


W Installing the battery

1. Remove the battery cover, remove the battery and insert the SIM card.



2. Install the battery and replace the cover.



🕊 Charging the battery

1. Plug the supplied travel adapter.



2. When charging is finished, unplug the adapter.



lote: Do not remove the battery from the phone without unplugging the adapter first. Otherwise, the phone may be damaged.

W Switching on or off the phone

- 1. Press and hold form one form one second to switch on the phone.
- 2. To switch off the phone, press and hold is for more than two seconds.

Changing the display language

- 1. In Idle mode, press the Menu soft key.
- 2. Select Phone settings \rightarrow Language.
- 3. Select a language.

V Sending a message

- 1. In Idle mode, press the Menu soft key.
- 2. Select Messages \rightarrow Write new.
- 3. Enter the message text.
- 4. Press the Options soft key and add items using the following options:
 Add templates: retrieve a text template.
 - Add phonebook: retrieve a Phonebook entry.
- 5. Press the Options soft key and select Save and send, Send only or Save only.
- 6. If you selected Save and send or Save only, select a memory location.
- 7. Enter a destination number and press the $\ensuremath{\text{OK}}$ soft key.

Making a call

1. In Idle mode, enter the area code and phone number, and press $[\widehat{\ }]$.


Your phone displays the following status indicators on the top of the screen:

🎸 Using the menus

In Idle mode, press the Menu soft key or or to enter the main menu.



Use the 4-way navigation keys (_____) as shortcuts to access your favourite menus.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the Menu soft key.
- 2. Select Phone settings \rightarrow Short cut.
- 3. Select a key.
- 4. Select a menu to be assigned to the key.

To select and modify menu or feature:

- 1. In Idle mode, press the Menu soft key.
- 2. Press the Navigation keys to reach the desired menu and then press the Select soft key or .
- 3. If the menu contains any submenus, locate the one you want by pressing the Navigation keys. Press the Select soft key or ∞ to enter the submenu.

If the selected menu contains additional submenus, repeat this step.

- 4. Press the Navigation keys to find the setting of your choice.
- 5. Press the Select soft key or is to confirm your chosen setting.

Shortcut numbers

You can quickly access the menu you want by using shortcut numbers. The shortcut number displays in front of the menu name in Menu mode.


Silent mode

Disable all sounds on the phone, when pressed and held # in Idle mode. To exit, press and hold this key again.

Lock the keypad, when pressed and held $\frac{1}{2}$, to ignore accidental key pressing. To unlock, press the left soft key and then this key.

🖌 Display

Your phone is in Idle mode when you are not on a call or using a menu. You must be in Idle mode to dial a phone number.



W Phone layout and key functions

Menu/Confirm key In Idle mode, access Menu mode. Select the highlighted option or confirm input in a menu.

Dial key Make and answer a call. In Idle mode, retrieve the most recent calls.

Cancel/Clear key Delete characters from the display. Return the display to the previous menu level.

4-way navigation keys In Menu mode, scroll through menu options. In Idle mode, access your favourite menus directly.

Soft keys Perform functions indicated by the text above the key.

Power/End key Turn the phone on or off when pressed and held. Also end a call.

Entering text

Changing the text input mode

In a text input field, press the right soft key until the input mode indicator you want appears:

- 19 : T9 mode
- A : ABC mode
- 1 : Number mode
- None: Symbol mode

T9 (English) mod

- 1. Press keys 2 to 9 to start entering a word. Press each key only once for one letter.
- The word you are entering appears on the display. It may change with each keypress.
- Finish entering the word before editing or deleting any keystrokes.
- Example: To enter "Hello" in T9 mode, press 4, 3, 5, 5, and 6.
- If the word is not correct, press **0** to display alternative word choices for the keys that you have pressed.
- 2. When the word displays correctly, insert a space after it by pressing #.

ABC mo

Press the keys labelled with the letter you want:

- once for the first letter

<u>Example</u>: To enter बहुत अच्छा (ब + ह + ु + त + space + अ + च + ् +

- $\overline{\mathbf{69}}$ + $\overline{\mathbf{1}}$) using the linguistic dictionary, first press the **5**, **3**, **7**, and 3 keys and then you will see बहुत in the word prediction box. Press the I key to select the word.
- Press the # key to insert a space for the next word. Press the **8**, **1**,

Number mode

Press the keys corresponding to the digits you want.

Symbol mode

Press the number keys corresponding to the symbol you want. You can press Up or **Down** to display more symbols.

Tips for entering text

- To move the cursor, press the Navigation keys.
- To delete letters one by one, press C. To delete all of the letters, press and hold C.
- To insert a space between letters, press #.
- To change case in T9 or ABC mode, press *.
- To enter punctuation marks in T9 or ABC mode, press 1.

Using the Neopad Indian Mode

To type a character in the Noepad Hindi mode:

1. Press a corresponding key to access the Virtual Keypad that contains a character you want. The character will appear in the Virtual Keypad at the bottom of display.

If you want to know which key is assigned to which Hindi characters troup, see the table of "List of the characters available in Hindi".

2. Press the corresponding key 1 to 5 to input a character, or press the stkey to toggle a virtual keypad page to Virama.

Note: When you enter a character, you will see the predicted word in the word prediction box at the bottom of the display. If you want to know about this input method, see the page 2. Otherwise, repeat above steps to enter other characters

W Important safety precautions

Read these guidelines before using your wireless phone. Failure to comply with them may be dangerous or illegal

Do not use a hand-held phone while driving; park the vehicle first.

Do not use the phone at a refueling point (service station) or near fuels or

chemicals

Wireless phones can cause interference. Using them in an aircraft is both illegal and dangerous.

Hospitals and health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy. Follow any regulations or rules in force.

All wireless phones may be subject to interference, which could affect their performance.

Follow any special regulations in force in any area and always switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it.

Your phone is not water-resistant. Keep it dry.

Use only in the normal position (held to the ear). Avoid unnecessary contact with the antenna when the phone is switched on.

Key in the emergency number for your present location, then press \Box . Do not end the call until given permission to do so.

🕊 SAR information

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the European Union (EU) Council. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The quidelines are based on the safety standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and through evaluation of scientific studies.

The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for wireless phones employs a unit of measurement known as Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR limit set by the EU Council is 2.0 W/ kg. The highest SAR value for this model phone was 0.796W/kg.
