- Access your messages remotely from any other Touchtone™ phone.
- Use Caller Display to see who is calling before you pick up the phone and keep track of incoming calls with the 40 number Calls list.\*
- Use the phonebook to store and dial up to 50 of your most frequently used phone numbers.
- Handsfree operation for greater flexibility when on the phone.

# **Getting started**


#### Location

You need to place your BT Freestyle 650 close enough to a mains power and telephone wall socket so that the cables will reach.

The strength of the handset signal depends on where you site the base. Make sure it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference. Do not place your BT Freestyle 650 in the bathroom or other humid areas.

## Setting up the base and handset

 Plug the power adaptor and telephone cable into the underside of the base. Only use the cables provided with the product.



#### Handset range

The BT Freestyle 650 has a range of 300 metres outdoors when there is a clear line of sight between the base and handset. Any obstruction between the base and handset will reduce the range significantly. With the base indoors and handset either indoors or outdoors, the range will normally be up to 50 metres. Thick stone walls can severely affect the range.

#### Signal strength

The (\*) icon on your handset indicates when you are in range. When it flashes, you are out of range.

#### **IMPORTANT**

The base station must be plugged into the mains power socket at all times.

Do not connect the telephone line to the telephone line wall socket until the handset is fully charged.

#### **Battery performance**

To keep your batteries in the best condition, leave the handset off the base for a few hours at a time.

Running the batteries right down at least once a week will help them last as long as possible.

The charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out, giving the handset less talk/standby time.


Eventually they will need to be replaced. New batteries are available from the BT Freestyle 650 Helpline on 0870 605 8047.

After charging your handset for the first time, subsequent charging time is about 6–8 hours a day. Batteries and handset may become warm during charging. This is normal.

Plug the power adaptor into the mains wall socket and switch the power on. When connected correctly, the green Power light and the red Messages light on the base will come on.

Your BT Freestyle 650 answering machine will announce, "Answer On. Hello, your call cannot be taken at the moment, please leave your message after the tone".

3. Place the battery ribbon in the base of the handset battery compartment. Insert the 2 x AAA rechargeable batteries supplied observing the polarity (+ and -) markings. Then slide the battery compartment cover into place.



4. Place the handset in the base to charge, the red charging light comes on and you will hear a beep. The icon in the display begins scrolling to indicate the battery is charging.

The  $\mathbb{1}^{\mathbb{N}}$  icon will flash while the handset searches for the base. When the handset has linked with the base the idle display will be shown:



You should charge the handset for at least 24 hours on first charge.

Once fully charged, plug the telephone line cord into the telephone wall socket.

## Set the day and time using the handset

You will need to set the day and time so that you know when each answering machine message was received.

Once a message has been played back, the machine will announce, for example, "Tuesday, four fifty, pm."

#### Set the day:

- 1. Press Menu, scroll  $\nabla$  to TAM SETTINGS and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll **v** to *DRY SETTING* and press Menu. The current day is displayed.

#### **Battery symbols**

■ Battery fully charged

■ Battery half charged

■ Battery low

#### Battery low warning

If the battery charge becomes low during a call you will hear a warning beep every minute (provided the battery warning beeps are set to on, see page 42). If the battery runs out you will be cut off. You will need to recharge the handset before using it again.

During charging, the vill scroll in the display.

#### Talk/Standby time

In ideal conditions, the handset batteries should give about 10 hours talk time or 100 hours standby on a single charge. The base must remain plugged in to the mains and switched on at all times

Note that new batteries do not reach full capacity until they have been in normal use for several days.

#### Default day and time

The default day and time is Saturday, 12.01pm. If the power to the base is lost, the date and time will revert to this default setting. Your messages will be unaffected

If you have subscribed to your network's Caller Display service, the day and time will be set on the handset automatically. However, the correct day can only be set manually, see previous page.

3. Press and to select the required day and press to confirm.

#### Set the time:

- 1. Press Menu, scroll v to DRTE-TIME and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to *CLOCK SET* and press Menu. The current time is displayed.
- 3. Use the keypad to set the required time in 24 hour format, e.g. 18-30 for 6.30pm. Press to confirm.

## Check the current day and time setting

1. Press The current day and time setting is announced.


## BT Freestyle 650 multi-pack owners only

For each additional handset:

You need to place your BT Freestyle 650 charger close enough to a mains power socket so that the cable will reach.

## Setting up the charger and additional handset

 Plug the power adaptor cable into the underside of the charger.



- 2. Plug the power adaptor into the mains wall socket and switch the power on.
- 3. Place the battery ribbon in the base of the handset battery compartment. Insert the 2 x AAA rechargeable batteries supplied observing the polarity (+ and -) markings. Then slide the battery compartment cover into place.
- 4. Place the handset in the charger and charge the handset for at least 24 hours. The red Charging light on the charger comes on and the real icon begins to scroll.

## Your BT Freestyle 650 is ready for use.

#### BT Freestyle 650 Additional Handset

Your BT Freestyle 650 handsets are the same, so instructions throughout this guide apply to both.

#### Handset numbers

Once registered with the base, each handset will display its handset number, 1 and 2 respectively.

#### Secrecy/Delete/Clear

During a call, press to stop your caller hearing you, *page 18*.

In menu mode, press to return to the previous menu or press and hold to exit and return to standby.

In enter/edit mode, press to delete characters and digits.

Use to delete Calls list and Redial list entries.

#### Talk

Press to make, receive or end a call, page 16.

