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Assembling

Unpack

Check your product box for the following items:

- Mobile phone
- Battery
- Travel adapter (charger)
- User manual



Use only Samsung-approved software. Pirated or illegal software may cause damage or malfunctions that are not covered by your manufacturer's warranty.



- The items supplied with your phone may vary depending on the software and accessories available in your region or offered by your service provider.
- You can obtain additional accessories from your local Samsung dealer.
- The supplied accessories perform best for your phone.
- Accessories other than the supplied ones may not be compatible with your phone.



Install the UIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a User Identity Module (UIM) card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the UIM card and battery,

- 1 If the phone is on, press and hold [/] to turn it off.
- 2 Remove the back cover.



Be careful not to damage your fingernails when you remove the back cover.

3 Insert the UIM card.



- Place the UIM card into the phone with the goldcoloured contacts facing down.
 - If you do not insert a UIM card, you can only use your phone's non-network services and some menus.
 - You can only use voice call and text message functions with the regular UIM card. To use full network services, insert an OMH card (OMH marked OMH RUIM card).

4 Insert the battery.



5 Replace the back cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

You can charge the phone with the provided travel adapter or by connecting the phone to a PC with a PC data cable.



Use only Samsung-approved chargers and cables. Unauthorised chargers or cables can cause batteries to explode or damage your phone.

Ø

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and display a low battery message. The battery icon im will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.



> Charge with the travel adapter

- 1 Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
- 2 Plug the small side of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.

- 3 Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
 - You can use the phone while it is charging, but it may take longer to fully charge the battery.
 - While charging, the phone may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.
 - If your phone is not charging properly, bring your phone and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre.
- When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the phone and then from the power outlet.
- Do not remove the battery before removing the travel adapter. Doing this may cause damage to the phone.



When you charge the battery for the first time, charging your battery completely may take about 3 hours. Because the battery is a consumable part, the battery will gradually wear out and the charging time will be reduced. The initial charging capacity of your battery is about 960 mAh.

Charge with the PC data cable

Before charging, ensure that your PC is turned on.

- Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
- Plug one end (micro USB) of the PC data cable into the multifunction jack.
- Plug the other end of the PC data cable into a USB port on a PC.



Depending on the type of PC data cable you are using, it may take some time before charging begins.

When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), unplug the PC data cable from the phone and then from the PC.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD[™] or microSDHC[™] memory cards with maximum capacities of 16 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).

(!)

Samsung uses approved industry standards for memory cards, but some brands may not be fully compatible with your phone. Using an incompatible memory card may damage your phone or the memory card and can corrupt data stored on the card.





- Your phone supports only the FAT file structure for memory cards. If you insert a card formatted with a different file structure, your phone will ask you to reformat the memory card.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data will shorten the lifespan of memory cards.
- Remove the back cover.
- 2 $\,$ Insert a memory card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.



3 Replace the back cover.

> Remove the memory card

- Ensure that the phone is not currently using the memory card.
- 2 Remove the back cover.
- \mathcal{J} Push the memory card gently until it disengages from the device.
- 4 Pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.
- 5 Replace the the back cover.

Do not remove a memory card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data or damage to the memory card or phone.



> Format the memory card

Formatting your memory card on a PC may cause incompatibilities with your phone. Format the memory card only on the phone.

In Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Memory settings \rightarrow Memory card and press <Format>.



Before formatting the memory card, remember to make backup copies of all important data stored on your phone. The manufacturer's warranty does not cover loss of data resulting from user actions.

Attach a hand strap (optional)

l Remove the back cover.

2 Slide a hand strap through the hand strap hole and hook it over the small projection.



Replace the back cover.



Getting started

Turn your phone on and off

To turn on your phone,

- Press and hold [].
- 2 Enter your PIN and press < OK > (if necessary).
- 3 When the setup wizard opens, customise your phone as desired by following the screen.


To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

- Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where the use of wireless devices is restricted, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.

Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- 1 In Idle mode, press < Menu> to access Menu mode.
- $2 \,\,$ Press the Navigation key to select a menu or application.
- 3 Press <Back> to move up one level; Press [>>] to close the menu or application and return to Idle mode.

Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

- > Change the language of the display
- $\label{eq:linear} \begin{array}{ll} In \mbox{ Menu mode, select } \textbf{Settings} \rightarrow \textbf{Phone settings} \rightarrow \textbf{Language}. \end{array}$
- 2 Select a language you want.

> Set the current time and date

I In Menu mode, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Time and date**.

