To Control a Compatible TV

To program your DVD remote to control a specific brand of TV;

- 1 Turn the TV on and point the remote at the TV.
- Press and hold down At the same time, press the appropriate buttons respectively according to the chart below. When the TV turns off, programming is completed. The remote then controls the TV as shown in the chart. A "YES" indicates the remote button works as marked, a "NO" indicates the button does not work. Any other functions are marked.

(For example: for an Emerson TV, +100 works for DISPLAY.)

It will not operate all TV's made by these manufacturers. If your TV does not respond to any of the button combinations, the TV probably cannot be controlled by this remote control. The DVD remote will now control certain functions of your TV depending on the type of TV.








How to set up the Parental Level

The Parental Level control allows users to set the level necessary to prevent children from viewing unsuitable movies such as those with violence, adult subject matter, etc... There are up to 8 parental levels on a disc and they can be used to prevent the viewing of certain movies. For example, Level 1 is the "Kids Safe" level and is the most restrictive. Only youth oriented movies will be played back when the player is set to Level 1. Level 8 is the "Adult" level and is the least restrictive. All types of movies will play when the player is set to this level.



ANGLE

Recorded onto some DVD discs are scenes which have been simultaneously shot from a number of different angles(the same scene is shot from the front, from the left side, from the right side, etc.) With such discs, the ANGLE button can be used to view the scene from different angles.

•CHAPTER NUMBER

These numbers are recorded on DVD discs. A title is subdivided into many sections, called chapters, each of which is numbered, and specific parts of video presentations can be searched quickly using these numbers.

●Dolby Digital(AC-3)

Digital audio compression technology that the Dolby Laboratories Corporation developed. This technology conforms to 5.1-channel surround. When connecting a component with a built-in Dolby Digital decoder, you can enjoy more real audio presence.

A disc that contains up to 8 hours of moving pictures even though its diameter is the same as a CD. The data capacity of a single-layer and single-sided DVD, at 4.7GB(Giga Byte), is 7 times that of a CD. Furthermore, the data capacity of a dual-layer and single-sided DVD is 8.5GB, a single-layer and double-sided DVD 9.4GB, and a dual-layer and double-sided DVD 17GB. The picture data uses the MPEG 2 format, one of the worldwide standards of digital compression technology. The picture data is compressed to 1/40 of its original size, The DVD also uses the variable rate coding technology that changes the data to be allocated according to the status of the picture. The audio data is recorded in Dolby Digital(AC-3) as well as in PCM, allowing you to enjoy more real audio presence. Furthermore, various advanced functions such as the multi-angle and multilingual functions are provided with the DVD.

OPTICAL DIGITAL OUT

The optical Digital out enables you to send the signal from the DVD to an amplifier by using an optical fiber cable.

It is an abbreviation of pulse code modulation and refers to analog sound.

●Playback Control(PBC)

Signals encoded on VIDEO-CDs(Version2.0) to control playback. By using menu screens recorded on VIDEO-CDs with PBC functions, you can enjoy playing simple interactive programs, programs with search functions, and so on.

DVD players and discs have regional numbers. It is impossible to play a disc on a DVD player that has a different region number. The playable region number of this DVD player is 1.

OSUBTITLES

This is text which appears at the bottom of the screen which translates or transcribes the dialogue. Up to 32 subtitle languages can be recorded on a DVD disc.

•TITLE NUMBER

•TIME NUMBER

This indicates the play time which has elapsed from the start of a disc or a title. It can be used to find a specific scene quickly. (It may not work with some discs.)

•TRACK NUMBER

These numbers are assigned to the tracks which are recorded on video CDs and audio CDs. They enable specific tracks to be located quickly.

●VIDEO-CD

A compact disc that contains moving pictures. The picture data uses the MPEG 1 format, one of the worldwide standards of digital compression technology. The picture data is compressed 1/140 of its original size. Consequently, a 12cm VIDEO-CD can contain up to 74 minutes of moving pictures. VIDEO-CDs also contain compressed audio information. Sounds outside the range of human hearing are compressed while the sounds we can hear are not compressed. VIDEO-CDs can hold 6 times the audio information of conventional audio CDs.

There are 2 versions of VIDEO-CDs.

-Version 1.1:You can play only moving pictures and sounds.

-Version 2.0: You can play high-resolution still pictures and enjoy PBC functions.
