### **Safety Instructions**



- ◆ Do not expose the television to extreme temperature conditions or to extreme humidity conditions.

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




#### **Control Panel of Your Television**

#### Using the Buttons on the Panel


If the remote control no longer works or you have lost it, you can use controls on the panel of the TV to:

- ◆ Switch on the TV when it is in Standby mode and select channels (▲ C/P. 🛡 ▼ )
- ◆ Access the menu ( **MENU** )
- ◆ Switch among Video input modes ( TV/VIDEO ) and access to the selected option on the menu system ( ENTER )



#### Rear of the TV











#### **Inserting the Batteries in the Remote Control**










You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when you:

- ◆ Purchase the television
- Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly
- 1 Remove the cover on the rear of the remote control by pressing the symbol (\(\beta\)) downwards and then pulling firmly to remove it.
- Insert two R03, UM4, "AAA" 1.5V or equivalent batteries taking care to respect the polarities:
  - + on the battery against + on the remote control
  - on the battery against on the remote control
- 3 Replace the cover by aligning it with the base of the remote control and pressing it back into place.

### **Connecting to an Aerial or Cable Television Network**



To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received by the set from one of the following sources:

- An outdoor aerial
- ♦ A cable television network
- ◆ A satellite network
- 1 In the first three cases, connect the aerial or network input cable to the  $75\Omega$  coaxial socket on the rear of the television.
- If you are using an indoor aerial, you may need to turn it when tuning your television until you obtain a picture that is both sharp and clear.

### **Switching Your Television On and Off**



#### The mains lead is attached to the rear of your television.

If you have purchased this television in the United Kingdom, refer to page 61 for further instructions on plug wiring.

- 1 Plug the mains lead into an appropriate socket.
  - The main voltage is indicated on the rear of the television and the frequency is 50 or 60Hz.
- 2 Press the "①" button (On/Off) on the front of the television.


Result: The Standby indicator on the front of the television lights up.

3 Press the POWER button on the remote control to switch the television on.

Result: The programme that you were watching last is reselected automatically.


- If you have not yet stored any channels, No clear picture appears. Refer to "Storing Channels Automatically" on page 16 or "Storing Channels Manually" on page 17.
- 4 To switch your television off, press again the "①" button (On/Off) on the front of the television.
  - If your television isn't turned on when the "⊕" button
     (On/Off) is pressed, press the SELECT button to check if
     the "TV" mode has been chosen.





### **Placing Your Television in Standby Mode**





Your television can be placed in Standby mode, in order to reduce the power consumption.

The Standby mode can be useful when you wish to interrupt viewing temporarily (during a meal, for example).

1 Press the **POWER** button on the remote control.

Result: The screen is turned off and the Standby indicator on the front of the television lights up.

2 To switch the television back on, simply press again the POWER button on the remote control.



Do not leave your television in Standby mode for long periods of time (when you are away on holiday, for example). Turn your television off by pressing the "①" button (On/Off) on the front of the television. It is best to unplug the set from the mains and aerial.

## **Becoming Familiar with the Remote Control**


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The remote control is used mainly to:

- ♦ Change channels and adjust the volume
- ♦ Set up the television using the on-screen menu system

#### **Plug and Play Feature**















When the television is initially powered on, several basic customer settings proceed automatically and subsequently. The following settings are available.

1 If the television is in Standby mode, press the POWER button on the remote control.

Result: The Plug & Play is displayed.

2 To start the Plug & Play, press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The Language menu is displayed.

3 Select the appropriate language by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button to confirm your choice.

Result: The message Antenna input check is displayed.

4 Make sure that the antenna is connected to the TV.

Result: After a little while, the **Country** menu is displayed.

5 Select your country by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER button to confirm your choice.

Result: The ATM menu is displayed.

**6** To start the channel store, press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The search will end automatically. Channels are sorted and stored in an order which reflects their position in the frequency range (with lowest first and hialghest last).

To stop the search before it has finished or return to normal viewing, select the Exit and press the ENTER button.

When the setting has finished all, the message Enjoy viewing your new TV is displayed, and then the channel which has been stored will be activated.

#### **Plug and Play Feature**



If you want to reset this feature...

1 Press the MENU button.

> Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select **Setup**.

