List of Features

Your TV was designed with the latest technology. This TV is a high-performance unit that includes the following special features:

- Easy-to-use remote control
- Easy-to-use on-screen menu system
- Automatic timer to turn the TV on and off
- Adjustable picture and sound settings that can be stored in the TV's memory
- Automatic channel tuning for up to 181 channels
- A special filter to reduce or eliminate reception problems
- Fine tuning control for the sharpest picture possible
- Built-in, dual channel speakers
- A special sleep timer
- Surround, Turbo sound, Auto Volume

Accessories

Once you have unpacked your TV, check to make sure that you have all the parts shown here. If any piece is missing or broken, call your dealer.



Familiarizing Yourself with The TV

Control Buttons

You can control your TV's basic features, including the on-screen menu. To use the more advanced features, you must use the remote control.



Connection Jacks (Side)

You can use the Side panel jacks to connect an A/V component that is used only occasionally, such as a camcorder or video game. (For information on connecting equipment, see page 15.)



1 AUDIO Input

Audio signals from VCRs, DVD players and similar devices.

O VIDEO Input

Video signals from VCRs, DVD players and similar devices.

Headphone

Connect a set of external headphones to this jack for private listening.

Please be sure to match the color coded input terminals and cable jacks.

Connection Jacks (Rear)

Use the rear panel jacks to connect an A/V component that will be connected continuously, such as a VCR or a DVD player. Because there are two sets of input jacks, you can connect two different A/V components (i.e., a VCR and a DVD, 2 VCRs, etc.)

For more information on connecting equipment, see pages 9-14.



• Please be sure to match the color coded input terminals and cable jacks.

Audio-Video Output jacks Connect to the audio/video input jacks of a

recording VCR.

O Video Input jacks

Connect to the video output jacks of VCRs, DVD players and similar devices.

Audio Input jacks

Connect to the audio output jacks of VCRs, DVD players and similar devices. When using the Component Video input, connect audio jacks to "AV IN 2 (AUDIO-L/R)".

Component Video Input jacks (Y, PB, PR)

Connect to the Component audio and video outputs of a DVD or DTV set-top box. 480i video signal input is available.

6 VHF/UHF

Connect to an antenna or to a cable TV system.

Remote Control

You can use the remote control up to about 23 feet from the TV. When using the remote, always point it directly at the TV.

Connecting VHF and UHF Antennas

If your antenna has a set of leads that look like this, see "Antennas with 300-ohm Flat Twin Leads" below.



If your antenna has one lead that looks like this, see "Antennas with 75-ohm Round Leads" on next page.



If you have two antennas, see "Separate VHF and UHF Antennas" on next page.

Antennas with 300-ohm Flat Twin Leads

If you are using an off-air antenna (such as a roof antenna or "rabbit ears") that has 300-ohm twin flat leads, follow the directions below.



Antennas with 75-ohm Round Leads



Separate VHF and UHF Antennas

If you have two separate antennas for your TV (one VHF and one UHF), you must combine the two antenna signals before connecting the antennas to the TV. This procedure requires an optional combiner-adaptor (available at most electronics shops).



Connecting Cable TV

To connect to a cable TV system, follow the instructions below.

Cable without a Cable Box



 Because this TV is cable-ready, you do not need a cable box to view unscrambled cable channels.

Connecting to a Cable Box that Descrambles All Channels



 This terminal might be labeled "ANT OUT", "VHF OUT" or simply, "OUT".

Connecting to a Cable Box that Descrambles Some Channels

If your cable box descrambles only some channels (such as premium channels), follow the instructions below. You will need a two-way splitter, an RF (A/B) switch, and four lengths of coaxial cable. (These items are available at most electronics stores.)

After you've made this connection, set the A/B switch to the "A" position for normal viewing. Set the A/B switch to the "B" position to view scrambled channels. (When you set the A/B switch to "B", you will need to tune your TV to the cable box's output channel, which is usually channel 3 or 4.)

Connecting a VCR

These instructions assume that you have already connected your TV to an antenna or a cable TV system (according to the instructions on pages 9-12). Skip step **1** if you have not yet connected to an antenna or a cable system.



A coaxial cable is usually included with a VCR. (If not, check your local electronics store).

Follow the instructions in "Viewing a VCR or Camcorder Tape" to view your VCR tape. *Note: This figure shows the Standard connector-jack panel. The actual configuration for your TV may be different.*

Connecting a Second VCR to Record from the TV (Depends on the model)

Your TV can send out signals of its picture and sound to be recorded by a second VCR. To do this, connect your second VCR as follows:



(The VCR input jacks might be either on the front or on back of the VCR.)



Refer to your VCR's instructions for more information about how to record using this kind of connection.

Note: This figure shows the Standard connector-jack panel. The actual configuration for your TV may be different.

Connecting a DVD Player

The rear panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a DVD player to your TV. *Note: Only 480i formats are supported.*



Note: For an explanation of Component video, see your DVD player's owner's manual.

