

### **IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS**

### **INSTALLATION**

#### **Water and Moisture**

Do not install the appliance near water: for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool.

#### Heat

Do not install the appliance near sources of heat such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other appliances that produce heat.

#### Ventilation

Slots and openings in the cabinet and in the back or bottom are provided for necessary ventilation. To ensure reliable and safe operation of the appliance, and to protect it from overheating, these slots and openings must never be blocked or covered.

Do not place the appliance on a bed, sofa, rug or other similar surface which may block the slots and openings.

Do not install the appliance in a confined space, such as a bookcase or built-in cabinet, unless proper ventilation is provided.

#### **Carts and Stands**

#### **Power Source**

### **Power-Cord Protection**

#### When not in use

Unplug the power cord of the appliance from the outlet when left unused for a long period of time. To disconnect the cord, pull it out by grasping the plug. Never pull the plug out by the cord.



### **Outdoor Antenna Grounding**

If an outdoor antenna or cable system is installed, follow the precautions below. An outdoor antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can come in contact with such power lines or circuits. WHEN INSTALLING AN OUTDOOR ANTENNA SYSTEM, EXTREME CARE SHOULD BE TAKEN TO KEEP FROM CONTACTING SUCH POWER LINES OR CIRCUITS AS CONTACT WITH THEM IS ALMOST INVARIABLY FATAL.

Be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.




#### SERVICE

Unplug the appliance from the wall outlet and consult qualified service personnel when:

- -the power cord or the plug has been damaged.
  -a solid object or liquid has fallen into the cabinet.
- -the appliance has been exposed to rain or moisture.
- -the appliance does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance.
  -the appliance has been dropped, or the enclosure damaged.

Do not attempt to service the appliance beyond that described in the operating instructions. For all other servicing refer to qualified service personnel only.



## **Setting the Clock**

Set the time when the CD or radio is turned off.

- 1. Plug in the unit. The display will flash "AM 12:00"
- 2. While holding down TRACK/ENTER/ CLOCK, press either TUNING/TIME **SET** + or – till the correct time appears in the display.

When you release TRACK/ENTER/ **CLOCK**, the clock begins to operate and ":" flashes.

- To set the current time rapidly, keep pressing the + or button while holding down TRACK/ENTER/CLOCK.
- To set the current time from zero second, at step 2, release **TRACK/ENTER/CLOCK** with the time signal.

### **Playing a Disc**

  To change the clock mode to track mode.

#### Notes

Do not open the CD compartment lid during playing, otherwise, the disc will be damaged. Be sure to stop the disc first.
When you press CD ►II, if there is no disc in the CD compartment, the "00" indication flashes

for about 10 seconds and the unit will be turned

If the ACD alarm time comes during listening to the CD, the track changes to that preset by pressing BAND/WAKE UP TRACK.

## **Playing the Radio**

### **Manual Tuning**

1. Press RADIO/SLEEP

The "RADIO" indication lights and the band and frequency of the last station chosen appear in the display. After 10 seconds, the indication becomes the current time but the "RADIO" indication remains.

2. Press BAND/WAKE UP TRACK to select the band, **FM** or **AM**. Each press of BAND/WAKE UP **TRACK** changes the band from  $\mathbf{FM}$  to AM or vice versa.

3. Tune in a station by pressing TUNING/ TIME SET + or -

The FM channel step is set to 0.1 MHz and the **AM** channel step is set to 10 kHz. Beeps sound at the band edge. After 10 seconds, the indication becomes the current time but the "RADIO" indication remains.

4. Adjust VOL.

- To turn off the radio, press CD or OFF/ALARM

To improve radio reception

FM: Extend the FM wire antenna to improve FM reception.

AM: Rotate the unit horizontally for FM:

optimum reception. A ferrite bar antenna is built into the unit.

To check the station you are listening to, press **RADIO**. The band and frequency appear for 10

### **Preset Tuning**

You can preset up to five **FM/AM** stations (one station for each **MEMORY PRESETS** number button 1 to 5.)

## **Setting the Alarm**

You can set the CD, radio and buzzer alarms at the preset time. Before setting the alarm, be sure to set the clock. (See "Setting the Clock".)

### **Setting the Alarm Time**

To set the A CD alarm

**1.** While holding down **ALARM A**, press TUNING/TIME SET + or - till the desired time appears in the display window. The " A CD" flashes.



- 2. Release ALARM A. The alarm time is set and the indication becomes the current time.
- 3. While holding down BAND/WAKE UP TRACK, set the desired track by pressing TUNING/TIME SET + or
- 4. Release BAND/WAKE UP TRACK. The track is preset and the indication becomes the current time.



#### Note

When the CD player is preset to start with track 5, it will always start with track 5 even though you change the CD, unless you change BAND/WAKE UP TRACK.

To set the B RADIO / B BUZZER alarm

- 1. While holding down ALARM B, press either TUNING/TIME SET + or - till the desired time appears in the display window
  - The "B RADIO" or "B BUZZER" " and "-:--"indication flash.
- **2.** Release **ALARM B**. The alarm time is set and the indication becomes the current time.

### **Setting the Alarm Mode**

Before setting **MODE**, be sure to set the alarm time. (See "Setting the Alarm Time".)

