

#### Front Panel

This unit uses a flip-down structure that makes possible large-size displays.

## CAUTION

When opening and closing the front panel, be careful not to catch your fingers. They could be injured.

- Always use this unit with the front panel closed.
- Do not force operations or use this device abnormally when opening or closing the front panel.
- 3. Do not use the front panel as a tray to place objects on when it is open.
- 4. When closing the front panel, do not press the [OPEN] button.
- Strong impacts to the operating or display section can cause damage or deformation.
- If the front panel does not open fully, gently open it with your hand.

## **Handling Compact Discs**

- Compared to ordinary music CDs, CD-R and CD-RW discs are both easily affected by high temperature and humidity and some of CD-R and CD-RW discs may not be played.
  - Therefore, do not leave them for a long time in the boat.
- Never stick labels on the surface of the compact disc or mark the surface with a pencil or pen.

## Display Screen

In extreme cold, the screen movement may slow down and the screen may darken, but this is normal.


The screen will recover when it returns to normal temperature.

## **USB Port**


- The USB memory sticks must be recognized as "USB mass storage class" to work properly. Some models may not operate correctly.

# 3. CONTROLS

## Names of the Buttons and Their Main Functions



### With the front panel opened



#### [DISC] button

Use to switch to CD/MP3/WMA mode.

## [AUX/iPod] button

Use to switch to USB/iPod mode or AUX mode.

#### [OPEN] button

 Open the panel by pressing the "Clarion" oval latch button. Audio will mute with the front panel open.

#### [AM/FM] button

- Use to switch to Badio mode.
- Switch the band.

#### [SAT] button

· Use to switch to Satellite mode.

- · Switch the band.
- Press and hold the button to enter the category selection mode.

#### [MENU] button

· Use to switch to the menu mode.

### [ MUTE ] button

- Press and hold the button (1 sec.) to play or pause.
- · Turn the mute on/off.

#### [ENTER] button

Confirm(press)

## Names of the Buttons and Their Main Functions

#### [RETURN] button

Press the button to return to the previous mode in some adjust operations.

#### [ ◀], [ ▶ ] (Search) buttons

- Select a station while in the Radio mode or select a track while in CD/MP3/WMA mode.
- · Press and hold the button for (1 sec.) to switch to fast-forward/fast-reverse.

## [IR RECEIVER]

 Receiver for optional IR remote control unit. (Operating range: 30° in all directions)

## [UP/DOWN] knob

- · Select folders while in MP3/WMA/USB mode.
- Select previous/next preset station in Radio/Satellite mode.

## [VOLUME] knob

Adjust the volume by turning the knob.

#### [ADJUST] button

· Press the button to enter the adjust mode.

### [OPTION] button

· Press the button to enter the option mode.

## [DISPLAY] button

Press the button to switch the display indication.

#### [AUDIO] button

Press the button to enter the audio adjust mode.

#### **[POWER]** button

Press the button to turn on or off the power.

#### [CD SLOT]

· CD insertion slot.

#### [ ] (Eject) button

• Eject a CD when it is loaded into the unit.

## [RESET] button

- · Press the button when the following symptoms occur.
  - \* Nothing happens when buttons are pressed.
  - \* Display is not accurate.
  - \* The settings will remain in the memory even if you turn the power off or press the reset button.


# 4. REMOTE CONTROL

# **Optional Wired Remote Control Unit Operations**

Following operations are enabled by remote control with the separately sold Wired Remote Control Unit MW1 (shown below), MW2 or MW3.

#### Note:

If the remote control is connected with this unit while the power on, please restart this unit again to confirm the normal display.



## **Optional Wired Remote Control Unit Operations**

## **A** CAUTION

Lower the volume level before powering the source unit off. The source unit stores the last volume setting.

## **WARNING**

When the front panel is open, no sound is produced, and source unit controls and remote control unit operations are disabled. Always shut the front panel after changing the CD.

#### [ @ /SOURCE] button

Radio mode -> DISC mode -> USB/iPod mode -> AUX mode -> Satellite mode -> Radio mode....

