## User Instructions

### Screen Image retention

Do not display a still image (such as on a video game or when hooking up a PC to this PDP) on the plasma monitor panel for more than 2 hours as it can cause screen image retention. This image retention is also known as "screen burn". To avoid such image retention, reduce the degree of brightness and contrast of the screen when displaying a still image.

### Height

The PDP can normally operate only under 2000m in height. It might abnormally function at a place over 2000m in height so do not install and operate there.

### ♦ Heat on the top of the PDP TV

The top side of the product may be hot after long periods of use as heat dissipates from the panel through the vent hole in the upper part of the product. This is normal and does not indicate any defect or operation failure of the product. However, children should be prevented from touching the upper part of the product.

### ♦ The product is making a 'cracking' noise.

A 'cracking' noise may occur when the product contracts or expands due to a change of surrounding environment such as temperature or humidity. This is normal and not a defect of the unit.

### Cell Defects

The PDP uses a panel consisting of 1,230,000(SD-level) to 3,150,000(HD-level) pixels which require sophisticated technology to produce. However, there may be few bright or dark pixels on the screen.

These pixels will have no impact on the performance of the product.

### ◆ Avoid operating the TV at temperatures below 5°C(41°F)

### ♦ A still image displayed too long may cause permanent damage to the PDP Panel.



Watching the PDP TV in 4:3 format for a long period of time may leave traces of borders displayed on the left, right and centre of the screen caused by the difference of light emission on the screen.

Playing a DVD or a game console may cause similar effect to the screen. Damages caused by the above effect are not covered by the Warranty.

### Afterimage on the Screen.

Displaying still images from Video games and PC for longer than a certain period of time may produce partial after images. To prevent this effect, reduce the 'brightness' and 'contrast' when displaying still images.




- Warranty does not cover any damage caused by image retention.

Be sure to contact an authorized service centre, when installing your set in a location with heavy dust, high or low temperatures, high humidity, chemical substance and where it operates continually such as the airport, the train station etc. Failure to do so may cause a serious damage to your set.

The ferrite core is used to shield the cable from interference. When connecting a cable, open the ferrite core and clip it around the cable.







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





# **Connection Panel**

The product colour and shape may vary depending on the model.



- Whenever you connect an audio or video system to your set, ensure that all elements are switched off.
- When connecting an external device, match the colour of the connection terminal to the cable.
- ANT IN VHF/UHF (75Ω)
  - 75Ω Coaxial connector for Aerial/Cable Network.
- Onnecting external Audio Devices
  - Connect ŘCA audio signals from the TV to an external source, such as Audio equipment.
- O PC IN / AUDIO
  - Connect to the video and audio output jack on your PC.

  - Connect RCA cable to an appropriate external A/V device such as VCR, DVD or Camcorder.

### O HDMI/DVI IN

The HDMI jack of a device with HDMI output. These inputs can also be used as a DVI connection with separate analog audio inputs. An optional HDMI/DVI cable will be necessary to make this connection. When using the optional HDMI/DVI adapter, the DVI analog audio inputs on your TV allow you to receive left and right audio from your DVI device. (Not compatible with PC)

- When connecting this product via HDMI or DVI to a Set Top Box, DVD Player or Games Console etc, make sure that it has been set to a compatible video output mode as shown in the table below. Failure to observe this may result in picture distortion, image breakup or no picture.
- Do not attempt to connect the HDMI/DVI connector to a PC or Laptop Graphics Card.
   (This will result in a blank screen being displayed)





- The performance of the remote control may be affected by bright light.
- This is a special remote control for the visually impaired, and has Braille points on the Power, Channel and Volume buttons.

# **Installing Batteries in the Remote Control**



- 1 Lift the cover at the back of the remote control upward as shown in the figure.
- 2 Install two AAA size batteries.
  - Make sure to match the "+" and "-" ends of the batteries with the diagram inside the compartment.
- 3 Close the cover as shown in the figure.
  - Remove the batteries and store them in a cool, dry place if you won't be using the remote control for a long time.

### If the remote control doesn't work! Check the following:

- 1. Is the TV power on?
- 2. Are the plus and minus ends of the batteries reversed?
- 3. Are the batteries drained?
- 4. Is there a power cut, or is the power cord unplugged?
- 5. Is there a special fluorescent light or a neon sign nearby?

