Tools needed for assembly: Phillips Screwdriver, Slotted Screwdriver, Hammer, Safety Scissors.

Three size LR6 "AA" alkaline batteries (not included) needed for sound box.

Use only with Power Wheels® Type H 6 Volt Batteries, Power Wheels® 30 Amp Fuses and Power Wheels® Type H 12 Volt Charger (all included).

Throughout this manual you will find important messages in the form of **WARNINGS**, **CAUTIONS**, and **NOTES**.

 **WARNING**

WARNING – SIGNALS SOMETHING THAT COULD HURT YOUR CHILD OR YOU.

The message explains the hazard and how you can avoid it.

 **WARNING**

- Children can be harmed by small parts, sharp edges and sharp points in the vehicle's unassembled state, or by electrical items. Care should be taken in unpacking and assembly of the vehicle. Children should not handle parts, batteries or help in assembly of the vehicle.
- Keep small parts and plastic bags out of children's reach. Dispose of plastic bags properly.
- Adult supervision is required. Children do not have the judgement necessary to avoid many accidents. Be sure that children operating this vehicle can do so safely and that they are supervised at all times.
- Improper use of this vehicle could lead to a serious or fatal accident. Allow children to play with **Monster Sound BIGFOOT**® only when you have determined that they can do so safely. Follow all instructions to help your child enjoy this vehicle as safely as possible.
- Never use near steps, driveways, steep inclines, roadways, alleys, swimming pool areas or other bodies of water.
- Always wear shoes or sneakers when operating or riding in this vehicle.
- Never allow more than one rider.
- The rider should sit on the seat when the vehicle is in operation.
- **Hot** motor covers. Handle carefully.
- Never alter this vehicle or its electrical system in any way. Alterations could cause a fire resulting in injury and could also ruin the electrical system.
- Use of the wrong type 6 volt battery, fuse or charger could cause a fire or explosion, resulting in serious injury.
- Never add unauthorized parts to the vehicle or use substitute parts. Use only specified Power Wheels® replacement parts.
- The 6 volt batteries must be handled by adults only.
- Never lift or carry the 6 volt batteries by the wires or connectors. This can damage the 6 volt batteries and possibly cause a fire resulting in injury. Lift and carry the 6 volt batteries by the cases only.
- Never permit a child to handle the 6 volt batteries. The 6 volt batteries are heavy and contain sulfuric acid (electrolyte), and if dropped could result in serious injury. Read the cautions on the back panel of the 6 volt batteries.
- Never allow children to charge the 6 volt batteries. Battery charging must be done by adults only. A child could be injured by the electricity involved in charging the 6 volt batteries.
- Examine the 6 volt batteries, charger and their connectors for excessive wear or damage each time you charge the 6 volt batteries. If damage or excessive wear is detected, do not use the vehicle until you have replaced the worn or damaged part as it could possibly cause a fire resulting in injury.

 **CAUTION**

- Do not operate your vehicle for the first time until you have inserted the 30 amp fuses into the 6 volt batteries and charged the 6 volt batteries for at least 18 hours. Never charge the 6 volt batteries longer than 30 hours.
- After first-time use, charge the 6 volt batteries for at least 14 hours after each use. You do not have to let the 6 volt batteries run down completely before recharging. Never charge the 6 volt batteries longer than 30 hours.
- Use the charger indoors only.
- Read and follow the Battery Care instructions on page 30. Failure to follow the Battery Care instructions may permanently damage your 6 volt batteries and will void your warranty.
- When you purchase replacement 6 volt batteries, you should buy a set. Using an older 6 volt battery with a new 6 volt battery may cause permanent damage to both 6 volt batteries.
- To avoid damaging motors and gears, do not overload the vehicle.
 - Never allow more than one child in the vehicle at one time.
 - Do not exceed the maximum weight capacity of 65 lbs.
 - Do not tow anything behind **Monster Sound BIGFOOT®**. The extra weight may overload the vehicle.
- Avoid operating the vehicle in wet or snowy conditions, and do not spray the vehicle with a hose. Do not wash the vehicle with soap and water. Water or moisture in the motors or electrical switches can cause them to corrode, and could cause switch failure.
- Avoid operating the vehicle on sand, loose dirt or gravel. Sand, loose dirt and gravel in the electrical switches or motors can cause them to jam, and could cause switch failure. Use **Monster Sound BIGFOOT®** on grass, asphalt or other hard surfaces.


