Getting started

WARNING

Do not place your BT Synergy 3205 SMS in the bathroom or other humid areas.

Handset range

The BT Synergy 3205 SMS has a range of 300 metres outdoors when there is a clear line of sight between the base and handset. When there is no clear line of sight between the base and handset, e.g. base indoors and handset either indoors or outdoors, the range could be reduced to 50 metres. Thick stone walls can severely affect the range.

Signal strength

The Y symbol on your handset display indicates when you are in range. When you are out of range, it flashes and BASE 1 is displayed.

IMPORTANT

Do not connect the telephone line until the handset is fully charged.

The base station must be plugged into the mains power at all times.

You must charge your handset for 16 hours before you can use it.

Location


You need to place your BT Synergy 3205 SMS within 2 metres of a mains power and telephone socket so that the cables will reach.

Make sure it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference.

Your BT Synergy 3205 SMS works by sending radio signals between the handset and base. The strength of the signal depends on where you site the base. Putting it as high as possible ensures the best signal.


Setting up


1. Plug the mains power cable into the base. Use the power supply with the clear plastic end.



The green Power/In use light comes on.

2. Plug the telephone line cord into the base.





- 3. Insert the 2 x AAA NiMH batteries supplied. Then slide the battery compartment cover into place.
- 4. Place the handset on the base to charge for at least 16 hours. The red Charging light comes on (the red Charging light stays on even when the batteries are full charged). The handset is pre-registered to the base as SYNERGY 1. This is shown on the display. When the handset is fully charged the display shows a full battery symbol.
- 5. After 16 hours, plug one end of the telephone line cord into your BT Synergy 3205 SMS base and the other end into the telephone wall socket.

Talk/Standby time

Under ideal conditions, fully charged handset batteries should give about 12 hours talk time or 300 hours standby time on a single charge.

Your BT Synergy 3205 SMS is now ready for use.

BATTERY LOW WARNING

If the handset battery symbol is empty and flashing, and you hear a warning beep every minute, you will need to recharge your handset before you can use it.

Battery performance

To keep your batteries in the best condition, leave the handset off the base for a few hours at a time (after the initial 16 hour charge).

New NiMH batteries do not reach full capacity until they have been in normal use for several days.

Running the batteries right down at least once a week will help them last as long as possible.

The charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out, so reducing the talk' standby time of the handset. Eventually they will need to be replaced. New batteries can be obtained from the BT Synergy Helpline 0870 605 8047.

Under no circumstances should non-rechargeable batteries be used. Use only approved Nickel Metal Hydride batteries (NiMH) size AAA capacity 550mAL 1.2V. Using unapproved batteries will invalidate your guarantee and may damage the telephone


Range indicator

The \forall symbol on your handset display indicates when you are in range of the base. If the symbol flashes and you hear a warning beep, you are out of range and will need to move closer to the base.







Navigating the menus

Your BT Synergy 3205 SMS handset has a menu system which is easy to use. Each menu has a list of options, which you can see on the menu map on the following page.

When the handset is switched on and in standby:

- Press to view the sub-menus for the displayed menu, then use and to select further menu options and to confirm any settings.

For example to change the handset ringer volume:


- 1. Scroll to HANDSET scroll to RING VOL .
- 2. Scroll \triangle and ∇ to select volume \bigcirc to confirm.

Exit or go back one level in the menu

Press **and hold** to return to standby.

If no buttons are pressed for 15 seconds, the handset reverts to standby automatically.

Using the phone

When the handset is off and it is placed back on the base it will switch back on automatically.

If you make a mistake when preparatory dialling, press to delete.

Call timer

The display shows the duration of all external calls, both during the call and for a few seconds after you hang up.

Caller Display

If you have subscribed to your network's Caller Display service, the caller's number (and name if stored in the phone book) is displayed. See page 32 for more information.

Switch handset on/off

1. Press *and hold* to switch the handset off.

Or

Press button to switch the handset on.

Make an external call

1. Press then dial the number you want.

Preparatory dialling

Preparatory dialling allows you to enter the number before pressing the button. You can correct any mistakes before you actually make the call.

- 1. Enter the number to be dialled.
- 2. Press to dial the number.

End a call

1. Press or place the handset back on the base.

Receiving calls

When the phone rings, the display shows EXTERNAL CALL and the **EXT** symbol flashes.

 Press or if the handset is on the base, simply lift it up and speak.

Earpiece volume

During a call:

1. Press \triangle or ∇ to select volume 1 to 5.

In standby:

- 2. Press **⊘** then **▽** to display EAR VOL.
- 3. Press \bigcirc then \triangle or ∇ to select volume 1 to 5.
- 4. Press ot to confirm.
- 5. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

To switch back to the handset at any time, press
again.

During a handsfree call, press △ or ▼ to change the volume.

