## **Paper Handling Features**

## Output (Unstapled)

- 3,000 sheets Letter (20 lb bond)/A4 (80 g/m<sup>2</sup>)
- 1,500 sheets Ledger (20 lb bond)/A3 (80 g/m<sup>2</sup>)

## Stapling (HP 3000-sheet Stapler/Stacker)

- 2 to 50 sheets of 20 lb bond, or equivalent job height (5 mm)
- Multiple staple positions:
  - One angled
  - One, two, three, or six
  - Custom, up to seven staples



## **Ordering Information**

The product number for the replacement Stapler refills is C4791A (3 Stapler refills, 5,000 staples per refill).

## **User LED Interpretation**

Use the following table to interpret the status of the device by referring to the user LED (see the graphic on the next page).

User LED status	Interpretation
Solid Green	The device is on and ready.
Flashing Amber	<ul> <li>The device is not correctly attached to the printer.</li> <li>One or more bins are full.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The device has a paper jam or staple jam, or a page needs to be removed from the bins.</li> </ul>
Solid Amber	The device is experiencing a hardware malfunction.
Off	<ul> <li>The printer is in PowerSave mode. Press Go on the printer's Control Panel.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The device is not receiving power. Check the power box connections, power cables, and C-link cable connections.</li> </ul>
Flashing Green	The device is in service mode.

## Using the Device



## Selecting the Output Bin

The system has several output locations: the Standard Output Bin, the Face-up Bin, and the Stacker Bin.





Note

Envelopes, labels, and transparencies are ONLY supported in the Face-up Bin.

## Configuring the Device

The device attaches to the left side of the printer. There is a menu in the printer's Control Panel called CONFIGURATION OF STKR where you can change the default offset and default stapler actions.

**Note** The network administrator can limit access to the offset and default stapler actions.

#### **Offset** actions

Offset Action: No When the Job Offset mode is off, all of the jobs are stacked with no separation.

**Offset Action: Yes** 

When the Job Offset mode is on, the device automatically separates complete jobs or mopies (multiple original prints of a single job). Each job or mopy is separated by offsetting the jobs from each other.





## Offset actions (continued)

Offset Action: Job Separator	When the Job Separator action is enabled, the device automatically separates jobs or mopies. Each job or mopy is separated by only offsetting the first page.
	<b>Note</b> This offset action is only available for the HP 3000-sheet Stacker.

Note The user can select the available stapler action through the printer driver (for example, 1 staple or 2 staples). When selecting any stapler action, the jobs or mopies are automatically separated by offsetting the jobs or mopies from each other. If the proper printer driver is not used, the default stapler action occurs.

Default stapler actions (HP 3000-sheet Stapler/Stacker ONLY)

No Staple	If the default action is set to No Staple, the job is not stapled.



Default stapler actions (HP 3000-sheet Stapler/Stacker ONLY) (continued)

#### Angled Staple



If the default action is set to Angled Staple, the staple is placed in the corner of the document at a 40 degree angle.

Default stapler actions (HP 3000-sheet Stapler/Stacker ONLY) (continued)

**One Staple, Two Staples, Three** If the default action is set to One Staple, Two Staples, **Staples, or Six Staples** Three Staples, or Six Staples, one job or mopies are

Three Staples, or Six Staples, one job or mopies are stapled with the number of staples indicated from one to six. All of the staples are placed parallel to the edge closest to the printer. These are predetermined staple positions.

#### Note

When using the Six Staples option, if the paper is narrower than 8.5 in. (216 mm), the job may have less than six staples.

#### Note

Default stapler actions (HP 3000-sheet Stapler/Stacker ONLY) (continued)

#### Custom



If the default action is set to Custom, the network administrator must define the number of staples (up to seven) and their location. The users can select this feature through the printer driver.

#### Note

Only the network administrator can configure the Custom action through HP JetAdmin.

# **Refilling the Stapler Cartridge (HP 3000-sheet Stapler/Stacker ONLY)**

- 1 Move the Stapler/Stacker away from the printer, open the Stapler door.
- 2 To remove the Stapler Cartridge, squeeze the green cartridge release handle, and pull the Stapler Cartridge out.
- **3** Remove the empty cardboard box and discard it.