# **Switching Your Television On and Off**


The mains lead is attached to the rear of the television.

- 1 Plug the mains lead into an appropriate socket.
  - > The main voltage is indicated on the rear of the television and the frequency is 50 or 60Hz.
- 2 Press the (b) (Power) button (On/Off) on the front of the television or press the POWER (c) button on the remote control to switch the television on. The programme that you were watching last is re-selected automatically. If you have not yet stored any channels, no clear picture appears. Refer to "Storing Channels Automatically" on page 13 or "Storing Channels Manually" on page 14.
  - ➤ If the television is initially powered on, several basic customer settings proceed automatically. Refer to "Plug & Play Feature" on page 10.
- 3 To switch the television off, press the ψ (Power) button (On/Off) on the front of the television or press the **POWER** (ψ) button on the remote control.
- 4 To switch the TV on, press the ψ (Power) button (On/Off) on the front of the TV or press the **POWER** (ψ) button or number buttons on the remote control.

# Viewing the Menus

- Press the MENU (III) button.
   The main menu is displayed on the screen.
   Its left side has five icons: Input, Picture, Sound, Channel, and Setup.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select one of the icons. Press the ENTER (→) button to access the icon's sub-menu.
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to move to items in the menu.
  Press the ENTER ( → ) button to enter items in the menu.
- 4 Press the ▲/▼/◄/► button to change the selected items. Press the MENU (□□□) button to return to the previous menu.
- 5 Press the **EXIT** button to exit from the menu.





# **Freezing the Current Picture**

You can freeze the picture when watching a television programme simply by pressing the "STILL" button. To return to normal viewing, press it again.

> This function will automatically cancel five minutes later.



# **Plug & Play Feature**

When the television is initially powered on, several basic customer settings proceed automatically and subsequently. The following settings are available.













- 1 If the television is in standby mode, press the POWER (b) button on the remote control. The message to start Plug & Play is displayed.
- 2 Make sure that the antenna is connected to the TV. Press the ENTER ( ) button. The menu to select channels is displayed
- To start channel store, press the **ENTER** ( ) button.
  The search will end automatically. The TV will begin memorizing all of the available channels.
  Press the **ENTER** ( ) button to set the clock.
- 4 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to select the hour or minute. Set these by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.
  - You can enter the hours or minutes by using the numeric buttons on the remote control.

5 Plug and Play for TV complete, and Plug and Play for DTV will start automatically.

The search will end automatically. Channels are sorted and stored in the order which reflects their position in the frequency range (with lowest first and highest last). When this has finished, the menu to set the Time Zone will be displayed.

- > To stop DTV channel the search before it has finished or return to normal viewing, press the **D.MENU** or the **ENTER** ( ) button.
- 6 Select the time zone where you locate by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER (→ ) button. The following options are available.

New South Wales/ACT - Victoria - Queensland - South Australia - Western Australia - Tasmania - Northern Territory

7 Press the ENTER ( ) button to confirm your setting. The message "Enjoy your watching" is displayed.









### If you want to reset this feature ...

- 1 Press the **MENU** ( ) button to display the menu. (On TV mode)
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Setup, then press the ENTER (→) button.
- 3 Press the ENTER (군) button again to select Plug & Play. The message to start Plug & Play is displayed.




# **Viewing an External Signal Source**

You can switch between viewing signal from connected equipment, such as a VCR, DVD, Set-Top Box, and the TV source (broadcast or cable).







- 1 Press the **MENU** ( ) button to display the menu.
- 2 Press the ENTER ( ) button to select Source List.
- 3 Press the ENTER ( ) button again.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the signal source, then press the ENTER ( → ) button.

Available signal source: TV, AV1, AV2, S-Video, Component1, Component2, PC, HDMI, DTV

You can select these options simply by pressing the SOURCE button on the remote control. (Only for External Signal Source)

# **Editing Device Names**

You can give a name to the external source.





- 1 Press the **MENU** (**III**) button to display the menu.
- 2 Press the ENTER ( ) button.
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Edit Name, then press theENTER (→) button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the external source to be edited, then press the ENTER (→ ) button.
- 5 Select the required device by pressing ▲ or ▼, then press the ENTER ( → ) button.