- $2\,$ Set the time and date format, and enter the current time and date.
- 3 Press <Save>.

> Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key.

2 Adjust the key tone volume by pressing the Volume key.

> Switch to the silent profile

In Idle mode, press and hold [#] to mute or unmute your phone.



> Set up a sound profile

You can change your phone's sounds by customising the current sound profile or switching to another sound profile. To set up a profile,

- 1 In Menu mode, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Phone profiles**.
- $2 \;\;$ Scroll to the profile you are using.
- \mathcal{J} Press < Options > \rightarrow Edit.
- 4 Customise the sound options for incoming calls, incoming messages, and other phone sounds. ► p. 70



Available sound options vary depending on the selected profile.

5 Press <**Options** $> \rightarrow$ **Save**.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

- > Select a wallpaper for the idle screen
- $\left[\right]$ In Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Display and light \rightarrow Home screen.
- 2 Scroll left or right to **Images**.
- 3 Select Wallpaper → Default wallpaper. To select an image from the image folder, select My files.
- 4 Scroll left or right to an image and press **Select**>.
- 5 Press <**Save**>.
- > Select a theme for menu screens
- $\begin{array}{ll} & \text{In Menu mode, select Settings} \rightarrow \text{Display and light} \\ \rightarrow \text{My theme.} \end{array} \end{array}$
- 2 Select a theme.
- *3* Select <**Set**> to apply the theme.



Adjust the brightness of the display



The brightness level of the display will affect how quickly the phone consumes battery power.

- \prod In Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Display and light \rightarrow Brightness.
- 2 Scroll left or right to adjust the level of brightness.
- 3 Press <**Save**>.

Set menu shortcuts

- \prod In Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Phone settings \rightarrow Shortcuts.
- 2 Select a key to use as a shortcut.
- β Press **<Options**> \rightarrow **Change**.
- 4~ Select a menu to assign to the shortcut key.

> Use shortcuts from the toolbar

Use the icons on the toolbar to access popular applications.

To activate and customise the toolbar,

- [In Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Display and light \rightarrow Homescreen toolbar.
- 2 Scroll left or right to **On**.
- 3 Scroll down and press <**Options** $> \rightarrow$ **Edit**.
- 4 Select applications to use on the toolbar.
- 5 Press <**Save**>.

To launch an application from the toolbar,

- In Idle mode, press the Navigation key up.
- 2 Scroll left or right to an application and press the Confirm key.



Lock your phone

You can lock your phone by activating the phone password.

- *I* In Menu mode, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Security**.
- 2 Select Phone lock \rightarrow On \rightarrow Yes.
- *3* Enter a new 4 digit password and press **<OK**>.
- 4 Enter the new password again and press < OK >.
 - The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.

Once the phone lock is enabled, you must enter the password each time you turn on the phone.

- If you forget your password, bring your phone to a Samsung Service Centre to unlock it.
 - Samsung is not responsible for any loss of passwords or private information or other damages caused by illegal software.

Lock your UIM card

You can lock your UIM card by activating the PIN supplied with your UIM card.

- In Menu mode, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Security**.
- 2 Select **PIN lock** \rightarrow **On**.
- 3 Enter the PIN of your UIM card and press **<OK**>.

Once the PIN lock is enabled, you must enter the PIN each time you turn on the phone.

- If you enter an incorrect PIN too many times, your UIM card will be blocked. You must enter a PIN unlock key (PUK) to unblock the UIM card.
 - If you block your UIM card by entering an incorrect PUK, bring the card to your service provider to unblock it.



> Activate the mobile tracker

When someone inserts a new UIM card in your phone, the mobile tracker feature will automatically send the contact number to specified recipients to help you locate and recover your phone.

- *I* In Menu mode, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Security**.
- 2 Select Mobile Tracker.
- 3 Enter your password and press <**OK**>.
- 4 Select Settings and scroll left or right to On.
- 5 Scroll down to **Recipients** and enter a phone number including a country code (with +).
- 6 Scroll down to **Sender** and enter a sender's name.
- 7 Press <Options> \rightarrow Save \rightarrow <Accept>.

Enter text

You can enter text by pressing keys on the keypad.

Change the text input mode

- Press [#] to change case or switch to Number mode.
- Press and hold [*] to select an input method, change the input language, or select T9 on or T9 off to switch between T9Ab and ABC modes in English input modes.
- Press [*] to switch to Symbol mode.



