. Paint can clog the device's moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Do not put the phone in or on heating devices, such as a microwave oven, a stove or a radiator. The phone may explode when overheated.
- Use only the supplied or an approved replacement antenna. Unauthorized antennas or modified accessories may damage the phone and violate regulations governing radio devices.
- If the phone, battery, charger or any accessory is not working properly, take it to your nearest qualified service facility. The personnel there will assist you, and if necessary, arrange for service.