> Result: The options available in the Setup group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

> Result: The Plug & Play is selected.

4 Press the ENTER button again.

> Result: This feature starts with the message Plug & Play is

displayed.



### **Choosing Your Language**

When you start using your television for the first time, you must select the language which will be used for displaying menus and indications.

1 Press the MENU button.

> Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the **▼** or **△** button to select **Setup**.

> Result: The options available in the Setup group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Language. Press the ENTER

button.

Result: The languages available are listed.

5 Press the **▼** or **△** button to select the appropriate language.




### **Storing Channels Automatically**














You can scan for the frequency ranges available to you (and availability depends on your country). Automatically allocated programme numbers may not correspond to actual or desired programme numbers. However you can sort numbers manually and clear any channels you do not wish to watch.

1 Press the MENU button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channe1** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

Result: The **Country** is selected.

Press the ENTER button again. Select your country by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button.

The countries are displayed in the following order:

Austria - Belgium - Croatia - Denmark - Finland - France - Germany - Iceland - Ireland - Italia - Netherlands - Norway - Poland - Spain - Sweden - Swizerland - Turkey - United Kingdom - Others - East Europe.

- If you have selected the **Others** option but do not wish to scan the PAL frequency range, store the channels manually (see page 17).
- **5** Press the **ENTER** button to confirm your country selected.
- 6 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select ATM. Press the ENTER button.
- 7 Press the ENTER button again to start the search.

Result: The channels are stored in an order which reflects their positions in the frequency range. Finally, the search will end automatically.

- To stop the search before it has finished or return to normal viewing, select the **Exit** and press the **ENTER** button.
- **8** When the channels have been stored, you can:
  - Clear a channel (refer to page 19)
  - Sort them in the order required (refer to page 20)
  - Assign a name to the stored channels (refer to page 21)
  - ◆ Fine tune channel reception if necessary (refer to page 24)

### **Storing Channels Manually**

You can store the television channels, including those received via cable networks.

When storing channels manually, you can choose:

- ♦ Whether or not to store each of the channels found
- ◆ The programme number of each stored channel which you wish to identify
- 1 Press the MENU button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER button.
- Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Manual Store. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The current channels are displayed.

5 Select required channel by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The Manual Store menu is displayed with the Prog.No is selected.

- 6 To assign a programme number to a channel, press the ▼ or ▲ button to find the correct number.

Result:

The color standards are displayed in the following order (depending on the model).

- ◆ Auto PAL SECAM
- ◆ Auto NTSC3.58 NTSC4.43 PAL60
- 8 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to select sound. Press the ▼ or ▲ button repeatedly.

Result:

The sound standards are displayed in the following order (depending on the model).

- lacktriangle BG DK I M
- ♦ BG DK I L











#### Storing Channels Manually (continued)











- 9 If you know the number of the channel to be stored, see the following steps.
  - ◆ Press the ◀ or ▶ button to select **Channel**.
  - Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select c (Air channel) or s (Cable channel).
  - ◆ Press the ▶ button
  - Press the numeric buttons (0~9) to select the required number. (The input range for numeric buttons may vary within different regions.)
    - If no sound or abnormal sound, re-select the sound standard required.
- 10 If you do not know the channel numbers, select Search by pressing the 

  or 

  button. Press the 

  or 

  button to start the search.

Result: The tuner scans the frequency range until the first channel or the channel that you selected is received on your screen.

- To store the channel and associated programme number, select Store by pressing the ◀ or ▶ button. Set to ok by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button.
- 12 Repeat Steps 9 to 11 for each channel to be stored.

#### Channel mode

- P (Programme mode): When completing tuning, the broadcasting stations in your area have been assigned to position numbers from P00 to max P99. You can select a channel by entering the position number in this mode.
- C (Real channel mode): You can select a channel by entering the assigned number to each air broadcasting station in this mode.
- \$ (Cable channel mode): You can select a channel by entering the assigned number for each cable channel in this mode.

### **Skipping Unwanted Channels**

You can exclude the channels of your choice from the channel scan operation. When you scan through the stored channels, those that you have chosen to skip are thus not displayed. All channels that you do not specifically choose to skip are displayed during scanning.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel Edit. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The Channel Edit menu is displayed with the

Add/Delete selected.