#### Note:

 If the above equipment is not connected, corresponding mode cannot be selected.

## [ENTER] button

- · Confirm various selectings.
- Long press to input the channel No.directly. (in Sirius mode.)

## [ ♥ ], [ ♥ ] buttons

- Press the [ or ] button to increase the volume.
- Press the [ ♣] button to decrease the volume.

#### [ **◄** ], [ **▶** ] buttons

- Press the [▶] button to start playback from the beginning of the following track.
   Press the [◄] button to start playback from the beginning of the current track.
   If pressed again, the track moves to the previous one. (in CD/MP3/WMA mode or USB/iPod mode)
- Press and hold the [▶] button to fastforward the disc. Press and hold the [◄] button to fast-reverse the disc.

 Press the [◄] or [▶] button to tune in a station for seek tuning or manual tuning (Radio mode/Satellite mode only).

## [ ▲ ], [ ▼ ] buttons

- Select preset stations (in Radio or Satellite mode)
- Select category items (in Satellite category mode)
- Select folders (in MP3/WMA or USB mode)

#### [MENU/BAND] button

• Each time the button is pressed, the band switches in the following order:

Radio: FM1 -> FM2 -> FM3 -> AM -> FM1.....

Sirius Satellite: SR1 -> SR2 -> SR3

- Press and hold the button to enter the category selection mode. (in Sirius Satellite mode.)
- Press and hold the button, it will start from the first track. (in CD/MP3/WMA and USB modes)
- Press the [MENU] button to enter the list search mode. (in CD/MP3/WMA and USB modes)

## [ NUTE ] button

- Press the [ Multiple ] button. The sound is muted immediately. To cancel, press the [ Multiple ] button again. (in Radio and Satellite modes)
- Press to play or pause in CD/MP3/WMA and USB mode.



## Shared modes

## [SRC/(1)] button

- · Press the button to turn on the power. Press and hold the button (1 sec.) to turn off the power.
- · Use to alternate operation mode among the various modes

### [ ▲ ], [ ▼ ] buttons

Increases and decreases volume.

### [MUTE] button

· Turns mute function on and off.

#### [DISP] button

Press to select the desired display.

## Radio | Satellite Radio modes

#### [BAND/TOP] button

· Switches reception band.

#### [ |◀◀ ], [ ▶▶| ] buttons

· Moves preset channels up and down.

### [SCN/PS/AS] button

- Press to perform preset scan. (in Radio
- · Press and hold the button (2 sec.) to perform auto store. (in Radio mode)
- In the channel selection mode, press to perform preset scan; in the category mode, press to perform category scan. (in Sirius Satellite Radio mode)

#### CD/MP3/WMA and USB modes

## [BAND/TOP] button

• Press to play the first track.

## [ I◄◀ ], [ ▶▶I ] buttons

- · Press to select tracks.
- · Press and hold the button (1 sec.) to perform fast-forward/fast-reverse (Except DRM file).

#### [▶||] button

Switches between playback and pause.

#### [SCN/PS/AS] button

· Press to perform scan play.

### [RPT] button

- · Press to perform repeat play.
- When in repeat play mode, press to perform folder repeat play.

#### [RDM] button

Press to perform random play.

## Wireless Remote Control Unit Operations

## • iPod mode

#### [ I◄◀ ], [ ▶▶I ] buttons

- · Press to move the tracks up and down.
- Press and hold the button (1 sec.) to perform fast-forward/fast-reverse.

#### [▶||] button

· Switches between playback and pause.

## [RPT] button

· Press to perform repeat play.

## [RDM] button

- · Press to perform repeat play mode.
- When in random album play, press the button to perform random song play.

# Notes of remote control using

- Aim the remote control at the remote sensor on the unit.
- Remove the battery from the remote control or insert a battery insulator if the battery has not been used for a month or longer.
- DO NOT store the remote control under direct sunlight or in high temperature environment, or it may not function properly.
- 4. Use "button shaped" lithium battery "CR2025" (3V) only.
- DO NOT subject battery to recharge, disassemble, heat or dispose in fire or water.
- 6. Insert the battery in proper direction according to the (+) and (-) polarities.
- 7. Store the battery in a place where children cannot reach to avoid the risk of accident.

