RF Exposure

General Statement on RF Energy

Your mobile device contains a transmitter and a receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your device, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your device transmits.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR)

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organization ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to assure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The guidelines use a unit of measurement known as Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg and the highest SAR value for this device when tested at the ear was 1.54 W/kg*. As

mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body as described in this user guide**.

As SAR is measured utilizing the device's highest transmitting power, the actual SAR of this device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to automatic changes to the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum power required to communicate with the network.

Your device may become warm during charging and during normal use.

Electrical Safety

Accessories

Use only approved accessories.

Do not connect with incompatible products or accessories.

Take care not to touch or allow metal objects, such as coins or key rings, to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.

Connection to a Car

Seek professional advice when connecting a mobile device interface to the vehicle electrical system.

Faulty and Damaged Products

Do not attempt to disassemble the device or its accessory.

Only qualified personnel should service or repair the device or its accessory.

If your device or its accessory has been submerged in water, punctured, or subjected to a severe fall, do not use it until you have taken it to be checked at an authorized service center.

Interference

General Statement on Interference

Care must be taken when using the mobile device in close proximity to personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids.

Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15 cm be maintained between a mobile device and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To achieve this, use the mobile device on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket.

Hearing Aids

People with hearing aids or other cochlear implants may experience interfering noises when using wireless devices or when one is nearby. The level of interference will depend on the type of hearing device and

the distance from the interference source, increasing the separation between them may reduce the interference. You may also consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Medical Devices

Please consult your doctor and the device manufacturer to determine if operation of your mobile device may interfere with the operation of your medical device.

Hospitals

Switch off your wireless device when requested to do so in hospitals, clinics or health care facilities. These requests are designed to prevent possible interference with sensitive medical equipment.

Aircraft

Switch off your wireless device whenever you are instructed to do so by airport or airline staff.

Interference in Cars

Please note that because of possible interference to electronic equipment, some vehicle manufacturers forbid the use of mobile devices in their vehicles unless a hands-free kit with an external antenna is included in the installation.

Explosive Environments

Petrol Stations and Explosive Atmospheres

In locations with potentially explosive atmospheres, obey all posted signs to turn off wireless devices such as other radio equipment.

Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres include fuelling areas, below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders.


Blasting Caps and Areas

Key Definition

Key	Function
Power Key	Press and hold to power on your FileMate Light. Press to switch to sleep mode. Press to wake up your FileMate Light. Hold on for your FileMate Light options: Silent mode, Vibration mode or Power off.
Home Key	Tap to return to the Home Screen from any screen. Hold to see the recently used applications.
Menu Key	Tap to get menu options for the current screen.
Back Key	Tap to go to the previous screen.
Volume Keys	Use to control the volume Up or Down.

Starting up

How to slot your memory card

Power off your FileMate Light before installing or replacing the battery or memory card.

1. Remove the back cover.



Locate and open the thumb catch on the lower right hand corner (viewed from the back)

Note: Your FileMate Light has been pre-installed with an 8 GB microSD card.



Lift the back cover up to open

Insert your memory card into the memory card slot. There is a diagram showing the correct orientation of the card printed above the memory card slot.



How to pop in your battery

- 1. Insert the battery with the contacts located against the gold springs.
- 2. Push the battery down into place.



How to charge your FileMate Light

The new battery is not fully charged. To charge the battery, you need to:

1. Connect the adapter to the charger jack.



2. Connect the charger to a standard AC wall outlet.

Notes:

- ▶ If the battery is low, there will be a pop-up message on the screen and the indicator light will be red.
- ► When you charge your device, the indicator light will change according to the battery level:

Indicator color	Battery level
Red	Battery is very low.
Orange	Battery is low.
Green	Battery is full or partially drained.

- ▶ If the device is powered on and the battery is charging, the icon will appear on the status bar. When charging is completed, the battery indicator appears on the status bar.
- 3. Disconnect the charger when the battery is fully charged.

Powering On/Off Your Device

How to power on your device

- 1. Make sure the battery is inserted.
- Press and hold the **Power Key** to power on your device.

To power off your device, press and hold the **Power Key** to get the FileMate Light options, select **Power off**, and then tap **OK**.

How to switch your device to sleep mode

Press the Power Key.

Sleep Mode suspends your device to a low-power-consumption state while the display is off to save battery power. Your device also goes into Sleep Mode automatically when you leave it idle after a certain period of time.

How to wake up your device from sleep mode

If your device is switched to sleep mode, you need to wake it up:

- 1. Press the **Power Key** to activate your screen display.
- 2. Drag icon to the right.



Notes:

If you have set an unlock pattern for your device (See Settings -> Security Settings -> Protecting Your ØA^T æA^\$\tilde{A}\$ @with a Screen Lock -> Set the screen unlock pattern), you need to draw the pattern to unlock your screen.

Getting Around Your Device

Using Finger Gestures

You can use finger gestures to control your device. The controls on your touch screen change dynamically depending on the tasks you are performing.

