WHEELCAIR USER

As a manufacturer of wheelchairs, Invacare endeavors to supply a wide variety of wheelchairs to meet many needs of the end user. However, final selection of the type of wheelchair to be used by an individual rests solely with the user and his/her healthcare professional capable of making such a selection.

WHEELCHAIR TIE-DOWN RESTRAINTS AND SEAT POSITIONING STRAPS

Invacare recommends that wheelchair users NOT be transported in vehicles of any kind while in wheelchairs. As of this date, the Department of Transportation has not approved any tie-down systems for transportation of a user while in a wheelchair, in a moving vehicle of any type.

It is Invacare's position that users of wheelchairs should be transferred into appropriate seating in vehicles for transportation and use be made of the restraints made available by the auto industry. Invacare cannot and does not recommend any wheelchair transportation systems.

AS REGARDS RESTRAINTS - SEAT POSITIONING STRAPS - IT IS THE OBLIGATION OF THE DME DEALER, THERAPISTS AND OTHER HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS TO DETERMINE IF A SEATPOSITIONING STRAP IS REQUIRED TO ENSURE THE SAFE OPERATION OF THIS EQUIPMENT BY THE USER. SERIOUS INJURY CAN OCCUR IN THE EVENT OF A FALL FROM A WHEELCHAIR.

SAFETY SUMMARY

OPERATING INFORMATION

WARNING

Unless otherwise noted, all service and adjustments should be performed while the wheelchair is unoccupied.

After ANY adjustments, repair or service and BEFORE use, make sure all attaching hardware is tightened securely - otherwise injury or damage may result.

To determine and establish your particular safety limits, practice bending, reaching and transferring activities in several combinations in the presence of a qualified health care professional BE-FORE attempting active use of the wheelchair.

DO NOT attempt to reach objects if you have to move forward in the seat.

DO NOT attempt to reach objects if you have to pick them up from the floor by reaching down between your knees.

DO NOT lean over the top of the back upholstery to reach objects from behind as this may cause the wheelchair to tip over.

DO NOT shift your weight or sitting position toward the direction you are reaching as the wheel-chair may tip over.

DO NOT tilt the wheelchair without assistance.

DO NOT use an escalator to move a wheelchair between floors. Serious bodily injury may occur.

DO NOT attempt to stop a moving wheelchair with the wheel locks. WHEEL LOCKS ARE NOT BRAKES.

Before attempting to transfer in or out of the wheelchair, every precaution should be taken to reduce the gap distance. Turn both casters toward the object you are transferring onto. When transferring to and from the wheelchair, ALWAYS ENGAGE BOTH WHEEL LOCKS.

DO NOT operate on roads, streets or highways.

DO NOT climb, go up or down ramps or traverse slopes greater than 9°.

DO NOT attempt to move up or down an incline with a water, ice or oil film.

DO NOT attempt to ride over curbs or obstacles. Doing so may cause your wheelchair to tip over and cause bodily harm or damage to the wheelchair.

DO NOT use unauthorized parts, accessories, or adapters other than those authorized by Invacare.

DO NOT attempt to lift a wheelchair by lifting on any removable (detachable) parts. Lifting by means of any removable (detachable) parts of a wheelchair may result in injury to the user or damage to the wheelchair.

DO NOT stand on the frame of the wheelchair.

NON-RECLINERS ONLY: Anti-tippers MUST BE attached at all times. Inasmuch as the anti-tippers are an option on this wheelchair (You may order with or without the anti-tippers), Invacare strongly recommends ordering the anti-tippers as an additional safeguard for the wheelchair user.

Anti-tippers MUST be fully engaged. Ensure that the release button of the anti-tipper fully protrudes out of the hole on the bottom of the wheelchair frame.

Ensure both anti-tippers are adjusted to the same height.

When changing the seat-to-floor height, the height of the anti-tippers must be adjusted as well.

DO NOT use the footplate as a platform when getting in or out of the wheelchair.

ALWAYS wear your SEAT POSITIONING STRAP. Inasmuch as the SEAT POSITIONING STRAP is an option on this wheelchair (You may order with or without the SEAT POSITIONING STRAP), Invacare strongly recommends ordering the SEAT POSITIONING STRAP as an additional safeguard for the wheelchair user.

OPERATING INFORMATION

WARNING

TIRE PRESSURE

DO NOT use your wheelchair unless it has the proper tire pressure (p.s.i.). DO NOT overinflate the tires. Failure to follow these suggestions may cause the tire to explode and cause bodily harm. Recommended tire pressure is listed on the side of the tire.

Replacement of a pneumatic tire or tube MUST be performed by a qualified technician.

WEIGHT TRAINING

Invacare DOES NOT recommend the use of its wheelchairs as a weight training apparatus. Invacare wheelchairs have NOT been designed or tested as a seat for any kind of weight training. If occupant uses said wheelchair as a weight training apparatus, Invacare shall NOT be liable for bodily injury and the warranty is void.

WEIGHT LIMITATION

The Tracer DLX / SX / SX RECLINER / TITAN wheelchairs have a weight limitation of 250 lbs.

TRACER RECLINER ONLY:

WARNING

ALWAYS make sure that the wheelchair is stable BEFORE using the recliner.

Anti-tippers MUST BE attached at all times.

ALWAYS engage both wheel locks while reclining or inclining (reverse recline) the wheelchair.

Make sure detent pin of the spreader bar is completely extended through the hole in the handle BEFORE using the wheelchair.

Make sure both back canes are at the same angle BEFORE releasing the handles of the recline mechanisms.

Mount the rear wheels in the Rear Wheel Offset Bracket ONLY. NEVER reposition the rear wheels to the forward position, stability of the wheelchair will decrease.

TO HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS/ASSISTANTS:

The Tracer SX Recliner wheelchair MUST be operated by a healthcare professional or assistant when in ANY reclined position.

Make sure the patient is properly positioned in the wheelchair before reclining or inclining (reverse recline) to maintain maximum stability and safety.

When returning the occupant of the wheelchair to the full upright position, more body strength will be required for approximately the last twenty (20) degrees of incline (reverse recline). Make sure to use proper body mechanics (use your legs) or seek assistance if necessary to avoid injury.

Assistants MUST be prepared to support the weight of the occupant when reclining, or returning the occupant of the wheelchair to the full upright position.

