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Introduction

Your Synergy 3200 SMS has been designed for ease of use and made to the high standards set by BT.

Please read the instructions carefully before use and keep this user guide for future reference.


DECT

By purchasing the Synergy 3200 SMS you now own a product which combines the advantages of cordless operation with the performance of a high quality corded telephone. It complies with the Digitally Enhanced Cordless Telecommunications (DECT) standard and offers unparalleled quality and features.

You can use up to 5 handsets with your Synergy 3200 base station without the need for additional wiring. This user guide applies to both single and multiple handset systems. The internal call functions described in this guide apply only to Synergy 3200 base stations with more than one handset connected.

Important

If you wear a hearing aid, please note that the Synergy 3200 works by sending radio signals between the base station and the handset. These signals may interfere with some hearing aids, causing a humming noise.

General

Only use the power supply included with the product. Using an unauthorised power supply will invalidate your guarantee and may damage the telephone. The item code for the mains power supply is 872260.

Do not open the handset or base station. This could expose you to high voltages or other risks. Contact the Synergy Helpline **08706 058 047** for all repairs.

Radio signals transmitted between the handset and base may cause interference to hearing aids.

It is recommended that advice from a qualified medical expert be sought before using this product in the vicinity of emergency/intensive care medical equipment.

It is recommended that if you have a pacemaker fitted you check with a medical expert before using this product.

Your product may interfere with other electrical equipment, e.g. TV and radio sets, clock/alarms and computers if placed too close. It is recommended that you place your product at least one metre away from such appliances to minimise any risk of intereference.

Never dispose of batteries in a fire. There is a serious risk of explosion and/ or the release of highly toxic chemicals.

Cleaning

Simply clean the handset and base station with a damp (not wet) cloth, or an anti-static wipe. Never use household polish as this will damage the product. Never use a dry cloth as this may cause a static shock.

Environmental

Do not expose to direct sunlight.

The product may heat up when the battery pack is being recharged. This is normal. However, we recommend that you do not place the product on antique/veneered wood to avoid damage.

Do not stand your product on carpets or other surfaces which generate fibres, or place it in locations preventing the free flow of air over its surfaces.

Do not submerge any part of your product in water and do not use it in damp conditions, such as bathrooms.

Do not expose your product to fire, explosive or other hazardous conditions.

There is a slight chance that your phone could be damaged by an electrical storm. We recommend that you unplug the power and telephone line cord for the duration of the storm.


Setting up Follow these steps to set up your Synergy 3200 SMS ready for use

Plan the location


Position your Synergy 3200 SMS within 2 metres of a power socket and phone socket otherwise extension cables will be required.

Make sure it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical products to avoid interference.

Do not place your Synergy 3200 SMS product in the bathroom or other humid areas.



Plug the power adaptor into the mains power socket and switch on. The green Power/In Use light comes on.




Note

The base station must be plugged into the mains power socket at all times.

2 Install the batteries

2 x NiMH AAA rechargeable batteries are supplied.

Install the batteries as shown.



Slide the battery compartment cover into place (the battery cover may be found in the packaging with the batteries).



Charge the handset batteries for at least 16 hours

Before you use your Synergy 3200 SMS for the first time, it is important to have the handset batteries fully charged. The batteries need to charge continuously for **at least 16 hours to reach full charge**.

Place the handset on the base. The red charging light will come on. The handset comes pre-registered to the base station as SYNERGY 1. This is shown on the display. The Ψ icon is also shown on the display and the battery icon.

Once the handset is fully charged, the display shows a full battery symbol.



Battery low warning

If the handset battery symbol is empty and flashing, and you hear a warning beep every 10 seconds, you will need to recharge your handset before you can use it.

Note

The Υ symbol on your handset display indicates when you are in range of the base station. If the symbol flashes and you hear a warning beep, you are out of range and will need to move closer to the base station.

