



MAINS CONNECTION

- Check if the mains voltage as shown on the type plate corresponds to your local mains supply. If it does not, consult your dealer or service organisation.
- Connect the mains plug into the wall socket. The mains supply is now switched on. As soon as the power plug is put into the wall socket, the numbers on the display will start to flash. This means that you must set the correct time.
- To disconnect the set from the mains completely, pull the mains plug from the wall socket.



POWER BREAKDOWN

- As soon as the power fails, the whole appliance will be switched off.
- All settings will remain in memory for three minutes

CONNECTING HEADPHONES / LOUDSPEAKERS


- Connect headphones with a 3.5 mm jack plug to the R socket or:
- Connect amplified loudspeakers with a 3.5 mm jack plug to the
 O socket
- In both cases, the loudspeakers of the main unit will now be muted.

ILLUMINATION BRIGHTNESS

- You can change the brightness of the display by pressing the brightness button.
 - Each press will change the brightness of the illumination by one step in the following sequence:

ightarrow Low — ightarrow Medium — ightarrow High .

SETTING THE CLOCK



- Keep the TIME button pressed and press the ⋈ or ⋈ buttons to set the time.
- If the ₩ or ₩ are pressed once, the time will increase or decrease by one minute.
- If the ⋈ or ⋈ are pressed for more than 0,5 seconds, the time will increase or decrease by about 6 minutes per second.
 If the ⋈ or ⋈ are pressed for more than 5 seconds, the time will increase or decrease by about 60 minutes per second.
- Release the TIME button, when you have reached the correct time setting.
- To indicate that the clock is running, the colon between the hour and the minute digits will start to blink.

NOTE

Since the indication of many functions are combined on the display, the display may show other information than the current time. The display will return to the current time indication automatically after a few seconds.

Press the TIME button for immediate return to the current time indication.



CD Player

PLAYBACK

English

- Open the CD door by pressing OPEN/ CLOSE.
- Insert a CD, printed side up, and close the door.



- Press CD to start playback.
- The CD sign starts flashing on the display.
- The first track number of the CD will appear on the display and playback will start.
- The display will return to clock mode
- During playback the CD sign will remain on the display.
- You can check the CD track number by pressing the CD button.
- Playback will stop after the last track and the set will be switched off.
- You can stop playback by:
- Pressing CD STOP/OFF

洲/树 CHANGING CD TRACKS

1. Selecting another track during play: Press briefly

₩ - go to the next track

- You can jump to the next track by briefly pressing M once.
- If you want to skip more than one track, then briefly press № more than once until the display shows the desired track number.
 ₩ - go to the previous track
- If you want to repeat the current track from the beginning, briefly press KI once.
- If you want to repeat one of the previous tracks, briefly press IV more than once until the display shows the required track number.

2. Search during play:

- During PLAY MODE, press ⋈ or ⋈ to search forwards or backwards.
- Release the button as soon as you recognize the required passage.
- The CD will continue to play normally from this passage onwards.
- If the button is pressed for longer than 5 seconds, the search speed will increase.

RADIO

- · Switch the radio on by pressing RADIO.
- The radio indication appears on the display.
- Select the waveband with the BAND SELECTOR.
- Select the required station with the TUNING knob.
- You may have to adjust the position of the CD clock radio slightly for optimal reception.
 - For FM reception, there is a wire aerial at the rear of the set. This wire must be extended and if necessary adjusted lightly, in order to obtain good reception.
 - The AM-aerial is built into the set. To obtain optimum reception you may have to adjust the position of the set slightly.
- Switch the radio off by pressing CD STOP/OFF.

ALARM TIME

If you wish to use the alarm, then you should first of all set the alarm time. You may set two different alarm times.

General

- If the ₩ or ₩ button is pressed once, the alarm time will increase or decrease by one minute.
- If the ₩ or ₩ button is pressed for more than 0,5 seconds, the alarm time will increase or decrease by about 6 minutes per second.
- If the № or № button is pressed for more than 5 seconds, the alarm time will increase or decrease by about 60 minutes per second.

Setting alarm time 1:

- Keep ALARM 1 button pressed and set the required alarm time with the № and № buttons.
- The display will show the set alarm time.
- Select the required alarm source by pressing CD, RADIO or BUZZER once.
- Release the ALARM 1 button.
- The indicators will show that the alarm is activated.

Setting alarm time 2:

 Keep ALARM 2 button pressed and follow the same procedure as in "setting alarm time 1".

CD WAKE UP TRACK

The CD wake up track number is a CD track number between 01 and 99 which can be set for both ALARM 1and ALARM 2.


- Press and hold the WAKE UP TRACK button
- Select ALARM 1 or ALARM 2 to program the wake up track.
- Once CD has been programmed for ALARM 1 or ALARM 2, a particular track number can be selected for the CD to start with at the set alarm time.

NOTE


if the selected CD track number does not exist on the CD in the compartment, the unit will play the first track of the CD instead. Press and hold WAKE UP TRACK.

briefly press ALARM 1 or ALARM 2 to select the alarm.

 The display shows the selected alarm and the track.




- Adjust the required track number by pressing № or ₩ or CD STOP/OFF.
- The display shows the selected alarm and the selected wake up track.



Release the WAKE UP TRACK button

SETTING BUZZER MELODIES

- You can set 5 different buzzer melodies for both ALARM 1 and ALARM 2
- Keep the BUZZER button pressed and select ALARM 1or ALARM 2 to set the buzzer melody.
- The display will show the alarm number and the buzzer melody number.



- To increase the buzzer melody number press №, and to decrease the melody number press №.
- Press the BUZZER button (during stand by mode) to hear the selected melody over the speakers.

