# **Dear SHARP customer**

Thank you for your purchase of the SHARP LCD colour TV product. To ensure safety and many years of troublefree operation of your product, please read the Important Safety Precautions carefully before using this product.

# **Important Safety Precautions**

Electricity is used to perform many useful functions, but it can also cause personal injuries and property damage if improperly handled. This product has been engineered and manufactured with the highest priority on safety. However, improper use can result in electric shock and/or fire. In order to prevent potential danger, please observe the following instructions when installing, operating and cleaning the product. To ensure your safety and prolong the service life of your LCD colour TV product, please read the following precautions carefully before using the product.

- 1. Read instructions—All operating instructions must be read and understood before the product is operated.
- 2. Keep this manual in a safe place—These safety and operating instructions must be kept in a safe place for future reference.
- 3. Observe warnings—All warnings on the product and in the instructions must be observed closely.
- 4. Follow instructions—All operating instructions must be followed.
- 5. Attachments—Do not use attachments not recommended by the manufacturer. Use of inadequate attachments can result in accidents.
- 6. Power source—This product must operate on a power source specified on the specification label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply used in your home, consult your dealer or local power company.
- 7. AC cord protection—The AC cords must be routed properly to prevent people from stepping on them or objects from resting on them. Check the cords at the plugs and product.
- 8. Overloading—Do not overload AC outlets or extension cords. Overloading can cause fire or electric shock.
- 9. Entering of objects and liquids—Never insert an object into the product through vents or openings. High voltage flows in the product, and inserting an object can cause electric shock and/or short internal parts. For the same reason, do not spill water or liquid on the product.

# **Supplied accessories**

Make sure the following accessories are provided with the product.

• The illustrations and on-screen displays in this operation manual are for explanation purposes and may vary slightly from the actual operations.

• The examples used throughout this manual are based on LC-32AX3X.

# Preparation

## Inserting the batteries

Before using the TV for the first time, insert two "AAA" size batteries (supplied). When the batteries become depleted and the remote control fails to operate, replace the batteries with new "AAA" size batteries.

**1** Open the battery cover.



**2** Insert two supplied "AAA" size **3** Close the battery cover. batteries.



• Place batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (-) indications in the battery compartment.



## 

- Improper use of batteries can result in chemical leakage or explosion. Be sure to follow the instructions below.
- Do not mix batteries of different types. Different types of batteries have different characteristics.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries can shorten the life of new batteries or cause chemical leakage in old batteries.
- Remove batteries as soon as they have worn out. Chemicals that leak from batteries can cause a rash. If you find any chemical leakage, wipe thoroughly with a cloth.
- The batteries supplied with this product may have a shorter life expectancy due to storage conditions.
- If you will not be using the remote control unit for an extended period of time, remove the batteries from it.

## Using the remote control unit

Use the remote control unit by pointing it towards the remote sensor window.

Objects between the remote control unit and sensor window may prevent proper operation.



## Cautions regarding remote control unit

- Do not subject the remote control unit to shock. In addition, do not soak the remote control unit with liquids, or place it in an area with high humidity.
- Do not install or place the remote control unit under direct sunlight. The heat may cause deformation of the unit.
- The remote control unit may not work properly if the remote sensor window of the TV is under direct sunlight or strong lighting. In such case, change the angle of the lighting or TV, or operate the remote control unit closer to the remote sensor window.

## Setting the TV

## Notes on installing the TV

- Avoid direct sunlight and place the TV in a well-ventilated location.
- Place the TV in a level location.



Press down the hooks to remove the cover toward you.

2 Connecting the AC cord, antenna, and external equipment to the TV



See pages 9 and 41–43 for connecting antennas and external equipment, such as VCR and DVD player.

**3** Bundling the cables and closing the terminal cover



• TO PREVENT RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK, DO NOT TOUCH UN-INSULATED PARTS OF ANY CABLES WITH THE AC CORD CONNECTED.

Adjust the screen with both hands. Put one hand on the TV and tilt the screen while steadying the stand with your other hand. To change the vertical angle of the TV, tilt the screen up to 2 degrees forward or 6 degrees backward. The TV can also be rotated up to 10 degrees to the right or left.

## Protection against overturning

There is a danger of the product overturning in the case of a disaster or sudden collision. Carry out the following tip-resistant measurement for your safety.



(I) CAUTION

• As this product is heavy, use a table that is wide enough to support the product and capable of withstanding the product's weight. The table should be set where it will not be overturned.

## Preparation

Simple operations for watching a TV programme

## **Basic connection**

### Connecting to an antenna

To enjoy a clearer picture, use an outdoor antenna. The following is a brief explanation of the types of connections that are used for coaxial cable.



#### Connecting to the power outlet



## **NOTE**

- Always turn off the power of the TV when connecting the AC cord.
- Disconnect the AC cord from the AC outlet if the TV will not be used for a long period of time.