SAFETY/HANDLING OF WHEELCHAIRS

"Safety and Handling" of the wheelchair requires the close attention of the wheelchair user as well as the assistant. This manual points out the most common procedures and techniques involved in the safe operation and maintenance of the wheelchair. It is important to practice and master these safe techniques until you are comfortable in maneuvering around the frequently encountered architectural barriers.

Use this information only as a "basic" guide. The techniques that are discussed on the following pages have been used successfully by many.

Individual wheelchair users often develop skills to deal with daily living activities that may differ from those described in this manual. Invacare recognizes and encourages each individual to try what works best for him/her in overcoming architectural obstacles that they may encounter, however ALL WARNINGS and CAUTIONS given in this manual MUST be followed. Techniques in this manual are a starting point for the new wheelchair user and assistant with "safety" as the most important consideration for all.

STABILITY AND BALANCE

WARNING

ALWAYS wear your seat positioning strap. Inasmuch as the SEAT POSITIONING STRAP is an option on this wheelchair (You may order with or without the Seat Positioning Strap), Invacare strongly recommends ordering the Seat Positioning Strap as an additional safeguard for the wheelchair user.

To assure stability and proper operation of your wheelchair, you must at all times maintain proper balance. Your wheelchair has been designed to remain upright and stable during normal daily activities as long as you do not move beyond the center of gravity.

Virtually all activities which involve movement in the wheelchair have an effect on the center of gravity. Invacare recommends using seat/chest positioning straps for additional safety while involved in activities that shift your weight.

DO NOT lean forward out of the wheelchair any further than the length of the armrests. Make sure the casters are pointing in the forward position whenever you lean forward. This can be achieved by advancing the wheelchair and then reversing it in a straight line.

COPING WITH EVERYDAY OBSTACLES

Coping with the irritation of everyday obstacles can be alleviated somewhat by learning how to manage your wheelchair. Keep in mind your center of gravity to maintain stability and balance.

A NOTE TO WHEELCHAIR ASSISTANTS

When assistance to the wheelchair user is required, remember to use good body mechanics. Keep your back straight and bend your knees whenever tipping the wheelchair or traversing curbs, or other impediments.

WARNING

DO NOT attempt to lift the wheelchair by any removable (detachable) parts. Lifting by means of any removable (detachable) parts of a wheelchair may result in injury to the user or damage to the wheelchair.

Also, be aware of detachable parts such as armrests or legrests. These must NEVER be used for hand-held or lifting supports, as they may be inadvertently released, resulting in possible injury to the user and/or assistant(s).

When learning a new assistance technique, have an experienced assistant help you before attempting it alone.


PERCENTAGE OF WEIGHT DISTRIBUTION

WARNING

DO NOT attempt to reach objects if you have to move forward in the seat or pick them up from the floor by reaching down between your knees.


Many activities require the wheelchair owner to reach, bend and transfer in and out of the wheelchair. These movements will cause a change to the normal balance, the center of gravity, and the weight distribution of the wheelchair. To determine and establish your particular safety limits, practice bending, reaching and transferring activities in several combinations in the presence of a qualified healthcare professional BEFORE attempting active use of the wheelchair.

Proper positioning is essential for your safety. When reaching, leaning, or bending forward, it is important to use the front casters as a tool to maintain stability and balance.




FUNCTIONAL REACH FROM A WHEELCHAIR

The approximate reach-limit values shown in the accompanying graph were derived on the basis of a sample of 91 male and 36 female wheelchair users. Note the difference between the maximum and the comfortable reach limits, a subjective but important consideration in design.



REACHING, LEANING AND BENDING - FORWARD

Position the front casters so that they are extended as far forward as possible and engage wheel locks. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO REACH OBJECTS IF YOU HAVE TO MOVE FORWARD IN THE SEAT OR PICK THEM UP FROM THE FLOOR BY REACHING DOWN BETWEEN YOUR KNEES.



REACHING, LEANING - BACKWARDS

WARNING

DO NOT lean over the top of the back upholstery. This will change your center of gravity and may cause you to tip over.



Position wheelchair as close as possible to the desired object. Point front casters forward to create the longest possible wheelbase. Reach back only as far as your arm will extend without changing your sitting position.

TIPPING

WARNING

DO NOT tip the wheelchair without assistance.

When tipping the wheelchair, an assistant should grasp the back of the wheelchair on a non-removable (nondetachable) part. Inform the wheelchair occupant before tipping the wheelchair and remind him/her to lean back. Be sure the occupant's feet and hands are clear of all wheels.


After mastering the techniques of tipping the wheelchair, use one (1) of the following methods to tackle curbs, short stairs, etc.

Tipping - Curbs: Method 1 - Wheelchair with Step Tubes

Apply a continuous downward motion until the balance point is achieved and the front casters clear the curb. At this point, the assistant will feel a difference in the weight distribution.

WARNING

When lowering the front casters of the wheel-chair, DO NOT let the wheelchair drop the last few inches to the ground. This could result in injury to the occupant and/or damage to the wheelchair.



METHOD 1 - WHEELCHAIR WITH STEP TUBE

Roll the wheelchair forward and slowly lower the front of the wheelchair in one continuous movement onto the sidewalk. Do not let the wheelchair drop the last few inches to the ground. This could result in injury to the occupant. Push the wheelchair forward until the rear wheels roll up and over the curb.

Tipping - Curbs: Method 1 - Wheelchair without Step Tubes


This method requires two (2) assistants. The second assistant should be positioned at the front of the wheelchair lifting upward on a non-removable (non-detachable) part of the wheelchair frame when lifting the wheelchair and stabilizing the wheelchair when the wheelchair is being lowered to the ground.

The first assistant should stand on the sidewalk and turn the wheelchair so that the rear wheels are against the curb. Turn the anti-tippers so the anti-tip wheels are pointing up, The wheelchair should be tilted back to the balance point and, in one continuous upward movement, the rear wheels should be pulled up and over the curb. DO NOT return the front casters to the ground until the wheelchair has been pulled backward far enough for the front casters to clear the edge of the curb.

WARNING

When lowering the front casters of the wheel-chair, DO NOT let the wheelchair drop the last few inches to the ground. This could result in injury to the occupant and/or damage to the wheelchair.

Roll the wheelchair backward and **SLOWLY** lower the wheelchair in one continuous movement. DO NOT let the wheelchair drop the last few inches to the ground. This could result in injury to the occupant.



