



TOP, FRONT and SIDE PANEL

- (1) **TIME** To adjust clock time.
- (2) WAKE UP TRACK To set / select / review CD wake up track number for ALM 1 or 2.
- (3) **ALM 1** To set / review / switch off ALM 1.
- (4) ALM 2 To set / review / switch off ALM 2.
- ⑤ SEARCH ⋈ ►>> To adjust clock time / alarm time; to skip CD tracks / search for a particular passage; to select a different buzzer melody.
- (6) Function buttons

CD ► - To start CD playback; to select CD mode for ALM 1 or 2. **RADIO** - To go to radio mode;

to select radio mode for ALM 1 or 2

BUZZER - To select buzzer mode / melody for ALM 1 or 2.

BRIGHTNESS - To change the brightness of the display illumination.


SLUMBER - To switch slumber time on / off; to display remaining slumber time.

ALARM RESET - To stop the active alarm for 24 hours

- ⑦ \(\operatorname{0} \) 3.5 mm socket for plugging in headphones / speakers.
- ® CD OFF To switch off CD / RADIO / ALM 1 or 2.
- REPEAT ALARM To switch off the alarm for a 10 minute period.
- (10) FM AM To select the waveband.
- (1) **VOLUME** To adjust the sound level.
- (12) TUNING To tune to radio stations.
- (13) ▲ To open the CD door.

MAINS CONNECTION

- Check if the mains voltage as shown on the type plate (on the bottom of the set) corresponds to your local mains voltage. If it does not, consult your dealer or service organisation.
- 2. Connect the mains plug to the wall socket.
 - The mains supply is now switched on and the numbers on the display will start to flash. You will need to set the correct time.
- To switch off the mains supply completely, pull the mains plug out of the wall socket.



Power breakdown

In the event of a power failure the set will be completely switched off. All settings will remain in the memory for three minutes.

Connecting headphones / loudspeakers

Connect headphones / loudspeakers with a 3.5 mm plug in to the socket.

→ The built-in loudspeakers of the set will now be muted.

Illumination brightness

Press the BRIGHTNESS button once or more.

→ The brightness of the display will change in this sequence: LOW → MEDIUM → BRIGHT → LOW


SETTING THE CLOCK

The time is displayed using the 24-hour clock.

For some versions, the clock display may use a 12 hour display with AM/PM indicators.

- 1. Press and hold down the TIME button.
- - Press SEARCH

 or → briefly and repeatedly to adjust the alarm time minute by minute.
- Release the TIME button when you have reached the correct setting.



CD PLAYER

CD playback

- 1. Press \(\textbf{\textit{L}}\) to open the CD door.
- Insert a CD with the printed side facing up, and press the door down to close.
- 3. Press CD ▶ to start playback.
 - → The CD mode indicator, 'ɛ d' and the total number of tracks flashes briefly on the display followed by the current track number.
 - → The display reverts back to showing the clock time. The CD mode indicator will remain throughout CD playback.
- 4. Adjust the sound by using the VOLUME control.
- To check the current track number during playback, press CD ▶.
- 6. Press CD OFF to stop playback.
 - → OFF appears briefly in the display before the set is switched off.
- Playback also stops after the last track and the set will be switched off

Selecting a different track

During playback, to jump to the next or a previous track, press **SEARCH** ** or ** once more until the desired track number appears in the display.

Finding a passage within a track

- During playback, press and hold down the SEARCH

 or

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
 button.
 - → The CD is played at an increasingly high speed and low volume.












RADIO

- 1. Press RADIO to switch on the radio mode.
 - → The RADIO mode indicator appears in the display.
- 2. Adjust the FM AM band switch to select your waveband.
- 3. Use the TUNING control to find your station.

To improve radio reception:

- For FM, extend the wire aerial at the back of the set fully for optimum reception.
- For AM, the set is provided with a built-in aerial. Direct the aerial by turning the whole set.
- 4. Adjust the sound using the VOLUME control.
- 5. Press CD **OFF** to switch off the radio.
 - → DFF appears briefly in the display before the set is switched off.