Connecting a Camcorder

The side panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a camcorder to your TV. They allow you to view the camcorder tapes without using a VCR. (Also see "Viewing a VCR or Camcorder Tape" on page 28.)



The audio-video cables shown here are usually included with a Camcorder. (If not, check your local electronics store.) If your camcorder is stereo, you need to connect a set of two cables.

Note: This figure shows the Standard connector-jack panel. The actual configuration for your TV may be different.

Installing Batteries in the Remote Control





2 Install two AAA size batteries.



Make sure to match the "+" and "—" ends of the batteries with the diagram inside the compart ment.



Remove the batteries and store them in a cool, dry place if you won't be using the remote control for a long time.

The remote control can be used up to about 23 feet from the TV. (Assuming typical TV usage, the batteries last for about one year.)

Note: This figure shows the Standard remote control. The actual configuration may be different.

OPERATION

Turning the TV On and Off

Press the " I " button (On/Off) on the front of the television.

Press the **POWER** button on the remote control to switch the television on.

Caution : One pole switch is totally not off (one line still live) if power cord is not unplugged.

Plug & Play Feature

When the TV is initially powered On, five basic customer settings proceed automatically and subsequently: Setting the language, Video signal source, Ant. input check, Auto program and Clock.

Viewing the Menus



The on-screen menus disappear from the screen after about two minutes.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select one of the four icons. Then press the ► button to access the icon's sub-menu. Press the **EXIT** button to exit. You can also use the MENU, CHANNEL and VOLUME buttons on the control panel of the TV to make selections.

Viewing the Display



 The on-screen displays disappear after about ten seconds.

When Closed Caption has been set, the icon(**CC**) will appear by pressing the INFO button.

Memorizing the Channels

Your TV can memorize and store all of the available channels for both "off-air" (antenna) and cable channels. After the available channels are memorized, use the **CH** \land and **CH** \checkmark buttons to scan through the channels. This eliminates the need to change channels by entering the channel digits. There are three steps for memorizing channels: selecting a broadcast source, memorizing the channels (automatic) and adding and deleting channels (manual).

Selecting the Video Signal Source

Before your television can begin memorizing the available channels, you must specify the type of signal source that is connected to the TV (i.e., an antenna or a cable system).





Note: STD, HRC and IRC identify various types of cable TV systems. Contact your local cable company to identify the type of cable system that exists in your particular area.

At this point the signal source has been selected. Proceed to "Storing Channels in Memory" (next page).

Storing Channels in Memory (Automatic Method)

First, select the correct signal source (ANT, STD, HRC, IRC). See steps 1~2 on previous page.

Press the **MENU** button, then press the ▲ or ▼ button to select "Channel" then press the ◀ or ► button.

After all the available channels are stored, the Channel menu reappears. Press the $\ensuremath{\text{EXIT}}$ button to exit.

 The TV automatically cycles through all of the available channels and stores them in memory. This takes about one to two minutes.

Press the MENU button at any time to interrupt the memorization process and return to the Channel menu.

Adding and Erasing Channels (Manual Method)







Press the ◀, ► or number buttons to select the channel you want added or erased.

Changing Channels

Using the Channel Buttons

Press the CH \wedge or CH \vee button to change channels.

When you press $CH \land$ or $CH \lor$, the TV changes channels in sequence. You will see all the channels that the TV has memorized. (The TV must have memorized at least three channels.) You will not see channels that were either erased or not memorized.

Using the "-" Button

The "-" button is used to select channels that broadcast a analog.



Using the PRE-CH Button to select the Previous Channel

Press the **PRE-CH** button. The TV will switch to the last channel viewed.



To quickly switch between two channels that are far apart, tune to one channel, then use the number button to select the second channel. Then, use the **PRE-CH** button to quickly alternate between them.

Customizing the Picture

You can use the on-screen menus to change the contrast, brightness, sharpness, color, and tint according to personal preference. (Alternatively, you can use one of the "automatic" settings. See next page.)

Using Automatic Picture Settings

Your TV has three automatic picture settings ("Dynamic", "Standard" and "Movie") that are preset at the factory. You can activate either Dynamic, Standard or Movie by making a selection from the menu. Or, you can select "Custom" which automatically recalls your personalized picture settings.



- Choose "Dynamic" for viewing the TV during the day or when there is brightlight in the room.
- Choose "Standard" for the standard factory settings.
- Choose "Movie" when viewing the TV in low light, or when playing video games.
- Choose "Custom" if you want to adjust the settings according to personal preference (see "Customizing the Picture", page 25).

Adjusting the Volume

Press the $\ensuremath{\text{VOL}}\xspace+$ or $\ensuremath{\text{VOL}}\xspace+$ or decrease the volume.

Using the MUTE Button

At any time, you can temporarily cut off the sound using the MUTE button.

Press the **MUTE** button and the sound cuts off. The word "Mute" will appear in the lower-left corner of the screen.

Special Features

Fine Tuning Channels

Use fine tuning to manually adjust a particular channel for optimal reception.

