How To Perform a Full Text Search

Before you begin

You must have either Adobe Acrobat Reader 4.0 with Search or Adobe Acrobat Reader 5.0 installed on your workstation before you can perform a full text search. You must also set up the index (see [How to set up the index](#) below).

How to perform a full text search

Step	Action
1	Click  in Adobe Acrobat Reader. Alternatively, press <i>Ctrl+Shift+F</i> .
2	Enter the text for your search inquiry, then click <i>Search</i>. You can enter a number, word, phrase, or term using wild card characters (*, ?) and operators (=, ~, !, Boolean, and comparison).
3	Choose a guide in <i>Search Results</i> by highlighting a guide and clicking <i>View</i>. Adobe Acrobat highlights the first hit or hits that match your inquiry.
4	Navigate within a guide by clicking: <ul style="list-style-type: none">  to go to the next highlight (alternatively, press <i>Ctrl+]</i>)  to go to the previous highlight (alternatively, press <i>Ctrl+[</i>)  to perform another search (alternatively, press <i>Ctrl+Shift+F</i>)
5	Navigate from guide to guide by: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> pressing <i>Ctrl+Shift+]</i> to search the next guide in <i>Search Results</i> clicking  (or pressing <i>Ctrl+Shift</i>) or to choose another guide in <i>Search Results</i>

How to set up the index

You only need to perform this procedure once.

Step	Action
1	Choose <i>Edit > Search > Select Indexes</i> in Adobe Acrobat Reader. Alternatively, press <i>Ctrl+Shift+X</i> . Adobe Acrobat displays <i>Index Selection</i> .
2	Click <i>Add</i>. Adobe Acrobat displays <i>Select Index</i> .

Step	Action
3	Enter: <code><install_directory>\common\doc\pdf\<product_name>\<product_name>.index.pdx</code> For example: C:\Program Files\Reuters\Common\doc\pdf\extra\extra_index.pdx
4	Click <i>Open</i>. Adobe Acrobat displays the index in the <i>Available Indexes</i> list.
5	Remove any other indexes in the list (such as the Acrobat guides) then click <i>OK</i>. Removing indexes improves response time and avoids unnecessary search results.

Introducing Reuters Search

What Reuters Search does

Reuters Search enables you to search for, retrieve, and display financial information from the Reuters Database (RDB). The search is based on the criteria that you enter for chosen attributes of a market sector. When you perform a search, the items that match the search criteria are displayed in a results pane.

Important! Reuters Search is only available if you have purchased Reuters 3000 Xtra.

What you can find

Usually the items you find are instruments. For example, searching the options market sector enables you to find options. However, in the following two market sectors you can find more than one type of item:

- in the equities market you can find company details (for example, for the Air and Water Technologies Corporation), and issue details (for example, British Petroleum common stock)
- in the indices market you can find indices (for example, the AMEX International Market Index), and vendors (for example, the American Stock Exchange)

Note: Market sector searches are performed within the chosen market sector only. For example, you cannot use the same search to find both equities and options.

Market sectors

There are a number of market sectors which you can search, and you can search for any type of instrument within all markets.

Background on the Reuters Database

About the RDB

The Reuters Database (RDB) is the reference database containing historical data and financial instruments. A request for data by Reuters Search to the RDB returns any relevant data found in the database, according to the search request criteria.

What you can access

The database contains data for securities and treasury instruments.

What securities data you can search for

For securities instruments, you can access the following types of data in the RDB:

- price history for equities, indices, and key money rates
- index constituents and weights
- historical company fundamental data
- over 100 derived fields per equity, such as standard ratios and growth rates

What treasury data you can search for

For treasury instruments, you can access the following types of descriptive data in the RDB:

- coupon attributes
- credit ratings
- debt type
- issue data
- maturity dates
- currencies

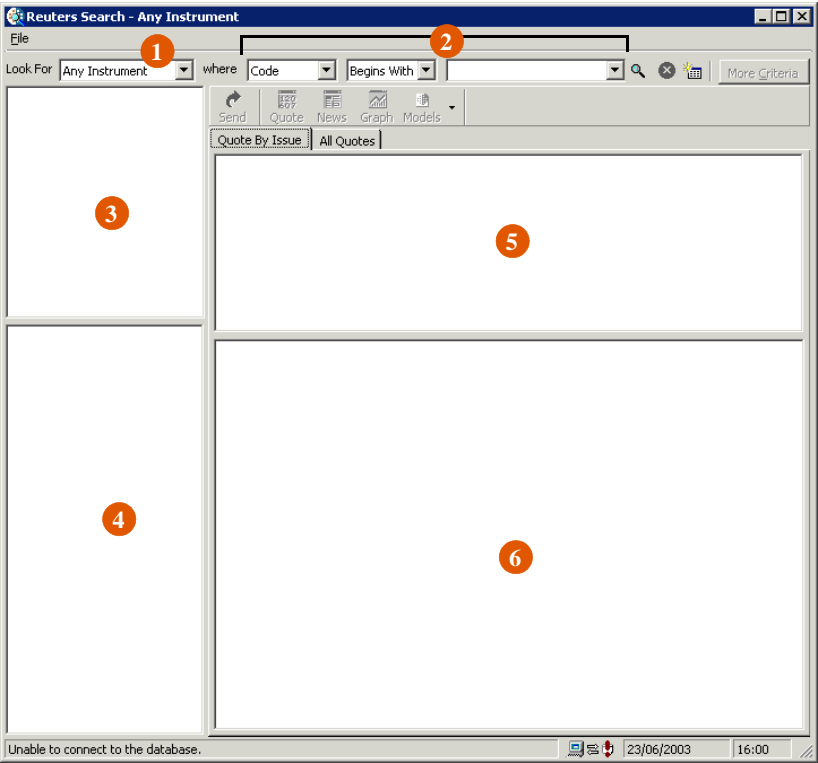

When you start Reuters Search, you see the following window.



