When the power is turned on, light illuminates around the display. To turn on/off the light, hold down the CLEAR/DIMMER button on the remote control for 2 seconds or more.

■ Speaker light up control

The speaker will light up according to the level of the music source played back. To turn on/off the light, hold down the CLEAR/DIMMER button on the remote control for 2 seconds or more.

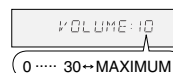
■ Volume auto fade-in

If you turn off and on the main unit with the volume set to 27 or higher, the volume starts at 16 and fades in to the last set level.

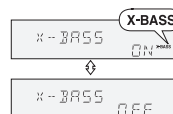

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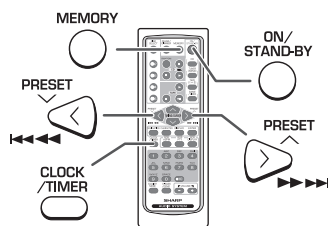

To change the 24-hour or 12-hour display:

- 1 Clear all the programmed contents. [Refer to "Clearing all the memory (reset)" on page 42 for details.]
- 2 Perform "Setting the clock" from step 1.

Listening to a CD or MP3/WMA disc

This system can play back a standard CD, CD-R/RW in the CD format and CD-R/RW with MP3 or WMA files, but cannot record on them. Some audio CD-R and CD-RW discs may not be playable due to the state of the disc or the device that was used for recording.

MP3:

MP3 is a form of compression. It is an acronym which stands for MPEG Audio Layer 3.

MP3 is a type of audio code which is processed by significant compression from the original audio source with very little loss in sound quality.

- This system supports MPEG 1 Layer 3, MPEG 2 Layer 3, and VBR files.
- During VBR file playback, time counter in the display may differ from its actual playback time.

WMA:

WMA files are Advanced System Format files that include audio files which are compressed with Windows Media Audio codec. WMA is developed by Microsoft as an audio format file for Windows Media Player.

- "MP3" or "WMA" indicator will light up after the unit reads information on an MP3 or WMA disc.

Auto power on function:

When you press any of the following buttons, the unit turns on.

- CD button (main unit and remote control): The unit turns on and the "CD" function is activated.
- CD ►/◄ button on the remote control: The unit turns on and CD playback starts (regardless of the last function).
- ►/◄ button on the main unit: The unit turns on and playback of the last function starts (CD,TAPE,TUNER,GAME/VIDEO).

Auto power off function:

In the stop mode of CD, MP3 or WMA operation, the main unit enters the stand-by mode after 15 minutes of inactivity.

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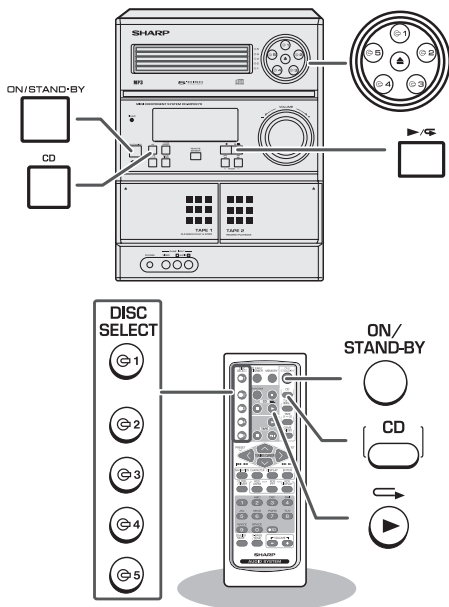

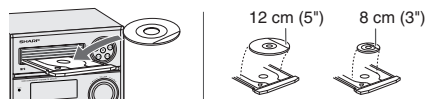

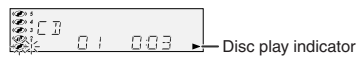

● Due to the structure of the disc information, it takes longer to read an MP3/WMA disc than a normal CD (approximately 20 to 90 seconds).

- 6 You can place discs on the trays 2 - 5 by following steps 3 - 5.

- 7 Press the play/pause button to start playback.