## Inserting the Battery

- 1. Slide remote control unit's rear cover in the direction shown.
- 2. Insert battery (CR2025) into insertion guides with printed side (+) up.
- 3. Press battery into compartment as shown.
- 4. Replace and slide cover until it clicks into place.

#### Note:

Be sure to read this chapter referring to the front diagrams of chapter "3. CONTROLS"

# **Basic Operations**

## **A** CAUTION

Be sure to lower the volume before powering the source unit off. The unit remembers its last volume setting.

## **WARNING**

When the front panel is open, no sound is produced, and source unit controls and remote control unit operations are disabled. Always shut the front panel after changing the CD.

EXPOSING THE UNIT TO WATER WITH THE FRONT PANEL OPEN WILL CAUSE DAMAGE OR UNIT MALFUNCTION!

## Turning on / off the power

Press the [**POWER**] button to turn on or off the power.

## Selecting a mode

- Press the [DISC], [AUX/iPod], [AM/FM] or [SAT] button to change the operation mode.
  - \* iPod or iPhone can connect to this unit via CCA-748 cable.

## Adjusting the volume

- Turning the [VOLUME] knob clockwise increases the volume; turning it counterclockwise decreases the volume.
  - \* The volume level is from 0 (minimum) to 40 (maximum).

# Switching the display

Press the [**DISPLAY**] button to select the desired display.

# Audio Adjustment

You can adjust a audio effect or tone quality to your preference.

## To change sound setting

- Press the [AUDIO] button to switch to the sound adjustment selection display.
- Then press the [◄] or [▶] button to select the audio adjustment mode.

Each time you press the  $[\ \ \ \ ]$  or  $[\ \ \ \ \ ]$  button, the audio adjustment mode changes as following order:

BEAT EQ -> BALANCE -> FADER -> M-B EX -> NO FADER

- \* In the case of display blinking "ENT", you can press the [ENTER] button to adjust the setting value.
- Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to adjust the selected audio mode.
- After completing settings, press the [RETURN] button to return to the previous mode.

## **Basic Operations**

## Adjusting BEAT EQ

- 1. Select "BEAT EQ".
  - Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to select following order:
  - OFF -> B-BOOST -> IMPACT -> EXCITE -> CUSTOM
- When B-BOOST, IMPACT or EXCITE appears on the LCD, press [ENTER] to changes it, then turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to adjust the gain from –3 to +3.
- 3. Press the [ENTER] button to changes CUSTOM, then press [ ◀ ] or [ ▶ ] button to select it including: BAS-G -> BAS-F -> BAS-Q -> MID-G -> MID-F -> MID-Q -> TREBLE-G -> TREBLE-F, turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to select a value.

BAS-G / MID-G / TREBLE-G: (-7)- (+7)

BAS-F: 60/80/100/200 BAS-Q: 1.0/1.25/1.5/2.0 MID-F: 500/1K/1.5K/2K MID-Q: 0.5/0.75/1.0/1.25

TRE-F: 10.0K/12.5K/15.0K/17.5K

## Adjusting the balance

- 1. Select "BALANCE".
- 2. Turn the [**UP/DOWN**] knob to adjust the balance of the right and left speakers.
  - \* The factory default setting is "CENTER". (Adjustment range: RIGHT 7 to LEFT 7)

### Adjusting the fader

- 1. Select "FADER".
- Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to adjust the balance of the rear and front speakers.
  - \* The factory default setting is "CENTER". (Adjustment range: FRONT 7 to REAR 7)

## Adjusting the M-B EX

- Select "M-B EX".
- Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to select ON or OFF.

## Adjusting the non-fader volume

Adjust volume output from the unit's nonfader output terminal.

