




Disc Function or Operation that is Not Available



Titles. Chapters and Tracks

- DVDs are divided into "titles" and "chapters". If the disc
 has more than one movie on it, each movie would be a
 separate "title". "Chapters" are sections of titles.
- Audio CDs are divided into "tracks". A "track" is usually one song on an Audio CD.



NOTE: Numbers identify each title, chapter, and track on a disc. Most discs have these numbers recorded on them, but some do not.

REMOTE CONTROL

Using the Remote Control

- This remote control is magnetic and can be attached to most refrigerators. Some refrigerators panels are not metallic. In this case, try attaching the magnetic remote control to the side of the refrigerator.
- Point the remote control at the REMOTE SENSOR located on the unit.
- When there is a strong ambient light source, the performance of the infrared REMOTE SENSOR may be degraded, causing unreliable operation.
- The recommended effective distance for remote operation is about 16 feet (5 meters).

To Install Batteries

1. Open the battery door.



2. Insert two AAA batteries.



Battery Replacement

When the batteries become weak, the operating distance of the remote control is greatly reduced and you will need to replace them.

Caution: Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type.

NOTE:


- Do not place the remote control near magnetic devices or magnetic cards.
- If the remote control is not going to be used for a long time, remove the batteries to avoid corrosion damage caused by battery leakage.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Do not mix ALKALINE, standard (CARBON-ZINC) or rechargeable (NICKEL-CADMIUM) batteries.
- Always remove batteries as soon as they become weak.

Remote Control



1) MUTE X Button

Press to turn off the sound.

2) STANDBY/ON Button

Turns on the unit and puts it in standby mode.

3) DISPLAY Button

Changes disc status information displayed on the screen.

4) PICTURE Button

Selects from preset screen display settings to match the type of show you are watching.

5) ANGLE Button

During DVD playback, switch the camera angle of the video presentation when scenes with multiple camera angles are recorded on a DVD.

6) RETURN 5 / EXIT Button

Press to exit the TV menu and return directly to normal viewing.

7) DVD MENU Button

Press to enter the main menu of the DVD you are watching.

8) CURSOR (\land, \lor, \lt, \gt) Buttons

Use to highlight selections on a screen and make adjustments to certain settings.

CH+ / CH- buttons

Use to change TV channels.

ENTER Button

Confirm selections on a menu screen.

9) VOLUME (+/-) Buttons

Adjusts the volume.

10) ■ STOP/AM/FM Button

Stops playback.

Switches between AM and FM.

11) ► PREV Button

Selects previous title, chapter or track on a disc.

Selects previous preset station in radio mode.


12) Number (0-9) Buttons

13) FORMAT Button

Press to set size of LCD display (LCD Off, full, 4:3).

14) FUNCTION Button

Use to select DVD. TV or RADIO mode.

15) GOTO Button

Goes directly to a programmed location on a DVD/CD.

16) SUBTITLE Button

Selects one of the subtitle languages programmed on a DVD.

17) SOUND Button

Press to select from preset sound settings to match the type of show you are watching.

18) AUDIO Button

Selects audio soundtracks of a DVD or changes the output mode of a CD.

MTS Button

Press to select MONO sound, STEREO sound or Secondary Audio Program (SAP).

19) TV MENU Button

Press to display the on-screen TV menu.

20) ► PLAY Button

Starts playback.

21) II PAUSE Button

Pauses playback, frames advance.

22) ◀◀ TUNING ▶▶ Buttons

Scans all available radio stations.

: Fast reverse playback.

> : Fast forward playback.

23) ►► NEXT Button

Selects next title, chapter or track on a disc. Selects next preset station in radio mode.

24) LAST CH Button

Press to switch repeatedly between the last two channels displayed.

25) MEMORY Button

Sets title/chapter/track in a favorite order.

Enters the number of a selected station.

Press to enter digital sub-channels (i.e. 11.3, 12.7).

26) SETUP Button

Enters and exits the SETUP menu of the DVD in STOP mode.



Repeats chapter or title of a DVD.

Repeats single track or whole CD.

1) Disc Tray

Press OPEN/CLOSE button to open or close the tray.

Place a disc on the disc tray, label side up.

2) Display Window

Displays system information.