- Carefully read this manual for important safety information and operating instructions before using your vehicle.
- Please complete and return the enclosed Registration Card, or call 1-800-348-0751 to register your vehicle by phone.
- **Monster Sound BIGFOOT®** is designed for use by children 3-7 years.
- Adult assembly is required.
- **Monster Sound BIGFOOT®** has an adjustable play seat belt. Please note that the adjustable seat belt is designed to be a play feature only and does not function as a protective safety restraint.
- This vehicle uses two Power Wheels® Type H 6 volt batteries with Power Wheels® 30 amp fuses and a Power Wheels® Type H 12 volt charger (120 VAC 60 HZ 28W with an output of 12 VDC 1200 mA). **Do not** substitute any other batteries, fuses or charger.
- **Before first-time use, charge the 6 volt batteries for at least 18 hours. Never charge the 6 volt batteries longer than 30 hours.**
- After the first charge, charge the 6 volt batteries a minimum of 14 hours after each use. Never charge the 6 volt batteries longer than 30 hours.
- Do not run down the 6 volt batteries completely before charging.
- Leaving the 6 volt batteries in a discharged condition will ruin them.
- Charge the 6 volt batteries before storing your vehicle.
- Charge the 6 volt batteries at least once per month, even if the vehicle has not been used.
- Do not store the 6 volt batteries in temperatures above 75° F or below -10° F.
- Even with proper care, the 6 volt batteries will not last forever. The life of the 6 volt batteries depends on how well you follow the Battery Care instructions and the total number of hours the 6 volt batteries are used. Please refer to the Battery Handling/Care/Disposal instructions on page 30 for detailed information about battery care.
- When you purchase replacement Power Wheels® Type H 6 volt batteries, you should buy them as a set. Using an older 6 volt battery with a new 6 volt battery may result in poor performance and may cause permanent damage to both 6 volt batteries. Remember to charge new 6 volt batteries for at least 18 hours before first use.
- To purchase Power Wheels® Type H 6 volt batteries, Power Wheels® 30 amp fuses or a Power Wheels® Type H 12 volt charger, please contact:
 - the store where your vehicle was purchased.
 - an Authorized Service Center (see Authorized Service Center list beginning on page 40).
 - Power Wheels® Consumer Affairs at **1-800-348-0751**.
- While the 6 volt batteries are charging, the charger may become warm to the touch. This is a normal condition and does not indicate a problem.
- **Monster Sound BIGFOOT®** is suitable for use on grass, asphalt or other hard surfaces. To prevent damage to the motors and switches, do not operate the vehicle on loose dirt, gravel or sand.
- To prevent damage to electrical components, store **Monster Sound BIGFOOT®** inside or under a protective cover during snowy or rainy weather. Do not leave **Monster Sound BIGFOOT®** out in the rain or let your child wash it with soap and water.
- **Monster Sound BIGFOOT®** has a special circuit-breaker in the wiring to protect the motors and electrical system. If the vehicle is put under extreme load (driving on rough surfaces, too much weight, climbing too steep of an incline), the circuit-breaker will shut the electrical system down for up to 20 seconds. If the system repeatedly shuts down, the driving conditions may be too demanding (ie: too steep or too much weight).
- Metal parts have been coated with a lubricant to protect them during shipment. Wipe all metal parts with a paper towel to remove any excess lubricant.

First-Time 6 Volt Battery Charging

We recommend that you start charging your 6 volt batteries before beginning assembly of your vehicle. **Your new 6 volt batteries must be charged for at least 18 hours before you use your vehicle for the first time.**




- Use of the wrong type 6 volt battery, fuse or charger could cause a fire or explosion, resulting in serious injury.
- Never permit a child to handle batteries. The 6 volt batteries are heavy and contain sulfuric acid (electrolyte), and if dropped could result in a serious injury. Read the cautions on the back panels of the batteries.
- Never lift or carry the 6 volt batteries by the wires or connectors. This can damage the 6 volt batteries and possibly cause a fire. Lift and carry the 6 volt batteries by the cases only.
- Examine the 6 volt batteries, charger and their connectors for excessive wear or damage each time you charge the 6 volt batteries. If damage or excessive wear is detected, do not use the charger or the vehicle until you have replaced the worn or damaged part.



