Please read this instruction manual carefully before using this product and keep it for future reference.

# IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

- Read Instructions All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the appliance is operated.

- Do not press the LC panel strongly or with a sharp-pointed object, or it would cause break or failure to the color LC panel.



When the output video is switched to the SD mode as per "Switching Video" (P.118) and the [MENU/ENTER] button is pressed, the OSD SD split screen menu appears. When [SS SLIDE SHOW SETTING] is selected from the OSD SD split screen menu, the OSD SD Slide Show Setting menu appears.



# **Receiving by Wireless Remote Control**

Point the transmission unit of the wireless remote control at the sensor unit located on the front side of the Camera main unit, press the operation button of the intended operation and operate the Camera main unit accordingly.

## Receivable Range

Distance: Within approx. 7m from the front face of the wireless remote control sensor unit. Angle: Within 30° in upward, downward, rightward and leftward from the wireless remote control sensor unit.




- The receivable range may be shortened or narrowed and the laser beam from the wireless remote control
  may not be sensed depending on the surrounding circumstances (e.g., sun light, position adjacent to
  inverter fluorescent lamp). In this case, relocate the receiving side or shield the sun light or fluorescent lamp.
- When setting the batteries, remove the battery case cover by pushing the [ ▼ ] mark in the arrow direction on the back side of the wireless remote control, and set 2 pieces of AAA batteries in the case.
- Direct good care to the polarity (directions of +/-) of the battery.
- · Be sure to use AAA batteries.
- Replace the batteries once every year.
- The attached batteries are only for initial operation check. Their effective duration of service is not guaranteed.



- When shooting a transparent film, place a white paper under the film. (This is applicable only to the black-body type of the North American specifications.)

# **Connecting AC Adapter and Video Cable**



#### Note:

- To protect the Camera and the peripheral units to be connected to the Camera, be sure to turn OFF the power supply to all peripheral units to be connected and unplug the power plug from the outlet beforehand.
- When plugging/unplugging the power plug, the AC adapter and the video cable, hold on to their cable connector plugs.
- For the information of how to switch the output video, refer to "Switching Video" (P.118).
- For the information of how to switch the video output system, refer to "DIP Switch" (P.92).

## ① For Connecting AC Adapter

- **1.** Connect the supplied power cord to the AC adapter beforehand.
- **2.** Plug the DC plug of the AC adapter into the 12VDC IN terminal of the rear panel.
- **3.** Plug the AC adapter into the outlet.

## ② For Connecting to device having DVI Input Terminal

- **1.** Connect the DVI cable to the DVI OUT terminal of the rear panel.
- Connect the DVI cable to the DVI IN terminal of the unit having a DVI input terminal.

## ③ For Connecting to device having Analog RGB Input Terminal

- Connect the analog RGB cable to the RGB OUT terminal of the rear panel.
- **2.** Connect the analog RGB cable to the RGB IN terminal of the unit having an analog RGB input terminal.

- The display position of the screen may be displaced from the center of the screen. In this case, adjust the horizontal and vertical positions manually from the connected device.
- Vertical stripes may appear on the LCD projector or the monitor screen. In this case, adjust the dot clock manually from the connected device. The vertical stripes may be mitigated.
- When a laptop having an external output mode switching function is used, switch the video output of the Camera to [PC] and then set the laptop to the external output mode.


- Do not turn ON/OFF the power supply to the Camera by plugging/unplugging the AC adapter or power plug.
- Even if instantaneous power failure occurs, the main unit of the Camera may restart. In this case, turn OFF the power supply to the Camera once, wait for the recovery of the supply power, and turn ON the power supply. If power failure is probable, it is advisable to use an UPS (uninterruptible power supply).

# **Basic Operation of OSD**







# **Turning ON/OFF Lamp**

When used in the case of insufficient brightness of the material surface or shooting a 3D object, the lamp helps obtaining sharp video.

- **1.** When the OSD menu is in display, hide the OSD menu by operating the front operating panel or repeatedly pressing the [BACK] button on the wireless remote control.
  - When [ \* HIDE MENU] is ON, cancel it.
- 2. Press the [▼] button on the front operating panel or the [♣] button on the wireless remote control.