- Tap the buttons, icons, or applications to select items or to open applications.
- 2. Hold a certain item to get available options.
- Slide on the screen, you can scroll up/down. From Home Screen, you can also slide left/right to browse the extended Home Screen.
- Drag a certain item to move it or to do some other corresponding operations.

Tips:

Besides using finger gestures to control your device, you can also switch your device screens (such as text input screen, gallery screen, etc.) between portrait or landscape mode by holding the device upright or sideways.

Home Screen

You can add or remove home items in your Home Screen.



	Displays the reminders and status icons of your device. Flick down to open the notifications panel.
Bars	Shows you which part of the Home Screen

Shortcuts & Widgets	Tap to start related applications.

How to extend the Home Screen

Beyond the screen width, the Home Screen extends to provide more space for adding items. Slide your finger to the left or right to get the extended Home Screen.



Customize the Home Screen Wallpaper

To change the wallpaper

- 1. Tap the **Home Key** to return to the Home Screen.
- Tap the Menu Key and select Wallpaper.
- Select the wallpaper you want to use from Gallery, Live wallpapers, or Wallpapers.
- 4. Tap Save or Set wallpaper.

To add a Home Screen item

- Tap the Home Key to return to Home Screen.
- Slide left or right to find an extended Home Screen where there is space to add an item.
- Tap the Menu Key and select Add.
 You can also tap and hold the blank area of the Home Screen to get
 the Add to Home screen shortcut menu.
- 4. Select an item type and the item you want to add to Home Screen.

To remove a Home Screen item

- 1. Tap the **Home Key** to return to Home Screen.
- Tap and hold the item you want to delete until the icon appears on the screen.

Contacts

Starting to use Contacts

You can add new contacts along with their information.

Contacts are saved in the internal memory. If you store the information in the internal memory, you can fill out more information including Email, Postal address, pictures, Nickname, website, etc.

Tap the **Home Key > ! > Contacts** to enter the Contacts Screen.

Contacts Screen

There are three tabs in the Contacts Screen: **Contacts**, **Favorites**, and **Groups**.



Managing Contacts

Importing/Exporting Contacts

You can import/export contacts from/to memory card.

Import/export contacts from/to memory card

- 1. Tap the **Menu Key > Import/Export** from the Contacts Screen.
- Select to import or export contacts from/to microSD card.
 If you want to import contacts from microSD card, you should have vCard files saved in the microSD card. If there is more than one vCard file, you need to select the vCard file.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Creating a Contact

- 1. Tap the **Menu Key > New contact** from the Contacts Screen.
- Enter the name and phone numbers. You can also set the Group, Email addresses, IM addresses, Postal addresses, Organizations etc.
- Tap **Done** to save the contact.

Adding a Contact to Favorites

- Select the contact you want to add to Favorites from your Contacts Screen.
- 2. Hold the contact until a shortcut menu appears.



3. Tap Add to favorites.

Searching for a Contact

- Tap the Menu Key > Search from the Contacts Screen.
- 2. Input the contact name you want to search for.

The contacts matched will be listed.

Editing a Contact

- Select the contact you want to edit from the Contacts Screen.
- 2. Tap the Menu Key > Edit contact.

Tips:

You can also edit a contact by holding it in the Contacts Screen and select **Edit contact** from the pop-up shortcut menu.

3. Edit the contact and tap Done.

Deleting a Contact

- 1. Select the contact you want to delete from the Contacts Screen.
- 2. Tap the Menu Key > Delete contact.

Tips:

You can also delete a contact by holding it in the Contacts Screen and select **Delete contact** from the pop-up shortcut menu.

3. Tap **OK**.


Entering Text

Using the On-screen Keyboard

When you enter a field that needs text or numbers, hold the input box and select **Input method** from the pop-up menu to change input method.

Android Keyboard

Android Keyboard is a keyboard layout similar to a desktop computer keyboard. You can choose to use the landscape orientation of the on-screen keyboard, by turning the FileMate Light sideways.



Tips:


 If you want to use the landscape keyboard, you need to select the Auto-rotate screen check box in Settings > Display.

XT9 Text Input

XT9 Text Input can speed up text input by replacing the letter tapping/typing motion of input with a tracing gesture where you move your finger from letter to letter without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.

You can select to use one of the three layouts (**Keyboard**, **Reduced keyboard**, **Phone keypad**) of XT9 Text Input Keyboard.

Keyboard




Move your finger from letter to letter to trace a word without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.


The trace feature is also available in the **Reduced keyboard** layout and **Phone keypad** layout.





Entering Text through the On-screen Keyboard

- Enter a field that needs text or numbers.
- 2. Tap or hold the letters on the keyboard to enter your text.

Entering Numbers or Symbols

- 1. Enter a field that needs text or numbers.
- 2. Tap 7123 / 2123 to open the number panel.
- 3. Select the numbers or symbols.

