




REMOTE CONTROL

USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

- Point the remote control at the REMOTE SENSOR located on the unit.
- When using this unit in bright light, the infrared REMOTE CONTROL SENSOR may not work properly.
- The recommended effective distance for using the remote control is about 16 feet.

TO CHANGE THE REMOTE CONTROL BATTERIES

1. Open the battery door.







BATTERY REPLACEMENT

When the batteries become weak, the operating distance of the remote control will be greatly reduced and you will need to replace the batteries.

Note:

- If the remote control is not going to be used for a long time, remove the batteries to avoid damage caused by battery leakage corrosion.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Do not mix ALKALINE, standard (CARBON-ZINC) or rechargeable (NICKEL-CADMIUM) batteries.

CONNECTING A TV ANTENNA/CABLE/SATELLITE


To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received from one of the following sources:

- An indoor or outdoor aerial antenna
- A cable system
- A satellite system

Note:

For receiving over-the-air TV broadcasts, we recommend that you use an external fixed antenna.

Should you require the use of a temporary antenna, please ensure that you purchase an antenna with sufficient ability to receive in weak signal areas. Only when you are in close proximity to a transmitter will a temporary antenna reproduce a signal as strongly as a fixed antenna.






CONNECTING THE AC POWER CORD

- · Connect the AC power cord into an AC power
- Press the STANDBY/ON button on the left side of the unit or use the remote control to turn on the unit.

Notes:

- Be sure the AC power cord is disconnected and all functions are off before making connections.
- Make sure that all the components are connected correctly.
- · To prevent electrical shock, match wide blade of AC power cord to wide slot of AC power outlet, then fully insert.
- · When you are not going to use the unit for a long period of time, disconnect the AC power cord.











CONNECTING AN A/V DEVICE (VCR, PVR, Camcorder, Game System, etc.)

Connecting to Devices with an S-Video Output

To connect to A/V devices such as a VCR, camcorder, satellite system or cable, etc.



Connect the AUDIO and S-VIDEO cable (not included) as shown.

Make sure you connect the cable from the other equipment (AUDIO OUT and S-VIDEO OUT) to this unit (AUDIO IN and S-VIDEO IN)

Connecting Devices with a Composite (yellow RCA-type) Video Output



Make sure you connect the cable from the other equipment (AUDIO and VIDEO OUT) to this unit (AUDIO and VIDEO IN)

Connecting Devices with a Composite (yellow RCA-type) Video Input

To connect A/V devices such as a VCR, PVR or camcorder:

- Connecting a VCR/PVR

Connect the right (red) and left (white) audio input from the VCR/PVR to the right (red) and left (white) output on this unit (Audio cable not included)

Connect the video (yellow) input from the VCR/PVR to the video output on this unit (Video cable not included).

Make sure you connect both audio and video from the same VCR/PVR to the same output (AV OUT).

To output DVD video signal to other device, first press the **FUNCTION** button or **DVD** button to select the DVD mode.

Note:

Please refer to the user manual for the VCR/PVR for more information.

Notes:

- The video out function only works in DVD mode.
- For the reason of copyright protection, the resulting copy may have bad picture and/or sound.

AUDIO/VIDEO CABLE (Not included)

- Connecting a Camcorder

Connect the right (red) and left (white) audio input from the camcorder to the right (red) and left (white) output on this unit (Audio cable not included).

Connect the video (yellow) input from the camcorder to the video output on this unit (Video cable not included).

Make sure you connect both audio and video from the same camcorder to the same output (AV OUT).


To output DVD video signal to other device, first press the **FUNCTION** button or **DVD** button to select the DVD mode.

CONNECTING A HIGH-DEFINITION (HD) SOURCE

High-Definition (HD) Devices with component video output must be connected to the YUV input.

Connect the three video outputs (Y, Pb, Pr) from the source to the corresponding video inputs on this unit (Component video cable not included).