3) Remote Sensor

Receives the remote control unit signals.

4) ON/OFF Button

Turns the unit on and off.

5) ► PLAY Button

Press to start or resume playback of a disc.

6) ■ /AM/FM Button

Stops playing a disc.

Switches between AM and FM.

7) TIMER Button

Use to set the cooking timer.

8) ENTER Button

Use to enter the sub-menu and confirm selections on a menu screen.

9) **I**◀◀ / ▶▶**I** Button

Press to go back to previous chapters / tracks in DVD mode.

Press to advance to chapters / tracks in DVD mode.

Use to search for a station automatically or select presetted stations.

CH ∧ CH ∨ Button

Press to change TV channel in TV mode.

10) VOL+/-Button

Increases/decreases the volume level.

Button

Makes adjustments to certain settings.

11) TV MENU Button

Opens and closes the TV menu.

12) SET CLOCK Button

Use to set the current time.

13) DVD/TV/RADIO Button

Use to select DVD. TV or RADIO mode.

14) ▲ OPEN/CLOSE Button

Use to open / close the disc tray.

MOUNTING INSTRUCTIONS

TOOLS NEEDED: 1) Electric drill with 1/4" bit; 2) Phillips-head (cross style) screwdriver.

STEP 1

If your cabinet does **NOT** have an overhang:

a) Place the Mounting Template in the desired location inside or underneath the cabinet (whichever has less obstructions, and will be easier for you to reach to drill holes), flush with the front edge of the cabinet and tape it down. Go to STEP 2.

If your cabinet DOES have an overhang:

a) Measure the thickness "T" of the cabinet overhang (see Figure 1).



- b) Fold the Mounting Template along the guideline that is closest to the thickness of your cabinet overhang.
- c) Tape Mounting Template to the underside of the cabinet with the folded portion of the Mounting Template flush up against the cabinet overhang (see Figure 2). Go to STEP 2.





Use an electric drill with a ¼" drill bit (not included) to drill all four holes marked on the Mounting Template (see Figure 3). To reduce splintering, place a small piece of masking tape over each hole location before drilling. Go to **STEP 3.**



STEP 3

If your cabinet does **NOT** have an overhang:

- a) Eight screws are included with this unit, but you will only need four of them. Select the screw length which will go completely through your cabinet bottom, and provide at least 3/8" of thread to screw into the main unit.
- b) Insert the four selected screws through each hole from the inside of the cabinet going down (see Figure 4).



- c) Hold the unit up against the bottom of the cabinet, and align the four holes on the top of the unit with the screws. Partially tighten each screw, but do not fully tighten the screws until all of them have been started.
- d) Gently tighten each screw until they are firmly holding the unit in place.

If your cabinet **DOES** have an overhang:


- a) Four screws are included with this unit. Make sure the screws will go completely through your cabinet bottom, and extend at least 3/8" past the bottom of your cabinet overhang.
- b) This unit includes two sets of four spacers of various lengths. The spacers can be put together to form longer spacers to accommodate various cabinet overhang thicknesses. Determine the best combination of spacers which is equal to or longer than the cabinet overhang thickness.

c) Insert the four selected screws through each hole from the inside of the cabinet going down (see Figure 5).



d) Hold each screw head down and push the unit and spacers onto the screws, then hold the unit up until spacers are firmly against the bottom of the cabinet (and fully nested within each other if you are using multiple spacers for each screw).

e) Partially tighten each screw, but do not fully tighten the screws until all of them have been started (see Figure 6).



f) Gently tighten each screw until they are firmly holding the unit in place. The top front edge of the unit should clear the overhang.


Mounting Suggestions

- 1) If your cabinet has obstructions inside it which prevent you from using the template, cut out the corresponding area on the template, but do NOT cut out or through the screw holes.
- 2) If your cabinet has obstructions underneath it, which will interfere with the mounting of the unit, remove the obstruction before mounting the unit, or find another location to mount the unit.
- 3) It is recommended that you wear safety glasses while drilling to prevent eye injuries.
- 4) For wood cabinets, you may want to mark the hole locations with a nail, pressed gently but firmly into the wood so that a slight impression is made. This will also help keep the drill bit centered in the right location.
- 5) Hold the drill firmly against the cabinet to keep the drill from "walking".


