safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



Safety warnings

Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone.
 Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries in a fire. Follow all local regulations when disposing used batteries.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

Avoid interference with pacemakers


Maintain a minimum of 15 cm (6 inches) between mobile phones and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

When sending text messages or playing games on your phone, hold the phone with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, use special features that reduce the number of keys you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent breaks.



Drive safely at all times

Avoid using your phone while driving and obey all regulations that restrict the use of mobile phones while driving. Use hands-free accessories to increase your safety when possible.

Follow all safety warnings and regulations

Comply with any regulations that restrict the use of a mobile phone in a certain area.

Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your phone or cause injury.

Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

Your phone can cause interference with aircraft equipment. Follow all airline regulations and turn off your phone or switch to a mode that disables the wireless functions when directed by airline personnel.



Protect batteries and chargers from damage

- Avoid exposing batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0° C/32° F or above 45° C/ 113° F). Extreme temperatures can reduce the charging capacity and life of your batteries.
- Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and - terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- Never use a damaged charger or battery.

Handle your phone carefully and sensibly

 Do not allow your phone to get wet—liquids can cause serious damage. Do not handle your phone with wet hands. Water damage to your phone can void your manufacturer's warranty.

- Avoid using or storing your phone in dusty, dirty areas to prevent damage to moving parts.
- Your phone is a complex electronic device protect it from impacts and rough handling to avoid serious damage.
- Do not paint your phone, as paint can clog moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Avoid using the phone's camera flash or light close to the eyes of children or animals.
- Your phone and memory cards may be damaged by exposure to magnetic fields. Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic closures or allow your phone to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time.

Avoid interference with other electronic devices

Your phone emits radio frequency (RF) signals that may interfere with unshielded or improperly shielded electronic equipment, such as pacemakers, hearing aids, medical devices, and other electronic devices in homes or vehicles. Consult the manufacturers of your electronic devices to solve any interference problems you experience.

Important usage information

Use your phone in the normal position

Avoid contact with your phone's internal antenna.

Allow only qualified personnel to service your phone

Allowing unqualified personnel to service your phone may result in damage to your phone and will void your warranty.

Ensure maximum battery and charger life

- Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.
- Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.

- Disconnect chargers from power sources when not in use.
- Use batteries only for their intended purpose.

Handle SIM, UIM, and memory cards with care

- Do not remove a card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or phone.
- Protect cards from strong shocks, static electricity, and electrical noise from other devices.
- Frequent writing and erasing will shorten the life span of memory cards.
- Do not touch gold-coloured contacts or terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.

Ensure access to emergency services

Emergency calls from your phone may not be possible in some areas or circumstances. Before travelling in remote or undeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) certification information

Your phone conforms to European Union (EU) standards that limit human exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy emitted by radio and telecommunications equipment. These standards prevent the sale of mobile phones that exceed a maximum exposure level (known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR) of 2.0 watts per kilogram of body tissue.





assembling and preparing your mobile phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.


Install the battery

1. Remove the battery cover.





2. Insert the UIM and SIM card.





- Place the UIM and SIM card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
- Use the left slot for the UIM card only. Use the right slot for the SIM card only.

3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

- Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
- 2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.





- Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- When the battery is fully charged (the (IIIII icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.

About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD $^{\rm TM}$ memory cards of up to 4 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).

- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Remove the battery.

3. Unlock the memory card cover.



4. Lift the memory card cover and insert a memory card with the label side facing up.



5. Close and lock the memory card cover.



using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

Your phone supports GSM and CDMA networks simultaneously and allows you to switch between available networks.

- Press and hold [[®]].
- Activate the UIM or SIM card and set a primary card.
- Enter your PIN and tap → (if necessary).
 To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

Switch to Offline mode

By switching to Offline mode, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.

To switch to Offline mode, tap $\boxed{\exists}$ \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Call settings \rightarrow Flight mode \rightarrow On.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- 1. In Idle mode, tap an icon for the menu you want.
- 2. Scroll to a menu or an option.
- Tap →, ⑤, or ♂ to confirm the highlighted option.
- 4. Tap ← to move up one level; Press [•] to return to Idle mode.

Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down to adjust the key tone volume.

Select a key tone

- In Idle mode, select → Sounds → Key tones/ Others → Keypad tone.
- 2. Scroll down to Sound.
- 3. Scroll left or right to a key tone.
- 4. Tap [중].

Switch to or from Silent mode

In Idle mode, press and hold [#] to switch to or from Silent mode.

Calibrate the screen

You can calibrate the screen so that your phone recognise the input better.

- In Idle mode, tap ₱ → Settings → Stylus adjust.
- 2. Tap the target on the screen with your stylus.

Change your ringtone

- 1. In Idle mode, tap \blacksquare \rightarrow Sounds \rightarrow Ringtone.
- 2. Scroll down to Melody.
- 3. Scroll left or right to a ringtone.
- 4. Tap 🖪.

Activate SSR mode

In Idle mode, press and hold the navigation key up. Your phone will alert you to incoming calls by vibrating itself and ringing at the highest volume in noisy places.

Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- In Idle mode, tap 国 → Display → Wallpaper → Stand-by → Background image.
- 2. Select an image category → an image.
- 3. Tap 🖫.

Select a skin colour (Menu mode)

- 1. In Idle mode, tap \blacksquare \rightarrow Display \rightarrow Skin color.
- 2. Select a colour pattern.
- 3. Tap 🖫.

Set menu shortcuts

- 2. Select a key to use as a shortcut.
- 3. Tap ₱ → Assign.
- 4. Select a menu to assign to the shortcut key.
- 5. Tap 📑.
- 6. Tap a desired icon.

Set the smart screen shortcuts

- In Idle mode, tap ₱ → Display → Smart screen.
- 2. Select the menus you want to use in the smart screen.
- 3. Tap 🕄.

To use the smart screen, tap **[3]** in Idle mode.

Lock your phone

- In Idle mode, tap ₱ → Settings → Password/ Lock settings.
- 2. Tap O to confirm.
- 3. Enter a new 4-digit password and tap ->.
- Enter the new password again and tap →.
- 5. Select Select lock method → On or Once.
- 6. Tap 🗒.

Select a primary network

- 1. In Idle mode, press [₺].
- Select a CDMA or GSM network by selecting a primary card.
- 3. Select →.

Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

Make a call

- In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
- 2. Press [-], or tap \mathcal{C}_{\bullet} or \mathcal{C}_{\bullet} to dial the number.
- 3. To end the call, press $[\ensuremath{\ensuremath{\sigma}}$].

Answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [-].
- 2. To end the call, press [7].

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume key up or down.

Use the speakerphone feature

- During a call, tap
 ¬ Private loud speaker to activate the speaker.
- To switch back to the earpiece, tap ₱ → Private loud speaker again.

Use the headset

By connecting the supplied headset to the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press the headset button, and then press again and hold.
- To answer a call, press and hold the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

Send and view messages

Learn to send and view text (SMS) and multimedia (MMS) messages.

Send a text message

- In Idle mode, tap
 → Messages → Text message → Write new message.
 You can also tap
 → Text message → Write new message in Idle mode.
- 2. Select a card.
- 3. Enter your message text and tap →. ▶ p. 26
- Enter a destination number and tap → to send the message.

Send a multimedia message

- In Idle mode, tap → Messages →
 Multimedia message → New message.
 You can also tap → Multimedia message →
 New message in Idle mode.
- Enter a title and tap →.
- 3. Tap the message field.
- Enter your message text and tap →.
- 5. Tap Picture/Video or Sound and add an item.
- 3. Tap →.
- 7. Tap the destination input field.
- Enter a destination number or an email address and tap ->.
- 9. Tap to send the message.

Enter text

With your phone's keypad, touch screen, and stylus, you can enter or write text.

To change the text input method, tap an input method icon.