#### \*/Keypad lock

Press and hold to switch key lock on, page 44.

Press any button then to switch key lock off, page 44.



#### In-use light

Comes on when you make a call. Flashes when you receive a call.

#### Menu/Select

Press to access the menu, *page 15*. Press to select menu options.

#### Phonebook

Press to access the phonebook, *page 20*.

#### Calls list /Scroll Down

From standby, press to access the Calls list, *page 22*.

During a call, press to decrease the earpiece volume, *page 18*.

While the phone is ringing, press to decrease the ringer volume, *page 18*.

Press to scroll down through display options, *page 15*.

#### Int

Use to make an internal call, page 50.


Or to transfer a call to an additional BT Freestyle 650 handset, *page 52*.





#### Navigating the menus

Your BT Freestyle 650 handset has a menu system to guide you through the handset and base options. Refer to the menu map below for the available options.


When the handset is displaying the idle screen:

- 1. Press Menu to open the main menu.
- 2. Use and to scroll through the menu list.
- 3. When the menu item you want is displayed, press to select and view the sub-menus available.

Press to exit a menu.

Keep pressing to return to the idle screen at any time.

# Using the phone

When you make a call, the In Use light on the handset comes on and the In Use light on the base flashes.

#### Dialling numbers quickly

Numbers can also be dialled in Handsfree mode (page 17), using the phonebook (page 20), and from the calls list (page 22).

When you receive a call, the In Use lights on the handset and on the hase flash.

#### Auto-answer

If you have switched auto-answer off (see page 43) then you will need to press after lifting the handset to take the call

## Switching the handset power on/off


Press *and hold* the B button.

#### Make an external call

1. Press and listen for the dial tone, then dial the number

The display shows the  $C^{EXT}$  icon.

## Preparatory dialling





2. Press to dial.

#### End a call

1. Press or place the handset back on the base.

#### Receiving calls

The base and handset will ring when receiving a call, the CEXT icon flashes and CALL is displayed.

1. Press to answer the call or, if the handset is on the base, simply lift it and speak.

If you have subscribed to your network's Caller Display service, the caller's number, or name (if an exact name/number match is found in the phonebook) will also be displayed, *See page 22* for more information.

#### **Call timer**

Your handset automatically times the duration of all calls, showing the time on the display during your call and for a few seconds after it has finished.

## Handsfree calling

Handsfree lets you talk to your caller without holding the handset. It also enables other people in the room to listen to both sides of your conversation.

1. Press listen for the dial tone then dial the number.

The display shows the  $\square$  and then the  $\bigcirc$  icons.

At any time during the call, to toggle between handsfree mode and normal mode (using the handset), press 4.

The button is located on the left side of the handset rather than on the actual keypad.

To end a handsfree call, press **4**.

The earpiece volume will remain at the level set for all calls until changed.

The default setting is 3.

## **Earpiece volume**

There are 5 volume levels to select from. The default is 3. You can only adjust the earpiece volume *during a call*.

1. Press to increase or to decrease the earpiece volume. The display shows the set volume, e.g. EAR VOLUME 2.

## Handset ringer volume

There are 5 volume levels to select from, or you can set the volume to off.

While the phone is ringing:

1. Press to increase or to decrease the ringer volume. The display shows the set volume.

## Secrecy

During a call, you can talk to someone nearby without your caller hearing you.

- 1. During your call, press . MUTE is displayed and your caller cannot hear you.
- 2. Press again to resume your call.

## Redial

Your handset automatically saves the last 10 numbers you dialled into a redial list.

- 1. Press . Then scroll . or to the number you want to redial.
- 2. Press to dial the number.

#### Last number redial

- 1. Lift the handset and press **(a)**.
- 2. Press . The last number called is redialled.

#### Delete a redial number

With the name or number you want to delete displayed:

- 1. Press DELETE? is displayed.
- 2. Press Menu to confirm.

## Delete the redial list

With any number from the redial list displayed:

- 1. Press and hold . DELETE ALL? is displayed.
- 2. Press Menu to confirm.

Each redial number can be up to a maximum of 32 digits long.

Only the last 12 digits of the number will be displayed. The ▶ icon will be displayed if there are more digits to view.

If there are no numbers saved in the redial list EMPTY will be displayed.

If a name/number match is found in the phonebook the name will be displayed instead of the number. Press to toggle between the name and number.

Press to exit a menu.

Keep pressing to return to the idle display at any time.

The  $\prod$  icon is displayed while you view the phonebook.

If you have Caller Display enabled on your line and your caller's details are matched to an entry in the phonebook then your handset will ring with the melody selected for that caller.

# Using the phonebook with additional handsets

If you are using more than one handset, each handset has a separate phonebook, so you can store 50 entries per handset.

## Deleting characters/digits

If you make a mistake, press

#### Cancel storing

Press once to return to ADD ENTRY.

Press repeatedly to exit.

#### **Entering names**

Type the letters shown on the number buttons by pressing the corresponding digit. For example, to enter the name TOM:

Press 8 for T.

Press 6 three times for O.

Press 6 for M.

Press 1 to enter a space.

The maximum length for names is 12 characters.

## Store a phonebook entry

You can use the phonebook to store up to 50 names and numbers for easy dialling. Each number can be up to 24 digits and each name up to 12 characters long.

