Drive safely at all times

Do not use a hand-held phone while driving. Park your vehicle first.

Switch off the phone when refuelling

Do not use the phone at a refuelling point (service station) or near fuels or chemicals.

Switch off in an aircraft

Wireless phones can cause interference. Using them in an aircraft is both illegal and dangerous.

Switch off the phone near all medical equipment

Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external radio frequency energy. Follow any regulations or rules in force.

Interference

All wireless phones may be subject to interference, which could affect their performance.






Phone layout

Keys and icons

Keys

- Perform the function indicated on the bottom line of the display.
 - In Idle mode, scroll up to access My menu mode and scroll down, left, or right to access your favourite menus directly.

In Idle mode, press to launch the web browser.

In Menu mode, scroll through menu options, select the highlighted menu option or confirm input.

- Make or answer a call.

 In Idle mode, retrieve the numbers recently dialled, missed, or received.
- Press and hold to switch the phone on or off.
 End a call.
 In Menu mode, cancel input and

In Idle mode, press and hold [1] to access your voicemail server. Press and hold [0] to enter an international call prefix.

	 Tap a desired icon. Tap the left or right arrow to scroll left or right. Tap and drag the scroll bar to scroll up or down. Tap a displayed option or function. Tap → or ⑤ to confirm the function displayed or option highlighted. Tap ← to move up one level. Press [⑤] to return to Idle mode.
Use menu numbers	Press the number key corresponding to the option you want.

Enter text

You can use both the touch screen and the keypad to enter characters. To use the touch screen, tap ... To use the keypad, press any alphanumeric or special function key.

Predictive text

When you enter a character, your phone displays additional characters that are commonly used to make words and phrases. This helps you enter phrases or words with minimal key presses.

Stroke mode To enter a word:

- 2. If necessary, scroll up or down to find the character you want.
- 3. Press the trackhall, Numbers are added to each character.
- 4. Press the number key corresponding to the character you want.

Predictive text

When you enter a character, your phone displays additional characters that are commonly used to make words and phrases. This helps you enter phrases or words with minimal key presses.





Customise your phone

Display language

- 2. Select a language.

Call ringer melody

- In Idle mode, tap → Ring tone.
- 2. Scroll left or right.
- 3. Select a ringtone.
- 4. Tap 🖫.

Key tone volume

In Idle mode, press [Volume] to adjust the key tone volume.

Idle mode wallpaper

- 2. Select an image category.
- 3. Select an image.
- 4. Tap 🖫.

Menu mode skin colour

- 2. Select a colour pattern.

Menu shortcuts

- 1. In Idle mode, tap 🗐 → Settings → Phone settings → Shortcuts.
- 2. Select a key.
- Select a menu to be assigned to the key.

Silent mode

You can switch the phone to Silent mode to avoid disturbing other people. In Idle mode, tap and hold ,, or press and hold [#].

Phone lock

- Select Enable.
- 3. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and tap →.
- 4. Enter the new password again and tap →.

Make or answer calls

Make a call

- In Idle mode, enter an area code and phone number and press [♠].
 Alternatively, tap ⟨ in to open the onscreen keypad and enter the phone number.
 And then, tap ⟨ in the press (Volume) to adjust the volume during a call.
- 2. Press [to end the call.

Answer a call

- 1. When the phone rings, press [].
- 2. Press [to end the call.

Use the speakerphone feature

During a call, press the trackball and tap \bigcirc to activate the speaker.

Press the trackball again to switch back to the earpiece.

Make a multi-party call

- During a call, call the second participant.
 The first call is put on hold.
- Press < Options > and select Join.
- 3. Repeat step 1 and 2 to add more participants.

- 4. During a multi-party call:
 - Press < Options > and select Split to have a private conversation with one participant.
 - Press < Options > and select Remove to drop one participant.
- 5. Press [a] to end the multi-party call.

Use the camera

Take a photo

- In Idle mode, press and hold [Camera] to turn on the camera.
- Aim the lens at the subject and make any desired adjustments.
- Press the trackball or [Camera] to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.
- Press <>> to take another photo.

View a photo

- In Idle mode, press [Camera] and select Go to My photos.
- 2. Select the photo you want.

Record a video

- In Idle mode, press [Camera] and select Record video.
- Press the trackball or [Camera] to start recording.
- Press [Camera] or tap to stop recording. The video is saved automatically.

View a video

- In Idle mode, press
 [Camera] and select Go to
 My video clips.
- 2. Select the video you want.

Play music

Prepare music files

Use these methods:

- Download from the wireless web.
- Download from a PC using the optional Samsung PC Studio. See Samsung PC Studio User's Guide.

- Copy to a memory card and insert the card into the phone.

Copy music files to a memory card

- 1. Insert a memory card into the phone.
- Connect your phone and PC with an optional PC data cable.
- Select Open folder to view files when a pop-up window appears on your PC.
- 5. Copy files from the PC to the memory card.
- When you have finished, disconnect the phone from the PC.