METHOD 2 - WHEELCHAIR WITHOUT STEP TUBE

STAIRWAYS

WARNING

ALWAYS wear your seat positioning strap. Inasmuch as the SEAT POSITIONING STRAP is an option on this wheelchair (You may order with or without the Seat Positioning Strap), Invacare strongly recommends ordering the Seat Positioning Strap as an additional safeguard for the wheelchair user.

Do not attempt to lift a wheelchair by lifting on any removable (detachable) parts. Lifting by means of any removable (detachable) parts of a wheelchair may result in injury to the user or damage to the wheelchair.

Extreme caution is advised when it is necessary to move an occupied wheelchair up or down the stairs. Invacare recommends using two (2) assistants and making thorough preparations. Make sure to use ONLY secure, non-detachable parts for hand-held supports.

Follow this procedure for moving the wheelchair between floors when an elevator is NOT available:

- After the wheelchair has been tilted back to the balance point, one assistant (in the rear) backs the wheelchair up against the first step, while securely grasping a non-removable (non-detachable) part of the wheelchair for leverage.
- The second assistant, with a firm hold on a nondetachable part of the framework, lifts the wheelchair up and over the stair and steadies the wheelchair as the first assistant places one (1) foot on the next stair and repeats STEP 1.
- 3. The wheelchair should not be lowered until the last stair has been negotiated and the wheelchair has been rolled away from the stairway.



ESCALATORS? SORRY!

DO NOT use an escalator to move a wheel-chair between floors. Serious bodily injury may occur.

TRANSFERRING TO AND FROM OTHER SEATS

WARNING

BEFORE attempting to transfer in or out of the wheelchair, every precaution should be taken to reduce the gap distance. Turn both casters toward the object you are transferring onto. Also be certain the wheel locks are engaged to help prevent the wheels from moving.

CAUTION

When transferring, position yourself as far back as possible in the seat. This will help prevent broken screws, damaged upholstery and the possibility of the wheelchair tipping forward.

NOTE: This activity may be performed independently provided you have adequate mobility and upper body strength.



Position the wheelchair as close as possible along side the seat to which you are transferring, with the front casters pointing toward it. Engage wheel locks. Shift body weight into seat with transfer.

During independent transfer, little or no seat platform will be beneath you. Use a transfer board if at all possible.


FOLDING AND UNFOLDING THE WHEELCHAIR

WARNING

Keep hands and fingers clear of moving parts to avoid injury.

Opening

- 1. Open the wheelchair by grasping the push handle of the wheelchair closest to you.
- 2. Tilt the wheelchair towards you (raising the opposite wheel and caster off the ground/floor).
- Push downward on the **TOP** of the seat rail closest to you where the seat upholstery is attached until the wheelchair is fully open.
- Engage both wheel locks, open the footrest/legrest for clearance and transfer into the wheelchair. Refer to TRANSFERRING TO AND FROM OTHER SEATS in this section of the manual.




"HAMMOCK OR SLING SEAT" MODELS

Closing

- 1. Swing footrest/legrest in locked position to the front of the wheelchair.
- 2. Pivot footplates upward to vertical position.
- 3. With both hands, grasp the middle of the seat upholstery at the front and back edge and lift up.

NOTE: If wheelchair is equipped with carry straps, the wheelchair may be closed by pulling up on the straps.

FOLDING.

- 1. Push in detent pin on one side of spreader bar.
- While holding spreader bar, pull out handle until the release pin is out of the handle of the back cane.
- 3. Drop the spreader bar to one side.
- 4. Lift up on the seat upholstery.
- 5. Lift up on the two (2) crossbraces.


UNFOLDING.


- 1. Lift the wheelchair to one side.
- 2. Push down on the raised side of the wheelchair.

WARNING

Make sure detent pin of the spreader bar is completely extended through the hole in the handle BEFORE using the wheelchair.

- Push in detent pin on the handle of the spreader bar and insert into the handle of the back cane.
- Engage both wheel locks, open the footrest/legrest for clearance and transfer into the wheelchair. Refer to TRANSFERRING TO AND FROM OTHER SEATS in this section of the manual.

SAFETY INSPECTION CHECKLIST

NOTE: Every six (6) months take your wheelchair to a qualified technician for a thorough inspection and servicing. Regular cleaning will reveal loose or wom parts and enhance the smooth operation of your wheelchair. To operate properly and safely, your wheelchair must be cared for just like any other vehicle. Routine maintenance will extend the life and efficiency of your wheelchair.

Initial adjustments should be made to suit your personal body structure and preference. Thereafter follow these maintenance procedures:

MAINTENANCE SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

WARNING

After ANY adjustments, repair or service and BEFORE use, make sure all attaching hardware is tightened securely - otherwise injury or damage may result.

CAUTION

DO NOT over tighten hardware attaching to the frame. This could cause damage to the frame tubing.

SUGGESTED MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES

- Before using your wheelchair, make sure all nuts and bolts are tight. Check all parts for damage or wear and replace. Check all parts for proper adjustment.
- Keep quick-release axles free of dirt and lint to ensure positive locking and proper operation. Refer to ADJUSTING THE QUICK-RELEASE AXLE in PROCEDURE 4 of this manual.
- 3. If equipped, oil quick-release axles at least once (1) a month (3-in-1[®] oil or equivalent).

WARNING

DO NOT use the wheelchair unless it has the proper tire pressure (p.s.i.). DO NOT overinflate the tires. Failure to follow these suggestions may cause the tire to explode and cause bodily harm. Recommended tire pressure is listed on the side wall of the tire.

- The wheels and tires should be checked periodically for cracks and wear, and should be replaced when necessary by your authorized dealer or by a qualified technician.
- Periodically check handrims to ensure they are securely attached to the rear wheels. Refer to REPLACING REAR WHEEL HANDRIM in PRO-CEDURE 4 of this manual.
- Periodically adjust wheel locks in correlation to tire wear. Refer to WHEEL LOCK ADJUSTMENT in PROCEDURE 6 of this manual.
- 7. Periodically check front caster and rear wheel hubs to make sure they are clean. Use a Teflon® lubricant if necessary.
- 8. Check Upholstery for sagging, rips or tears.

WARNING

After ANY adjustments, repair or service and BEFORE use, make sure all attaching hardware is tightened securely - otherwise injury or damage may result.




FIGURE 1 - SWINGAWAY FOOTREST ASSEMBLY INSTALLATION

SWINGAWAY FOOTREST ASSEMBLY INSTALLATION (FIGURE 1)

- 1. Turn the swingaway footrest to the side (open footplate is perpendicular to wheelchair).
- 2. Place the hinge plates on the swingaway footrest onto the hinge pins on the wheelchair frame.
- 3. Push the swingaway footrest towards the inside of the wheelchair until it locks into place.