- 1. Press Menu, then scroll to PHONEBOOK and press Menu.
- 2. Display shows ADD ENTRY. Press Menu to display NAME?.
- 3. Enter a name using the keypad *(see notes on left)*, then press Menu. NUMBER? is displayed.
- 4. Enter the telephone number, then press Menu. You cannot store a name without a number.
- 5. Select a ringer melody (1 to 10) using or , then press . You hear a confirmation beep.
- 6. Repeat steps 2 to 5 to add more entries, or keep pressing to return to the idle display.

## Dial a phonebook entry

- 1. Press 🕮.
- 2. Enter the first letter of the name you want using the keypad, then scroll to the exact entry using or .
- 3. Press to dial the number.

## Delete a phonebook entry

- 1. Press Menu, then scroll  $\checkmark$  to PHONEBOOK and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll or to select the entry to delete and press
- 3. CONFIRM? is displayed. Press Menu to confirm.

## Edit a phonebook entry

- 1. Press Menu, then scroll v to PHONEBOOK and press Menu.
- 2. Press or to select MODIFY ENTRY. Press to confirm.
- 3. Scroll or to the entry you want to edit and press or
- 4. Use or to move the cursor through the name, and edit using to delete and enter new characters using the keypad, then press
- 5. Use to delete digits and enter the new number using the keypad, then press Menu.
- 6. Select a ringer melody (1 to 10), then press You hear a confirmation beep.

#### Inserting a Pause

You can insert a Pause in the dialling sequence. This can be useful if your phone is connected to an internal switchboard, see page 55.

Phonebook entries are listed alphabetically.

If the number has more than 12 digits, press again to display the remaining digits.

To change individual characters
Use to wove the cursor
underneath the letter you want to
change, then overtype the correct
letter.

# Caller Display and the calls list

#### **IMPORTANT**

To use Caller Display you must first subscribe to the service from your network provider. A quarterly fee may be payable.

For more information on BT's Calling Features, call BT on Freefone 0800 800 150.

#### Caller information not available

Occasionally the telephone number of the caller is not available and cannot therefore be displayed.

In this case, your BT Freestyle 650 will show one of the following explanatory messages:

WITHHELD

UNAVAILABLE

INTERNATIONA(L)

OPERATOR

PAYPHONE

#### RINGBACK

If the telephone number is longer than 12 digits, then only the first 12 digits will be displayed. The ▶ icon will be displayed to the right of the number if there are more digits to view.

If you subscribe to a Caller Display service you can see your caller's number on your handset's display (unless it has been withheld) before you answer the call. If you have stored the caller's name and number in the phonebook then they will be shown alternately in the display.

Whether you answer a call or not, the caller's phone number is stored in the calls list.

When you have new entries in the calls list the of icon will flash in the display.

When all the entries have been viewed, the **o** icon will disappear.

Up to 40 phone numbers can be stored in the calls list. When the calls list is full, a new call replaces the oldest.

Each stored number can be up to 20 digits and each name up to 12 characters long.

## View and dial a calls list entry

- 1. Press to open the Calls list.
- 2. Press or repeatedly to scroll through the entries. For each entry, the caller's number is displayed, or their name if a name/number match is found in the phonebook.

- 3. When viewing an entry press repeatedly to view the details for the entry: the caller's number, and the date and time the call was received.
- 4. Press to dial the displayed number.

Or

Press to exit the calls list and return to the idle screen.

## Delete a calls list entry

- 1. Press to open the Calls list.
- 2. Press or repeatedly to scroll to the entry you want.
- 3. Press Sec. DELETE? is displayed.
- 4. Press denote to confirm. The display will show the next number in the calls list.

#### **Delete all calls list entries**

- 1. Press to open the Calls list.
- 2. Press and hold until DELETE ALL? is displayed.
- 3. Press Menu to confirm (or Series) to cancel).

#### What type of call?

The con indicates a new call waiting to be viewed.

The cicon will be displayed for calls that you answered.

The icon will be displayed for unanswered calls

If there are no numbers saved in the Calls list EMPTY will be displayed.

When you reach the start or the end of the Calls list and there are no more calls to view, you will hear a long beep tone.

# Using the calls list with additional handsets

If you are using more than one handset, each handset has a separate calls list. A call answered on one handset will show as unanswered on another.

Copy a calls list entry to the phonebook

- 1. Press to open the Calls list.
- 2. Press or repeatedly to scroll to the entry you want to copy.
- 3. Press Menu twice, ADD? is displayed, press Menu.
- 4. NAME? is displayed. Enter the name, then press Menu.
- 5. The Calls list number is displayed, press Menu.
- 6. Press or to select a ringer melody (1 to 10), then press Menu. You will hear a confirmation beep.

# **Call Waiting**

Providing you have subscribed to your network provider's Call Waiting service, you will hear a soft beep every 5 seconds if an incoming call arrives while you are already on the phone. This beep is not audible to the person you are speaking to. The second caller's number (and name if stored in the phonebook) will appear on the handset display.

Instead of the engaged tone, the second caller will hear an announcement asking them to hold the line.

You can edit the number (if required) using and the keypad, then press Menu

A quarterly fee may be payable for this service

## Speak to a second caller

1. Press to answer the second call and put your current caller on hold. Press again to return to your first caller and to switch between both callers.

Or

2. If you want to end the current call and pick up the waiting call, press . The handset will ring. Press again to connect to the waiting caller.

The second caller is only charged from the second you answer, not while they are waiting to be connected.

# Using the answering machine

#### Ready to record

The answering machine is pre-set to ON, so it's ready to record messages as soon as the base is plugged in.

