Should the fuse in the plug supplied need to be replaced, a 5 AMP fuse approved by ASTA or BSI to BS 1362, (I.e., marked with or wark) must be used.

If the plug supplied with this equipment has a detachable fuse cover, be sure to attach the fuse cover after you change the fuse. Never use the plug without the fuse cover. If you should lose the fuse cover, please contact your nearest Sony service station.

Precautions

The power requirements of this unit are indicated on the AC adaptor. Check that the unit's operating voltage is identical with your local power supply.

On safety

- Caution-The use of optical instruments with this product will increase eve hazard.
- To prevent fire or shock hazard, do not place objects filled with liquids, such as vases, on the apparatus.
- Should any solid object or liquid fall into the cabinet, unplug the player and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.
- Do not put any foreign objects in the DC IN 9.5V (external power input) jack.
- This car adaptor is not intended to be serviced. Should the product cease to function in its intended manner, it should be returned to the manufacturer or be discarded.
- Install this system so that the power cord can be unplugged from the wall socket immediately in the event of trouble.

On temperature increases

- Heat may build up while charging or during extended use.
 This is not a malfunction.
- If the surrounding temperature is very high, the protective function will turn off the player automatically.
 Leave the player in a cool location for about 30 minutes before using it again.

On power sources

 Use only the supplied AC adaptor. Do not use any other AC adaptor. It may cause a malfunction.



- If the AC adaptor causes interference to radio reception, move it away from the radio.
- Do not touch the AC adaptor with wet hands.
- Even when the player is turned off, it is still connected to the AC power source (mains) as long as it remains connected to the wall outlet
- If you are not going to use the player for a long time, be sure to disconnect the player from the wall outlet. To disconnect the AC power cord (mains), grasp the plug itself: never pull the cord.
- Should the AC power cord need to be changed, have it done at a qualified service shop only.
- When necessary, depending on the design of the wall outlet, you may use a commercially available AC plug adaptor.

CAUTION

Never expose the battery pack to temperatures above 140° F (60° C). Do not leave, for example, in a car parked in the sun or under direct sunlight.

On the rechargeable battery

- Charge the battery before you start using it.
- Do not allow dust to come into contact with the battery terminals of the player and battery.
- Do not short the terminals.
- Do not open the terminal covers of the player.
- Do not leave the battery in a place subject to direct sunlight, or in a car with its windows closed.
- Keep the battery dry.
- Use only the battery (NP-FX110) supplied with this player (DVP-FX810). The rechargeable batteries supplied with other models cannot be used with this player. Note that the battery may explode if incorrectly replaced.
- Do not disassemble.
- Do not incinerate.
- Dispose of used batteries promptly.

To dispose of the rechargeable battery

 Certain countries may regulate disposal of the battery used to power this product. Please consult with your local authorities.

To store the rechargeable battery

The battery is consumed gradually as time elapses even if is not used. In order to prevent the battery from deteriorating, store it as follows:

- Remove the battery from the player after use.
 (Even if the player is off, it still uses some power.)
- Use up the battery completely on the player before storing it.
- Keep the battery in a cool location to prevent it from deteriorating.
- Charge and use the battery at least once every 6 months.


On charging the rechargeable battery

- Heat may build up in the battery while charging. This is not a malfunction.
- When the battery life of a fully charged battery becomes about half the normal life, you may need to replace the battery with a new one.

On handling the player

- Keep the lens on the player clean and do not touch it.
 Touching the lens may damage the lens and cause the player to malfunction.
- Keep the player in a location with adequate ventilation to prevent heat build-up in the player.
- Do not put heavy objects on top of the player.
 Doing so may damage the player and the discs.
- Do not leave the player near heat sources, or in a place subject to direct sunlight, excessive dust or sand, moisture, rain, mechanical shock, on an uneven surface, or in a car with its windows closed.
- Do not wrap the player in a cloth or blanket during use.
 Doing so may cause malfunction or serious accidents.
- If the player causes interference to radio or television reception, turn off the player or move it away from the radio or television.
- Keep the player and discs away from equipment with strong magnets, such as microwave ovens, or large loudspeakers.
- Do not install this equipment in a confined space such as a bookshelf or similar unit.

