In order to minimise creasing of

synthetic fabrics only press Rinse Hold. (Programmes 🗐 , 📵 and 🔟 ). The machines will then stop during the final rinse, leaving the clothes immersed in water until you are ready to spin them dry, the Programme Selector, will stop at the green symbol ➤ 🛋 .


### **Economy Wash**

For lightly soiled washing; saves electricity and time.

Economy Wash switches off the machine's own water heater so your clothes are washed at the temperature of the water coming in from your hot and cold water tanks. This saves you electricity, but can mean a cooler wash, so you should only use Economy Wash for lightly soiled clothes, not for really dirty clothes.

## Washing Detergent

### Washing powder Which one to use?

Use any low suds automatic powder. Non-automatic powders reduce washing performance and can cause the machine to overflow.

Your machine has been specially developed to take advantage of the cooler wash performance of the new low temperature biological powders. Hotpoint recommends Biological Persil Automatic.

### How much to use

Use the right amount of powder; too little won't get the clothes clean, and too much is a waste.





## Liquid Detergent

To dispense all liquid detergents more efficiently you can use the Hotpoint Liquid Detergent Dispenser (Part No. 9003) which is obtainable from your nearest Hotpoint Spares Centre (see back page) using the order form enclosed. You should place the Liquid Detergent Dispenser in the right hand section of the dispenser drawer.



When using liquid detergents in their own dispensers, follow manufacturer's instructions.

### **Fabric Conditioner**


