

safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries or phones in a fire.
 Follow all local regulations when disposing used batteries or phones.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

Avoid interference with pacemakers


Maintain a minimum of 15 cm (6 inches) between mobile phones and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

While using your phone, hold the phone with a relaxed grip, press the buttons lightly, use special features that reduce the number of buttons you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent breaks.



Drive safely at all times

Avoid using your phone while driving and obey all regulations that restrict the use of mobile phones while driving. Use hands-free accessories to increase your safety when possible.

Follow all safety warnings and regulations

Comply with any regulations that restrict the use of a mobile phone in a certain area.

Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your phone or cause injury.

Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

Your phone can cause interference with aircraft equipment. Follow all airline regulations and turn off your phone or switch to a mode that disables the wireless functions when directed by airline personnel.

Protect batteries and chargers from damage

- Avoid exposing batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0° C/32° F or above 45° C/113° F). Extreme temperatures can reduce the charging capacity and life of your batteries.
- Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and - terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- Never use a damaged charger or battery.


Handle your phone carefully and sensibly

 Do not disassemble your phone due to a risk of electric shock.

- Do not allow your phone to get wet—liquids can cause serious damage. Do not handle your phone with wet hands. Water damage to your phone can void your manufacturer's warranty.
- Avoid using or storing your phone in dusty, dirty areas to prevent damage to moving parts.
- Your phone is a complex electronic device protect it from impacts and rough handling to avoid serious damage.
- Do not paint your phone, as paint can clog moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- If your phone has a camera flash or light, avoid using it close to the eyes of children or animals.
- Your phone may be damaged by exposure to magnetic fields. Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic closures or allow your phone to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time.

Avoid interference with other electronic devices

Your phone emits radio frequency (RF) signals that may interfere with unshielded or improperly shielded electronic equipment, such as pacemakers, hearing aids, medical devices, and other electronic devices in homes or vehicles. Consult the manufacturers of your electronic devices to solve any interference problems you experience.



Use your phone in the normal position

Avoid contact with your phone's internal antenna.

Allow only qualified personnel to service your phone

Allowing unqualified personnel to service your phone may result in damage to your phone and will void your warranty.

Ensure maximum battery and charger life

- Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.
- Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.

- Disconnect chargers from power sources when not in use.
- Use batteries only for their intended purpose.

Handle UIM cards and memory cards with care

- Do not remove a card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or phone.
- Protect cards from strong shocks, static electricity, and electrical noise from other devices.
- Frequent writing and erasing will shorten the life span of memory cards.
- Do not touch gold-coloured contacts or terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.

Ensure access to emergency services

Emergency calls from your phone may not be possible in some areas or circumstances. Before travelling in remote or undeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) certification information

Your phone conforms to U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) standards that limit human exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy emitted by radio and telecommunications equipment. These standards prevent the sale of mobile phones that exceed a maximum exposure level (known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR) of 1.6 watts per kilogram of body tissue. In normal use, the actual SAR is likely to be much lower, as the phone has been designed to emit only the RF energy necessary to transmit a signal to the nearest base station. By automatically emitting lower levels when possible, your phone reduces your overall exposure to RF energy.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorisation for this model phone based on the compliance of all reported SAR levels with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. The authorization can be found on the FCC Office of Engineering and Technology website at http://www.fcc.gov/oet/ea.

Closing the phone automatically locks the exposed keys to prevent you from accidentally pressing them. To unlock these keys, press <Unlock> \rightarrow <OK>.

assembling and preparing your mobile phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the UIM card and the battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a User Identity Module, or UIM, card with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the UIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.





If the phone is on, press and hold [•••] to turn it off.

2. Insert the UIM card.



- Place the card in the phone with the goldcoloured contacts facing down.
- You can only use voice call and text message functions with the regular UIM card. To use full network services, insert an OMH card (Ruby marked RUIM card).

3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

- 1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
- 2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- 3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- 4. When the battery is fully charged (the IIIII icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.

About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ memory cards up to 2 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).

- 1. Open the cover to the memory card slot on the side of the phone.
- 2. Insert a memory card with the label side facing up.



To remove the memory card, push it gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.



using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- 1. Slide open the phone.
- 2. Press and hold [.].
- 3. Enter your PIN and press <OK> (if necessary).
- 4. When the setup wizard opens, customise your phone as desired by following the screen.