5 Press the **ENTER** button again.

Result: The current channels are displayed.

6 Select the channel that you wish to delete by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.

7 Select Erased or Added by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.











#### **Sorting the Stored Channels**











This operation allows you to change the programme numbers of stored channels. This operation may be necessary after using auto store. You can delete the channels you do not want to keep.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel Edit. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The Channel Edit menu is displayed.

**5** Press the **▼** or **△** button to select **Sort**. Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The current channels are displayed.

Select the channel that you wish to move by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.

7 Select the number of the programme to which the channel is to be moved by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The channel is moved to its new position and all other channels are shifted accordingly.

**8** Repeat Steps **6** to **7** until you have moved all the channels to the required programme numbers.

#### **Assigning Names to Channels**

Channel names will be assigned automatically when channel information is broadcast. These names can be changed, allowing you to assign new names.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the Channel group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel Edit. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The Channel Edit menu is displayed.

5 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Name. Press the ENTER button.


Result: The current channels are displayed.

6 If necessary, select the channel to be assigned to a new name by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.

Result: Arrow indications are displayed around the name box.

- 7 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select a letter (A~Z), a number (0~9) or a symbol (-, \_, space). Move on the previous or next letter by pressing the ◄ or ▶ button.
- When you have finished entering the name, press the ENTER button to confirm the name.
- 9 Repeat Steps 6 to 8 for each channel to be assigned to a new name.









### **Using the LNA (Low Noise Amplifier) Feature**









This function is very useful in the situation that the TV is used in weak signal. LNA amplifies the TV signal in the weak signal area, but not noise.

This feature is working only weak signal condition, and that is memorized on current channel, additional.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel Edit. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The Channel Edit menu is displayed.

5 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select **LNA**. Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The current channels are displayed.

6 Select the required channel by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.

7 Select on or off by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.

#### **Activating the Child Lock**

This feature allows you to lock the television so that it cannot be switched on via the front panel. It can, however, still be switched on via the remote control. Thus, by keeping the remote control away from unauthorised users, such as children, you can prevent them from watching unsuitable programme.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the Channel group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel Edit. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The Channel Edit menu is displayed.

5 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Child Lock. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The current channels are displayed.

6 Select the required channel by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.

7 Select Unlocked or Locked by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.









### **Fine Tuning Channel Reception**











If the reception is clear, you do not have to fine tune the channel, as this is done automatically during the search and store operation. If the signal is weak or distorted, you may have to fine tune the channel manually.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Fine Tune. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The horizontal bar is displayed. Move the horizontal

bar's cursor left or right by pressing the ◀ or ▶ button to reach the required setting.

### **Displaying Information**





You can view the channel information and setting status you select by pressing the "INFO" button on the remote control.

### **Changing the Picture Standard**

You can select the type of picture which best corresponds to your viewing requirements.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The options available in the Picture group are

displayed.

2 Press the ENTER button.

Result: The **Picture Mode** is selected.

3 Press the ENTER button again. Select the required picture effect by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button.

Result: The following picture effects are available:

Dynamic - Standard - Movie - Custom.

You can also set these options simply by pressing the **P.MODE** (Picture Mode) button.





### **Adjusting the Picture Settings**

Your television has several settings which allow you to control picture quality.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The options available in the **Picture** group are

displayed.

- 2 Press the ENTER button.
- 3 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Custom Picture. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The options available in the Custom Picture group

are displayed.

4 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select the option to be adjusted (Color Tone, Brightness, Color, Contrast, Sharpness or Tint-NTSC only). Press the ENTER button.


Result: The horizontal bar is displayed. Move the horizontal

bar's cursor left or right by pressing the ◀ or ▶

button.

If you make any changes to these settings, the picture mode is automatically switched to **Custom**.





#### Viewing the Picture In Picture (PIP) (continued)













You can display a sub picture within the main picture of TV program or external A/V devices. In this way you can watch TV program or monitor the video input from any connected devices while watching TV or other video input.

If the current (main) picture is the DVR, DVD or PC mode, the PIP feature does not work.

1 Press the MENU button.

Result: The options available in the **Picture** group are

displayed.

2 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select PIP. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The PIP option is selected.

3 Press the ENTER button again.

To activate the PIP feature, select the on by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.