Connect the right (red) and left (white) audio output from the source to the right (red) and left (white) input on this unit (Audio cable not included).

Make sure you connect both audio and video from the same source to YUV IN.

To operate the connected device and play the source, first press the **FUNCTION** button or the **YUV IN** button to select the YUV mode.

Note:

When connecting a DVD player to the television, the picture resolution is solely dependent upon the resolution supported by the DVD player attached. DVD player resolutions vary from 480i to 1080i, and this television can support DVD players up to a maximum resolution of 1080i.



CONNECTING A PC


Connect the 15-pin D-SUB PC/VGA connector from your computer to the 15-pin D-SUB PC/VGA input on this unit using a monitor cable (not included).


Connect a stereo audio cable (not included) to the PC AUDIO IN jack on this unit, and the other end to the AUDIO OUT jack on your computer's sound card.

To operate the connected device, first press the **FUNCTION** button to select the PC mode.

Notes:

- If the TV is cold, there may be a small "flicker" when the set is switched on. This is normal, there is nothing wrong with your TV.
- If possible, use the VESA 1440 x 900 @60Hz video mode to obtain the best image quality for your LCD monitor. If used under the other resolutions, some scaled or processed pictures may appear on the screen. The TV has been preadjusted to the mode VESA 1440 x 900 @60Hz.











CONNECTING AN AUDIO AMPLIFIER


This connection allows you to use an audio amplifier and external speakers.

Connect the right (red) and left (white) audio OUTPUT from this unit to the right (red) and left (white) audio INPUT on your amplifier. Refer to your amplifier's user manual for more information.

Note:

To control the audio, both the TV and the amplifier must be turned on, and the volume of the amplifier must be set above 0, or you will not hear any sound.

If you want to hear the sound from the amplifier only, press the **VOL** – button on the TV to decrease the volume or press the **MUTE** button on the remote control to turn off the sound.




CONNECTING HEADPHONES

- Turn down the volume before connecting headphones to the unit, then adjust the volume to your desired level.
- When headphones are connected, no sound will come from the front speakers.

Note:

Avoid listening to sound at high levels for prolonged periods of time. This may be harmful to you and may cause hearing loss.






INITIAL SETUP

TURNING THE UNIT ON

When you turn on your television set for the first time, be sure to place it on a solid stable surface. To avoid danger, do not expose the TV to water or a heat source (e.g. lamp, candle, radiator). Do not obstruct the ventilation grid at the rear and be sure to leave sufficient gaps around the unit.



TURNING THE UNIT ON FOR THE FIRST TIME

The first time for you turning on the unit, the unit will enter Virgin mode. You can easily follow up prompt message on screen to finish basic TV settings of the system.

Make sure RF aerial has been connected properly to the **TV ANTENNA** input jack on the rear of the system.

- Press the ◀/▶ button to select Tuning mode. AIR (over-the-air broadcasts, CH 2-69), CATV (cable/ satellite broadcasts, CH 1-125), HRC (CH 1-125) or IRC (CH 1-125) mode are available.
- 2. Use the ▲ / ▼ button to highlight Auto Tune.
- Press the ▶ button to begin auto scan. The system will automatically start to scan and preset all available TV channels.







4. After scaning finished, the system will return to the first TV channel scaned just now.





CD/DVD OPERATION

This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this unit. Some DVDs are produced to limited operation during playback. For example, many DVDs do not allow users to skip government warnings, or in some cases previews or other features. This is not a defect in the unit. Refer to the instruction notes of discs.

"O" may appear on the screen during operation. A "O" means that the desired operation is not permitted by the unit or disc.

PLAYING A DISC

- Press the STANDBY/ON button (on unit or remote control) to turn on the unit.
- Press FUNCTION button to select DVD mode.

See CUSTOMIZING THE DVD FUNCTION SETTINGS before proceeding to step 3.

