



INTRODUCTION

Congratulations on the purchase of your new Wertheim vacuum cleaner. There are many useful features built into your cleaner and we recommend that you carefully read this instruction manual so that you may take best advantage of them.

Due to our program of continuous product improvement and innovation, sometimes the product you buy may differ slightly from the one shown on this product carton.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

The cleaner must be operated in accordance with these instructions and used only for domestic household cleaning to remove DRY dirt and dust from household carpets, flooring and fabrics. This cleaner is not fit to be used as an industrial cleaner, and is not designed for the collection of vitreous building material including particle board, construction products and similar products such as wood/fibres, cement, fillers, fibre glass etc or excessive or frequent sand. The infrequent pick-up of these materials in these circumstances may be harmful to your cleaner and may void the manufacturer's warranty.

Please read these instructions thoroughly

This will ensure you obtain full benefit from your new cleaner. Keep this instruction manual in a handy place for future reference.

Important

Always switch the cleaner off and remove the plug from the mains power supply before cleaning your appliance, when not in use, or attempting any maintenance task. The cleaner must only be connected to an AC supply at the voltage shown on the rating plate. This cleaner should only be used for its intended purpose as described in these instructions. Never operate the vacuum cleaner without filters.

Precautionary measures:



1. Do not operate the vacuum cleaner too close to heaters, radiators, and other hot surfaces.



2. Before inserting the plug into the wall, make sure your hand is dry.



3. Before turning on the vacuum cleaner, remove any large or sharp objects from the floor or cleaning surface in order to prevent damage to the filter.



- When you want to pull the plug from the wall, do not use the power cable, gently pull the plug from the power socket.
- If the air inlet, floor head or telescopic tube are blocked, you should switch off the cleaner straight away and remove from mains power. First clear the blocked substance before attempting to start the vacuum cleaner again.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, or injury:

- Do not leave the appliance connected to the mains power supply when not in use. Disconnect from any power supply before performing any maintenance duties.
- To reduce the risk of electric shock, do not use outdoors or on wet surfaces.
- This appliance must not be used as a toy. Do not allow children to use the appliance unattended.
- 4. Use only as described in this instruction manual. **Do not** use for any other purpose except those outlined in this instruction manual.
- If the power cable or plug appears damaged, do not use. If the vacuum cleaner is not working correctly, has been dropped, damaged, left outdoors, or dropped into water, please contact Customer Care: 1800 815 270 or email enquiries@wertheim.net.au
- 6. Do not pull or carry the appliance by the power cable, use the power cable as a handle, or pull the power cable around sharp edges or corners. Avoid running the appliance over the power cable.
- 7. Keep the appliance away from heated surfaces.
- 8. Unplug the appliance by lightly grasping and pulling the plug from the wall. **Do not** unplug the machine by pulling on the power cable.
- 9. **Do not** handle the appliance and/or power cable with wet hands.
- 10. Always ensure that all openings and entry points on the appliance are clear from objects or any blockages before commencing use. Removal of dust, lint, hair and dirt from all openings and entry points will help improve airflow on the appliance.

- 11. Keep hair, loose clothing, fingers and all body parts away from openings and entry points on the appliance.
- 12. Ensure the appliance is switched off before unplugging.
- 13. Use extra care when cleaning on stairs.
- 14. Do not use the appliance to pick up flammable items or combustible liquids (i.e. petrol, hot ashes, cigarettes, matches or anything burning) or use in areas where such substances and items may be present.
- 15. Hold the plug when rewinding onto cord reel. To prevent accidental injury **do not** allow the plug to whip when rewinding.
- 16. Ensure the appliance is disconnected from the mains power supply before connecting the hose to the unit.
- 17. **Do not** use the appliance without dust bag and/or filter in place.
- 18. If the power cable is damaged, **do not** use and contact Customer Care: 1800 815 270 in order to avoid a hazard.
- 19. **Do not** extend the power cable beyond the red mark.
- 20. This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety. Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- 21. If using an extension cord please make sure that it is of an approved type and that it is fully extended. Failure to do so could cause your cleaner to overheat and damage it.
- 22. Regularly check the vacuum hose to ensure that there are no damages. If damage is found please do not use.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

Before using, unwind a sufficient length of cable and insert the plug into the power socket. A yellow mark on the power cable shows the ideal cable length. Do not extend the cable beyond the red mark.