To turn your phone off, repeat steps 1 and 2 above.

Switch to the offline mode

By switching to the offline mode, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.

To switch to the offline mode, in Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Phone settings \rightarrow Phone profiles \rightarrow Offline.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- 1. In Idle mode, press <**Menu**> to access Menu mode.
- 2. Use the Navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.
- 3. Press <**Select**> or the Confirm key to confirm the highlighted option.
- 4. Press <**Back**> to move up one level; Press [••••] to return to Idle mode.

Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press $[\blacktriangle/ {\bf \nabla}]$ to adjust the key tone volume.

Switch to or from the silent profile

In Idle mode, press and hold [#] to silence or unsilence your phone.

Change your ringtone

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Scroll to the profile you are using.
- 3. Press $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Edit \rightarrow Voice call ringtone.$

4. Select a ringtone category \rightarrow a ringtone.

5. Press <**Options** $> \rightarrow$ **Save**.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- 1. In Menu mode, select Settings → Display settings → Home screen → Wallpaper.
- 2. Select an image category \rightarrow an image.
- 3. Press <Save>.

Set menu shortcuts

- 1. In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone settings → Shortcuts.
- 2. Select a key to use as a shortcut.
- 3. Select a menu to assign to the shortcut key.

Lock your phone

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Security settings → Phone lock → On.
- 2. Enter a new 4-digit password and press <OK>.
- 3. Enter the new password again and press <OK>.



The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.

Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

Make a call

1. In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.

- 2. Press [----] to dial the number.
- 3. To end the call, press [----].

Answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [-].
- 2. To end the call, press [---].

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press $[\blacktriangle/\intercal]$.

Use the speakerphone feature

- 1. During a call, press the Confirm key \rightarrow <**Yes**> to activate the speaker.
- 2. To switch back to the earpiece, press the Confirm key again.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.

Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press and hold the headset button.
- To answer a call, press and hold the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

Send and view messages

Learn to send and view text (SMS) and multimedia (MMS) messages.

Send a text message

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create new message → Text messages.
- 2. Enter a destination number and scroll down.
- 3. Enter your message text. ► Enter text
- 4. Press $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Send$ to send the message.

Send a multimedia message

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create new message → Multimedia messages.
- 2. Enter a destination number or an email address and scroll down.

- 3. Enter a subject and scroll down.
- 4. Enter your message text.
- Press <Options> → Add picture, Add video or Add sound and add an item.
- 6. Press $\langle \text{Options} \rangle \rightarrow \text{Send}$ to send the message.

Enter text

When entering text, you can change the text input mode:

- Press and hold [*] to select an input mode.
- Press and hold [#] to switch between T9 and ABC modes.
- Press [#] to change case or switch to Number mode in T9 or ABC mode.
- Press [*] to switch to Symbol mode.

Enter text in one of the following modes:

Mode	Function
Т9	 Press the appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word. When the word displays correctly, press [0] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, select an alternate word from the list that appears.
ABC	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.
Hinglish	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a Hinglish word, which is made by combining of Hindi and English according to Hindi grammar.
Number	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number.
Symbol	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to select a symbol.

View text or multimedia messages

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** \rightarrow **Inbox**.
- 2. Select a text or multimedia message.

Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the phonebook feature.

Add a new contact

- 1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press <**Options**>.
- 2. Select **Save** \rightarrow a memory location (phone or UIM).
- 3. Enter contact information.
- 4. Press < Options $> \rightarrow$ Save to add the contact to memory.

Find a contact

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find.
- 3. Select the contact's name from the search list.
- using basic function
- Once you have found a contact, you can:
 - call the contact by pressing [----]
 - edit the contact's information by pressing the Confirm key

Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

Capture photos

1. In Idle mode, press and hold [1] to turn on the camera.

- 2. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- Press the Confirm key or [[™]] to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.
 After capturing photos, press < [™]> to view photos.

View photos

In Menu mode, select My files \rightarrow Phone memory \rightarrow Images \rightarrow a photo file.

Capture videos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [@] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Press [1] twice to switch to Recording mode.
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 4. Press the Confirm key or [6] to start recording.

 Press < ●> or [1] to stop recording. The video is saved automatically.

After capturing videos, press $<\!\!\underline{\mathbb{E}}\!\!\underline{\mathbb{N}}\!\!>$ to view videos.