(Remember to charge the handset for at least 24 hours first).

The Messages indicator on the base comes on when the answering machine is switched on.

Your BT Freestyle 650 answering machine uses voice prompts to guide you simply through its operation.

You can operate your answering machine from:

- the base
- the handset
- remotely, from any other Touchtone® telephone, see page 37.

Before first using your answering machine you should set the correct day and time. If you have not done this already when you set up your phone, please see *page 9*.

## Switching the answering machine on/off

Using the base:

1. Press "The machine announces, "Answer on", followed by the current outgoing message, or "Answer off".

Using the handset:

- 1. Press Menu, scroll v to TAM SETTINGS and press Menu.
- 2. ANS ON/OFF is highlighted, press Menu.
- 3. Press  $\bigcirc$  or  $\bigcirc$  to select either  $\bigcirc$  or  $\bigcirc$  or  $\bigcirc$  and press  $\bigcirc$ .

## Listening to your messages

When you have messages recorded on your answering machine, the Messages light will flash.

#### Using the base:

1. Press and hold Play. Before each message the day and time of recording is announced and then the total number of messages is announced. All messages are then played back, with the oldest message played back first. After each message the day and time of recording are announced.

## During playback:



Once repeats the current message, twice plays the previous message.

Once plays the next message, twice plays the message after that.

Del Deletes the current message and you hear "Message deleted".

Stops playback, machine goes back to Answer On.

If no messages are stored on the answering machine, you will hear. "You have no messages" or "You have no new messages".



#### Message indicator

Flashes when there are answering machine messages.

#### Loudspeaker volume

You can adjust the base loudspeaker volume at any time. In standby, you hear a beep which gets louder or softer. A double beep signifies the highest or lowest setting. Use the and huttons


#### Cancel operation

Press to end any operation at any time.

You will need to place the handset to your ear to hear the message(s).

## At the end of playback:

The machine announces, "End of messages. To delete all messages, press delete". The machine gives you 8 seconds during which you can press:



to *cancel* message deletion. This will also restore any messages you have selected individually for deleting. Any messages not deleted are saved.

You will hear a beep to signal when 8 seconds have elapsed.

## Using the handset:

- 1. Press Menu, PLAY MESSAGE is highlighted, press Menu.
- 2. NEW MSG is highlighted and the number of new messages, press Mer to play *new* messages only or scroll to ALL MSG and press Mer to play *all* your messages.

## During playback:

- Press or to adjust the playback volume.
- Press **1** or **4** once to repeat the current message.
- Press 1 or 4 twice to play the previous message.
- Press **3** or **6** to play the next message.

Press to delete the current message. You will hear, 'Message deleted'.

## At the end of playback:

You will hear, "End of messages. To delete all messages, press delete". To delete all messages, press , you will hear, "All messages deleted". If you do not press any buttons during the countdown the display will return to idle and any messages you selected individually for deletion will be saved

## **Outgoing messages**

The outgoing message (OGM) is the greeting a caller hears when the answering machine picks up their call. Your BT Freestyle 650 gives you a choice of two prerecorded outgoing messages, one for Answer and Record and one for Answer Only.

#### **Answer and Record**

Callers hear the announcement and are able to leave a message for you. The pre-recorded message is, "Hello, your call cannot be taken at the moment, so please leave your message after the tone."

#### Answer only

Callers hear an announcement but *cannot* leave a message. The pre-recorded message is, "Hello, your call cannot be taken at the moment, and you cannot leave a message, so please call later."

#### Personalise your OGM

To record your own outgoing message, see 'Record your own outgoing message', see page 30.

The answering machine is pre-set to Answer and Record mode.

## Select and play outgoing message

## Using the base:

- 1. Press and hold on until you hear, "Please select outgoing message."
- 2. For **Answer and Record**, press or for **Answer Only** press . The selected message is played.

## Using the handset:

- 1. Press Menu, scroll v to TAM SETTINGS and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to ANS MODE and press Menu.
- Press or to select either ANS AND REC or ANS ONLY and press (New to confirm.

## Record your own outgoing message(s)

#### Using the base:

- 1. Press and hold on until you hear, "Please select outgoing message."
- 2. Press and keep holding to select Answer and Record or press and keep holding for Answer Only, until you hear, "Please speak after the tone. To end recording release the button."

If you only want to hear the current message just press the OG, button.

Your own outgoing message can be up to 3 minutes long.

Please ensure you speak into the microphone on the base when recording.

3. After the beep, record your message. *Release* the button to end recording. Your new outgoing message is played.

#### Using the handset:

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to TAM SETTINGS and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to OGM SETTING and press Menu.
- 3. Scroll to RECORD OGM and press Menu.
- 4. Press or to select either ANS AND REC or ANS ONLY and press to confirm.
- 5. Place the handset to your ear. You will hear, "Please speak after the tone. To end recording, press #".
- After the long beep speak your message slowly and clearly into the handset, to end recording press .
   Your message will then be played back to you through the handset.


## To re-instate the pre-recorded outgoing message

You can delete your own outgoing message and return to the pre-recorded outgoing message.

## Using the base:

1. Press and hold outgoing message." until you hear, "Please select outgoing message."

You can only delete your own outgoing message, not the prerecorded message.



3. *During playback*, press Del. The machine will stop playing your outgoing message and will revert to and play the pre-recorded outgoing message.