- Playback will begin from track 1 on disc 1. After that disc finishes playing, the next disc will automatically play.
- After the last track on the fifth disc is played, the unit will stop automatically.

- "ST" will appear when an FM broadcast is in stereo.
- If the FM reception is weak, press the TUNER (BAND) button to extinguish the "ST" indicator. The reception changes to monaural, and the sound becomes clearer.

■ Memorising a station

You can store 40 AM and FM stations in memory and recall them at the push of a button. (Preset tuning)

1 Perform steps 1 - 3 in "Tuning" on page 23.

2 Press the MEMORY button to enter the preset tuning saving mode.



3 Within 30 seconds, press the PRESET (✓ or ^) button to select the preset channel number.

Store the stations in memory, in order, starting with preset channel 1.

4 Within 30 seconds, press the MEMORY button to store that station in memory.



If the "MEMORY" and preset number indicators disappear before the station is memorised, repeat the operation from step 2.

5 Repeat steps 1 - 4 to set other stations, or to change a preset station.

When a new station is stored in memory, the station previously memorised for that preset channel number will be erased.

Note:

The backup function protects the memorised stations for a few hours should there be a power failure or the AC power lead become disconnected.

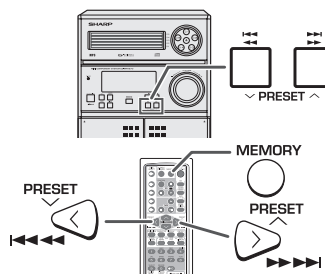

1 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to turn the power on.

Auto power on function:

When you press any of the following buttons, the unit turns on.

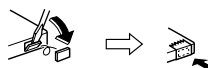
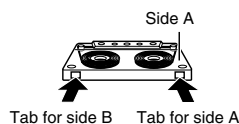

Erase-prevention tab of cassette tapes:

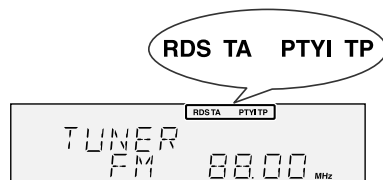
Using the Radio Data System (RDS)

RDS is a broadcasting service which a growing number of FM stations provide. These FM stations send additional signals along with their regular programme signals. They send their station names, and information about the type of programme such as sport, music, etc.

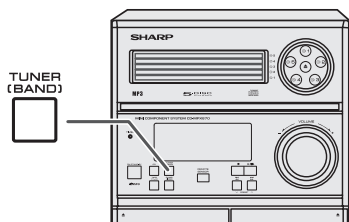
When tuned to an RDS station, "RDS" and the station name will be displayed.

"TP" (Traffic Programme) will appear on the display when the received broadcast carries traffic information, and "TA" (Traffic Announcement) will appear whilst a traffic information is on air.

"PTY" (Dynamic PTY Indicator) will appear whilst the Dynamic PTY station is received.

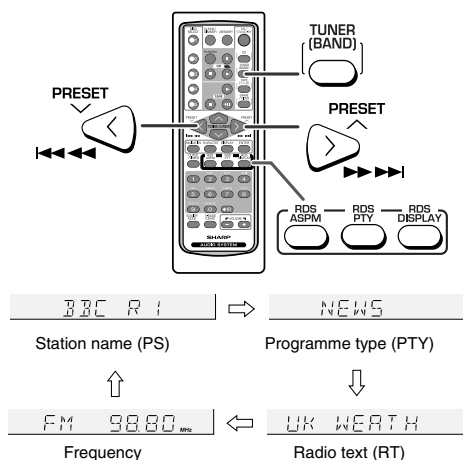


You can control the RDS by using the buttons on the remote control only.