View videos

In Menu mode, select My files \rightarrow Phone memory \rightarrow Videos \rightarrow a video file.

Listen to music

Learn how to listen to music via the music player or FM radio.

Listen to the FM radio

- 1. Plug the supplied headset into the phone's multifunction jack.
- 2. In Menu mode, select FM radio.

- 3. Press the Confirm key to start the FM radio.
- Press < Yes> to start automatic tuning. The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.




- The first time you access the FM radio, you will be prompted to start automatic tuning.
- 5. Control the FM radio using the following keys:

Key	Function
Confirm	Turn on or off the FM radio
Volume	Adjust the volume
Navigation	 Left/Right: Tune a radio station Up/Down: Select a radio station saved in the favourite list

Listen to media files

Start by transferring files to your memory card. Your phone supports files with the following extension: mp3, mp4, aac, m4a, 3gpp, 3gp2, midi.

- Download from the wireless web. > Browse web pages
- Download from a PC with the optional Samsung PC Studio. ▶ p. 34
- Receive via Bluetooth. ▶ p. 38
- Copy to your phone or a memory card. ► p. 35



After transferring mp3 files to your memory card,

- 1. In Menu mode, select Music player.
- 2. Select a music category \rightarrow a music file.

3. Control playback using the following keys:

Confirm	Pause or resume playback
Volume	Adjust the volume up or down
Navigation	 Left: Restart playback; Skip backward (press within 3 seconds); Scan backward in a file (press and hold) Right: Skip forward; Scan forward in a file (press and hold) Up: Open the playlist Down: Stop playback
1	Rate the current track
2	Activate Shuffle mode
3	Change the repeat mode

Use Air services



- You may incur additional charges for accessing the web and downloading media.
- Air services may be labelled differently depending on your service provider.

Browse web pages

- In Menu mode, select Air service → WAP to launch your service provider's homepage.
- 2. Navigate web pages using the following keys:

Key	Function
Navigation	Scroll up or down on a web page
Confirm	Select an item
<back></back>	Return to the previous page
<menu></menu>	Access a list of browser options

Use the Brew service

You can use this service to download various kinds of ringtones, wallpapers, or games offered by your service provider.

In Menu mode, select Air service \rightarrow BREW.

Use UIM Tool Kit menus

You can use a variety of additional services offered by your service provider. This menu is available only when you use a UTK UIM card that provides additional services.

In Menu mode, select Air service \rightarrow UIM Tool Kit.



Air services are applicable to Reliance and Tata mobile CDMA services in India.

Learn how to perform advanced operations and use additional features of your mobile phone.

Use advanced call functions

Learn about your phone's additional calling capabilities.

View and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call,

- 1. Press <View>.
- 2. Scroll to the missed call you want to dial.
- 3. Press [-] to dial.

Call a recently dialled number

- In Idle mode, press [-] to display a list of recent numbers.
- 2. Scroll to the number you want and press [----] to dial.

Answer a second call

If your network supports this function, you can answer a second call during a call:

Press [----] to answer the second call. The first call is automatically placed on hold.

Call an international number

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [0] to insert the + character.
- Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then press [-] to dial.

Call a contact from the phonebook

You can call numbers directly from the phonebook using stored contacts. \blacktriangleright p. 24

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- Scroll to the number you want to dial and press
 [-] to dial.

Use advanced phonebook functions

Learn to create namecards, set speed dial numbers, and create groups of contacts.

Create a namecard

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Select $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow My$ namecard.
- 3. Enter your personal details.
- 4. Select $< Options > \rightarrow Save$.



You can send your namecard by attaching it to a multimedia message or transferring it via the Bluetooth wireless feature.

Set speed dial numbers

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Press <**Options**> → **Settings** → **Speed dial**
- 3. Select a number you want to set (1-9) and press the Confirm key.
- 4. Select a contact \rightarrow a number (if necessary) to assign to the number.



You can now call this contact from Idle mode by pressing and holding the assigned speed dial number.

Create a group of contacts

By creating groups of contacts, you can assign ringtones and caller ID photos to each group or send messages to an entire group. Start by creating a group:

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Scroll left or right to Group.
- 3. Select $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Create group$.
- 4. Enter a group name and press the Confirm key.
- To set the caller ID image, scroll to the group and press <**Options**> → **Group settings** → **Image** → an image category → an image.
- 6. To set a group ringtone, select **Ringtone** \rightarrow a ringtone category \rightarrow a ringtone.
- 7. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$ Save.

