

Safety precautions

Information for parents

Please read the operating instructions and safety precautions carefully before use. Explain the content and the hazards associated with using the phone to your children.



Remember to comply with legal requirements and local restrictions when using the phone. For example in airplanes, gas stations, hospitals or while driving.



Cell phones can interfere with the functioning of medical devices such as hearing aids or pacemakers. Keep the phone at least 20 cm (8 inches) away from pacemakers. When using the cell phone, hold it to the ear farther away from the pacemaker. For more information, consult your doctor.



The ringtones, message tones and handsfree talking are reproduced through the loudspeaker. Do not hold the phone to your ear when it rings or when you have switched on the handsfree function. Otherwise you risk serious permanent damage to your hearing.



Do not place the phone close to electromagnetic data carriers such as credit cards or floppy disks. The information stored on them could be lost.



Use only original Siemens batteries (100 % mercury-free) and charging devices. Otherwise you risk serious damage to health and property. The battery could explode, for instance.



Do not use an optical magnifier to look at the activated infrared interface [Class 1 LED product (classification as per IEC 60825-1)].



Small parts such as the SIM card, sealing stop, lens ring, and lens cap can be dismantled and swallowed by small children. The phone must therefore be stored out of the reach of small children.



The line voltage specified on the power supply unit (V) must not be exceeded. Otherwise the charging device may be destroyed.

The power supply must be plugged into an easily accessible AC wall outlet when charging the battery. The only way to turn off the charging device after charging the battery is to unplug it.



You may only open the phone to replace the battery (100% mercury-free) or SIM card. Do not open the battery under any circumstances. All other changes to this device are strictly prohibited and will invalidate the guarantee.

Please dispose of unwanted batteries and phones as permitted by the laws in your country.




The phone may cause interference in the vicinity of TV sets, radios and PCs.



Use only Siemens original accessories. This will avoid potential risks to health or property and ensure compliance with all relevant regulations.

Improper use will invalidate the warranty! These safety instructions also apply to Siemens original accessories.

As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in positions other than the head, such as on the body. In this case, during data transfer (GPRS) a separation distance of 1.5 cm is required.

Getting started

Inserting the SIM card/ battery

The service provider supplies you with a SIM card on which all the important data for your line is stored. If the SIM card has been delivered in credit-card size, snap the smaller segment out and remove any rough edges.

Additional information

Please switch off your phone before removing the battery!

1.8-V and 3-V SIM cards are supported. Please contact your service provider if you have an older card.

SIM card problemspage 120

 Press and hold down the catch ①, then push cover towards the front in the direction indicated by the arrow ②.



 Place the SIM card in front of the slot with the contact surface facing downwards. Then press the SIM card slightly to push it in ③ (ensure that the chamfered corner is in the correct position).



 Insert the battery sideways into the phone ④, then press it downwards ⑤ until it engages.



- To remove, press the retaining tab on the side of the battery, then lift the battery out.
- Place the battery cover, then push it towards the front (6), until it clicks into place.



Charging the battery

Charging the battery

The battery is not fully charged when delivered. Plug charger cable into the bottom of the phone, plug power supply unit into a wall outlet and charge for at least **two hours**.

As an alternative, the battery can be charged via the USB port (see Accessories, page 127).

Charging time

A discharged battery is fully charged after about 2 hours. Charging is only possible within a temperature range of +5 °C to 45 °C (41 °F to 113 °F). If the temperature rises/falls 5 °C (9 °F) above/below this range, the charge symbol flashes a warning. The line voltage specified on the power supply unit must not be exceeded.

Operating time

The operating time depends on the conditions of use. Extreme temperatures considerably reduce the phone's standby time. Avoid leaving the phone in the sun or on a heater. Call time: 100 to 330 minutes Standby time: 60 to 300 hours

Charge icon not visible

If the battery is fully discharged, the charge icon is not immediately visible when the power supply is plugged in. It will appear after up to two hours. In this case, the battery is fully charged after 3 to 4 hours.

Only use the plug-in power supply included in the delivery!

Display while in service

Charge level display during operation (empty-full):



A beep sounds when the battery is nearly flat. The charge level of the battery is only displayed correctly after an uninterrupted charging/discharging cycle. You should therefore **not remove the battery unnecessarily** and where possible **not finish the charging process prematurely**.

Additional information

The power supply unit heats up when used for long periods. This is normal and not dangerous.

If the battery is removed for longer than 30 seconds, the clock must be reset.