NOTE: The footplate will be on the inside of the wheel-chair when locked in place.

- 4. Repeat this procedure for the other footrest assembly.
- 5. To release the footrest, push the footrest release lever inward, rotate footrest outward.




FIGURE 2 - SWINGAWAY FOOTREST HEIGHT ADJUSTMENT

SWINGAWAY FOOTREST HEIGHT ADJUSTMENT (FIGURE 2)

NOTE: Release the footrest locking mechanism and lift the footrest off of the hinge pins. Lay the assembly on a flat surface to simplify this procedure.

- Loosen, but do not remove the bolt and locknut that secure the lower footrest assembly to the upper footrest support.
- Reposition the lower footrest assembly to the desired height.
- 3. Securely tighten the bolt and locknut.
- 4. Repeat this procedure for the other footrest, if necessary.




FIGURE 3 - HEEL LOOP REPLACEMENT

HEEL LOOP REPLACEMENT (FIGURE 3)

- Loosen, but do not remove the bolt and locknut that secure the lower half of the footrest to the swingaway footrest assembly.

- 3. Remove the phillips screw, spacer and locknut that secure the heel loop to the footplate.
- 4. Remove heel loop from slide tube.
- 5. Replace heel loop.
- 6. Reverse STEPS 1-5 to reassemble.

NOTE: When securing the heel loop to the footrest assembly, tighten the phillips screw and locknut until the spacer is secure. FRONT RIGGINGS PROCEDURE 1




FIGURE 4 - ELEVATING LEGREST INSTALLATION

ELEVATING LEGREST ASSEMBLY INSTALLATION (FIGURE 4)

- Place legrest assembly on the outside of the wheelchair and install the hinge plates onto the hinge pins on wheelchair frame (FIGURE 4).
- 2. Rotate legrest assembly toward the inside of the wheelchair until it locks in place (**FIGURE 4**).

NOTE: The footplate will be on the inside of the wheelchair when locked in place.

- 3. Repeat this procedure for other legrest assembly.
- After seated in wheelchair, adjust footrest to correct height by loosening the locknut and sliding the lower footrest assembly tube up or down until desired height is achieved.
- Tighten locknut securely.

- To adjust the elevating legrest, raise legs until the desired height is obtained.

- 3. To adjust the calfpad, turn pad towards the outside of the wheelchair.
- Slide the calfpad up or down until the desired position is obtained.
- 5. To secure the calfpad, turn the calfpad towards the inside of the wheelchair.




FIGURE 5 - ADJUSTING THE ELEVATING LEGREST ASSEMBLY

ADJUSTING ARMREST HEIGHT -ADJUSTABLE HEIGHT ARMS ONLY




FIGURE 1 - ADJUSTING ARMREST HEIGHT - ADJUST-ABLE HEIGHT ARMS ONLY - WHEELCHAIRS EQUIPPED WITH HEIGHT ADJUSTMENT LEVERS

Wheelchairs Equipped With Height Adjustment Levers (FIGURE 1)

WARNING

Make sure the armrest is securely locked BEFORE using the wheelchair.

- Unlock the armrest by flipping the height adjustment lever on the top front of the armrest to the UP (HORI-ZONTAL) position.
- 2. Adjust armrest to desired height.

NOTE: Height adjustment lever MUST be in the unlocked position when placing armrest into the arm assembly.

3. Lock the armrest by pressing the height adjustment lever into the **DOWN** (**VERTICAL**) position when the desired armrest height is achieved.




FIGURE 2 - ADJUSTING ARMREST HEIGHT -ADJUSTABLE HEIGHT ARMS ONLY - WHEEL-CHAIRS EQUIPPED WITH HEIGHT ADJUST-MENT KNOBS

Whelchairs Equipped With Height Adjustment Knobs (FIGURE 2)

WARNING

Make sure the height adjustment knob is in the locked position before using the wheelchair.

- Unlock the armrest by pulling the height adjustment knob on the front of the armrest and twisting it 1/4turn into the UNLOCKED position (FIGURE 1).
- 2. Adjust armrest to one (1) of four (4) OR five (5) positions (depending on model type).
- Lock the armrest by pulling the height adjustment knob on the rear of the armrest and twisting it 1/4-turn into the LOCKED position as in FIG-URE 1.
- 4. Repeat STEPS 1-3 for other armrest.

- 3. Replace the armrest by reversing STEPS 1-2.




FIGURE 2 - REMOVING OR REPLACING ARMREST

Using

- 1. Press in armrest release button located on armrest front tube.
- 2. Rotate front of armrest UP, BACK and OUT of arm socket.
- 3. Reverse STEP 2 to replace armrest to DOWN position.
- Ensure armrest is securely locked into arm socket and armrest release button locks into place BEFORE using.

Replacing

- 1. Perform STEPS 1-2 above to flip the armrest back.
- Remove hex head screw, washer, spacer and locknut securing the EXISTING armrest and insert to the wheelchair frame.
- 3. Remove the EXISTING armrest and insert from frame.
- 4. Position NEW insert into NEW rear armrest tube, aligning the mounting holes.




FIGURE 3 - USING OR REPLACING FLIP-BACK ARMREST

- 5. Insert the NEW hex head screw through the armrest mounting bracket, NEW washer, spacer and armrest rear tube with insert, as shown in FIGURE 3.

NOTE: Ensure the spacer sits flush against the armrest.

- 6. Install nut onto hex head screw. Torque to 55-60 in./lbs.
- 7. Rotate armrest DOWN and into the arm socket.
- 8. Ensure armrest is securely locked into arm socket and armrest release button locks into place BEFORE using.

WARNING

After making adjustments, always make sure that parts are properly tightened BEFORE using the wheelchair.




FIGURE 1 - ASSEMBLING THE BACK CANE

ASSEMBLING THE BACK CANE TO THE WHEELCHAIR (FIGURE 1)

- Remove the attaching hardware from the bottom of the back canes.
- 2. Insert the two (2) back canes into the two (2) mounting holes in the wheelchair frame.
- 3. Position the mounting hardware through the wheelchair frame and back canes as shown in **FIGURE 1**.
- 4. Securely tighten the attaching hardware. Torque to 170-inch pounds.