Touch Input Settings

You can configure the touch input settings by tapping the **Menu Key > Settings > Language & keyboard** from Home Screen.

Select language

Select the language you used.

XT9 Text Input

- Languages and settings: Select input languages. Tap a language to set up keyboard layout, word suggestion settings, key input settings, trace input settings, and handwriting input settings.
- Preferences: Set up keypress vibration, keypress sound, auto-capitalization, and auto-punctuation.
- **About:** View the XT9 version information.

Android keyboard

- Vibrate on keypress: Enables vibration feedback as you touch on the keyboard.
- Sound on keypress: Enables the sound feedback as you touch on the keyboard.
- Auto-capitalization: Select the check box to capitalize the fist letter
 of each sentence automatically.
- Voice input: Enables you to input by voice instead of typing.
- Input languages: Select the input language.

Using Email

Tap the **Home Key >** \blacksquare **> Email**. You can enter the Email Screen to setup your Email account and exchange Emails.

Creating an Email account

 Enter your Email address and password, then tap Next when you enter the Email Screen for the first time.



- 2. Select the type of your account and tap Next.
- 3. Edit the incoming server settings and then tap Next/Next[Check]. If you tap Next[Check], your device will check the incoming server settings and finish the setup automatically. If you are notified that setup could not be finished, you might need to correct some settings to finish it. If there is any problem, please contact your mobile service provider and Email service provider.
- Edit the outgoing server settings and tap Next/Next[Check].
 If you tap Next[Check], your device will check the outgoing server settings and finish the setup automatically.
- 5. Set the Email checking frequency, select whether to use this account by default or be notified when Email arrives, and then tap **Next**.
- Give your account a name and set a name displayed on outgoing message, and then tap **Done**.

Composing and sending an Email

After creating an Email account, you can compose and send Email messages.

- Tap the Menu Key > Compose from the Email Screen.
- 2. Tap the To field and enter the recipient's address.

When you enter the address, the matching addresses saved in your **Contacts** will be displayed. You can tap the recipient from the list.

Tips:

You can also tap the Menu Key > Add Cc/Bcc to add recipients.

- 3. Enter the subject and the content of your Email.
- 4. Tap Send.

Reply to or Forward an Email

- 1. Open the Email you want to reply to or forward from Email Screen.
- Tap Reply or the Menu Key > Forward to reply to/forward the Email.You can also tap Reply all to reply to all recipients of the Email.

- Enter the contents/recipients of your Email.
- 4. Tap Send.

Email Settings

Tap the account you want to set from the Email Screen and tap the **Menu Key > Account settings**. You can get the Email settings.

Getting Connected

Connecting to the Internet

Your device's networking capabilities allow you to access the Internet.

Ways of Connecting to the Internet

You can use the default connection settings to connect to the Internet through Wi-Fi.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides wireless Internet access over distances of up to 300 feet (100 meters).

Turn on Wi-Fi

- 1. Tap the Home Key > Here > Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Select the Wi-Fi check box to turn Wi-Fi on.

Add a Wi-Fi network

The Wi-Fi network names and security settings (open network or secured network) of detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed in the **Wi-Fi networks** section.

- 2. Tap a network to connect.
 - ▶ If you select an open network, you will be automatically connected to the network.
 - ▶ If you select a secured network, you will need to input the wireless password.

Check the Wi-Fi network status

You can check the Wi-Fi network status from the status bar and wireless controls

1 Check the licon in the status bar

Tap the Home Key > Settings > Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings, then tap the wireless network that the device is currently connected to.

You can check the network status from the pop-up window.



Using Browser

You can use your Browser to browse most of the websites. Some web pages may not be displayed properly as some specific web page technologies, such as Flash, are not supported by the browser.

Opening Browser

Tap the **Home Key >** \blacksquare **> Browser** to start this function.

Opening Web Pages

In Browser, you can open web pages through the following ways.

- Tap the address bar to enter the website you want to browse, and tap Go.
- 2. Tap the **Menu Key > Bookmarks** and select an item to open.
- 3. Select an item from **Most visited/History** tab of Bookmarks Screen.

Browsing Options

When browsing web pages, you can do some operations.

 - ▶ Settings: Set the browser.

Rotate your device sideways to view the landscape Browser Screen if you select the **Auto-rotate screen** check box in **Display settings** by tapping **Home Key** > \Longrightarrow > **Settings** > **Display**.



Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology. Wireless devices with Bluetooth capabilities can exchange information within a distance of about 10 meters without any physical connection. The Bluetooth devices must be paired before the communication is performed.

Turning on/off Bluetooth

- 1. Tap the Home Key > 🖼 > Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Select the Bluetooth check box to turn Bluetooth on.

The **[3]** icon will be displayed in the status bar. If you want to turn Bluetooth off, clear the **Bluetooth** check box.

By default, Bluetooth is turned off. If you turn it on, and then turn off your device, Bluetooth is also turned off. When you turn on your device again, Bluetooth turns on automatically.


