Install Batteries in the Remote

- Open the battery cover on the back of the remote.
- Insert two AAA batteries. Make sure that the polarities (+ and -) are aligned correctly.
 Replace the battery cover.

If remote doesn't operate properly:

- Check the polarity + of the batteries (Dry-Cell)
- Check if the batteries are drained.
 Check if remote sensor is blocked by obstacles.
 Check if there is any fluorescent lighting nearby.



Play Region Number

Both the DVD player and the discs are coded by region. These regional codes must match in order for the disc to play. If the codes do not match, the disc will not play. The Region Number for this player is described on the rear panel of the player.

1. DIGITAL AUDIO OUT JACKS

· Use either a coaxial digital cable to connect to a compatible Dolby Digital receiver. Use to connect to an A/V Amplifier that contains a Dolby Digital, MPEG-2 or DTS decoder.

2. DIGITAL AUDIO OUT JACKS (DVD-P3535K only)

· Use either a optical cable to connect to a compatible Dolby Digital receiver. Use to connect to an A/V Amplifier that contains a Dolby Digital, MPEG-2 or DTS decoder.

3. ANALOG AUDIO OUT JACKS

Connect to the Audio input jacks of your television, audio/video receiver.

4. VIDEO OUT JACK

- Use a video cable to connect to the Video input jack on your television.
 The Video Output in Setup Menu must be set to the Component(I-SCAN) or S-Video.

- 5. S-VIDEO OUT JACK
 Use the S-Video cable to connect this jack to the S-Video jack on your television for a higher picture quality.


6. COMPONENT VIDEO OUT JACKS

- Use these jacks if you have a TV with Component Video in jacks. These jacks provide Pr. Pb and Y video. Along with S-Video, Component Video provides the best picture quality.

1. DVD POWER Button

• Turns the power on or off.

2. NUMBER Buttons

PROG Button
 Allows you to program a specific order.

4. STEP Button

Advances play one frame at a time.

SEARCH/SKIP Buttons (◀ / ▶, |◀ / ▶i)
 Allows you to search forward/backward through a disc. Use to skip the title, chapter or track.

6. STOP Button ()

7. MENU Button
• Brings up the DVD player's setup menu.

8. RETURN Button

Returns to a previous menu.

9. KARAOKE Button

Use to begin Karaoke functions.

10. SUBTITLE Button

11. OPEN/CLOSE (▲) Button • To open and close the disc tray.

12. CLEAR Button

 Use to remove menus or status displays from the screen.

13. INSTANT REPLAY Button

This function is used to replay the previous 10 seconds of the movie from the current position.

14. INSTANT SKIP Button

This function skips playback ahead 10 seconds.

15. PLAY/PAUSE Button (►II)
• Begin/Pause disc play.

16. INFO Button

Displays the current disc mode.

17. DISC MENU Button

Brings up the Disc menu.

18. ENTER/DIRECTION Button (UP/DOWN or LEFT/RIGHT Buttons)
• This button functions as a toggle switch.

19. EZ VIEW Button
• Easy View can convert Letter Box images to full screen viewing on your conventional TV.

REPEAT Button
 Allows you to repeat play a title, chapter, track, or disc.

21. ANGLE Button

• Use to access various camera angles on a DVD.


22. AUDIO Button

Use this button to access various audio functions on a disc.

Choosing a Connection

Connection to a TV (For Video)

TV (Normal, Widescreen, Projection, etc..)



Method 1

DVD Player + TV with Video Input Jack

(The Video Output in Setup Menu must be set to the S-Video or Component(I-SCAN).)

Method 2

DVD Player + TV with S-Video Input Jack (The Video Output in Setup Menu must be set to the S-Video.)

Method 3

DVD Player + TV with interlace Scan Component Video Jacks (The Video Output in Setup Menu must be set to the Component(I-SCAN).)

- DVD Player + TV with Progressive Scan Component Video Jacks.
 (The Video Output in Setup Menu must be set to the Component(P-SCAN).)

 If you want to convert Video Output to the Progressive Scan, you have to first connect Video or S-Video on your TV. Then select Component(P-SCAN)(480p) out of Video Output in Setup Menu. Within 10 seconds, change the TV's external input to 525p(480p or Component) and select "Yes" (See Page 31).

Using the Search & Skip Functions

During play, you can search quickly through a chapter or track or use the skip function to jump to the next selection.

Searching through a Chapter or Track

Press the SEARCH (◀ or ▶) button on the remote for more than 1 second.

If you want to search at a faster speed on the DVD, VCD or CD, press and hold the button.

Skipping Tracks

Repeat Play

Repeat the current track, chapter, title, a chosen section (A-B), or all of the disc.

