### Requirements

- Pentium 133 MHz or higher.
- Microsoft Windows 98/Me/2000/XP.
- Microsoft Internet Explorer 5.0 or later.
- PC system requires 32 Mb RAM minimum but 64 Mb is recommended.
- USB port PS2 Port.
- CD-ROM drive (4X or later) for software installation.

### **Ergonomic Safety Precautions**

### Installing the keyboard/Mouse using a USB Connection:

- Connect the keyboard and Mouse to the USB port as shown below.
- 2. Insert the ViewSonic Wizard CD into your computer's CD drive.

Wait for the CD-ROM to autostart. If your computer does not have a CD-ROM drive, contact Customer Support.

If the CD-ROM does not autostart: double-click on the CD-ROM icon in Windows Explorer, then double-click on **setup.exe**.


Follow the on-screen instructions: select Software Install or View the user guide.

#### 3. Restart your computer.



### Installing the mouse using a PS/2 Adapter Connection



- 1 Turn off your PC.
- **2** Plug the mouse and keyboard with a PS/2 Adapter Connection into the PS/2 port on your computer.
- **3** Turn on your PC and monitor. Installation is now complete with standard mouse features.
- 4 Insert the ViewSonic Wizard CD into your computer's CD drive.
- **5.** Restart your computer.

### **Un-installing the software**

Follow these instruction to remove the ViewSonic Keyboard and Mouse software from your computer's hard drive:

- 1 Click on start button, slect Programs, and slect ViewMate Desktop CC2201.
- 2 Click on Un-install ViewMate Mouse.
- **3** Repeat these same steps to un-install the ViewMate Keyboard.





The Enhanced Function Keys shown on page 6 are controlled by your PC computer's setup. Driver installation is required for following Function keys.


### **Application Keys**

The keyboard icon shows that all hotkey are active.


**Options:** You can program P1, P2 hot key function; configure the WWW and Email hot key on the keyboard and OSD display setting.


**On-Screen KB:** Pop up Multimedia keyboard on screen.

### **Troubleshooting**

#### Function keys, or hot keys do not work properly

- Check to see if there are other keyboard drivers install on your system. If so, then uninstall all keyboard drivers and re-install your ViewSonic ViewMate keyboard drivers.
- Check to see if one of the LED lights is on. Press the corresponding key to turn that function off. For example, if the Undo key does not work and the Scoll LED light is on, press the Scoll Key. The Scroll Lock LED turns off and the Undo Key functions properly.

#### Other software applications do not install properly

- Uninstall the keyboard drivers from your system. See the Uninstall keyboard software section above. To do this, right click on the keyboard icon in the tool bar and choose EXIT. Install the desired software application. Restart your system. For more information, see the Keyboard Functions diagram on page 5.
- If a key malfunctions, please contact Customer Support. See the Customer Support table in this guide.

#### VCD or MPEG files do not display properly

VCD (video CD) titles or MPEG files need Media Player 7 installed on your system. Media Player 7 can be downloaded from the Microsoft Website.

### To clean the keyboard

- 1 Power-OFF the computer and turn the keyboard upside down.
- 2 Use a vacuum cleaner with a brush attachment. Or, use a can or air to spray out any loose dirt. Do not spray liquid on the keyboard.

#### What the warranty covers:

**ViewSonic®** warrants its products to be free from defects in material and workmanship during the warranty period. If a product proves to be defective in material or workmanship during the warranty period,

**ViewSonic** will, at its sole option, repair or replace the product with a like product. Replacement product or parts may include remanufactured or refurbished parts or components. How long the warranty is effective:

**ViewSonic** Keyboard and Mouse (if included in package) are warranted for one (1) year for all parts and one (1) year for all labor from the date of the first consumer purchase.

#### Who the warranty protects:

This warranty is valid only for the first consumer purchaser.

#### What the warranty does not cover:

- 1. Any product on which the serial number has been defaced, modified or removed.
- 2. Damage, deterioration or malfunction resulting from:
  - a. Accident, misuse, neglect, fire, water, lightning, or other acts of nature, unauthorized product modification, or failure to follow instructions supplied with the product.
  - b. Repair or attempted repair by anyone not authorized by ViewSonic.
  - c. Any damage of the product due to shipment.
  - d. Removal or installation of the product.
  - e. Causes external to the product, such as electrical power fluctuations or failure.
  - f. Use of supplies or parts not meeting ViewSonic's specifications.
  - g. Normal wear and tear.