- Insert a 30 amp fuse into each 6 volt battery.


Note: The top of the fuse will not be flush with the top of the 6 volt battery when properly installed.

- Stack one battery connector on top of the other and snap them together.

- Squeeze the Lock-In™ connector tabs on the charger connector and plug it into the battery connector.

- Plug the charger into a standard 120 volt wall outlet.

Note: If power flow to the wall outlet is controlled by a switch, make sure the switch is "ON".


- Before first time use, charge the 6 volt batteries for **at least 18 hours**. Never charge the 6 volt batteries longer than 30 hours.

Note: The 6 volt batteries must be upright while charging.



Do Not Omit Any Steps. Please set aside at least 45 minutes for assembly.

- Locate the sound box battery compartment.
- Loosen the screw in the battery compartment door with a Phillips screwdriver. The screw will remain in the door.
- Lift the battery compartment door open.
- Insert three size LR6 "AA" alkaline batteries into the battery compartment as indicated on the battery compartment door.
- Close the battery compartment door.
- Tighten the screw with a Phillips screwdriver. Do not over-tighten.



- Place the sound box into the dash pocket in the vehicle body, speaker side down.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not mix different types of batteries: alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium).
- Remove batteries during long periods of non-use. Always remove exhausted batteries from the product. Battery leakage and corrosion can damage the product.
- Never short circuit the battery terminals.
- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.
- Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended in the battery installation instructions are to be used.
- If removeable rechargeable batteries are used, they are only to be charged under adult supervision.
- Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the product before they are charged.
- Battery chargers used with the product must be examined regularly for damage to the cord, plug enclosure and other parts. In the event that such damage is found, the product must not be used with the battery charger until the damage has been repaired.



- Fit the knob into the hole in the right side of the sound box cover.
- Fit the key into the hole to the left of the knob.
- Insert a #6 x $\frac{3}{8}$ " screw into the back of the knob and into the back of the key.
- Tighten the screws with a Phillips screwdriver. Do not over-tighten.




- Insert the tabs on the sound box cover into the slots in the dash near the sound box.

- Tighten the screws with a Phillips screwdriver. Do not over-tighten.


- Bend the end of the microphone cord so that it forms a "T".
- Insert the end of the microphone cord through the hole in the right side of the dash.
- Gently pull on the microphone cord to make sure it is secure in the dash.
- Fit the tab on the back of the microphone into the slot in the dash to secure the microphone.

Helpful Hint: You may want the help of another person to complete assembly steps 6 through 9.

- Wipe the steering column with a paper towel to remove any excess lubricant.
- Carefully lift the front end of the vehicle.
- Insert the straight end of the steering column **under** the front axle, through the slot in the vehicle body and out through the large hole in the center of the dash.



Please Note: The seat can be assembled in either of two positions for your child's comfort.

- Push down on the center of the seat and slide it toward the rear of the vehicle.
- Align the screw holes in the back of the seat with the first or second set of holes in the vehicle body.
- Check your child's fit in the vehicle by observing foot to pedal distance and adjust the position of the seat, if necessary.
- Insert two #8 x 1" screws through the holes in the back of the seat and into the holes in the vehicle body, as shown.
- Insert two screws through the holes in the armrests and into the vehicle body, as shown.
- Tighten the screws with a Phillips screwdriver. Do not over-tighten.



- Using safety scissors, remove the sport bar feet from the plastic connector. Dispose of the plastic connector.
- Insert the peg on a sport bar foot into the hole closest to the back of the seat in one side of the vehicle body.
- Align the hole in the sport bar foot with the hole in the vehicle body. Make sure the large hole in the center of the sport bar foot faces toward the front of the vehicle.
- Insert a #8 x 1" screw through the hole in the sport bar foot and into the vehicle body.
- Tighten the screw with a Phillips screwdriver. Do not over-tighten.
- Repeat this procedure to assemble the remaining sport bar foot to the other side of the vehicle body.