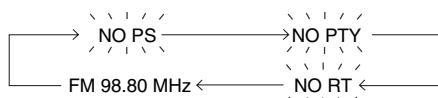


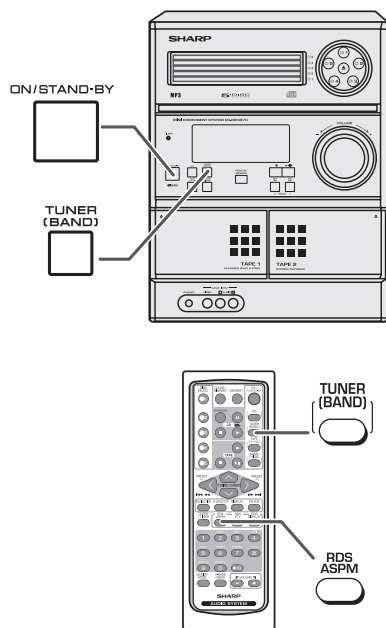
Information provided by RDS

Each time the RDS DISPLAY button is pressed, the display will switch as follows:



When you are tuning in to a station other than an RDS station or to an RDS station which sends weak signal, the display will change in the following order:





■ Using the Auto Station Programme Memory (ASPM)

Whilst in the ASPM operation mode, the tuner will automatically search for new RDS stations. Up to 40 stations can be stored. If you have already stored some stations in memory, the number of new stations you can store will be less.

- 1 Press the TUNER (BAND) button to select the FM band.**
- 2 Press and hold down the RDS ASPM button on the remote control for at least 3 seconds.**
 - 1 After "ASPM" has flashed for about 4 seconds, scanning will start (87.50 - 108.00 MHz).
- 3 After scanning, the number of stations stored in memory will be displayed for 4 seconds, and then "END" will appear for 4 seconds.**

- 2 When an RDS station is found, "RDS" will appear for a short time and the station will be stored in memory.

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Using the Radio Data System (RDS) (continued)

To stop the ASPM operation before it is complete:

Press the RDS ASPM button whilst it is scanning for stations.
The stations which are already stored in memory will be kept there.

Notes:

- If the same station is broadcasting on different frequencies, the strongest frequency will be stored in memory.
- Any station which has the same frequency as one stored in memory will not be stored.
- If 40 stations have already been stored in memory, the scan will be aborted. If you want to redo the ASPM operation, erase the preset memory.
- If no stations have been stored in memory, "END" will appear for about 4 seconds.
- If the RDS signals are very weak, station names may not be stored in memory.

To erase all of the contents of preset memory:

- 1 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to enter the power stand-by mode.
 - 2 Whilst pressing down the Δ button and the $\blacktriangleleft\blacktriangleleft$ button, press the TUNER (BAND) button until "TUNER CL" appears.
- After performing this operation, all of the preset memory information will be erased.

To store a station name again if the wrong name was stored in memory:

It may be impossible to store station names in memory using the ASPM function if there is lots of noise or if the signal is too weak. In this case, perform as follows.

- 1 Press the PRESET ($\wedge$ or $\vee$) button to check whether the names are correct.
 - 2 If you find a wrong name during receiving the station, wait until the correct name will be displayed. And then press the MEMORY button.
 - 3 Within 30 seconds, press the MEMORY button whilst the preset channel number is flashing.
- The new station name has been stored in memory correctly.

Notes:

- The same station name can be stored in different channels.
- In a certain area or during certain time periods, the station names may temporarily be different.

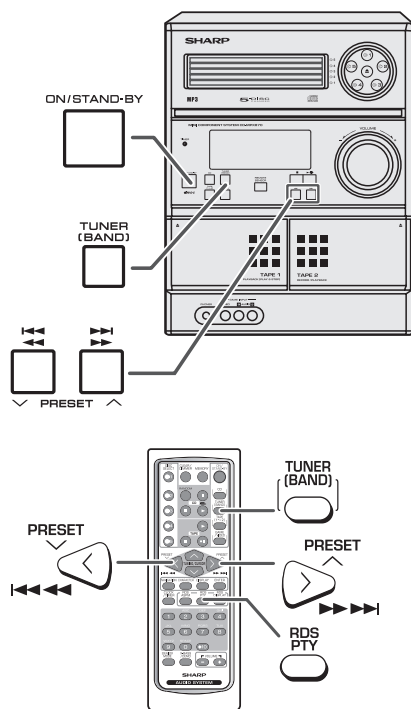
■ Notes for RDS operation

If any of the following events occur, it does not mean that the unit is faulty:

- "PS", "NO PS" and a station name appear alternately, and the unit does not operate properly.
- If a particular station is not broadcasting properly or a station is conducting tests, the RDS reception function may not work properly.
- When you receive an RDS station whose signal is too weak, information like the station name may not be displayed.
- "NO PS", "NO PTY" or "NO RT" will flash for about 5 seconds, and then the frequency will be displayed.

