Getting Started

Intended Use

Nexus has been designed to complement the development of the youngster for which it has been prescribed by the health care professional.

It is imperative that Nexus is used correctly (as per instructions) and adjusted and maintained regularly (as per instructions) to accommodate development and growth.

Young children using this equipment should be continuously monitored and not left unattended.

Using the Nexus

- Before using the Nexus always check all the supports are secure and tight.
- We recommend that children should not be transferred directly from seating to standing with a quick physio/stretch.
- Open all the lateral supports and remove the supine knee blocks, before transfer.
- Lock the caster before transferring.
- When doing a hoist transfer, please ensure that the hoist sling is not caught on any part of the stander.
- As soon as the child has been transferred into the stander, please secure the side laterals, foot straps, knee blocks and tray immediately.
- When fitting the front knee blocks, please take care as the knee blocks are heavy.
 Ensure the knee blocks are locked tight before angling the stander in upright position.
- Batteries should be charged for 30 mins to an hour at the end of each day to maintain optimum life.
- To charge the batteries, plug the charger into the mains and connect the charger lead into the handset.
- It is imperative that children are continuously monitored whilst using this equipment. NEVER LEAVE A CHILD UNATTENDED IN THIS PRODUCT.




Angle Adjustment

To angle Nexus use handset by pressing up and down pads on hand controller.

- Check that the pelvic support and laterals fit the child snugly.
- Check all upholstery for wear and tear.
- Check framework for wear and tear, splinters, breaks.

Monthly Checks


The monthly check, again the frequency is only a minimum and should be adjusted depending on the environment in which the equipment functions. As this check is a more in-depth check a suitably competent individual should be nominated by/on behalf of the prescriber.

- Check that supports and straps are functionally correct and securely fixed.
- Check all the supports are secure and tight.
- Check missing or worn bolts/fixings as required.
- Check straps for fraying and missing or broken buckles.
- Check all upholstery for wear and tear.
- Check framework for wear and tear, splinters, breaks.
- Check the overall structure of the Nexus for any signs of fatigue or damage.
- Ensure end user log is updated.

Cleaning

- Metalwork and coated parts can be wiped with soapy water or antibacterial spray. Please dry the product thoroughly. Please do NOT use solvents, abrasive cleaners, caustic soda, sodium hypochlorite and organic solvents.
- Padded chest, pelvic and knee block should be wiped regularly with soapy water or antibacterial spray. Please dry material thoroughly after wiping.
 Please do not soak the fabric.

Supine Knee Block

Knee blocks can be removed by undoing the blue knobs by a few turns. Like wise to secure the kneeblock slide the knee block to the depth stop and re-tighten the blue knob. 1

Supine knee block fixing stem can be angled up or down when transferring a child by pulling the two plungers out and flipping the stem up or down.



Foot Straps


To fit, loosen webbing at all 3 fixing points, secure cuff around the ankle with buckle fixing and pull each D ring up, to pull webbing tight and to secure the heel. 1

Toe Straps

Fit with buckle fixing adjusting webbing as required. 2

Prone Tray

Loosen the black/orange knobs 1 to achieve the desired tray surface angle adjustment and secure. Fit tray and secure with black wing nuts.

Using Nexus



Prone Headrest

To fit and remove headrest loosen both black fixing wing nuts **1** on mounting bar.



Supine Tray

Loosen the orange knobs 2 to achieve the desired tray surface angle adjustment and secure Fit tray and secure with black wingnuts.
