

- 3. Refund or replacement via your retailer is available for a period of 14 days after purchase for goods that have been inspected and determined to have a major failure. Refund and exchange is not applicable for change of mind.

5. <u>In Home Service/Pick up* Service</u>

This service will only be provided as part of this warranty if all the following conditions are met;

- a) The product is indicated in the Warranty Period Table.
- b) The product is within the warranty period.
- c) The product is located within the normal service area of the local TEAC Authorised Service Centre.

If TEAC determines that the product is not repairable on site, TEAC can complete the repair by taking the product to a TEAC Authorised Service Centre.

Carry-in Service

Where In-Home service/Pick up* is not available, the purchaser is required to send the product to the nearest TEAC Authorised Service Centre for repair. In this event, proof of purchase is required to support a warranty claim. After the repair, the product will be available for collection by or return to the purchaser at a fee upon request. TEAC inhome service can be made available at a fee upon request.

- 6. A 12-month replacement warranty is applicable to all Accessories such as Remote, Power Adaptors and Cables.

1.1 Power Supply

Warnings

DO NOT touch the power plug with wet hands.



1.2 Installation

Warnings

DO NOT place containers with liquids such as vases, drink cans, bottles or small metallic objects on top of the unit.

• If liquid enters the unit or any metal object falls into the unit, it may result in a short circuit, fire, or electric shock.



DO NOT place the unit where it is exposed to rain, excessive moisture or grease.

DO NOT use or store flammable or combustible materials near the unit.

DO NOT place the unit on an unstable surface, such as a sloped table, or any stand with a contact area smaller than the bottom surface of the unit stand.





1.3 Use and Maintenance

Although the LED screen is made with high-precision technology and 99.99% or more of the pixels are effective, black dots may appear or bright points of light (red, blue, or green) may appear constantly on the LED screen. This is a property of the LED screen and is not a malfunction.

Warnings

Disconnect the power cord from the power source during a thunderstorm.

· Not doing so may result in fire or electric shock.



DO NOT insert any metal objects, such as a screwdriver. paper clip, or a bent wire into the ventilation openings or A/V terminals.

· Doing so poses a serious risk of fire or electric shock.



DO NOT allow children to climb onto the unit.

• The unit could topple over onto a child and result in serious injury.



DO NOT dismantle or modify the unit in any way. Do not attempt to service the unit yourself.

Do not display still images and partially still images on the LED panel for more than 2 hours as it can cause screen image retention. This image retention is also known as "screen burn". To avoid such image retention, reduce the degree of brightness and contrast of the screen when displaying a still image. Watching the LED TV in 4:3 format for a long period of time may leave traces of borders displayed on the left, right and centre of the screen caused by the difference of light emission on the screen. Playing a DVD or a game console may cause a similar effect to the screen. Damages caused by the above effect are not covered by the Warranty. Displaying still images from Video games and PC for longer than a certain period of time may produce partial after-images. To prevent this effect, reduce the 'brightness' and 'contrast' when displaying still images.




1.4 Important safety Instructions

Warnings and Precautions

To prevent any injuries, the following safety precautions should be observed in the installation, use, servicing and maintenance of this device. Please read this manual carefully and keep it for future reference.

- 1. Read these instructions.
- 2. Keep these instructions.
- 3. Heed all warnings.
- 4. Follow all instructions.
- 5. Clean only with a dry cloth.
- 6. Do not block any ventilation openings. Install according to manufacturer instructions.
- 7. Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves or other devices (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- 8. Do not defeat the purpose of the polarized or grounding type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong is provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your power outlet, consult an electrician to replace the power socket.
- 9. WARNING: If the mains plug/appliance coupler is used as disconnect device, the disconnect device shall remain readily operable.
- 10. Do not bend the power cord excessively. Prevent the cord from being walked on or pinched by weights placed on it.
- 11. Only use the attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.
- 12. Use only with a cart, stand, tripod, bracket or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the device. When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart and device.

2.2 TV Stand/Wall Mounting Assembly

This TV comes ready to be set up with the provided TV stand. Alternatively, opt to mount the TV on the wall by obtaining a wall mount bracket and mounting eyebolts/screws (thread size M6X12) from your local hardware store. For best results, we recommend that wall mounting should be performed by a professional installer.

