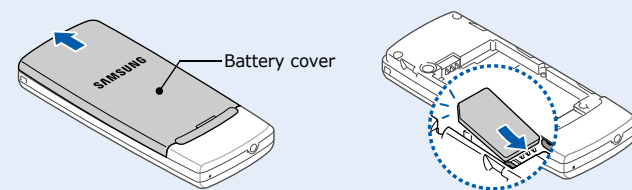

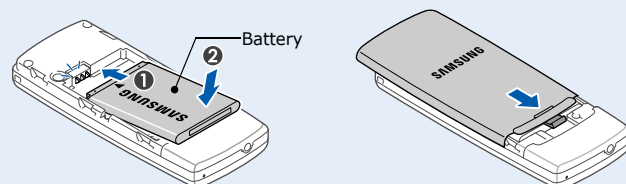

Installing the SIM card and battery

1. Remove the battery cover and insert the SIM card.

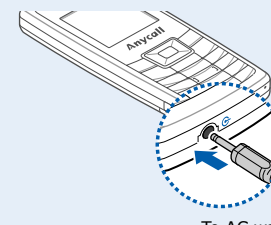


2. Install the battery and reattach the cover.



Charging the battery

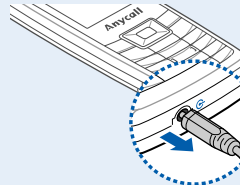
1. Plug the supplied travel adapter.



To AC wall outlet

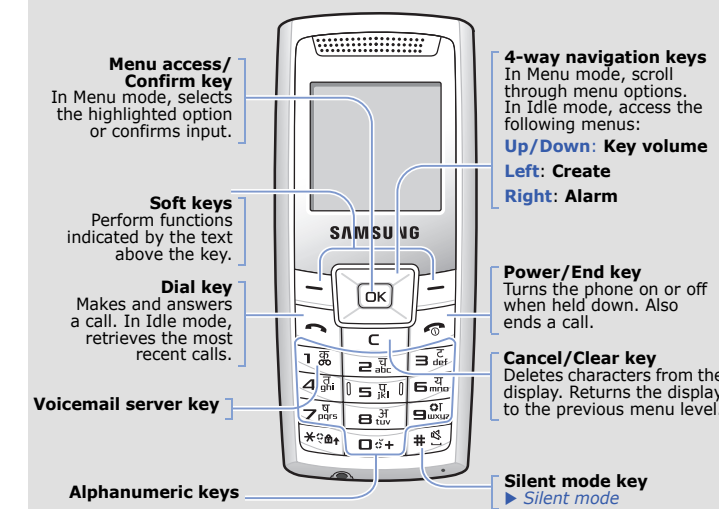
Note: When you plug in the travel adapter, the charging indicator may not appear for up to 5 minutes, but the battery is charging properly.

2. When charging is finished, unplug the adapter.



Note: Do not remove the battery from the phone without unplugging the adapter first. Otherwise, the phone may be damaged.

Phone layout and key functions

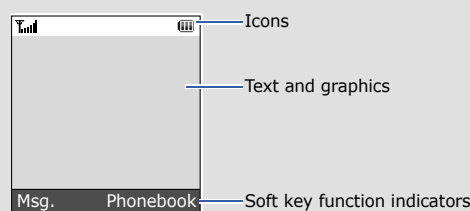


Silent mode
 Press and hold **#** in Idle mode to disable all sounds on the phone. To exit, press and hold this key again.

Keypad lock mode
 Press and hold ***** in Idle mode and then press the **Yes** soft key to lock the keypad. To unlock, press the **Unlock** soft key and then *****.

Display

Your phone is in Idle mode when you are not on a call or using a menu. You must be in Idle mode to dial a phone number.



Your phone displays the following status indicators on the top of the screen:

Switching on or off the phone

- Press and hold for more than one second to switch on the phone.
- If the time & date message appears, press the **Yes** soft key and set the time and date by the following onscreen instructions.
- To switch off the phone, press and hold for more than two seconds.

Changing the display language

- In Idle mode, press **OK** key.
- Select **Phone settings** → **Language** → **Text language**.
- Select a language.

Making a call

- In Idle mode, enter an area code and phone number, and press .
- When you want to end the call, press .

Answering a call

- When the phone rings, press the **Accept** soft key or to answer a call.
 To reject the call, press .
- To end the call, press .