Refilling the Stapler Cartridge (HP 3000-sheet Stapler/Stacker ONLY)

- 4 Holding the Stapler refill with the arrow pointing up, insert the Stapler refill into the Stapler Cartridge.
- Grasp the orange cardboard tab on the Stapler 5 refill and remove the tape.
- Insert the Stapler Cartridge into the Stapler 6 module.
- 7 Push the Stapler Cartridge in place. A click means that the Stapler Cartridge is installed properly.











## **Clearing Paper Jams**

The message STKR: DETACH AND CLEAR JAM displays on the Control Panel.

- **1** Move the device away from the printer.
- 2 Remove paper from any of the indicated areas (A, B, C, D, or E). See the <u>graphic</u> on the following page.
- **3** Reattach the device. Wait for the solid green status light on the user LED on the device.
- Note When clearing paper jams, be very careful not to tear the paper. If a small piece of paper is left in the device, it could cause additional jams.

# Clearing Stapler Jams

The message STKR: DETACH AND CLEAR STAPLE JAM or CHECK STAPLER DEVICE alternating with CLEAR JAMMED STAPLE displays on the Control Panel.

- 1 Move the Stapler/Stacker away from the printer.
- **2** To clear the paper jam from the Stacker Bin, pull the paper out of the rollers.
- **3** Open the Stapler door on the rear of the Stapler/Stacker.

- 4 To remove the Stapler Cartridge, squeeze the green cartridge release handle, and pull the Stapler Cartridge out.
- 5 Pull the cartridge lever up.
- 6 Remove the staple that is jammed in the Stapler Cartridge.
- 7 Push the cartridge lever down.

- 8 Insert the Stapler Cartridge into the Stapler module.
- **9** Push the Stapler Cartridge into place. A click means that the Stapler Cartridge is installed properly.
- **10** Close the Stapler door on the rear of the Stapler/Stacker.
- **11** Reattach the Stapler/Stacker and wait for a solid green status light on the user LED on the device.













## Control Panel Messages for the Device

The following table explains messages that might display on the printer's Control Panel. Messages are listed in alphabetical order.

STAPLER LOW ON STAPLES	The Stapler Cartridge has 20 to 50 staples remaining.	No action required.
STAPLER OUT OF STAPLES	There are no more staples in the Stapler Cartridge.	Refill the Stapler Cartridge. See page <u>15</u> for instructions.
STKR: ATTACH TO PRINTER	The device is not attached to the printer properly.	Make sure that there is a proper attachment between the device and the printer, and wait for a solid green status light on the user LED on the device.

Too Many Pages In Job to Staple	The job height is greater than the stapler capacity. The height of the job to be stapled should not exceed 5 mm.	See the stapling specifications on page <u>32</u> for more information.

# **Determining System Problems**



Output does not go to selected bin

Situation	Possible Reason
Job went to a different bin than was expected.	The selected bin does not support the media used. (See page <u>30</u> for supported paper sizes.)

Note Envelopes, labels, and transparencies are ONLY supported in the Face-up Bin.

The Stapler can staple jobs of 2 to 50 sheets or 5 mm of thickness. If the job is thicker than this, the job is ejected unstapled. The Stacker Bin can hold a maximum of 3,000 sheets, depending on the paper's size and weight.

## Information Menu

This control panel menu contains printer information pages that give details about the printer and its configuration. To print an information page, scroll to the desired page, and press SELECT.

#### **Paper Path Test**

The paper path test can be used to verify that the paper path is working properly or to troubleshoot problems with a type of paper.

- **1** Press MENU repeatedly until INFORMATION MENU appears.
- **2** Press ITEM repeatedly until PRINT PAPER PATH TEST appears.
- **3** Press SELECT to select the paper path test.
- 4 Select the input tray, output bin, duplexer (if available), and number of copies using the VALUE + key and the SELECT key. After selecting the last option, the paper path test automatically starts.

For the HP 3000-sheet Stapler/Stacker: To send the output to the Face-up Bin, select the FACE-UP BIN option. To send the output to the Stacker Bin, select the OPTIONAL BIN 1 option.

Note When running the paper path test to confirm that the stapler is working correctly, make sure that one of the stapler action options has been selected. If one has not been selected, the job will not be stapled. Also make sure that you are selecting and sending more than one copy.

## Paper Handling Menu

When paper handling settings are correctly configured through the printer's Control Panel, you can print by choosing the type and size of paper from the printer driver or software application.