(i) NOTE:

- The TV should be levelled or angled directly at the viewer's eye.
- Allow a space of 10cm around the TV to reduce risk of overheating.
- The TV stand allows sideways turning of the TV to a limited degree. Do not force it to turn more than it can as you will damage the stand.


⚠ CAUTION

- Make sure the TV is completely disconnected and unplugged from power.
- To prevent damage to the TV screen, avoid touching or pressing on the screen with hands or objects at any time. Do not press on the front panel as it may damage the screen.
 - To protect the TV from damage or scratching, only place the TV on a soft, flat surface like a table covered with a cotton towel or foam mat.
- Assembly, lifting and moving of the TV must be done by at least 2 people to prevent unit damage or physical injury from accidents.
- Ensure that all screws are tight and secure after assembly, so that the stand or mounting bracket is stable enough to prevent the TV from falling and causing personal injury or property damage.
- Make sure that the TV is not knocked or pulled down from its position. Prevent children and pets from playing with or climbing on the TV. If the TV falls, it may cause personal injury or property damage.
- If the TV stand or wall mounting bracket is damaged, do not use it to support the TV. Contact your dealer immediately.

2. TV PLACEMENT SETUP

TV Stand Installation/Removal


- 1. Place the unit face down on a soft surface.
- 2. Gently position the glass base to the leg at the bottom of the TV.
- **3.** Fasten the 4 provided screws (screw size B4x18F) to secure the stand to the TV according to the diagram.
- **4.** To remove the stand, reverse the steps above.




Fall Prevention

To prevent the TV from tilting forward and falling over to cause damage or injury, please secure the TV to your table or wall using screws or eyebolts and strong cord (not provided). An example on fixing the TV to a table is shown below

- 1. Install a wood screw or eyebolt into the table that is supporting the TV.
- 2. Fix a machine screw into a screw hole near the base in the back of the TV.
- **3.** Tie the wood screw or eyebolt to the machine screw with a strong cord.






Alternatively, secure the TV to the wall directly behind it by fixing eyebolts to the wall and tying them to screws fixed on the centre of the TV back panel.


2. TV PLACEMENT SETUP

Wall Mounting

- 1. Ensure that the selected wall is made of appropriate material and can support the weight of the TV. Make sure there are no pipes or cables inside the wall on your chosen position.
- 2. Obtain a suitable wall mounting bracket and mounting eyebolts (thread size M6x12) and screws from your local hardware store.
- **3.** Place the unit face down on a soft surface.
- **4.** Remove the attached leg at the bottom of the TV by removing the 5 screws on the leg cover.
- **5.** Refit the cover securely by replacing the 5 screws into their original positions.




- **6.** Fasten 4 eyebolts into the four screw holes on the TV's rear panel according to the diagram.
- 7. Fasten the wall mounting bracket using screws onto the wall.
- **8.** Connect the eyebolts and the wall bracket securely with strong rope
- **9.** Carefully check that all fastenings are secure before releasing the TV.



♦ Thread hole size -M6 x 12 depth (TV Mounting Screw Size) on the TV.

3. PARTS & CONNECTIONS

3.1 Front View



INPUT: Display the input source menu. **MENU:** Display/exit the OSD menu. CH+/-: Scan through channels.

VOL+/-: Adjust the volume.


PLAY: Play / Pause the disc playback.

EJECT: Eject the disc.

POWER: Turn on/standby the TV set.

NOTE: Before making or changing cable connections, please make sure that power to the unit is completely disconnected by switching off the power supply and unplugging the power cable from the wall outlet.

4. INITIAL SETUP & INPUT SOURCES

4.1 Initial Power On

When the TV is turned on the first time out of the box or after a factory settings reset, it will prompt you to run auto channel tuning.

- 1. Connect the TV to your antenna wall socket using a coaxial TV cable.
- After making sure all connections are secure, plug in the power cord and turn on AC power.
- 3. Press On the remote control to turn on the TV.
- The TV will initialise and prompt you to choose between Home Mode and Shop Mode. Home Mode is recommended for optimal energy saving. Choose with
 ★ ★ ▼ and press OK to proceed.
- 5. Next, a tuning menu will display. Adjust the settings with ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ and press to start tuning.
- 6. After tuning is complete, the TV will display programmes from detected channels.

(i) NOTE: If no channels are detected, please check the connection and condition of your external antenna.

4.2 Selecting an Input Source

To play different media types and from any connected external device, change input sources to activate the desired connection.