- 3. Press the A PUSH OPEN button to open the disc door.
- 4. Hold the disc by its sides and carefully press onto the central support of compartment with the printed side facing towards you until you hear a "click".
- 5. Push the disc tray to close the disc door.

It takes a short while for your unit to load the disc. After loading, the unit will automatically either bring you to the main menu of the DVD, or start playing the DVD. If the unit does not automatically start playing the DVD, press the ▶ button.

PAUSING PLAYBACK (STILL MODE)

Press the **■** button. To resume normal playback, press the **▶** button. Each time you press the **■** button, the picture advances one frame on DVD.

STOPPING PLAYBACK

Press the button at the location where you want to interrupt playback. To resume playback at the position where the disc was stopped, press the button.

If you press the
■ button twice, the unit's memory will be cleared and pressing the
▶ button will reset the disc to the beginning.

SKIP (FORWARD / REVERSE)

- Press the ► PREV button repeatedly to go back to current or previous chapters/tracks.
- Press the ►►I NEXT button to to advance chapters/tracks.
- For Audio CD disc, use the number buttons (remote control only) to jump immediately to that track number.

FAST FORWARD/FAST REVERSE

- Press the ▶▶ or ◀◀ button when a disc is playing.
 - The disc begins fast scan at x2 speed.
 - Four speeds are available. Each time the ▶▶ or ◀◀ button is pressed, the speed of fast scan changes in the following sequence:

FORWARD X 2 \rightarrow FORWARD X 4 \rightarrow FORWARD X 8 \rightarrow FORWARD X 20 \rightarrow PLAY BACKWARD X 2 \longrightarrow BACKWARD X 4 \longrightarrow BACKWARD X 8 \longrightarrow BACKWARD X 20 \longrightarrow PLAY

2. Press the ▶ button when you reach the desired point to resume playback at normal speed.

SLOW-MOTION PLAY (DVD)

1. Press the **I** ► **SLOW** button on remote control in the play mode. Six speeds are available. Each time the **I**► **SLOW** button is pressed, the speed of slow-motion playback changes in the following sequence: SF $1/2 \longrightarrow$ SF $1/3 \longrightarrow$ SF $1/4 \longrightarrow$ SF $1/5 \longrightarrow$ SF $1/6 \longrightarrow$ SF $1/7 \longrightarrow$ PLAY

Press the ➤ button to return to the normal playback speed.





CD/DVD OPERATION

AUDIO SELECTION (DVD)

On some discs, the sound is recorded in two or more formats. Follow the directions below to select the type of playback.

- 1. While a disc is playing, press the AUDIO button to show the current audio format number.
- 2. Press the **AUDIO** button repeatedly to select the desired audio format.

Notes:

- · If only one audio format is recorded, the number does not change.
- About two seconds later, playback continues in the new audio format.

SUBTITLE SELECTION (DVD)

- While a DVD is playing, press the SUBTITLE button to display the current language setting, as shown in the example below.
- 2. Press the SUBTITLE button repeatedly to select the desired subtitle language.

....: [1 CHINESE]

Notes:

- If only one language is recorded, the language does not change.
- About two seconds later, playback continues with the new subtitle you selected.
- The number of languages recorded differs depending on the disc.
- If no button is pressed within a few seconds, playback continues without changing the current subtitle.
- This function can only be used for discs on which subtitles have been recorded in multiple languages.
- On some DVDs, subtitles are activated from the main menu of the DVD. Press the DVD MENU button
 to activate the main menu.

ANGLE SELECTION (DVD)

Some DVDs contain scenes that have been shot from a number of different angles. For these discs, the same scene can be viewed from each of these different angles.

- While you are playing a DVD with different angles recorded, press the ANGLE button to view the number of the current angle available.
- 2. Press the **ANGLE** button repeatedly to change the scene to the next angle in those recorded.
 - About two seconds later, playback continues from the new angle selected.
 - If no button is pressed within 10 seconds, playback continues without changing the current angle.