## Using the handset:

- 1. Press Menu, scroll v to TAM SETTINGS and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to 06M SETTING and press Menu.
- 3. Scroll to DELETE OGM and press Menu.
- 4. Press or to select either ANS AND REC or ANS ONLY and press to confirm. Your personal OGM has been deleted and the pre-recorded OGM will be played.

## Answer delay

Answer delay is the number of times your BT Freestyle 650 rings before the answering machine picks up calls and starts playing the outgoing message to callers. You can choose between 2–9 rings, or Time Saver. The default setting is 6 rings.

## Adjust answer delay

## Using the base:

- 1. Press . The machine announces, "Calls will be answered after X rings."
- 2. Press and hold . The machine announces the settings in turn. Release the button when you hear the answer delay you want. The new setting is announced.

## Using the handset:

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to TAM SETTINGS and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to ANS DELAY and press Menu. The handset will display the current setting.
- 3. Press or to select the number of rings required and press Menu to confirm.

#### What is Time Saver?

Time Saver can save you the cost of a call when you want to ring in to find out if you have new messages (see 'Remote access', page 37).

If you have new messages, your answering machine answers after 2 rings. If you do not have new messages, it answers after 6 rings. This gives you a chance to hang up before the line is connected.

#### IMPORTANT

You should change the security PIN from the original setting of 000.

## **Security PIN**

Your 3-digit PIN lets you access your answering machine remotely from another phone. For security reasons, it is recommended that you change the PIN from the original setting of 000.

## Change the security PIN

- 1. Using the handset, press (Menu), scroll toTAM SETTINGS and press (Menu).
- Scroll to REMOTE CODE and press will display the current code.
- 3. Enter a new code and then press Menu to confirm.

## **Check the security PIN**

1. Press Del on the base. The security PIN is announced.

## Record a memo

You can record memo messages for other users which can be played back just like normal messages.

1. Using the handset, press Menu, scroll toTAM SETTINGS and press Menu.

Memos can only be recorded using the handset.

To listen to memos, see 'Listening to your messages', *page 27*.

- 2. Scroll to MEMO REC and press Place the handset to you ear and you will hear, "Please speak after the tone. To end recording, press "then a beep is heard."
- 3. You can now record your memo by speaking into the handset, press \( \bar{\omega} \) to end recording.

# Memory full

When the recording memory has been used up or a maximum of 59 messages have been received, no more messages can be taken. The machine will switch to Answer Only mode and play future callers the message, "Hello your call cannot be taken at the moment and you cannot leave a message, so please call later."

You must delete existing messages before new ones can be recorded.

## Memory full during a call

When there is approximately 30 seconds of recording memory left, the caller will hear, "Please complete your call within 30 seconds."

If the memory runs out or the maximum message length of 3 minutes is reached while a caller is leaving a message, the call is ended.

When the answering machine memory is full the Message light on the base will flash steadily every half a second.

See 'Listening to your messages' on *page 27* for instructions on how to delete messages.



## Call screening

When the answering machine is switched on, you can use the loudspeaker to listen to callers leaving their messages.

1. Press to interrupt and speak to the caller.

Any message they have already recorded will be kept.

## Power failure

If the mains power is lost, your answering machine will keep many personalised settings when it is switched on.

The settings after a power failure will be:

Outgoing message As last set by you
Answer DelayAs last set by you
On/OffAs last set by you
Message indicator Flashing, if any messages
have been recorded
MessagesSaved
VolumeAs last set by you
or level 5 default
PIN
or 000 default
Day/time Saturday 12:01 PM

## Remote access

You can operate your answering machine from any modern Touchtone™ phone by calling your BT Freestyle 650 and entering a 3-digit security PIN.

Using a PIN code prevents other people from accessing your machine without permission.

# Switch on your answering machine from another phone

If you forget to switch on your answering machine, you can do it from another phone.

1. Dial your phone number and let it ring. After 20 rings, your answering machine will switch on.

# Operating your answering machine from another phone

- 2. The machine announces, "Please enter your security code". Use the phone's keypad to enter your 3-digit PIN (default PIN: 0000). The machine announces, "You have 'x' new messages", and they are played.

The default PIN code is 000.

If you make a mistake when entering your PIN you will hear, "Incorrect security code, please enter your security code." Enter the correct PIN. The default PIN code is 000.

If you make a mistake again, you will hear, "Incorrect security code", then a beep and the machine will hang up.

If you pause for over a minute without entering the code, the machine will hang up.

If you leave the machine on pause for over 1 minute it will announce, "Thank you for calling," and hang up.

#### Delete all messages

To delete all messages, press when prompted at the end of playback.

- Using the phone's keypad you can replay, pause, skip or delete messages and adjust settings.
- 1 To hear the menu options.
- 2 To play/pause/restart your messages.
- **3** To play new messages only.
- **4** Once to repeat the current message; twice to skip back to previous messages.
- **6** To delete the current message.
- Once to skip to the next message; twice to skip to the message after.
- **7** To switch the answering machine on or off.
- To play the outgoing message menu, see 'Outgoing message menu' on the following page.
- **②** To set a new security PIN. Follow the voice prompts.
- **①** There are two options:

To *hear* the day and time, press .

To set the day and time, press . Follow the voice prompts, when you are asked to, "Enter the Day and Time after the tone":

Enter the day: 1 = Sunday to 7 = Saturday.

Enter hours then minutes using the 24-hour clock, e.g. 1340 for 1:40pm.