FIGURE 2 - REPLACING THE SLIP-ON BACK UPHOLSTERY

REPLACING THE SLIP-ON BACK UPHOLSTERY (FIGURE 2)

- 1. Remove the two (2) phillips screws and washers that secure the existing back upholstery to the back canes.
- 2. Remove the screw, coved washers and locknut that secure one (1) back cane to the wheelchair frame.

NOTE: It is necessary to remove only one (1) back cane to replace the back upholstery.

- 3. Pull the loose back cane out of the existing back upholstery.
- 4. Pull the existing back upholstery up and over the mounted back cane.
- 5. Install the new back upholstery over the mounted back cane.
- 6. Slide the loose back cane through the new back upholstery.
- 7. Secure the back cane to the wheelchair frame with the hex screw, coved washers and locknut. Torque to 170-inch pounds.
- 8. Secure the new back upholstery to the back canes with the existing Phillips screws and washers.




FIGURE 3 - REPLACING SCREW-ON BACK UPHOLSTERY

 Refer to INSTALLING THE SEAT POSITIONING STRAP in PROCEDURE 9 of this manual.
- 4. Install new seat upholstery by reversing STEPS 1-2.




FIGURE 4 - REPLACING SEAT UPHOLSTERY




FIGURE 5 - ADJUSTING SEAT DEPTH

ADJUSTING SEAT DEPTH (FIGURE 5)

 Remove the existing seat upholstery from the wheelchair. Refer to REPLACING THE SEAT UPHOL-STERY in this section of the manual.

NOTE: If adjusting the seat depth of the wheelchair, the seat upholstery MUST be changed as well.

Remove the two (2) plug buttons from the ends of the crossbraces that are towards the front of the wheelchair.

NOTE: The two (2) plug buttons will be used in the ends of the seat extensions.

- 3. Install the two (2) seat extension tubes into the ends on the crossbraces. Line up the **second** mounting hole from the **rear** of the seat extension tube with the mounting hole in the crossbrace.
- 4. Install the two (2) seat extension spacers onto the two (2) seat extension tubes.

- Install the new seat upholstery onto the wheelchair. Make sure to line up the mounting holes in the seat extension tubes and seat extension spacers with the new seat upholstery. Refer to REPLACING THE SEAT UPHOLSTERY in this section of the manual.
- 6. Install plug buttons into the ends of the seat extension spacers.




FIGURE 6 - ADJUSTING SEAT WIDTH

ADJUSTING SEAT WIDTH (FIGURE 6)

WARNING

Adjusting the seat width of the wheelchair MUST be performed by a qualified technician.

 Remove the existing back and seat upholstery from the wheelchair. Refer to REPLACING THE BACK UPHOLSTERY and REPLACING THE SEAT UP-HOLSTERY in this section of the manual.

NOTE: If adjusting the seat width of the wheelchair, back and seat upholstery as well as the crossbraces MUST be replaced.

2. Perform one (1) of the following:

TRACER TITAN/SX/SX RECLINER/DLX (BUILT AFTER MARCH 13, 2000) -

- Remove the button head screws and locknuts that secure the two (2) pivot links to the cross-braces.
- Remove the four (4) phillips screws and locknuts that secure the insert tube to the lower wheelchair frame.
- Remove the inserts from the rear of the wheelchair.

NOTE: If changing the seat width of the SX Recliner the spreader bar and headrest upholstery MUST be changed. The headrest pillow may need to be changed according to the chart below.

HEADREST PILLOW SEAT WIDTH RANGES

14-inches, 16-18-inches, 20-inches, or 22-inches

NOTE: if the seat width required is within the range of the original headrest pillow, the original headrest pillow may still be used.

TRACER DLX (BUILT BEFORE MARCH 13, 2000) - NOTE: There are no pivot links on the Tracer DLX.

- Pull crossbrace assembly up and away from the main body of the wheelchair. Seat guides will stay attached to rear canes.
- b. Remove upholstery screws.
- c. Remove crossbraces from seat guides.
- 3. Remove the hardware that secures the two (2) existing crossbraces together (FIGURE 6).
- 4. Perform one (1) of the following:


TRACER TITAN/SX/SX RECLINER/DLX (BUILT AFTER MARCH 13, 2000) -

a. Assemble the two (2) **NEW** crossbraces together. Refer to **FIGURE 6** for hardware orientation.

b. Reinstall the button head screws and locknuts that secure the pivot links to the crossbraces.

TRACER DLX (BUILT BEFORE MARCH 13, 2000) -

- a. Position the crossbraces onto the seat guide.
- 5. Slide insert tubes into the wheelchair frame.
- 6. Align the holes in the insert tube with the holes in the wheelchair frame.
- 7. Insert the phillips screws and tighten the locknuts securely.
- Install the NEW back and seat upholstery onto the wheelchair. Refer to REPLACING THE BACK UP-HOLSTERY and REPLACING THE SEAT UPHOL-STERY in this section of the manual.

Removing/Installing the Rear Wheels

Adjusting the Quick-Release Axle

Replacing Rear Wheel Handrim

Replacing/Repairing Rear Wheel Tire/Tube

WARNING

After ANY adjustments, repair or service and BEFORE use, make sure all attaching hardware is tightened securely - otherwise injury or damage may result.

REMOVING/INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS

NOTE: Non-Recliner ONLY. For the SX RECLINER see **REMOVING/INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS** in **PROCEDURE 8** of this manual.




FIGURE 1 - REMOVING/INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS - PERMANENT AXLES

Permanent Axles (FIGURE 1)

- Remove the dust cap, hex screw, spacer and locknut that secure the rear wheel to the wheelchair.
- 2. Repeat **STEP 1** for the opposite rear wheel.
- 3. To reinstall the rear wheel(s) onto the wheelchair, reverse **STEPS 1-2**.
- Adjust wheel locks. Refer to WHEEL LOCK ADJUSTMENT in PROCEDURE 6 of this manual.




FIGURE 2 - REMOVING/INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS - OUICK-RELEASE AXLES

Quick-Release Axles (FIGURE 2)

NOTE: Quick Release Axles are available on Non-Recliner wheelchairs ONLY.

- 1. Push in the tip of the quick-release axle (with wheel) and pull the axle out through the opening in the center of the rear wheel and axle spacer.
- 2. Push in the tip of the quick-release axle again and pull the axle out of the rear wheel.
- 3. Repeat **STEPS 1-2** for the opposite rear wheel.
- 4. To reinstall the rear wheel onto the wheelchair, reverse **STEPS 1-3**.