- 1. Press NPUT to display the list of input sources.
- 2. Press ▲ ▼ to choose an input source.
- 3. Press ok to confirm.

DTV, USB and HDMI can also be accessed using the shortcut buttons (DTV/USB) and (HDMI).

This TV starts in DTV mode by default when it is switched on for the first time. Subsequently, it will start in the most recently selected input mode.

(i) NOTE: Please make sure the device is connected before selecting the input source.



5. REMOTE CONTROL

The remote control uses Infrared signals. Point it at the Infrared sensor at the front of the TV.

(i) NOTE: The remote control may not work correctly if it is operated out of range or angle, of if there are objects blocking the signal.

5.1 Remote Control Buttons and Functions



POWER: Switch the TV on or off Standby mode.

DTV/USB: Switch to DTV/USB Mode.

3D: No function for this model.

INPUT: Access the Input Source Menu. **HDMI:** Cycle through HDMI Modes 1-2.

P MODE: Cycle through preset picture profiles. S MODE: Cycle through preset sound profiles. MEDIA CENTER: Switch to Blu-ray mode from other modes. While in Blu-ray mode, press to switch between

disc playback and file/folder navigation.

DELETE: Delete files from the Recorded File List.

REC. LIST: Display the Recorded File List.

SCH.LIST: Display the Schedule List.

SCREEN: 1. While playing music, turn off/on the screen.

2. In HDMI Mode, change between Video and

PC Modes.

3. In PC Mode, auto-align the screen.

MENU: Switch the TV on or off Standby mode.

SUBTITLE: Choose from available subtitles.

AUDIO: Choose from available audio tracks.

EPG: Access the Electronic Programme Guide.

DISPLAY: Display detailed information or controls.

OK: Confirm or enter a selected item.

CH+/-: Browse next/previous channel.

VOL+/-: Adjust volume level.

EXIT: Exit menu or return to last level.

MUTE: Toggle audio output muting.

Number Buttons: Key in numbers to view channels or

other option inputs.

: Return to the most recently viewed TV channel. CH.FAV: Press once to show Channel List. Press again.

Teletext operation:

Teletext is an information system broadcasted by certain channels providing news, weather forecasts, puzzles as well as subtitles. Subject to availability from the broadcaster.

SUBPAGE: Toggle subpage.

HOLD: Hold or resume browsing the subpage. **SIZE:** Cycle through page zoom-in views.

INDEX: Go to Index.

CANCEL: Cancel the Teletext Display. **REVEAL:** Reveal any hidden text.

TV/TXT: Toggle Teletext viewing modes.

Colour buttons: Shortcut keys per on-screen hints.

D.SETUP:Access or exit the Setup Menu in Blu-ray Mode. **2nd AUDIO:** Play the 2nd Audio of 2nd Video (PIP's subwindow video) in Blu-ray Mode.

BONUS VIEW: Turn on or off the secondary video in a small screen window during play (applicable only to Blu-ray disc video that supports the BONUSVIEW or Picture-In-Picture feature) in Blu-ray Mode.

GOTO: Jump to a specific point during playback.

A-B: Define Points A and B for looping playback.

RANDOM: Toggle Random playback mode On or Off.

ASPECT: Cycle through different picture aspect settings.

ANGLE: Choose alternative camera angles if available.

SLEEP: Cycle through and set Timer Sleep settings.

5.2 Battery Installation

6. ON-SCREEN DISPLAY (OSD) MENU

6.1 OSD Menu Overview

The OSD menu system acts as the Main Menu and allows access to main feature controls as well as optional user settings.


(i) NOTE: Certain menus are available only in their relevant input modes.



Navigating the OSD

- **1.** Press MENU to display the OSD.
- 2. Use → to navigate to different menus via the tabs at the top.
- 3. Use ▲ ▼ to enter a menu and select available settings or submenus.
- **4.** Use **♦** or press (on a selected item to adjust settings or enter a submenu.
- **5.** Press ^{⊙K} or **1** to confirm a setting and continue browsing the menu. If you have entered a submenu, please follow the hints at the bottom of the screen, or refer to the relevant sections in this user manual for operation details.
- **6.** Press again to exit the menu, or to exit the OSD completely.

7.1 ATV/DTV Mode

Start watching TV by pressing (INPUT) to switch to the ATV (Analogue TV) or DTV (Digital TV) input source. For detailed steps on changing inputs, please see the Input Source section.