4. Hang up the phone to end remote access.

### Outgoing message menu

You can record an outgoing message (OGM) and set the message type from another telephone.

- 1. During message playback, press **3**. The machine announces, "Outgoing message menu":
- 2 To play OGM.
- **3** To record Answer and Record OGM.
- 4 To record Answer Only OGM.
- **6** To select Answer and Record OGM.
- **6** To select Answer Only OGM.
- **8** To hear OGM menu again.
- 1 To hear main menu again.
- 2. When you have selected the option you want, follow the simple voice prompts.

# Handset settings

To exit and return to the idle display at any time, press repeatedly.

#### The default setting is 1.

You can also assign a different ringer melody to entries in your phonebook, *see page 20*.

The default setting is 3.

## Handset ringer melody and volume

You have a choice of 10 melodies and 5 volume levels (or OFF). You can change the external ringer (ring for an external incoming call) or the internal ringer (ring for an internal call).

#### To change the external ringer melody

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to HANDSET and press Menu.
- Scroll to EXT MELODY and press Menu. The current melody is played.
- 3. Press or to hear and select a melody then press

  Meru. The handset gives a confirmation tone.
- 4. Press repeatedly to return to the idle screen.

#### To change the external ringer volume

- 1. Press Menu, scroll v to HANDSET and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to EXT RING VOL and press Menu. The current setting is played.
- Press or to select a volume then press Menu.
   The handset gives a confirmation tone.
- 4. Press repeatedly to return to the idle screen.

### To change the internal ringer melody

- 1. Press Menu, scroll v to HANDSET and press Menu.
- Scroll to INT MELODY and press Menu. The current melody is played.
- 3. Press or to hear and select a melody then press

  Menu. The handset gives a confirmation tone.
- 4. Press repeatedly to return to the idle screen.

### To change the internal ringer volume

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to HANDSET and press Menu.
- Scroll to INT RING VOL and press Men. The current setting is played.
- 3. Press or to select a volume then press here. The handset gives a confirmation tone.
- 4. Press repeatedly to return to the idle screen.

The default setting is 1.

The default setting is 3.

The default settings: Battery low beeps=LOW Keytone beeps=ON Out of range beeps=OFF

#### Please note

Beeps which confirm settings cannot be switched off.

## Key beeps

You can set your BT Freestyle 650 handset to alert you to certain situations by beeping:

- · If the battery is low
- · If you go out of range of the base
- To beep as confirmation each time a handset button is pressed.

These beeps can be switched ON or OFF.

#### Switch beeps on/off

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to HANDSET and press Menu.
- 2. Display shows BEEP. Press Menu to confirm.
- 3. Press or to select the alert you want ot set on/off then press Menu.

KEYTONE – for handset button beeps

LOW BATTERY – for low battery warning beeps

OUT RANGE – for out of range warning beeps

Press ♠ or ▼ to select ON or OFF then press Menu.
 The handset gives a confirmation tone.

5. Press repeatedly to return to the idle screen.

## **Auto Answer**

When you receive a call, you can answer it by lifting the handset off the base station, this is called auto answer. When you switch auto answer off, all calls must be answered by pressing .

- 1. Press Menu, scroll v to HANDSET and press Menu.
- 2. Display shows BEEP. Scroll to AUTO ANSWER and press Menu.
- 3. Press or to select UN or OFF then press Menu. The handset gives a confirmation tone.
- 4. Press repeatedly to return to the idle screen.

## Selecting a display language

You can select from 17 different display languages for your BT Freestyle 650.

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to HANDSET and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to LANGUAGE and press Menu.
- 3. Press or until the language you require is shown then press were. The handset gives a confirmation tone.
- 4. Press repeatedly to return to the idle screen.

The default setting is ON.

#### WARNING

While key lock is switched on, it is NOT possible to make calls, including calls to emergency numbers (999/112).

## Key lock on/off

You can lock the keypad so that it cannot be used accidentally while carrying the handset around.

## To switch key lock on:

- 1. Press Menu, scroll v to HANDSET and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to KEY LOCK? and press Menu to confirm.

The **O**— icon is displayed on the idle screen while the keypad is locked.

### To switch key lock off:

- 1. Press any button and the display shows PRESS \*.
- 2. Press 🛠 and the display returns to the idle screen.

## Quick key lock

1. Press *and hold* **%** for 3 seconds.

## Naming a handset

Each handset registered to the base is assigned a number. You can give a handset a name as well as a number to match the user or location e.g. ANNE or OFFICE. The name can be up to 10 characters long.

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to HANDSET and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to NAME and press Menu to confirm.
- 3. Use to delete the existing name. Enter a new name using the keypad, then press Manu.
- 4. Press repeatedly to return to the idle screen.

#### Set the alarm

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to DATE-TIME and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to ALARM SET and press Menu to confirm.
- 3. Press or to select ON or OFF then press Menu.
- 4. Use the keypad to enter the time you want the alarm to sound, e.g. 07--30 for 7.30 am.

The handset name will only be displayed for approximately 20 seconds when no button is pressed.

#### To silence the alarm

When the alarm sounds, press any button to turn it off.

# Base settings

To exit and return to the idle display at any time, press repeatedly.

The default PIN is 0000.

You can make a note of your new base PIN using the space provided on *page 62*.

## Security PIN

Your BT Freestyle 650 has a security PIN code which you will need to change some of the base settings. The default setting is 0000. You may want to change this to prevent unauthorised changes to your settings.