Notes for radio text:

- The first 10 characters of the radio text will appear for 4 seconds and then they will scroll across the display.
- If you tune in to an RDS station which is not broadcasting any radio text, "NO RT" will be displayed when you switch to the radio text position.
- Whilst radio text data is received or when the text contents change, "RT" will be displayed.



■ To recall stations in memory

To specify programmed types and select stations (PTY search):

You can search a station by specifying the programme type (news, sports, traffic programme, etc. ... see pages 33 -34) from the stations in memory.

1 Press the TUNER (BAND) button to select the FM.

2 Press the RDS PTY button on the remote control.

SELECT ↔ PTY TI

"SELECT" and "PTY TI" will appear alternately for about 6 seconds.

3 Within 6 seconds, press the PRESET (∨ or ∧) button to select the programme type.

NEWS

Each time the button is pressed, the programme type will appear. If the button is held down for more than 0.5 seconds, the programme type will appear continuously.

4 Whilst the selected programme type is flashing (within 6 seconds), press the RDS PTY button again.

NEWS → SEARCH

After the selected programme type has been lit for 2 seconds, "SEARCH" will appear, and the search operation will start.

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Using the Radio Data System (RDS) (continued)

Notes:

- If the display has stopped flashing, start again from step 2. If the unit finds a desired programme type, the corresponding channel number will flash for about 4 seconds, and then the station name will flash for 7 seconds, which will remain lit.
- If you want to listen to the same programme type of another station, press the RDS PTY button whilst the channel number or station name is flashing. The unit will look for the next station.
- If no station can be found, "NOT FOUND" will appear for 4 seconds.

If you select the traffic programme:

If you select the traffic programme (TP) in step 3, "TP" will appear. (This does not mean that you can listen to the traffic information at that time.)

When the traffic information is broadcast, "TA" will appear.

To specify station names and select stations manually:

You can select a station by specifying the name (BBC R1, BBC R2, etc.) from the stations stored in memory.

Before starting this operation, you must store one or more station names in memory.

- 1 Press the TUNER (BAND) button to select the FM band.
- 2 Press the PRESET (✓ or ^) button on the remote control to select a desired station.
- 3 The station name will be displayed for 6 seconds. Then the display will change.

Descriptions of the PTY (Programme Type) codes, TP (Traffic Programme) and TA (Traffic Announcement).

You can search for and receive the following PTY, TP and TA signals.

NEWS	Short accounts of facts, events and publicly expressed views, reportage and actuality.
AFFAIRS	Topical programme expanding or enlarging upon the news, generally in different presentation style or concept, including debate, or analysis.
INFO	Programmes whose purpose is to impart advice in the widest sense.
SPORT	Programme concerned with any aspect of sport.
EDUCATE	Programme intended primarily to educate, of which the formal element is fundamental.
DRAMA	All radio plays and serials.
CULTURE	Programmes concerned with any aspect of national or regional culture, including language, theatre, etc.
SCIENCE	Programmes about the natural sciences and technology.
VARIED	Used for mainly speech-based programmes usually of light-entertainment nature, not covered by other categories. Examples include: quizzes, panel games, personality interviews.
POP M	Commercial music, which would generally be considered to be of current popular appeal, often featuring in current or recent record sales charts.
ROCK M	Contemporary modern music, usually written and performed by young musicians.
EASY M	Current contemporary music considered to be "easy-listening", as opposed to Pop, Rock or Classical, or one of the specialised music styles, Jazz, Folk or Country. Music in this category is often but not always, vocal, and usually of short duration.