Switching on/off/entering PIN

The SIM card can be protected with a 4- to 8-digit PIN.



Enter the PIN using the number keys. The characters **** appear to ensure nobody can read your PIN on the display. Correction with \mathbb{C} .

Emergency number (SOS)

Only to be used in real emergencies!

By pressing the SOS softkey, you can make an emergency call on any network without a SIM card and without entering a PIN (not available in all countries).

Switching on your phone for the first time

Time/date

When switching on your phone for the first time, set the clock so that it displays the correct time. You will not have to make this setting again.



Press this key, then select Change.

First enter the date (day/ month/year), then the time (24 hours, including seconds).



Press this key. The time and date are updated.

Time zones

- Set the time zone you are in.
- Select a city in the desired time zone .
- Options Use Set time zone to save.

Copying SIM addresses

The first time the SIM card is inserted, the entries on it can be copied to the Addressbook. Please **do not interrupt this procedure**. During this time, **do not accept any incoming calls**. Follow the instructions in the display.

You can also copy data from the SIM card at a later time (page 35).

General instructions

Standby mode

The phone is in **standby mode** and is **ready for use** once the name of the service provider appears on the display.



Press and **hold** the On/Off/ End key to return to standby mode from any situation.

Signal strength

Strong signal strength.

A weak signal reduces the call quality and may lead to loss of the connection. Change your location.

Digital Rights Mgmt. (DRM)

Remember that your telephone has digital rights management. The use of downloaded pictures, sounds or applications can be restricted by the suppliers, e.g. copy protection, use for a limited period of time only, number of times it can be used, etc. (see also page 74).

Security

The phone and SIM card are protected against misuse by several security codes.

Keep these confidential numbers in a safe place where you can access them again if required.

PIN code

PIN	Protects your SIM card (person- al identification number).
PIN2	This is needed to set the charge detail display and to access additional features on special SIM cards.
PUK PUK2	Key code. Used to unlock SIM cards after the wrong PIN has been entered repeatedly.
Phone code	Protects your phone. Must be entered at the first security setting.

PIN control

The PIN is usually requested each time the phone is switched on. You can deactivate this feature but you risk unauthorized use of the phone. Some service providers do not permit deactivating the control.

You define the phone code (4–8 digits) when you call up a phone-code protected feature for the first time (e.g. Direct call, page 26). It is then valid for all phone-code protected features.

Following the third unsuccessful attempt, access to the phone code and the features that use it is denied. Contact Siemens Service (page 122).

Clearing SIM card blocking

If the PIN is entered incorrectly three times, the SIM card is blocked. Enter the PUK (MASTER PIN) provided by your service provider with the SIM card in accordance with the instructions. If the PUK (MASTER PIN) has been lost, please contact your service provider.

Preventing accidental activation

Even if PIN use is deactivated (page 16) confirmation is required to switch on the phone.

This prevents accidental activation of the phone, e.g. when you are carrying it in a bag or traveling in an aircraft.

Connecting to PCs

You can connect your phone using Infrared or a data cable (accessories, page 127) to a PC. The PC program MPM (Mobile Phone Manager, page 116) enables you to back up data on your PC and to synchronize the Addressbook with Outlook®, Lotus Notes™ and other Siemens phones (as well as Gigaset). T9 word suggestions

If several options are found in the dictionary for a key sequence (a word), the most probable is displayed first. If the word you want has not been recognized, the next suggestion from T9 may be correct.

The word must highlighted be displayed. Then press

again. The displayed word is replaced with a different word. If this word is also incorrect, press

again. Press until the correct word is displayed.

If the word you want is not in the dictionary, it can also be written without T9.

To add a word to the dictionary:

The last suggestion is deleted and the word may now be entered without T9 support. Press Save to add it automatically to the dictionary.

Correct a word

- Move left or right, word by word, until the required word is highlighted.
- Scroll through the T9 word suggestions again.

Additional information

Within a "T9" word, individual letters may not be edited without first removing the T9 status. In most cases it is better to rewrite the complete word.



In this case, at data transfer (GPRS) a separation distance of 1.5 cm is required. As SAR is measured utilizing the device's highest transmitting power, the actual SAR of this device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to automatic changes to the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum level required to reach the network.

The World Health Organization has stated that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for the use of mobile devices. They note that if you nevertheless want to reduce your exposure then you can do so by limiting the length of calls or using a 'hands-free' device to keep the mobile phone away from the head and body.