Enter text using input modes

Mode	Function	
T9Ab	Press appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word. When the word displays correctly, press [0] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, select an alternate word from the list that appears. Press and hold [*], and select Hide word list to hide the word	
	suggestion list.	
Abc	Press an appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.	
Numeric	Press an appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number.	
Symbol	Press an appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a symbol.	





Communication


Calling

Learn to use calling functions, such as making and answering calls, using options available during a call or customising and using call-related features.

Make and answer a call

Make a call

- 1 In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
- 2 Press [] to dial the number.



- Use the phonebook to save numbers you dial frequently. ► p. 48
 - To quickly access the call log to redial the numbers you dialled recently, press [].

Answer a call



When a call comes in, press [\].
 When the phone is ringing, press the Volume key to adjust the volume, or press and hold the Volume key to mute the ringtone.

2 To end the call, press [\checkmark].



Reject a call

When a call comes in, press [\checkmark]. The caller will hear a busy tone.

- Ø
- You can set up a list of numbers to reject incoming calls automatically. ► p. 28
- You can send a message when you reject incoming calls. In Menu mode, select Settings → Application settings → Call → All calls → Reject call with message.

Call an international number

- In Idle mode, press and hold [0] to insert the international prefix.
- 2 Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code and phone number), and then press [\scaledymbol{s}] to dial the number.



You can change to another prefix. In Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Application settings \rightarrow Call \rightarrow Int'l call prefix.

> Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press and hold the headset button.
- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To end a call, press the headset button.

> Use options during a voice call

You can use the following options while a voice call is in progress:

- To adjust the voice volume, press the Volume key.
- To activate the speakerphone feature, press the Confirm key \rightarrow Yes.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing some calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.



- To turn on Whisper mode so that the other party can hear you well even if you speak quietly, press <**Options**>
 → Whisper mode on.
- To turn off the microphone so that the other party cannot hear you, press <**Options**> → **Mute**.
- To use some application, press <**Options**> → **Applications**.
- To use a variety of additional services offered by your service provider, if this service is supported by your UIM card, press <**Options**> → **UTK**.
- To send DTMF (Dual tone multifrequency) tones as a group, press <**Options**> → Send DTMF. DTMF tones are the tones used in phones for tone dialling, sounding when you press the number keys.
- To set the DTMF tone length, press ${<}\textbf{Options}{>} \rightarrow \textbf{DTMF}$ length.

- To use the enhanced privacy mode, press $<\!\!Options\!\!> \rightarrow$ Voice privacy.
- To place a call on hold, press []. To retrieve a held call, press [] again.
- To dial a second call, place the first call on hold and then dial a new number.
- To answer a second call, press [~] when a call waiting tone sounds. The first call is automatically placed on hold. You must subscribe to the call waiting service to use this feature.
- To switch between the two calls, press [
].
- To end the calls, press [🦟].
- To make a three-way call, make a second call and press 3 and [] when connected to the second party. You must subscribe to the multiparty call service to use this feature.



View and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display.

/ Press <View>.

- 2 Scroll to the missed call you want to dial.
- 3 Press [🔨] to dial.

> Use additional features

You can use various other call-related features, such as auto rejection, or call diverting.

Set auto rejection

Use auto rejection to reject calls from certain numbers automatically. To activate auto rejection and set up the reject list,

 $\label{eq:linear} \begin{array}{l} In \mbox{ Menu mode, select Settings} \to \mbox{ Application settings} \to \mbox{ Call} \to \mbox{ All calls} \to \mbox{ Reject list.} \end{array}$

- 2 Enter a number to reject.
- 3 Press **<Options**> \rightarrow **Save**.

Make a fake call

You can simulate incoming calls when you want to get out of meetings or unwanted conversations.

To make a fake call, press and hold the Navigation key down in Idle mode. A fake call comes in after a specified length of time.



You can change the delay time before fake calls. In Menu mode, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Application settings** \rightarrow **Call** \rightarrow **Fake call** \rightarrow **Fake call timer**.

You can make fake calls appear more realistic by playing back a recorded voice. To record a voice,

- $\label{eq:linear} \begin{array}{l} In \ \mbox{Menu mode, select } \textbf{Settings} \to \textbf{Application} \\ \textbf{settings} \to \textbf{Call} \to \textbf{Fake call} \to \textbf{Fake call voice}. \end{array}$
- 2 Scroll to Fake call voice.



- 3 Press < Options $> \rightarrow$ Edit.
- 4 Press < **Record**> to start recording.
- 5 Speak into the microphone.
- 6 When you are finished, press the Navigation key down.

