

Front of the TV




- 1) Switch the TV on and off
- 2) Remote control sensor
- 3) Standby & Timer indicator
- 4) Display the on-screen menu
- 5) Adjust the volume
- 6) Select channels
- ➤ You can use the ∨C/P. ∴ buttons to switch on the TV when it is in standby mode.
 - The
 → + and
 → C/P.
 → buttons have the same function as the
 △/▼/◄/▶ buttons on the remote control in main menu mode.
- If the remote control no longer works or you have misplaced it, you can use the controls on the panel of the TV.
 - Press the MENU button once in DTV mode, then the DTV menu is displayed.
 For displaying the analog menu, press it twice. Press the MENU button three times to off.
 - ◆ To change external sources, display the analog menu by pressing the MENU button twice and refer to "Viewing an External Signal Source" on page 52.



Infrared Remote Control

The remote control is used mainly to:

- ♦ Change channels and adjust the various settings
- ♦ Use the EPG (<u>E</u>lectronic <u>P</u>rogramme <u>G</u>uide)
- ♦ Set up the television using the on-screen menu system





The performance of the remote control may be affected by bright light.


Inserting the Batteries into the Remote Control

You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when you:


- ◆ Purchase the television
- ♦ Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly
- 1 Remove the cover on the rear of the remote control by pressing the symbol (→) downwards and then pulling firmly to remove it.
- Insert two R03, UM4, "AAA" 1.5V or equivalent batteries taking care to respect the polarities:
 - on the battery against on the remote control
 - + on the battery against + on the remote control
- 3 Replace the cover by aligning it with the base of the remote control and pressing it back into place.
 - Do not mix battery types, i.e. alkaline and manganese.







Connecting to an Aerial or Cable Television Network



To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received by the set from one of the following sources:

- ♦ An outdoor aerial
- ◆ A cable television network
- ♦ A satellite network
- 1 In the first three cases, connect the aerial or network input cable to the ANT IN on the rear of the television.
- If you are using an indoor aerial, you may need to adjust it when tuning your television until you obtain a picture that is both sharp and clear.

Switching Your Television On and Off

The mains lead is attached to the rear of your television.


- 1 Plug the mains lead into an appropriate socket.
 - The main voltage is indicated on the rear of the television and the frequency is 50 or 60Hz.
- 2 Press the "①" (On/Off) button on the front of the television.

Result: The Standby indicator on the front of the television lights up.

3 Press the **POWER** (心) button on the remote control to switch the television on.

Result: The programme that you were watching last is reselected automatically.

- If you have not yet stored any channels, no clear picture appears. Refer to "Storing Channels Automatically" on page 32 or "Storing Channels Manually" on page 34.
- You can also switch the television back on by pressing the P○/○ (or ∨C/P. on the front panel) or numeric button on the remote control.
- **4** To switch your television off, press the "⊕" (On/Off) button again.





Placing Your Television in Standby Mode

Your television can be placed in Standby mode, in order to reduce:

- **♦** Power consumption
- ♦ Wear of the cathode ray tube

Standby mode can be useful when you wish to interrupt viewing temporarily (during a meal, for example).


- 1 Press the **POWER** (也) button on the remote control.

 Result: The screen is turned off and the **Standby indicator**
- 2 To switch the television back on, simply press the POWER (也) button again.
 - You can also switch the television back on by pressing the $P \bigcirc / \bigcirc$ (or $\checkmark C/P . \bigcirc \checkmark$ on the front panel) or numeric button on the remote control.

on the front of the television lights up in red.

Do not leave your television in Standby mode for long periods of time (when you are away on holiday, for example). Turn your television off by pressing the "①" (On/Off) button on the front of the television. It is best to unplug the set from the mains and aerial.






Plug & Play Feature

Plug & Play



Check antenna input.









When the television is initially powered on, three basic customer settings proceed automatically and subsequently: setting the language, channel and clock.

1 If the television is in Standby mode, press the **POWER** (ம) button on the remote control.

Result: The message Plug & Play is displayed. It flickers for a little while and then Language menu is automatically displayed.