1. Press the on/off button to turn the vacuum on.



2. To rewind the power cable, press the rewind button with one hand and guide the cable with the other hand to ensure that it does not whip, causing damage to the cable.

Assembling Your Cleaner

The cleaner should be switched off and disconnected from the mains power supply before you start to assemble.



 Connect the hose connector to the cleaner making sure it fits firmly.



2. Fit handle into the telescopic wand until it clicks into place.



 Extend or reduce the length of the wand by depressing button and moving the slider.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE (cont'd)

Assembling Your Cleaner (cont'd)

The cleaner should be switched off and disconnected from the mains power supply before you start to assemble.



4. Push the wand into the powerhead (or combination floor head), until it clicks into place. To remove, press button and separate.



5. Push the powerhead can be controlled by the on/off switch on the handle.

Powerhead

The use of a powerhead is recommended for the optimal cleaning of carpets. The rotating design allows the powerhead to move in any direction, making it easily manoeuvrable around obstacles.

Safety Precautions

- Keep hair, hands and feet away from rotating brush while the powerhead is running.
- 2. Remember the powerhead will operate whenever it is connected to a running vacuum. If children are present, make sure to turn the vacuum system off when leaving powerhead unit unattended.
- Do not attempt to service or unclog the powerhead while unit is running.

Combination Floor Tool

Ideal for daily cleaning on carpets and hard floors.

Mini Hand Turbo Brush

Ideal for picking up pet hair on upholstery.

Note: The mini hand turbo brush adaptor must be used to fit the rod to the accessory.

- 1. Insert the smaller end of the adaptor into the end of the mini hand turbo brush.
- 2. Insert the larger end of the adaptor into the end of the telescopic wand.
- 3. The mini hand turbo brush is now ready to be used with the vacuum.

Note: By unlocking the side release buttons, the external bristles can be rotated to face upwards allowing a closer clean as required.



ACCESSORIES



Dusting Brush/ Crevice Tool

On-board tools are located in their own compartment between control panel and hose outlet and include a crevice tool and dusting brush.



Attach tools to the end of the handle or the wand.




Variable Speed Control

Push the (-) button to reduce energy consumption and to clean lightly soiled areas or delicate fabrics. Push the (+) button for maximum cleaning power in heavily soiled areas.

MAINTENANCE



ALWAYS DISCONNECT VACUUM FROM MAINS POWER SUPPLY BEFORE STARTING THIS PROCEDURE!




Step 1. Remove Screws

• Remove screws from the base of the powerhead.



Step 2. Remove Powerhead Cover

• Turn the nozzle upright and lift the hood off (A).




Step 3. Remove Brushroll Cover

• Remove brushroll cover **(B)** by removing the 2 phillips head screws.




Step 4.

• Lift brushroll cover off (C).




Step 5. Check/Remove Belt

 If belt is not broken but is stretched or cut, pull it off the motor pulley (D).




Step 6. Remove/Replace Belt

- Lift up the end of the brushroll Remove the old belt from the brushroll pulley (E) and replace with a new belt. The lettering on the belt must be visible. (Lettering should be facing out.)
- Stretch the belt and attach to the motor pulley.



Step 7. Replace Brushroll

 Hold the opposite end of brushroll in place. Push the belt end forward and down while rotating the end plate (F) until it slides into place. Turn the brushroll, making sure it rotates freely.



Step 8. Replace Brushroll Cover

- Place brushroll cover back over the brushroll.
- Replace the two cover screws.



Step 9. Replace Powerhead Cover

- The nozzle must be in the upright locked position.
- Position the hood on top of nozzle base. Make sure wires and buttons are aligned. Do not force the hood on.
- Turn the nozzle over.
- Replace the screws for the hood and base. See Step 1.



Step 10. When to Replace the Brushroll

- When brushroll bristles are worn, the brushroll should be replaced.
- To check condition of the bristles, hold a card on the bottom plate while turning the brushroll. Replace the brushroll if bristles do not touch the card.