Item	Description
1	Enables you to choose which type of instrument or asset class you want to search.
2	Selection of text boxes and lists which enable you to specify the basic criteria for a search.
3	Lists all the asset classes found during the search.

Item	Description
4	Lists all the items that relate to the asset class that you have chosen.
5	Lists all the issues that relate to the type of instrument that you have chosen.
6	Lists all the quotes that relate to the type of instrument that you have chosen.

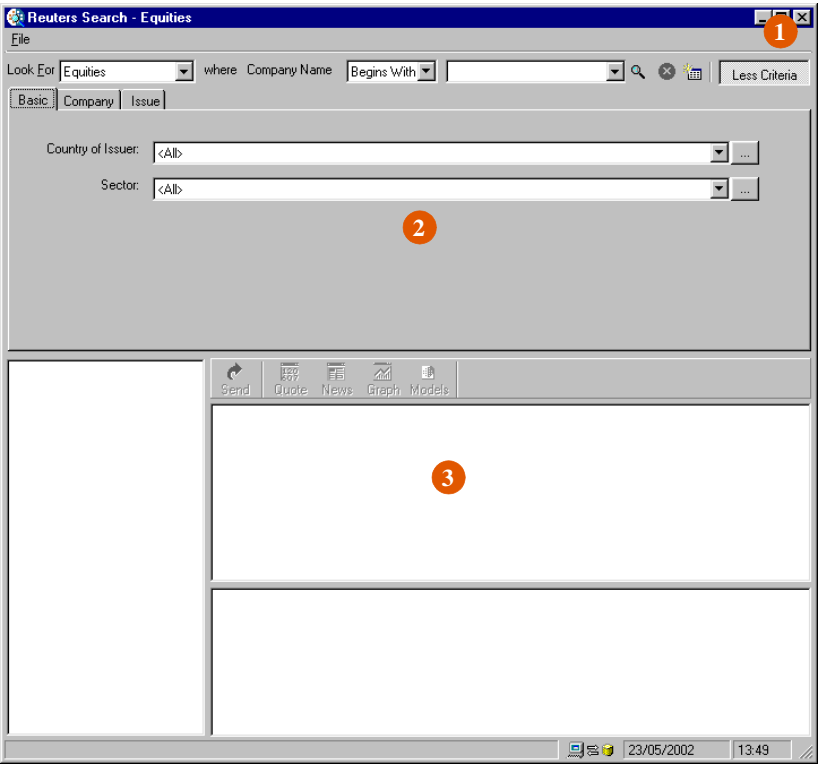

- search for any type of instrument by specifying simple search criteria
- define multiple criteria to search for a specific type of instrument or asset class

Searching for a specific type of instrument

This illustration shows what Reuters Search looks like when you are performing a search using multiple criteria. Note that the display changes according to which asset class you have chosen.




Item	Description

3	Lists all the items that are retrieved as the result of a search.






4	<p>Click <i>More Criteria</i>.</p> <p>For each instrument type, Reuters Search displays specific advanced criteria which enable you to narrow down your search.</p> 
5	<p>Clicking  opens a dialog box from which you can choose specific criteria.</p> <p>Click the single chevron buttons to move a chosen item to the right-hand pane. Click the double chevron buttons to move all items to the right-hand pane.</p>
6	<p>Click <i>Find Reuters Data</i>  to search for items in the Reuters Database.</p> <p>Reuters Search displays items retrieved from the Reuters Database that relate to your specific search criteria in the results pane.</p>

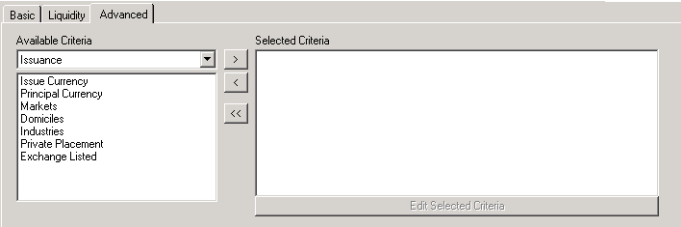

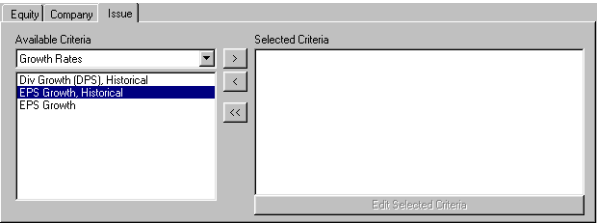