- With the light plate at an angle, fit the notches in the light plate around the top tabs on the inside of a light housing.
- Lower the light plate into the housing so that it lays flat.
- Insert a #6 x 1/2" screw into the light plate as shown.
- Tighten the screw with a Phillips screwdriver. Do not over-tighten.
- Repeat this procedure to assemble the other light housing.



- Apply a label to the center of each of the light plates, as shown.
- Align the cut-outs in the labels with the slots in the light plates, so that the labels do not cover the slots.
- Make sure the areas where the labels will be applied are clean and dry. For best adhesion, avoid applying the labels more than once.
- Set the light housing assemblies aside.


- Fit the wide notch in the side of a lens under the wide tab on a lens guard.
- Press firmly on the inside of the lens to snap it into the lens guard.
- Repeat this procedure to assemble the other lens to the remaining lens guard.

- Press firmly to snap the lens assembly into the light housing assembly.



- Tighten the screws with a Phillips screwdriver. Do not over-tighten.



Please Note: For your convenience, the air scoop has been pre-assembled. If the air scoop has separated into two pieces during shipment, snap the "C" clips on the top half of the air scoop onto the hinge bar on the bottom half of the air scoop. Then, snap the front tab on the top half into the slot in the bottom half.

- Align the tab on the back of the air scoop with the notch in the hood opening and fit the air scoop into the center of the hood.
- Press firmly to snap the air scoop into the hood.

Proper label application will help to keep the labels looking their best!

- Wash your hands before applying the labels.




6 Volt Battery Installation

Please Note: It is easier to install the Type H 6 volt batteries before assembling the hood to your vehicle. If you have already assembled the hood to your vehicle, you may want to remove it to install the Type H 6 volt batteries.

- The battery compartment is located under the hood of your vehicle.
- Place both Power Wheels® Type H 6 volt batteries upright in the battery compartment. Make sure the bottoms of the 6 volt batteries are flat on the bottom of the battery compartment and that the battery connectors extend toward the rear of the vehicle.
- Make sure a Power Wheels® 30 amp fuse in good condition is installed in each of the 6 volt batteries and that the battery connectors are snapped together.






- Re-assemble the hood to the vehicle if you have removed it to install your Power Wheels Type H 6 volt batteries.

Charging the 6 Volt Batteries

WARNING

- Batteries must be handled by adults only.
- Never allow children to charge the 6 volt batteries. Battery charging must be done by adults only. A child could be injured by the electricity involved in charging batteries.
- Use of the wrong type of battery, fuse or charger could cause a fire or explosion, resulting in serious injury.
- Never permit a child to handle batteries. The 6 volt batteries are heavy and contain sulfuric acid (electrolyte), and if dropped could result in serious injury. Read the cautions on the back panels of the 6 volt batteries.
- Never lift or carry the 6 volt batteries by the wires or connectors. This can damage the 6 volt batteries and possibly cause a fire. Lift and carry the 6 volt batteries by the cases only.
- Examine the 6 volt batteries, charger and their connectors for excessive wear or damage each time you charge the 6 volt batteries. If damage or excessive wear is detected, do not use the vehicle until you have replaced the worn or damaged parts, as it could possibly cause a fire resulting in injury.
- Never alter this vehicle or its electrical system in any way. Alterations could cause a fire resulting in injury and could also ruin the electrical system.





- Rotate the lock fasteners in the hood counter-clockwise 90° (1/4 turn) using a slotted screwdriver to unlock the hood (⊖).
- Lift the hood to access the 6 volt batteries.
- Use pliers to remove the fuses from the 6 volt batteries.
- Look at each fuse to make sure it is not blown. If a fuse has blown, replace it with a new Power Wheels® 30 amp fuse.
- Re-insert the fuses into the 6 volt batteries before charging. The 6 volt batteries will not charge if a 30 amp fuse in good condition is not inserted into each 6 volt battery.




- Squeeze the tabs on the motor harness connector to unplug it from the battery connector.