You can also activate the PIP simply by pressing the **PIP ON** button. To deactivate, press it again.

Fress the ▼ or ▲ button to select TV/Video. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The sources available are displayed.

TV - EXT1 - EXT2 - EXT3 - EXT4 - S-VIDEO

Select a source of the sub picture by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.

7 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select **swap**. Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The main picture and the sub picture are interchanged.

#### **Viewing the Picture In Picture (PIP)**



8 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Size. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The sizes available are displayed.

(Large) – (Small) – (Double) – (16-PIP)

- 9 Select a size of the sub picture by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.
  - You can select these options simply by pressing the SIZE button.
- 10 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Position. Press the ENTER button.

Result: The positions available are displayed.




- You can select these options simply by pressing the button.
- 11 Select a position of the sub picture by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.
- 12 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select **Prog.No**. You can select the channel that you want to view through sub picture by pressing the ◀ or ▶ button.
  - When the TV/Video is set to TV, you can select the channel of sub picture.
    - You can select the channel of the sub picture simply by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button.
  - ➤ To freeze the sub picture, press the **STILL** button. Press it again to return to normal viewing. (If you press it when the PIP feature is deactivating, you can freeze the current picture.)
    - If you press it during on the 16-PIP mode, serial scenes of the last sub picture will be captured.












#### **Selecting the Picture Size** (depending on the model)






#### **Wide CRT**











You can select the picture size which best corresponds to your viewing requirements.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The options available in the Picture group are displayed.

- 2 Press the ENTER button.
- 3 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to select Size. Press the ENTER button.

Result: Depending on the model, the following modes are available:

♦ Wide CRT: Auto wide - Wide - Panorama - Zoom1 - Zoom2 - 4:3

You can control the vertical size and position of the screen by using the ▼ or ▲ button in Auto wide mode when the vertical size is changed automatically by Auto wide mode.

♦ Normal (4:3) CRT: Normal - Zoom1 - Zoom2 - Wide Normal - 16:9 (In the DTV mode)

- You can select these options by simply pressing the P.SIZE button on the remote control. At this time, lifting is available in the Zoom1 or Zoom2 mode by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button.
  - If the PC is connected, you can adjust the VGA mode by using the ◀, ▶, ▼, or ▲ button.
- Press the ◀ or ▶ button to change the setting. When you are satisfied with the setting, press the ENTER button to store.
  - You can shift the screen to your required position in the VGA mode by pressing the P.SIZE button followed use the ◀, ▶, ▼, or ▲ button. To adjust the screen size, press the P.SIZE button again followed use the ◀, ▶, ▼, or ▲ button.

#### **Extra Picture Settings**

#### ♦ Scan Mode

You will normally find that scan mode is best set to **Natural Scan** to reduce any slight picture flicker. However, it is possible that some occasional broadcasts (NTSC-M) may benefit by changing the scan mode. The **Natural Scan**, **Digital Scan** and **Progressive** modes are available.

#### ♦ Digital NR

If the signal received by your television is weak, you can activate this feature to reduce any static and ghosting that may appear on the screen

◆ DNIe (Digital Natural Image engine DNIe)

This feature bring you more detailed image with 3D noise reduction, detail enhancement, contrast enhancement and white enhancement. New image compensation Algorithm gives brighter, clearer, much detailed image to you. **DNIe™** technology will fit every signals into your eyes.

#### ♦ Blue Screen

If no signal is being received or the signal is very weak, a blue screen automatically replaces the noisy picture background. If you wish to continue viewing the poor picture, you must set the **Blue Screen** mode to **Off**.

#### ◆ Tilt

If you find that the picture received is slightly tilted to one side, you can adjust the tilt setting.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The options available in the **Picture** group are displayed.

- 2 Press the ENTER button.
- 3 Select the required option (Scan Mode, Digital NR, DNIe, Blue Screen or Tilt) by pressing the ▼ or ▲ button. Press the ENTER button.
- 4 Press the ▼ or ▲ button to change the setting.
  - ◆ Scan Mode : Natural Scan, Digital Scan, Progressive
  - ◆ Digital NR : Off or On (activating)
  - ◆ DNIe : Off or On (activating)
    - You can select these options simply by pressing the **DNIe** button.

## **Displaying the Teletext Information**






You can display Teletext information at any time on your television.

