Deciding How to Connect DVD-VCR

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You must take into account various factors when connecting audio or video systems:

- Types of connectors available on your systems
- Systems connected permanently to the DVD-VCR (satellite receiver for example) or temporarily (camcorder for example)

Whenever you connect an audio or video system to your DVD-VCR, ensure that <u>all</u> elements are switched <u>off</u>.

Refer to the documentation supplied with your equipment for detailed connection instructions and associated safety precautions.

Connecting DVD-VCR to the TV using the Coaxial Cable

To receive television programmes a signal must be received from one of the following sources:

- An outdoor aerial
- An indoor aerial
- A cable television network
 - ♦ A satellite receiver
- Make sure that both the television and the DVD-VCR are switched off before connecting the cables.
- 1 Remove the aerial or network input cable from the television.
- 2 Connect this cable to the 75Ω coaxial socket marked ¬¬¬ on the rear of your DVD-VCR.
- 3 Plug the coaxial cable supplied into the T socket on your DVD-VCR.
- 4 Plug the other end of the coaxial cable into the connector previously used for the aerial on the television.
- 5 To obtain better quality pictures and sound on your television, you can also connect your DVD-VCR to the television via the RCA cable (see section below) if your television is equipped with this type of connection.

Connecting DVD-VCR to the TV using the RCA Cable



You can connect your DVD-VCR to the television using the RCA cable if the appropriate input is available on the television. You thus:

- Obtain better quality sound and pictures
- Simplify the setting up procedure of your DVD-VCR
- Regardless of the type of connection chosen, you must always connect the coaxial cable supplied. Otherwise, no picture will be visible on the screen when the DVD-VCR is switched off.
- Make sure that both the television and the DVD-VCR are switched off before connecting the cables.

1 Connect the coaxial cable as indicated in the above section.

- 2 Connect one end of the RCA Audio/Video cable to the Video output and Audio L, R output socket on the rear of the DVD-VCR.
- 3 Plug the other end into the appropriate connector on the television.



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Connecting Other Equipment to Your DVD-VCR

Plug & Auto Set Up

You can connect other audio and/or video equipment to your DVD-VCR in different ways. The following illustrations give a few examples of the connection possibilities.

The RCA input/output connectors on the rear of the DVD-VCR are used for equipment, such as camcorders, VCRs or sound systems.



Your DVD-VCR will automatically set itself up when it is plugged into the mains for the first time. TV stations will be stored in memory. The process takes a few minutes. Your DVD-VCR will then be ready for use.

- 1 Connect the coaxial cable as indicated on page 11. (Connecting Your DVD-VCR to the TV Using the Coaxial Cable)
- 2 Plug the DVD-VCR into the mains. <u>Result</u>: The LANGUAGE SET menu is displayed.
- 3 Select the required language by pressing the ▲ or ▼ buttons.
- 4 Press ENTER to store the language selected. <u>Result</u>: A message appears.
- Press ENTER to start the auto scanning.
 The number of stations automatically stored by the DVD-VCR depends on the number of stations that it has found.
- 6 Check the data and time. (see page 17)
- 7 On completion, press RETURN to exit the menu.
- Auto preset can be performed by pressing (STOP) on the DVD-VCR continuously for 5 seconds or more with no tape inserted.













Tuning Your Television for the DVD-VCR





- You must tune your television for the DVD-VCR only if you are not using a RCA cable
 - \succ To view pictures from your DVD-VCR when a RCA cable is used, the television must be set to the audio/video mode (AV).
- 1 Switch on the television.
- 2 Switch on the DVD-VCR by pressing STANDBY/ON on the front of the DVD-VCR or STANDBY/ON on the remote control.
- 3 Select a programme position on the television to be reserved for use with your DVD-VCR.
- 4 Insert the video cassette in the DVD-VCR. Check that the DVD-VCR starts reading the cassette; if not, press bill button.
- 5 Start a scan on your television or set the television to UHF channel 38 (Newzealand:UHF 36 CH).
- 6 Fine tune the television until the pictures and sound are obtained clearly.
- 7 If you cannot find the pictures and sound, or there is interference from nearby channels, it may be necessary to change the setting of the DVD-VCR output channel (see Setting the DVD-VCR Output Channel on page 23 and Problems and Solutions on page 75).
- 8 When the picture and sound are perfectly clear, store this channel at the desired programme position on the television. Result: That programme is now reserved for use with your
 - DVD-VCR.

The DVD-VCR uses one set of controls to operate both decks. The following keys are helpful in successfully controlling each deck.

Deck Control Keys

- STANDBY/ON Button Press the STANDBY/ON button on the remote control or front panel to turn on the DVD-VCR.

- DVD Button Press the DVD button on the remote control when you want to control the DVD deck.
- The DVD indicator will light on the Front Panel Display to show that the DVD deck is selected.
- VCR Button Press the VCR button on remote control when you want to control

- 4 INPUT Button
- Press the INPUT button repeatedly to cycle through all of your input sources, including the Tuner (PR##), Line 1, Line 2 and Line 3 (rear AV input).

Inserting Batteries in the Remote Control

You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when you:

- ♦ Purchase the DVD-VCR
- Find that the remote control is no longer working correctly
- Push the tab in the direction of the arrow to release the battery 1 compartment cover on the rear of the remote control.
- 2 Insert two AA, R6 or equivalent batteries, taking care to respect the polarities:
- 3 Replace the cover by aligning it with the base of the remote control and pushing it back into place.
- \succ Do not mix different battery types (manganese and alkaline for example).

