2 IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When using your telephone, basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and injury, including the following:

- 1. Read and understand all the instructions.
- 2. Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the product.
- 3. Unplug the power adapter from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- 4. Keep your phone away from hot, humid conditions or strong sunlight and don't let it get wet or use this product near water (for example, near a bath tub, kitchen sink, swimming pool).
- 5. Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in the risk of fire or electric shock.



5.2 Display icons and symbols (see P2)

5.5 Text and digit entry

The following tables show you where each letter and punctuation character can be found, by using repeated presses of the alphanumeric keypad. This will be helpful when storing a name in the phonebook and renaming your handset.

In editing mode, a cursor is displayed to indicate the current text entry position. It is positioned at the right of the last character entered.

Writing tips:

- Once a character is selected, the cursor will move to the next position after a short pause.
- You can move the cursor within the text with the ▲/▼ keys to amend the text entry.
- Press ⁵/⋈ to delete the last character.
- Press and hold $5/\boxtimes$ to delete the entire text string.

6 INSTALLING YOUR PHONE

6.1 Connecting the base station (see P5)

- Plug the power adapter and line cord into the base station.
- Plug the power adapter into a 210 240 V ac, 50/60 Hz mains socket and the other end of the line cord into your telephone line socket.

Warning:

- Always use the line cord provided in the box. Other line cords may not be compatible and may not work.
- Only use the power adapter supplied.
- The base unit needs mains power for normal operation, not just for charging the handset batteries.

6.2 Installing and charging the batteries (see P3)

- Slide open the battery compartment cover.
- Place the 2 batteries with the correct polarity, as shown.
- Slide the battery compartment cover back.
- Put the handset on the base and charge for 14 hours before first time use. A beep indicates that the handset is properly placed on the base or charger.

Warning:

- Only use AAA size NiMH rechargeable batteries.
- If the handset will not be used for a long time, disconnect and remove the batteries to prevent possible leakage.

7 USING YOUR PHONE

7.1 Make a call

7.1.1 Preparatory dialling

- Enter the phone number and press (to dial the number, press it again to turn on the speakerphone.
 - >When entering the number, if you make a mistake, press 5/8 to delete digits.

7.1.2 Direct dialling

- Press (to connect to the line and then enter the phone number.
- Press (again to turn on the speakerphone.

7.1.3 Call from the contacts list

- Press
 ■ to access the contacts list and press
 ▲/▼ to select the desired contacts entry.
- Press (to dial out the selected entry. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

7.1.4 Call from the call log

- Press ♣ to access the call log and press ♠/▼ to select the desired call log entry.
- Press (to dial out the selected call log entry. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.
- Alternatively, press \blacksquare and \triangle/∇ to access the call log from the main menu.

7.1.5 Call from the redial list

- Press (to dial out the selected redial number. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

7.1.6 Call timer

Your handset automatically times the duration of every call.

The call timer will display a few seconds after the call has made. It is shown in hours, minutes and seconds format (HH:MM:SS).

7.2 Make a call from direct access memory

Using the handset:

• In idle, press and hold M1/M2/M3 to dial the number pre-stored into the keys respectively.

OR

• Press (, and then press and hold M1/M2/M3 to dial the number prestored into the keys respectively.

Note:

You need to set the direct access number first.

> If no number is stored, you will hear double beeps tone.

Using the base:

• In idle, press M1/M2/M3/M4 to dial the number pre-stored into the keys respectively.

Note:

You need to set the direct access number first.

7.3 Answer a call

Using the handset:

If the handset is not on the charging cradle:

• When the phone rings, press (to answer a call, press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

Note:

If the handset is on the charging cradle and if "AUTO ANS" is set to "ON": when the phone rings, pick up the handset to answer a call auto matically, without having to press any button.

Using the base:

• When the phone rings, the base speaker LED will flash. Press ■ to answer the call.

7.4 Audio boost feature

The audio boost feature allows you to amplify the handset earpiece volume to compensate for the ear's limited sensitivity.