- For Teletext information to be displayed correctly, channel reception must be stable; otherwise:
  - ◆ Information may be missing
  - Some pages may not be displayed
- Select the channel providing the Teletext service using the PO or PO button.
- 2 Press the TTX/MIX button to activate the teletext mode.
  - Result: The contents page is displayed. It can be redisplayed at any time by pressing the [ii] (index) button.




## **Connecting Headphones**


## **Connecting Additional Speakers**





#### Setting up Your PC Software (Windows only)

The Windows display-settings for a typical computer are shown below. But the actual screens on your PC will probably be different, depending upon your particular version of Windows and your particular video card. But even if your actual screens look different, the same, basic set-up information will apply in almost all cases. (If not, contact your computer manufacturer or Samsung Dealer.)









First, click on **Settings** on the Windows start menu.

While **Settings** is highlighted, move the cursor so that **Control Panel** is highlighted.

When the control panel screen appears, click on **Display** and a display dialog-box will appear.

Navigate to the **Settings** tab on the display dialog-box.

The correct setting of size (resolution) is **640 x 480 pixels**.



## **Programming the Remote Control for Other Components**







This TV's remote control can operate almost any VCR, Cable box, or DVD, in addition to controlling the TV.

- The remote control might not be compatible with the TV manufactured by another company.
- 1 Turn off your VCR, Cable box, or DVD.
- 2 Press the SELECT button repeatedly to activate another component (TV, VCR, CATV, DVD).

Example: If you want to program the remote control to operate your VCR, make sure that **VCR** is displayed

- 3 Press the SET button.
- 4 Use the numeric buttons to enter the code by manufacturer. Each code must be three digits long.

Example: To enter the code "6", press 0, 0, and 6. To enter the code "76", press 0, 7, and 6.

- See the remote control code tables to find the appropriate code for your particular component. If more than one code is listed, try each one separately until you find the one that works.
- 5 Press the POWER button on the remote control. The component you select should turn on. If it turns on, your remote control is now set correctly.
  - ➤ If it does not turn on, repeat steps above, but try one of the other codes listed for the brand of particular yours. If no other codes are listed, try each code, "000" through "089" for VCR/DVD and "000" through "077" for Cable box.
- Once your remote control is set up, press the SET button any time you want to use the remote to operate your VCR, Cable box, or DVD.
  - When your remote control is in the VCR, CATV, or DVD mode, the volume buttons still control your TV's volume.
    - When your remote control is in the TV or CATV mode, the VCR or DVD control buttons (PLAY, PAUSE, etc.) still operate your VCR or DVD.

## Wiring the Mains Power Supply Plug (UK Only)

### **IMPORTANT NOTICE**

The mains lead on this equipment is supplied with a moulded plug incorporating a fuse. The value of the fuse is indicated on the pin face of the plug and, if it requires replacing, a fuse approved to BSI1362 of the same rating must be used.

Never use the plug with the fuse cover omitted if the cover is detachable. If a replacement fuse cover is required, it must be of the same colour as the pin face of the plug. Replacement covers are available from your dealer. If the fitted plug is not suitable for the power points in your house or the cable is not long enough to reach a power point, you should obtain a suitable safety approved extension lead or consult your dealer for assistance. However, if there is no alternative to cut off the plug, remove the fuse and then safely dispose of the plug. Do NOT connect the plug to a mains socket as there is a risk of shock hazard from the bared flexible cord.

### **IMPORTANT**

The wires in the mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

BLUE - NEUTRAL BROWN - LIVE

As these colours may not correspond to the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:

The wire coloured BLUE must be connected to the terminal marked with the letter N or coloured BLUE or BLACK. The wire coloured BROWN must be connected to the terminal marked with the letter L or coloured BROWN or RED.

<ul> <li>Adjust the colour settings.</li> <li>Check that the broadcast system selected is correct.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Try to identify the electrical appliance that is affecting the television then move it further away.</li> <li>Plug your television into a different mains socket.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Check the direction, location and connections of your aerial.</li> <li>This interference is often occurs to the use of an indoor aerial.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Replace the remote control batteries.</li> <li>Clean the upper edge of the remote control (transmission window).</li> <li>Check the battery terminals.</li> </ul>