NOTE

It is recommended to use two different buzzer melodies for the two alarms in order to distinguish the alarms if both are set to the buzzer alarm mode.



ALARM OFF

You can switch off the alarm in three ways:

Switching off the alarm for 10 minutes:


- Press the REPEAT ALARM button.
 After 10 minutes the alarm (radio, CD or buzzer) will sound again.
- If you repeat this operation, the same will happen.



 If the ALARM RESET button is not pressed, the alarm will switch itself off after 60 minutes. The following day the alarm signal will sound again at the set alarm time.

Switching off the alarm for 24 hours

- Press ALARM RESET to switch off the alarm for 24 hours.
- You will hear a beep tone, to remind you that the alarm will not sound again until the next day.



Switching off the alarm completely

- Press ALARM 1/ALARM 2 and CD STOP/OFF to completely disable the alarm.
- The alarm indicator will disappear from the display.

NOTE

 Make sure the volume of the radio or the CD player is loud enough to wake you up.

NOTE

- When using the alarm function make sure the headphones are disconnected.
- If amplified loudspeakers are connected, make sure that the loudspeakers are switched on.
- The buzzer alarm sound is at a fixed volume.

If the alarm mode is set to CD and the unit is in standby or radio mode, the following will happen:

- At alarm time the current mode (standby or radio) aborts and the CD starts at the beginning of the wake up track.
- When the REPEAT ALARM button is pressed, playback stops and the set will resume to radio or standby mode.
- After 10 minutes, the CD will start playback where it stopped when REPEAT ALARM was pressed.

If the alarm mode is set to CD and the CD is in playing mode just before the alarm will sound, the following will happen:

- At alarm time, the current position of the CD will be memorized and the CD will start playback at the beginning of the wake up track.
- When REPEAT ALARM is pressed, the set will start playback of the CD where the track was stopped.
- After 10 minutes, the current position of the CD is memorized again and the CD starts playback at the beginning of the wake up track.

Slumbering

SLUMBER TIME

The CD clock radio has a built-in slumber function. With this function you can continue to listen to the CD or the radio while falling asleep. You do not need to switch off the radio yourself. This happens automatically. The period during which you continue to listen to the CD or the radio is called the slumber time. You can set this yourself. The maximum slumber time is 60 minutes.

Slumber time:

- Slumber time can only be set at CD or radio mode (not activated by alarms).
- Press CD or RADIO
- If you wish to slumber for 60 minutes, you should simply press the SLUMBER button.
- If you wish to slumber for less than 60 minutes, then press SLUMBER:
- twice for 30 minutes;
- three times for 10 minutes.
- The slumber indication will appear on the display.
- If the slumber button is pressed when the slumber function is active, the display will show the remaining slumber time.

Slumber off:

• Press SLUMBER until the slumber indication disappears from the display.

NOTE

- If CD has been selected as an alarm function and the CD is damaged or inserted incorrectly, then BUZZER will automatically be selected.
- During slumber operation the radio or CD player is often set to a lower volume. Remember this if you wish to be woken the next day, as you will perhaps sleep through the sound of the CD or the radio.

Maintenance

MAINTENANCE

CD player



- The lens may steam up when the set is taken from a cold into a warm environment. Playing a CD is then not possible. Do not clean the lens, but let the set acclimate for a while.
- Always pick up the CD by the edge and put it back in its box immediately after use.
- To remove dirt from a CD, first breathe on the CD and wipe it off in a straight line from centre to edge using a soft, lint-free cloth. The use of cleaning agents may damage the CD.

Environmental note



General

- If you do not intend to use the CD clock radio for a long time, it is better to remove the plug from the wall socket.
- Fingerprints, dust and dirt on the CD clock radio should be removed using a clean and damp soft cloth or chamois leather. When cleaning do not use any products which contain abrasive agents or solvents (benzine, thinner, alcohol etc.). These might affect the housing.
- Rain, dampness and extreme heat may damage the CD clock radio. For this reason it should not be placed in full sun or close to heating elements for any period of time.
- Keep the set and the CDs away from sand.

RECYCLING

Please observe the local regulations regarding the disposal of packing materials and old equipment.

- All redundant packaging material has been omitted. We have done our utmost to make the packaging easy to separate into three mono-materials:
 - cardboard (box),
 - expandable polystyrene (buffer)
 - polyethylene (bags, protective foam sheet)
- Your set consists of materials which can be recycled if disassembled by a specialized company.

Troubleshooting

If a fault occurs, first check the points listed below before taking the set for repair. If you are unable to remedy a problem by following these hints, consult your dealer or service centre.

WARNING

Under no circumstances should you try to repair the set yourself, as this would invalidate the guarantee.

No sound

- The volume is not set to the proper level
- Turn VOLUME to adjust the sound level

AM broadcast cannot be received

- Orientation of the set not optimal
- Rotate the set for better reception

In FM mode a crackling sound occurs from time to time (especially in weak signal areas)

- Weak signal
- Rotate the set and stretch the antenna

In AM mode continuous crackling and a hiss noise occurs

- Interference by the vicinity of electrical equipment like TVs, video recorders, computers, thermostats, fluorescent lamps (TL), engines etc.
- Keep the set away from electrical equipment

No reaction to operation of keys

- Electrostatic discharge
- Disconnect the set from the mains supply (unplug the mains cable) and reconnect the set after a few minutes.

Playback of the CD does not start

- The CD has been loaded upside down
- Reload the CD, label side up
- The CD is badly scratched or dirty
- Clean the CD


The alarm does not function

- The alarm is not set
- · Set the alarm time and alarm sources
- The current time is not correct
- · Set the correct time
- Headphones connected
- Disconnect headphones
- Volume too low
- Increase volume
