

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

## **About this Manual**

For easy reference, names of all functions and/or components on the hardware and accessories are denoted by upper-case letters.



**1.POWER ON/OFF button -** Turns the AM-828 on or off. When the POWER is ON, indicator lights on the front panel illuminate.

2.AUX INPUT jacks (VIDEO/L/R)- RCA video and audio input for auxiliary source. 3.BALANCE knob- Pans the music output to the stereo left and right channels. Turn counter-clockwise to gradually pan to the stereo left channel. Turn clockwise to gradually pan to the stereo right channel. Center the knob for equal output from both stereo left and right channels. (Please note: the microphone inputs will NOT be affected)

**4.MUSIĆ TREBLE control-** Adjusts the high frequency setting for DVD/AUX/USB/BGM inputs. Turn counter-clockwise to decrease and clockwise to increase.

**5.MUSIC BASS control-** Adjusts the low frequency setting for DVD/AUX/USB/BGM inputs. Turn counter-clockwise to decrease and clockwise to increase.

**6.DELAY control-** Adjusts the delay time interval (frequency of ECHO) on the echo effect for the microphone channels. Turn counter-clockwise for a shorter delay time and clockwise for a longer delay time.

**7.ECHO control -** Adjusts the intensity (loudness of ECHO) of the echo effect for the microphone channels. Turn counter-clockwise to decrease intensity and clockwise to increase intensity.

**8.REPEAT control -** Adjusts the ECHO decay time (number of ECHO) of the echo effect for the microphone channels. Turn counter-clockwise to decrease decay time and clockwise to increase decay time.

**9.MIC TREBLE control-** Adjusts the high frequency setting for MICROPHONE INPUTS. Turn counter-clockwise to decrease and clockwise to increase.

**10.MIC BASS control-** Adjusts the low frequency setting for MICROPHONE INPUTS. Turn counter-clockwise to decrease and clockwise to increase.

**11.12.13. MIC VOL control (1, 2, 3)-** Independently adjusts the signal volume of each corresponding MICROPHONE INPUT. Turn counter-clockwise to decrease volume and clockwise to increase volume.


15.16.17. MIC INPUT jacks (1, 2, 3) -1/4 inch inputs for microphones.

14. HEADPHONE jack -1/8 inch output for headphones.

**18. MIC MASTER VOL control -**Adjusts the overall volume output for all three microphone channels, collectively. Turn counter-clockwise to decrease volume and clock-wise to increase volume.

**19. MUSIC VOL control -**Adjusts the volume output for the selected music channels. Turn counter-clockwise to decrease volume and clock-wise to increase volume.

## Front Pannel Function and Operation



**1.DVD button-** Selects the external source connected to the DVD INPUT. Corresponding indicator light will illuminate when selected.

**2.AUX button-** Selects the external source connected to the AUX INPUT. Corresponding indicator light will illuminate when selected.

**3.USB button-** Selects the external source connected to the PC CONNECTION.

Corresponding indicator light will illuminate when selected.

**4.BGM button-** Selects the external source connected to the BGM INPUT. Corresponding indicator light will illuminate when selected.

**5.AUTO button -**Sets the input source selection to automatic mode. In this mode input selection defaults to the external source currently/last powered on.

**6.MUTE button -**Mutes all output signal from the selected input source. When muted, the indicator light for the currently selected input source (i.e. DVD) will flash. (Please note: the microphone inputs will NOT be affected)

7.L button (left) -Switches output signal to left channel only.

8.STEREO button- Switches output signal to both left and right channels (default).

**9.R button (right)-** Switches output signal to right channel only. Select this for vocal removal on Multiplex\* song sources.

**10. BBE button-**Toggles BBE\*\* on or off. Turning BBE ON helps to aesthetically enhance the output signal. Turning it OFF reverts the output signal back to its original characteristics. (see below for more detailed description of BBE\*\*)

**11. VOCAL PARTNER button-** Toggles on/off VOCAL PARTNER mode. When in this mode, lead vocals are heard until the microphone inputs detect singing, at which point they are removed. When live singing stops, the lead vocals return.

**12. VOCAL CANCEL button-**Toggles on/off VOCAL CANCEL mode. When in this mode, lead vocals are removed from the output signal.

13. FLAT button (b)-lowers music key by one half-tone.

14. NATURAL button (+) - resets music to original key.


15. SHARP button (#)- raises music key by one half-tone.

16. KEY MODE display- Indicates the current key in terms of half tones in relation to the original key of song source. Pressing the NATURAL button resets the display to zero.
17. AUDIO SIGNAL METER- Displays the left and right audio signal strength from the selected input source, measured in decibels (db). The louder the audio signal, the higher the decibels.

\* **Multiplex-**refers to karaoke music designed to allow lead vocals to be turned on/off by isolating them to just the left channel.

\*\* **BBE-** refers to BBE company's patented Sonic Maximizer technology. It is a sound enhancement technology designed to eliminate undesirable phase shifting between high and low frequencies, increasing sound clarity and transparency. It also boosts the very high and low frequencies for added brilliance and richness.