- To turn on the audio boost feature, press **3** at any time during a call. > The handset top indicator turns on.
- When the audio boost feature is activated, press ▲/▼ to increase or decrease the handset volume within the specific frequency range set in equalizer.
- To turn off the audio boost feature and return the earpiece volume back to normal, press again and the handset top indicator light turns off.
 - > The audio boost feature will be turned off automatically when the call is ended.

7.5 End a call

Using the handset:

- During a call connection on handset, press to end the call. OR
- Put the handset on the base station to end the call.

Using the base:

• During a call connection on base, press

■ to end the call.

7.6 Adjust earpiece and handsfree volume

There are 5 levels ("VOLUME 1" to "VOLUME 5") to choose from for each of the earpiece and handsfree volumes.

Using the base:

During a call:

- Press ▲/▼ to select volume 1-8.
 - >The current setting is shown.
 - >When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level.

Using the handset:

During a call:

- Press to select volume 1-5.
 - >When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level.

7.7 Mute a call

You can talk to someone nearby without letting the caller hear you during a call.

During a call:

- Press 🔀 to mute the microphone and "MUTED" will display on the screen.
 - > Your caller cannot hear you.
- Press 🛭 again to unmute the microphone.

7.8 Set the silent mode

- In idle mode, press and hold # to turn off the handset ringer. The \bigset* icon is displayed on the screen.
- In silent mode, press and hold # to turn on the handset ringer. The \rat{s} icon will disappear.

7.9 To turn the handset ringer off

- In idle mode, press and hold # to turn off the handset ringer.
 - >The ringer off 👗 icon will be displayed.
- When the ringer is off, press and hold the # key to turn on the handset ringer.
 - >The ringer off icon 👗 will turn off.

7.10 Turn on the keypad lock

- In idle mode, press and hold * to turn on the keypad lock.
 - >The keypad lock icon 🗐 will be displayed.

Note:

You can still use (to answer a call when the handset is ringing.

• In keypad lock mode, press and hold * to turn off the keypad lock. > The keypad lock icon i will turn off.

7.11 Redial the last number

You can redial any of the 5 last numbers called. If you have stored a name in the contacts list to go with the number, the name will be displayed instead.

The most recent last number will display at the top of the redial list.

7.11.1 Redial a number from the redial list

• In idle mode, press To access the redial list.

Note:

If the redial list entry shows a name, press # to view the number of this entry.

- Press 🛋/🔻 to browse the redial list.
- Press (to dial to the selected redial number.

Note:

If there are no numbers in the redial list, the display shows "EMPTY".

7.11.2 Store a redial number into the phonebook

- Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 7.11.1.
- Press OK to enter the name.
- Press OK to store the redial number into the phonebook.
- Press OK to select phonebook melody.
- Press ▲/▼ to browse the melody list. The respective melody will be played when browsing the melody list.
- Press OK to confirm.

7.11.3 Delete a redial number

- Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 7.11.1.
- Press OK to confirm.

7.11.4 Delete the entire redial list

• Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 7.11.1.

- Press OK to confirm.
- Press OK to confirm again.

7.12 Find the handset

You can locate the handset by pressing the find key • on the base station. All the handsets registered to the base will produce the paging tone and show "PAGING" on the screen.

You can stop the paging by pressing $(, \cdot)$ or $^{5}/\boxtimes$ on any handset or $^{\bullet 0}$ on the base again.

Note:

If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call instead of paging.

7.13 Make an internal call

This feature is only applicable when there are at least two registered handsets. It allows you to make internal calls, transfer external calls from one handset to another handset and make conference calls. If the called handset is not answered within 60 seconds, the called handset will stop ringing and the calling handset will return to standby mode.

Note:

If only one handset is registered to the base station, press 5/\bigsim will display "FAILED".

7.13.1 Intercom another handset

- In idle mode, press 5/8 and the registered handsets will display except the calling handset.
- Enter the desired handset number to intercom with.
- The called handset rings. Press (on the called handset to establish the internal call.

Note:

If two handsets are registered to the base station, press $^{5}/^{2}$ will connect to another handset immediately.

7.13.2 Call all handsets

- In idle mode, press $^{5}/^{\boxtimes}$ and the registered handsets will display.
- Press 9 to ring to all registered handsets.