SETTING THE ALARM TIME

General

Two different alarm times can be set in a variety of modes. This can be useful when for example you need to be woken up at a different time during the week and at the weekend.

Setting alarm 1 and 2

- 1. Press and hold down the ALM 1 or 2 button.
- Select your choice of alarm mode by pressing CD ►, BUZZER or RADIO.
- 4. Release the ALM 1 or 2 button.
 - → An indicator will appear next to your selected alarm mode.
- To review the alarm time, press your selected ALM 1 or 2 button.

IMPORTANT!

If you want the alarm to wake you up, FIRST CHECK if:

- you have adjusted the volume loud enough when using the CD / wake up track / radio alarm modes;
- you have disconnected the headphones;
- the loudspeakers are switched on if you are using amplified loudspeakers in the headphone socket.





SETTING THE WAKE UP TRACK

You can programme and select a CD WAKE UP TRACK number between 01-99, when the set is in the standby mode or during CD playback.

However, if the track number programmed does not exist on your CD, the first track of the CD will be played during the alarm call.


- 1. Insert a CD into the CD compartment
- Press and hold down the selected ALM 1 or 2 button and set your alarm time using the SEARCH

 or → controls.
- 3. Before releasing ALARM, press the CD ▶ button.
 - → An indicator will appear next to the CD.

- To review your programmed track number, press WAKE UP TRACK again.
 - → The wake up track and alarm number will be shown.



- The BUZZER alarm option will automatically replace the CD / wake up track alarm if you have;
 - inserted a CD incorrectly;
 - inserted a damaged CD;
 - forgotten to insert any CD.
- Reviewing the wake up CD track number is not possible during the REPEAT ALARM mode.






SETTING BUZZER MELODIES

You can set 5 different melodies for both alarm 1 or 2. The buzzer melodies are set at a fixed volume and cannot be adjusted.

- Set the alarm time as described in steps 1-3 of 'Setting alarm 1 and 2'.
- - The buzzer melody and alarm number will be shown.
- To review your selected buzzer melody over the speakers, press BUZZER.



SWITCHING OFF THE ALARM

There are three ways to switch off the alarm. Unless you cancel the alarm completely, the ALARM RESET will be automatically selected after 60 minutes, from the time your alarm goes first off.

Alarm reset

If you want the alarm mode to be stopped immediately but also wish to retain the same alarm setting for the following day:

- 1. Press ALARM RESET.
 - → You will hear a long beep tone to confirm that the ALARM RESET has been activated.

Repeat alarm

This will repeat your alarm call at 10 minutes intervals.

- 1. During the alarm call, press REPEAT ALARM.
 - → After 10 minutes the alarm will call again.
- 2. You can press REPEAT ALARM again as often as desired.
 - → The **ALM 1** or **2** indicator '•' and ':' in the display will flash throughout the time when REPEAT ALARM is active.

NOTES: REPEAT ALARM for WAKE UP / CD TRACK In standby mode:

- At the set alarm time the normal clock display (standby mode) is interrupted.
 - → The display flashes and shows in order: CD mode; total number of tracks of the inserted CD; and the WAKE UP TRACK number before playing the WAKE UP / first CD track.
- When REPEAT ALARM is pressed, the position of the WAKE UP / CD track is memorized and playback stops. The set goes to standby mode.
 - → After 10 minutes, the WAKE UP / CD track will resume playback at the point interrupted by REPEAT ALARM.
- To cancel the REPEAT ALARM and return to normal CD playback, press the CD ➤ button.

During RADIO / CD playback:


Basically the same happens, except that the WAKE UP / first CD track starts from the beginning each time you press REPEAT ALARM. If you are playing a CD, the current track will be interrupted at the alarm time and the track position memorized. Playback from this position will resume when REPEAT ALARM is pressed.


