

Phone layout





Volume kev

In Idle mode, adjust the phone's volume; Make a fake call (down); Send an SOS message

- ▶ "Make fake calls"
- "Activate and send an SOS message"



Menu key

Access Menu mode; Launch the task manager to view all active applications (press and hold)



Dial key

Make or answer a call; In Idle mode, retrieve logs of your calls and messages



Power/Lock key

Turn the phone on or off (press and hold); Lock or unlock the touch screen and keys



End kev

End a call; In Menu mode, cancel input and return to Idle mode

Assembling and preparing your mobile phone


Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the SIM card and battery

1. Remove the back cover and insert the SIM card.



2. Insert the battery and replace the back cover.





Charge the battery

- Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the top of the phone.
- Plug the small end of the supplied travel adapter into the multifunction jack.



- 3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- When charging is finished, unplug the travel adapter.



Do not remove the battery from the phone before unplugging the travel adapter first. Otherwise, the phone may be damaged.




To save energy, unplug the travel adapter when not in use. The travel adapter does not have a power switch, so you must unplug the travel adapter from the outlet to interrupt the power supply. The travel adapter should remain close to the socket when in use.

Insert a memory card (optional)

Your phone accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards up to 16 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



- Formatting the memory card on a PC may cause incompatibility with your phone. Format the memory card only on the phone.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data will shorten the lifespan of memory cards.
- Open the cover to the memory card slot on the side of the phone.
- Insert a memory card with the gold-coloured contacts facing up.



- 3. Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.
- 4. Close the cover to the memory card slot.

Use the touch screen

Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.



- To avoid scratching the touch screen, do not use sharp tools.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come in contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come in contact with water. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.



- For the optimal use of the touch screen, remove the protection film before using your phone.
- Your touch screen has a layer that detects small electrical charges emitted by the human body.
 For best performance, tap the touch screen with your fingertip. The touch screen will not react to touches of sharp tools, such as a stylus or pen.
- Tap: Touch once with your finger to select or launch a menu, option, or application.
- Tap-and-hold: Tap an item and hold it for more than 2 seconds to open a pop-up option list.
- Drag: Tap and hold on an item, and then drag your finger to move the item.
- Double-tap: Tap twice quickly with your finger to zoom in or out while viewing photos or web pages.

Attach a hand strap (optional)

- 1. Remove the back cover.
- Slide a hand strap through the slot and hook it over the small projection.



3. Replace the back cover.

Using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on or off

To turn your phone on,

- 1. Press and hold [n].
- 2. Enter your PIN and select Done (if necessary).
- Follow the on-screen instructions to set up your phone.

To turn your phone off, press and hold $[\bigcirc]$ and select **Yes**.



If the battery is removed for more than a few minutes, the time and date will be reset.

Access menus

- In Idle mode, press the Menu key to access Menu mode.
- Scroll left or right to a main menu screen.You can also select a dot on the top of the screen to move to the corresponding main menu screen directly.
- 3. Select a menu or application.
- 4. Press [to return to Idle mode.



- When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

Launch and manage applications

To launch multiple applications

Press the Menu key to return to the main menu and select an application to launch.

To use the task manager

Press and hold the Menu key. The icons of active applications appear.

Use shortcuts panel

In Idle mode or while using an application, select in the indicator icons area to open the shortcuts panel.

Select icons to activate or deactivate the WLAN and Bluetooth features. You can also turn on or off the phone's volume and check new messages and alerts.

Use widgets

Learn to use widgets on the idle screen.



- Some of your widgets connect to web services.
 Selecting a web-based widget may incur additional charges.
- Available widgets may vary depending on your region or service provider.
- 1. In Idle mode, select **Widget** at the top left of the screen to open the widget toolbar.
- Read the widget disclaimer and select Accept (if necessary).
- Scroll left or right on the widget toolbar to find the widget you want to use.

- Drag the widget to the idle screen.
- 5. Select Done at the top left of the screen.

Customise your phone

To add new panels to the idle screen

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Widget** at the top left of the screen to open the widget toolbar.
- 2. Rotate the phone clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Select + to add new panels to the idle screen.
- 4. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to portrait view.
- 5. Select **Done** at the top left of the screen.

To set the sound profile

To switch to sound profile,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Sound profiles.
- Select a profile you want and select Set.

To edit a sound profile,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Sound profiles.
- Select a profile.
- Customise the sound settings as desired and select Set.