- 1. Select "NO FADER".
- Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob clockwise to increase volume; turn counterclockwise to decrease volume.
  - \* The factory default setting is "**0**". (Adjustment range: +6 to -6)
- During SOUND adjustment mode, if no operation is performed for more than 10 seconds, this mode can be cancelled and return to previous mode.

# Operations Common to Each Mode

## To change adjustment setting

- 1. Press the [ADJUST] button to switch to the adjustment selection display.
- Press the [ ◀] or [ ▶] button to select the "item name".
  - CLOCK, SCRN SVR, SCROLL, DIMMER, CONTRAST, REAR/N-F, BEEP, 12/24H, RESET
- 3. Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to select the "desired setting value".
  - \* In the case of display blinking "ENT", you can press the [ENTER] button to adjust the setting value.
- After completing settings, press the [ADJUST] or [RETURN] button to return to the previous mode.

#### CLOCK

- 1. Select "CLOCK".
- 2. Press the [ENTER] button.
- Press the [ ◀] or [ ▶] button to select the hour or the minute.
- Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to set the correct time.
  - \* The clock is displayed in 12-hour format by default.
- Press the [ENTER] button to store the time into memory.

#### Note:

 You cannot set the clock when it is displayed with only the ignition on. If you drain or remove the boat's battery or take out this unit, the clock is reset. While setting the clock, if another button or operation is selected, the clock set mode is canceled.

#### SCRN SVR: ON/OFF

- 1. Select "SCRN SVR".
- Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to choose SCRN SVR (screen saver) ON or OFF.

#### SCROLL: ON/OFF

For track information that is longer than the display panel:

- 1. Select "SCROLL".
- Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to select "ON" or "OFF".

When SCROLL is ON, the LCD will display ID3 TAG information cyclely, e.g: TRACK->FOLDER->FILE->ALBUM->TITLE-

#### >ARTIST->TRACK->...

When SCROLL is OFF, the LCD will display one of the ID3 TAG information, the default is TRACK, but user can adjust it to other ID3 TAG information by pressing [DISPLAY] button

#### DIMMER: ON/OFF

You can set the dimmer control "ON" or "OFF".

- \* The factory default setting is "ON".
- 1. Select "DIMMER".
- Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to select "ON" or "OFF".

#### CONTRAST

You can adjust the display contrast to match the angle of installation of the unit.

- The factory default setting is "9".
   (Adjustment level: 1 to 10)
- 1. Select "CONTRAST".
- Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to adjust the contrast.

#### REAR/N-F

- 1. Select "REAR/N-F".
- Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to choose REAR or NO FADER.

#### **BEEP: ON/OFF**

Rotate the [**VOLUME**] knob to choose button beep sound ON or OFF.

#### 12/24H

- 1. Select "12/24H".
- Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to choose time format: 12 HOURS or 24 HOURS.

#### RESET

- 1. Select "RESET".
- 2. Long press [ ENTER ] button.
- 3. Settings will be set to the default value.

# Radio Operations

## Changing the reception area

This unit is initially set to USA frequency intervals of 10 kHz for AM and 200 kHz for FM. When using it outside the USA, the frequency reception range can be switched to the intervals below.

## Setting the reception area

- All station preset memories are lost when the reception area is changed.
- 1. Press the [AM/FM] button and select the desired radio band (FM or AM).
- 2. Press the [OPTION] button.
- 3. Press the [ ◀] or [▶] button to select "TUN AREA".
- 4. Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to select:
  - U: U.S. standard (initial setting)
  - K: Other countries
  - E: Europe standard
- 5. Press and hold the [ENTER] button to store the selecting.
  - . The unit will turn off after setting.

# Listening to the radio

- 1. Press the [AM/FM] button and select the radio mode.
- 2. Press the [AM/FM] button and select the radio band. Each time the button is pressed, the radio reception band changes in the following order:

FM1 -> FM2 -> FM3 -> AM -> FM1...

#### Mute

Use this function to turn off the sound immediately.

- 1. Press the [ ►/II ] button. The sound turns off and "MUTE" appears on the display.
- 2. Press the [ NITE ] button again to cancel the mute mode.