ATV and DTV depends on the broadcasting services available in your locality. The quality of received channels depends on the strength of the signal reception in your location. We recommend using an external antenna connection to receive channels.

Tune to TV channels using Auto Scan or Manual Tuning.

Auto Tuning

Run a complete scan for channels and save all detected channels into the Channel List.

- **1.** Press MENU and navigate to the CHANNEL Menu.
- 2. Use ▲ ▼ and ^{OK} to select the Auto Tuning option.
- **3.** Use **♦** to adjust Country and Tune Type options.
- **4.** Press ok to start scanning.



(i) NOTE:

- Auto Tuning will overwrite all previously saved channels and channel settings.
- If the ATV+DTV option is selected, the first 50% of the scan represents ATV tuning, while the other 50% represents DTV tuning.
- Press if you wish to stop tuning halfway through the process.

DTV Manual Tuning

Scan a specific DTV frequency and save detected channels into the Channel List.

- 1. Press (MENU) and navigate to the CHANNEL Menu.
- 2. Use ▲ ▼ and ^{⊙K} to select the DTV Manual Tuning option.
- **3.** Use **♦** to select a DTV channel.
- **4.** Press ok to start scanning.

ATV Manual Tuning

Scan a specific ATV frequency and save detected channels into the Channel List.

- **1.** Press end navigate to the CHANNEL Menu.
- 2. Use ▲ ▼ and ⁽⁾ to select the ATV Manual Tuning option.
- **3.** Use ▲ ▼ **♦** to adjust scanning options.
- **4.** Press ok to start scanning.



7.2 Electronic Programme Guide (EPG)

While using DTV Mode, press to display the EPG. EPG is not available in ATV Mode.



Browsing the EPG

- 1. Change channels using ▲ ▼ to navigate and press (ok) to tune into a highlighted channel.
- 2. View channel guides when tuned in to the relevant channels by using ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶.
- 3. Browse channel schedules up to 7 days in advance with and and and another and another area.
- **4.** Press MENU or to exit the EPG.

(i) NOTE:

- You need to tune in to a channel before its schedule is displayed.
- EPG schedules are available up to 7 days in advance from the broadcaster.
- While a future programme is highlighted, press PROG to schedule automatic timed recording, or press (BookMark) to schedule a viewing. Please see the DVR section for detailed instructions.

7.3 Channel Customisation

Make personal changes to the channel list in the Channel Edit menu. Different options are available for ATV and DTV channels.

- **1.** Press MENU to display the OSD.
- 2. Use ▲ ▼ to navigate to CHANNEL Menu → Channel Edit and press ^{OK}.
- **3.** If password locks are enabled, key in the password to enter the Channel Edit menu.
- **4.** Customise your channels according to the instructions below.
- **5.** Press equal again to exit the menu, or to exit the OSD completely.





Favourite Channels

- 1. Use ▲ ▼ ◆ ▶ to highlight a desired channel.
- 2. Press D.CLEAR to mark it as a Favourite Channel. This channel will now be listed in the

Skip Channels

- **3.** To remove the channel's Skip status, press (ZOOM) again to remove the 'Skip' mark.

Delete Channels

- **3.** Press ◆ to confirm or ▶ to cancel the deletion.
- (i) NOTE: To add a deleted channel into the list again, you will have to scan for it via Auto or Manual Tuning. See the Tuning section for detailed instructions.

Rename Channels

This feature is only available for ATV channels. DTV channels cannot be deleted.

- 1. Use ▲ ▼ ◆ ▶ to highlight a desired channel.
- 2. Press (BOOKMark) to start renaming and use ▲ ▼ ◆ ▶ to enter the new channel name.

Move Channels

- **1.** Use ▲ ▼ ◆ ▶ to highlight a desired channel.
- 2. Press DIGEST to mark it to be moved, then use ▲ ▼ to move it to a desired position.
- **3.** Press DIGEST again to confirm the new position.

7.4 Channel List and Favourite List

Use the Channel List and Favourite Channel List to change channels with ease.

- 1. Press D.CLEAR to display the Channel List.
- 2. Press D.CLEAR a second time to display the Favourite Channel List.
- 3. Use ▲ ▼ to select a channel and ok to tune into the channel.

7.5 Password Lock for Channels and Programmes

Use the LOCK Menu in the OSD for password settings. This menu requires password access. The default password is 0000. If you have forgotten your password, use the master password 8899.