How to Replace the Brushroll

- Remove hood and base on powerhead, remove brushroll cover, belt and brushroll. See Steps 1-6.
- 2. Discard the old brushroll.
- 3. Install the new brushroll and belt. See Steps 7-9.




How to Clear Blockages


 Low suction or pick up may be due to a blockage in the system. Refer to the following steps to check for blockages, continuing with each step until the blockage is found.

Hose/Wand Blockage

- Disconnect powerhead and wand from handle.
- Plug vacuum in and turn it on.
 Check the hose end for suction.
 Remove any obstructions.
- If there is no blockage in the hose.
 Remove the powerhead from wand and attach wand to hose.
 Check for suction and remove any blockages.







Powerhead Blockage

- If the nozzle becomes clogged, use the following procedures to check for and clear the blockage.
- If blockage is severe enough the powerhead will shut off. After the blockage is cleared you must push the Overload Protection Reset button (A) before the powerhead will operate again.
- Make sure powerhead is disconnected from wand. Then check for blockage in nozzle connection (B).

 There is an additional panel on the bottom of the powerhead (C). This opening provides a secondary place to check and clear blockage.

Height Adjustment

The Powerhead is at the centre of the deep cleaning technology. It has a number of innovative features to make cleaning fast and efficient. There is a six step brush height adjustment, and a dirt seeking headlight. For added safety, an overload protection device has been fitted.

Mini Hand Turbo Brush



WARNING: ENSURE THE CLEANER IS NOT CONNECTED TO THE MAINS POWER SUPPLY WHEN PERFORMING ANY MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES.



Step 1: Unlock the neck on the hand turbo brush by twisting anti-clockwise.

Step 2: Push the release buttons on the side of the Mini Hand Turbo Brush down to unlock the external bristles. Rotate this bristle attachment upwards.



Step 3: Remove the clear cover.

Mini Hand Turbo Brush (cont'd)



Step 4: Remove any dirt or hair from the roller brush.



Step 5: Replace the clear cover.



Step 6: Lock the neck on the hand turbo brush by twisting clockwise.

Step 7: Rotate the external bristles down and lock the side release buttons by pushing upwards.

Changing the Germastadt Dust Bag

Ensure the vacuum cleaner is not connected to the mains power supply when performing any maintenance procedures. Use a damp cloth and mild detergent when cleaning the appliance.

This dust bag has a unique sealing system locking in the dust, making disposal easier, and ensuring no allergens are returned to the room.



1. To remove and replace dust bag, open dust bag cover.



Change the bag when full or when the bag indicator illuminates.



3. Remove bag by sliding out of bag holder and dispose.

Changing the Germastadt Dust Bag (cont'd)



4. Lift up dust bag holder and bend tab over to seal bag for disposal.



5. Refit new dust bag by sliding into dust bag holder.



Make sure that bag fits correctly and close lid securely.

Filter Maintenance

The HEPA filter should be replaced when clogged or at least once a year. Do not use cleaner without the filters fitted as it will cause damage to the cleaner.



 To remove motor filter, open cleaner cover and remove dust bag.



Remove motor filter by holding tab and pull filter out towards you.



 Before cleaning or replacing motor filter, remove any dust from surrounding area.

Filter Maintenance (cont'd)



 Remove the motor filter from its carrier and wash under warm tap water. Dry thoroughly and refit.



5. The HEPA filter is located above the motor filter, remove by lifting latch and slide towards you.



Replace the HEPA Filter and refit. Refit the motor filter back into cleaner.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Service problems that appear to be major can often be solved easily. You can be your own troubleshooter by reviewing this guide. All other servicing should be done by an authorised service agent or qualified technician.

Problem	Cause	Remedy
Motor does not start or stops.	No power supply.	Check cable, plug and socket. If still inoperative, contact service agent.
Suction force gradually decreases.	Dust-bag is full, suction hose or wand is blocked or dirty filters.	Replace dust-bag, remove objects from hose and wand, clean or replace filters.
Power Brush does not operate.	Not switched on, reset-button tripped, belt broken.	Switch on, press reset- button, have belt replaced by service agent.