• If the player is brought directly from a cold to a warm location, or is placed in a very damp place, moisture may condense on the lens of the player. Should this occur, the player may not operate properly. When this happens, remove the disc and leave the player for about half an hour until the moisture evaporates.



- Discs with non-standard shapes (e.g, heart, square, star) cannot be played on this player.
 Do not use such discs.
- Do not move, shake or otherwise allow any shock to the player while in operation. Doing so may cause a malfunction.
- Use this player in a stable, horizontal position where it is not subject to vibration.
- Do not touch the disc if it is still spinning when you open the lid.
- Before moving the player, remove the disc from it.

On handling the LCD screen

- Although the LCD screen is made with high-precision technology and has effective pixels of 99.99% or more, black dots may appear or bright points of light (red, blue, or green) may appear constantly on the LCD screen. This is a structural property of the LCD panel and is not a malfunction.
- Do not scratch the LCD or exert pressure on it.
 Doing so could cause a malfunction.
- Using the player in low temperature conditions may produce a residual image on the screen. This is not a malfunction. When the player returns to normal temperature, the screen will return to normal.
- A residual image may appear on the screen if the same image is displayed for a lengthy period of time.
 The residual image will disappear after a short time.
- If you are going to leave the player for a long time, turn off the power.
- The screen becomes warm during operation.
 This is normal and does not indicate a malfunction.

On headphones Preventing hearing damage

Avoid using headphones at high volumes. Hearing experts advise against continuous, loud, and extended play. If you experience a ringing in your ears, reduce the volume or discontinue use.

Showing consideration for others

Keep the volume at a moderate level. This will allow you to hear outside sounds and still be considerate to the people around you.

On adjusting the volume

Do not turn up the volume while listening to a section with very low level inputs or no audio signal. If you do, the speakers may be damaged when a peak-level section is played.

Road safety

Do not use the monitor unit and headphones while driving, cycling, or operating any motorized vehicle. Doing so may create a traffic hazard and is illegal in some areas. It can also be potentially dangerous to play your headsets at high volume while walking, especially at pedestrian crossings. You should exercise extreme caution or discontinue use in potentially hazardous situations.

 Do not install the monitor display where viewable by the driver.

On transportation

- To transport this player, use the original carton box and packing materials.
- Before you move this player, make sure to remove any discs from it.

On cleaning

Clean the cabinet, panel, and controls with a soft cloth slightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use any type of abrasive pad, scouring powder, or solvent such as alcohol or benzene.

On cleaning discs, disc/lens cleaners
Do not use a commercially available cleaning disc or
disc/lens cleaner (wet or spray type). These may cause

Disc related terms DVD VIDEO

A disc of animated or audio recordings with the same diameter (12 cm) as a CD/CD-ROM. Depending on the disc, turn on multiple audio languages and/or subtitles. There are many ways of enjoying this product. Video recording may not be performed on this disc.

DVD-RW/-R

This DVD-RW/-R disc can record a DVD VIDEO disc of the same size. In addition, DVD-RW can be rewritten.

On the DVD-RW/-R, there are two recording modes, video mode and VR mode.

Video mode is compatible with DVD VIDEO format.

Various editing or recording impossible with video mode are possible in VR (Video Recording) mode.

DVD+RW/+R

This DVD+RW/+R disc can record a DVD VIDEO disc of the same size. In addition, DVD+RW can be rewritten.

DVD+RW employs a recording method which can take on compatibility with DVD VIDEO format.

MP3

MP3 is an audio compression format with near CD quality.

JPEG

Joint Pictures Expert Group. JPEG is a type of still picture data compression format.

Notes on handling discs

How to handle discs

- Do not touch the playing surface when holding discs.
- Do not stick paper or tape on discs.
- Do not use any discs covered with scotch tape or CD rental labels, or glue-marks where these have been removed. If put in the DVD player, such discs may become stuck or cause a malfunction.





Storing discs

- Do not leave discs in places exposed to direct sunlight, high temperature, or high humidity.
- Please keep discs in their cases. Stacking uncased discs may cause them to bend or warp.