7.13.3 Transfer an external call from handset to handset

During an external call:

- Press

 and

 √
 to select "INTERCOM".
- Press OK to select the desired handset to intercom with.
- The external call is put on hold automatically and the called handset rings.
- Press (on the called handset to establish an internal call.
- Press on the calling handset or put the calling handset on the charging cradle to end the current call with the external party.
- The external call is transferred to the called handset.

7.13.4 Transfer an external call from base to handset

During an external call on base:

• Grab off the handset from base cradle, the external call on base will be transferred to handset automatically, and base will go to idle.

Note:

Before lifting up the handset, please ensure the handset is in line use status (shows the ficon). If you lift up the handset before it showing the icon, call transfer will be failed, you need to put back the handset on cradle and try again.

7.13.5 Make a 3-way conference call

The conference call feature allows one external call to be shared with base and handset or between two handsets (in intercom). The three parties can share the conversation and no network subscription is required.

Make a 3-way conference call with two handsets:

During an external call:

- Follow Steps 1 to 4 in section 7.13.3.
- Press and hold * on the calling handset to establish the conference call.

Note:

Any handset hangs up during a conference call will leave the other handset still in connection with the external call.

7.13.6 Make a 3-way conference call with Barge In

If you turn on the Barge in function (see section 11.7.6 for details to turn on/off barge in), you can conduct a conference call between handsets or handset and base easily as following.

During an external call:

• Press on the base to establish the conference call if any handset has answered the call.

OR

• Press (on the handset to establish the conference call if another handset or the base has answered the call.

Note:

Any party (base or handset) hangs up during a conference call will leave the other party still in connection with the external call.

8 PRIVATE PHONEBOOK

You can store up to 20 private phonebook entries with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 20 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name. You can also select different ringtones for your phonebook entries. (Note: the different ringtones only play if you subscribe to caller display and the incoming number matches the stored number.)

Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

8.1 Add a new contacts entry

- From idle model, press **t**o show "CONTACTS" and then press **K** to enter the contacts list.
- Press OK to show "ADD".
- Press OK and then enter the name.
- Press OK and then enter the number.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select the desired ringtone for your contacts entry.
- Press OK to store the contacts entry.

8.2 Search for a contacts entry

• From idle mode, press **E** to show "CONTACTS" and then press **OK** to enter the contacts list.

• Enter the first letter of the name using the alphanumeric keys (e.g. if it begins with C, press the 2 key three times) and then ▲/▼ to scroll to the entry you want.

8.3 View a contacts entry

In idle:

- Press 🗏 to select "CONTACTS" main menu item and then press OK to access the contacts list.
- Press ▲/▼ to select the desired contact entry.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "VIEW".
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to review the name, number and melody of the selected phonebook entry.

Note:

If number is more than 12 digits, press \blacksquare/OK or $^{5}/\boxtimes$ to view the remaining digits.

8.4 Edit a contacts entry

In idle:

- Press 🗏 to select "CONTACTS" main menu item and then press OK to access the contacts list.
- Press ▲/▼ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "EDIT".
- Press OK and the current contents of the selected phonebook entry displays.
- Edit the name and press OK
- Edit the number and press OK
- Press \triangle/∇ to select the ringtone and press $\bigcirc K$ to confirm.

8.5 Delete a contacts entry

In idle:

- Press
 to select "CONTACTS" main menu item and then press
 ok to access the contacts list.
- Press ▲/▼ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "DELETE".
- Press OK to confirm.

8.6 Delete the entire private phonebook

• Press 🗏 to select "CONTACTS" main menu item and then press OK to access the contacts list.

- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "DEL ALL".
- Press OK to confirm.
- Press OK to re-confirm.

8.7 Check the phonebook usage

You can check how many phonebook entries have been occupied in your phone and how many phonebook entries are available for you to store in the phonebook.

- Press 🗏 to select "CONTACTS" main menu item and then press OK to access the contacts list.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "CAPACITY".
- Press OK to confirm.

8.8 Set the fast dial numbers

After setting the fast dial numbers, you can dial to the pre-set numbers by pressing and holding the respective digit keys from idle mode.

8.8.1 Add or edit the fast dial number

- Press 🗏 to select "CONTACTS" main menu item and then press OK to access the contacts list.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "FASTDIAL".
- Press \triangle/∇ and OK to select one digit key from 2 to 9.

