SSR mode Press and hold **#** in Idle mode to activate/deactivate the SSR mode. The SSR mode is for alerting you to incoming calls in noisy places, by simultaneously vibrating and ringing at its highest volume.

Vibrate mode Press and hold **#** in Idle mode to disable all sounds on the phone. To exit, press and hold this key again.


Keypad lock mode Press and hold ***** in Idle mode to lock the keypad. After locking, accidental key presses do not affect the phone functions. To unlock, press the **Unlock** soft key and the ***** key.

SOS mode Press **C** four times in Idle mode to send SOS message to preset numbers. Once the SOS message is sent, the phone will change to Emergency Call Waiting mode and will receive calls only from the SOS message recipients until the Emergency Call Waiting mode is cancelled. Upon receiving a call from the SOS message recipients, the phone will automatically answer the call, after one vibration, relaying the emergency situation to the caller.

Display and icons

Your phone is in Idle mode when you are not on a call or using a menu. You must be in Idle mode to dial a phone number.

The display has three areas.



Your phone displays the following status indicators on the top of the screen:

Changing a ringtone for calls

- In Idle mode, press the **Menu** soft key.
- Select **Setup** → **Sound** → **Ringer** → **Voice calls**.
- Press **Down** and scroll to a ringer type by pressing **Left** or **Right**.
- Press **Down** the scroll to a ringer melody.
- Press the **Play** soft key to check the melody.
- Press the **Save** soft key.


Redialling recent numbers

- In Idle mode, press **○**.
- Press **Left** or **Right** to select a call type.
- Press **Up** or **Down** to scroll to a number or name.
- Press the **Select** soft key to view details of the call or **○** to dial the number.

Using the menus


In Idle mode, press the **Menu** soft key to enter the main menu.

Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key (**[...]**) or right soft key (**[...]**) to perform the function indicated.




Installing the UIM card and battery

- Remove the battery cover and insert the UIM card.




- Install the battery and reattach the cover.




Charging the battery

- Plug the supplied travel adapter.



- When charging is finished, unplug the adapter.



Note: Do not remove the battery from the phone without unplugging the adapter first. Otherwise, the phone may be damaged.

Phone layout and key functions

4-way navigation keys
In Menu mode, scroll through menu options.

In Idle mode, quickly access the following menus or functions:

Messages
View month
Ringer vol./type

Answering a call

- When the phone rings, press **○** to answer a call.
- To silence the ringer, press the **Silence** soft key.
- To reject the call, press the **Reject** soft key or **○**.
- When you want to end the call, press **○**.

Adjusting the volume

- In Idle mode, press the **Menu** soft key.
- Select **Setup** → **Sound** → **Ringer vol./type** → **Voice calls** → **Volume**.
- Press the Navigation keys to adjust the volume level.
- Press the **Play** soft key to check the volume level.
- Press the **OK** soft key.

While a call is in progress, press the Navigation keys to adjust the earpiece volume.

* You need to enter the phone password. It is preset to "0000".

Entering text

Changing the text input mode

- In the text input field, press the **Mode** soft key.
- Press the Navigation keys to scroll to the mode you want: **T9 Word**, **ABC Symbol**, and **123**.
- Press the **Select** soft key.

T9 Word mode

- Press keys **2** to **9** to start entering a word. Press each key only once for one letter.

The word you are entering appears on the display. It may change with each key press.

Finish entering the word before editing or deleting any keystrokes.

Example To enter "Hello" in T9 mode, press **4, 3, 5, 5**, and **6**.

If the word is not correct, press **0** to display alternative word choices for the keys that you have pressed.

- When the word displays correctly, insert a space after it by pressing **#**.

ABC mode

Press the keys labelled with the letter you want:

- once for the first letter

- twice for the second letter

- and so on.

For example, you press **2** three times to enter the letter "C" and **5** two times to enter the letter "K."