Connecting the TV Antenna

Connect a TV antenna or CATV cable or Satellite system to the TV antenna terminal.



Connecting the Unit to a TV or other Video Equipment

Use the Video cable (not supplied). Connect the VIDEO OUT on the rear of the unit to the VIDEO IN on your TV or other video equipment.




Connecting the AM LOOP Antenna

Connect the AM LOOP antenna (included) to the AM LOOP ANT terminal.

FM: Fully unwind the antenna wire and position it for the best reception.

AM: Fully unwind and rotate the loop antenna, then position it for the best reception.


Plugging in the Unit

Plug the AC power cord into the wall outlet

- a) Before plugging in the power cord, make sure the voltage of the unit matches your local voltage.
- b) Plug the power cord directly into the nearest wall outlet, and wrap the remaining cord around the cord storage knob at the rear of the unit.






UNIT OPERATION

Turning the Unit On


While the power cord is connected and the unit is on standby, power will be consumed and only the clock display will flash.

Press the **ON/OFF** button to turn the unit on, "DVD" will appear on the front display.
 After a short period of time, the DVD logo (start-up picture) will appear on the screen.



Press the DVD/TV/RADIO button (the FUNCTION button on the remote control) to TV mode, "TV" will appear
on the front panel display.

After a short period of time, and the TV program will begin on the screen.



Press the DVD/TV/RADIO button (the FUNCTION button on the remote control) to RADIO mode, FM frequency will appear on the front panel display.

After a short period of time, the station will begin.



SOUND SYSTEM

Dolby Digital (for DVD)

Dolby Digital is a technology developed by Dolby Laboratories. Soundtracks encoded in Dolby Digital can reproduce from one to 5.1 discrete channels of excellent quality audio.

The unit automatically recognizes the Dolby Digital bitstream and provides a downmix suitable for two-channel listening. An additional Dolby Digital decoder is required for reproduction of the discrete multi-channel soundtracks available on many DVDs.

SETTING THE CLOCK

To adjust the clock, the unit must be in standby mode. To enter standby mode, make sure that the unit is plugged in, but not turned on.

- Check that the rated voltage of the unit matches your local voltage.
- When the AC power cord is plugged in, the clock display will blink.



Press the SET CLOCK button until the HOUR blinks.



 Press the I◄◄ / ▶▶I buttons to set the current hours then press the SET CLOCK button once to confirm. The MINUTES will now blink.




 Press the I◄◄ / ▶▶I buttons to set to desired time then press the SET CLOCK button once to start the clock.




SETTING THE COOKING TIMER

 Press the TIMER button. The "TIMER" indicator appears and the cooking time "10" blinks.



- Press the ■◀ / ▶▶■ buttons to select your desired time from 1-99 minutes.
- Press the TIMER button repeatedly to select following preset times: 10, 15, 30, 45, 60, 75, 90 minutes. You can then "fine-tune" your time by using the I◄◄ / ▶▶I buttons on the unit.
- Press and hold the ■◀ / ▶▶■ buttons to fast forward/reverse to desired time.





 To turn OFF the ALARM, press the TIMER button once. Otherwise, the ALARM will automatically turn off after 60 minutes if no button is pressed.

Cancelling the Cooking Timer

Press the TIMER button until the time of the cooking timer shows " 0 F F". The "TIMER" indicator will disappear.

PLAYING A DISC

This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this unit. Some DVDs are produced in a manner that allows specific or limited operation during playback. Such as, the unit may not respond to all operating commands. This is not a defect in the unit. Refer to the instruction notes of discs.

" may appear on the screen during operation. A " " means that the desired operation is not permitted by the unit or disc.

Playing a Disc

- 1. Press the **ON/OFF** button to turn on the unit.
- Press the DVD/TV/RADIO button (the FUNCTION button on the remote) to select DVD mode.See CUSTOMIZING THE FUNCTION SETTINGS before proceeding to step 3.
- 3. Press the **△ OPEN/CLOSE** button. The disc tray opens.
- 4. Place a disc onto the disc tray with the label side up.
- Press the ▲ OPEN/CLOSE button. The disc tray closes.
 It takes a short while for your unit to load the disc. After loading, the unit will automatically either bring you to the main menu of the DVD or start playback of the disc.
- 6. If the unit does not automatically start playing the DVD, press the ▶ PLAY button.
- When MUTE is pressed, the sound is mute and the "L 0" indicator always blinks on the LCD display until MUTE is pressed again or VOL is pressed.



