# Drive safely at all times

#### Follow all safety warnings and regulations

Comply with any regulations that restrict the use of a

#### Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your phone or cause injury.

### Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations. posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel

#### Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

Your phone can cause interference with aircraft equipment. Follow all airline regulations and turn off your phone or switch to a mode that disables the wireless functions when directed by airline personnel.

# Install mobile phones and equipment with

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly

#### Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- · Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries or phones in a fire. Follow all local regulations when disposing used batteries or
- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating

#### Avoid interference with pacemakers

Maintain a minimum of 15 cm between mobile phones and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

#### Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refueling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

## Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

While using your phone, hold the phone with a relaxed grip, press the buttons lightly, use special features that reduce the number of buttons you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent hreaks

# Protect batteries and chargers from damage

- · Avoid exposing batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0° C/32° F or above 45° C/ 113° F). Extreme temperatures can reduce the charging capacity and life of your batteries.
- · Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and - terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- · Never use a damaged charger or battery.

#### Handle your phone carefully and sensibly

- Do not allow your phone to get wet—liquids can cause serious damage. Do not handle your phone with wet hands. Water damage to your phone can void your manufacturer's warranty.
- · Avoid using or storing your phone in dusty, dirty areas to prevent damage to moving parts
- Your phone is a complex electronic device—protect it from impacts and rough handling to avoid serious damage
- · Do not paint your phone, as paint can clog moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Your phone may be damaged by exposure to magnetic fields. Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic closures or allow your phone to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time


#### Avoid interference with other electronic devices

Your phone emits radio frequency (RF) signals that may interfere with unshielded or improperly shielded electronic equipment, such as pacemakers, hearing aids, medical devices, and other electronic devices in homes or vehicles. Consult the manufacturers of your electronic devices to solve any interference problems you experience.

# Use your phone in the normal position

Avoid contact with your phone's internal antenna



## Allow only qualified personnel to service your phone

Allowing unqualified personnel to service your phone may result in damage to your phone and will void your warranty.

### Ensure maximum battery and charger life

- · Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.
- · Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.
- · Disconnect chargers from power sources when not
- Use batteries only for their intended purpose.

#### Handle UIM cards and memory cards with care

- Do not remove a card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or phone
- · Protect cards from strong shocks, static electricity, and electrical noise from other devices
- · Frequent writing and erasing will shorten the life span of memory cards
- · Do not touch gold-colored contacts or terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.

# Ensure access to emergency services

Emergency calls from your phone may not be possible in some areas or circumstances. Before traveling in remote or undeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel


#### Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) certification information

Your device conforms to U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) standards that limit human exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy emitted by radio and telecommunications equipment. These standards prevent the sale of mobile devices that exceed a maximum exposure level (known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR) of 1.6 watts per kilogram of body tissue.

During testing, the maximum SAR values recorded for this model were: In normal use, the actual SAR is likely to be much lower, as the device has been designed to emit only the RF energy necessary to transmit a signal to the nearest base station. By automatically emitting lower levels when possible, your device reduces your overall exposure to RF energy.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone based on the compliance of all reported SAR levels with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. 

### Turn your phone on or off

To turn your phone on.

- 1. Press and hold [ ]
- 2. Enter your PIN and press < OK > (if necessary).
- 3. When the mobile tracker message appears, press <Yes> and activate the mobile tracker feature. ► Activate the mobile tracker

To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

#### Access menus

To access your phone's menus.

- 1. In Idle mode, press < Menu> to access Menu mode.
- 2. Use the Navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.
- 3. Press <**Select**>, <**OK**>, or [►II] to confirm the highlighted option
- 4. Press <Back> to move up one level; Press [ ] to return to Idle mode

#### Make a call

- 1. In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number
- 2. Press [-] to dial the number.
- 3. To end the call, press [ ]

### Answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [-].

In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.

### Call a recently dialed number

#### To change the text input mode

- · Press and hold [#] to switch between T9Abc and Abc modes; In T9 mode, press [#] repeatedly to switch to HingAbc mode
- Press [#] to change case in T9Abc, HingAbc, and Abc modes, or switch to Number mode.
- Press [\*] to switch to Symbol mode

### HingAbc mode

- 1. Press the appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word
- 2. When the word displays correctly, press [0] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, press the Navigation key down to select an alternate word.