Set call diverting

Call diverting is a network feature to send incoming calls to another number that you specify. You can set this feature separately for several conditions when you are not able to answer calls, such as when you are already on the phone or when you are outside of the service area.

- $\label{eq:linear} \begin{array}{l} In \mbox{ Menu mode, select } \textbf{Settings} \to \textbf{Application} \\ \textbf{settings} \to \textbf{Call} \to \textbf{Call diverting}. \end{array}$
- 2 Select a condition \rightarrow **Enable** \rightarrow an option.
- *3* Enter a number to forward to.
- 4 Press <**Call**>.
- 5 Follow the instructions from your service provider.

Set call waiting

Call waiting is a network feature to alert you of an incoming call while you are on a previous call. This feature is available only for voice calls.

- $[In Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Application settings \rightarrow Call \rightarrow Call waiting.$
- 2 Select Enable.
- 3 Press <**Call**>.
- 4 Follow the instructions from your service provider.

Logs

Learn to view and manage logs of calls you have dialled, received, or missed and messages you have sent, or received.



> View call and message logs

You can view logs of your calls and messages filtered by their types.

- In Menu mode, select Logs.
- 2 Select a log type.
- 3 Select a log to view its details.



From the detail view, you can dial the number, send a message to the number or add the number to the phonebook or reject list.

View the call time

You can view time data for your calls and data calls, such as the duration of the last call and the total duration of all calls.

In Menu mode, select Logs.



Select Call time or Data call time.

To reset the records, press < Delete>.

Messages

Learn to create and send text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), or email messages, and view or manage messages you have sent or received.



You may incur additional charges for sending or receiving messages while outside your home service area. For details, contact your service provider.

Send a text message

In Menu mode, select Messages → Create new message.

2 Enter a number.

You can select one from phonebook, groups, or recent contacts by pressing $< Options > \rightarrow Add$ recipients.



3 Scroll down and enter your message text.

4 Press $\langle \mathbf{Options} \rangle \rightarrow \mathbf{Send}$ to send the message.

- If you decide not to send a message immediately, you can save it to the draft folder for future use.
- If an error occurs while you are sending a message, it will be saved in the outbox so you can try to resend it later.
- When a message is sent successfully, it will be saved in the sentbox.

Send a multimedia message

- *I* In Menu mode, select Messages → Create new message.
- 3 Scroll down and enter a subject.
- 4 Scroll down and enter your message text.

5 Press **Options**> and attach a file.

You can select a file from the file list or capture a photo, video, or sound clip.

6 Press $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Send$ to send the message.

View a message

Messages you have received, sent or saved are sorted automatically into the following message folders.

- Inbox: Received text or multimedia messages.
- Email inbox: Received email messages.
- Drafts: Messages that you have saved for future use.
- Sentbox: Sent messages.
- **Outbox**: Messages that are currently sending or waiting to be sent.
- Web alert box: Push messages.
- My folders: Important messages and emails in a created folder.
- Spambox: Spam messages.



View a text or multimedia message

- In Menu mode, select **Messages** \rightarrow **Inbox**.
- 2 Select a text or multimedia message.

In a message folder, press <**Options**> to use the following options:

- To reply to the message, select Reply via.
- To forward the message to other people, select Forward.
- To delete the message, select **Delete**.
- To back up the message, select **Back up text message**.
- To move the message to a created folder, select Move to my folders. You can also move the message to the UIM card to manage your important messages separately.
- To move the message to UIM card, select Move to UIM card.
- To copy the message to UIM card, select **Copy to UIM** card.
- To view the messages by list options, select List by.

- To save a number from the message, select **Add to phonebook**.
- To register the number or text to the spam list, select **Block by**.
- To protect the message from accidental deletion, select **Protection on**.

> Use message templates

Learn to create and use text templates to quickly and easily create new messages. To create a text template,

- *I* In Menu mode, select **Messages** \rightarrow **Templates**.
- 2 Press <**Options**> → Create to open a new template window.
- *3* Enter your text and press the Confirm key.

You can now insert a text template in the text field while creating a text, multimedia, or email message by using the inserting option.



> Create a folder to manage messages

Learn to create folders to manage your messages according to your preferences and needs.

I In Menu mode, select **Messages** \rightarrow **My folders**.

2 Press <**Create**>.

 \mathcal{J} Enter a new folder name and press the Confirm key.

You can now move your important messages from the inbox or sentbox to a custom folder for easier management or preventing them from accidental deletion.