Symbol mode

Press the number keys corresponding to the symbols you want. You can press **Left** or **Right** to display more symbols.

123 mode

Press the number keys corresponding to the digits you want.

Tips for entering text

- To move the cursor, press the Navigation keys.
- To delete letters one by one, press **C**. To delete all of the letters, press and hold **C**.
- To insert a space between letters, press **#**.
- To change case in T9 Word or ABC mode, press *****.
- To enter punctuation marks in T9 Word or ABC mode, press **1**.

Sending a message

- In Idle mode, press the **Menu** soft key and select **Messages** → **Write**.
- Enter the message text and press the **OK** soft key.

- Select the priority level of the message, delivery acknowledgement option, and saving option you want and press the **OK** soft key.

- Enter a destination number.

Press the **Find** soft key to search for Phonebook numbers or recent call numbers.

- Press the **OK** soft key to send the message.

Note: If your message exceeds the maximum number of characters, the phone will split up to 3 messages.

Quick feature reference

This section provides brief explanations of features on your phone.

Air time	View the duration and number of recent calls you have dialled and received. Also reset the time counter.	Menu > Calls > Air time
Find Phone Book entry	Search for a Phone Book entry by name, entry number, group name, or storage location.	Menu > Phone Book > Find
Store phone number	Store a phone number, an email address, or a memo in Phone Book.	Menu > Phone Book > Add

Version	Check the phone's version.	Menu > Setup > Phone > Version
Airplane mode	Turn your phone's call functions on or off.	Menu > Setup > Phone > Airplane mode
Lock the phone	Lock the phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically. To unlock, enter the lock code.	Menu > Setup > Security > Phone lock
Change lock code	Change your current lock code.	Menu > Setup > Security > Change lock
Emergency numbers	Store emergency numbers. These numbers can be dialled even when your phone is locked.	Menu > Setup > Security > Emergency #
Voice privacy	Encrypts the voice channel so that people cannot eavesdrop on your conversation.	Menu > Setup > Security > Voice privacy
Restriction	Set the phone to restrict the use of call records, Phone Book entries and messages.	Menu > Setup > Security > Restriction
Clear memory	Erase Phone Book entries on the UIM card and in the phone's memory.	Menu > Setup > Security > Clear memory

Important safety precautions

Read these guidelines before using your wireless phone. Failure to comply with them may be dangerous or illegal.

Drive safely at all times

Do not use a hand-held phone while driving; park the vehicle first.

Switching off when refueling

Do not use the phone at a refueling point (service station) or near fuels or chemicals.

Switching off in an aircraft

Wireless phones can cause interference. Using them in an aircraft is both illegal and dangerous.

Switching off near all medical equipment

Hospitals and health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy. Follow any regulations or rules in force.

Interference

All wireless phones may be subject to interference, which could affect their performance.

Special regulations

Follow any special regulations in force in any area and always switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it.

Water resistance

Your phone is not water-resistant. Keep it dry.

Sensible use

Use only in the normal position (held to the ear). Avoid unnecessary contact with the antenna when the phone is switched on.

Emergency calls

Key in the emergency number for your present location, then press **OK**.

Do not end the call until given permission to do so.

Small children and your phone

Keep the phone and all its parts including accessories out of reach of small children.

Accessories and batteries

Use only Samsung-approved batteries and accessories, such as headsets and PC data cables. Use of any unauthorised accessories could damage you or your phone and may be dangerous.

CAUTION

Risk of explosion if a battery is replaced by an incorrect type.

Dispose of used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions.



At very high volume, prolonged listening to a headset can damage your hearing.

Qualified service

Only qualified service personnel may repair your phone.

SAR information

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on the safety standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and through evaluation of scientific studies.

The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for wireless phones employs a unit of measurement known as Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6W/kg*.

* In the U.S. and Canada, the SAR limit for mobile phones used by the public is 1.6 watts/kg (W/kg) averaged over one gram of tissue. The standard incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements.