LIGHT M	Classical music for general, rather than specialist appreciation. Examples of music in this category are instrumental music, and vocal or choral works.
CLASSICS	Performances of major orchestral works, symphonies, chamber music, etc., and including Grand Opera.
OTHER M	Musical styles not fitting into any of the other categories. Particularly used for specialist music of which Rhythm & Blues and Reggae are examples.
WEATHER	Weather reports and forecasts and meteorological information.
FINANCE	Stock Market reports, commerce, trading, etc.
CHILDREN	For programmes targeted at a young audience, primarily for entertainment and interest, rather than where the objective is to educate.
SOCIAL	Programmes about people and things that influence them individually or in groups. Includes: sociology, history, geography, psychology and society.
RELIGION	Any aspect of beliefs and faiths, involving a God or Gods, the nature of existence and ethics.
PHONE IN	Involving members of the public expressing their views either by phone or at a public forum.
TRAVEL	Features and programmes concerned with travel to near and far destinations, package tours and travel ideas and opportunities. Not for use for announcements about problems, delays, or roadworks affecting immediate travel where TP/TA should be used.
LEISURE	Programmes concerned with recreational activities in which the listener might participate. Examples include, Gardening, Fishing, Antique collecting, Cooking, Food & Wine, etc.
JAZZ	Polyphonic, syncopated music characterised by improvisation.

COUNTRY	Songs which originate from, or continue the musical tradition of the American Southern States. Characterised by a straightforward melody and narrative story line.
NATION M	Current Popular Music of the Nation or Region in that country's language, as opposed to International 'Pop' which is usually US or UK inspired and in English.
OLDIES	Music from the so-called "golden age" of popular music.
FOLK M	Music which has its roots in the musical culture of a particular nation, usually played on acoustic instruments. The narrative or story may be based on historical events or people.
DOCUMENT	Programme concerned with factual matters, presented in an investigative style.
TEST	Broadcast when testing emergency broadcast equipment or receivers.
ALARM !	Emergency announcement made under exceptional circumstances to give warning of events causing danger of a general nature.
NONE	No programme type (receive only).
TP	Broadcasts which carry traffic announcements.
TA	Traffic announcements are being broadcast.

Timer and sleep operation (Remote control only)

Timer playback:

The unit turns on and plays the desired source (CD, tuner, tape) at a preset time.

Timer recording:

The unit turns on and starts recording from the tuner at the preset time.

This unit has 2 types of timer: ONCE TIMER and DAILY TIMER.

Once timer: Once timer play or once timer recording works for one time only at a preset time.

For example, if you are away but want to record a programme on a radio station.

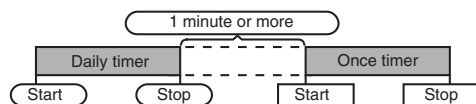
Daily timer: Daily timer play or daily timer recording works at the same preset time every day.

For example, set the timer as a wake-up call every morning.

Using the once timer and daily timer in combination:

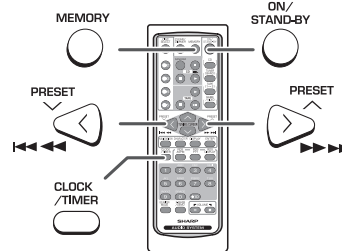
For example, use the once timer to record a radio programme, and use the daily timer to wake up.

- 1 Set the daily timer (pages 35 - 37).
- 2 Set the once timer (pages 35 - 37).



Note:

When set times for the daily timer and once timer overlap, the once timer takes priority. Allow an interval of at least 1 minute between operations.



■ Timer playback or timer recording

Before setting timer:

- 1 Check that the clock is set to the correct time (refer to page 11). If it is not set, you cannot use the timer function.
- 2 For timer playback: Load a cassette or discs to be played.
For timer recording: Load a cassette for recording in the cassette compartment.



- 1 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to turn the power on.
- 2 Press the CLOCK/TIMER button.
- 3 Within 10 seconds, press the <<< or >>> button to select "ONCE" or "DAILY", and press the MEMORY button.

ONCE ↔ DAILY

Set the clock to the correct time if "ONCE" or "DAILY" does not appear.