> Send an SOS message

In case of an emergency, you can ask for help by sending an SOS message to specified recipients.



This feature may be unavailable depending on your region.

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Settings → SOS messages → Sending options.
- 2 Scroll left or right to **On** to turn on the SOS messaging feature.
- *3* Select **Recipients** to open the recipient list.
- 4 Enter a recipient number and press the Confirm key.
- $5\,$ Scroll down and scroll left or right to select the number of times to repeat the SOS message.
- 6 Press $\langle Save \rangle \rightarrow \langle Yes \rangle$.

To send an SOS message, the keypad must be locked. Press the Volume key 4 times.

Once you send an SOS message, all phone functions will be suspended until you press [\sim].

Email

Learn to create and send email messages, and view or manage messages you have sent or received.

Set up an email account

In addition to the email account predefined by your service provider, you can add your personal email accounts.

 $\begin{array}{l} In \mbox{ Menu mode, select } \textbf{Messages} \rightarrow \textbf{Settings} \rightarrow \textbf{Emails} \\ \rightarrow \textbf{Email accounts}. \end{array}$

For assistance with setting up your email account, select **Email setup wizard**.

- 2 Press $\langle \mathbf{Options} \rangle \rightarrow \mathbf{Add} \rightarrow \langle \mathbf{Yes} \rangle$.
- β Select an email service or other email accounts.

4 Customise the settings for the account by following the screens.



Connectivity

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology capable of exchanging information over a distance of about 10 metres without requiring a physical connection.

You do not need to line up the devices to beam information with Bluetooth. If the devices are within range of one another, you can exchange information between them even if they are located in different rooms.

Troubleshooting

When you turn on your phone or while you are using the phone, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
Password	When the phone lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the phone.
PIN	When using the phone for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the UIM card. You can disable this feature by using the PIN check menu.

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
PUK	Your UIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.

Your phone displays "Service unavailable" or "Network error"

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

Calls are being dropped

When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose your connection to the network. Move to another area and try again.



Outgoing calls are not connected

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number you are dialling.

Incoming calls are not connected

- Ensure that your phone is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the incoming phone number.

Others cannot hear you speaking on a call

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

Audio quality is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

When dialling from contacts, the call is not connected

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the contact's phone number.

The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

The battery does not charge properly or the phone turns off

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both goldcoloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery (refer to your local ordinances for proper disposal instructions).

Your phone is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your phone for an extended period of time, your phone may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.

Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your Samsung mobile phone must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery or replace it with a battery that is fully charged.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your phone.
- Restart the phone. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact a Samsung Service Centre.



Error messages appear when opening music files

Some music files may not play on your Samsung mobile phone for a variety of reasons. If you receive error messages when opening music files on your phone, try the following:

- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your phone.
- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRMprotected, ensure that you have the appropriate license or key to play the file.
- Ensure that your phone supports the file type.

A connection is not established when you connect the phone to a PC

- Ensure that the PC data cable you are using is compatible with your phone.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your PC.



Safety precautions

To prevent injury to yourself and others or damage to your device, read all of the following information before using your device.

Warning: Prevent electric shock, fire, and explosion

Do not use damaged power cords or plugs, or loose electrical sockets

Do not touch the power cord with wet hands, or disconnect the charger by pulling on the cord

Do not bend or damage the power cord

Do not use your device while charging or touch your device with wet hands

Do not short-circuit the charger or the battery

Do not drop or cause an impact to the charger or the battery

Do not charge the battery with chargers that are not approved by the manufacturer

Do not handle a damaged or leaking Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) battery

For safe disposal of your Li-Ion batteries, contact your nearest authorised service centre.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your device. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your device.
- Never dispose of batteries or devices in a fire. Follow all local regulations when disposing of used batteries or devices.
- Never place batteries or devices on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.



Protect the device, batteries, and chargers from damage

- Avoid exposing your device and batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures.
- Extreme temperatures can cause the deformation of the device and reduce the charging capacity and life of your device and batteries.
- Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and – terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- Never use a damaged charger or battery.

Caution: Follow all safety warnings and regulations when using your device in restricted areas

Turn off your device where prohibited

Comply with all regulations that restrict the use of a mobile device in a particular area.

Do not use your device near other electronic devices

Most electronic devices use radio frequency signals. Your device may interfere with other electronic devices.