## Tuning

There are 3 types of tuning mode available, seek tuning, manual tuning and preset tuning.

#### Seek tuning

- 1. Press the [AM/FM] button repeatedly and select the desired band (FM or AM).
- Press and hold the [ ◀ ] or [ ▶ ] button (1 sec.) to automatically seek a station.

#### Manual tuning

Press the [ ◀] or [ ▶] button to manually tune in a station.

#### Recalling a preset station

A total of 24 preset positions (6-FM1, 6-FM2, 6-FM3, 6-AM) exists to store individual radio stations in memory.

- 1. Press the [AM/FM] button and select the radio band.
- 2. Press the [MENU] button.
- 3. Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to select the desired preset station.
- 4. Press the [ENTER] button to recall the stored frequency.

#### Note:

After the band selecting, you can also turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to select a desired preset station.

#### Manual memory

- 1. Select the desired station with seek tuning or manual tuning.
- 2. Press the [MENU] button
- 3. Turn the [UP/DOWN] knob to select a desired station.

#### Auto store

# Channel input directly

This function allows you to input the channel No. directly.

# To disable DRM (Digital Rights Management)

When using Windows Media Player 9/10/11, click on Tool -> Options -> Copy Music tab, then under Copy settings, unclick the Check box for Copy Project Music. Then, reconstruct files.

Personally constructed WMA files are used at your own responsibility.

## Precautions when creating MP3/ WMA file

## Usable sampling rates and bit rates

- MP3: Sampling rate 8 kHz-48 kHz, Bit rate 8 kbps-320 kbps / VBR
- 2. WMA: Bit rate 8 kbps-320 kbps

#### File extensions

- Always add a file extension ".MP3", ".WMA" to MP3, WMA file by using single byte letters. If you add a file extension other than specified or forget to add the file extension, the file cannot be played.
- Files without MP3/WMA data will not play. The files will be played soundlessly if you attempt to play files without MP3/WMA data.
  - \* When VBR files are played, the play time display may differ the play location.
  - \* When MP3/WMA files are played, a little no sound part is caused between tunes.

#### Logical format (File system)

- When writing MP3/WMA file on a CD-R disc or CD-RW disc, please select "ISO9660 level 1, 2 or Joliet or Romeo" or Apple ISO as the writing software format. Normal play may not be possible if the disc is recorded on another format.
- The folder name and file name can be displayed as the title during MP3/WMA play but the title must be within 32 single byte alphabetical letters and numerals (including an extension).

3. Do not affix a name to a file inside a folder having the same name.

#### Folder structure

A disc with a folder having more than 8 hierarchical levels will be impossible.

#### Number of files or folders

- 1. Up to 999 files can be recognized per folder.
  - Up to 3000 files can be played.
- Tracks are played in the order that they were recorded onto a disc. (Tracks may not always be played in the order displayed on the PC.)
- Some noise may occur depending on the type of encoder software used while recording.

## Eject function

1. Press the [**OPEN**] button to open the front panel.

#### Notes:

- If the front panel will not open far enough, open it gently with your hand.
- Press the [ ] button. Remove the disc after it is ejected.
- 3. Close the front panel.
  - \* Press the center of the front panel to close.

#### Notes:

- Always close the front panel once you take out the disc.
- If you force a CD into before auto reloading, this can damage the CD.

The top function resets the CD player to the first track of the disc. Press and hold the [MENU] button (1 sec.) to play the first track (track No. 1) on the disc.

In case of MP3/WMA, the first track of the current folder will be played.

#### Search Function

## Connecting an iPod

When an iPod is connected to the USB slot, "Shuffle" set on the iPod will become as follows:

- "Shuffle (Albums)" play -> Random play
- "Shuffle (Songs)" play -> All random play
  The iPod has two modes, the "Play mode"
  and the "iPod menu mode" for selecting
  tracks.

Switch between these modes by pressing the [MENU] button.

#### Note:

 To connect iPod or iPhone, please use CCA-748 cable (sold separately).

## Select iPod mode