Cleaning discs

- Fingerprints or dust on a disc may cause the image or sound quality to deteriorate. Use only clean discs.
- For regular cleaning, wipe the disc with a soft cloth from the center out to its edge.



- If the disc is very dirty, lightly wet a cloth and wipe it, then take off moisture with a dry cloth.
- Do not use benzene, commercial record cleaning fluid, or anti-static spray, as these may harm the disc's protective coating.
- This player only takes conventional round music CD discs. Using non-round discs (i.e. novelty star or heart-shaped discs) may cause the player to malfunction.

Basic Usage Precautions

Positioning the Player

Do not set the player in the following types of places.

- Wobbly tables or other unstable surfaces
- On top of rugs or futons
- Damp or poorly ventilated places
- Dusty places
- Places in direct sunlight, or with high temperature
- Extremely cold places
- Close to tuners, televisions, or video players/decks
 (Using this player near audio/video tuners,
 televisions, or video players/decks may cause
 sound distortions or disruptions to image quality.
 Since such distortions or disruptions are more
 common with an indoor antenna, use of an outdoor
 antenna is recommended.)

About the LCD Display

- Although the LCD screen is manufactured with high-precision technology, black dots may sometimes appear, and red, blue, or green spots may remain on the screen. This is not a malfunction.
- Do not wipe the LCD screen with anything wet.
 Moisture getting into the screen may cause a malfunction.
- Do not drop or place objects on the LCD screen.
 Additionally, never rest your weight on the screen with elbows or any other body part.
- Carrying the player from cold to warm places, such as from the outdoors into a warm room, may cause condensation to form on the LCD screen. If condensation develops, wipe up all drops before using. Tissue paper or equivalent is recommended for wiping away drops of condensation. When the LCD screen has been in a cold place, even after wiping away drops of moisture, condensation may still occur. Therefore, please wait before until the LCD screen warms up to room temperature before using it.


Install this system so that the power cord can be unplugged from the wall socket immediately in the event of trouble.

Do not place the device anywhere it may get wet. Do not rest flower vases or any type of water container on it.


Rear Panel of the Player

 Be careful that no sand, dust or other objects get into the battery connection terminal (diagram A) and the battery guide slot (diagram B).



About the Battery Pack

- Do not short terminals ⊕ and ⊖ (diagram A) with metal objects (necklaces etc.).
- Be careful that no sand, dust or other objects get into the battery connection terminals ⊕ and ⊖ (diagram A) and the battery projecting guides (diagram B).
- Do not leave the player in an overheated vehicle, under the blazing sun, or in any place 60° Celsius or higher.
- Do not let the appliance get wet.



Using the AC adaptor

- Please use the AC adaptor that is included with the player.
 Using an adaptor not intended for the player may cause a malfunction.
- Do not connect any type of overseas traveling electrical transformer, as this may cause overheating or malfunction

When adjusting the sound volume

Compared with a record, there is extremely little background noise or static on a disc. Adjusting the sound by listening to a recording or portion thereof without any vocal component may result in unintentionally setting the volume loud, and may cause damage to the speakers. Before playing any music, make sure to always set the volume low.

Basic Usage Precautions (continued)

Cleaning the Player

- If the cabinet or panel screen becomes dirty, please use a soft cloth with mild detergent to wipe dirt away. Do not use thinner or benzene, as they may damage the display.
- Wipe the LCD screen lightly with a soft dry cloth. When you notice that the device has become dirty, make an effort to wipe all grime away.

Warning:

- Do not wipe the LCD screen with anything wet. Moisture getting into the screen may cause a malfunction.
- Do not use alcohol, thinners, or other volatile substances, as they may damage the display's finish. When using a pretreated dustcloth, please follow these written warnings.

Cleaning the Lens

When the image becomes distorted or CD begin to skip, filth or dust may have settled on the lens. When this happens, please clean the lens with a commercial camera lens "blower" brush. Take care not to make direct contact with the lens when cleaning.

Do not use a lens cleaning disc or disc cleaner (moistener or spray type) with this device, as this may cause a malfunction.




Caution about residual Images (Burn Outs on the Screen)

Do not leave the LCD, television, or any screen set to the player inactive for a long time while on the DVD menu, Title Menu, Set Up or similar screen. This may cause a residual image (burn out of the screen). Projection televisions are especially susceptible to residual images.