<u>Available device names</u>: VCR, DVD, D-VHS, Cable STB, HD STB, Satellite STB, AV Receiver, DVD Receiver, Game, Camcorder, DVD Combo, DHR (DVD HDD Recorder), Of PC.

6 Press the EXIT button to exit.

# **Storing Channels Automatically**

You can scan for the frequency ranges available to you (availability depends on your Country). Automatically allocated programme numbers may not correspond to actual or desired programme numbers. However you can sort numbers manually and clear any channels you do not wish to watch.

- 1 Press the MENU (III) button to display the menu.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel, then press the ENTER (→) button
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Auto Store, then press the ENTER ( → ) button
- 4 Press the ENTER ( ) button again to start the search. The search will end automatically.
  - > To stop the search before it has finished, press the **MENU** ([]) or the **ENTER** ([]) button.
  - The Australia is the default in the Country cases depending on the model.





# **Storing Channels Manually**

You can store television channels, including those received via cable networks. When storing channels manually, you can choose:

- ♦ Whether or not to store each of the channels found.
- ◆ The programme number of each stored channel which you wish to identify.





- 1 Press the **MENU** ( ) button to display the menu.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Channel**, then press the **ENTER** ( → )
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Manual Store, then press the ENTER ( )
  button
- Select the required option by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button, then press the ENTER (→ ) button.
- 5 When you are satisfied with your setting, press the **ENTER** ( ) button.
- 6 Press the EXIT button to exit.
- ◆ **Programme** (Programme number to be assigned to a channel)
  - Press the ▲ or ▼ button until you find the correct number.
- ◆ Colour System: AUTO/PAL/SECAM/NTSC4.43
  - Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the required colour standard.
- ♦ Sound System: BG/DK/I
  - Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the required sound standard.
- ◆ Channel (When you know the number of the channel to be stored)
  - Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select C (Air channel) or S (Cable channel).
  - Press the ▶ button, then press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the required number.
    - ightharpoonup You can also select the channel number directly by pressing the numeric buttons (0~9).
    - > If there is abnormal sound or no sound, re-select the sound standard required.
- ◆ Search (When you do not know the channel numbers)
  - Press the ▲ or ▼ button to start the search.
  - The tuner scans the frequency range until the first channel or the channel that you selected is received on the screen.
- ◆ Store (When you store the channel and associated programme number)
  - Set to **OK** by pressing the **ENTER** (→) button.

### Channel mode

- ◆ P (Programme mode): When completing tuning, the broadcasting stations in your area have been assigned to position numbers from P00 to P99. You can select a channel by entering the position number in this mode.
- ◆ C (Air channel mode): You can select a channel by entering the assigned number to each air broadcasting station in this mode.
- ◆ S (Cable channel mode): You can select a channel by entering the assigned number for each cable channel in this mode.

# **Adding / Locking Channels**

Using the Channel Manager, you can conveniently lock or add channels.

- 1 Press the **MENU** (\(\iii\)) button to display the menu.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Channel**, then press the **ENTER** ( → ) button.
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel Manager, then press the ENTER (→) button.

### **♦** Adding channels

Using the Channel Manager, you can add channels.

- 4 Select the **channel Manager** by pressing the **ENTER** ( ) button.
- Move to the (⊕) field by pressing the A/V/√/► buttons, select a channel to be added, and press the ENTER (→) button to add the channel.
  - ➤ If you press the ENTER (→) button again, the (∨) symbol next to the channel disappears and the channel is not added.

### ♦ Locking channels

This feature allows you to prevent unauthorized users, such as children, from watching unsuitable programmes by muting out video and audio.

- 6 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Child Lock, then press the ENTER ( →) button.
- 7 Select on by pressing the ▲ or ▼ buttons, then press the ENTER (→) button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to select the Channel Manager, then press the ENTER (→) button.
- Move to the ( ♠) field by pressing the ▲/▼/◄/▶ buttons, select a channel to be locked, and press the ENTER ( ➡) button.
  - ➤ If you press the ENTER (→) button again, the (✓) symbol next to the channel disappears and the channel lock is canceled.
  - > A blue screen is displayed when Child Lock is activated.
- 10 Press the EXIT button to exit.
- You can select these options simply by pressing the CH MGR button on the remote control.