Sequence of angle shots (Example)

Note:

This function can only be used for discs on which scenes shot from multiple angles have been recorded.









SPECIAL FUNCTIONS

DISPLAY FUNCTION (DVD)

Using DISPLAY, you can check the current settings of the following items: ANGLE, AUDIO and SUBTITLE.

While the disc is playing, press the DISPLAY button to display the screen shown below.



LOCATING A SPECIFIC TITLE (DVD)

If a DVD contains title numbers, you can locate a specific title by directly selecting a title number.

- 1. Press the **GOTO** button.
- Press the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight a specific field and press the corresponding number button(s) for the title you want.
- 3. Press the ENTER OK button to confirm. The Unit will start playback about 3 seconds later.



LOCATING A SPECIFIC CHAPTER / TRACK

If you know the chapter / track number you want to play, you can locate a specific chapter / track by directly selecting a chapter / track number.

- 1. Press the GOTO button to search your desired chapter / track.
- 2. Press the ◀or ▶ button to highlight a chapter / track and press the corresponding number button(s) for the chapter you want.
- 3. Press the ENTER OK button to confirm. The Unit will start playback about 3 seconds later.



LOCATING A SPECIFIC TIME

You can move to a specific location by entering its corresponding time (hours, minutes, seconds)

- 1. Press the GOTO button.
- 2. Press the ◀or ▶ button to highlight time.
- 3. Press the corresponding number buttons for the setting point you want.
- 4. Press the ENTER OK button to confirm. The Unit will start playback about 3 seconds later.

- Some discs may not respond to this process.
- Some scenes may not be located as precisely as specified.
- This method for accessing specific locations is available only within the current title of the DVD.





CD/DVD PROGRAMMABLE MEMORY

CD PROGRAMMABLE MEMORY

The two types of programmed playback provided by this Unit are title/chapter programmed playback and track programmed playback.

TITLE/CHAPTER PROGRAMMED PLAYBACK (DVD)

- 1. Press the **MEMORY** button while the disc is stopped.
- 2. Enter the title numbers in □ ... Use the ◀ or ▶ button to move the highlight to chapter and enter the chapter numbers in □ ...
- 3. Use the \triangleleft , \triangleright , \triangle or ∇ button to move to the other field.
- 4. Repeat steps 2 to 3.
- Press the ► button to start the programmed playback.

TRACK PROGRAMMED PLAYBACK (CD)

- 1. Press the **MEMORY** button while the disc is stopped.
- 2. Enter the track numbers in
- 3. Use the ◀, ▶, ▲ or ▼ button to other field.
- 4. Repeat steps 2 to 3.
- 5. Press the ▶ button to start the programmed playback.





REPEAT PLAYBACK

You can play a specific title or chapter repeatedly. (Title repeat, chapter repeat, A-B repeat)

REPEATING A CHAPTER (DVD)

You can play the same chapter repeatedly.

1. While the disc is playing, press the **REPEAT** button until the GEP: GHAPTEN indicator displays on the screen. The current chapter is played repeatedly.

REPEATING A TITLE

You can play the same title repeatedly.

2. While the disc is playing, press the **REPEAT** button until the **REPEAT** indicator displays on the screen. The current title is played repeatedly.

TO RESUME NORMAL PLAYBACK

 While the disc is playing, press the REPEAT button until the REP: [OFF] indicator displays on the screen.

You can play a single track and whole disc repeatedly.

REPEATING A SINGLE TRACK (CD)

You can play the same track repeatedly.

1. While the disc is playing, press the **REPEAT** button until the REPEAT indicator displays on the screen. The current track is played repeatedly.

REPEATING A WHOLE DISC

2. While the disc is playing, press the **REPEAT** button until the REP: REP ALL indicator displays on the screen. The whole disc is played repeatedly.