 By sliding the HOLD switch to the left, the hold function is enabled. It locks the buttons on the DVD player so that they will not work if accidentally touched.

Using the Remote Control

Putting Batteries in the Remote Control

Put **②** and **④** facing in the same direction, insert the two R6 batteries (AA, included).



- Using batteries incorrectly may result in leakage or bursting.
 MAKE CERTAIN TO FOLLOW THE NEXT STEP.
 - 1. Correctly insert and in the proper direction.
 - 2. Do not use a mix of old and used batteries or batteries of different types.
 - 3. Do not attempt to recharge normal batteries.
 - 4. When the remote control has not been used for some time, please change its batteries.
 - If there is any leakage of battery fluid, carefully wipe up any liquid from the battery compartment before putting in fresh batteries.
- When using the remote control, be careful that no direct sunlight or strong light from an illumination source hits the remote sensor. The remote control may not be able to function in some conditions.


About the LCD Panel

Rotation Mechanism of the LCD Panel

The LCD panel of this device can rotate a maximum of 180 degrees clockwise and still be used. After rotation of the LCD panel, it can be folded down on the main body of the player and still function

Rotation of the LCD Panel

- 1. Place the device on a table or other flat stable surface.
- 2. Push the LCD panel up with your thumbs until it is open to the vertical position. (Refer to Picture 1.)
- 3. Slowly rotate the LCD panel 180 degrees in the direction indicated by the arrow (clockwise). (Refer to Picture 2.)



Notes:

- If the LCD panel does not come fully open, please do not rotate it. The LCD panel may become damaged.
- DO NOT rotate the LCD panel over 180 degrees. In addition, DO NOT rotate in the opposite direction. Doing so will break the LCD panel.





Rotation and folding down of the LCD panel

After rotating the LCD panel 180 degrees clockwise push the LCD panel down onto the main body of the player. In this position the panel is facing up. (Refer to Picture 3.)

Returning the LCD panel to its original position

- 1. Open the LCD panel to the vertical position.
- Slowly rotate the LCD panel counter-clockwise until it clicks..


Note:

 Please return the LCD panel to its original position after use. The LCD screen can be damaged by sudden shocks or similar treatment.

Connecting the AC Adaptor

Please follow steps 1-3 below to connect the AC adaptor.

To disconnect, follow the steps in reverse order.



Note:

• Please turn off the player when unplugging the AC power cord. Unplugging the AC power cord while the player is in use may cause a malfunction.


Using with Batteries

When an outlet is not available, the player can be enjoyed with the battery pack installed (included).

• Please charge the battery pack before using it.

■ Installing the Battery Pack

- 1. Match the hooks of the battery pack into the holes on the bottom of the player.
- 2. Slide the battery pack in the direction of the arrow until it clicks into place.



Notes:

- Please turn the player off before installing the battery pack.
- Never touch the connecting points of the main body and the battery pack. Doing so may cause a malfunction.

■ Removing the Battery Pack

- 1. Slide the release knob.
- Slide the battery pack in the direction of the arrow until it clicks loose.




- Never remove the battery pack while the player is in use.
- Be careful not to drop the battery pack.

Using with Batteries (continued)

■ Charging the Battery Pack

- 1. Attach the battery pack.
- 2. Connect the AC adaptor, and then plug it into an AC outlet.



- 3. When charging begins, the indicator light turns on.
- 4. When charging ends, the indicator light turns off.
- After charging is finished, remove the AC adaptor and disconnect the electrical cord from the outlet.

■ Checking the Battery Reserve Level

When the player is stopped, the battery mark is displayed on the LCD screen. When [______] is displayed or the charge indicator flashes, please recharge the battery.

The battery mark is not displayed when a DVD or JPEG files are being played. Stop the player and check the battery reserve level.

 - •If the disc is inserted with label-side down, a "No Disc" or "Check Disc" message will be displayed.

 - •The player may start playing automatically by itself.
- After all titles have been played, the player will stop itself and the display will return to the menu screen.
- 7. Adjust sound volume.
 - •Adjust to the preferred sound level using the [VOLUME] knob on the right side of the player.