If there is no number stored in the selected key:

- Press ▲/▼ to select an entry from the contacts list.
- Press OK to confirm.

If there is already a number stored in the selected key:

- Press OK to select "EDIT".
- Press OK to select an entry from the contacts list.
- Press OK to confirm.

8.8.2 Delete the fast dial number

- Repeat the steps 1 to 3 in section 8.8.1.
- Press ▲/▼ to select an entry from the contacts list.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "DELETE".
- Press OK to confirm.

9 CALLER DISPLAY (NETWORK DEPENDENT)

This feature is available if you have subscribed the Caller Line Identification service with your telephone service provider. Your phone can store up to 10 received calls with date/time information in the call log. The number will be shown on the screen when the phone is ringing. If the number matches with one of the entries in your Private Phonebook, the caller's name stored in the private phonebook will be displayed alternatively with the number. The handset will ring with the melody associated with that phonebook entry.

If the call is from someone who withheld their number,"WITHHELD" will display.

In standby, if three unanswered calls are received, "3 CALLS" will be displayed.

9.1 View the call log

All received calls are saved in the call log with the latest call at the top of the list. When the call log is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new call. Any unanswered calls which have not been viewed are marked with a at the top of the display.

• Press **L** to access the call log.

OR

- Press \blacksquare and \triangle/∇ to show "CALL LOG", then press $\bigcirc K$ to select it.
- Press ▲/▼ to select the desired entry.
- Press # to view the caller's number if applicable.

9.2 Store a call log number into the phonebook

- Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 9.1.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "STORE".
- Press OK to enter the name.
- Press OK and the selected call list number is displayed.
- Edit the number if necessary.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select the melody.
- Press OK to confirm.

9.3 Delete an entry in the call log

- Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 9.1.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "DELETE".
- Press OK to confirm.

9.4 Delete the entire list of the call log

- Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 9.1.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "DEL ALL".
- Press OK to confirm.
- Press OK to re-confirm.

9.5 View the details of the call list entry

- Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 9.1.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "DETAILS".
- Press OK to display the date and time of the selected call list entry.
- Press OK to go back to previous screen.

9.6 Set the category of call log (Optional)

- Follow Steps 1 and 2 in Section 9.1.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "CATEGORY".
- Press OK and \triangle/∇ to select the category ("ALL" or "MISSED").
- Press OK to confirm.

Note:

"ALL" means all received calls will be shown in the call log, while "MISSED" means only the missed calls will be shown.

10 PHONE SETTINGS

Your phone comes with a selection of settings that you can change to personalise your phone the way you like it to work.

10.1 Clock settings

You will need to set the correct time and date so that you know when you received call list entries.

10.1.1 Change the date format (Optional)

- Press and ▲/▼ to select "CLOCK".
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "DATE FMT".
- Press ▲/▼ to select your desired date format (DDMMYY or MMDDYY).
- Press OK to confirm.

10.1.2 Change the time format (Optional)

- Press and ▲/▼ to select "CLOCK".
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "TIME FMT".

- Press ▲/▼ to select your desired time format (12 HR or 24 HR).
- Press OK to confirm.

10.1.3 Set the time

- Press and ▲/▼ to select "CLOCK".
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "SET TIME".
- Press OK to enter the time information. The time entered will be in the format you set in section 11.1.2
- Press OK to confirm.

Note:

If time has been set before, the current time will display, otherwise, "HH:MM" will display.

10.1.4 Set the date

- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select "SET DATE".
- Press OK to enter the date information. The date entered will be in the format you set in section 11.1.2.
- Press OK to confirm.

Note:

If date has been set before, the current date will display, otherwise, "DDMMYY" will display.

10.2 Alarm settings (Optional)

You can use this phone to set an alarm clock. When an alarm is set, the displays on the screen. When the alarm time is reached, the and "ALARM ON" flash on the screen ringing with the alarm melody for a duration of 45 seconds. You can press any key to disable the alarm. If snooze function is activated, the alarm will sound again at the end of the snooze period of 7 minutes.

Note:

- > Key press is still applicable if handset keypad is locked and when the alarm time is reached.