TO RESUME NORMAL PLAYBACK

3. Press the **REPEAT** button until the **REP:[OFF]** indicator displays on the screen.







REPEAT PLAYBACK

REPEATING A SPECIFIC SECTION (DVD) (CD)

You can play a specific section repeatedly.

- 1. While the disc is playing, press the **A-B** button at the beginning of the section (REPEAT A- is displayed) you want to play repeatedly.
- 2. Press the **A-B** button again at the end of the section (REPEAT A-B is displayed).
- 3. The Unit will immediately begin replaying your selection.

TO RESUME NORMAL PLAYBACK

4. While the disc is playing, press the **A-B** button until the A-B cancel indicator displays on the screen.

Notes:

- A-B repeat can only be used within the same title. If the start and end of the section to be repeated are
 in different titles, A-B repeat is cancelled.
- The A-B repeat function does not operate in scenes where different camera angles are recorded.

PLAYING A PICTURE FILE DISC

This unit can play Picture files recorded on CD-R and CD-RW discs.

PLAYING A PICTURE FILE DISC

- 1. Press the A PUSH OPEN button to open the disc door.
- 2. Hold a Picture file disc by its edges and gently push it onto the spindle with the label side facing up until you hear a "click".
- 3. Push the disc tray to close the disc door.
- 4. The unit will load the disc and automatically display the contents of the disc on the screen, while also beginning to play the Picture file. These files will then be played back one by one.
- 5. In stop mode, press the ◀ or ▶ button to select to play Picture file.
- Press the A, V or ✓, ► button to view and select the files that you want to view to, then press ENTER button to confirm the selected file.

Notes:

- You can press the button to interrupt playback. Press the ➤ button to resume playback.
- You also can use GOTO function or use the numbered buttons to enter the number to quickly select
 any image.
- Press the ANGLE button on the remote control to rotate the picture orientation by 90°.





CUSTOMIZING THE DVD FUNCTION SETTINGS

LANGUAGE SETUP

- 1. Press the **SETUP** button in stop mode.
- 2. Use the ▶ button to change the highlight cursor. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select an option, then press the ▶ and ▲ / ▼ button to select your preferred language, then press the ENTER OK button. The screen will change to your selected language immediately.
- To exit the DVD SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the SETUP button.



VIDEO SETUP

- 1. Press the **SETUP** button in stop mode.
- Press the ◀ or ▶ button repeatedly until the VIDEO SETUP appears.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select an option, then press the ► button. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to adjust, then press the ENTER • OK button. (The screen will change to your selected setting).
- 4. Repeats steps 2 and 3 above to adjust other options.
- To exit the DVD SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the SETUP button.



SYSTEM SETUP

- 1. Press the **SETUP** button in stop mode.
- 2. Press the ◀ or ▶ button repeatedly until the SYSTEM SETUP appears.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the desired option, then press the ▶ button.
 Use the ▲ or ▼ button to adjust, then press the ENTER OK button. (The screen will change to your selected setting).
- 4. Repeats steps 2 and 3 above to adjust other options.
- To exit the DVD SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the SETUP button.



TV Type

Pan Ścan

- When wide-screen video is played, this mode clips the right and left sides of the image so that it can be viewed on a conventional screen.
- Some wide-screen DVDs that do not permit Pan Scan mode playback are automatically played in letterbox mode (black bands top and bottom).

Letter Box

 When wide-screen video is played in this mode on a conventional screen, black bands appear at the top and bottom of the screen.

Wide screen

 This is the correct mode for playing wide-screen videos on a widescreen.

Notes:

- The displayable picture size is preset on the DVD. Therefore the playback picture of some DVDs may not conform to the picture size select.
- When you play DVDs recorded in the 4:3 aspect ratio, the playback picture will always appears in the 4:3 aspect ratio regardless of the TV TYPE setting.
- TV TYPE will always change to Wide screen after you switch off the unit.

Default

It takes 3-5 seconds to reset the DVD settings to the factory default.