Select the appropriate language by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER(→) button to enter the language.

Result: The message **Check antenna input.** is displayed.

If any language is not selected on the Language menu, the Language menu will disappear about 30 seconds later.

Make sure that the antenna is connected to the TV. Press the ENTER (—) button.

Result: The Auto Store menu is displayed with Country selected.

Press the ENTER (→) button again. Select your area by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button, then press the ENTER (→) button.

To search the channels, select Search by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button, and then press the ENTER (→) button.

Press the ENTER (→) button again to start search the channels.

Press the MENU (□) button to stop the search.

Result: The **Time** menu is displayed with **Clock** selected.

Refer to "Storing Channels Automatically" on page 32.

Fress the ◀ or ➤ button to move to the hour or minute. Set the hour or minute by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

Refer to "Setting and Displaying the Current Time" on page 47.

6 When you have finished, press the **MENU** (**□**) button.

Result: The menu is turned to **Auto Store** in DTV mode automatically.

7 If you want to reset this feature...

Not available in DTV mode.

Press the MENU (Ⅲ) button.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Setup, and then press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The Plug & Play is selected.

3 Press the ENTER () button again.

Result: This feature starts with the message Plug & Play displayed.

Changing Channels

It may take some time to display a channel if your chosen channel has the MHEG feature.

Using the P \bigcirc / \bigcirc *buttons.*

Press the $P \bigcirc /P \bigcirc$ button on the remote control (\checkmark C/P. \bigcirc \land on the front of TV).

The TV changes channels in sequence. You can select all channels (analog and digital channels) that the TV has memorized.

You can not select channels that were either erased or not memorized.

Using the numeric (0~9) buttons.

Press the numeric buttons to guickly tune to any channel.


You can select all channels that were either erased or not memorized.


To select analog channel **27**, press the **2**, then **7**. To select digital channel **27**, press the **0**, **2**, then **7**. The TV will change channels when you press the second number.

To change to single-digit channels (0~9) faster, press the $\mathbf{0}$ before the single digit. (For analog channel $\mathbf{4}$, press the $\mathbf{0}$, then $\mathbf{4}$. For digital channel $\mathbf{4}$, press the $\mathbf{0}$, $\mathbf{0}$, then $\mathbf{4}$.)

➤ MHEG(Multimedia and Hypermedia Information Coding Experts Group)?

An International standard for data encoding systems used in multimedia and hypermedia. This is at a higher level than the MPEG system which includes data-linking hypermedia such as still images, character service, animation, graphic and video files as well as multimedia data. MHEG is user runtime interaction technology and is being applied to various fields including VOD (Video-On-Demand), ITV (Interactive TV), EC (Electronic Commerce), tele-education, tele-conferencing, digital libraries and network games.





Viewing the Demonstration

To become familiar with the various menus provided by your television, you can view the in built demonstration.

1 Press the MENU (____) button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Setup.

Result: The options available in the **Setup** group are displayed.

Press the **ENTER** (button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Demonstration**.

5 Press the ENTER (←) button.

Result: Each of the menu options is displayed in turn.

➤ When you wish to exit from the demonstration, press the EXIT (+□) button on the remote control.

Choosing Your Language

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Setup**.

6 Select the appropriate language by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button repeatedly.



Result: The available languages are listed.

Adjusting the Translucency Level





You can set the translucency of the on-screen menu.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Preference.

Result: The options available in the **Preference** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER (←) button.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Translucency Level. Press the ENTER (→) button.

5 Select the required option (High, Medium, Low, or Opaque) by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

6 Press the **ENTER** (→) button to confirm.

Updating the Channel List Automatically

You can update the channel list when the broadcaster adds new services or if you move the TV to a new location.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the Channel group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER (button.

Result: The **Auto Store** is selected.

4 Press the **ENTER** () button again to start the search.

Result: When it has finished, the number of scanned services will be displayed.

The existing favourite channel list will be deleted when the channel list is updated.