## Rear Panel Function and Operation



1.MIC INPUT jacks (1, 2, 3)- 1/4 inch inputs for microphones.

**2.AUDIO/VIDEO OUTPUT** - jacks (2 sets) Each row consists of a complete set of AUDIO LEFT, AUDIO RIGHT, VIDEO, S-VIDEO, and RGB VIDEO outputs:

**a.MR-**AUDIO RIGHT RCA output. Connect to the audio right input on an external component.

**b.ML-** AUDIO LEFT RCA output. Connect to the audio left input on an external component. **c.VIDEO -**VIDEO RCA output. Connect to the video input on an external component.

**d.S-VIDEO** -S-VIDEO (Y/C) output. Connect to the S-VIDEO input on an external component.

**e.RGB-** RED, GREEN, BLUE component video RCA outputs. Connect to the red, green and blue component video inputs, respectively, on an external component.

**3.AUDIO/VIDEO INPUT jacks (BGM, DVD)** -Each row consists of a complete set of AUDIO LEFT, AUDIO RIGHT, VIDEO, S-VIDEO, and RGB VIDEO inputs. The top row is designated as the BGM input, and the bottom row as the DVD input:

**a.MR-**AUDIO RIGHT RCA input. Connect to the audio right output from an external component.

**b.ML-** AUDIO LEFT RCA input. Connect to the audio left output from an external component.

**c.VIDEO-** VIDEO RCA input. Connect to the video output from an external component. **d.S-VIDEO-** S-VIDEO (Y/C) input. Connect to an S-VIDEO output from an external component.

**e.RGB-** RED, GREEN, BLUE component video RCA inputs. Connect to the red, green and blue component video outputs, respectively, from an external component.

**4.EQ L/R INPUT and OUTPUT jacks -** For external equalizer connection. Utilize to send and return AM-828 input signal to and from an external equalizer for further signal processing. (Please see connection diagram on page 8 for proper configuration)

**5.PC CONNECTION** -USB connection used to interface with computer-based devices.

6.VIDEO INPUT- additional VIDEO RCA input.


7.AC inlet -Male inlet for alternate current adapter.

8.AC outlet -Female outlet for alternate current adapter.

**9.AC 115/230V SELECT-** Supply voltage selection switch. Push the switch down for 115V, and up for 230V. (Note: different regions of the world use different voltage strength. Please check to make sure the correct voltage is selected for your area.)

**10.SPEAKER SYSTEM**- Provides audio output to stereo external speakers. Designed to be used with bare speaker wire as well as banana connectors. The LEFT and RIGHT outputs each consist of a positive (+, red) and negative (-, black) signal that correspond with the inputs on each speaker. (Please see connection diagram on page 8 for proper configuration)

## Remote Control:



**1.AUTO button-** Sets the input source selection to automatic mode.

**2.MUTE button-** Mutes all output signal from the selected input source.

#### 3.Manual Input Source Selection:

**1.DVD button -**Selects the external source connected to the DVD INPUT.

**2.AUX button -**Selects the external source connected to the AUX INPUT.

**3.USB button -**Selects the external source connected to the PC CONNECTION.

**4.BGM button -**Selects the external source connected to the BGM INPUT.

**4.VOCAL PARTNER button-** Toggles on/off VOCAL PARTNER mode.

**5.VOCAL CANCEL button-** Toggles on/off VOCAL CANCEL mode.

### 6.L/R/Stereo:

**1.L button (left)-** Switches output signal to left channel only.

**2.STEREO button-** Switches output signal to both left and right channels (default).

**3.R button (right)-** Switches output signal to right channel only.

### 7.KEY CONTROL:

**1.FLAT button (b)-** lowers music key by one half-tone.

2.NATURAL button (4)- resets music to original key.

**3.SHARP button (#)-** raises music key by one half-tone.

8.BBE ON/OFF buttons- Turns BBE on or off.

**9.MUSIC VOL +/- buttons-** Increase or decrease the music output volume.


**10. MIC VOL +/- buttons-** Increase or decrease the microphone master output volume.

Make sure all power is disconnected from each component before connecting. Plug all cables and cords securely to prevent unwanted noise.





## General Operation

Make sure all external components (players, speakers, microphones) are connected before you turn on the AM-828. See page 9,10 for connection information.

#### Powering On/Off:

Press **POWER button** on the front panel. There is no power button on the remote control. When the POWER is turned ON, indicator lights on the front panel illuminate. Press the

POWER button again to turn OFF.



#### **Selecting Desired Input Source:**

In order for external video and audio sources to play, the correct input source must be selected. From the front panel, press one of the four buttons in the INPUT SELECTOR section:


-DVD button selects the source connected to DVD INPUT on the rear panel.

-AUX button selects the source connected to AUX INPUT on the front panel.

-USB button selects the source connected to PC CONNECTION on the rear panel.

-BGM button selects the source connected to BGM INPUT on the rear panel.


