Turning the Power On & Off



Turning the Power On

Press and hold the [►II] button.

Power is turned on.

Turning the Power Off

Press and hold the [►II] button.

- Power is turned off.
- If you press and hold the [REC] button in power-off condition, the player turns on and voice recording will start.



Voice Recording



- Press and hold the [] button to move to the main menu.
- Press the [I◄◀, ►►I] button to select <Voice REC> and press the [►II] button.

The voice recording screen appears.

- **3** Press the [FOLDER] button to select a folder where the recording file is stored.
 - Press the [REC] button.
 - Voice recording starts.

Volume Control



Press the [+, -] button to control the volume.

- The volume bar appears.
- You can control the volume from 0 to 30.
- Press the [+] button to increase the volume or the [] volume to decrease it.



 If <Volume Limit> is set to <On>, you couldn't control the volume over 16. Set <Volume Limit> to <Off>.

Lock Function

In Hold mode, all buttons are disabled. This function is useful when you are walking or jogging.



- Slide the [<HOLD] switch in the direction of the arrow.
 - No button works at all.
- 2 Slide the [<HOLD] switch in the opposite direction of the arrow to release the Lock function.

Searching for files with <File Browser>

Search easily for files using the <File Browser> function.



- Press and hold the [] button to move to the main menu.
- Press the [I◄◄, ►►I] button to select <File Browser> and press the [►II] button.
 - You will see the folder list including VOICE, MUSIC, TTS and PLAYLIST.
- **3** Press the [+, -] to select a folder of your choice.
- 4 Press the [►II] button to move to the file list of the selected folder.
 - Press the [] button to move to the previous level.
- **5** Press the [+ ,] button to select a file of your choice.
- 6 Press the [►II] button.
 - The selected file will be played.

File Deletion



- Press the [I◀◀, ▶►I] button during pausing to select <File Browser> and press the [►II] button.
- 2 Use the [+ , −] button to select the file you want to delete in the file list and press and hold the [DEL] button.
- Press the [I◄◄, ▶►I] button to select <YES> and then press the [►II] button.
 - The selected file will be deleted.

If you want to directly delete a file during playing, press and hold the [DEL] button after pausing.



- You can't recover the file once it is deleted. So double-check to make sure the file is the one you want to delete.
- You cannot delete the file during playback.

Using as a Removable Disk

You can use the player as a removable storage device.

Before you start!

Connect the player to your PC.



- Open files/folders to transfer from your PC.
- **2** Open <My Computer> \rightarrow <V150> from the desktop.
- 3 Select the files/folders to transfer from your PC and drag and drop them to a folder of your choice in the <V150>.
 - The selected folders or files are transferred to the player.



- The file transfer message will appear during file download or upload. Disconnecting the USB cable while the message is displayed may cause malfunction of the player.
- The order of music files displayed in Windows Explorer may differ from the playback order on your player.
- If you transfer a DRM file(charged file) to the removable disk, the file will not be played.

What is DRM?

DRM (Digital Rights Management) is a technology and service to prevent the illegal use of digital contents and protect the profit and rights of copyright holders. DRM files are charged music files applied with the illegal copy protection technology of legally purchased MP3 music.

Disconnecting from your PC Follow the steps below to prevent damage to the player and data when disconnecting from your PC.

- Do not disconnect the player from the PC during file transfer. This may cause damage to data and the player.
- You cannot remove the player while files within the player are being played on your PC. Please retry after playback is finished.

Installing TTS

TTS (Text-to-Speech) is a converting program that converts text into voice. TTS reads out the text you entered on your PC in a human voice, a great help to enhance your language skill.

In the Dictionary option, you can " Define Reading" for the words.

For instance, if you want the system to read the word "IT" as "Information Technology", you just have to define "IT" as "Information Technology" in the Dictionary.

- ADD: To add words to be newly defined.

To stop recording

Press the [REC] button again.

- Voice recording stops.
- The recording file is automatically stored in the selected folder.
- You can save a maximum of 300 files in a folder.