The handset has a range of 300 metres outdoors and up to 50 metres indoors. The stated range of this product is measured in open field conditions. Walls, ceilings and metal structures will reduce the maximum range.

Battery performance

Under no circumstances should non-rechargeable batteries be used. Only use the approved batteries, type: rechargeable Nickel Metal Hydride (NiMH); Size AAA; Capacity 550 mAh; 1.2V. Using unapproved batteries will invalidate your guarantee and may damage the telephone.

To keep your batteries in the best condition, leave the handset off the base station for a few hours at a time (after the initial 16 hour charge).


Fully discharging the batteries at least once a week will help them last as long as possible.

However, charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out, so reducing talk/standby time of the handset. Eventually they will need to be replaced. New batteries can be obtained from the BT Synergy Helpline on **08706 058 047**.

After charging your handset for the first time, subsequent charging time for the battery is approximately 6-8 hours a day. Batteries and handset may be come warm during charging. This is normal.

Under ideal condition the handset batteries should give about 14 hours talk time or 350 hours standby on a single charge. (This does not mean you can unplug the base station or leave it for this length of time without charge.)

Please note however, that new NiMH batteries do not reach full capacity until they have been in normal use for several days.




Note

It is recommended that you do not connect the telephone line cord to the phone socket until your handset is fully charged. This will prevent the risk of the batteries discharging during a conversation which could cause you to lose a call.




Fit the belt clip onto the back of the handset if required.







Using the telephone

Preparatory dialling



The number is shown in the display.




If you make a mistake, press the \bigstar button to remove the incorrect digit.

When you have entered the number correctly, press the **TALK** button to dial the number.

Call timer

Your handset will automatically time the duration of all external calls.

The handset display shows the call duration both during your call and for a few seconds after it is complete.



To end a call

Press the TALK button.

Or

Place the handset back on the base.

To receive a call

When the phone rings the display will show External Call and the EXT symbol will flash.

If you have subscribed to a Caller Display Service, the number of the caller (and name if stored in the phonebook) will be displayed.



Press the **TALK** button to answer the call.

Or

If the handset is on the base, simply lift it up and speak.

To adjust the earpiece/handsfree volume

During a call:

You can adjust the earpiece/ loudspeaker volume. There are 5 levels to choose from.



Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button until you reach the required level.

In standby mode:

Press the 🛩 button.

Press the **DOWN** button until you reach Handset Menu.

Press the 🛩 button.

Press the **DOWN** button until you reach Ear Vol.



Press the 🛩 button.

Press the **DOWN** button to select the volume required 1-5.

Handsfree

Handsfree allows you to talk to your caller without holding the handset. It also enables other people in the room to listen to your conversation.

To use handsfree

To make a call, answer a call or during a call you can switch to handsfree mode.



Display shows the \blacksquare icon to indicate handsfree is active.



To end the call, press the **TALK** button.

Redial

You can redial up to 5 of the last numbers called. They are stored in the redial list. If you have stored a name to go with a number in the phonebook, the name will be displayed instead. *See Name and Number Phonebook'*, page 16. Ŵ

To redial the last number called

Press the TALK button.

Press the **UP** button. The last number is redialled.

(Please note that if you press the **UP** button again it will adjust the earpiece volume.)

To dial a number from the redial list

Press the **REDIAL** button to enter the redial list.

Continue pressing the **UP** button to view the next number. The most recently dialled numbers are shown first.

Press the **TALK** button when the number (or name) you want to call is displayed. The number is dialled automatically.

Secrecy

When on a call, you can talk to someone in the same room without your caller hearing.

To switch secrecy on / off


During a call, press the X button. The display will show Secrecy on. Your caller cannot hear you.

Secrecy

Press the \mathbf{X} button again to resume your call.

Name and number Phonebook

You can store up to 40 of your most frequently used names and numbers in the Phonebook. Names can be up to 8 characters long and numbers up to 20 digits.





Press the 🛩 button.

Press the **DOWN** button to reach Ed. Phonebook.

