### • RF Exposure

### General Statement on RF energy

Your phone contains a transmitter and a receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your phone transmits.

### Specific Absorption Rate (SAR)

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organisation ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to ensure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg and the highest SAR value for this device when tested at the ear was 0.623 W/kg <sup>(1)</sup>. As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body as described in this user guide.

As SAR is measured utilising the device's highest transmitting power, the actual SAR of this device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to automatic changes to the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum power required to communicate with the network.

### Body worn operation

Important safety information regarding radiofrequency radiation (RF) exposure.

To ensure compliance with RF exposure guidelines the phone must be used with a minimum of 1.5 cm separation from the body.

Failure to observe these instructions could result in your RF exposure exceeding the relevant guideline limits.

"The highest SAR value for this mobile phone when tested for use at the body and compliance against the standard is 0.955 W/kg. While there may be differences between the SAR levels on various phones and at various positions, they all meet the relevant International guidelines and EU requirements for RF (radio-waves) exposure"

### Limiting exposure to radio frequency (RF) fields

For individuals concerned about limiting their exposure to RF fields, the World Health Organisation (WHO) provides the following advice:

Precautionary measures: Present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for the use of mobile phones. If individuals are concerned, they might choose to limit their own or their children's RF exposure by limiting the length of calls, or using 'hands-free' devices to keep mobile phones away from the head and body.

### Distraction

#### Driving

- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to open flames or lit tobacco products.

### Accessories

Use only approved accessories.

Do not connect with incompatible products or accessories.

Take care not to touch or allow metal objects, such as coins or key rings, to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.

### Connection to a Car

Seek professional advice when connecting a phone interface to the vehicle's electrical system.

### Faulty and Damaged Products

Do not attempt to disassemble the phone or its accessories.

Only qualified personnel must service or repair the phone or its accessories.

If your phone or its accessories have been submerged in water, punctured, or subjected to a severe fall, do not use them until you have taken it to be checked at an authorised service centre.

### Battery Handling & Safety

### • Interference

### General statement on interference

Care must be taken when using the phone in close proximity to personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids.

### **Hearing Aids**

People with hearing aids or other cochlear implants may experience interference noises when using wireless devices or when one is nearby. The level of interference will depend on the type of hearing device and the distance from the interference source, increasing the separation between them may reduce the interference. ### Medical devices

### Hospitals

## Charging the battery (1)



Connect the battery charger to your phone and mains socket respectively.

## Set up the SOS key

A long press on the SOS key will bring up an SOS setup wizard, please follow the wizard to define your SOS contacts and SOS messages.

Once you have defined your SOS contacts, a long press on the SOS key will cause your phone to emit a loud alert sound, send out help messages and call your defined SOS contacts. When the call is connected with your SOS contact, the loud alert sound will stop and you will be able to communicate with your SOS contact with the loud speaker on (hands-free mode). This is for you to use when you are in an emergency situation. To stop the SOS processing, please press the SOS key again.

We suggest that you define your close contacts as SOS contacts, or if necessary, choose your local emergency telephone number. For your local emergency telephone number, please check the regulations for your own country.

## 3 Calls.....

## 3.1 Making a call

Dial the desired number then press the  $\$  key to place the call. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the  $\_$ <sup> $\circ$ </sup> key.

To hang up the call, press the  $\_$ <sup> $\circ$ </sup> key.

## Making an emergency call

If your phone is covered by the network, dial emergency number and press the <u>key</u> to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code or unlocking the keypad.

## 3.2 Calling your voicemail <sup>(1)</sup>

To access your voicemail, hold down the loo key.

#### Receiving a call 3.3

When you receive an incoming call, press the  $\$  key to talk and then hang up using the  $\stackrel{\circ}{\longrightarrow}$  key.

To use the hands-free option, please press  $\bigcup$  during the call.

## 6 Messaging .....

## 6.1 Create message

From the main menu select "**Messaging**" to create a text message.

While writing a message, select "**Options**" to access all the messaging options.

You can type a message, or you're also able to insert a pre-defined message from "**Templates**".

You can save any messages that you send often to "Drafts".



Specific letters (with accents) will increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

## 7 Settings...... O

From the main menu, select the menu icon O and select the function of your choice in order to customize your telephone: Sound, Phone settings, Network, Call settings, Security, Restore default set.

## 7.1 Sound

With this menu, you can personalize ringtones for different events and environments.

## 7.2 Phone settings

You can set **Time and date**, **Display**, **Speed dial**, **Languages**, **Input mode** according to your choice.