The **■** icon is displayed when handsfree is switched on.

Handsfree

Handsfree lets you talk to your caller without holding the handset. It also enables other people in the room to listen to your conversation over the loudspeaker.

Make a call in handsfree

- 1. Dial the number then press •••.
- 2. Press to end the call.

Answer a call in handsfree

When the phone rings:

1. Press and the call is transferred to the loudspeaker.

Switch to handsfree during a call

During a call:

- 1. Press . The call is transferred to the loudspeaker.
- 2. Press to end the call.

Redial

The last 5 numbers called are stored in the redial list for quick and easy redialling. The name will be displayed instead of the number, if a name/number match is found in the phonebook (see page 18). The most recent number will be shown first.

To dial a number from the redial list

- 1. Press **\Delta** *repeatedly* to display and scroll through the redial list.
- 2. With the number you want displayed, press 🔊 to dial.

Secrecy

Use secrecy during a call to mute your voice so that you can talk to someone nearby without your caller hearing you.

- Press , SECRECY ON is displayed. Your caller cannot hear you now.
- 2. Press 🗞 *again* to return to your caller.

Any number entered during a call after a • or • will not be stored in the redial list.

Paging calls cannot be answered by a handset.

Entering namesUse the keypad letters to enter names, e.g. to store TOM:

Press **8** once to enter T.

Press **6** three times to enter 0.

Press **6** once to enter M.

Writing tips

If you make a mistake, press to delete the last character or digit.

Press **1** *once* to insert a space, or *twice* to insert a hyphen (-). Press *three* times to enter 1.

Paging

You can alert handset users that they are wanted or locate a missing handset.

- 1. Press on the base. The handsets will ring and the displays will show Paging.
- 2. Press Page to stop the paging ring

Or

Press any button on the handset.

Phonebook

You can store up to 40 names and numbers in the Phonebook. Names can be up to 8 characters long and numbers up to 20 digits.

Store a name and number

- 1. Press 🕜 .
- 2. Press **▼** to scroll to Ed. Phonebook and press **⋄**.
- 3. Press oto select Add Entry.
- NAME is displayed. Use the keypad to enter a name (8 characters max).

5. Press . NUMBER is displayed, enter the telephone number and press . Display will show Stored.

Now either press to enter another entry or press and hold to return to standby.

Dial from the phonebook

- 1. Press 🕖.
- 2. Press **▼** to scroll to Phonebook and press **⊘**.
- Press △ or ▼ to scroll to the entry you want.
 Or

To search alphabetically, enter the first letter of the name you want, e.g. for Tom, press 3 to search for names beginning with T.

4. Press to dial.

Edit an entry

- 1. Press 🕜.
- 2. Press **▼** to scroll to Ed.Phonebook and press **⊘**.
- 3. Press **▼** to scroll to Edit Entry and press **⊘**.
- Press △ or ▼ to scroll to the entry you want to edit and press ✔.

Phonebook with Caller Display If you subscribe to a Caller Display service, and want the names in your Phonebook displayed instead of the phone numbers, you must store the full telephone number including the full dialling code.

Insert a 'pause' in a stored number

You may need to enter a pause when storing international numbers, charge card numbers or if you connect your telephone to a switchboard. (For more information on use with a switchboard, see page 65)

When storing a number, at the point you want to insert a pause, press and hold **\Delta** until P is displayed.

You may enter as many pauses as required.

If you want phonebook entries to be recognised by Caller Display and to display the name of the person calling then you must enter the full telephone number including dialling code.

 Edit the name, using to delete characters and the keypad to enter new ones then press .

The number is displayed.

- 6. Edit the number, using 🗞 to delete digits and the keypad to enter new ones then press 🕜.
- 7. Press *and hold* **3** to return to standby.

Delete entries

- 1. Press 🕖.
- 2. Press **▼** to scroll to Ed.Phonebook and press **⊘**.
- 3. Press ▼ to scroll to Delete Entry? and press ✔.
- 4. Press △ or ▼ to scroll to the name of the entry you want to delete and press ✔.
- 5. The number for the entry is displayed and Delete Entry?, press again to confirm.
- 6. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Baby call

Baby call allows you to enter a telephone number which can be used as an emergency quick dial number. When baby call is switched on, you can press any button on the handset (except) and your baby call telephone number will be automatically dialled.

This could be used, for example by a babysitter.

To set your baby call telephone number

- 1. Press 🕖.
- 2. Press **▼** to scroll to Babycall and press **⊘**.
- 3. Press ▼ to scroll to Number and press ✔.
- 4. Enter the telephone number and press .
- 5. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

To switch baby call on

- 1. Press 🕖.
- 2. Press **▼** to scroll to Babycall and press **⊘**.

To switch baby call off

- 1. Press **wice**.
- 2. Press ▲ to scroll to Off.
- 3. Press 🕖.