- 4** Within 10 seconds, press the **◀◀** or **▶▶** button to select "ONCE SET" or "DAILY SET", and press the **MEMORY** button.



- 5** Press the **◀◀** or **▶▶** button to select "PLAY" or "REC", and press the **MEMORY** button.



The illustrations show the daily timer setting.

- 6** Press the **◀◀** or **▶▶** button to adjust the hour and then press the **MEMORY** button.



The illustrations show the timer playback setting in the daily timer mode.

- 7** Press the **◀◀** or **▶▶** button to adjust the minutes and then press the **MEMORY** button.



- 8** Set the time to finish as in steps 6 and 7 above.

- 9** Switch input with the **◀◀** or **▶▶** button, and then press the **MEMORY** button.

To select the timer playback source: CD, TUNER, TAPE 1 or TAPE 2.

To select the timer recording source: TUNER.

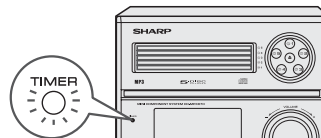
- When you select the tuner, select a station by pressing the **◀◀** or **▶▶** button, and then press the **MEMORY** button.
- If a station has not been programmed, "NO PRESET" will be displayed and timer setting will be cancelled.

- 10** Adjust the volume using the **VOLUME** control, and then press the **MEMORY** button.

Do not turn the volume up too high.

- 11** Press the **ON/STAND-BY** button to enter the power stand-by mode.

The "TIMER" indicator lights up and the unit is ready for timer playback or timer recording.

Timer and sleep operation (Remote control only) (continued)

12 When the preset time is reached, playback or recording will start.

The volume will increase gradually until it reaches the preset volume.

13 When the timer end time is reached, the system will enter the power stand-by mode automatically.

Once timer:

The timer will be cancelled.

Daily timer:

The timer will operate at the same time every day. It will continue until the daily timer setting is cancelled. Cancel the daily timer when it is not in use.

Notes:

- When performing timer playback or recording using another unit connected to the GAME INPUT sockets, select "GAME" in step 9. This unit will turn on or enter the power stand-by mode automatically, however, the connected unit will not turn on or off.
- During timer playback or timer recording, TIMER indicator light and timer indicator on the display  will blink. To stop the blinking, follow step "Cancelling the timer setting in the timer stand-by mode" on the right hand side of this page.

Checking the timer setting in the timer stand-by mode:

- Press the CLOCK/TIMER button.
- Within 10 seconds, press the  or  button to select "ONCE" or "DAILY", and press the MEMORY button.
- Within 10 seconds, press the  or  button to select "ONCE CALL" or "DAILY CALL", and press the MEMORY button. The unit returns to the timer stand-by mode after displaying the settings in order.

Cancelling the timer setting in the timer stand-by mode:

- Press the CLOCK/TIMER button.
- Within 10 seconds, press the  or  button to select "ONCE" or "DAILY", and press the MEMORY button.
- Within 10 seconds, press the  or  button to select "ONCE OFF" or "DAILY OFF", and press the MEMORY button. Timer will be cancelled (the setting will not be cancelled).

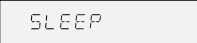
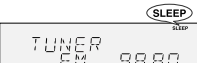
Reusing the memorised timer setting:

The timer setting will be memorised once it is entered. To reuse the same setting, perform the following operations.

- Turn the power on and press the CLOCK/TIMER button.
- Within 10 seconds, press the  or  button to select "ONCE" or "DAILY", and press the MEMORY button.
- Within 10 seconds, press the  or  button to select "ONCE ON" or "DAILY ON", and press the MEMORY button.

(Maximum: 3 hours - Minimum: 1 minute)
 - 3 hours - 5 minutes → 5-minute intervals
 - 5 minutes - 1 minute → 1-minute intervals
- 5 Press the MEMORY button. 
"SLEEP" will appear.
- 6 The unit will enter the power stand-by mode automatically after the preset time has elapsed.
The volume will be turned down 1 minute before the sleep operation finishes.