> Press the 🖊 button.



Press the 🛩 button to select Add Entry.

The display shows NAME.



Enter the name using the letters on the keypad. Names can be no longer than 8 characters.

Entering names



Use the keypad letters to enter names, e.g. if you wish to store the name TOM:

To enter the letter T, press the **8** button once.

To enter O, press the **6** button *three times* and wait for the cursor to move across.



To enter M, press the ${\bf 6}$ button once.



If you enter a character or digit incorrectly, press the **X** button to delete it.

The display shows NUMBER. Enter the telephone number

- Press the r button to confirm. Display shows Stored. You will hear a confirmation beep.

Press the \checkmark button to continue storing entries in the phonebook.

Press the **1** button once to insert a space, twice to insert the number 1, three times to insert an underscore and four times to insert a hyphen.

The character options available are shown in small font at the top of the display. Please refer to the character map on page 2 of the Using SMS user guide.

To enter a pause in a stored number

You may want to enter a pause when storing international numbers, charge card numbers or if you connect your telephone to a switchboard. (For more information on switchboard use, *see page 41*.)



When storing the number, press *and hold* the **UP** button until a P is displayed at the point where you want to enter the pause.

You may enter as many pauses as required.

To dial a number from the Phonebook



Press the 🖊 button.

Press the **DOWN** button to reach Phonebook.



You can alert handset users that they are wanted, or locate a missing handset. (Paging calls cannot be answered by a handset.)

To page a handset from the base

Press the **PAGE** button on the base.

The handset(s) will ring.

To end paging, press the **PAGE** (Page) button again.

Baby call


The baby call feature allows you to enter a chosen telephone number which can then be used as an emergency quick dial number. When baby call is switched on you can press any button on the handset (except the *v* button) and your baby call telephone number will be automatically dialled.

This could be used for example by a baby sitter.

To set your baby call telephone number



Press the *button*.



Press the \checkmark button.

If you have at least two handsets registered to your Synergy 3200 SMS base station you can leave one handset in a room and monitor the noise in the room by making an internal call to the handset.

This could be used for example in a child's bedroom.

- Press the **DOWN** button to reach Monitor mode.
- Press the 🛩 button.

- Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to select either Off or On.
- Press the 🛩 button to confirm.

You will hear a confirmation beep.

If you have chosen On, the display will show Monitor mode until you switch it off.

To use the room monitor

Enter the handset number of the handset you want to monitor, i.e. the handset you have left in the room to be monitored.

Handset settings

Time and date

Providing you have subscribed to your network's Caller Display service, the date and time is set automatically when your Synergy 3200 SMS receives its first call. When new handsets are registered to the base, they will also receive the current date and time.

If the base station power is cut, the date and time is saved on the handset.

The date and time can also be adjusted manually.

To set the time and date

- Press the \checkmark button to enter the menu.
 - Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to Setup and press the *>* button.
- Press the *button* to select Time Setting. The display shows the date setting.







To use Caller Display and Call Waiting you must first subscribe to the service from your network provider. A quarterly fee is payable.

For more information on BT's Select Services, call BT free on **0800 800 150**.

Caller Display

If you subscribe to a Caller Display service you can see who is calling you on your handset display, as well as the time and date of their call.

If you have stored a name to go with the number in your handset phonebook, the name will be displayed as well.

Please ensure that you have stored the full telephone number, including the area code, otherwise the name will not match the number stored in the phonebook.

Whether you take a call or not, the caller's details are stored in the Calls list. You can display, scroll through and dial numbers on the list and copy them into the phonebook.

Caller information not available

With some incoming calls the telephone number of the caller is not available and cannot therefore be displayed.

In this case, your Synergy 3200 SMS provides you with some explanatory information about the type of call received. This will be one of the following.

UNAVAILA The number is unavailable.

WITHHELD The caller has withheld their number.

RINGBACK Ringback call.