**3.** Each time the [▼] button on the front operating panel or the [☼] button on the wireless remote control is pressed, the material lamp repeats turning ON and OFF.



- Do not look into the lamp part. It may damage your eyes.
- The brightness of the lamp (LED) deteriorates as the operating time passes.
- The lamp may become high-temperature during lighting. Do not touch the lamp part.

### For Adjusting Illumination Position

- **1.** Adjust the lamp column so that the lamp head cannot be shot on the screen.
- **2.** Adjust the angle of the lamp head while watching the screen so that the illumination can be provided uniformly over the stage.

• Depending on the illumination position, the shadow of the camera column may appear on the screen.







The zoom speed can be changed in 2 steps.

When the wireless remote control is used, hold down the [Q] button or the [Q] button, and the zoom speed will be changed in 2 steps.





- The zoom magnification is available up to 16xfor the optical zoom and up to 4xfor the digital zoom.
- When the digital zoom is in operation, the image quality is degraded.
- Within the digital zoom range, the zoom speed stays constant.
- When the digital zoom is in operation, the screen can be scrolled by using the [ATAD] buttons on the wireless remote control.
- When the video is in transmission through the USB cable, the digital zoom speed is slow.
- In the SD mode, the SD image can be zoomed (zoom-in, zoom-out) digitally.
- When the power supply is turned OFF, the zoom settings are reset to the factory settings.





- If the mode is switched to the SD mode when the SD card is not set in the Camera, the screen is blacked out.
- If the RGB input terminal [RGB IN] is not connected to the PC or other unit, nothing appears on the screen.
- When [GUIDE] on the OSD Setting menu is set to [ON], the settings appear on the screen.
- When a laptop having an external output mode switching function is used, switch the video output of this Camera to [PC] and then set the notebook PC to the external output mode.

## **Adjusting Focus**

The focus of the object can be adjusted.

The Camera is of one-shot auto focus type. Once the object is brought into focus, the auto focus operation is cancelled and the then focus position is maintained.

The manual focus is used to adjust the focus to any part of the object (e.g., 3D material).



- The current zoom field angle when the digital zoom is in operation cannot be saved. If the saving of the current zoom field angle when the digital zoom is in operation is attempted, the optical zoom range is set to the maximum extent of the TELESCOPIC [ ◀ ] side.
- To reset the settings as of the turning ON the power supply to the factory settings, save the factory settings in Memory No. [8].

### For Presetting

- **1.** Press the [PRESET] button on the wireless remote control.





- When inserting the SD card into the SD card slot, confirm that the output video has been switched to the camera video beforehand. If not, the contents of the SD card may be destroyed or the SD card may be broken.
- Since the SD card is made up of components susceptible to static electricity, the SD card may
  have false operation or its contents may be destroyed under the influence of static electricity.
   Therefore, treat the SD card with utmost care not to be affected by static electricity.
- All image data that can be displayed on the Camera is only the image data saved in the Camera and that converted by using the bundled software.
- If the display of any image data in any undisplayable form is attempted, the output screen is blackened or grayed.
- If the video is switched to the SD card image without inserting the SD card in the SD card slot, the output screen is blackened and the warning of "NO CARD" is displayed there.
- After using the SD card, do not leave it inserted but remove it and keep it safe.
- It is recommendable that the SD card to be used should be Panasonic 256MB or 512MB. The resolutions available to the images to be saved are 1280x1024 (SXGA output), 1280x720 (HD 720P output) and 1280x960 (XGA output).

Set the slide or film on the slide shooting adapter (Fig. [C]), and adjust the slide size so that it can fit the screen size by using the zoom dial on the camera head or the zoom buttons [ ] [ ] on the wireless remote control.

**4.** Adjust the focus.

Press the [AF] button on the camera head or wireless remote control to bring the camera into focus.

**5.** Adjust the brightness.

If the screen is too bright or too dark, adjust the brightness by selecting [BRIGHTNESS SETTING] from the OSD Setting menu or pressing the BRIGHTNESS [::] or [ ] button on the wireless remote control.

- If the screen looks still dark after adjusting the screen brightness, put a white sheet or the like on the stage and then set the slide shooting adapter thereon, and the brightness will be improved.