Enable Locks

This option MUST be turned on to use any password locks for channels and other settings.

- **1.** Press (MENU) to display the OSD.
- 2. Use ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ to navigate to LOCK Menu. You will need the password for access.
- 3. Select Enable Locks and use ◆ ▶ to turn it On or Off as desired.

Password Customisation

Set your personal password with the following steps.

- **1.** Press (MENU) to display the OSD.
- 2. Use ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ to navigate to LOCK Menu. You will need the password for access.
- **3.** Navigate to Set Password and press ${}^{\text{OK}}$.
- **4.** Key in the current password (the default password is 0000).
- **5.** Key in the new password carefully.
- **6.** Key in the new password once more to confirm and save the new password.

(i) NOTE:

The default password is 0000. If you have forgotten your password at any time, use the master password 8899 to reset your personal password.

Channel Locking

Lock specific TV channels so that they can only be viewed after using the right password.

- **1.** Press MENU to display the OSD.
- 2. Use ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ to navigate to LOCK Menu. You will need the password for access.
- **3.** Select Enable Locks and set it to 'On'.
- **4.** Select the Block Channel option and press . The Channel Lock list will display.
- Highlight a desired channel with ▲ ▼ and press BookMark to lock it. Press again to unlock.
- 6. Press to exit.

Parental Control for Rated Programmes

Lock specific TV programmes by rating so that they can only be viewed after using the right password.

- **1.** Press MENU to display the OSD.
- 2. Use ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ to navigate to LOCK Menu → Lock Channel and set it to 'On'. A password will be required to change this setting. See the Password Customisation section for details.
- 3. Use ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ to select Parental Control and choose a rating limit. Programmes with the chosen rating and any ratings beyond it will be locked.

(i) NOTE:

- Programme ratings depend on availability from the broadcasting service.
- Locked programmes or channels cannot be recorded unless they are already being accessed using the password. Please keep this in mind when scheduling recordings.

This feature allows the recording of TV programmes to a compatible USB storage device like a hard disk drive or thumb drive. While recording is in progress, the front panel LED light will flash red and green.

(i) NOTE:

- USB devices such as mobile phones, MP3 players and cameras do NOT support file recording.
- Recorded file sizes depend on the broadcast content, up to several GB per hour.

For best recording and playback results, we recommend using a USB storage device with:

- A. Data storage capacity up to 1.5TB
- B. Maximum disk partition size 400GB
- C. An external power supply
- D. Maximum USB extension cable length 50cm.

8.1 Setting up for USB Recording (Only for USB1)

- 1. Connect the USB storage device to the USB1 port on the back panel of the TV.
- 2. If the USB storage device uses its own power supply, make sure it is turned on.
- 3. Press MENU to display the OSD.
- **4.** Use **▲ ▼** to navigate to CHANNEL Menu → DVR File System and press ok to access the setup options in the DVR File System Menu, as described below.



Selecting a Disk Drive and Checking Compatibility

Select a desired USB storage device for recording if multiple devices are connected. Then check if the connected USB storage device is compatible and ready for recording.

- **1.** Select a disk drive using the Select Disk option.
- **2.** Select Check DVR File System in the DVR File System Menu and press $^{\text{OK}}$.
- 3. One of the following messages will appear: 'SUCCESS' for a compatible device and 'FAIL' for an incompatible device.

(i) NOTE:

- This TV will always use the first partition (C:\) for recording purposes. If your hard disk contains more than one partition, please use the first partition for recording
- Failure to identify the File System may also be due to insufficient memory space on the storage device, or a faulty USB cable. Try another USB storage device with a larger capacity or another USB cable.
- If no device is connected, this detail will be greyed out.

Formatting a Disk

You may need to format the USB storage device for reasons such as:

- A. The device is currently in an incompatible format.
- B. The device's file system is damaged and needs to be rewritten via formatting.
- C. You wish to wipe all data from the device to begin again with an empty drive.

Formatting will ensure that the USB storage device is in the FAT32 file system and that there is enough storage space available for recording programs.

⚠ CAUTION

- Formatting will erase ALL data on the storage device! Please back up all valuable data before proceeding to format. TEAC is not responsible for any lost data due to formatting.
- **1.** Select the disk drive to be formatted.
- Select the Format option in the DVR File System Menu and press (%).
- 3. Select the FAT32 option and press (ok) to start formatting.