# **Sorting the Stored Channels**

This operation allows you to change the programme numbers of stored channels. This operation may be necessary after using auto store.





- 1 Press the **MENU** ( ) button to display the menu.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel, then press the ENTER (→) button.
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Sort**, then press the **ENTER** (→) button.
- 4 Select the channel that you wish to move by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button, then press the ENTER (→ ) button.
- 5 Select the number of the programme to which the channel is to be moved by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.
  - Press the **ENTER** ( ) button. The channel is moved to its new position and all other channels are shifted accordingly.
- 6 Repeat steps 4 to 5 until you have moved all the channels to the required programme numbers.
- 7 Press the EXIT button to exit.

# **Assigning Names to Channels**

Channel names will be assigned automatically when channel information is broadcast. These names can be changed, allowing you to assign new names.

- 1 Press the MENU ( ) button to display the menu.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Channel**, then press the **ENTER** ( ) button.
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Name, then press the ENTER (→) button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the channel to be assigned to a new name, then press the ENTER (→) button.
- 5 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select a letter (A~Z), a number (0~9), or a symbol. Move on to the previous or next letter by pressing the ◄ or ▶ button, then press the ENTER (→) button.
- 6 Repeat steps 4 to 5 for each channel to be assigned to a new name.
- 7 Press the EXIT button to exit.

# **Fine Tuning Channel Reception**

If the reception is clear, you do not have to fine tune the channel, as this is done automatically during the search and store operation. If the signal is weak or distorted, you may have to fine tune the channel manually.

- 1 Press the MENU ( ) button to display the menu.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Channel**, then press the **ENTER** ( → ) button
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Fine Tune, then press the ENTER ( → ) button.
- 4 To obtain a sharp and clear picture and good sound quality, press the ◀ or ▶ button until you reach the optimal setting. Press the ENTER (→) button.
  - ➤ To reset the fine tuning to 0, select Reset by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER (→) button.
- 5 Press the EXIT button to exit.
  - > Fine Tune Store will change the colour of the Channel OSD (On Screen Display) from White to Red and add the "\*" mark.

You can select the type of picture which best corresponds to your viewing requirements.



Available modes: Dynamic, Standard, Movie, Custom

- The settings values may vary depending on the input source. (ex. RF, Video, Component, PC, or HDMI)
- 5 Press the EXIT button to exit.

  - Choose Standard for the standard factory settings.

# **Customizing the Picture Settings**



- ◆ Contrast Brightness Sharpness Colour Tint (NTSC only)
- ◆ Contrast Brightness Colour : PC Mode Press the ◀ or ▶ button until you reach the optimal setting.
- ◆ Colour Tone: Cool 2/Cool 1/Normal/Warm 1/Warm 2
- ◆ Reset: You can return to the factory defaults picture settings.
  - > The reset function is set for each picture mode and colour tone.



# **Selecting the Picture Size**

You can select the picture size which best corresponds to your viewing requirements.


- 1 Press the **MENU** (**)** button to display the menu.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Picture, then press the ENTER (→) button.
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Size, then press the ENTER ( → ) button.
- 4 Select the required option by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button, then press the ENTER (→) button.

Available options: 16:9, Wide 4:3, Zoom, 4:3

- ♦ 16:9: Sets the picture to 16:9 wide mode.
- Wide 4:3: Magnify the size of the picture more than 4:3.
  Move the screen up/down using the ▲ or ▼ button after selecting the 艸 by pressing the ► or ENTER (→) button.
- ◆ **Zoom**: Magnify the size of the picture vertically on screen.
- ◆ 4:3: Sets the picture to 4:3 normal mode.
- 5 Press the EXIT button to exit.
  - You can change the picture size simply by pressing the P.SIZE button on the remote control.
  - If you change the picture size when PIP is On, PIP will automatically be turned Off.
  - > Depending on the input source, the picture size options may vary.
  - The items available may differ depending on the selected mode.