Create a playlist

- 2. Tap \nearrow Add music from \rightarrow a memory location.
- Press the trackball or tap

Play music files

- From the music player screen, press the trackball or tap .

- Scroll right or tap >> to skip to the next file. Tap and hold >> to scan forward in a file.
- Tap ♠, ♠, or → to change the repeat mode.
- Tap x to play tracks in random order.
- Tap to display the volume adjustment indicator.
- Scroll up to open the playlist.
- Press [Volume] to adjust the volume.
- Scroll down to stop playback.

Listen to the FM radio

Listen to the radio

- Plug the connecter of the supplied headset into the multi-function jack on the phone.
- In Idle mode, tap ₱ → FM radio.
- 3. Press the trackball or tap **1** to turn on the radio.
- When you turn on the FM radio for the first time, tap O to start automatic tuning.

Available radio stations are automatically saved.

- Scroll up or down to find the radio station you want.
 Alternatively, scroll left or right to select a stored radio station.
- 6. While listening to the radio, use the following icons:
 - d n or di: change the sound input mode.
 - **:** open the saved station list.
 - Jul: display the volume adjustment indicator.
- 7. Press the trackball or tap **f** to turn off the radio.

Store radio stations

By automatic tuning:

- 1. From the radio screen, tap \exists \rightarrow **Self-tuning**.
- Tap O to confirm. Available radio stations are automatically saved.

By manual setup:

- From the radio screen, scroll up or down to find the radio station you want.
- 2. Tap **■** → **Add**.

- To scroll through browser items, scroll up or down.

- To access browser options, tap 同.

- Scroll to a number and press [] to dial, or tap any field to edit contact information.

Send messages

Send a text message

- 1. In Idle mode, tap 🗐.
- 2. Enter the message text.
- 4. Enter destination numbers.
- Press the trackball to send the message.

Send a multimedia message

- In Idle mode, tap 国 →
 Messages → Create new
 message → Multimedia
 message.
- 2. Tap Subject.
- Enter the message subject and press the trackball.
- Tap Image or video and add an image or a video clip.
- Tap Music or sound and add a music file or a sound clip.
- 6. Tap Text.

- 7. Enter the message text and press the trackball.
- 8. Tap **| ∃** → **Send**.
- Enter destination numbers or email addresses.
- 10.Press the trackball to send the message.

Send an email

- 3. Enter the email subject and press the trackball.

- 5. Enter the email text and press the trackball.
- 6. Tap File attach.
- Add media files, contacts, calendar items, or other files.
- 8. Tap **■ Send**.
- 9. Enter email addresses.
- 10.Press the trackball to send the email.

Use Bluetooth

Your phone is equipped with Bluetooth technology, enabling you to connect the phone wirelessly to other Bluetooth devices and exchange data with them, talk hands-free, or control the phone remotely.

Turn on Bluetooth

- Tap My phone's visibility
 → On to allow other devices
 to locate your phone.

Search for and pair with a Bluetooth device

- 2. Select a device.

When the owner of the other device enters the same code, pairing is complete.

Send data

- Access an application, such as Phonebook, My files, Calendar, Memo, or Sketch memo.
- 2. Select an item.
- 3. Tap 🗐 → Send via → Bluetooth.
- For sending a contact, select which data you want to send.
- 5. Search for and select a device.
- 6. If necessary, enter a Bluetooth PIN and tap →.

Receive data

- If necessary, enter the Bluetooth PIN and tap →>.
- 2. Tap () to confirm that you are willing to receive.

Use Sketch memo

Create a new sketch memo

- 1. In Idle mode, tap ②.
- Draw a sketch using the stylus pen on the screen. You can use the following sketch tools on the screen:
 - 🛛: use a pen.
 - Z: use a brush.

- : erase the drawing as you move the pen.
- 🔄: cancel your last action.
- : change the line thickness. This option is not available when you use a brush.
- : change the pen or brush colour.
- 3. Tap 圆.

Menu	Description
Contact list	Search for contact information stored in Phonebook.

Menu	Description
FDN contacts	Create a list of contacts to be used in FDN (Fixed Dialling Number) mode, in which the phone allows outgoing calls only to the specified phone numbers, if your SIM card supports this feature.
Create contact	Add a new contact to Phonebook.
Group	Organise your contacts in caller groups.
Speed dial	Assign a speed dial number for your most frequently dialled numbers.
My namecard	Create a name card and send it to other people.

Menu	Description
Own number	Check your phone numbers, or assign a name to each of the numbers.
Management	Manage contacts in Phonebook or change the default settings for Phonebook.
Service number	View the SDN (Service Dialling Number) list assigned by your service provider, if supported by your SIM card.

Phone settings → Greeting message	Enter the greeting that is displayed briefly when the phone is switched on.
Phone settings → Shortcuts	Use the trackball as shortcuts to access specific menus directly from Idle mode. Scrolling up is fixed as a shortcut to My menu mode.

Phone settings → My menu	Set up a menu of your own using your favourite menu items, which can be easily accessed by scrolling up the trackball in Idle mode.