- Press the [►II] button if you want to pause recording.
- If you press and hold the [REC] button in power-off condition, the player turns on and voice recording will start. It takes a minute until the recording starts.
 - You can listen to the sound at the same time with recording by using the earphones.
 - The microphone should face forward the sound soruce during the recording.
 - Beeps are disabled while recording.



- Keep the external microphone away from the earphones during the recording. Otherwise, it can cause noise on the recording.
- CAUTION Do not put the microphone too close to or far distant from your mouth. Otherwise, the sound quality may be poor.
 - If the battery capacity is low, you cannot record. So check the battery and replace it with a new one before recording.
 - Do never remove the battery during the recording. Otherwise, the player will not completely record the file.
 - Continuing the recording time, the displayable time is 99 hours. Depending on the model, the recording time indicates the sum of the possible recording time.
 - When changing the battery, the recording time shows 00.

Voice Recording Voice Recording menu

To select Voice Recording Quality



- Press the [😑] button in standby mode.
 - The voice recording menu appears.
- Press the [+ ,] button to select <Voice REC Quality> and press the [►II] button.

The voice recording quality menu appears.

- **3** Press the [+, -] button to select a mode and press the $[|\cdot||]$ button.
 - <SP>: To set the recording quality to standard.
 - <HQ>: To set the recording quality to high quality.
 - SHQ> : To set the recording quality to the best quality.



During the voice recording, the menu is not accessed.

To set VOR <Voice Operating Recording>

You can set the player to record only if a sound or voice is detected.



- Press the [😑] button in standby mode.
 - The voice recording menu appears.
- **2** Press the [+, -] button to select <VOR> and press the $[\bullet II]$ button.
 - The VOR menu appears.
- **3** Press the [+, -] button to select the mode and press the [|||] button.
 - Off>: To record even if there is no sound.
 - <On>: To pause recording automatically when there is no sound.

To set Noise Reduction

Noise Reduction filters out any other noise than voice to clarify the recording.



- Press the [=] button in standby mode.
- The voice recording menu appears.
- Press the [+, -] button to select <Noise Reduction> and press the [►II] button.
 - The noise reduction menu appears.
- Press the [+, -] button to select the mode and press the [**▶II**] button.
 - Off> : To record as a original sound.
 - <On>: To reduce noise to make the recording clearer.

Recording with a phone

You can record phone conversation in your player.

Before you start! Turn on the player and check the battery capacity.



- Connect the phone connector to the phone recording adapter.
- $\mathbf 2$ Connect the phone to the phone recording adapter using the phone cable.
- **3** Connect the player to the phone recording adapter using the external device cable.
- **4** Press the [FOLDER] button to select a folder where the recording file is stored.
 - Press the [REC] button during the phone conversation.
 - Recording starts.
 - To stop recording, press the [REC] button again.
 - Recording stops.

To pause playback

Press the [>II] button while the file is playing.

The file playback will be paused.

Press the [>II] button again.

The file will play from the point where it stopped.



Power is automatically turned off when none of the buttons have been pressed for a certain time in the standby and the music pause mode for power saving purposes.

To search within a file

Press and hold the [I◄◄, ►►I] button while the selected file is playing.
 It searches to the beginning or the end of the file.

2 Release the button at the point you want to start.

It starts playing from the point you release the button.

To play from the beginning of the current file

Press the [I <>] button after 3 seconds of play.

• The current file starts playing from the beginning.

To play the previous/next file

Press the [I <>] button within 3 seconds of play.

The previous file will start playing.

Press the [►►I] button.

The next file will start playing.



■ When playing VBR files, the previous file may not play even if you press the [I ◄] button within 3 seconds of the play.

Listening to Voice or Music File

Section Repeat

This function enables you to listen to specific parts of a file repeatedly. Recommended for language learning.

Before you start!

Turn on the player and check the battery capacity.



To set a section to repeat

- Play a file of your choice.
- **2** Press the [A B] button at the beginning of the section you want to repeat.
 - The starting point is set and <A → > will appear in the screen display window.

Press the [A - B] button again to set the ending of the section you want to repeat.

To cancel the section repeat