- The FAT32 file system is best for high speed storage devices. High Speed FS is best for low speed storage devices.
- After formatting into the FAT32 file system, you will still be able to store and share other media files on the same storage device.
- Storage devices formatted in High Speed FS system can only be used to record from this TV and cannot store other media files.





Time Shift Size

After the USB storage device is formatted into the FAT32 file system, Time Shift cannot be altered. During 'DVR File System Check', the display will show that the whole storage device space will be used for Time Shift. However, Instant and Scheduled Recording will still have priority over available storage space.

For details on using Time Shift, please see the Time Shift section.

8.2 Instant Recording

When a compatible USB storage device is connected, you can record TV programmes at will with the press of a button. While recording is in progress, the TV's LED light will flash.

- 1. Press while watching TV to start recording. Alternatively: → CHANNEL Menu → Record Start
- 2. Press 🕑 if you wish to display the Recording progress bar during recording. Press again to close.
- **3.** Press to stop recording.




(i) NOTE:

- $oxed{1}$ to view the currently recording file while recording. **Press**
- Press (BOOKMARK) to play any other recorded files from the Recorded File List.
- It is not possible to view channels on other frequencies while recording is ongoing.
- The recorded file size depends on the broadcasted content. Please make sure your USB storage device has ample space for recording.
- Please do not turn off or unplug the USB storage device during recording. This may damage the USB storage device or cause data corruption.

Recording in Standby Mode

Continue recording after turning off the TV. (Similarly, scheduled recording can be done while the TV is turned off in Standby Mode.)

- 1. Press while watching TV to start recording. Alternatively: → CHANNEL Menu → Record Start
- 2. Press to turn the TV off into Standby Mode.
- **3.** A prompt will appear. Choose whether to continue recording after turning the TV off, then press (%).



Setting a Record Limit

Set a time limit for Instant Recording. When the time limit is up, recording will stop automatically.

- **1.** Press MENU to display the OSD.
- 2. Use ▲ ▼ to navigate to CHANNEL Menu → Free Record Limit and adjust the setting between 1 – 6 hours.



8.3 Time Shift (Pause Live TV)


Pause live TV temporarily and avoid missing part of the TV show even if you are interrupted.

- while watching TV to pause live TV and start Time Shift. **1.** Press
- Press to resume watching TV from where it was paused. The TV will continue recording live TV.
- **2.** When a Time Shifted programme is playing, a \triangleright sign is displayed on the screen.
- 3. Press 😂 if you wish to display the Time Shift progress bar during Time Shift recording. Press again to close.
- **4.** Press _____ to stop recording and return to live TV broadcast.

(i) NOTE:

Fast Forward/Rewind can be done with $\textcircled{\bullet}$, but if you reach the end of the Time Shift recording, the TV will stop recording and return to the live TV broadcast.

- The max recording time for Time Shift depends on the available data storage space and the size of the broadcast DTV content.
- Time Shift recordings do not remain saved on the USB storage device.



8.4 Scheduled Recording/Viewing Reminder

Schedule an automatic programme recording or viewing event by directly selecting a programme from the EPG.

- A. Scheduled recording: Record a programme into a connected USB storage device.
- B. Viewing reminder: Show a scheduled programme on time.

① NOTE:

- If channel locks or parental control locks are enabled, the locked programmes and channels can be recorded, viewed and played back on this TV using password access. Key in your current password when the password prompt pops up.
- While recording is in progress for a locked channel, you will still need to key in the password to watch that channel. This does not interrupt the recording process.

Schedule a New Recording/Viewing Event

This feature can be used in DTV Mode.

- 1. Press O and use ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ to highlight a desired programme in the programme guide.
- 2. Press PROG to schedule a recording, or BookMark to schedule a viewing reminder.
- A scheduling menu will appear. The desired programme details will already be automatically set. Press ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ to change any details if desired.
- 4. Press k to save. If the new event clashes with an existing event, you will be asked whether to cancel the scheduling or overwrite the old event. The Schedule List will display and list the new event.



5. Press to return to TV viewing. When the time is reached, a countdown will be displayed before recording or showing starts.

(i) NOTE:

- If the TV is in Standby Mode, Scheduled Recording will proceed without needing the TV to turn on.
- At least 20 events can be scheduled. If the maximum is reached, existing events must be deleted before new ones can be scheduled.

Viewing the Schedule List

- When Parental Control is enabled, some recorded programmes may be locked because of their rating according to the EPG. Key in the correct password to play them.