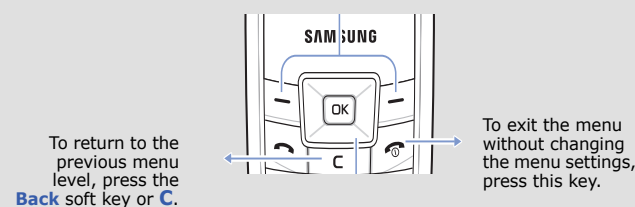

Using the menus

In Idle mode, press the **OK** key to enter the main menu.

Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key () or right soft key () to perform the function indicated.



Use the 4-way navigation keys to scroll up, down, left, or right through the menu system, highlight menu items, and change feature settings.

To select or modify a menu or feature:

- In Idle mode, press the **OK** key.
- Press the Navigation keys to reach a desired menu and then press the **Select** soft key or **OK** key.
- If the menu contains any submenus, locate the one you want by pressing the Navigation keys. Press the **Select** soft key or **OK** key to enter the submenu.
 If the selected menu contains additional submenus, repeat this step.
- Press the Navigation keys to find the setting of your choice.
- Press the **Select** soft key or **OK** key to confirm your chosen setting.

Adjusting the volume

- In Idle mode, press **OK** key.
- Select **Sound settings** → **Incoming calls** → **Ring volume**.
- Press the Navigation keys to adjust the volume level.
- Press the **Save** soft key.

While a call is in progress, press **Up** or **Down** to adjust the earpiece volume.

Changing a ringtone for calls

- In Idle mode, press **OK** key.
- Select **Sound settings** → **Incoming calls** → **Default ringtones**.
- Select a ringtone and press the **Yes** soft key.

Redialling recent numbers

- In Idle mode, press .
- Press **Up** or **Down** to scroll to the number you want.
- Press to dial the number.

Entering text

Changing the text input mode

In a text input field, press the right soft key until the input mode indicator you want appears:

- Eng**: T9 mode
- Eng**: ABC mode
- Eng**: Number mode
- None: Symbol mode

T9 mode

- Press **2** to **9** to start entering a word. Press each key once for one letter.

The word you are entering appears on the display. It may change with each keystroke. Finish entering the word before editing or deleting any keystrokes.

Example: To enter "Hello" in T9 mode, press **4, 3, 5, 5,** and **6**.

- Press **#** to insert a space and enter the next word.

ABC mode

Press the keys labelled with the character you want once for the first letter, twice for the second letter, and so on.

For example, press **2** three times to enter "C" and **5** two times to enter "K".

Number mode

Press the keys corresponding to the digits you want.

Symbol mode

Press the number keys corresponding to the symbol you want and press the **OK** soft key. You can press **Up** or **Down** to display more symbols.

Tips for entering text

- To move the cursor, press the Navigation keys.
- To delete characters one by one, press **C**. To delete all of the characters, press and hold **C**.
- To insert a space between characters, press **#**.
- To change case in T9 mode or ABC mode, press *****.
- To enter punctuation marks in T9 mode or ABC mode, press **1**.
- To access additional options related to text input, press and hold the **Right** soft key.

Using the Neopad Indian Mode

To type a character in the Neopad Hindi mode:

- Press a corresponding key to access the Virtual Keypad that contains a character you want. The character will appear in the Virtual Keypad at the bottom of display.

If you want to know which key is assigned to which Hindi characters troup, see the table of “List of the characters available in Hindi”.

Sending an SMS message

- In Idle mode, press **Left**.
- Enter the message text.
- Press the **Options** soft key and add items using the following options:
 - Add media**: add sounds, images, or animated images.
 - Add emoticon**: add emoticons.
 - Templates**: add text templates.
- Press the **Options** soft key and select **Send**.
- Select an empty location.
- Enter a destination number and press the **OK** soft key.
- Press the **Send** soft key to send the message.

Quick feature reference

This section provides brief explanations of features on your phone.

View recent calls	View the most recent calls you have dialed, received, or missed.	OK > Call log > Missed calls, Received calls, or Dialed calls

Select a message tone	Select the alert ringtone and alert type for incoming SMS messages or set how often you are informed of a new message.	OK > Sound settings > Messages
Power on/off tone	Set the phone to sound when it is switched on or off.	OK > Sound settings > Power on/off
Connection tone	Set the phone to beep when a call is connected to the system.	OK > Sound settings > Connection tone
Select key tone and volume	Select a tone which the phone sounds when you press a key or adjust the key tone volume.	OK > Sound settings > Keypad tone
Minute minder	Set the phone to beep every minute during a call to keep you informed of the length of your call.	OK > Sound settings > Minute minder
Silent mode	Set how the phone acts to alert you to a specific event while in Silent mode.	OK > Sound settings > Silent mode
Alerts on call	Set the phone to alert you when you receive a new message or when the time for an alarm comes during a call.	OK > Sound settings > Alerts on call
Display settings	Change settings for the display and backlight.	OK > Phone settings > Display
Greeting message	Enter the greeting message to be displayed when the phone is switched on.	OK > Phone settings > Greeting message

- Press the corresponding key 1 to 5 to input a character, or press the ***** key to toggle a virtual keypad page to Virama.