To select a wallpaper to the idle screen

1. In Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Display and light \rightarrow Wallpaper.

- 2. Select an image.
- Select Set → Set.

Use basic call functions

To make a call

- In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and enter an area code and a phone number.
- 2. Press [] to dial the number.
- 3. To end the call, press [-].

To answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [-].
- 2. To end the call, press [-].

To adjust the volume of voice during a call

While a call is in progress, press the Volume key up or down to adjust the volume.

To use the speakerphone feature

- During a call, select **Speaker** to activate the speaker.
- To switch back to the earpiece, select Speaker again.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.

To use the headset

By plugging a headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press and hold the headset button
- · To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To end a call, press the headset button.



You must use a compatible headset with your phone to ensure for proper performance. You can purchase a compatible headset from your local Samsung dealer.

Send and view messages

To send a text or multimedia message

- 1. In Menu mode, select $Messages \rightarrow Compose$.
- Select Contacts.
- Select the check boxes next to contacts and select Add.
- 4. Select Tap to add text.

- Enter your message text. ▶ p. 24
 For sending as a text message, skip to step 7.
 For attaching multimedia, continue with step 6.
- 6. Select and add an item.
- 7. Select Send to send the message.

To view text or multimedia messages

- In Menu mode, select Messages and select a contact.
- 2. Select a text or multimedia message.

Send and view emails

To send an email

- In Menu mode, select Email → an account → Compose.
- 2. Select Contacts.
- Select the check boxes next to contacts and select Add.
- 4. Select the subject field and enter a subject.
- Select Tap to add text and enter your message text.
- Select → Attach items and add an item (if necessary).
- 7. Select **Send** to send the message.

To view an email

- In Menu mode, select Email → an account.
- 2. Scroll to the inbox.
- Select → Download.
- 4. Select an email or a header.
- If you selected a header, select → Retrieve to view the body of the email.

Enter text

You can enter text by selecting characters on the virtual keypad or by inputting handwriting on the screen.



Available text input modes may vary depending on your region.

To change the text input mode

- Tap and hold and select Keyboard type to select a text input method.
- Tap and hold and select Predictive text to switch between T9 and ABC modes.
- Select to change case.
- Select 123 to switch between Symbol/Number mode and ABC mode.
- Select
 to insert a space; Double-tap to insert a
 period and space; Tap and hold to show frequently
 used symbols.

- Select to start a new line.

T9 mode

- Select appropriate virtual keys to enter an entire word.

ABC mode

Select an appropriate virtual key until the character you want appears on the display.

Number mode

Select an appropriate virtual key to enter a number.

Symbol mode

- Select ◀ or ▶ to scroll to a symbol set you want.
- 2. Select an appropriate virtual key to enter a symbol.

Handwriting mode

Tap and hold and select Keyboard type → Writing full screen or Writing box.

Write a character in the handwriting box at the bottom half of the screen.

Add and find contacts



The memory location to save new contacts may be preset depending on your service provider. To change the memory location, in Menu mode, select Contacts \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Memory in use \rightarrow Save new contacts to \rightarrow a memory location.

To add a new contact

- In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and enter a phone number.
- Select Add to Contacts → a memory location (if necessary).
- 3. Select Create contact.
- 4. Select a number type (if necessary).
- 5. Enter contact information.
- 6. Select Done to add the contact to memory.

To find a contact

- 1. In Menu mode, select Contacts → Search.
- Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find and select Search.
- Select the contact's name from the contact list.

Use basic camera functions

To capture photos

- In Menu mode, select Camera to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- Select to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.

After capturing photos, select b to view photos.

To view photos

In Menu mode, select \mathbf{My} files \rightarrow \mathbf{Images} \rightarrow a photo file

To record videos

- In Menu mode, select Camera to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Select to switch to Recording mode.
- Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 5. Select to start recording.
- Select to stop recording. The video is saved automatically.

After recording videos, select b to view videos.

To view videos

In Menu mode, select **Video player** or select **My files**→ **Videos** → a video.

Listen to music

To listen to the FM radio

- 1. Plug a headset into the phone.
- In Menu mode, select FM radio.
- Select Yes to start automatic tuning. The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.



The first time you turn on the FM radio, you will be prompted to start automatic tuning.