Labeling the Channels

Use this feature to assign an easy-to-remember label to any channel (i.e., "CBS", "ESPN", "PBS2", CNN1", etc.). A label consists of four fields, where each field is a letter, a number, "*", or a blank. When the **INFO** button is pressed, the channel label will appear next to the channel number.

Changing the Screen Size







- Normal : Sets the picture to 4:3 normal mode. This is a standard TV screen size.
- Zoom : Magnifies the size of the picture on screen.

Using the Surf Feature

This feature allows you to set the TV to return to a particular channel after a certain amount of time. For example, you may be watching a channel when commercials start. You can set the Surf to "5 minutes", then switch channels. After 5 minutes, the TV will return to the original channel. To use the Surf:

The time you set will begin counting down on the screen. When the time runs out, the TV will return to the channel you were watching when you set the timer.

The time will be decreasing while you are setting up the timer. And you will reset it when you pass

Choosing a Multi-Channel Sound (MTS) Soundtrack

Depending on the particular program being broadcast, you can listen to stereo, mono or a Separate Audio Program. (SAP audio is usually a foreign-language translation. Sometimes SAP has unrelated information like news or weather.)



- Choose "Stereo" for channels that are broadcasting in stereo.
- Choose "*Mono*" for channels that are broadcasting in mono, or if you are having difficulty receiving a stereo signal.
- Choose "SAP" to listen to the Separate Audio Program, which is usually a foreign-language translation.

Extra Sound Settings

Auto Volume

Each broadcasting station has its own signal conditions, and so it is not easy for you to adjust the volume every time the channel is changed. "Auto Volume" lets you automatically adjust the volume of the desired channel by lowering the sound output when the modulation signal is high or by raising the sound output when the modulation signal is low.

Melody

You can set a melody to sound when the TV is powered On or Off.

• Surround

"Surround" converts a mono or stereo signal into simulated surround sound. Once the "Surround" is set to "On", the setting applies to sound effects such as Standard, Music, Movie and Speech.

• Turbo Sound

Turbo sound suitably emphasizes both higher and lower bands of sound (and includes other effects).



Setting the On/Off Timer



 Before using the timer, you must set the TV's clock. (See "Setting the Clock" on page 29).

Special Features



Setting the Sleep Timer

The sleep timer automatically shuts off the TV after a preset time (from 10 to 180 minutes).



 After about 5 seconds, the sleep display will disappear from the screen, and the time interval will be set.

Viewing Closed Captions

Your TV decodes and displays the closed captions that are broadcast with certain TV shows. These captions are usually subtitles for the hearing impaired or foreign-language translations. All VCRs record the closed caption signal from television programs, so home-recorded video tapes also provide closed captions. Most pre-recorded commercial video tapes provide closed captions as well. Check for the closed caption symbol in your television schedule and on the tape's packaging: **cc**.



Use the \blacktriangle , \bigtriangledown , \triangleleft and \triangleright buttons to make the changes. (Follow the same procedure as in steps 3~4 above.)

Viewing the Demonstration

To become familiar with the various menus provided by your television, you can view the in built demonstration.



When you wish to stop the demonstration, press any button on the remote control.

If the TV seems to have a problem, first try this list of possible problems and solutions. If none of these troubleshooting tips apply, then call your nearest service center.

Problem	Possible Solution
Poor picture	Try another channel. Adjust the antenna. Check all wire connections.
Poor sound quality.	Try another channel. Adjust the antenna.
No picture or sound.	Try another channel. Press the SOURCE button. Make sure the TV is plugged in. Check the antenna connections.
No color, wrong colors or tints.	Make sure the program is broadcast in color. Adjust the picture settings. If the set is moved or turned in a different direction, the power should be OFF for at least 30 minutes.
Picture rolls vertically.	Adjust the antenna. Check all wire connections.
The TV operates erratically	Unplug the TV for 30 seconds, then try operating it again.
The TV won't turn on.	Make sure the wall outlet is working.

Identifying Problems

Cleaning and Maintaining Your TV

With proper care, your TV unit will give you many years of service. Please follow these guidelines to get the maximum performance from your TV.

Placement

- Do not place the TV near extremely hot, cold, humid or dusty places.
- Do not place the TV near appliances with electric motors that create magnetic fields, such as vacuum cleaners.
- Keep the ventilation openings clear; do not place the TV on a soft surface, such as cloth or paper.
- Place the TV in a vertical position only.

Liquids

• Do not handle liquids near or on the TV. Liquids that spill into it can cause serious damage.

Cabinet

- Never open the cabinet or touch the parts inside.
- Wipe your TV with a clean, dry cloth. Never use water, cleaning fluids, wax, or chemicals.
- Do not put heavy objects on top of the cabinet.

Temperature

• If your TV is suddenly moved from a cold to a warm place, unplug the power cord, and allow at least two hours for moisture that may have formed inside the unit to dry completely.

Using Your TV in Another Country

If you plan to take your TV with you to a foreign country, please be aware of the different television systems that are in use around the world. A TV designed for one system may not work properly with another system due to differences in the TV channel frequencies.