WARNING

Make sure the detent pin and locking pins of the quick-release axle are fully released BE-FORE operating the wheelchair.

The locking pins MUST be protruding past the inside of the rear wheel axle bushing for a positive lock.

Keep locking pins clean.

Invacare recommends inserting quick-release axles with the head end to the inside of the wheelchair to prevent accidental release during contact activities.

5. If the locking pins are not protruding past the inside of the axle bushing or there is too much movement of the rear wheel assembly in a back and forth position, refer to ADJUSTING THE QUICK-RELEASE AXLE in this section of the manual.

- 2. Depress detent pin in the quick-release axle and slide axle through the wheel hub.
- 3. Release detent pin ensuring that the locking pins are fully released.
- 4. Increase or decrease end play by adjusting the locknut on the end of the quick-release axle.
- Reinstall rear wheel onto the wheelchair. Refer to REMOVING/INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS in this section of the manual.




FIGURE 3 - ADJUSTING THE QUICK-RELEASE AXLE




FIGURE 4 - REPLACING REAR WHEEL HANDRIM

REPLACING REAR WHEEL HANDRIM (FIGURE 4)

This Procedure Includes the Following:

Installing/Replacing Six or Eight-inch Front Casters and Forks

Replacing/Repairing Front Caster Tire/Tube Front Caster Mounting Adjustments

WARNING

After ANY adjustments, repair or service and BEFORE use, make sure all attaching hardware is tightened securely - otherwise injury or damage may result.




FIGURE 1 - INSTALLING/REPLACING SIX OR EIGHT-INCH FRONT CASTERS AND FORKS

INSTALLING/REPLACING SIX OR EIGHT-INCH FRONT CASTERS AND FORKS (FIGURE 1)

- 1. Remove the dust cover.
- 2. Remove the locknut and nylon washer that secures the fork to the caster headtube.
- Drop the front caster and fork out of the caster headtube.
- 4. Slide in the new front caster and fork.
- 5. Reassemble by reversing STEPS 1-3.
- 6. Repeat **STEPS 1-5** for the opposite front caster and fork .
- 7. To properly tighten caster journal system and guard against flutter, perform the following check:
 - a. Tip back of wheelchair to floor.
 - b. Pivot both forks and casters to top of their arc simultaneously.
 - c. Let casters drop to bottom of arc.
 - d. Adjust locknuts according to freedom of caster swing.
 - e. Repeat steps c-d untill wheels swing once to oneside, then immediately rest in a downward position.


FRONT CASTER MOUNTING ADJUSTMENTS (FIGURE 2)

- Remove the hex screw and locknut that secures the front caster to the fork.

- Reinstall the spacers (6-inch caster and fork ONLY) and securely tighten with the existing hex screw and locknut.

WARNING

Make sure both front casters are positioned in the same mounting hole BEFORE using the wheelchair; otherwise injury can occur.

4. Repeat STEPS 1-3 for the opposite front caster.

Wheel Lock Adjustment

WARNING

After ANY adjustments, repair or service and BE-FORE use, make sure all attaching hardware is tightened securely - otherwise injury or damage may result.

INSTALLING/ADJUSTING THE ANTI-TIPPERS

WARNING

NON-RECLINERS ONLY: Inasmuch as the antitippers are an option on this wheelchair (You may order with or without the anti-tippers), Invacare strongly recommends ordering the anti-tippers as an additional safeguard for the wheelchair user.

RECLINERS ONLY: Anti-tippers MUST BE attached at all times.

Anti-tippers MUST be fully engaged. Ensure that the release button of the anti-tipper fully protrudes out of the hole on the bottom of the wheelchair frame.

Ensure both anti-tippers are adjusted to the same height.




FIGURE 1 - ANTI-TIPPER LENGTH

Installing The Anti-tippers (FIGURES 1 & 2)

NOTE: To ensure the correct model anti-tipper is used refer to **FIGURE 1**. Measurements for NON-RECLINER anti-tippers are approximate and are taken with extension tube in TOP hole position. Measurements for RE-CLINER anti-tippers are approximate and are taken with extension tube in BOTTOM hole position.

- Depress the release buttons and insert the anti-tippers with the anti-tipper wheels pointing toward the ground/floor into the wheelchair frame tubing as shown in FIGURE 2.
- Ensure that the release button of the anti-tipper fully protrudes out of the hole in the bottom of the wheelchair frame tubing.
- Adjust anti-tippers as necessary. Refer to ADJUST-ING THE ANTI-TIPPERS in PROCEDURE 6 of this manual.

Adjusting The Anti-tippers (FIGURE 3)

NOTE: A 1-1/2 to 2-inch clearance between the bottom of the anti-tipper wheels and the ground/floor MUST be maintained at all times.

1. Place wheelchair on a flat, level surface.

NOTE: If adjusting anti-tippers on recliner models, ensure back cains are in the upright position before making adjustments.

- 2. Press the release buttons near the wheeled portion of the anti-tipper and slide it up or down to achieve the 1-1/2 to 2-inch clearance (FIGURE 3).
- Check to make sure that the release buttons are fully engaged in adjustment holes, and ensure both anti-tippers are adjusted to the same height.
- Check to make sure that a 1-1/2 to 2-inch clearance between the bottom of the anti-tipper wheels and the ground/floor has been achieved BEFORE using t h e wheelchair.
- 5. Repeat **STEPS 1-3** until 1-1/2-2-inch clearance is achieved.




FIGURE 4 - WHEEL LOCK ADJUSTMENT

WHEEL LOCK ADJUSTMENT (FIGURE 4)

NOTE: Before adjusting or replacing the wheel lock assemblies, ensure that the tires are inflated to the recommended psi on the side wall of tire.

- 1. Ensure the wheel lock is in the open (unlocked) position.
- 2. Loosen the bolt and locknut that secure the wheel lock assembly to the wheelchair frame.
- 3. Adjust the position of wheel lock until the measurement between the rear wheel and the wheel lock shoe is between 5/32 and 5/16-inches.
- 4. Securely tighten the bolt and locknut.
- Engage wheel lock and push against the wheelchair and determine if wheel lock engages the wheel lock shoe enough to hold the wheelchair.
- 6. Repeat the above procedures until the wheel lock holds the wheelchair.
- 7. Repeat **STEPS 1-6** for the opposite wheel lock.