Control the FM radio using the following icons:

Icon	Function
AF	Set the FM radio to automatically retune frequencies for stations when the current signal is weak
	Change the sound output to headset or phone's speaker
HH HH	Search for an available radio station
H	Change the frequency by 0.1 MHz
I	Turn the FM radio on or off

To listen to music files

Start by transferring files to your phone or memory card:

- Download from the wireless web. ▶ p. 30
- Download from a PC with the optional Samsung Kies. ▶ p. 41
- · Receive via Bluetooth. ▶ p. 45
- Copy to your memory card. ▶ p. 42
- Synchronise with Windows Media Player 11.

After transferring music files to your phone or memory card,

- In Menu mode, select Music.
- 2. Select a music category → a music file.
- 3. Control playback using the following icons:

Browse the web

- In Menu mode, select Internet to launch your service provider's homepage.

To bookmark your favourite web pages

- In Menu mode, select Internet → □ .
- 2. Select Add.
- Enter a page title and a web address (URL) and select Save.

To download applications from the web

- In Menu mode, select Samsung Apps.
- Search and download applications to the phone as you want.

View videos via YouTube



This feature may be unavailable depending on your region or service provider.

- 1. In Menu mode, select YouTube.
- 2. Select a video from the list of the featured videos.

Access Social Hub

You can access Social Hub™, the integrated communication application for email, messages, instant messages, contacts or calendar information.

- 1. In Menu mode, select Social Hub.
- 2. Check and use contents delivered from Social Hub.

Use community websites



The feature may be unavailable depending on your region or service provider.

- 1. In Menu mode, select Facebook or Twitter.
- Enter your user ID and password of the destination (if necessary).
- Share photos, videos, or messages with friends and family.

Using advanced functions

Learn how to perform advanced operations and use additional features of your mobile phone.

Use advanced call functions

To view and dial missed calls

Your phone will display missed call icon (**) when you have missed calls

Open the shortcuts panel and select a missed call.
Select the call from the call log and press [---] to dial.

To call a recently dialled number

- In Idle mode, press [] to display a list of recent numbers.
- Scroll to the number you want and press[] to dial.

To hold a call or retrieve a held call

Select **Hold** to place a call on hold or select **Unhold** to retrieve a held call.

To dial a second call

If your network supports this function, you can dial another number during a call:

- 1. Select Hold to place the first call on hold.
- Enter the second number to dial and press [-].
- 3. Select Swap to switch between the two calls.

To answer a second call

If your network supports this function, you can answer a second incoming call:

- Select Accept to answer the second call.
 The first call is automatically placed on hold.
- 2. Select Swap to switch between the calls.

To make a multiparty call (conference call)

- Call the first party you want to add to the multiparty call.
- While connected to the first party, call the second party.
 - The first party is automatically placed on hold.
- 3. When connected to the second party, select Join.

To call an international number

- In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and tap and hold **0** to insert the + character.
- Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then press [] to dial.

To call a contact from the phonebook

- In Menu mode, select Contacts.
- Select a contact you want and press [-].

To reject a call

To reject an incoming call, select **Reject**. The caller will hear a busy tone.

To reject calls from certain numbers automatically, use the auto rejection feature. To activate the auto rejection feature and set up the reject list,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Applications → Call → All calls → Auto reject.
- 2. Select Create.
- Enter a number to reject.
 Select Match criteria → an option (if necessary).
- Select Save.
- 5. To add more numbers, repeat steps 2-4.

Use advanced phonebook functions

To create your namecard

- In Menu mode, select Contacts → My profile.
- Enter your personal details and select Done.

To create a group of contacts

- 1. In Menu mode, select Contacts → Groups.
- Select Create
- 3. Select a memory location.
- 4. Enter a group name.
- 5. To set a group ringtone, select **Ringtone**.
- Select a ringtone category → a ringtone.
- 7. Select Save.

Use advanced messaging functions

To synchronise emails with the Exchange server

- In Menu mode, select Email → Exchange ActiveSync.
- Customise the settings for the Exchange server by following screens.

- After customising the server settings, select the dot next to data types to synchronise.
- 4. When you are finisehed, select Done.

To synchronise your emails,

- In Menu mode, select Email → the Exchange ActiveSync account.
- Select → Download.

To create a text template

- 2. Select Create to open a new template window.
- 3. Enter your text and select Save.

To create a multimedia template

- In Menu mode, select Messages → My folders → MMS cards.
- Select Create to open a new template window.
- Create a multimedia message, with a subject and desired attachments, to use as your template.
 - ▶ p. 22
- 4. Select Save.

To use the instant messenger



This feature may be unavailable depending on your region or service provider.

- 1. In Menu mode, select IM.
- 2. Select a messenger.
- Enter your user name and password, and select Sign In.
- 4. Chat with your family or friends instantly.