Cancelling the alarm completely

- To cancel the set alarm time before it goes off, press the activated ALM 1 or 2 button and CD
 OFF simultaneously.
 - → The alarm indicator will disappear from the display.
- To cancel the alarm during a call, first press ALARM RESET, and then the activated ALM 1 or 2 and CD ■ OFF button simultaneously.










REFLECTION DETECTOR

not all versions

This detector which can detect objects placed within close range (15 cm maximum distance), is located on the front of the set as an additional device for operating the REPEAT ALARM.

- 1. During an alarm call, place your hand in front of the set.
 - → The alarm will be switched off for 10 minutes, during which the display will flash.

Note: The display will also flash if an alarm you have set is accidentally deactivated by objects within range of the reflection detector. To prevent this from happening, place a sticker over the reflection detector.



SLUMBER

About slumber time

The CD clock radio has a built-in device called the slumber, which enables the set to be automatically switched off during the RADIO or CD playback modes after a set period of time. There are three slumber times: 10, 30 and 60 minutes before the set turns itself off.


 During SLUMBER, the radio or CD player is set to a lower volume. If you wish to be woken by the alarm next day, it may be necessary to adjust the volume to a higher volume before setting SLUMBER.


Setting the slumber

- 1. Press the CD ➤ or RADIO button.
 - → For the CD mode, make sure you have inserted a disc first.
- Select your slumber time by pressing the SLUMBER once or more:

once: 60 minutes; twice: 30 minutes; three times: 10 minutes.

- → The word SLUMBER will appear on the bottom of the display when slumber is active.
- To review the remaining slumber time, press the SLUMBER button.
 - → The display will show '5½;' and the minutes.
- 4. To cancel the slumber function, you can;
 - press the **SLUMBER** button until the word disappears from the display;
 - press CD OFF to cancel immediately and switch off the set.





GENERAL

- If you do not intend to use your CD clock radio for a long time, withdraw the plug from the wall socket.
- Do not expose the set or CDs to humidity, rain, sand, or excessive heat caused by heating equipment or direct sunlight.
- A chamois leather slightly moistened with water is sufficient for cleaning the housing. Do not use cleaning agents containing alcohol, spirits, ammonia or abrasives as these may harm the housing.





CD PLAYER AND CD HANDLING

- The lens of the CD player should never be touched.
- The lens may cloud over if the CD player is moved from cold to warm surroundings. The CD player will not start. Give the player some time to acclimatize.
- To take a CD out of its box, press the center spindle while lifting the CD. Always pick up the CD by the edge and replace the CD back in its box after use to avoid scratching and dust.
- To clean the CD, wipe in a straight line from the centre towards the edge using a soft, lint-free cloth. Do not use cleaning agents as they may damage the disc.
- Never write on a CD or attach stickers to it.



Environmental information

All redundant packaging material has been omitted. We have done our utmost to make the packaging easily separable into three mono materials: cardboard (box), expandable polystyrene (buffer) and polyethylene (bags, protective foam sheet).

CD PLAYER

CD playback does not work

- CD is badly scratched or dirty.
- · Replace or clean the CD, see Maintenance.
- Laser lens steamed up.
- · Wait until lens has acclimatized.

RADIO

Crackling sound during FM broadcast

- Weak signal.
- · Aim and extend wire aerial fully.

Continuous crackling / hiss disturbance during AM broadcast

- Electrical interference from TVs, computers, fluorescent lamps, etc.
- Move the set away from other electrical equipment.

ALARM

The alarm does not function

- Alarm time not set.
- Set the alarm time.
- Alarm mode not selected.
- Hold down your selected alarm and press the CD / RADIO / BUZZER button.
- Volume too low for radio / CD / wake up track alarm mode.
- · Adjust the volume.
- Alarm deactivated by object within range of reflection detector.
- Move object away / place a sticker over reflection detector.