◆ To stop the scan before it has finished, press the ENTER (→) or D.MENU button.

If the signal status is poor, the **No service found! Check the aerial connection** message is displayed.





Updating the Channel List Manually













You can specify the channel or frequency for a fast channel search.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channe1** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER (→) button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Manual Store.

5 Press the ENTER (button.

Result: The options available in the Manual Store group are displayed.

6 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to select Channel, Frequency, or Bandwidth.

♦ Channel

Press the \blacktriangle , \blacktriangledown or numeric buttons (0~9) to select a channel. The available channels are 21~68.

Result: The corresponding frequency for the selected channel is automatically set.

◆ Frequency

You can specify the frequency (KHz) using the numeric buttons (0~9). If you do not know the exact frequency, follow the above step to select the frequency automatically using channel.

◆ Bandwidth

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select a bandwidth. The available bandwidths are 7 and 8 MHz.

7 Press the red button to start the scan for digital services.

Result: When it has finished, channels are updated in the channel list.

Editing Your Favourite Channels

You can edit your favourite channels using the colour buttons.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are

displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER (←) button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Favourite Channels.
- 5 Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The Favourite Channels menu is displayed.

- **6** Press the red button to display all currently stored channels.
- 7 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select a channel you want. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: A "**" icon is shown next to the selected channel and the channel will be added to the favourites list.

- ➤ To undo, press the ENTER (←) button again.
 - ◆ **Select All**: Select all channels currently displayed.
 - ♦ **Select None**: Deselect all selected channels.
 - ◆ **Preview**: Displays (a) currently selected channel(s).
- The Favourite Channels settings have been completed.

♦ Add

You can use this function when one or more favourite channels have been selected.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channe1** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER (←) button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Favourite Channels.
- 5 Press the ENTER (→) button.
- 6 Press the red button in the Favourite Channels menu. To add more channels, refer to the step 7 above.
 - To add all channels to the favourites channel list, press the red button.
 - ◆ To remove all channels, press the green button.
 - Press the CH.LIST button to display the favourite channel list.

- In the Favourite Channels menu, select the channel to be previewed by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

Result: Displays currently selected channel.

◆ Delete

- In the Favourite Channels menu, select the channel to be deleted from the favourite channels list by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.
- 2 Press the blue button.

Result: The selected channel and number will be deleted.

To add a deleted channel back into the favourite channel list, see "Add" on page 17.

Setting up the Parental Lock

This feature allows you to prevent unauthorized users, such as children, from watching unsuitable programmes by a 4-digit PIN (Personal Identification Number) code that is defined by the user. The on-screen menu will instruct you to assign a PIN code (you can change it later, if necessary).

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Preference.

Result: The options available in the Preference group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER (→) button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Parental Lock.

Press the **ENTER** (button.

Result: The Enter PIN is displayed.

5 Enter your current 4-digit PIN code by using the numeric buttons (0~9).

Result: The options available in the Parental Lock group are displayed with the Parental Rating selected.

- The default PIN code for a new TV set is 0000.
 - If you enter a invalid PIN code, the Invalid PIN code. Please try again. message is displayed.
- 6 Press the ENTER (←) button.
- 7 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the age of 3~18 rating you want to lock out. Press the ENTER (→) button.
 - If you set the rating to lower than the parental control level of the channel, the channel will be locked.
- 8 If you want to change the PIN code, select **Change PIN** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the **ENTER** (→) button.

Result: The Enter New PIN is displayed.

9 Enter your new PIN code by using the numeric buttons (0~9).

Result: The Confirm New PIN is displayed.

10 Re-enter your new PIN code to confirm by using the numeric buttons (0~9).

Result: The Your PIN code has been changed successfully message is displayed.

If you forget the PIN code, press the remote control buttons in the following sequence, which resets the PIN to **0-0-0-0**: **POWER** (Off), **MUTE**, **8**, **2**, **4**, **POWER** (On)














Viewing EPG (Electronic Programme Guide) Information











The EPG (Electronic Programme Guide) information is provided by the broadcasters. Programme entries may appear blank or out of date as result of the information broadcast on a given channel. The display will dynamically update as soon as new information becomes available.