To confirm the remaining sleep time:

- 1 Whilst "SLEEP" is indicated, press the CLOCK/TIMER button.
- 2 Within 10 seconds, press the **◀◀** or **▶▶** button to select "SLEEP X : XX".
"X : XX" is remaining sleep time.

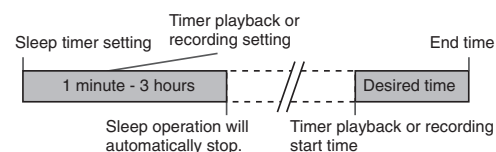

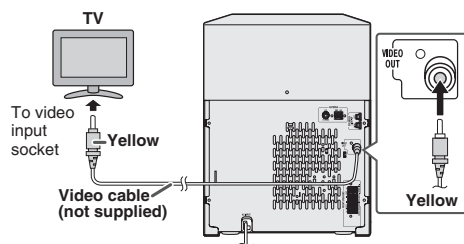
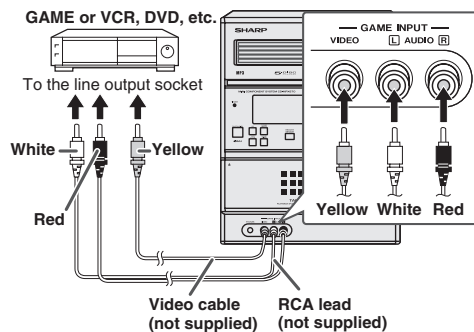


Caution:

When using the cassette deck, be sure the tape length is long enough to perform both functions. If you want to sleep and wake up listening to a tape, and the length of the tape is shorter than the sleep timer setting, timer playback or recording will not be possible.

■ Listening to playback sounds of Game, VCR, DVD, etc.

Switch the TV input to auxiliary.

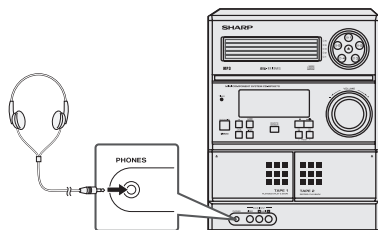

■ Headphones

- Before plugging in or unplugging the headphones, reduce the volume.
- Be sure your headphones have a 3.5 mm (1/8") diameter plug and impedance between 16 and 50 ohms. The recommended impedance is 32 ohms.
- Plugging in the headphones disconnects the speakers automatically. Adjust the volume using the VOLUME control.



Troubleshooting chart

Many potential problems can be resolved by the owner without calling a service technician.
If something is wrong with this product, check the following before calling your authorised SHARP dealer or service centre.

■ General

Symptom	Possible cause
● The clock is not set to the correct time.	● Did a power failure occur? Reset the clock. (Refer to page 11.)
● When a button is pressed, the unit does not respond.	● Set the unit to the power standby mode and then turn it back on. ● If the unit still malfunctions, reset it. (Refer to page 42.)
● No sound is heard.	● Is the volume level set to "0"? ● Are the headphones connected? ● Are the speaker wires disconnected?

■ CD player

Symptom	Possible cause
● Playback does not start.	● Is the disc loaded upside down?
● Playback stops in the middle or is not performed properly.	● Does the disc satisfy the standards? ● Is the disc distorted or scratched?
● Playback sounds are skipped, or stopped in the middle of a track.	● Is the unit located near excessive vibrations? ● Is the disc very dirty? ● Has condensation formed inside the unit?

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Troubleshooting chart (continued)

■ Cassette deck

Symptom	Possible cause
Cannot record.	Is the erase-prevention tab removed?
- Cannot record tracks with proper sound quality. - Cannot erase completely.	Is it a normal tape? (You cannot record on a metal or CrO₂ tape.)
- Sound skipping. - Cannot hear treble. - Sound fluctuation.	- Is there any slack? - Is the tape stretched? - Are the capstans, pinch rollers, or heads dirty?
Cannot remove the tape.	If a power failure occurs during playback, the heads remain engaged with the tape. Do not open the compartment with great force.

■ Remote control

Symptom	Possible cause
The remote control does not operate.	- Is the AC power lead of the unit plugged in? - Is the battery polarity correct? - Are the batteries dead? - Is the distance or angle incorrect? - Does the remote control sensor receive strong light?