## To change the base PIN code

- 1. Press Menu, scroll v to SETUP and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to PIN CODE and press Menu PIN? is displayed.
- Enter your old 4 digit PIN then press Menu .
   NEW PIN is displayed.
- 4. Enter your new 4 digit PIN then press Menu RETYPE is displayed.
- 5. Enter your new 4 digit PIN again for verification then press . The handset beeps to confirm.
- 6. Press wice to return to the idle screen.

## De-register a handset from the base

- 1. Press Menu, scroll v to SETUP and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to DEL HANDSET and press Menu. PIN? is displayed.
- 3. Enter your 4 digit PIN then press Menu. HANDSET? is displayed.
- 4. Enter the handset number you want to de-register, you will hear a beep, then press .
- 5. Press twice to return to the idle screen.

## Base ringer melody and volume

### To change the ringer melody

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to SETUP and press Menu.
- Scroll to BASE MELODY and press Menu. The current melody is played.
- 3. Press or to hear and select a melody then press
- 4. Press wice to return to the idle screen.

You cannot de-register the handset you are using. One handset must remain registered to the base at any time.

If you enter a handset number that does not exist, you will hear a long beep.

You have a choice of 5 melodies and 5 volume levels (or OFF).

The default setting is 1.

The default setting is 3.

### To change the ringer volume

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to SETUP and press Menu.
- 2. BASE VOLUME is displayed, press Menu.
- 3. Press or to hear and select a volume level then press representation. The handset gives a confirmation tone.
- 4. Press wice to return to the idle screen.

## Reset the handset and base

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to SETUP and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to DEFAULT and press Menu. PIN? is displayed.
- Enter your 4 digit PIN then press (Menu). Display will show CONFIRM?. Press (Menu) to select. Your BT Freestyle 650 will reset itself to the default settings.

### Reset if you have forgotten your PIN code

- 1. Remove the handset batteries.
- 2. Press and hold  $\mathfrak{S}$  as you replace the batteries. Wait until the display shows DEFAULT.
- 3. Press to confirm. After a few seconds the base will beep and the handset and base will reset automatically.

#### WARNING

If you reset the handset and base, you will lose any names or numbers stored in the phonebook, redial list and calls list.

# Using additional handsets

#### **IMPORTANT**

You must choose a handset that is GAP compatible to use with your BT Freestyle 650.

You can register up to 5 handsets to one BT Freestyle 650 base.

If the handset does not locate the base, the handset will return to the previous menu. Try to register again by using a different available base number. Ensure that you are in close vicinity of the base.

The Civit icon is displayed on both handsets during an internal call.

If you purchase a new handset to use with your BT Freestyle 650 it will have to be registered to the base. You will need to do this before you can use it.

If you have purchased a BT Freestyle 650 multiple pack any additional handsets comes pre-registered to the base. With 2 or more handsets, you can make internal calls, page handsets and transfer external calls between your handsets.

# Registering a new handset to your BT Freestyle 650 base

At the new handset:

1. Follow the new handset's user guide to set the handset in registration mode.

At the BT Freestyle 650 base:

Press and hold the base button for at least 30 seconds, until you hear the validation tone (two beeps), then release the button.

#### Making internal calls

You can make internal calls between two BT Freestyle 650 handsets.

1. Press Int.

 Enter the other handset number using the keypad (1 or 2). The called handset will ring and show the calling handset's number.

If there is no response, press to end the call at your handset.

### Receiving internal calls

- 1. When the handset rings, press to answer.
- 2. Press again to end the call.

### Find a handset/Paging

You can alert handset users that they are wanted or locate a missing handset. Paging calls cannot be answered by a handset.

- Press on the base. The handset(s) and base will ring for 30 seconds.
- 2. Press any button on the handset(s), or press again on the base to stop the paging ring.

#### Transferring calls

You can transfer an external call to the other handset.

During an external call:

- 1. Press Int and the number of the other handset.
  Your caller is put on hold. The other handset will ring.
- 2. When the handset answers, press 🔊 to transfer the call.

If the other handset does not answer, press to talk to the caller again.

#### 3-Way conference call

During an external call you can invite another handset to join the conversation.

During your call:

- 1. Press To Your external caller is put on hold. Enter the handset number you want to call (e.g.1–5).
- 2. When the receiving handset answers, press to begin the conference call.
- Press on either handset to leave the conference call. The second handset will remain connected to the external caller.

# Using additional bases

Your BT Freestyle 650 handset can be registered to up to 4 other bases.

# Registering your BT Freestyle 650 handset to another base

On the base:

1. Press *and hold* to put the base into registration mode.

The base beeps and the In use light flashes while the handset is being registered.

On the handset:

- 2. Press Menu.
- 3. Press until REGISTER is displayed then press Menu.



- 5. BASE 1 2 3 4 will be displayed. The base that you are currently registered to will flash.
- 6. Enter the number of the base you want to register to.

SEARCHING 1 is displayed (where 1 is the base number you are searching for).

When the base is located, you will hear a confirmation tone and PIN? will be displayed.

#### IMPORTANT

You can only register your BT Freestyle 650 handset to another base if it is GAP compatible

### 54 Using additional bases

The default PIN code is 0000.

If registration is unsuccessful, after 1 minute, the handset will display the list of registered bases and you can try again or select another hase to use

If you are in an environment where there is a lot of electrical interference you may experience difficulty registering to a base.