- Squeeze the tabs on the charger connector to plug it into the battery connector ①.
 - Plug the charger into a standard 120 volt wall outlet ②.
- Note:** If power to the outlet is controlled by a wall switch, make sure the switch is "ON".
- Charge the 6 volt batteries a minimum of 14 hours after each use. Never charge the 6 volt batteries longer than 30 hours. Overcharging or undercharging the 6 volt batteries may shorten battery life and decrease vehicle running time.
 - Once the 6 volt batteries are charged, reconnect the battery connector and motor harness connector and lower the hood.
- Note:** Remember to lock the lock fasteners to prevent children from accessing the 6 volt batteries.

Handling

If a battery leak develops:

- Avoid contact with the leaking acid.
- Place the damaged battery in a plastic bag. See information below for proper disposal.

If acid comes in contact with skin or eyes:

- Flush with cool water for at least 15 minutes.
- Call a physician.

If acid is internally ingested:

- Give water, milk of magnesia or egg whites immediately.
- Never give emetics or induce vomiting.
- Call a physician.

Disposal

- The 6 volt sealed lead-acid batteries must be collected, recycled or disposed of in an environmentally sound manner.
- Do not dispose of lead-acid batteries in your regular, household trash. The incineration, landfilling or mixing of sealed lead-acid batteries with household trash is prohibited by law in most areas.
- Return the lead-acid batteries to a federal or state approved lead-acid battery recycler, such as a Power Wheels® Authorized Service Center or a local seller of automotive batteries. In Minnesota, call 1-800-348-0751 if further disposal information is required. Contact your local waste management officials for other information regarding the environmentally sound collection, recycling and disposal of lead-acid batteries.

Care

- Charge new 6 volt batteries for at least 18 hours before first use. Never charge the 6 volt batteries longer than 30 hours. Overcharging or undercharging the 6 volt batteries may shorten battery life and decrease vehicle running time.
- After the first charge, charge the 6 volt batteries for at least 14 hours after each use. Never charge the 6 volt batteries longer than 30 hours.
- Charge the 6 volt batteries after each use, regardless of how long the vehicle was used.
- The 6 volt batteries must be upright while charging.
- Do not allow the 6 volt batteries to run down completely before charging.
- Charge the 6 volt batteries before storing the vehicle.
- Charge the 6 volt batteries at least once per month, even if the vehicle has not been used.
- Leaving the 6 volt batteries in a discharged condition will ruin them.
- Do not store the 6 volt batteries in temperatures above 75° F or below -10° F.
- Prevent the 6 volt batteries from moving freely inside the battery compartment. Always use the battery retainer to secure the 6 volt batteries in the battery compartment.
- Examine the 6 volt batteries, charger and their connectors for excessive wear or damage each time you charge the 6 volt batteries. If damage is detected, do not use the charger or the 6 volt batteries until you have replaced the worn or damaged part.
- Attempting to charge the 6 volt batteries without fuses or with blown fuses will not damage the 6 volt batteries, but they will not charge. Check the fuses to make sure they are in good condition each time you charge the 6 volt batteries.

Rules for Safe Driving

WARNING

- Adult supervision is required. Children do not have the judgement necessary to avoid many accidents. Be sure that children operating this vehicle can do so safely and that they are supervised at all times.
- Never use near steps, driveways, steep inclines, roadways, alleys, swimming pool areas or other bodies of water.
- Always wear shoes or sneakers when operating or riding in this vehicle.
- Never allow more than one rider.
- The rider should sit on the seat when the vehicle is in operation.
- Improper use of this vehicle could lead to a serious or fatal accident. Allow children to play with **Monster Sound BIGFOOT**® only when you have determined that they can do so safely. Follow all instructions to help your child enjoy this vehicle as safely as possible.

CAUTION

- To avoid damaging motors and gears, do not overload the vehicle.
 - Never allow more than one child in the vehicle at one time.
 - Do not exceed the maximum weight capacity of 65 lbs.
 - Do not tow anything behind **Monster Sound BIGFOOT**®. The extra weight may overload the vehicle.
- Avoid operating the vehicle in wet or snowy conditions, and do not spray the vehicle with a hose. Do not wash the vehicle with soap and water. Water or moisture in the motors or electrical switches can cause them to corrode, and could cause switch failure.
- Avoid operating the vehicle on sand, loose dirt or gravel. Sand, loose dirt and gravel in the electrical switches or motors can cause them to jam, and could cause switch failure. Use **Monster Sound BIGFOOT**® on grass, asphalt or other hard surfaces.