Use advanced camera functions

To capture a photo in Smile shot mode

- In Menu mode, select Camera to turn on the camera.
- Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- Select → Smile shot.
- 4. Make any necessary adjustments.
- Select a to take a photo.
- Aim the camera lens at your subject. Your phone recognises people in an image and detects their smiles. When the subject smiles, the phone automatically takes a photo.

To capture a panoramic photo

- In Menu mode, select **Camera** to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- Select □ → Panorama.
- 4. Select a direction.
- 5. Make any necessary adjustments.
- 6. Select at to take the first photo.
- Slowly move the phone in the direction you selected and align the green frame with the viewfinder.

When you have aligned the green frame and viewfinder, the camera will automatically take the next photo.

- 8. Repeat step 7 to complete the panoramic photo.
- 9. Select $\stackrel{\text{\tiny Im}}{\text{\tiny Im}}$ to save the panoramic photo.

To use camera options

Before capturing a photo, select $\{ \widehat{o} \}$ to access the following options:

White balance	Adjust the colour balance

To customise camera settings

Before capturing a photo, select $\{\widehat{\wp}\} \to \P$ to access the following options:

Review	Set the camera to display the captured image
Shutter sound	Set the camera shutter to make a sound when capturing a photo
Storage	Select a memory location for storing captured photos

Option	Function
Reset settings	Reset menus and shooting options

Before recording a video, select $\{\hat{o}\} \rightarrow \P$ to access the following options:

Function
Change the preview screen
Select a memory location for storing captured videos
Reset menus and recording options

Use advanced music functions

To copy music files via Samsung Kies

- Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your phone to a PC.
 Samsung Kies will launch automatically.
 If Samsung Kies does not automatically launch, double-click the Samsung Kies icon on your PC.
- Copy files from the PC to the phone.

 Refer to the Samsung Kies help for more information.



To transfer data from a PC to your phone with Windows XP, you must have at least Service Pack 2.

To synchronise your phone with Windows Media Player

- - When connected, a pop-up window will appear on the PC.
- Open Windows Media Player to synchronise music files.
- 3. Edit or enter your phone's name in the pop-up window (if necessary).
- Select and drag the music files you want to the sync list.
- 5. Start synchronisation.

To copy music files to a memory card

- 1. Insert a memory card.
- 2. In Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Connectivity \rightarrow USB utilities \rightarrow Mass storage.

- Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your phone to a PC.
 When connected, a pop-up window will appear on the PC.
- 4. Open a folder to view files.
- 5. Copy files from the PC to the memory card.

To create a playlist

- 1. In Menu mode, select Music.
- 2. Select Playlists → Create.
- 3. Enter a title for your new playlist and select **Done**.
- 4. Select the new playlist.
- Select Add.
- 6. Select the files you want to include and select Add.

Using tools and applications

Learn how to work with your mobile phone's tools and additional applications.

Use the Bluetooth wireless feature

To turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Connectivity
 → Bluetooth.
- Select the dot on the top right of the screen to turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature
- To allow other devices to locate your phone, select
 → Settings → My phone's visibility → Always on → Set.

If you selected **Custom**, enter duration that your device is visible and select **Done**.

To find and pair with other Bluetooth-enabled devices

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Connectivity → Bluetooth → Search.
- 2. Select a device.

 Enter a PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature or the other device's Bluetooth PIN, if it has one, and select **Done**. Alternatively, select **Yes** to match the PIN between your device and the device.

When the owner of the other device enters the same code or accepts the connection, pairing is complete.



You may not need to enter a PIN depending on the device.

To send data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

- 1. Select the file or item that you want to send from one of your phone's applications.
- 2. Select → Send namecard via or Send via → Bluetooth.

To receive data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

- Enter the PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature and select **Done** (if necessary).
- 2. Select **Yes** to confirm that you are willing to receive data from the device (if necessary).

Use the WLAN feature

Learn to use your phone's wireless networking capabilities to activate and connect to any wireless local area network (WLAN) compatible with the IEEE 802.11 b/g/n standards.



Your phone uses non-harmonised frequency and is intended for use in all European countries. The WLAN can be operated in the EU without restriction indoors, but cannot be operated outdoors in France.

To activate the WLAN feature

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Connectivity → Wi-Fi.
- Select the dot on the top right of the screen to turn on the WLAN feature.