Pausing Playback (Still Mode)

Press the **■ PAUSE** button on the remote control. To resume normal playback, press the **▶ PLAY** button. Each time you press the **■ PAUSE** button, the picture advances one frame in DVD mode.

Stopping Playback

Press the **STOP** button at the location where you want to interrupt playback. To resume playback at the position where the disc was stopped, press the **PLAY** button.

If you press the ■ STOP button twice, the unit's memory will be cleared and pressing the ▶ PLAY button will reset the disc to the beginning.

Skipping to a Different Chapter/Track

- Press the I◀◀ PREV button repeatedly to skip to the start of the current or previous chapter/track.
- Press the ►►■ NEXT button to skip to the next chapter/track.
- For an audio CD, use the number buttons (remote control only) to go directly to that track number.

Fast Forward/Fast Reverse

- 1. Press the **TUNING** ▶ or **◄ TUNING** button on the remote control when a disc is playing.
 - The disc begins fast scan at x2 speed.
 - Six speeds are available. Each time the TUNING ▶ or ◄ TUNING button is pressed, the speed of fast scan changes in the following sequence:



Press the ► PLAY button when you have reached the desired point to resume playback at normal speed.


Angle Selection OVD



Some DVDs contain scenes which have been shot from a number of different angles. For these discs, the same scene can be viewed from each of these different angles.

- 1. While you are playing a DVD with different angles recorded, press the ANGLE button to view the number of current angles available.

Presetting Stations

DVD No sound or only a very low-level sound is heard.	Make sure that you've selected DVD mode. The system is in pause mode. Press the ▶PLAY button to return to normal play mode. Fast forward or fast reverse is performed. Press the ▶PLAY button to return to normal play mode. The DTS DVD cannot be decoded to have speaker output. This unit is too hot. Shut off the unit for 30 minutes to allow it to cool down.
No picture.	The region number of the disc doesn't match the region number of this unit.
The picture is not clear.	Clean the disc. The disc is scratched.
Severe hum or noise is heard.	Clean the disc.
The disc does not play.	There is no disc inside ("No Disc" appears on the screen). Insert the disc correctly with the label side facing up on the disc tray. Clean the disc. A non-NTSC disc has been inserted. The unit and disc region number are incompatible. Condensation may have formed inside the unit due to a sudden change in temperature. Wait about an hour for it to clear and try again.
TV Snowy picture, multiple image, picture distorted, picture blurred and noisy sound.	Check antenna location, direction or connection.
No color of picture.	Check the PICTURE SETTING in the TV SETUP MENU.
No picture and sound.	Not plugged into AC outlet. Make sure that you've selected TV mode. Try a new channel to check for possible station trouble. Make sure the antenna is connected to properly. Increase the volume. The antenna is broken. Check for local interference.
Colored patches of picture.	Magnetic interference from unshielded equipment. Turn OFF the unit for 30 minutes, then turn ON again.

MAINTENANCE

Cleaning the Disc

A defective or soiled disc inserted into the unit can cause sound to drop out during playback. Handle the disc by holding its inner and outer edges.

- Do NOT touch the surface of the unlabeled side of the disc.
- · Do NOT stick paper or tape on the surface.
- Do NOT expose the disc to direct sunlight or excessive heat.
- Clean the disc before playback. Wipe the disc from the center outward with a cleaning cloth.
- NEVER use solvents such as benzine or alcohol to clean the disc.
- Do NOT use irregular shaped discs (example: heart shaped, octagonal, etc.). They may cause malfunctions.



Cleaning the Unit

Clean plastic cover over screen if it becomes dirty with oil, grease, dust, etc while cooking. Please follow below steps.

- Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before cleaning the unit.
- Wipe the unit with a dry soft cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth that has been
 dipped in a weak soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly. Then wipe with a dry cloth.
- Never use alcohol, benzine, thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals. Do NOT use compressed air to remove dust.
