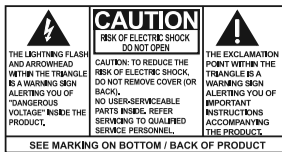

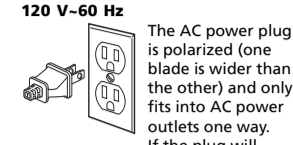

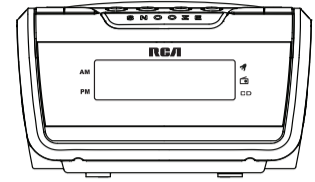
- Apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.
- Always leave sufficient space around the product for ventilation. Do not place product in or on a bed, rug, in a bookcase or cabinet that may prevent air flow through vent openings.

**Plugging in for power AC OUTLET POWER SUPPLY: 120 V-60 Hz**

The AC power plug is polarized (one blade is wider than the other) and only fits into AC power outlets one way. If the plug will not go into the outlet completely, turn the plug over and try to insert it the other way. If it still does not fit, contact a qualified electrician to change the outlet, or use a different one. Do not attempt to bypass this safety feature.

Portable Cart Warning

**Before you begin****Battery back-up operation**

The power failure protection circuit will not operate unless battery is installed.

**No worry battery backup**

When the battery backup functions, the digital display will not light, however, the wake function still occurs during the power interruption if remaining battery power is adequate.

Normal operation will resume after AC power is restored so you will not have to reset the time or wake.

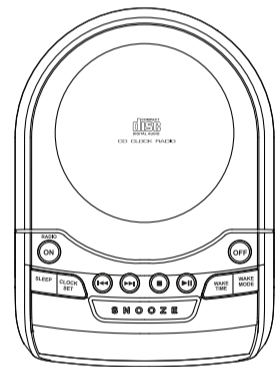
**Install battery as follow:**

1. Remove battery compartment door (located at the bottom of the radio) by applying thumb pressure to the tab on battery door and then lift the door out and off the cabinet.
2. Connect a 9-volt battery (not supplied) to the connector plug.
3. Replace the compartment door.

**Power failure indicator**

When AC power is interrupted (disconnected) for a short period of time, both time and alarm settings will change (unless battery is installed). After AC power is restored (reconnected), the Digital Display will blink to indicate that power was interrupted and you should readjust the time and alarm settings.

Alkaline (NEDA 1604A/IEC 6LR61) battery is recommended. Carbon-zinc battery may be used but memory holding time will be substantially reduced. Memory holding time for a fresh alkaline battery is approximately 8 hours (if radio or alarm are not operated) which should take care of short, nuisance-type AC power failures. To preserve battery life, the unit should remain plugged into an AC outlet. As the battery gets older, its voltage drops and memory may be lost. Be sure to replace the battery periodically. Battery should be removed if the unit will be stored for more than one month. Leaky battery can badly damage the clock radio.

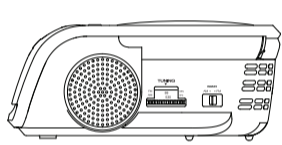
**General controls****Top view**

- - stops CD playback
- ▶|| - turns on the unit from CD mode; pauses or resumes CD playback
- SLEEP - activates the Sleep function
- CLOCK SET - activates clock time setting mode
- WAKE TIME - activates wake time setting mode; checks current wake time
- WAKE MODE - activates wake function and changes wake mode
- SNOOZE - turns off the wake function temporarily; cancels the sleep function

**RADIO ON** - turns on the radio; selects the radio from other modes

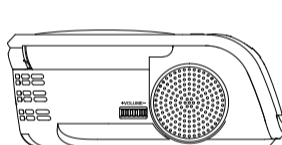
**OFF** - turns off the unit; turns off the wake function and sleep mode

◀▶ - sets clock or wake time; skips to previous or next CD track during CD playback

**Right view**

**TUNING** - selects radio frequency

**BAND AM/FM** - selects radio band

**Left view**

+ **VOLUME** - adjusts volume

**Clock****Setting clock**

1. Press **CLOCK SET** once. The current clock time flashes on the display.
2. Press **◀** or **▶** to set the clock time. The time decrements or increments will follow by a faster rate when you press and hold the buttons. AM or PM indicator also lights beside the time on the display.
3. When finished, wait for about 5 seconds or press **CLOCK SET** to exit clock setting mode.