Press **AUTO button** to set the input source selection to automatic mode. In this mode input selection defaults to the external source currently/last powered on.



#### Muting:

To mute all music, press the MUTE button on the front panel or remote control. Press the MUTE button again to un-mute.

To play only the left channel of input source, press the LEFT button. To play only the right channel of input source, press the RIGHT button. Press the STEREO button to return output to both LEFT and RIGHT channels.



## General Operation



### <u>Music Controls :</u>

Use **MUSIC VOL control** to adjust the overall volume of music. Stereo left-right panning can be adjusted with **BALANCE control**. Use **MUSIC TREBLE control** and MUSIC BASS control to adjust high and low frequency characteristics of the music.

**BBE** - BBE is a sound enhancement technology designed to eliminate undesirable phase shifting between high and low frequencies, increasing sound clarity and transparency. It also boosts the very high and low frequencies for added brilliance and richness. To turn BBE ON, press the BBE button and the BBE indicator light should illuminate. Press the BBE button again to turn BBE OFF.



### Microphone Controls :

Use **MIC MASTER VOL control** to collectively adjust the overall volume output for all three microphone channels. Individual microphone volume can be adjusted using the **MIC 1 VOL**, **MIC 2 VOL**, and **MIC 3 VOL controls**. To adjust overall microphone high and low frequency characteristics, use MIC TREBLE control and MIC BASS control.

Use **DELAY control, ECHO control and REPEAT control** to make microphone echo effect adjustments.

**DÉLAY control**- Adjusts the delay time interval (frequency of ECHO) on the echo effect for the microphone channels. Turn counter-clockwise for a shorter delay time and clockwise for a longer delay time.

**ECHO control**- Adjusts the intensity (loudness of ECHO) of the echo effect for the microphone channels. Turn counter-clockwise to decrease intensity and clockwise to increase intensity.

**REPEAT control** - Adjusts the ECHO decay time (number of ECHO) of the echo effect for the microphone channels. Turn counter-clockwise to decrease decay time and clockwise to increase decay time.

### Karaoke Related Features:



The **VOCAL PARTNER** and **VOCAL CANCEL features** can be used to suit your karaoke preferences:

**VOCAL PARTNER button-** Toggles on/off VOCAL PARTNER mode. When in this mode, lead vocals are heard until the microphone inputs detect singing, at which point they are removed. When live singing stops, the lead vocals return.

**VOCAL CANCEL button-** Toggles on/off VOCAL CANCEL mode. When in this mode, up to 90% lead vocals are removed from the output signal.

The **KEY CONTROL feature** allows for source input music to be raised or lowered in half-tone increments to suit your vocal range.

**FLAT button (b)** lowers music key by one half-tone.

NATURAL button (4) resets music to original key.

SHARP button (#) raises music key by one half-tone.

When key control adjustments are made, changes will be reflected in the KEY MODE DISPLAY above the buttons. 12

Symptom	Possible Causes	Solution
Will not turn on	AC power adapter cord is incorrectly attached or not plugged into outlet	Check both the AC adapter connection as well as the AC outlet connection.
	Incorrect input source selected	Check to make sure the correct corresponding button is pressed on the input selector in relation to your audio source.
	MUTE button is ON, or MUSIC VOL control is down	Press the MUTE button once or check to see if MUSIC VOL control is all the way down. If so, turn the knob slowly clockwise.
	Poor or incorrect output connection to speakers or other external units, or bad/defective cables, wires or connectors	Double check all output connections to speakers or other units. Try using another set of cables/cords. Make sure to turn POWER OFF before reconnecting cables.
No audio can be heard, audio signal meter DOES NOT show signal	Poor or incorrect input connection from audio source unit, or bad/defective cables, wires or connectors	Double check all input connections from audio source units. Try using another set of cables/cords. Make sure to turn POWER OFF before reconnecting cables.
No microphone signal can be heard	Microphone controls are turned down	Check MIC MASTER VOL and all MIC VOL controls to see if they are turned down. If so, turn the knob slowly clockwise.
	Poor or incorrect input connection from microphone, or bad/defective cables, wires or connectors.	Double check all microphone connections. Try using another cable/cord. Make sure to turn MIC MASTER VOL down before reconnecting cables.
Music sounds hollow or distant	VOCAL CANCEL button is ON	If you do not want to eliminate vocals from the source, press the VOCAL CANCEL button once to return music to original characteristics.
No vocals present in source that normally contains vocals	VOCAL CANCEL button is ON, or RIGHT channel button selected on a multiplex* source	Press the VOCAL CANCEL button once, or press the STEREO button once.
Unpleasant howling and screeching heard from speakers	Microphone feedback	Place microphones further away from speakers. Face microphones away from speakers.
Remote control not functioning	Batteries are exhausted or positioned incorrectly	Replace with fresh batteries or double check battery positioning.
	Remote is out of range or there is an obstruction	Move closer to the AM-828 or make sure no objects are obstructing your view of the unit.