### Positioning and Sizing the screen using Zoom

- ◆ Resizing the screen using the Zoom enables the positioning and sizing of the screen to up/down direction using the ▲ or ▼ button as well as the screen size.

- ♦ Digital NR: On/Off

If the signal received by the television is weak, you can activate this feature to reduce any static and ghosting that may appear on the screen.

♦ SMD(Smooth Motion Driver): On/Off

If you set SMD to On, you can view more natural skin and clear text even in fast moving scenes.

(SMD is applicable only to PAL and SECAM system.)

SMD is not available in PC mode.

♦ DNIe Demo: On/Off

This TV includes the DNIe function so as to provide a high visual quality. If you set DNIe Demo to On, you can view an applied DNIe and a normal picture on the screen, for demonstration purposes. Using this function, you can view the difference in the visual quality.

  - The programme title is on the upper part of the screen center. Please click on **INFO** button for the detailed information. Channel Number, Running Time, Status Bar, Parental Level, Video Quality Information(HD/SD), Sound Modes, Subtitle or Teletext, Languages of Subtitle or Teletext, and brief summary of the highlighted programme are included on the detailed information. "..." will be appeared if the summary is long.
    - Six channels are displayed. To scroll between channels, move to a channel using the ▲ or ▼ button. To display page by page, use the P or P v button.

# **Using the Scheduled List**

If you make a scheduled viewing list of programs you may like to see, the channel will be automatically switched to the scheduled program at the scheduled time even if you are watching another program.

- Press the **D.MENU** button.
   The options available in the **Guide** group are displayed.
- 2 Press the ENTER ( ) button.
- 3 Select the **Scheduled List** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.
- 4 Press the **ENTER** ( ) button. The selected guide menu is displayed.



# **Upgrading the Software (Option)**

After downloading is finished, when changing the channel or repowering the television, the message box will appear on the screen.

While downloading, it's better to keep the current channel to make sure entirely downloading. It will not take too much time. If you change the

channel, the downloading will continue when you change back.

You are given the option to install the upgrade.

#### ♦ Upgrade Now

If you select **Upgrade Now**, the **iDTV** immediately installs the new upgrade and then restarts.

#### ♦ Upgrade Later

If you select **Upgrade Later**, the upgrade is postponed until the next restart or channel change some 90 minutes later, when the upgrade dialog appears again.

#### ♦ Don't Upgrade

If you select **Don't Upgrade**, the **iDTV** does not perform the upgrade and the software upgrade banner is not displayed again.

The upgrade is still stored internally, to subsequently upgrade to the new version then the following sequence of steps are performed.

Alternatively, you can manually upgrade the software.

- 1 Press the **D.MENU** button to display the DTV menu.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select System. Press the ENTER (→ ) button. The options available in the System group are displayed.
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Software Upgrade, and press the ENTER ( → ) button.

- 3 Enter your current 4-digit PIN code by using the numeric buttons (0~9). The warning message is displayed.All values will be reset by pressing the coloured buttons (red,green, yellow,and blue) in turn.
- 4 Press the D.MENU button to return to the previous menu or press the EXIT button to return to normal viewing.

# Teletext Feature (depending on the model)

Most television stations provide written information services via teletext. The index page of the teletext service gives you information on how to use the service. In addition, you can select various options to suit your requirements by using the remote control buttons.

For teletext information to be displayed correctly, channel reception must be stable. Otherwise, information may be missing or some pages may not be displayed.

# (teletext on/mix)

Press to activate teletext mode after selecting the channel providing the teletext service. Press it twice to overlap the teletext with the current broadcasting screen.

#### ② (sub-page)

Used to display the available sub-page.

#### ⊕ (hold)

Used to hold the display on a given page if the selected page is linked with several secondary pages which follow on automatically. To resume, press it again.

#### 4 (size)

Press to display the double-size letters in the upper half of the screen. For lower half of the screen, press it again.

To display normal screen, press it once again.

### ⊕ (store)

Used to store the teletext pages.

#### 

Press to select the teletext mode (LIST/FLOF). If you press it in the LIST mode, it switches into the List save mode. In the List save mode, you can save teletext page into list using the (store) button.

#### (page up)

Used to display the next teletext page.

#### (page down)

Used to display the previous teletext page.