WARNING: To prevent damage to the unit and/or your iPod, connect or remove your iPod when the unit is powered off or the unit is not in iPod mode.

Make sure video out is activated in the setting of iPod Classic or iPod Nano.

Playing Videos

- In iPod Home menu, use the ▼ /▲ button to select Videos and press the ENTER•OK button.
- Use the ▼ /▲ button to select from Movies, Music Videos, TV Shows or Video Podcasts. Press the ENTER•OK button to enter.

("Navigate your iPod Video Library directly from your iPod" appears on the screen if your are using an iPod touch.)

- Use the ▼/▲ button to navigate the iPod menu lists and select a video, press the ENTER•OK button to begin playback. (You may also use the control wheel and key on your iPod to operate it.)
 - Press the PLAY button to pause, press the PLAY button to resume.

MAINTENANCE

CLEANING THE DISC

A defective or soiled disc inserted into the unit can cause sound to drop out during playback.

Handle the disc by holding its inner and outer edges.

- Do NOT touch the surface of the unlabeled side of the disc.
- Do NOT stick paper or tape on the surface.
- Do NOT expose the disc to direct sunlight or excessive heat.
- Clean the disc before playback. Wipe the disc from the center outward with a cleaning cloth.
- · NEVER use solvents such as benzine or alcohol to clean the disc.
- Do NOT use irregular shaped discs (example: heart shaped, octagonal, etc.). They may cause malfunctions.

CLEANING THE UNIT

- Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before maintaining the unit.
- Wipe the unit with a dry soft cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth that has been dipped in a weak soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly. Wipe with a dry cloth.
- Never use alcohol, benzine, thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals. Do NOT use compressed air to remove dust.

IMPORTANT NOTE

Before transporting the unit, remove the disc from the disc compartment.

- Replace the batteries in the remote with new ones.

DVD

No sound or only a very low-level sound is heard.

- Make sure that you've selected DVD mode.
- The system is in pause mode. Press the
 ▶ button to return to normal play mode.
- Fast forward or fast reverse is performed. Press the
 ▶ button to return
 to normal play mode.
- Make sure the AUDIO / VIDEO output and AV IN input connections are correct.
- The DTS DVD cannot be decoded to have speaker output.
- This unit is too hot. Power off the unit for 30 minutes to cool down.

No picture

 The region number of the disc doesn't match the region number of this unit.



The picture is not clear

- · Clean the disc.
- · The disc is scratched.

Severe hum or noise is heard

- The plugs and jacks are dirty. Wipe them with a cloth slightly moistened with alcohol.
- · Clean the disc.

The disc does not play.

- There is no disc inside ("No Disc" appears on the screen).
- Insert the disc correctly with the playback side facing down.
- · Clean the disc.
- A non-NTSC disc has been inserted. The unit and disc region number are incompatible.
- Condensation may have formed inside the unit due to a sudden change in temperature. Wait about an hour for it to clear and try again.

No picture or sound.

- Make sure the unit is plugged in and turned on.
- Make sure that the TV mode is selected.
- Try a new channel to check for possible station trouble.
- Make sure the antenna is connected properly.
- · Increase the volume.
- Make sure the antenna or audio/video source device is working properly.
- Make sure all cables are firmly connected.
- Check for local interference.

Colored patches of picture.

- Make sure there are no unshielded electrical devices nearby that are causing interference.
- Turn the TV off for 30 minutes, then try it again.

Panel function key does not respond correctly.

- Under the influence of electrostatic phenomenon, the product may malfunction and require user to power reset.
- Unplug and re-plug the AC power cord.

iPOD

iPod does not dock properly or does not install properly.

 Remove your iPod from the dock and check for obstruction on the connectors in the dock and on your iPod.

iPod does not respond to the speaker system.

 Make sure that your iPod is working properly before docking into the unit. Please refer to your iPod manual for details.