When the Menu Screen is Displayed DVD-V

- The size of the image displayed on the LCD screen can be adjusted by pressing the [LCD MODE] button.
- Since this player has been equipped with Viewer Restrictions (i.e. Parental Control), a password must be entered to play a viewer restricted disc.
 For further details, please refer to the parental control on pages 45-46.
- DVD discs are equipped with region codes.
 This player can paly discs with "2" or "ALL" region code.

■ Changing Picture Size

Use the [LCD MODE] button to change the picture size.

After pressing the [LCD MODE] button, choose "LCD Aspect" and press [ENTER]. Picture size can be selected from different options for each of the discs below.

Notes:

- When playing a DVD disc, selectable picture size differs according to the disc being played.
- When playing a DVD disc recorded in widescreen "16:9" mode, "Normal" cannot be selected.

■ Restarting When the Screen is Set to [Off]

When the screen is set to [Off], press [ENTER] or the [LCD MODE] button to turn it on.

- The LCD screen turns off automatically when the LCD panel is closed.
- When in "Line In" mode, by pressing the [LCD MODE] button "Normal" or "Full" can be selected.

Adjusting the LCD Screen

Press the [LCD MODE] button to display the menu.



1. Adjusting Backlight

Select "Backlight" and press ←/→ to adjust the brightness.

2. Adjusting Contrast

Select "Contrast" and press ←/→ to adjust the difference between light and dark areas.

3. Adjusting the Hue

By pressing "Default", all settings return to the preset factory values.

Stopping Playback DVD-V DVD-RW

When a disc is playing, press [STOP].

Notes:

- Do not touch discs that are still spinning when you open the lid.
- Take out discs after they have stopped spinning.

Resuming Playback

If "Resume" is displayed on the LCD screen after a disc stops playback, then the player has recorded the point where playback was stopped. Pressing [PLAY] again will cause the disc to resume playback from that point. As long as the disc lid is not opened, even if the power is turned off, the player will resume playback from the point it was stopped.

Notes:

- If the power is turned off in resume mode and turned on again, the player will automatically resume playing from the point where it was stopped.
- To turn off the resume function:
 Press the [STOP] button again when the player is stopped.
 When the power is turned on, open the disc lid.

- Pressing the ← or → button on the player main body will have the same result as [SCAN/SLOW] ← or → button on the remote control.
- To exit from Search Mode, press the button shown below. Remote Control: [PLAY]
 Player Main Body: [PLAY] or [ENTER]

- There is no sound being played when in Search Mode.
- Search speed differs with different disc being played.

Slow Play DVD-RW

- Press [PAUSE] [II] while a disc is playing.
 The playback will pause.
- 2. The desired speed can be selected by pressing [SCAN/SLOW] ◄ or ▶ .



3. To exit from Slow Play Mode, press [PLAY].

Screen Saver

The screen saver is displayed after the player is in Stop Mode for 15 minutes.

Once the screen saver has been displayed for 15 minutes, the power be automatically turned off.

Playing Discs Recorded in VR Mode OVD-RW

- -Playing discs (DVD-RW/DVD-R) recorded in VR Mode
- If a playlist is recorded on a disc set by this player, the disc will start by displaying the playlist.

- If no playlist is recorded on a disc, the disc will start by displaying the original menu.
- Press [TOP MENU] once when the disc is stopped to display the current mode. To switch between the playlist and original list press [TOP MENU] repeatedly when the disc is stopped.
- During playback, press [DISPLAY] button to know the current mode. On the Display screen under "Title" either Playlist (PL) or Original(ORG) will be shown.

- Switching between Playlist and Original Menu is impossible when the player is in Resume Mode (page 26). Pressing [STOP] button twice and then [TOP MENU] repeatedly will make it possible to switch between Playlist and Original Menu.
- When a disc recorded without a playlist is stopped, pressing [TOP MENU] will cause the prohibit mark to be displayed.
- DVD-RW/DVD-R recorded on other DVD recorders (in VR Mode) must be finalized to play.
 Non-finalized DVD-RW/DVD-R (in VR mode) cannot be
 - Non-finalized DVD-RW /DVD-R (in VR mode) cannot be played.
- For more about finalized discs, please refer to the manual of the recorder used for recording.
- In case of DVD-RW/DVD-R(VR Mode), depending on the contents of the discs, there may be a time lag between setting the disc in the player and start of playback.