# T9Abc mode

- 1. Press the appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word
- 2. When the word displays correctly, press [0] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, press the Navigation key down to select an alternate word.

# Abc mode

Press the appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.

Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number

## Symbol mode

Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a symbol.



- · To move the cursor, press the Navigation key.
- To delete characters one by one, press <Clear>. To delete all of the characters, press and hold <Clear>.
- To insert a space between characters, press [0].
- To enter punctuation marks, press [1].

### Add a new contact

- 1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press <Options>
- 2. Select Create contact → a memory location (phone or UIM).
- 3. Select a number type (if necessary).

- 4 Enter contact information
- 5. Press < Options > → Save to add the contact to memory.

# Set favourite numbers

- 1 In Menu mode, select Phonebook → Favourites
- 2. Scroll to a number you want to set (1-9) and press [**▶**II]
- 3. Select a contact to assign to the number.

# Send and view messages

## To send a text message

- 1. In Menu mode, select  $Messages \rightarrow$ Create message
- 2. Enter a destination number and scroll down.
- 3. Enter the message text. ▶ Enter text
- 4. Press [►II] to send the message

### To view text messages

- 1. In Menu mode, select Messages → Inbox.
- 2. Select a text message.

# Activate the mobile tracker

This feature helps track your phone when it is stolen or when someone tries to use your phone using other UIM card, the phone will automatically send the preset tracking message to family or friends. This feature may be unavailable due to certain features supported by vour service provider.

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Security**  $\rightarrow$ Mobile tracker.
- 2. Enter your password and press < OK> The first time you access Mobile tracker, you will be

# Activate and send an SOS message

In an emergency, you can send SOS messages to your family or friends for help.

### To activate the SOS message

- 1. In Menu mode, select  $Messages \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow$  $\textbf{SOS messages} \rightarrow \textbf{Sending options}.$
- 2. Scroll left or right to On
- 3. Scroll down and press [▶II] to open the recipient list.
- 4. Press <Options>  $\rightarrow$  Add recipients  $\rightarrow$  Contacts list to open your contact list.
- 5. Select a contact
- 6. When you are finished selecting contacts, press <Options> → Save to save the recipients.
- 7. Scroll down and set the number of times to repeat the SOS message.
- 8. Press **<Save>** → **<Yes>**.

# To send an SOS message

- 1. With the keys locked, press [-] four times to send an SOS message to preset numbers. The phone switches to SOS mode and sends the preset SOS message
- 2. To exit SOS mode, press [ TO]

# Listen to music files

- 1. In Menu mode, select Music player.
- 2. Press < Options > → Create
- 3. Enter a title for your new playlist and press <Save>.

## Listen to the FM radio

- 1. Plug the supplied headset into the phone.
- 2. In Menu mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  FM radio.
- 3. Press [▶II] to start the FM radio.
- 4. Select < Yes> to start automatic tuning. The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.
- 5. Scroll left or right to a radio station.
- 6. To turn off the FM radio, press [►II].

# **Use Air services**

### To use the Brew service

You can use this service to download various kinds of ringtones, wallpapers, or games offered by your service provider. In Menu mode, select Air services → Brew.

## To use UIM Card toolkit menus

You can use a variety of additional services offered by your service provider. This menu is available only when you use a UTK UIM card that provides additional services. In Menu mode, select Air services → UIM

# Set and use alarms

# To set a new alarm

- 1. In Menu mode, select Organiser → Alarms
- 2. Select an empty alarm location.
- 4. Press [ $\blacktriangleright$ II], <Save>, or press <Options>  $\rightarrow$  Save.

### To stop an alarm

When the alarm sounds

- Press <OK> or [►II] to stop an alarm without
- Press <OK> or [►II] to stop an alarm with snooze, or press <Snooze> or any key to silence the alarm for the snooze period.

### To deactivate an alarm

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Organiser** → **Alarms**.
- 2. Select the alarm you want to deactivate