Deleting Recorded Files

- BookMark to view the Recorded File List, then use ▲ ▼ to select a file. **1.** Press

This TV can play movie, audio, image and text files from a connected USB device. For information on supported file formats, see the Reference section.

9.1 Connecting the USB Storage Device

Use a USB storage device such as a hard disk drive or flash drive. USB devices such as mobile phones, MP3 players and cameras are NOT supported.

- 1. Connect the USB storage device to the USB1 port on the back panel of the TV.
- **2.** If the USB storage device uses its own power supply, make sure it is turned on.
- **3.** When the device is detected, it will be listed in the Multimedia Menu. The TV may take a while to read the data, depending on the device's storage size and content.

(i) NOTE: For best results, we recommend using a USB storage device with:

- Data storage capacity up to 1.5 TB
- An external power supply
- Maximum USB extension cable length 50cm.

9.2 Playing Multimedia Files

Press OTVIUSB or And switch to the USB input source. When in USB Input Mode, the USB Menu will be shown. Browse and play files using specific menus for different file types.



- 1. In the USB Menu, press ◆ ▶ to choose the desired multimedia type: Photo for images, Music for audio, Movie for videos, and Text for text files.




10.2 Playing a Disc

Make sure that you have changed to Blu-ray input before loading a disc.

Insert a compatible Blu-ray disc (BD), DVD or CD into the disc slot gently. The disc label/printed side should face away from you and the reflective side should face you. The disk mechanism will draw the disc into the disc player and start reading the disc.

Disc content structure

The structure of a disc content is generally divided as shown below.



- Title/chapter refers to the contents on a BD/DVD.
- Track refers to the contents on an audio CD.
- Folder/file refers to the contacts of a disc in MP3/WMA/JPEG format.

10.3 Playback Controls in Blu-ray Mode

Menu Button Functions

BD video disc:

D.TOPMENU stops the video playing and returns to the disc menu. (Availability of this feature depends on the disc content and manufacturer.)

D.TOPTITLE will access the BD video disc menu without interrupting disc play.

DVD video disc:

D.TOPMENU will display the root menu of a disc.

D.TOPTITLE will display disc information and guide you through the available functions on the disc.



a. Connect a network wire from your modem or router to the RJ45 Ethernet port on the unit.



b Insert a USB memory device into the unit (USB memory should have at least 1GB free space) via the USB2 port.

c Prepare a BD disc that has the BD Live feature.

2. Network testing

a. Navigate to Network → Connection Test, then press OK to start testing your network connection.



b. If the network connection works, the following will be displayed:



c. Navigate to System → BD Live Data → Information, then press OK to get into the submenu to check the available data space left on the USB memory device. We recommend that the free data size should be larger than 1GB.



Highlight the 'Check BD Data' button and press OK to check that the USB memory device is compatible and ready for use.

3. Connect to BD Live

a. Play a BD disc with the BD live feature, and navigate the menu to access the feature.



b. The BD Live feature allows you to connect to the movie studio's server and access their online content. Content availability depends on the movie studio servers.



c. When the BD Live connection is successful, you can browse the online content and downloads. (Different discs will show different menus and interface designs.)





① NOTE:

- The unit must be connected and correctly set up to access the Internet. If you require support in setting up the network connection, please contact your local IT technician.
- Depending on your connection speed and the server connection, it may take time to connect and download online content.
- Follow the instructions given by the disc when using the BD Live function.
- You are recommended to use a USB storage device for downloading BD Live content (at least 1GB free space is recommended).

10.5 Playing music

The BD Player can also play digital music files like MP3 or WMA files.

- **3.** Select a photo folder, then press OK to open.
- **4.** To select a photo, use the **♦** ▶ **△** ♥ buttons.

10.8 Watching 3D Blu-ray Discs in 2D

This is a non-3D TV, but it can downconvert and display 3D DTV broadcasts or 3D video files in normal 2D. When tuned into a 3D channel, the 3D picture will most likely be displayed in a split-screen format. In order to watch normally in 2D on your 2D television, find the correct 3D mode:

- 1. While watching the 3D disc, press the PROG (RED) button to display the 3D Modes menu
- 2. Use ◀ ▶ to select the correct 3D Mode so that the picture displays in normal 2D without split screens or zooming errors.
- **3.** Press or to resume watching the downconverted 3D picture in 2D.