■ Tuner

Symptom	Possible cause
The radio makes unusual noises continuously.	- Is the unit placed near the TV or computer? - Is the FM aerial or AM loop aerial placed properly? Move the aerial away from the AC power lead if it's located nearby.

■ Condensation

Sudden temperature changes, storage or operation in an extremely humid environment may cause condensation inside the cabinet (CD pickup, tape heads, etc.) or on the transmitter on the remote control. Condensation can cause the unit to malfunction. If this happens, leave the power on with no disc (or cassette) in the unit until normal playback is possible (about 1 hour). Wipe off any condensation on the transmitter with a soft cloth before operating the unit.

■ If trouble occurs

When this product is subjected to strong external interference (mechanical shock, excessive static electricity, abnormal supply voltage due to lightning, etc.) or if it is operated incorrectly, it may malfunction.

If such a problem occurs, do the following:

- 1 Set the unit to the stand-by mode and turn the power on again.
- 2 If the unit is not restored in the previous operation, unplug and plug in the unit, and then turn the power on.

Note:

If neither operation above restores the unit, clear all the memory by resetting it.

■ Clearing all the memory (reset)

- 1 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to enter the power stand-by mode.
- 2 Whilst pressing down the  button and the  button, press the TUNER (BAND) button until "CLEAR ALL" appears.



Caution:

This operation will erase all data stored in memory including clock, timer settings, tuner preset, and CD programme.

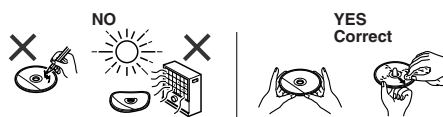
■ Before transporting the unit

Remove all CDs from the unit. Make sure there is no CD in the disc tray. Then, set the unit to the power stand-by mode. Carrying the unit with discs left inside can damage the unit.

■ Care of compact discs

Compact discs are fairly resistant to damage, however mistracking can occur due to an accumulation of dirt on the disc surface. Follow the guidelines below for maximum enjoyment from your CD collection and player.

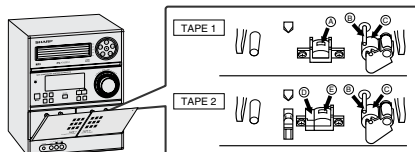
- Do not write on either side of the disc, particularly the non-label side from which signals are read. Do not mark this surface.
- Keep your discs away from direct sunlight, heat, and excessive moisture.
- Always hold the CDs by the edges. Fingerprints, dirt, or water on the CDs can cause noise or mistracking. If a CD is dirty or does not play properly, clean it with a soft, dry cloth, wiping straight out from the centre, along the radius.



Maintenance

■ Cleaning the tape-handling parts

- Dirty heads, capstans or pinch rollers can cause poor sound and tape jams. Clean these parts with a cotton swab moistened with commercial head/pinch roller cleaner or isopropyl alcohol.
- When cleaning the heads, pinch rollers, etc., unplug the unit which contains high voltages.

- After long use, the deck's heads and capstans may become magnetised, causing poor sound. Demagnetise these parts once every 30 hours of playing/recording time by using a commercial tape head demagnetiser. Read the demagnetiser's instructions carefully before use.

■ Cleaning the CD pickup lens

In order to ensure proper operation of the CD player, preventative maintenance (cleaning of the laser pickup lens) should be performed periodically. Lens cleaners are commercially available. Contact your local CD software dealer for options.

■ Cleaning the cabinet

Periodically wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth and a diluted soap solution, then with a dry cloth.

Caution:

- Do not use chemicals for cleaning (petrol, paint thinner, etc.). It may damage the cabinet finish.
- Do not apply oil to the inside of the unit. It may cause malfunctions.

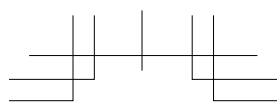

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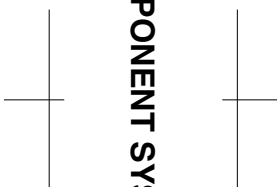