- 8. If 5/32 and 5/16-inches measurement can not be achieved, remove the bolt and locknut that secure the wheel lock to the wheelchair and mount the wheel lock in one (1) of two (2) mounting positions
- 9. Repeat **STEPS 1-7** until the wheel lock holds the wheelchair.

Changing Seat-To-Floor Height

WARNING

After ANY adjustments, repair or service and BEFORE use, make sure all attaching hardware is tightened securely - otherwise injury or damage may result.




FIGURE 1 - CHANGING SEAT-TO-FLOOR HEIGHT - ADULT/HEMI FRAME STYLE




FIGURE 2 - CHANGING SEAT-TO-FLOOR HEIGHT - RECLINER FRAME STYLE

CHANGING SEAT-TO-FLOOR HEIGHT (FIGURE 1 AND 2)

WARNING

When changing the seat-to-floor height, the height of the anti-tippers must be adjusted as well.

NOTE: Invacare recommends that the following procedure be performed by an authorized dealer or qualified technician.

 Remove the rear wheels from the wheelchair. (ADULT/HEMI FRAME STYLE): Refer to RE-MOVING/INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS in PROCEDURE 4 (RECLINER FRAME STYLE): Refer to REMOVING/INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS in PROCEDURE 8 of this manual.

- Remove the front casters from the wheelchair. Refer to FRONT CASTER MOUNTING ADJUSTMENTS in PROCEDURE 5 of this manual.
- Refer to the charts of front caster/fork and rear wheel sizes, to determine mounting positions for obtainable seatto-floor heights (FIGURE 1 for ADULT/HEMI FRAME STYLE or FIGURE 2 for RECLINER FRAME STYLE).
- Reinstall the front casters onto the wheelchair. Refer to FRONT CASTER MOUNTING ADJUSTMENTS in PROCEDURE 5 of this manual.
- Reinstall the rear wheels onto the wheelchair. (ADULT/HEMI FRAME STYLE): Refer to RE-MOVING/INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS in PROCEDURE 4 (RECLINER FRAME STYLE): Refer to REMOVING/INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS in PROCEDURE 8 of this manual.
- Adjust Anti-tippers according to NEW seat-to-floor height. Refer to ADJUSTING THE ANTI-TIPPERS in PROCEDURE 6 of this manual.





This Procedure Includes the Following:

Recliner Operation
Replacing the Headrest Pillow
Replacing Headrest/Back Upholstery
Adjusting the Seat Depth
Storing/Replacing the Spreader Bar
Removing/Installing the Rear Wheels

WARNING

After ANY adjustments, repair or service and BEFORE use, make sure all attaching hardware is tightened securely - otherwise injury or damage may result.




FIGURE 1 - RECLINE OPERATION

RECLINER OPERATION (FIGURE 1)

WARNING

ALWAYS make sure that the wheelchair is stable BEFORE using the recliner.

ALWAYS wear your Seat Positioning Strap. Inasmuch as the SEAT POSITIONING STRAP is an option on this wheelchair (You may order with or without the Seat Positioning Strap), Invacare strongly recommends ordering the Seat Positioning Strap as an additional safeguard for the wheelchair user.

Anti-tippers MUST BE attached at all times.

Anti-tippers MUST be fully engaged. Ensure that the release button of the anti-tipper fully protrudes out of the hole on the bottom of the wheelchair frame.

Ensure both anti-tippers are adjusted to the same height.

ALWAYS engage both wheel locks while reclining or inclining (reverse recline) the wheelchair.

Ensure the spreader bar is attached and secured BEFORE using the Tracer SX Recliner.

Make sure both back canes are at the same angle BEFORE releasing the handles of the recline mechanisms.

Mount the rear wheels in the Rear Wheel Offset Bracket ONLY. NEVER reposition the rear wheels to the forward position, stability of the wheelchair will decrease, and injury or damage may result.

WARNING (CONTINUED)

TO HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS/ASSISTANTS:


Make sure the patient is properly positioned in the wheelchair before reclining or inclining (reverse recline) to maintain maximum stability and safety.

When returning the occupant of the wheel-chair to the full upright position, more body strength will be required for approximately the last twenty (20) degrees of incline (reverse recline). Make sure to use proper body mechanics (use your legs) or seek assistance if necessary to avoid injury.

Assistants MUST be prepared to support the weight of the occupant when reclining, or returning the wheelchair back to the full upright position, otherwise injury may occur.

- Unfold wheelchair. Refer to SAFETY/HANDLING section of this manual.
- Attach spreader bar. Refer to STORING/REPLAC-ING THE SPREADER BAR in this procedure of the manual.
- Inform the occupant of the wheelchair that the wheelchair is about to be reclined.
- Make sure wheelchair is occupied and on a level surface before reclining.
- 5. Stand behind the wheelchair and grasp both handles firmly.
- 6. Lifting up on handles, squeeze release levers.
- 7. SLOWLY, pull back on the back assembly while squeezing the release levers.
- 8. When the back reaches the desired angle, SLOWLY let go of the release levers.
- To return the back to the full upright position, reverse the STEPS 6-9 keeping in mind proper body mechanics.




FIGURE 2 - REPLACING THE HEADREST PILLOW

REPLACING THE HEADREST PILLOW (FIGURE 2)

- Unfasten straps of headrest pillow from behind headrest upholstery and remove the existing headrest pillow from headrest.
- 2. Center new/existing headrest pillow onto the front of the headrest upholstery.
- 3. Pull straps of new/existing headrest pillow around the back canes.
- 4. Pressing firmly, attach the fastening strips of the new/ existing headrest pillow to the fastening strips on the back of the headrest upholstery.

REPLACING THE HEADREST/BACK UPHOLSTERY




FIGURE 3 - REPLACING THE HEADREST/BACK UPHOLSTERY

Headrest Upholstery (FIGURE 3)

- Remove the headrest pillow. Refer to REPLAC-ING THE HEADREST PILLOW in this procedure of the manual.
- Remove the six (6) mounting screws that secure the headrest upholstery to the headrest extension tubes.
- Secure **NEW** headrest upholstery onto headrest extension tubes with the existing six (6) mounting screws.
- Install headrest pillow. Refer to REPLACING THE HEADREST PILLOW in this procedure of the manual.