## Setting the TV on the wall

- You can mount the TV on the wall, using the optional AN-37AG2 bracket for LC-32AX3X/LC-37AX3X.
- For details, refer to the instructions supplied with the optional bracket.

#### (Indicaution)

Installing the Liquid Crystal Television requires special skill that should only be performed by qualified service
personnel. Customers should not attempt to do the work themselves. SHARP bears no responsibility for improper
mounting or mounting that results in accident or injury.

#### <Example>

#### Hanging on the wall

Wall mount bracket. (See the bracket instructions for details.)



# Regarding the angle when mounting the TV on the wall

• The maximum angle to which you can tilt the wall-mounted TV is as follows. Do not tilt it more than the maximum angle.

LC-32AX3X	Up to 10°
LC-37AX3X	Up to 5°

• Tilt the wall-mounted TV slowly when adjusting its angle.

## **Removing the stand**

For wall mounting with the optional bracket, remove the stand.

#### Before attaching/detaching stand

- Before detaching (or attaching) stand, unplug the AC cord from the AC outlet.
- Remove all terminal covers and connected cables.
- Lay the TV down on cushioning (such as a blanket) over a table.
- Make sure two or more people perform the operation.

#### CAUTION

#### • Do not remove the stand from the TV unless using an optional bracket to mount it.



#### **NOTE**

• To attach the stand, perform the above steps in reverse order.

### Part names



- \* Press **RESET** if the TV cannot return to its original state after performing various operations. This will reset the TV as shown below.
  - "AV MODE" resets to "USER".
- TV channel resets to channel 1.
- Sound volume is initialised.
- Image position is initialised.
- \*\* Press SYSTEM RESET if the TV does not operate after starting up.

## NOTE

- Pressing **RESET** will not work if the TV is in standby mode (indicator lights red).
- Pressing RESET will not delete channel preset and password. See page 30 for resetting the password. See page 47 for initialising to the factory preset values in case you forget your password.
- Still image mode deactivates.
- Teletext mode resets to normal.
- "Audio Only" setting resets to "Off".

# Watching TV



#### POWER button



## Turning on the power

#### Press POWER on the TV.

- POWER indicator (Green): The TV is on. (After a few seconds, an image appears with sound.)
- After turning the power "ON" by pressing **POWER** on the TV, you can turn the power ON/OFF by pressing **POWER** on the remote control.

## Turning off the power

#### Press **POWER** on the remote control.

- The TV enters standby mode and the image on the screen disappears.
- The POWER indicator on the TV changes from green to red.

#### Press POWER on the TV.

- The POWER indicator on the TV turns off.
- When the TV is turned off by **POWER**, you cannot turn on the power by pressing **POWER** on the remote control.

#### **POWER** indicator

Off	Power off
Red	The TV is in standby mode.
Green	The TV is on.

#### **NOTE**

- If you are not going to use this TV for a long period of time, be sure to remove the AC cord from the power outlet.
- Minor power is consumed when the unit is in standby mode.

## Simple button operations for changing channels

You can change channels in several ways.

## Using CH/V on the remote control unit

- Press **CH** to increase the channel number.
- Press CHV to decrease the channel number.



## 

• CH/V on the TV operates the same as /V on the remote control unit.



## Using 0 - 9 on the remote control unit

Select the channels directly by pressing buttons **0** to **9**.



## EXAMPLE

- To select a 1-digit channel (e.g. channel 2):
- Press 0, followed by 2.
- To select a 2-digit channel (e.g. channel 12):
- Press 1, followed by 2.

#### When viewing Teletext information

View a page directly which is 3-digit page number from 100 to 899 by pressing buttons **0** to **9**.

#### **Channel display**

Channel display changes approximately after 3 seconds as shown below.



# Using Flashback (⇐) on the remote control unit



Press 😴 to switch the currently tuned channel to the previously tuned channel.

Press S again to switch back to the currently tuned channel.

Press ♀ to toggle between the currently selected input source and the previously selected one.

Press rightharpoonup 5 to return to the previous page in TELETEXT mode.

# Using MPX on the remote control unit



#### In the NICAM TV broadcasts

#### When receiving a stereo signal

Each time you press **MPX**, the mode switches between NICAM STEREO and MONO.



#### When receiving a bilingual signal

Each time you press **MPX**, the mode switches among NICAM CH A, NICAM CH B, NICAM CH AB and MONO.



#### When receiving a monaural signal

Each time you press **MPX**, the mode switches between NICAM MONO and MONO.



#### In the TV mode of A2 TV broadcasts

#### When receiving a stereo signal

Each time you press **MPX**, the mode switches between STEREO and MONO.



#### When receiving a bilingual signal

Each time you press **MPX**, the mode switches among CH A, CH B and CH AB.



## When receiving a monaural signal

When you press **MPX**, "MONO" displays.

