The iPAQ Networking 10/100 Fast Ethernet USB Adapter, when used with an Ethernet hub, switch, or router (sold separately), connects your PC to the network through your computer's USB port. The adapter works with desktop or notebook PCs. Key product features and benefits are listed below.

Its Auto Negotiation feature automatically detects the speed of the network and adjusts appropriately. *Note:* While the network may run up to 100 Mbps, 12 Mbps is the maximum speed supported by USB.
Easy to Set Up and Use	iPAQ Networking solutions come with easy-to-follow instructions and intelligent software that guides you through the installation process. You can easily set up your network to share Internet access, share files and printers, or play the latest multi-player PC games.
Advanced Bridging Technology	Even if you have a combination of Ethernet, wireless, or phone line products in your networking environment, the iPAQ networking software has the power to bring them together, or create a bridge, so they operate as one integrated network.
Share Internet Access	iPAQ Networking allows you to share a single Internet account and let more than one computer use it at the same time! Simultaneous Web surfing works with cable and DSL high-speed Internet access as well as with standard dial-up.

What Else Do I Need?

To use the iPAQ Networking 10/100 Fast Ethernet USB Adapter, you need a PC with the following components:

- > One available universal serial bus (USB) port
- > Intel[®] Pentium processor or higher
- > At least 24MB RAM
- > Microsoft[®] Windows[®] 98, 98SE, ME, or 2000

Note: This Ethernet USB Adapter provides the hardware you need to install networking capabilities on a single PC. A complete Ethernet network requires a local hub, switch, or router, such as the iPAQ Networking 5 Port 10/100 Fast Ethernet Auto-Sensing Switch, to provide a central connection point for all computers.

Note: You will also need a twisted-pair Ethernet cable with an RJ-45 jack (purchased separately) to connect your computer to the network. This type of cable is commonly available at computer stores. The maximum desired cable length is 100 meters (328 feet). Use Category 3, 4, or 5 cable for connection to 10 Mbps Ethernet, or Category 5 cable for connection to 100 Mbps Fast Ethernet.

What's in Front?

The LED indicators on the front panel of your Ethernet USB Adapter help you monitor system status.



	LED	Status	Description
0	Power	On (green)	Indicates a valid USB power connection.
		Off	Indicates there is no power to the Ethernet USB Adapter.
2	Link/Act	On (green)	Indicates the Ethernet USB Adapter has a valid network connection.
		Flashing green	Indicates data is being transmitted.
3	100	On (amber)	Indicates the Ethernet USB Adapter is connected to a 100Base-TX network
		Off	Indicates the Ethernet USB Adapter is connected to a 10Base-T network.

What's In Back?


The ports on the back panel of your Ethernet USB Adapter help you make connections to your PC and the network.



Port	Description
0	The RJ-45 port is where you connect your USB Adapter to a hub, switch, or router. You must purchase a twisted-pair cable separately for this connection.
2	The USB port is where you connect your USB Adapter to your PC. Use the USB cable provided in the package contents.

USB Cable

Your USB Adapter comes with a USB cable that has two connector ends: one rectangular (Type A 1) and the other square (Type B 2).



Installing the Product

Overview

Installing the product involves several steps:

- > Install drivers
- > Install the Ethernet USB Adapter
- > Connect the Ethernet USB Adapter to the network
- > Install iPAQ Networking software

Installing the Drivers


1. Insert the **iPAQ Networking CD** into the CD-ROM. The iPAQ Networking menu should display automatically.



Note: If the menu is not displayed, select the **Start** button and choose **Run**. Type in "**D:\setup.exe**" where "D:\" is the location of your CD ROM drive. Then click **OK** to start the iPAQ Networking menu.

2. Click **Install Drivers** 1 to start the driver installation software.

The opening panel of the Network Driver Installation Utility is displayed.




3. Click **Install Drivers** in this panel to start installing the drivers. 2

A progress indicator is displayed while the files are being installed.



4. When installation is complete, the Driver Installation Complete window is displayed. Click **OK** 3 to complete the installation.



Complete the hardware installation before proceeding with software installation.

Installing the Ethernet USB Adapter

The iPAQ Networking 10/100 Fast Ethernet USB Adapter is an external device, so there's no need to install anything inside your computer.



- 1. Connect the Type-A plug to the USB port on the PC. 1
- 2. Connect the Type-B plug to the USB Adapter. 2

3. Connect one end of the cable to the RJ-45 port on the USB Adapter 3 and the other end to any available station port on a network hub or switch.

Note: When inserting an RJ-45 plug, be sure the tab on the plug clicks into position to ensure that it is properly seated.

4. Install the product software, including printer sharing, file sharing and Internet connection sharing, using the **Install Software** option on this CD.

Installing the Software

When you are finished installing the drivers and hardware, you are now ready to install the iPAQ Networking software. Please refer to the **Software Documentation** on this CD.