To enter text using the keypad,

Mode	Function
English T9	 Press the appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word. When the word displays correctly, scroll right. If the correct word does not display, press [0] to select an alternate word.
English abc	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.
Hinglish	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a Hinglish word, which is made by combining of Hindi and English according to Hindi grammar.
Number	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number.
Symbol	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to select a symbol.

To enter text using the virtual keyboard,



Find a contact

Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

Capture photos

- In Idle mode, press and hold [面] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Press [1] and select **Single shot** to switch to Capturing mode (if necessary).
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 4. Press [OK] or [窗], or tap [o] to take a photo.
- 5. Tap 3 or press 6 to save the photo.

View photos

In Idle mode, tap \blacksquare \to Contents box \to Photos/Movies \to My album \to Gallery \to a photo file.

Capture videos

- In Idle mode, press and hold [面] to turn on the camera.
- Press [1] and select Video cam to switch to Recording mode.
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 4. Press [OK] or [a], or tap to start recording.
- 5. Tap
 or press [6] to stop recording.

Use advanced call functions

Learn about your phone's additional calling capabilities.

View and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call,

- Tap
- 2. Scroll to the missed call you want to dial.
- 3. Press [] to dial.

Call a recently dialled number

- In Idle mode, press [] to display a list of recent numbers.
- Scroll to the number you want and press [¬], or tap ← or ← to dial.

Hold a call or retrieve a held call (GSM network only)

Tap \mathfrak{A} to place a call on hold or retrieve a held call.

Dial a second call (GSM network only)

If your network supports this function, you can dial another number during a call:

- 1. Tap & to place the first call on hold.
- 2. Enter the second number to dial and press [-].
- 3. Tap 🔂 to switch between the two calls.
- 4. To end the call on hold, tap \nearrow End held call.
- 5. To end the current call, press [].

Answer a second call (GSM network only)

If your network supports this function, you can answer a second incoming call:

- Press [] to answer the second call.
 The first call is automatically placed on hold.
- 2. Tap (to switch between the calls.

Make a multiparty call (conference call) (GSM network only)

- 1. Call the first party you want to add to the multiparty call.
- While connected to the first party, call the second party.The first party is automatically placed on hold.

- Repeat steps 2 and 3 to add more parties (if necessary).
- 5. To end the multiparty call, press [.

Call an international number

- In Idle mode, press and hold [0] to insert the international call code.
- Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then press [--], or tap ← or ← to dial.

Call a contact from the Contacts

You can call numbers directly from the **Contacts** using stored contacts. \blacktriangleright p. 28

- In Idle mode, tap ₱ → Contacts → Search. You can also tap ₱ in Idle mode.
- 2. Scroll to the number you want to dial and press [-], or tap & to dial.

Use advanced Contacts functions

Learn to create namecards, set speed dial numbers, and create groups of contacts.

Create a namecard

- In Idle mode, tap
 □ → Contacts → Business card → Business card book.
- 2. Tap **3** → **Edit**.
- 3. Enter your personal details and tap 3.



You can send your namecard by attaching it to a message.

Set speed dial numbers

troubleshooting

If you are having trouble with your mobile phone, try these troubleshooting procedures before contacting a service professional.

While using your phone, the following messages may appear:

Message	Try this to solve the problem:
Emergency call only. Please insert SIM or UIM card to access network services	Ensure that the card is installed correctly.
Enter PIN	When using the phone for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the card.

Message	Try this to solve the problem:
Unblock code	Your card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.

Your phone displays "No service" or "Network error."

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

You enter a number, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key: [-].
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

Another caller cannot reach you.

- Ensure that your phone is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

Another caller cannot hear you speaking.

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes.

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

The audio quality of the call is poor.

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

You select a contact to call, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- · Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.

The battery does not charge properly or sometimes the phone turns itself off.

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both gold-coloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery.

Your phone is hot to the touch.

When you use several applications at once, your phone requires more power and may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.

Some of the contents in this manual may differ from your phone depending on the software of the phone or your service provider.