OPERATOR The call has been made via the operator.

PAYPHONE The caller is ringing from a payphone.

INTERNAT International call.

Calls list

The Calls list contains the telephone numbers of your last 20 callers.

New calls in the Calls list are indicated by the flashing **?** ? symbol.

If a call is received when the Calls list is full then the oldest entry will be deleted automatically.

To enter the Calls list



Press the **DOWN** button to enter the Calls list. The *f* symbol is displayed.



Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll backwards and forwards through the Calls list.

If the name of your caller has been stored in the phonebook, this will be displayed. Press the



✓ button and the number will be displayed.



Press the \bigstar button to go back to the Calls list.

To call back a number from the Calls list



Press the **DOWN** button to enter the Calls list.

Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to the number you want to call.

When the name and/or number is displayed, press the **TALK** button. The number will be dialled automatically.

To store a number from the Calls list into the Phonebook



Press the **DOWN** button to enter the Calls list.

When the number you want to store is displayed, press the ✓ button.

The display shows Add Entry and Delete.



Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button to select Add Entry.

If required, use the keypad buttons to enter the name as shown under *'Entering Names'*, *page 16*.



Press the \checkmark button to confirm. The name and number are now stored in the Phonebook.

Once stored in the Phone book, the entry will be deleted from the Calls list.

To delete a number from the Calls list



Press the **DOWN** button to enter the Calls list.



Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to the number you want to delete.

The display shows Add Entry and Delete.

Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button to select Delete Entry and press the \checkmark button.

The number is deleted from the Calls list.

Call Waiting

Providing you have subscribed to your network provider's Call Waiting Service, you will hear a soft beep every 5 seconds if an incoming call arrives while you are already on the phone. This beep is not audible to the person you are speaking to. The second caller's number (and name if already stored in the Phonebook) will appear on the handset display.

Instead of the engaged tone, the second caller will hear an announcement to hold on as you are aware that there is a second call.

To use Call Waiting

You can answer the second call without disconnecting your first caller, by pressing the **R** button. The first caller is put on hold.

When you have spoken to your second caller, you can return to the first caller by pressing the

R button again. In this way you can switch back and forth between the two calls without disconnecting either.



(R)

If you want to disconnect the first caller, press the **TALK** button after speaking to the first caller. The handset will then ring.




Press the **TALK** button again to connect to your second caller.

The second caller will only be charged for their call from the moment you answer and not while they are waiting for your initial contact.

Using additional handsets and bases

Up to 5 handsets can be registered and operated from any one Synergy 3200 SMS base. This allows you to make internal calls between two handsets while a third is making an external call.



Each handset can be registered on up to 4 bases.

Each additional handset you purchase must be registered with the base.

Your handset supplied is pre-registered as Synergy 1 to its base (**Base 1**).

Note

Remember to charge the batteries of new handsets for at least 16 hours before use.

If the display shows Not. Sub and the Υ symbol is flashing, your handset is not yet registered with the base.

To register a handset to the base

At the base:

Press and hold the base PAGE button for at least 10 seconds, until you hear the validation tone (two beeps), then *release* the button.

At the handset:



Press the \checkmark button to enter the menu.



The display will show Base 1-4. There will be a tick to indicate the other bases that the handset is already registered to.



Enter the base number (1-4) that you want to register the handset to.



Enter your 4-digit PIN (original setting 0000) and press the button.

Internal calls

If you have more than one handset registered to the base you can make internal calls between handsets.

- Enter the number of the handset you wish to call, (1-5). The handset will be called.
 - To end the call, press the **TALK** button.

Transferring calls

You can transfer an external call to another handset registered to the base.

To transfer an external call between handsets

During an external call:

- R Press *and hold* the **INT** button until Internal Call is displayed.
- Enter the number of the handset that you want to transfer the call to (1-5).

Your caller will be put on hold.

When the internal handset is answered, (if you want to you can talk to the handset user first), press the **TALK** button. The call will be transferred.