SAR certification information

This phone meets European Union (EU) requirements concerning exposure to radio waves.

Your mobile phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured to not exceed the limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy, as recommended by the EU Council. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines were developed by independent scientific organisations through the periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The limits include a substantial safety margin designed to ensure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR limit recommended by the EU Council is 2.0 W/kg.¹

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a base station, the lower the power output of the phone.

 The SAR limit for mobile phones used by the public is 2.0 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over ten grams of body tissue. The limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements. The SAR values may vary, depending on national reporting requirements and the network band.

Precautions when using batteries

- Never use a charger or battery that is damaged in any way.
- · Use the battery only for its intended purpose.
- If you use the phone near the network's base station, it uses less power. Talk and standby time are greatly affected by the signal strength on the cellular network and the parameters set by the service provider.
- battery charge, the type of battery, and the charger used. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will gradually wear out. When the operation time is noticeably shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.

Battery charging time depends on the remaining

- If left unused, a fully charged battery will discharge itself over time.

Accidental short-circuiting can occur when a metallic object like a coin, clip or pen causes a direct connection between the + and terminals of the battery (metal strips on the battery). For example, do not carry a spare battery in a pocket or bag where the battery may contact metal objects. Short-circuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the object causing the short-circuiting.
- Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Always recycle. Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.

Road safety

Operating environment

As with other mobile radio transmitting equipment, users are advised that for the satisfactory operation of the equipment and for the safety of personnel, it is recommended that the equipment should only be used

in the normal operating position (held to your ear with the antenna pointing over your shoulder).

Electronic devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless phone. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm (6 inches) be maintained between a wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, switch off your phone immediately.

Hearing aids

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may wish to consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Other medical devices

If you use any other personal medical devices, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy.

Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

Switch off your phone in health care facilities when regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so.

Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding your vehicle.

You should also consult the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Posted facilities

Switch off your phone in any facility where posted notices require you to do so.

Potentially explosive environments

Switch off your phone when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.

Users are advised to switch off the phone while at a refuelling point (service station). Users are reminded of the need to observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots (fuel storage and distribution areas), chemical plants, or where blasting operations are in progress.

Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often but not always clearly marked. They include the areas below decks on boats, chemical transfer or storage facilities, vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas, such as propane or butane, areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust or metal powders, and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.

Emergency calls

This phone, like any wireless phone, operates using radio signals, wireless, and landline networks as well as user-programmed functions, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you should never rely solely on any wireless phone for essential communications like medical emergencies.

To make or receive calls, the phone must be switched on and in a service area with adequate signal strength. Emergency calls may not be possible on all wireless phone networks or when certain network services and/ or phone features are in use. Check with local service providers.

To make an emergency call:

- 1. Switch on the phone.
- 2. Key in the emergency number for your present location. Emergency numbers vary by location.
- 3. Press [].

Certain features like Call Barring may need to be deactivated before you can make an emergency call. Consult this document and your local cellular service provider.

Other important safety information

- Only qualified personnel should service the phone or install the phone in a vehicle. Faulty installation or service may be dangerous and may invalidate any warranty applicable to the device.
- Check regularly that all wireless phone equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating properly.
- Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.
- For vehicles equipped with an air bag, remember that an air bag inflates with great force. Do not place objects, including installed or portable wireless equipment, in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment could result in serious injury if the air bag inflates.
- Switch off your phone before boarding an aircraft. It is dangerous and illegal to use wireless phones in an aircraft because they can interfere with the operation of the aircraft.

 Failure to observe these instructions may lead to the suspension or denial of telephone services to the offender, or legal action, or both.

Care and maintenance

Your phone is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill any warranty obligations and allow you to enjoy this product for many years.

- Keep your phone and all its parts and accessories out of the reach of small children and pets. They may accidentally damage these things or choke on small parts.
- Keep the phone dry. Precipitation, humidity, and liquids contain minerals that corrode electronic circuits.
- Do not use the phone with a wet hand. Doing so may cause an electric shock to you or damage to the phone.
- Do not use or store the phone in dusty, dirty areas, as its moving parts may be damaged.

- Do not store the phone in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries, and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the phone in cold areas. When the phone warms up to its normal operating temperature, moisture can form inside the phone, which may damage the phone's electronic circuit boards.
- Do not drop, knock, or shake the phone. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the phone. Wipe it with a soft cloth.
- Do not paint the phone. Paint can clog the device's moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Do not put the phone in or on heating devices, such as a microwave oven, stove, or radiator. The phone may explode when overheated.

- If your phone has a flash or light, do not use it too close to the eyes of people or animals. This may cause damage to their eyes.
- Use only the supplied or an approved replacement antenna. Unauthorised antennas or modified accessories may damage the phone and violate regulations governing radio devices.
- If the phone, battery, charger, or any accessory is not working properly, take it to your nearest qualified service facility. The personnel there will assist you, and if necessary, arrange for service.