## • Speed dial settings

Access "**Speed dial**" from "**Settings**\**Phone settings**", Select #", " $\stackrel{\text{\tiny M}}{\rightarrow}$  or any number key from  $2_{\text{\tiny ABC}}$  to  $9_{\text{\tiny WXYZ}}$  to set the speed dial key, add the contact number and press  $\stackrel{\text{\tiny OK}}{\rightarrow}$ .

## 7.3 Call settings

You can access a number of items with this option: My number, Billing, Call waiting, Call forwarding, Call barring, Caller ID, Auto redial, Noise cancellation.

## Noise cancellation

With this feature, others can hear you clearly even when you're in a noisy environment. We suggest that you keep it on permanently.

# 8 Tools.....

## 8.1 Voice reminder

Just record a reminder using your voice, then you will be reminded by hearing your message played back at the time/date you choose!

## To Set-Up A Voice Reminder

 Access this feature from the main menu by selecting "Tools\Voice reminder"

- 2. Select "Create" and press "OK"
- 3. Press "Start" to record the message
- 4. Press "**Stop**" to save the message (do not exceed 30 seconds)

## 8.2 SOS

When enter in SOS from main menu, press or will pop up help information.

## 8.2.1 SOS contacts

To add an SOS number to your SOS contacts, please Select "Tools\SOS\SOS contacts\No contact" and press "Edit", then you can edit your SOS numbers (4 numbers can be defined).

## 8.2.2 SOS message

From the main menu select "**SOS message**" to create an SOS message.

### 8.2.3 Activated

Press the \_\_\_\_\_ switch On/Off to activate the default SOS function.

## 8.3 FM Radio

Your phone comes with a radio<sup>(1)</sup> which support RDS, with an embedded FM internal antenna so you can listen to FM broadcasts without inserting headphones. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information relating to the radio programme on the display if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service. You can listen to it while running other applications.

<sup>(1)</sup> The quality of the radio depends on the coverage of the radio station in that particular area.

## 8.4 Alarm

Your mobile phone has a built-in alarm clock with a snooze feature.

- Select 💼 and then access **Alarm** to set the time and date.
- When the alarm rings, you can choose stop or snooze. If snooze is chosen, it will ring again 4 minutes later.

## 8.5 Calculator

Enter a number, select the type of operation to be performed by using the up or down key, and enter the second number. Then press Equal to display the result.

## 8.6 Games

Your phone may include some games. It allows you to manage settings, in which you may set Audio and Vibration.

## 8.7 Services

## **M-PESA**

You may access **M-PESA** by pressing <u>in idle screen</u> or access **Service** from the main menu and select **M-PESA.** 

M-PESA is a money transfer service that allows you to send and receive money from your phone, top-up airtime, make bill payments and buy goods. Visit an authorised retailer with your identification document to register for the service. Once registered you will receive an SMS to activate your account and create your personal identification number (PIN). Keep your PIN to yourself and do not share it with anyone. When your account is live you will have access to a range of services. You can put money into your account by depositing cash at an authorised retailer in exchange for electronic money which you can send to your family and friends anywhere in your country. You can also withdraw cash from your account at retail outlets. Every transaction is secured by your PIN and is confirmed by SMS.

M-PESA is only available from Vodafone and may not be provided in all countries.

## 9 Latin input mode.....

This mode allows you to type text by choosing a letter or a sequence of characters associated with a key. Press the key several times until the desired letter is highlighted. When you release the key the highlighted character is inserted into the text.

## II Troubleshooting.....

### My phone turns off by itself

## My phone cannot charge properly

- Make sure you are using an Alcatel battery and the charger from the box
- Make sure your battery is inserted properly and clean the battery contact if it's dirty. It must be inserted before plugging in the charger

## Invalid SIM card

### The sound quality of the calls is poor

- You can adjust the volume during a call by pressing the Volume key
- Check the network strength and
- Make sure that the receiver, connector or speaker on your phone is clean

# I am unable to use the features described in the manual

- Check with your operator to make sure that your subscription includes this service
- Make sure this feature does not require an Alcatel accessory

# When I select a number from my contacts, the number cannot be dialled

- $\mbox{ \ }$  Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file
- Make sure that you have entered the country prefix when calling a foreign country

## I am unable to add a contact in my contacts

• Make sure that your SIM card contacts are not full; delete some files or save the files in the phone contacts

# My callers are unable to leave messages on my voicemail

· Contact your network operator to check service availability

### I cannot access my voicemail

- Make sure your operator's voicemail number is correctly entered in "Number"
- Try later if the network is busy

# The flickering icon is displayed on my standby screen

 You have saved too many short messages on your SIM card; delete some of them or archive them in the phone memory

## SIM card PIN locked

• Contact your network operator to obtain the PUK code (Personal Unblocking Key)

### How to make your battery last longer

- Make sure you follow the complete charge time (minimum 3 hours)
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication
- Switch on the backlight upon request