To find and connect to a WLAN

To send an SOS message

 With the touch screen and the keys locked, press the Volume key down four times to send an SOS message to preset numbers. 2. To exit SOS mode, press and hold [①].

Activate the mobile tracker

When someone inserts a new SIM card in your phone, the mobile tracker feature will automatically send the contact number to two recipients to help you locate and recover your phone.

To activate the mobile tracker

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Security → Mobile tracker.
- 2. Enter your password and select Done.



The first time you access Mobile tracker, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.

- Select Accept to continue.
- Select Recipients to open the recipient list.
- Enter a phone number including a country code (with +).

- Select the sender input field and enter a sender's name.
- 8. Select Save.

Make fake calls

You can simulate an incoming call when you want to get out of meetings or unwanted conversations.

To activate the fake call feature

In Menu mode, select Settings \to Applications \to Call \to Fake call \to Fake call hot key \to Save.

To make the fake call

In Idle mode, press and hold the Volume key down.

Record and play voice memos

To record a voice memo

- In Menu mode, select Voice rec.
- Select to start recording.
- 3. Speak your memo into the microphone.
- 4. When you are finished speaking, select .

To play a voice memo

- 1. In Menu mode, select Voice rec.
- 2. Select to access the voice memo list.
- 3. Select a file.

Use Java-powered games and applications

- 1. In Menu mode, select Games.
- Select a game or application from the list and follow the on-screen instructions.



- The download of Java games or applications may not be supported depending on the software of the phone.
- Available games may vary, depending on your service provider or region. Game controls and options may vary.

Add your web or email accounts

Learn to manage your web accounts to use online data sync or community services.

- 1. In Menu mode, select My accounts.
- Select Add account → an account type.
- Enter your account information and select Next.
- 4. Enter the account details.
- 5. Select Set.

Get information or make purchases with the Near Field Communications (NFC) feature

Your phone allows you to read NFC tags that contain information about products, such as web addresses or service call numbers. The NFC feature is a short-range high frequency wireless connectivity technology that allows your mobile phone to read and write some information when placed near an NFC tag. You can also use this feature to make payments and buy tickets for transportation or events by downloading applications.



The back cover includes a built-in NFC antenna. Handle the phone carefully to avoid damaging the NFC antenna

To activate or deactivate the NFC feature

- 1. In Menu mode, select NFC.
- 2. Select Activation.

To deactivate the NFC feature, clear the green dot next to **Activation**.

To read information from an NFC tag

Once you activate the NFC feature, your phone will read product information when you place it near an NFC tag. Available information will appear on your display.



Your phone will not read NFC tags during calls or when the backlight is off.

To view the information at a later time

- 1. In Menu mode, select NFC.
- Select Tag read logs to view the information.

You can also save product information and exchange it with others.

To write information to NFC tags

You can write service call numbers, web addresses, memos, or phone numbers (for messaging) to NFC tags.

- 1. In Menu mode, select NFC \rightarrow Create NFC tag.
- Select a tag type you want to write → Next.
- 3. Select information you want to write.
- Place the centre of the back cover near an NFC tag.

When the writing is complete, a notice will appear on your phone's display.

To make a purchase with the NFC feature

Before you can use the NFC feature to make payments, you must register for the mobile payment service. To register or get details about the service, contact your service provider.

- Place the centre of the back cover near an NFC card reader.
- When prompted, enter your PIN and place your phone near again (if necessary).

Create a world clock

- In Menu mode, select Clock →
- 2. Select Add.
- 3. Enter the few letters of a city name.
- 4. Select the city name you want.

Set and use alarms

Learn to set and control alarms for important events.

To set a new alarm

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Clock** \rightarrow \bigcirc .
- 2. Select Create.
- 3. Set the details of the alarm and select Save.

To stop an alarm

When the alarm sounds,

- · Tap and hold **Stop** to stop the alarm.
- Tap and hold Snooze to silence the alarm for the snooze period.

Use the calculator

- 1. In Menu mode, select Calculator.
- Use the keys that corresponds to the calculator display to perform basic mathematical operations.

Set a countdown timer

- 1. In Menu mode, select Clock → X
- 2. Enter the time to count down and select Start.
- When the timer expires, tap and hold **Stop** to stop the alert

Use the stopwatch

- 1. In Menu mode, select $Clock \rightarrow \emptyset$.
- 2. Select **Start** to begin the stopwatch.
- Select Lap to record lap times.
- 4. When you are finished, select Stop.
- Select Reset to clear recorded times.