Teach Safety Rules to Children


While children can quickly develop the skill necessary to drive this vehicle, it is important to remember that their judgment skills are still very immature. Unsupervised driving by children can lead to serious injury. Before children use **Monster Sound BIGFOOT**®, an adult should carefully evaluate the driving area as well as the children's skill level and ability to drive this vehicle safely. Children are not always able to recognize or anticipate hazards, even when they have been taught about them. There is no acceptable substitute for adult supervision.

Teach appropriate safety rules to your child before you allow her to operate this vehicle. These rules should also be reviewed with neighborhood children or other playmates who want to drive or ride in this vehicle.

1. Do not allow any child to drive the vehicle in the street or near moving (motorized) vehicles.
2. Do not allow any child to drive near bodies of water (such as pools or creeks), obstructions (such as furniture, low tree limbs or play equipment), or drop-offs (such as stairs or decks).
3. Do not allow any child to drive the vehicle in the dark. A child could encounter unexpected obstacles and have an accident. Operate the vehicle only in the daytime or in a well-lit area.
4. Teach your child to avoid driving on steep inclines or slopes. Restrict your child's driving to areas that are fairly level with gentle inclines or slopes of no more than 10°.
 - While driving down a steep slope, the vehicle may gain unsafe speed, even if the foot pedal is released to stop.


Rules for Safe Driving

- While driving across a steep slope, the vehicle may tilt and tip over. The wheels could lose traction, causing the vehicle to slip.
- While driving up a steep incline, the motor may stop and the vehicle could roll backwards at an unsafe speed.



5. Never allow more than one child in the vehicle at one time. Children who are not sitting on the seat or who are standing on the vehicle could fall off, cause a tip-over or block the driver's view. A child could be seriously injured.
6. Always wear shoes or sneakers when operating or riding in this vehicle.
7. Never put anything near any moving parts. Rotating parts such as motors, gear boxes and wheels can snag fingers, hair, etc., causing serious injury. Do not allow operation of the vehicle when it is on its side or in an upside-down position.


8. Do not operate the vehicle near flammable vapors (gasoline, paint thinner, acetone, liquid wax, etc.). The vehicle's electrical switches, like most electrical switches, emit an internal spark when first turned on and when turned off. The presence of flammable liquids or vapors could cause an explosion or a fire. Keep all flammable products in tightly sealed containers and away from the vehicle.
9. Do not allow a child to operate the vehicle without proper adult supervision. To prevent unsupervised use of the vehicle, disconnect the motor harness from the batteries.
 - Rotate the lock fasteners in the hood counter-clockwise 90° (1/4 turn) with a slotted screwdriver to unlock the hood (⊖).
 - Raise the hood to access the batteries.
 - Squeeze the tabs on the motor harness connector to unplug the battery connector from the motor harness connector.
 - Lower the hood and rotate the lock fasteners clockwise 90° (1/4 turn) with a slotted screwdriver to lock the hood (⊕).


How to Operate Your Vehicle

To help your child develop the skill necessary to drive this vehicle safely, your Power Wheels® vehicle has been pre-assembled so that it will only operate in low speed (2½ mph, maximum). After your child has mastered the basic skills of driving and understands the rules for safe driving, it's time to disconnect the high-speed lock-out to allow the vehicle to operate at low (2½ mph, maximum) or high speed (5 mph, maximum). See the instructions below to disconnect the high-speed lock-out.




Beginner Drivers: Low Speed Forward To Drive

- Make sure the shifter is in the LOW () position ①.
- Press down on the foot pedal ②. The vehicle goes forward at a maximum of 2½ mph ③.
- Help your child practice steering to learn how far and how quickly to turn the steering wheel when driving forward in low speed.



To Stop

- Your **Monster Sound BIGFOOT®** has a patented, electronic braking system that automatically stops the vehicle when your child's foot is lifted from the pedal.
- Have your child practice so that he becomes familiar with low speed forward and automatically knows how to stop.