Do not use your device near a pacemaker

- Avoid using your device within a 15 cm range of a pacemaker if possible, as your device can interfere with the pacemaker.
- If you must use your device, keep at least 15 cm away from the pacemaker.
- To minimise the possible interference with a pacemaker, use your device on the opposite side of your body from the pacemaker.

Do not use your device in a hospital or near medical equipment that can be interfered with by radio frequency

If you personally use any medical equipment, contact the manufacturer of the equipment to ensure the safety of your equipment from radio frequency.

If you are using a hearing aid, contact the manufacturer for information about radio interference

Some hearing aids may be interfered with by the radio frequency of your device. Contact the manufacturer to ensure the safety of your hearing aid.

Turn off the device in potentially explosive environments

- Turn off your device in potentially explosive environments instead of removing the battery.
- Always comply with regulations, instructions and signs in potentially explosive environments.



- Do not use your device at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals.
- Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the device, its parts, or accessories.

Turn off your device when in an aircraft

Using your device in an aircraft is illegal. Your device may interfere with the electronic navigation instruments of the aircraft.

Electronic devices in a motor vehicle may malfunction due to the radio frequency of your device

Electronic devices in your car may malfunction due to radio frequency of your device. Contact the manufacturer for more information.

Comply with all safety warnings and regulations regarding mobile device usage while operating a vehicle

While driving, safely operating the vehicle is your first responsibility. Never use your mobile device while driving, if it is prohibited by law. For your safety and the safety of others, practice good common sense and remember the following tips:

- Use a hands-free device.
- Get to know your device and its convenience features, such as speed dial and redial. These features help you reduce the time needed to place or receive calls on your mobile device.
- Position your device within easy reach. Be able to access your wireless device without removing your eyes from the road. If you receive an incoming call at an inconvenient time, let your voice mail answer it for you.
- Let the person you are speaking with know you are driving. Suspend calls in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions. Rain, sleet, snow, ice, and heavy traffic can be hazardous.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers. Jotting down a "to do" list or flipping through your address book takes attention away from your primary responsibility of driving safely.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic. Place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic. Try to plan calls when your car will be stationary. If you need to make a call, dial only a few numbers, check the road and your mirrors, then continue.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting. Make people you are talking with aware you are driving and suspend conversations that have the potential to divert your attention from the road.

- Use your device to call for help. Dial a local emergency number in the case of fire, traffic accident, or medical emergencies.
- Use your device to help others in emergencies. If you see an auto accident, a crime in progress, or a serious emergency where lives are in danger, call a local emergency number.
- Call roadside assistance or a special, non-emergency assistance number when necessary. If you see a broken-down vehicle posing no serious hazard, a broken traffic signal, a minor traffic accident where no one appears injured, or a vehicle you know to be stolen, call roadside assistance or another special, non-emergency number.

Proper care and use of your mobile device

Keep your device dry

- Humidity and all types of liquids may damage device parts or electronic circuits.
- When wet, remove the battery without turning on your device. Dry your device with a towel and take it to a service centre.
- Liquids will change the colour of the label that indicates water damage inside the device. Water damage to your device can void your manufacturer's warranty.

Do not use or store your device in dusty, dirty areas

Dust can cause your device to malfunction.

Do not store your device on slopes

If your device falls, it can be damaged.

Do not store your device in hot or cold areas. Use your device at -20° C to 50° C

- Your device can explode if left inside a closed vehicle, as the inside temperature can reach up to 80° C.
- Do not expose your device to direct sunlight for extended periods of time (such as on the dashboard of a car).
- Store the battery at 0° C to 40° C.

Do not store your device with such metal objects as coins, keys and necklaces

- Your device may become deformed or malfunction.
- If the battery terminals are in contact with metal objects, it may cause a fire.

Do not store your device near magnetic fields

• Your device may malfunction or the battery may discharge from exposure to magnetic fields.

- Magnetic stripe cards, including credit cards, phone cards, passbooks, and boarding passes, may be damaged by magnetic fields.
- Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic closures or allow your device to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time.

Do not store your device near or in heaters, microwaves, hot cooking equipment, or high pressure containers

- The battery may leak.
- Your device may overheat and cause a fire.

Do not drop your device or cause impacts to your device

- The screen of your device may be damaged.
- If bent or deformed, your device may be damaged or parts may malfunction.

Do not use a flash close to the eyes of people or animals

Using a flash close to the eyes may cause temporary loss of vision or damage to the eyes.

Ensure maximum battery and charger life

 Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.

- Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.
- Disconnect chargers from power sources when not in use.