If AUTO is selected the handset will automatically link to another base with a strong signal, if the signal it is currently receiving from its present base becomes very poor. 7. Enter the base PIN code and press very. You hear a tone to confirm you have entered the correct code and the handset returns to idle mode.

Once registered, you will hear a confirmation tone and the next available handset number is allocated and shown in the display.

#### Selecting a base to use

If your handset has been registered to more than one base you can select which one it uses.

- 1. Press Menu.
- 2. Press until REGISTER is displayed then press Menu.



- 3. SELECT BASE is displayed, press Menu.
- 4. AUTO is displayed, press to select the base you want to use (all bases that your handset is registered to will be displayed).

When the handset locates the selected base you will hear a confirmation tone.

# Switchboard use

## Switchboard external line access code

You may need to enter an access code (e.g. 9) in order to get an outside line. So that the switchboard has time to pick up an outside line, you may also need to add a Pause after the access code.

A Pause lasts 3 seconds. You can Pause dialling at any time by pressing the button.

### To insert a pause

1. Begin storing a number and press *and hold* where a pause is needed. P is shown in the display.

## Recall

The button is used when connected to certain switchboards, e.g. to transfer calls, and for some

BT Calling Features or those services available via your network provider.

#### Switchboard compatibility

This product is intended for use within the UK for connection to public telephone network and compatible switchboards, which support tone dialling and timed break recall. If in doubt please consult your network service provider.

For more information on storing numbers see 'Store a phonebook entry' on page 20.

#### **Pause**

You may also need to insert a pause when storing international dialling codes, charge card numbers and with other telebanking facilities.

## Dialling mode

Your BT Freestyle 650 is set to tone dialling. If required you can switch it to pulse dialling.

- 1. Press Menu, scroll v to SETUP and press Menu.
- 2. Press vuntil DIAL MODE is displayed then press Menu.
- 3. Press or to select either TONE DIAL or PULSE DIAL then press Manu.
- 4. Press twice to return to the idle screen.

### Temporary change to tone dialling mode

If you have set your BT Freestyle 650 to Pulse dialling, you can temporarily switch to Tone dialling during a call.

- 1. Press , then press , then dial the number as normal.

  Your BT Freestyle 650 will switch to Tone dialling only for the duration of this call.
- 2. Press and hold  $\bigoplus$  before you store the number in the phonebook. \* is displayed.

# Help

Many common problems are caused by the telephone and power cables being incorrectly connected, not connected at all, or the power being turned off. Please check that your BT Freestyle 650 has been correctly set up, see page 7, before ringing the Helpline.

## No display

The batteries may be flat or dead. Recharge or replace the batteries, see page 8.

#### No dial tone

Is the telephone line cord plugged into the telephone wall socket?
 Check that the base station is connected to the mains power and switched on.

### You cannot link up with the base station

- Is the icon flashing in the display? The mains power cable may not be connected at the base or switched on.
- Are you in range of the base? Move closer to the base.
- The batteries could be low or flat. Recharge or replace the batteries.

#### No ring on the handset

- Check that the base station is plugged into the phone socket and that the mains power is switched on.
- The ringer volume may be set too low for you. See page 40 to adjust the volume.

### Buzzing noise on my radio, TV, computer or hearing aid

• Sometimes your BT Freestyle 650 can interfere with other electrical equipment if it is placed too close. It is recommended that you place your BT Freestyle 650 at least one metre away from such appliances to avoid any risk of interference.

#### The handset charger is not working

- Check that the power adaptor is properly plugged into the charger.
   Make sure your handset has slotted correctly into the charger.
- Check the batteries are fitted correctly into the handset.
- Check the base is plugged into a working mains power socket and that the power is switched on.
- Are you using the correct power adaptor?

# Caller's number is not displayed even though you have subscribed to a Caller Display service

 The number has been withheld by the caller, is unavailable or is an international call, see page 22.

#### Caller's name is not displayed even though their number is stored in the Phonebook

• When storing Phonebook numbers, you must remember to store the full number, including the dialling code. Only exact name/number matches will allow the name to be displayed.

#### Answering machine does not record any messages

• The memory may be full. Play and delete old messages, see page 27.

## Answering machine messages have the wrong date and time

• Have you set the date and time? See page 9.

#### Cannot access your messages from another phone

• Have you changed the remote access security PIN code? See page 34. Always keep a note of the new PIN code in a safe place.

# General information

## Safety

#### General

- Only use the power supply included with the product. Using an unauthorised power supply will invalidate your guarantee and may damage the telephone. The item code for the base mains power supply is 032763. If you have purchased a BT Freestyle 650 multiple pack, the item code for the charger mains power supply is 032765.
- For the handset use only approved Nickel Metal Hydride (NiMH) rechargeable batteries. Never use other batteries or conventional alkaline batteries. They could lead to a short circuit or destroy the battery casing.
- Recommended batteries should have a power rating of 550mAh 1.2V. Batteries are available from the BT Freestyle 650 Helpline 0870 605 8047
- Do not open the handset or base (other than to change batteries). This could expose you to high voltages or other risks. Contact the Helpline for all repairs.
- It is recommended that advice from a qualified medical expert be sought before using this product in the vicinity of emergency/intensive care medical equipment.
- It is recommended that if you have a pacemaker fitted you check with a medical expert before using this product.

- Your product may interfere with other electrical equipment, e.g. TV and radio sets, clock/alarms and computers if placed too close. It is recommended that you place your product at least one metre away from such appliances to minimise any risk of interference.
