





CONTROLS

- 1) AL 1 selects alarm 1 mode: OFF/ RADIO
- 2 AL 2 selects alarm 2 mode: OFF/ BUZZER / COCKCROW
- 3 DISPLAY shows clock and alarms (small display) times and status
- (4) REPEAT ALARM / BRIGHTNESS CONTROL
 - switches off the alarm for a 5 minute period
 - changes display illumination brightness
 - stops SLEEP function

(5) ALARM RESET / RADIO OFF

- stops active alarm for 24 hours
- stops SLEEP / RADIO function
- **6 SLEEP / RADIO ON**
- activates the radio for sleep function, and to select the sleep time - switches the radio on

- (17) **RESET** press if the set / display does not react to operation of any button
- (18) Battery door opens to store a 4 x R6/UM3/AA batteries (not included)

POWER SUPPLY

Batteries (not included)

- 1 Open battery door and insert four batteries (preferably PHILIPS POWER LIFE or alkaline), type R6, UM3 or AA as indicated in the compartment.
- 2 Remove the batteries from the set if they are exhausted or not be used for a long time.
- When the batteries are turning low, \widehat{A} appears in the display. The radio and backlight will not function, but the display and power saving buzzer will continue to operate.
- When replacing batteries, the clock time, alarm setting will be stored by the self-powered back-up for 1 minute (see 'Self-Powered Back-Up').
- Make sure the radio is switched off to save battery energy. Batteries contain chemical substances, so they should be disposed of properly.

Power adapter

- 1 Connect the power adapter to the set's DC jack and to the power outlet.
- → A indicates the set is now adapter operated.
- Make sure your adapter is properly connected to save battery energy!
- 2 Always disconnect the power adapter if you are not using the set.
 - → A indicator goes out.
- **NOTE**: To avoid damage to the set, use only the adapter supplied!

SELF-POWERED BACK-UP

The self-powered back-up conveniently allows your alarm and clock time settings to be stored for up to 1 minute when there is a power interruption e.g. AC power failure or when changing batteries.

The complete clock radio and backlight illumination will be switched off. As soon as the power supply returns the display will indicate the correct time.

• If power supply returns after 1 minute, the demo mode appears and you will need to re-enter all clock settings.

RATTERY LOW MODE

If you have inserted batteries, the battery low indicator $\widehat{\square}$ lights up when:

• battery power is low.

- you intend to use AC power, but the AC adapter connection is loose.
 During the battery low mode, both Radio/Sleep, backlight and sound will not function.
 Operation of any set alarm (Radio/Buzzer/Cockcrow) automatically changes to a slow buzzer been frequency.
- If the SLEEP / RADIO ON or BRIGHTNESS CONTROL button is pressed, the battery
 low indicator will flash for 5 seconds and then remains non-blinking.

GENERAL FEATURES

Reset

Should you receive external interference e.g. static electricity from carpets, thunderstorms, etc. which affects the display and electronic functions of your set, RESET allows you to clear all previous settings and start up again.

. Use a ballpoint pen to press RESET, found on the bottom of the set.

Demo mode

When the set is first connected to a power supply or has been reset, 'PHILIPS' will scroll continuously across the demonstration display.

- Press AL 2 button during the demo mode to listen to the cockcrow demo.
- Press SET TIME or SLEEP / RADIO ON to exit the demo mode, to set the time or switch on the Radio.

Illumination brightness

Press REPEAT ALARM / BRIGHTNESS CONTROL ONCE OF MORE.

- The brightness of the display will change in this sequence:
 bright dim backlight off (for AC adapter on)
- The brightness of the display will change in this sequence:
 off → dim (5 seconds) → off (for Batteries)

Note:

When the alarm or SLEEP function is active, the brightness cannot be adjusted.

SETTING THE CLOCK AND ALARM TIMES

The time is displayed using the 12-hour clock with PM indicator (PM off = AM).

- Press SET TIME or SET ALARM 1 (or 2) to enter the respective clock or alarm time setting mode.
 - → The clock time or the alarm time display flashes and you will hear 'set time' or 'set alarm'.
- Hold down or press HOUR or MINUTES
 repeatedly to set and adjust the hours and minutes respectively. Release HOUR or MINUTES when you have reached the
 correct setting.
- After both the hours and minutes are set, press SET TIME or SET ALARM 1 (or 2) to confirm the setting.
- Time setting is also automatically confirmed 10 seconds after you set the time.
- It is not possible to adjust the alarm time during an alarm call or the repeat alarm mode.

RADIO

- 1 Press SLEEP / RADIO ON once to switch on the radio.
- 2 Select your waveband using the BAND switch.
- 3 Adjust TUNING to find your radio station.
- 4 Adjust the sound using **VOLUME**.
- 5 Press ALARM RESET / RADIO OFF to switch off.

For **FM**, extend and position the pigtail fully to obtain optimum reception. For **AM**, the set is provided with a built-in aerial. Direct the aerial by adjusting the position of your clock radio.

SETTING THE ALARM

GENERAL

If you wish to use the alarm, first set the alarm time before selecting your choice of two alarm modes, radio or buzzer/cockcrow. The alarm display is shown constantly, and the alarm indicator appears if the alarm is set.

- To select the radio alarm, press AL 1 button once.
 - → The ALARM 1 display and 1 appear and you will hear 'Alarm ON'.
- Make sure you have adjusted the volume loud enough to wake you up!
 To select the buzzer or cockcrow alarm, press AL 2 button once or more.
- → The ALARM 2 display and ^Ω or [™] appear and you will hear 'Alarm ON'.
- When reach Alarm setting time, Radio, Buzzer or cockcrow will switch on for about 30 minutes and the alarm indicator flashes
- Within seconds, your gentle wake alarm :
 - → Buzzer option increases its beep tone frequency.
 - → Cockcrow option increases volume.

Note:

If alarm by Radio and Buzzer/Cockcrow are activated at the same time, Alarm by Buzzer/Cockcrow will dominate.

SWITCHING OFF THE ALARM

There are three ways of switching off the alarm. Unless you cancel the alarm completely, the **24-hour ALARM RESET** will be automatically selected after 30 minutes from the time your alarm first goes off.

24 HOUR ALARM RESET

If you want the alarm mode to be stopped immediately but also wish to retain the same alarm setting for the following day:

- Press ALARM RESET / RADIO OFF.
 - → You will hear a beep tone confirming 24 hour reset activation. The respective alarm display appears.

REPEAT ALARM

- This repeats your alarm call at 5 minute intervals.

 During the alarm call, press **REPEAT ALARM / BRIGHTNESS CONTROL**.
- → The alarm indicator flashes during repeat alarm.
- Repeat if desired.

CANCELING THE ALARM COMPLETELY

- During alarm activated or repeat alarm mode, press and hold the AL 1 or AL 2 button for more than 1 second. Alarm will be switched off completely.
 - → The selected alarm indicator and alarm time disappears and you will hear 'Alarm OFF'.

SLEEP

About Sleep

This set has a built-in sleep timer, which enables the radio to be automatically switched off after a set period of time. There are four sleep time options.

Setting and switching off SLEEP

- 1 Press SLEEP / RADIO ON to switch on the radio. The display shows 'ON' shortly
- 2 Within 1 second, press SLEEP / RADIO ON again once or more to select your sleep time.
- The display shows in sequence **ON**, and the sleep time options:
- SL: 30, SL: 20, SL: 10 and OFF.
 - → The Sleep indicator 💆 lights up.
- 3 To cancel sleep, press either:
 - ALARM RESET / RADIO OFF
 - REPEAT ALARM / BRIGHTNESS CONTROL.