Experienced Drivers: High Speed Forward

Disconnecting the High-Speed Lock-Out

- Before you disconnect the high speed lock-out, make sure your child:
 - knows how to start and stop the vehicle easily in low speed.
 - knows how to steer.
 - knows the safety rules well.
- Make sure the shifter is in the reverse () position.
- Loosen the screw in the shifter box using a Phillips screwdriver.
- Remove the screw. Keep the screw in a safe place out of children's reach for future use. You can re-insert the screw into the shifter box if you want to lock-out high speed and allow operation of the vehicle in low speed only.



To Drive:


Note: To prevent damage to the motors, stop the vehicle before shifting speeds.

- Make sure the shifter is in the HIGH (🚗) position ①.
- Press down on the foot pedal ②. The vehicle goes forward at a maximum of 5 mph ③.
- Help your child practice steering to learn how far and how quickly to turn the steering wheel when driving forward in high speed.



To Stop:

- Stopping in high speed is the same as stopping in low speed. The vehicle automatically stops when your child's foot is lifted from the pedal.



Reverse

Note: To prevent damage to the motors, stop the vehicle before shifting from forward (LOW 🚗 or HIGH 🚗) to reverse (🚗).

- Once your child is completely comfortable with operating the vehicle in the forward mode (LOW 🚗 or HIGH 🚗 speed), introduce reverse (🚗).

To Back Up

- Make sure the shifter is in the reverse (🚗) position ①.
- Press down on the foot pedal ②. The vehicle will go in reverse at a maximum of 2 1/2 mph ③.
- Help your child practice steering to learn how far and how quickly to turn the steering wheel when backing up.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. How often do I need to charge the 6 volt batteries?

A. Charge the 6 volt batteries for a minimum of 14 hours after each use of the vehicle or whenever the vehicle begins to slow down. When the vehicle is not in regular use, charge the 6 volt batteries at least once a month until normal use is resumed.

Q. How much riding time should I get after charging the 6 volt batteries?

A. You should get from one to three hours of riding time per charge. The riding time is affected by:

- the driving surface,
- passenger weight,
- the charge of the 6 volt batteries,
- whether the vehicle is used intermittently or continuously,
- condition of the electrical switches and connectors,
- whether the vehicle is used in low or high speed,
- the temperature.

Q. What is the life expectancy of the 6 volt batteries?

A. The life of the 6 volt batteries will vary depending on how well you follow the Charging and Battery Care instructions. It's also affected by the total number of hours the 6 volt batteries are used. Average 6 volt battery life is one to three years.

Q. Do the fuses have to be inserted into the 6 volt batteries when I'm charging?

A. Yes! The batteries must have good fuses installed when charging and during use. If the fuses are missing, blown or if you are using the wrong type of fuse, the 6 volt batteries will not charge.

Q. How can I tell if the fuses are blown?

A. Use pliers to remove the fuses from the 6 volt batteries and compare the fuses to the illustration on page 29.

Q. How can I tell if the charger is working?

A. There is no sure way to tell if your charger is working unless you have a volt meter. If you suspect there is a problem with your charger, contact your local Power Wheels® Authorized Service Center. They can test your charger for you.

Q. How and when should I store my vehicle?

A. During snowy or rainy weather, the vehicle should be stored inside or under a protective cover. Remember to charge the 6 volt batteries at least once per month while your vehicle is not in regular use.

Q. How should I care for my vehicle?

A. The vehicle can be wiped down with a soft, dry cloth. For a shiny finish, you can wipe plastic parts with a non-wax furniture polish applied to a soft cloth. Do not use automotive wax. Do not use soap and water or spray the vehicle with a hose. Check all nuts, bolts, and their protective coverings regularly and tighten as required. Check plastic parts on a regular basis for cracks or broken pieces.

To ensure that your vehicle stays in good operating order, we recommend that you periodically have your vehicle checked by a Power Wheels® Authorized Service Center. See page 40 for the list of Authorized Service Centers or call 1-800-348-0751 for the location of the Authorized Service Center nearest you.

Q. If I have a problem that I can't solve myself, what should I do?

A. Power Wheels® has over 300 Authorized Service Center locations. They can repair vehicles under warranty, or out of warranty, or sell you the proper parts for you to do the repair work. These service centers have factory-trained personnel, and use only genuine Power Wheels® replacement parts. If there is not an Authorized Service Center in your area, please call Power Wheels® Consumer Affairs toll-free at: **1-800-348-0751**.