DISPLAY Screen

The current play settings can be displayed on the LCD screen. The remote control may be used to change some items.

How To Use the DISPLAY Screen:

- 1. When play a DVD disc, press [DISPLAY] button on main body or press [DISPLAY] on the remote control.
- Press [↑/↓] to select an option.
 Selected items will become highlighted.

- Items in the DISPLAY can be changed during Play mode.
 However, the items that can be modified depend on the disc.
- To exit from the DISPLAY screen, press [DISPLAY] or [RETURN].
- Please use the remote control number buttons to change the Title, Chapter, T. Time, C. Time, and Angle options.
- The default setting for Time Display is "Title Elapsed".
 After selecting the other option of Time Display and exiting from the DISPLAY screen, the "Title Elapsed" still appears when the DISPLAY screen is re-entered.

General Features

Top Menu DVD-V

A DVD may contain several recorded images or songs. In this manual, these images or songs are referred to as "titles". When playing a DVD with several titles, please select the preferred title or titles from the Top Menu.

To use the Top Menu, press [TOP MENU] button, and enter the appropriate number with the number buttons of the remote control, or else use $\checkmark/ \uparrow / \checkmark/ \Rightarrow$ button to select the desired title, then press [ENTER].

Menu DVD-V

DVD disc contents can be selected using this menu. When playing this type of DVD, please select the desired item, subtitle language, or audio track language from the menu. To use the menu, press the [MENU] button, and enter the appropriate number with the number buttons of the remote control, or else use \checkmark / \uparrow / \checkmark / \rightarrow button to select the desired item, then press [ENTER].

Moving to Another Title DVD-V DVD-RW

When a disc contains multiple titles, you can move to another title.

- 1. Press [DISPLAY] while a disc is playing.
- 2. Press [♠ /♦] to select an item, press [ENTER] to confirm.
- 3. Enter the title number by pressing the number buttons.

Moving to Another Chapter DVD-W DVD-RW

When a title has multiple chapters, you can move to another chapter.

- 1. Press [DISPLAY] while a disc is playing.
- Press [↑ / ↓] to select chapter item and press [ENTER] to confirm.
- 3. Enter the title number by pressing the number buttons.
- Press [PREV I
] or [NEXT ►►I] button while a disc is
 playing to return to the start of the current chapter or
 move on to the next one.
- To return to the previous chapter, press [PREV ◄] twice.

- While playing a DVD, press the remote control number buttons to display the "Direct Search Window".
- Enter the desired chapter number with the number buttons, then press [ENTER] to confirm.

Time Search DVD-V

The display screen can be used to start play at a desired time.

- 1. Press [DISPLAY] while a disc is playing.
- Press [↑/↓] to select the title time option or the chapter time option; press [ENTER] to confirm. 「0:00:00」 will appear on the screen.
- Use the number buttons to enter the necessary start time from left to right, starting with hours, minutes, then seconds.

- Press [↑/♥] to select subtitle option, then press [ENTER] to confirm.
- Repeatedly press [↑/↓] until the desired subtitle has been chosen. And then press [ENTER].

Camera Angle OVD-V

When playing a DVD disc recorded with multiple camera angles, these camera angles can be switched as the disc plays.

Press [★] to reverse the image horizontally (left and right), or press [♠] to reverse image vertically (up and down). To rotate the image 90 degrees counter clockwise or clockwise, press [♠] or [♠].

Playing a VCD video

Video CD with PBC function VCD

PBC (Playback Control) function makes it possible to play Video CDs interactively according to the menu on the LCD screen.

- The Menu appears immediately when a Video CD with the PBC function starts playing.
- 2. Press the number buttons to select the desired item.
- Perform interactive operations according to the instructions provided in the menu.