- Chapter (): repeats the chapter that is playing.

This function may behave differently depending on the type of disc.

Changing the Camera Angle

When a DVD contains multiple angles of a particular scene, you can select the Angle function.

Using the ANGLE button

Press the ANGLE button to see if an ANGLE

- (😂) mark is present at the upper left hand corner of the screen.
- When an ANGLE mark is shown, press the ANGLE button, then an ANGLE select icon will appear at the upper hand corner of the screen.
- 2. Press the ANGLE button to select the desired screen angle.
- 3. To turn off the display, press the CLEAR or RETURN button.



Note

If the disc has only one angle, this feature won't work. Currently, very few discs have this feature.

Using the Instant Replay/Skip Function

Using the Instant Replay function (DVD) If you miss a scene, you can see it again using this function.

If you press the INSTANT REPLAY button, the current scene moves backward about 10 seconds, and plays back.

* Depending on the disc, the Instant Replay function may not work.



Using the Instant Skip function (DVD) Use this function to skip playback about 10 seconds ahead of the current scene.

Press the INSTANT SKIP button.

- Playback will skip ahead 10 seconds.
 Depending on the disc, this function may not work.



Using the Zoom Function

Using the Zoom Function (DVD/VCD)

- During play or pause mode, press the MENU button on the remote.
- Use the UP/DOWN buttons to highlight **Function**, then press the RIGHT or ENTER button.
- 3. Select **Zoom** using the UP/DOWN buttons, then press the RIGHT or ENTER button.

MP3/WMA Play

CD-R MP3/WMA discs

- Your MP3 or WMA files should be ISO 9660 or JOLIET format.

 ISO 9660 format and Joliet MP3 or WMA files are
- compatible with Microsoft's DOS and Windows, and with Apple's Mac. This format is the most widely used.
- · When naming your MP3 or WMA files, do not exceed 8 characters, and enter ".mp3, .wma" as the file

General name format of: Title.mp3. or Title.wma. When composing your title, make sure that you use 8 characters or less, have no spaces in the name, and avoid the use of special characters including: (.,/,,=,+).

- Use a decompression transfer rate of at least 128 Kbps when recording MP3 files. Sound quality with MP3 files basically depends on the rate of compression/decompression you choose. Getting CD audio sound requires an analog/digital sampling rate, that is conversion to MP3 format, of at least 128 Kbps and up is conversion to MF3 format, or at least 128 Apps and to 160 Kbps. However, choosing higher rates, like 192 Kbps or more, only rarely give better sound quality. Conversely, files with decompression rates below 128 Kbps will not be played properly.
- · Use a decompression transfer rate of at least 64Kbps

Use a decompression transfer rate of at least 64Kbp when recording WMA files. Sound quality with WMA files basically depends on the rate of compression/decompression you choose. Getting CD audio sound requires an analog/digital sampling rate, that is conversion to WMA format, of at least 64Kbps and up to 192Kbps.
Conversely, files with decompression rates below 64Kbps or over 192Kbps will not be played properly.

- Do not try recording copyright protected MP3 files. Certain 'secured' files are encrypted and code protected to prevent illegal copying. These files are of the following types: Windows MediaTM (registered trade mark of Microsoft Inc.) and SDMITM (registered trade mark of The SDMI Foundation). You cannot copy such files.
- Important: The above recommendations cannot be taken as a guarantee that the DVD player will play MP3 recordings, or as an assurance of sound quality. You should note that certain technologies and methods for MP3 file recording on CD-Rs prevent optimal playback of these files on your DVD player (degraded sound quality and in some cases, inability of the player to read the files).

Picture CD Playback

- 1. Select the desired folder. (See page 22 to select

Reserving a Song (DVD-P3535K Only)

It is the function to reserve the desired song in advance by use of Karaoke function.

Sequence of reservation

- 1. Playback the Karaoke Disc containing the wanted

- Input the number (Track No.) of the desired song into the flickering part(-).
 You can reserve up to 10 songs.

Cancellation of reservation

Setting Up the Parental Control

The Parental Control function works in conjunction with DVDs that have been assigned a rating - which helps you control the types of DVDs that your family watches. There are up to 8 rating levels on a disc.

- 2. Select **Setup** using UP/DOWN buttons, then RIGHT or ENTER button.
- 3. Select **Parental Setup** using UP/DOWN buttons, then press the RIGHT or ENTER button.



4. Use RIGHT or ENTER to select Yes if you want to use a password. The **Enter Password** screen appears.



5. Enter your password. The Re-enter Password screen appears to confirm the password. Enter your password again. The player is locked (().



Troubleshooting