Setting the Date and Time

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You can connect other audio/video equipment to your DVD-VCR using audio/video cables if the appropriate outputs are available on the equipment chosen.

- **<u>Examples</u>:** You wish to copy a video cassette with the help of a second VCR (see page 41).
 - You wish to play back and/or copy pictures taken with a camcorder (see page 41).
 - Make sure that both the television and the DVD-VCR are switched <u>off</u> before connecting the cables.
- Connect one end of the RCA audio/video cable into the VIDEO socket on the Rear of the DVD-VCR.
- 2 Plug the other end of the audio/video cable into the appropriate output connector on the other system (VCR or camcorder).
- 3 Connect one end of the RCA audio cable into the AUDIO sockets on the Rear of the DVD-VCR.
 - Take care to respect the colour coding of the left and right channels.
- 4 Plug the other end of the audio cable into the appropriate output connectors on the other system (VCR, camcorder or Hi-Fi sound system).

This function allows you to start a new recording at a specific position on the cassette while maintaining a very smooth scene change.

Using the Assemble Edit Function

- 1 Insert the cassette to be edited in your DVD-VCR.
- 2 Press the ►II button to start playback.
- 3 When you reach the position from which you wish to start the new recording, press the ►II button.
- 4 Turn the JOG Dial again as often as necessary to advance frame by frame, until the exact recording position is located.

Recording from Another VCR or Camcorder

- 7 When you have finished recording, press on <u>both</u> VCR and DVD-VCR.

With the Audio Dubbing function, you erase the previously recorded sound and replace it with a new soundtrack from:

♦ A CD, DVD

♦ A cassette player

- A microphone connected to a sound system

Audio dubbing is applicable only to the longitudinal audio track (normal audio).

- Connect an RCA audio cable to the appropriate output on your 1 sound system (cassette player for example).
- 2 Connect the other end of the RCA audio cable to the audio input connectors (L, R) on the Rear of your DVD-VCR.
- 3 Insert the pre-recorded cassette on which the audio track is to be replaced, and press the ►II to start playback.
- Search for the Audio Dubbing (ending) point using the ▶, and set the counter to 0:00:00 by pressing DISPLAY and CLEAR. 4
- 5 Search back slightly beyond the Audio Dub start point using the *«* button.
- 6 Press the **I** button. Press the **I** button one more time to make STILL mode.
- 7 Press A.DUB. Your DVD-VCR is now in the Audio dubbing Still Result: mode.
- 8 On the sound system, locate the point on the cassette at which you wish to start playback. Example: The track that you wish to record on the cassette.

- 10 The audio dubbing will finish when the counter reaches 0:00:00.
- \succ The new sound will be recorded on the normal sound track of the tape, and the original sound will remain on the Hi-Fi sound track. To hear the new sound and original sound mixed together, press the Audio button on the remote control until the MIX option is displayed (see page 36).

Using the TV Buttons on the Remote Control

Your DVD-VCR remote control will work with Samsung televisions and compatible brands.

To determine whether your television is compatible, follow the instructions below.

Result: If your television is compatible with the remote control, it will switch off. It is now programmed to operate with the remote control.

- ≻ If several codes are indicated for your television brand, try each one in turn until you find one that works.
- When you change the batteries in the remote control, you must reprogramme the code, following the same procedure.

You can then control the television using the following buttons.

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VCR SQPB (Super VHS Quasi Playback)

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This function is for playback of Super VHS format tapes only, not for recording.

Playing a Disc

Before Playback :

The Setup menu lets you customize your DVD player by allowing you to select various language preferences, set up a parental level, even adjust the player to the type of television screen you have.

5 Stop MP3 Selection

- * To ensure proper playback of discs burned from MP3 files, make sure the files have been recorded at a bit rate of at least 128 kbps.
- * If there are any gaps (blank data) on multi-session discs, you may experience playback problems.
- * On discs that are recorded with a Variable Bit Rate(VBR), e.g. from 32 to 320 kbps, the sound may cut in and out.
- * When the REPEAT button is pressed during playback, the current song will be played back repeatedly.

When playing CD-R MP3 discs, please follow the recommendations below:

• Your MP3 files should be ISO 9660 or JOLIET format.

ISO 9660 format and Joliet MP3 files are compatible with Microsoft's DOS and Windows, and with Apple's Mac. These two formats are the most widely used.

• When naming your MP3 files do not exceed 8 characters, and place ".mp3" as the file

extension. General name format of: Title.mp3. When composing your title, make sure that you use 8 characters or less, have no spaces in the name, and avoid the use of special characters including: $(.,/, h_{-}, +)$.

• Use a decompression transfer rate of at least 128 Kbps when recording MP3 files.

Sound quality with MP3 files basically depends on the rate of compression/decompression you choose. Getting audio CD quality sound requires an analog/digital sampling rate (conversion to MP3 format) of at least 128 Kbps and up to 160 Kbps. However, choosing higher rates, like 192 Kbps or more, only rarely give better sound quality. Conversely, files with sampling rates below 128 Kbps will not be played properly.

• Do not try recording copyright protected MP3 files.

Certain "securized" files are encrypted and code protected to prevent illegal copying. These files are of the following types: Windows MediaTM (registered trade mark of Microsoft Inc) and SDMITM (registered trade mark of The SDMI Foundation). You cannot copy such files.

Your DVD player only accepts one level of file directory. Consequently you must choose:
 - either to save all your MP3 recording files at the root of the disc;

Cooling fan