Room monitor mode

If you have at least two handsets registered to your BT Synergy 3205 SMS base station you can leave one handset in a room and monitor the noise by making an internal call to the handset.

This could be used, for example in a child's bedroom.

To switch room monitor on or off

- 1. Press 🕖.
- 2. Press lacktriangledown to scroll to Monitor mode and press $oldsymbol{\mathscr{O}}$.

To use room monitor

- 1. Enter the handset number of the handset you want to monitor the room.
- 2. Press *and hold* the R button.

To exit monitor mode, press 🔊.

Handset settings

If you have subscribed to your network provider's Caller Display Service, the date and time is set automatically when your BT Synergy 3205 SMS receives its first call. When new handsets are registered to the base, they will also receive the current date and time.

If the base station power is cut, the date and time is saved on the handset.

You can also adjust the date and time automatically.

Set time and date

- Press

 and then

 to display Setup and press

 again.
- Press to select Time Setting. Display shows the date setting.
- 3. Enter the day and month, e.g. 17 June = 17 06 and press .
- 4. Display shows the time setting. Enter the time using the 24 hour clock, e.g. 4.30pm = 16.30 and press .

Keypad and warning beeps

When you press a button on your handset, you hear a beep. You can switch the beeps on and off.

- 2. Press . Display shows Warning Tones, press again.
- Press ☐ or ▼ to select either Keypress, Low Battery or Out of range and press
- 4. Press △ or ▼ to select 0n or 0ff and press ⊘.
- 5. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Ringer volume

Select from volumes 1 to 5 or turn the ringer off completely if you do not want to be disturbed.

- 1. Press \bigcirc then \bigcirc to display Handset Menu.
- Press then to display Rins Vol then press
 The current ring volume is displayed and played.
- Press △ or ▼ to select Volume 1 to 5 or Vol Off
 (you will hear a sample ring) and press
 to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

External/Internal ringer melody

You can set different melodies for internal and external calls. There are 5 melodies to choose from.

- 1. Press then to display Handset Menu and press again.
- Press
 ▼ to display either Int. Melody or Ext. Melody and press .

The current ringer melody is displayed and played.

- 3. Press △ or ▼ to select the melody you want (you will hear a sample melody) and press ✔ to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

26 Handset settings

Keypad lock

Lock the keypad to prevent numbers from being accidentally dialled while carrying the handset around.

- 1. Press 🕖.
- 2. Press **▼** to display Keypad Lock and press **⊘**.
- 3. Press ∇ to select 0n and press .

To unlock the keypad again:

- 1. Press **wice**.
- 2. Press △ to select Off and press ◆.

Auto talk

When the handset is on the base, you can answer a call just by picking it up. When auto talk is switched off, you will always have to press to answer a call. The default setting is On.

- 2. Press ∇ to scroll to Auto Answer and press .
- 3. Press △ or ▼ to select 0n or 0ff and press ✔ to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Name a handset

The handset name is pre-set to SYNERGY. You can personalise each handset to the name you want, using up to a maximum of 8 characters.

- 2. Press **▼** to scroll to Handset Name and press **ℯ**.
- Press to delete the current name and then use the keypad to enter a new name and press to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Language

You can change the language used on the handset display. Choose from English, Francais, Deutsch, Italiano or Espanol.

- 1. Press then to display Handset Menu and press again.
- 2. Press **▼** to scroll to Language and press **⊘**.
- 3. Press △ or ▼ to scroll and display the language you want and press ✔ to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Use the button to correct any mistakes.

To return the handset to English:

- Press then six times.
 Press then seven times.
- 3. Press

 then

 or

 until ENGLISH is displayed and press

 to confirm.

Base settings

Ringer volume

Select from volumes 1 to 5 or turn the ringer off completely if you do not want to be disturbed.

- 1. Press **⊘** then **▽** to display Setup.
- 2. Press . The display shows Base Volume, press .
- 3. Press △ or ▼ to select Volume 1 to 5 or Volume Off (you will hear a sample ring) and press ✔ to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Ringer melody

Choose from 5 base ringer melodies.

- 1. Press **⊘** then **▽** to display Setup.
- 2. Press then to display Base Melody and press . .
- 3. Press △ or ▼ to select Melody 1 to 5 (you will hear a sample ring) and press ✔ to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Select a base

If a handset it registered to more than one base, you can select which one it will use. (For more information on registering your handset to another base, see page 35.)

- 1. Press **⊘** then **▼** to display Setup.
- 2. Press \bigcirc then \bigcirc to display Select Base and press \bigcirc .
- 3. Press △ or ▼ to select BASE 1 to 4 or AUTO and press
 to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Change base PIN

- 1. Press **⊘** then **▼** to display Setup.
- 2. Press then to display PIN Code and press . Display shows PIN Code?
- 3. Enter your 4-digit PIN then press . Display shows NEW Code?
- 4. Enter a new PIN and press . Display shows Confirm Code.
- 5. Enter the new PIN again to confirm and press .
- 6. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

IMPORTANT

If you change the base PIN, keep a record of new number by writing in the space provided on page 67. You need your base PIN for registering handsets and for some other optional settings.