Notes:

- Press [RETURN/TOP MENU/MENU] to return to the initial display of the menu.(if PBC is on).
- Press [DISPLAY] during VCD playback. Track number/Track total number, Track elapsed time will display on the screen from left to right.
- Press [AUDIO] repeatedly during VCD playback to switch among stereo, left or right in order.
- Operation varies for different Video CD.
 For further information, refer to the instructions provided with your Video CD disc.
- If no operations are executed within 10 seconds after the PBC menu is displayed, the unit will start playing from the beginning of the first track.

This option may not be available on all VCD. If you want to skip the index menu and playback directly from the beginning, go to SET UP Menu and General setup item to switch PBC Off. (Refer 43 page)

 The Repeat and Random functions are allowed only when PBC is Off.

Playing a DivX video

DivX® is a video file compression technology developed by DivXNetworks, Inc. This device is an official DivX® Certified product.

You can play DivX video files on DATA CD (CD-ROM/CD-R/CD-RW) and DATA DVD (DVD+RW/DVD+R/DVD-RW/DVD-R).

- Insert a DivX video file disc, the file menu appears on the screen.
- Press [PREV / NEXT] to go to the previous or next page of the list.
- Press [↑/ ▼] to select a folder. And press [ENTER] to see the folder contents.
- If you want to play a particular file, press [↑/ ↑] to select a file, and press [ENTER] to play or enter. Playback starts.
- Press [PREV / NEXT] to go to the previous or next file.
- Press [SCAN / SLOW] repeatedly to select the required speed for the search mode during playback.
- Press [SCAN / SLOW] repeatedly in pause mode to select the required slow motion speed.
- To return to the previous file list while playing a DivX video file, press [STOP].

Note:

• The slow reverse function is prohibited.

DivX video file Disc Features

Display DivX

If you press [DISPLAY] during DivX video playback, the following will appear on the LCD screen in this order: Title Elapsed, Title Remain, Display Off, Subtitle.

Audio DivX

Press [AUDIO] repeatedly during playback to change to a different audio stream. The operation works only with discs on which multiple audio soundtracks are recorded.

Subtitle DivX

Press [DISPLAY] to display subtitle information on the top right corner of the screen.

Press [↑/ ↓] to move the highlight and then press [ENTER]. When files without subtitles are played, "Off" displays on the top right corner of the screen after pressing [DISPLAY].

Playing a DivX video (continued)

To rent (purchase) DivX ® VOD files

DivX VOD files are downloaded from certain commercial websites after paying a rental fee. Prior to downloading a VOD you need to input the registration number of your DVD player on the purchase form on the site.

Follow the instructions below to find the registration number of your player: insert a disc and select the option DivX from the General Setup menu. Write down the VOD 8-character registration number so that you can fill in the form on the website you purchase your DivX VOD files from.

Note:

If you cannot play a DivX VOD file recorded on a disc after downloading it, it is possible that the recorded file is not compatible with your player because of different versions or incorrect download parameters. The parameters used when copying to disc may be another reason for this. Since it is not possible here to supply all the information, parameters and advice relating to the issue of DivX VOD files, we recommend that you visit specialist websites such as www.divx.com/vod.

DivX Video Disc compatibility with this player is limited as follow:

- The player can play data that is recorded in DivX format, and which has the extension ".avi" or ".divx". The player will not play files with the extension ".avi" or ".divx" if they do not contain a DivX video
- This player only plays DATA CD whose logical format is ISO 9660 Joliet, and DATA DVD of Universal Disc Format (UDF).

Refer to the instructions supplied with the disc drives and the recording software (not included) for details on the recording format.

- Note that the playback order may not be applicable, depending on the software used for creating the DivX video file, or if there are more than 299 folders and 648 DivX video files in each folder.
- The player may not be able to play some DATA CD/DATA DVD created in the Packet Write format.
- Discs recorded in multiple sessions may not play properly on this device.
- Maximum filename length is 14 characters.