If the call to the second handset is not answered you can speak to your caller again by pressing *and holding* the **INT** button.


Three-way conversation

You can talk to one external caller and another internal caller at the same time on your handset.

During a call with an external caller:



Press *and hold* the **INT** button. Your caller is put on hold and vou hear a tone.



When the internal handset is answered, press and hold the # (#) button for about 3 seconds. You can now start your three-way conversation.

> If the internal handset user does not answer your call, press and *hold* the **INT** button to return to vour external caller.

When on a three-way call, the call with the internal handset can only be ended by the handset that set it up. To do this press the (#) button.

Handset ring priority

This allows you to make the base or one of the handsets ring before the others when you receive an external call.

You can select which base or handset will ring and how many rings it can make before the others start to ring.



Press the *>* button to enter the menu.

Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to Setup and press the ▶ button.

Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to Ring Priority and press the *button*.



Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to Def. Priority and press the *button*.



Use the **DOWN** button to display the option you want, either Base or the handset number vou require, eg Handset 3.



Press the *v* button. The display shows Rings followed by a number between 1 and 9.



Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to the number of rings you require.



Press the 🛩 button. The ring priority is set.

Once the ring priority has been set, you can switch it on or off to provide normal ringing.

Press the \checkmark button to enter the menu.

Use the **DOWN** button scroll to Ring Priority and press the **/** button.

Press the 🖊 button.

Press *and hold* the \bigstar button to return to standby.

Help

Replacing the handset batteries.

After a time, you may find that the handset batteries are running out of charge more quickly. This is a standard sign of wear and the batteries will need replacing.



Technical information

How many telephones can you have?

All items of telephone equipment have a Ringer Equivalence Number (REN), which is used to calculate the number of items which may be connected to any other telephone line. Your Synergy 3200 SMS has a REN of 1. A total REN of 4 is allowed, if the total REN of 4 is exceeded. the telephones may not ring.

With different telephone types there is no guarantee of ringing, even when the REN is less than 4.

Only use approved power supply, item code 872260.

Only use approved AAA NiMH rechargeable batteries.

Switchboard compatibility

This product is intended for use within the UK for connection to the public telephone network and compatible switchboards, which support tone dialling and timed break recall. If in doubt please consult your service provider.

Switchboard external line access code

You may need to enter an access code (e.g. 9) in order to get an outside line. So that the switchboard has time to pick up an outside line, you may also need to add a Pause after the access code.

To use the recall button

This is used when connected to R certain switchboards and for some BT Select Services or those services available via your network provider.

To set the dialling mode

Your Synergy 3200 SMS is set to tone dialling. If required, you can switch to pulse dialling.

Press the *>* button to enter the menu.

Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to Setup and press the ▶ button.



Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to Dialling Mode and press the \checkmark button.



Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to select either Tone or Pulse.



Press the 🛩 button. You will hear a confirmation beep.



Press *and hold* the **X** button to return to standby.

To automatically insert an access code followed by a pause

With some switchboards it may be necessary to insert a pause after entering the switchboard access code, e.g. **9**, **11** etc to enable you to get an outside line.

If you use your Synergy 3200 SMS with two separate switchboards, you can set two separate access codes. Then you can simply select which switchboard you are using your phone with.

This feature can also automatically insert a pause between the access code and the phone number stored in the Phonebook.

You can then select which switchboard you want your Synergy 3200 SMS to work with.

Press the \checkmark button to enter the menu.

Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to Setup.

Press the 🛩 button.

Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to PABX Setup.

Press the \blacktriangleright button.

Use the $\ensuremath{\text{\mathsf{DOWN}}}$ button to scroll to Pabr 1.

Press the 🛩 button.

Display shows PIN Code?



Press the 🛩 button.

Display shows PABX Setup.

Enter the switchboard access code you want.



Press the \blacktriangleright button to confirm.

You can now also choose the length of the pause to be inserted – 3 or 5 seconds.