♦ Now & Next Guide

For the six channels indicated in the left-hand column, displays the Current programme and the Next programme information.

♦ Full Guide

Displays the programme information as time ordered 30 minute segments. One and half hours of programme information is displayed which may be scrolled forwards or backwards in time.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The options available in the **Guide** group are displayed.

- 2 Press the ENTER () button.
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Now & Next Guide or Full Guide. Press the ENTER (→) button.

 Result: The selected guide menu is displayed.
 - You can also display the guide menu simply by pressing the GUIDE button.

4 To Then

Watch a programme in the EPG list

- Select a programme by pressing the ▲/▼/◄/▶ button.
- ◆ Press the ENTER (→) button.
- If the next programme is selected, it is scheduled with the clock icon displayed. If the ENTER () button is pressed again, the scheduling is canceled with the clock icon gone. For details about scheduling programmes, refer to the next page.

View programme information

- Select a programme of your choice by pressing the
 ▲/▼/◄/▶ button.
- Press the INFO() button when the programme of your choice is highlighted.

Toggle between the Now & Next Guide or Full Guide

 Press the red button repeatedly.

Display the **Favourites** and the **All Channels** list

 Press the green button repeatedly.

View Categories

Press the yellow button.

Exit the guide

Press the blue button.



- ◆ Information such as the channel number, programme title and running time, status bar, and brief summary of the highlighted programme will be displayed in the top right corner of the screen. If there is a lengthy summary, "..." will be displayed. Press the INFO () button for the full summary text.
- Six channels are displayed. To scroll between channels, move to a channel using the ▲ or ▼ button. To display page by page, use the P or P button.

Using the Scheduled List

If you make a scheduled viewing list of programmes you may like to see, the channel will be automatically switched to the scheduled programme at the scheduled time even if you are watching another programme.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The options available in the Guide group are displayed.

2 Press the ENTER (button.

3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Scheduled List**. Press the **ENTER** (→) button.

Result: The selected guide menu is displayed.

4 Press the red button to add a new programme.

Result: The menu for adding a programme is displayed with Channel selected.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the required channel. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The **Time** is selected.

Enter the start and stop time of the programme by pressing the ▲,
 ▼. or numeric button.

Press the \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright button to move to the previous or next cell. When you have finished, press the **ENTER** (\frown) button.

Result: The **Date** is selected.

7 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the required date. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The Frequency is selected.













Using the Scheduled List (continued)








- 8 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the required frequency (Once, Daily, or Weekly). Press the ENTER (→) button.
- When you are satisfied with your settings, save the adjusted schedule by pressing the red button.

Result: The scheduled list is displayed again.

- 10 If you want to edit the scheduled programme, select a programme by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the Green button. If necessary, select the programme to be deleted by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the blue button.
- 11 Repeat step 4 to 9 for other programme to be added to the scheduled list.
 - When watching analog TV, the reserved DTV channel cannot be changed. The channel is only changed automatically to the reserved channel when you are watching DTV.
 - The more simple and easy way for scheduling programmes, refer to the step 4 on page 20.
 - Scheduling programme only functions with the television already turned on, and not from standby mode. For details about switching the television on and off automatically, refer to page 49.

Setting the Default Guide





You can preset the default guide style.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The options available in the **Guide** group are displayed.

2 Press the ENTER (→) button.

3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Default Guide**. Press the **ENTER** (→) button.

Result: The selected guide menu is displayed.

4 Select Now/Next or Full Guide by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

5 Press the ENTER (button to confirm.

Viewing All Channels and Favourite Channels

In the EPG menu, you can display all channels or favourite channels.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The options available in the Guide group are displayed.

- 2 Press the ENTER () button.
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Now & Next Guide or Full Guide. Press the ENTER ((→)) button.

Result: The selected guide menu is displayed.