Used to display the index (contents) page at any time while you are viewing teletext.







E	Text.
F	Status information. FASTEXT information.

- > Teletext information is often divided between several pages displayed in sequence, which can be accessed by:
  - Entering the page number
  - ◆ Selecting a title in a list
  - ◆ Selecting a coloured heading (FASTEXT system)
- Press the TV/DTV button to exit from the teletext display.











#### How to assemble the Wall Mount Bracket

The wall mount bracket is delivered separately. Please tighten the captive screw in the direction of the arrow after assembling the bracket. Install the Wall Mount Bracket after the screws are securely inserted into the wall.




#### Instructions on Securing the SET to the Wall Mount Bracket

- > The exterior of the SET may be different than the picture. (Assembly and installation of the plastic hanger is the same.)
- 1 Remove the screws from the back of the PDP.



2 Use the screw and assemble the plastic hanger. (Please refer to the following picture.)



- Please ask the installers to install the wall mount bracket.

  - 4 Please tightly secure the wall mount bracket to the wall to avoid injury from a falling SET.








Secure the PDP by inserting the Safety Pins, not to fall from the wall mount.



#### **How to Adjust Mounting Angle**

Please secure the mounting bracket on the wall surface after setting its angle at 0°






- Secure the SET to the wall mount bracket. (Please refer to the follow ing instructions.)
- 2 Set the angle by pulling the upper end of the SET attached to bracket in the direction of the arrow. (Refer to the illustration on the right.)
- 3 The angle can be adjusted from  $0^{\circ}$  to  $15^{\circ}$  by  $\pm 2^{\circ}$ .

Hold onto the middle of the PDP to adjust the angle (not the sides of the PDP).

#### Connecting External Devices to the PDP

> To connect external devices such as a DVD or a Home Theater System to the PDP, please refer to following instructions:



- Be sure to remove the safety pins underneath the PDP.
  - ➤ If the safety pins are not removed, the angle cannot be adjusted. Any attempt to do so may cause damage to the PDP.
- 2 Hold onto the bottom of the PDP and pull forward fully as directed by the arrow as illustrated) to adjust the angle. (0°~20° by 2°) Insert the Safety Pins to the front guide holes on both sides as illustrated in figure ②.
  - Viewing the PDP after connecting the external devices Remove the Safety Pins to adjust the angle to 0°, and then secure the Safety Pins again.
  - For safety, be sure to secure the PDP using the safety pins. If the safety pins are not used, the PDP may fall, causing serious injury.

# **Troubleshooting**

Before contacting the Samsung after-sales service, perform the following simple checks.

If you cannot solve the problem using the instructions below, note the model and serial number of the television and contact your local dealer.

#### No sound or picture

- Check that the mains lead has been connected to a wall socket.
- ◆ Check that you have pressed the (b (Power) button (On/Off) on the front panel or press the **POWER** (b) button on the remote control.
- Check the picture contrast and brightness settings.
- Check the volume.
- ◆ Check if Internal Mute is set to ON

#### Normal picture but no sound

- ◆ Check the volume.
- ◆ Check whether the volume **MUTE** button on the remote control has been pressed.

#### No picture or black and white picture

- Adjust the colour settings.
- Check that the broadcast system selected is correct.

#### Sound and picture interference

- ◆ Try to identify the electrical appliance that is affecting the television, then move it further away.
- ◆ Plug the television into a different mains socket.

#### Blurred or snowy picture, distorted sound

Check the direction, location and connections of your aerial.
 This interference often occurs due to the use of an indoor aerial.

#### Remote control malfunctions

- ◆ Replace the remote control batteries.
- ◆ Clean the upper edge of the remote control (transmission window).
- ◆ Check that the "+" and "-" ends of the batteries are inserted correctly.
- ◆ Check that the batteries are drained.

#### Screen is black and power indicator light blinks steadily

- ◆ On your computer check; Power, Signal Cable.
- ◆ The TV is using its power management system.
- ◆ Move the computer's mouse or press any key on the keyboard.
- ◆ On your equipment check (STB, DVD, etc); Power, Signal Cable.
- ◆ The TV is using its power management system.
- ◆ Press the Source button on the panel or remote control.
- ◆ Turn the TV off and on.