## Simple button operation for changing volume/sound



## Changing the volume

You can change the volume on the TV or on the remote control unit.

- To increase the volume, press VOL+.
- To decrease the volume, press VOL –.

• "TV", "INPUT1", "INPUT2", "INPUT3" and "INPUT4" modes can store volume adjustment values separately.

Mute

## Using 🕸 (Mute) on the remote control unit

ri mutes the current sound output.



#### **NOTE**

2

- Within 30 minutes after pressing 1/2, press one of the buttons below to cancel the mute. -VOL -/VOL + -11/2
- Mute will be cancelled after 30 minutes. However, the TV will not suddenly output loud sound as the volume level will be set to 0 automatically. Increase the volume level by pressing VOL+.
  - Press of again within 30 minutes to cancel the mute.
    - Before 30 minutes, the volume level returns to the previous setting.

## **Sleep timer**

Allows you to set a time when the TV automatically switches to standby.

## Press SLEEP.

 Remaining time displays when sleep timer has been set.

Sleep Timer: Remain 2 hr. 00 min.

Each time you press SLEEP, the remaining time switches as shown below. 🗕 1 hr. 30 min.

#### Off 🗲 – 2 hr. 30 min. 🗲 – 2 hr. 00 min.

- · When the time has been set, countdown automatically starts.
- Five minutes before the preset of time expires, the remaining time displays each minute.
- Select "Off" by pressing SLEEP to cancel the sleep timer.

## Still image

You can freeze a motion picture on the screen.





Press 🕃 again to exit still image.

#### 

- When this function is not available, "No still image display available." will display.
- The still image automatically goes out after 30 minutes.
- When you freeze the picture, an icon is displayed at the ٠ lower left corner of the screen.

# **Basic adjustment settings**

## Menu operation buttons

Use the following buttons on the remote control to operate the menu.



- MENU: Press to open or close the menu screen.
- ▲/▼/ ◄/►: Press to select a desired item on the screen or adjust a selected item.
- **ENTER:** Press to go to the next step or complete the setting.
- **RETURN:** Press to return to the previous step.

## **On-Screen Display**

#### Example



- ① Item displayed in yellow
  - This indicates the item currently selected.
  - Press **ENTER** to go to the adjustment screen for this item.
- 2 Item in brackets
  - This indicates the current setting for the item.
- ③ Item displayed in white
  - This indicates an item can be selected.
- ④ Item displayed in grey
  - This indicates that the item cannot be selected.
    - \*There are various reasons why items cannot be selected, but the main reasons are as follows:
      - 1. Nothing is connected to the selected input terminal.
      - 2. The function is not compatible with the current input signal.

## 

- Menu options differ in the selected input modes, but the operating procedures are the same.
- The screens in the operation manual are for explanation purposes (some are enlarged, others cropped) and may vary slightly from the actual screens.

## **Basic adjustment settings**

## **Auto installation**

You can run auto installation again, even after setting up the preset channels.



• After performing step 6, the menu screen shown in step 3 will reappear. Do not turn off the TV before then, because the TV is saving the data found.

## Programme setup

You can run the auto search procedure again at any time by accessing the Setup menu and Programme Setup. Channels can be tuned automatically or manually.

#### Auto search

You can also automatically search by performing the procedure below. This is the same function as programme auto search in auto installation.



Press **MENU** and the MENU screen displays.

## **Basic adjustment settings**

#### Manual setting for each channel

You can set some channel items manually. They are Search, Fine (TV frequency), Colour sys., Sound sys., Label (Network name), Skip and Lock (Child Lock).

#### **NOTE**

- You need to set a password when using the child lock function. See page 30 for setting a password.
- If "Lock" is set to "On" for a channel, "Child lock has been activated." is displayed when you select the channel, and the image and sound of the channel is blocked.
- When pressing **ENTER** while "Child lock has been activated." is displayed, password input menu will be displayed. Inputting the correct password lifts the child lock temporarily until the power is turned off.

## Erase Programme

The individual programme can be erased.



Repeat the steps 6 and 7 until all desired channels are erased.

## AV mode selection

AV mode gives you five viewing options to choose from to best match the system environment, which can vary due to factors like room-brightness, type of programme watched or the type of image input from external equipment.

1	Press <b>MENU</b> and the MENU screen displays.
2	Press ◀/► to select "Picture" or "Audio".

- Press ▲/▼ to select "AV Mode", and then 5 press ENTER.
  - Press  $\blacktriangle / \bigtriangledown / \checkmark / \blacklozenge / \triangleright$  to select the desired item, and then press ENTER.

Teletext broadcasts pages of information and entertainment to specially equipped television sets. News, weather reports, sports information, stock exchange prices and programme previews are among the many services available.

#### **Teletext mode**

Teletext is turned on/off with (=) on the remote control unit. You can operate your TV in Teletext mode directly by inputting commands with the remote control unit.