- 4 Press the green button repeatedly to toggle between the all and favourite channels list.
- 5 Select a programme of your choice by pressing the ▲, ▼, ◄, or ▶ button.
- 6 Press the **INFO** () button to display information about the highlighted programme.

Result: The available programme information is displayed.

- 7 When the favourite channel list has not been set up:
 - The favourites list is empty. Would you like to choose your favourites now? message is displayed.
 - ♦ Select Yes.

Result: The Favourite Channels menu is displayed. If you select No, all channels will remain unchanged.

- To edit the favourite channels, refer to page 17~18 for more details.
- ➤ All Channels is the list of channels that have been scanned by the channel list update. All channels are displayed in the all channel mode.
 - ◆ Favourites (favourite channels) is the list of channels that has been set in the Favourite Channels menu (refer to page 17~18).
 - When there is no channel information, the "NO DATA" message will be displayed and you will not be able to change the channel even if you press the ENTER button.

When the "**No data**" message appears and you cannot change the channel, press the channel number directly using the numeric buttons.














Selecting Category Colours









You can change the colours for categories.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.








Setting the Sleep Timer







You can select a time period of between 30 and 180 minutes after which the television automatically switches to Standby mode.

- 1 Press the **MENU** (**III**) button.
 - Result: The main menu is displayed.

 - Result: The options available in the **Setup** group are displayed.

Switching the Television On and Off Automatically




Auto Power Off

When you set the timer "**on**", the television will eventually turn off, if no controls are operated for 3 hours after the TV was turned on by timer. This function is only available in timer "**on**" mode and prevents overheating or leakages, which may occur if a TV is on for too long (on holiday, for example).

When the on/off timer is set, and the TV is turned off while watching a digital TV channel (or an analog TV channel), then the TV will automatically be turned on and display the digital TV channel (or the analog TV channel).



Locking the Channel

Not available in DTV mode.

This feature allows you to lock the television so that it cannot be switched on via the front panel. It can, however, still be switched on via the remote control. By keeping the remote control away from unauthorised users, such as children, you can prevent them from watching unsuitable programme.

Displaying Teletext Information



You can display Teletext information at any time on your television.



- channel reception must be stable, otherwise:



Selecting a Teletext Page



You can enter the page number directly by pressing the numeric buttons on the remote control.

1 Enter the three-digit page number given in the content by pressing the corresponding numeric buttons.

Result:

The current page counter is increased by one and the page is then displayed. If the selected page is linked with several secondary pages, the secondary pages are displayed in sequence. To freeze the display on a given page, press the (hold). Press it again to resume.

2 If the FASTEXT system is used by a broadcasting company, the different topics covered on a Teletext page are colour-coded and can be selected by pressing the coloured buttons on the remote control.

Press the coloured button corresponding to the topic that you wish to select; the available topics are given in the status line.

Automatic Degaussing to Remove Colour Patches

A degaussing coil is mounted around the picture tube, so you do not normally need to degauss the television manually.

If you move the television to a different position and colour patches appear on the screen, you must:

- ◆ Switch the television off by pressing the "①" (On/Off) button on the front panel
- **♦** Unplug the television from the wall socket
- **♦** Leave the television power-off for about 30 minutes so that the automatic degauss function can be activated, and then press the "①" (On/Off) button on the front panel.



If your television will be left unattended, press the " \bigcirc " (On/Off) button to turn your television off.

Normal picture but no sound	 ◆ Check the volume. ◆ Check whether the MUTE (□※) button on the remote control has been pressed.
No picture or black and white picture	Adjust the colour settings.Check that the broadcast system selected is correct.
Sound and picture interference	 Try to identify the electrical appliance that is affecting the television, then move it further away. Plug your television into a different mains socket.
Blurred or snowy picture, distorted sound	 Check the direction, location and connections of your aerial. This interference often occurs due to the use of an indoor aerial.
Remote control malfunctions	 Replace the remote control batteries. Clean the upper edge of the remote control (transmission window). Check the battery terminals.