Back Upholstery (FIGURE 3)

 Disengage one (1) side of the spreader bar. Refer to REMOVING/INSTALLING THE SPREADER BAR in this procedure of the manual. PROCEDURE 8 RECLINER

NOTE: To remove and install the bottom two (2) mounting screws of the back upholstery the wheelchair must be partially folded. Refer to **FOLDING AND UNFOLD-ING THE WHEELCHAIR** in the **SAFETY/HANDLING** section of this manual.

- 2. Remove the twelve (12) mounting screws that secure the back upholstery to the back canes.
- 3. Secure new back upholstery to back canes with the existing twelve (12) mounting screws. Securely tighten.
- Reengage spreader bar. Refer to REMOVING/ INSTALLING THE SPREADER BAR in this procedure of the manual.




FIGURE 4 - STORING/REPLACING THE SPREADER BAR

REMOVING/INSTALLING THE SPREADER BAR (FIGURE 4)

WARNING

Make sure detent pin of the spreader bar is completely extended through the hole in the handle BEFORE using the wheelchair.

Removing

- Push in detent pin on one side of existing spreader bar.
- 2. While holding existing spreader bar, pull handle until the release pin is out of the handle of the back cane.
- 3. Drop the spreader bar to one side.
- 4. Repeat **STEPS 1-3** on opposite end of spreader bar.

Installing

- Push in detent pin on the handle of the new/existing spreader bar.
- 2. Insert new/existing spreader bar into the handle of the back cane.
- 3. Repeat STEPS 1-2 on opposite end of spreader bar.




FIGURE 5 - REMOVING/INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS

REMOVING/INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS (FIGURE 5)

WARNING

TRACER SX RECLINER ONLY: Mount the rear wheels in the Rear Wheel Offset Bracket ONLY. NEVER reposition the rear wheels to the forward position, stability of the wheelchair will decrease, and injury or damage may result.



Removing

- 1. Note mounting position of EXISTING rear wheel.




FIGURE 1 - INSTALLING THE AMPUTEE BRACKET

INSTALLING THE AMPUTEE BRACKET (FIGURE 1)

- Refer to the following chart or FIGURE 1 to determine the mounting position of the amputee bracket:
- 2. Install the amputee bracket on the wheelchair frame to the position determined in **STEP 1**.

NOTE: Make sure the axle spacer is pointing towards the outside of the wheelchair.

- 3. Install the two (2) hex screws and locknuts that secure the amputee bracket to the wheelchair.
- 4. Install the rear wheels onto the wheelchair. Refer to REMOVING/INSTALLING THE REAR WHEELS in PROCEDURE 9 of this manual.




FIGURE 2 - INSTALLING THE SEAT POSITIONING STRAP

INSTALLING THE SEAT POSITIONING STRAP (FIGURE 2)

WARNING

ALWAYS wear your SEAT POSITIONING STRAP. Inasmuch as the SEAT POSITIONING STRAP is an option on this wheelchair (You may order with or without the SEAT POSITIONING STRAP), Invacare strongly recommends ordering the SEAT POSITIONING STRAP as an additional safequard for the wheelchair user.

- Remove the rear seat upholstery screw from the wheelchair.
- 2. Position one seat positioning strap half between the seat rail and seat upholstery.
- Secure the seat upholstery and seat positioning strap to the wheelchair with the existing seat upholstery screw.
- 4. Repeat **STEPS 1-3** for the opposite side of the wheelchair.




FIGURE 3 - INSTALLING THE CRUTCH AND CANE CARRIER

INSTALLING THE CRUTCH AND CANE CARRIER (FIGURE 3)

Safety and Maintenance

- 1. Check base weekly to secure proper placement.
- 2. Securely fasten strap while carrying items.
- 3. Never insert or remove items while wheelchair is moving.
- 4. Base should be parallel to step tube to avoid bending spokes when folding the wheelchair.

The base cleans easily with any chrome or glass cleaner. The strap can be cleaned with mild soap and water.

Installing

- 1. Slide the clamp with the base attached over the end of the step tube of the wheelchair.
- Position the base parallel to the step tube.
- 3. Securely tighten the locknut that secures the base to the step tube of the wheelchair.
- 4. Remove the upper back upholstery screw and washer.
- 5. Align the strap with the back upholstery screw mounting hole.
- 6. Reinstall the back upholstery screw and washer and secure the strap to the wheelchair.

PROCEDURE 9 OPTIONS

INSTALLING THE TELESCOPING I.V. ROD


NOTE: Flip-back style arms will not flip back when used on the same side of the wheelchair as the telescoping I.V. rod.




FIGURE 1 - INSTALLING THE TELESCOPING I.V. ROD ON NON-TRANSPORT WHEELCHAIRS ONLY

Installing Ther telescoping I.V. Rod on Non-Transport Wheelchairs Only (FIGURE 1)

 Determine if the telescoping I.V. rod will be mounted on the right or left side of the wheelchair.

NOTE: The telescoping I.V. rod is factory set for installation onto either the right side of a wheelchair with back upholstery mounted to the front of the back canes OR the left side of a wheelchair with back upholstery mounted to the back of the back canes. Refer to REPOSITIONING THE UPPER ATTACHMENT in this instruction sheet if any other mounting position is desired.

- 2. Position the I.V. rod mounting bracket on the step tube on the side determined in STEP 1.
- 3. Loosely install the lug screw, spacer and locknut that secure the mounting bracket to the back cane.
- 4. Remove the top phillips screw and washer from the back upholstery.
- 5. Line up the mounting holes in the back cane, back upholstery and upper attachment.
- 6. Reinstall the washer and phillips screw and securely tighten.
- 7. Securely tighten all attaching hardware.
- Loosen the adjustment knob and position the I.V. rod to the desired height and securely tighten the adjustment knob.

OPTIONS PROCEDURE 9




FIGURE 3- REPOSITIONING THE UPPER MOUNT-ING BRACKET

Repositioning The Upper Attachment (FIGURE 3)

 With the Telescoping I.V. rod in the lowest position, align the hole of the outer tube with the phillips screw of the inner tube. Remove phillips screw and set aside.

2. Remove the inner tube from the outer tube.

NOTE: Take note of the position and orientation of the height adjustment assembly before removing. The height adjustment assembly must be positioned to face away from the wheelchair when installed.

- 3. Firmly grasp the height adjustment assembly and Pull to remove from the outer tube.
- 4. Slide the upper attachment UP off of the outer tube.
- 5. Rotate the upper attatchment 180° and reinstall onto the outer tube.
- 6. Reverse STEPS 1-4 to reassemble the telescoping I.V. rod.