Create new tasks

- 1. In Menu mode, select Task.
- 2 Select Create
- 3. Enter the details of the task and select Save.

Create a text memo

- 1. In Menu mode, select Memo.
- 2. Select Create.
- Enter your memo text.
- 4. Select Back to hide the keypad.
- 5. Select a colour to change a background colour.
- 6. Select Save.

Manage your calendar

To change the calendar view

- 1. In Menu mode, select Calendar.
- Select a view mode from the top line of the calendar.

To create an event

- 1. In Menu mode, select Calendar.
- 2. Select Create.
- 3. Enter the details of the event and select Save.

To view events

- 1. In Menu mode, select Calendar.
- 2. Select a date on the calendar.
- 3. Select an event to view its details.

Troubleshooting

When you turn on your phone or while you are using the phone, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
Password	When the phone lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the phone.
PIN	When using the phone for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM card. You can disable this feature by using the PIN lock menu.
PUK	Your SIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.
PIN2	When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

Your phone displays "Network search failed" or "Network error"

 When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again. You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

The touch screen responds slowly or improperly

If your phone has a touch screen and the touch screen is not responding properly, try the following:

- Remove any protective covers from the touch screen. Protective covers may prevent the device from recognising your inputs and are not recommended for touch screen devices.
- Ensure that your hands are clean and dry when tapping the touch screen.
- Restart your phone to clear any temporary software bugs.
- Ensure that your phone software is upgraded to the latest version.
- If the touch screen is scratched or damaged, take it to your local Samsung Service Centre.

Calls are being dropped

When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose your connection to the network. Move to another area and try again.

Outgoing calls are not connected

- · Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number you are dialling.

Incoming calls are not connected

- · Ensure that your phone is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the incoming phone number.

Others cannot hear you speaking on a call

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

Audio quality is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

When dialling from contacts, the call is not connected

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- · Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the contact's phone number.

The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

The battery does not charge properly or the phone turns off

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both goldcoloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery (refer to your local ordinances for proper disposal instructions).

Your phone is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your phone for an extended period of time, your phone may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.

Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your Samsung mobile phone must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery or replace it with a battery that is fully charged.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your phone.
- Restart the phone. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

Error messages appear when launching the FM radio

The FM radio application on your Samsung mobile device uses the headset cable as an antenna. Without a headset connected, the FM radio will be unable to receive radio stations. To use the FM radio, first ensure that the headset is properly connected. Next, scan for and save the available radio stations.

If you still cannot use the FM radio after performing these steps, try accessing your desired station with another radio receiver. If you can hear the station with another receiver, your device may require service. Contact a Samsung Service Centre.

Error messages appear when opening music files

Some music files may not play on your Samsung mobile phone for a variety of reasons. If you receive error messages when opening music files on your phone, try the following:

- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your phone.
- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRMprotected, ensure that you have the appropriate license or key to play the file.
- · Ensure that your phone supports the file type.

Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on your phone.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on the device you wish to connect to, if necessary.
- Ensure that your phone and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 m).

If the tips above do not solve the problem, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

A connection is not established when you connect the phone to a PC

- Ensure that the PC data cable you are using is compatible with your phone.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your PC.

Your phone freezes or has fatal errors

If your phone freezes or hangs, you may need to close programs or reset the device to regain functionality. If your phone is still responsive but a program is frozen, close the program using the task manager. If your phone is frozen and unresponsive, remove the battery, replace the battery, and turn on the phone.

Safety precautions

To prevent injury to yourself and others or damage to your device, read all of the following information before using your device.

Do not use damaged power cords or plugs, or loose electrical sockets

- If you must use your device, keep at least 15 cm away from the pacemaker.
- To minimise the possible interference with a pacemaker, use your device on the opposite side of your body from the pacemaker.

Do not use your device in a hospital or near medical equipment that can be interfered with by radio frequency

If you personally use any medical equipment, contact the manufacturer of the equipment to ensure the safety of your equipment from radio frequency.

If you are using a hearing aid, contact the manufacturer for information about radio interference

- Let the person you are speaking with know you are driving. Suspend calls in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions. Rain, sleet, snow, ice, and heavy traffic can be hazardous.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers. Jotting down a "to do" list or flipping through your address book takes attention away from your primary responsibility of driving safely.

- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic. Place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic. Try to plan calls when your car will be stationary. If you need to make a call, dial only a few numbers, check the road and your mirrors, then continue.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting. Make people you are talking with aware you are driving and suspend conversations that have the potential to divert your attention from the road.