Note: When you enter a character, you will see the predicted word in the word prediction box at the bottom of the display. If you want to know about this input method, see the page 2. Otherwise, repeat above steps to enter other characters.

Feature	Description	Select
Delete recent calls	Delete the call logs in each call type, or all logs at once.	OK > Call log > Delete all
Call time display	View the duration of recent calls you have dialed and received. Also reset the time counter.	OK > Call log > Call time
Call cost display	View the cost of your calls.	OK > Call log > Call costs
Find a contact	Search for contacts in Phonebook.	OK>Phonebook > Find name
Create an FDN list	Create a list of contacts to be used in FDN (Fixed Dialling Number) mode, in which the phone allows outgoing calls only to the specified phone numbers.	OK > Phonebook > FDN list
Add a new contact	Add a new contact to Phonebook.	OK > Phonebook > Add entry
Speed dial	Assign speed dial numbers (2 to 9) for eight of your most frequently dialled numbers.	OK > Phonebook > Speed-dial list numbers.

Mobile tracker	Track your phone when it is stolen or lost. When someone tries to use your phone with other SIM card, the phone will automatically send the preset tracking message to your family or friends.	OK > Phone settings > Security > Mobile tracker
Auto redial	Set the phone to make up to ten attempts to redial a phone number after an unsuccessful call.	OK > Phone settings > Auto redial
Voice clarity	Remove extraneous noise and increase call quality so that the other person can hear you clearly.	OK > Phone settings > Voice clarity

Example: To enter **वम** (made up of half character), press the **1**,

- *** (Virama), **1**, **5**, and **5** keys.

Example: To enter **किए** (**क** + **ि** + **ए**), press the **1**, **1**, **9**, **2**, **8**,

- *** (toggles the page), and **2** keys.

Typing a word using the linguistic dictionary (Forward prediction)

- Enter the first character of the word you want.
- You will see a word starting with the first character you enter in the word prediction box at the bottom of the display.
- If that word is correct, go to step.
 - Alternatively, press the Up or Down key to search the word you want to enter.
- Press the **OK** key to select it.

Important safety precautions

Read these guidelines before using your wireless phone. Failure to comply with them may be dangerous or illegal.

Drive safely at all times

Do not use a hand-held phone while driving; park your vehicle first.

Switching off when refuelling

Do not use the phone at a refuelling point (service station) or near fuels or chemicals.

Switching off in an aircraft

Wireless phones can cause interference. Using them in an aircraft is both illegal and dangerous.

Switching off near all medical equipment

Hospitals and health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy. Follow any regulations or rules in force.

Interference

All wireless phones may be subject to interference, which could affect their performance.

Special regulations

Follow any special regulations in force in any area and always switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it.

Water resistance

Your phone is not water-resistant. Keep it dry.

Sensible use

Use only in the normal position (held to your ear). Avoid unnecessary contact with the antenna when the phone is switched on.

Emergency calls

Key in the emergency number for your present location, then press . Do not end the call until given permission to do so.

Small children and your phone

Keep the phone and all its parts including accessories out of reach of small children.

Example: To enter **बहुत अच्छा**(**ढ** + **ह** + **ु** + **त** + space + **अ** + **च** + **छ** + **ा**) using the linguistic dictionary, first press the **5**, **3**, **7**, and **3** keys and then you will see **बहुत** in the word prediction box. Press the **OK** key to select the word.

Press the **#** key to insert a space for the next word. Press the **8**, **1**, **2**, ***** (Virama), and **1** keys and then you will see **अच्छा** in the word prediction box. Press the **OK** key to select the word.

Message templates	Preset templates of frequently used messages.	OK > Messages > Templates
Voicemail	Access your voicemail server and listen to messages on the network.	OK > Messages > Voice mail
Broadcast message	Change settings for the service and access broadcast messages.	OK > Messages > Broadcast
Messaging options	Set options for using messaging services.	OK > Messages > Settings

Qualified service

Only qualified service personnel may repair your phone.

SAR information

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the European Union (EU) Council. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on the safety standards that were developed by independent scientific organisations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies.

The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for wireless phones employs a unit of measurement known as Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR limit set by the EU Council is 2.0 W/kg. The highest SAR value for this model phone was 0.832 W/kg.