**Radio****Switching on**

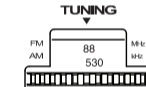
Press **RADIO ON** to turn on the radio.

**Switching band**

Slide the **BAND/AM-FM** switch on the right of the unit to select AM or FM band.

**Tuning radio**

Rotate the **TUNING** dial on the right of the unit to select radio frequency.

**Antennas**

**AM Antenna** - A built-in ferrite rod antenna eliminates the need for an outside antenna for AM reception. Rotating the unit slightly may improve reception of distant AM stations.

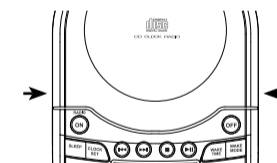
**FM Antenna** - The power cord acts as your FM antenna. The power cord picks up moderate to strong stations and eliminates the need for an external antenna in most strong signal areas. Be sure the power cord is stretched out to its full length. Do not coil or bunch the cord together. Changing position of the power cord may improve reception.

**Built-In AFC** - The Built In Automatic Frequency Control (AFC) works only on FM. It helps reducing drift on FM reception and keeping the radio locked in on the FM station to which it is tuned.

When tuning in FM stations, you may notice that the station you are tuning can be well-tuned on two or three nearby points on the dial. Always tune carefully at the loudest and clearest point.

**CD player****Listening to CD**

1. Lift open the CD compartment door.



- If disc is paused for more than 5 minutes, the CD player will resume to stop mode automatically.
- If disc is stopped in the CD mode for more than 30 minutes without further operations, the unit will turn off automatically.

2. Insert a disc and close the door.
3. Press **▶||** to select CD mode and start CD playback.
- Press **▶||** to pause playback and press again to resume.
4. Adjust volume to your desired level.
5. Press **◀** or **▶** to skip backward or forward a track. Press and hold to search through a track.
6. Press **■** to stop playback.
7. Press **RADIO ON** to listen to the radio or **OFF** to turn off the unit.

**Wake function****Setting wake time**

1. Press **WAKE TIME** once. The current wake time flashes on the display.



2. Press **◀** or **▶** to set the wake time. The time decrements or increments will follow by a faster rate when you press and hold the buttons. AM or PM indicator also lights beside the time on the display.
3. When finished, wait for about 5 seconds or press **WAKE TIME** to exit wake time setting mode.
- The Wake to Alarm mode (read below) will be automatically activated whenever the wake time has been set.

**Selecting wake source**

1. If your desired wake source is radio or CD:
- Wake to Radio - select an AM or FM station (refer to "Radio").
- Wake to CD - insert a CD in the CD compartment.
2. Set a wake time (refer to "Setting wake time").
3. Press **WAKE MODE** repeatedly to select a wake source. The indicator lights against the wake source icons on the right of the display to indicate the currently selected wake source:



- Once the wake source is selected, the wake function will be activated at the set wake time.

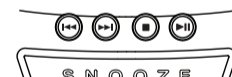
**Checking wake time**

Press **WAKE TIME** to show the current wake time which flashes briefly on the display.

**Turning off the wake function**

**Silence the wake function momentarily:**

- With SmartSnooze™, press **SNOOZE**, **◀**, **▶**, **■** or **▶||** to turn off the wake function temporarily for extra sleep time.



- The wake function will activate again when the snooze period (9 minutes) is over.
- The snooze period is fixed and cannot be changed.

**Stop the wake function:**

Press **OFF**. The wake function will activate again on the following day at the same time.

**Cancel the wake function completely:**

Press **WAKE MODE** repeatedly until no indicator lights against the wake source icons. The set wake time will not be erased and can be used the next time when you switch on wake function again.

**Sleep function**

You can set the duration (up to 90 min) before the radio or CD player turns off automatically.

1. Press **SLEEP** repeatedly to select a duration (90, 80, 70, 60, 50, 40, 30, 20, 10min or OFF) before the radio or CD player turns off automatically.
- The default sleep time is 60 minutes.
- By default, the radio will be switched on once **SLEEP** is pressed. You may change to listen to the CD player by pressing **▶||** if a disc is loaded.
2. To check the remaining duration before the unit turns off, press **SLEEP** once.
3. To cancel the sleep function, press **SNOOZE** or **OFF**.

If you set Sleep function with low volume level before going to bed, we advise using Wake to Alarm mode.