1. Press MODE till the alarm you want appears in the display window. Each time you press **MODE**, the alarm indication changes as follows.


#### Note

When you use the radio alarm, preset the station you want for the alarm in **MEMORY PRESETS** button 1, as the preset 1 station is the wake up

Example: To set AM 1260 kHz in MEMORY

- 1. Tune in the AM 1260 kHz (see "Manual Tuning").
- 2. Press TRACK/ENTER/CLOCK. P (preset) indication flashes
- 3. Keep TRACK/ENTER/CLOCK pressed and MEMORY PRESETS button 2 while P is flashing.

P changes to P2 (preset number) and the beeps sound. The station is preset. After 2 seconds the indication becomes the band and frequency. Then after 10 seconds, the indication becomes the current time.




- 4. Repeat steps 1 to 3 for each station to be preset.
- To change the preset station, preset a new station in the number of which you want to change the station. The previous station is cancelled.


### **Tuning in a Preset Station**

- 1. Press RADIO/SLEEP.
- 2. Press MEMORY PRESETS number button of the station you want to tune

The selected preset number appears in the display window. After 2 seconds, the band and frequency of the preset station appear. Then after 10 seconds, the indication becomes the current time.



To Obtain Powerful Bass Switch MEGA BASS to ON. The "MEGA BASS" system produces a powerful bass with the use of a bass reflex system added to a normal speaker



- To stop the alarm, press OFF/ALARM RESET. The alarm will sound at the same time the next day.
- To cancel the alarm, while holding down MODE, press OFF/ALARM RESET. Or press MODE until A CD, B RADIO, or B BUZZER indication does not appear.

  To check the alarm time you set, press the ALARM A or ALARM B.

- The alarm does not function, unless you set the clock and A CD / B RADIO / B BUZZER alarm.
   If you set the CD alarm and radio or buzzer
- If you set the CD alarm and radio of outside alarm at the same time, the CD alarm sounds.
  When you set the CD alarm, if there is no disc in the CD player, the buzzer sound will sound at the time you set.
  The selected alarm sounds at the time you set,
- and automatically turns off after 60 minutes. When the CD alarm comes on, the "ACD" indication flashes. If you want to stop flashing, press CD II.

  The CD player will stop playing at the last track.
- When the radio alarm comes on, the "BRADIO" indication flashes. If you want to keep on listening to radio and stop flashing, press RADIO/SLEEP. The "BRADIO" indication remains.
- The buzzer sound level is fixed, and independent of **VOLUME**.

#### To Doze for a Few More Minutes

- 1. Press SNOOZE/SLEEP OFF. The CD, radio or buzzer will shut off but will automatically come on again after about 8 minutes. You can repeat this process as many times as you want to.
- While SNOOZE/SLEEP OFF function is operating, the alarm indication flashes

## **Setting the Sleep Timer**

By setting the sleep timer, you can fall asleep to the radio sound. The radio turns off after the selected time.

- 1. Turn on the radio and tune in the desired station. See "Playing the Radio"
- 2. Press RADIO/SLEEP while the band and frequency of the station appear. 3. Select the desired operating time by
- pressing RADIO/SLEEP. Each time you press RADIO/SLEEP, the sleep timer indication changes as follows.

 $90 \rightarrow 60 \rightarrow 30 \rightarrow 15 \rightarrow Off$ Frequency indication The sleep timer is set and it will go off after the selected minutes. After 5 seconds, the indication becomes the current time.

- To turn off the sleep timer, press SNOOZE/ SLEEP OFF.
- To cancel the sleep timer, select OFF or press RADIO/SLEEP again after the indication becomes the current time at step 3.

#### To Use Both Sleep Timer and Alarm

You can fall asleep to the radio sound and you will be awakened by the CD, radio or buzzer alarm at the preset time.

- **1.** Set the alarm. (See "Setting the Alarm".)
- **2.** Set the sleep timer. (See "Setting the Sleep Timer".)

### **Precautions**

- Operate the unit only on 120 V AC, 60 Hz.
  The nameplate indicating voltage, etc. is located at the bottom
- Disconnect the cord by grasping the plug.
- Never pull it by the cord.

  As the laser beam used in the CD player section is harmful to the eyes, do not attempt
- to disassemble the casing.
  Refer servicing to qualified personnel only.
  Do not leave the unit in a location near a heat source such as a radiator or airduct, or in a place subject to direct sunlight, excessive dust, mechanical vibration, or shock.
- Allow adequate air circulation to prevent internal heat build-up. Do not place the unit on a surface (a rug, a blanket, etc.) or near materials (a curtain) which might block the ventilation holes.
- ventilation holes.
  Should any liquid or solid object fall into the unit, unplug the unit and have it checked by a qualified personnel before operating it further. When the casing becomes soiled, clean it with a soft cloth dampened with a mild detergent solution. Never use abrasive cleansers or chemical solvents, as they may mar the casing.

- Did you place a disc correctly?

- Skipping of sound in CD operation
  Dusty or defective disc—Clean the disc.
  Dirty lens—Clean the lens with a commercially available blower.

  The CD, radio or buzzer alarm does not come on at the preset time.