Playing a DivX video (continued)

- Depending on the DivX video file, the picture may pause or be unclear. In which case, it is recommended that you create the file at a lower bit rate. If the sound is still noisy, MP3 is the recommended audio format. Note, however, that this player does not conform to WMA (Windows Media Audio) format.
- Because of the compression technology used for DivX video files, it may take some time after you press [PLAY] for the picture to appear.
- Depending on the DivX video file, the sound may not match the pictures on the screen.
- The player may not be able to play a DivX video file that has been combined from two or more DivX video files.
- Depending on the DivX video file, the sound may skip.
- The player cannot play a DivX video file of size more than 720 (width) x 576 (height)/2 GB.
- The player cannot play some DivX video files that are longer than 3 hours.
- This unit does not support DTS sound system. If you select DTS sound, there will be no sound output.
- When the selected file is not supported (Codec/Sound system), "Data Error (DivX)" displays on the LCD screen and the file will not be played.

Set Up Menu

By using the SET UP Menu, image and sound can be adjusted in various ways. Additionally, subtitles and languages can also be set. For further details on individual options in the SET UP Menu, please refer to pages 43-46.

Displaying and Exiting from SET UP Menu

To display the SET UP Screen, press [SET UP] button. Press [SET UP] button the second time to exit from SET UP Menu.

Basic Operations

- 1. Press [SET UP]. The SET UP Menu will appear.
- 2. Use [←]/[→] to select the desired options. Press [★] to proceed to the next menu level. The current option setting and possible settings will be displayed on the screen.
- 3. Use [♠1/[♦1 to select the desired secondary option. press [→] to move to the third menu level, or press [←] to return to the initial menu level.
- 4. Use [♠]/[♦] to select the desired setting, press [ENTER] to confirm your choice. There may be additional steps to access certain menu items.

General Settings



TV Display DVD-V DVD-RW

Select the screen that corresponds to the TV connected to the player. Displayable screen size differs with each DVD video. Therefore, the DVD video play image may not be compatible with the selected image size.

Default image size value is 16:9.

4:3 PS (Pan Scan):

Select the standard 4:3 TV image size. If the entire screen is used it automatically becomes a widescreen display, and segments that cannot fit onto the screen will be cut off.

4:3 LB (Letter Box):

Select the standard 4:3 TV image size. The widescreen displays a horizontal border on its top and bottom.

16:9:

Select this when connected to a 16:9 widescreen television.

Angle Mark DVD-V

When playing a DVD disc recorded with camera angles, the angle marks (On) or (Off) are set to appear on the LCD screen when angle changes are possible. The default setting is On.

Screen Saver

When the set to (On), the screen will enter Screensaver Mode after it has been stopped for 15 minutes. The default setting is On.

PBC VCD

The Playback Control function offers scenes and information which can be selected interactively via a menu.

PBC resetting between "On" and "Off" works after lid is opened.

The default setting for the PBC is On.



DRC (Dynamic Range Control) DVD-V

To adjust for loud noises recorded on a DVD, reduce the volume to a moderate level.

This only has effect when playing DVD with a DRC function.

Selects the language displayed on the screen. The default setting is English.



Password

A password can be entered or changed. The password default setting is "136900".

- Select "Password" from Parental, if "Change" is chosen press [ENTER].
- To change your password, enter your current 6-digit password in the "Old Password" box, and your new password in the "New Password" box. Enter your new password once again in the "Verify Password" box, then press [ENTER] to confirm.

If you forget your password, follow the steps below to erase it.

Parental DVD-V

Some DVD videos can limit viewing based on set levels (i.e. the age of viewers).

When the parental control function is enabled, a password is required to play discs under the set level.

- Select "Parental" on the Parental Control page and press [ENTER].
- 2. To modify the Parental Control level, the selected password must be entered.

If a password is not set, Parental Controls cannot be set, therefore first set the password.







Using this Player with a Car Adaptor

Use the accessory cord included (DCC-FX110) to supply power from the cigarette lighter to this player. The adaptor is made for a 12 V car battery. Please do not use it with a 24 V car battery.

Connect the Car Adaptor included (DCC-FX110) into the cigarette lighter



Notes:

- Arrange the cord so as not to interfere with the driver.
- If using this device with a car adaptor, when finished using always turn the player off by its own power switch.
 Turning off the car engine with the player's power on stops the supply of electricity to the device and may damage it.
- Do not place the monitor where the driver can watch it.
- If image quality deteriorates, please disconnect the car adaptor from the main device.