The original PIN setting is 0000.

30 Base settings

If you reset your phone you will delete any Phonebook, Redial and Calls list entries.

Default settings

You can reset your BT Synergy 3205 SMS to its original/default settings. $\label{eq:synergy}$

- 1. Press \bigcirc then \bigcirc to display Setup.
- Press then to display Default and press .
 Display shows PIN?
- 3. Enter the 4-digit base PIN and press .

The display flashes BASE $\,1$ and then SYNERGY 1.

Your BT Synergy 3205 is now reset to its default settings.

Caller Display and Call Waiting

IMPORTANT

To use Caller Display and Call Waiting you must first subscribe to the service from your network provider. A quarterly fee is payable.

Caller information not available

Occasionally the telephone number of the caller is not available and cannot therefore be displayed.

In this case, your display will show one of the following explanatory messages:

WITHHELD - caller has withheld their number

LINAVATI A - the network is unable to send the number

RINGBACK – following a ringback request

OPERATOR - call is via the operator

PAYPHONE - call is from a payphone

INTERNAT - call is from an international number

Ensure that you store the full telephone number, including the area code, otherwise the name will not match the number stored in the phonebook.

Caller Display

If you subscribe to a Caller Display service you can see the caller's number on the handset display (unless it has been withheld) before you answer the call. If your BT Synergy 3205 SMS finds a name/number match in your handset phonebook, the name will be displayed as well.

Missed calls list

If you have missed an incoming call the caller's details are stored in the calls list.

When you have new entries in the calls list the ?? icon will flash in the handset display.

Up to 20 names/numbers can be stored in the missed calls list. When the calls list is full, a new call replaces the oldest call.

View the calls list

1. Press **▼** to open the calls list then scroll **△** or **▼** through the list.

If a name/number match is found in the phonebook, the caller's name will be displayed with the telephone number and time and date of the call.

2. Press and hold to return to standby.

Dial a calls list number

- Press
 ▼ to open the calls list then scroll or to the entry you want.
- 2. Press to dial the number.

Copy a number to the phonebook

- Press
 ▼ to open the calls list then scroll or to the entry you want and press .
- 2. Display shows Add Entry and Delete. Press . Display shows Name.
- Enter the name (of up to 8 characters) and press to confirm.
- 4. Press **and hold** to return to standby.

Delete an entry

- 1. Press **▼** to open the calls list then scroll **△** or **▼** to the entry you want and press **⊘**.
- Press to return to the calls list or press and hold to return to standby.

See page 18 for details on how to enter a name.

Caller Display and Call Waiting

IMPORTANT

To use Call Waiting you must first subscribe to the service from your network provider. A quarterly fee is payable.

You can use to switch back and forth between the two calls without disconnecting either.

The second caller is only charged for their call from the moment you answer, not while they are waiting for your initial contact.

Call Waiting

If an incoming call arrives while you are already on the phone, you will hear a soft beep every 5 seconds. This beep is not audible to the person you are speaking to. The second caller's number (and name if stored in the phonebook) will appear on the handset display.

Instead of the engaged tone, the second caller will hear an announcement to hold on as you know they are waiting.

Accept a Call Waiting call

If, during a call, you hear the call waiting beep:

- 1. Press to put your current call on hold and speak to the second caller.
- 2. Press again to return to your first caller.

To end the first call and take the second call:

- 1. When speaking to the first caller, press to end that call.
- 2. Your handset will ring, press **again** to connect to the waiting caller.

Up to 5 handsets can be registered and operated from any one BT Synergy 3205 SMS base.

With additional handsets, you can make internal calls between two handsets while a third is making an external call.



Each handset can be registered on up to 4 bases.

Register handset to base

Make sure the handset is close to the base.

At the base:

 Press and hold page until you hear two beeps (after about 10 seconds) then release.

At the handset:



Each additional handset you buy must be registered with the base.

Remember to charge the batteries of new handsets for at least 16 hours before use. If the display is flashing Not Resistered and Υ your handset is not yet registered with the base.

Your handset is supplied pre-registered as Handset 1 to its base (Base 1).

36 Additional handsets & bases

If the handset does not find the base, it will return to the previous menu. If this happens, try registering again using a different base number. Make sure you are close to the base.

You cannot de-register the handset you are using.

The display shows Base 1-4. There will be a \checkmark to indicate to other bases that the handset is already registered.

3. Enter 1 - 4 for the base you want to register to, followed by your base PIN (original setting 0000) then press .