Copy contacts to a new OMH card

You can copy the contacts saved in your UIM card to your new OMH card.

- 1. Insert the UIM card in the phone.
- 2. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.

- 3. Press <Options> \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Copy to \rightarrow Phone \rightarrow All \rightarrow Select.
- 4. Remove the UIM card and insert the new OMH card.
- 5. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- Press <Options> → Settings → Copy to → Card → All → Select.

Use advanced messaging functions

Learn to create and use templates to create new messages, and create message folders.

Create a text template

- 1. In Menu mode, select Messages → Templates.
- Press <Options> → Create to open a new template window.

3. Enter your text and press <Save> to save the template.

Insert text templates in new messages

- In Menu mode, select Message → Create new message → a message type.
- Insert a text template into your message.
 For a text message, in the text field, press
 <**Options> → Template →** a template.
 For a multimedia message, in the text field, press
 <**Options> → Insert → Template →** a template.

Create a folder to manage messages

- 1. In Menu mode, select Messages \rightarrow My folders.
- 2. Select Create.
- 3. Enter a new folder name and press <Options $> \rightarrow$ Save.

Move messages from the message folders to your folders to manage them as your preferences.

Use advanced camera functions

Learn how to capture photos in various modes and customise camera settings.

Capture a series of photos

Find and pair with other Bluetoothenabled devices

 Enter a PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature or the other device's Bluetooth PIN, if it has one, and press <OK>.

When the owner of the other device enters the same PIN or accepts the connection, pairing is complete.

To use the mobile tracker feature, you must activate this feature and specify the recipients to receive a tracking message.



Your network might not support the certain feature as the data of the mobile tracker cannot be obtained if two different operators are used.

To activate the mobile tracker,

If a remote phone has the mobile tracker 2.0 feature and it is activated, you can get contacts, delete data, forward calls, and get location information of the remote phone. To get contacts of the remote phone,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Security settings → Mobile tracker 2.0 → Access remote phone.
- 2. Enter the phone number of the remote phone and scroll down.
- 3. Enter the mobile tracker password of the remote phone and press <**OK**>.
- 4. Select Get contact.
- 5. Enter the name of the contact you want to retrieve and press <**OK**>.

Your phone will receive a text message with the contact information.

To delete data on the remote phone,

- 1. In Menu mode, select Settings → Security settings → Mobile tracker 2.0 → Access remote phone.
- 2. Enter the phone number of the remote phone and scroll down.
- 3. Enter the mobile tracker password of the remote phone and press <**OK**>.
- 4. Select Delete user data.
- 5. Press <Yes>.

Call records, phonebook contacts, and all messages of the remote phone will be deleted.

To forward calls to another phone,

 In Menu mode, select Settings → Security settings → Mobile tracker 2.0 → Access remote phone.

- 2. Enter the phone number of the remote phone and scroll down.
- 3. Enter the mobile tracker password of the remote phone and press <**OK**>.
- 4. Select Call diverting.
- 5. Enter the phone number to which incoming calls of the remote phone will be forwarded.
- 6. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$ Activate.

All incoming calls of the remote phone will be forwarded to the new phone number.

To get location information,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Security settings → Mobile tracker 2.0 → Access remote phone.
- 2. Enter the phone number of the remote phone and scroll down.

- 3. Enter the mobile tracker password of the remote phone and press <**OK**>.
- Select Get location information You will receive a text message with the remote phone's location information.

- 4. Move the visual feature and press < Done>.
- Save the edited image with a new file name. Refer to steps 6-7 of "Apply effects to images."

troubleshooting

If you are having trouble with your mobile phone, try these troubleshooting procedures before contacting a service professional.

Your phone displays "No service" or "Network error."

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

You enter a number, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key: [---].
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.

• Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

Another caller cannot reach you.

- Ensure that your phone is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

Another caller cannot hear you speaking.

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes.

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

The audio quality of the call is poor.

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

You select a contact to call, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- · Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.

The battery does not charge properly or sometimes the phone turns itself off.

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both gold-coloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery.

Your phone is hot to the touch.

When you use several applications at once, your phone requires more power and may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.

Some of the contents in this manual may differ from your phone depending on the software of your phone or your service provider.
