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


Using the phone menu

Use the  key to access the menu and scroll through the menu options. Press  to confirm an option. Some options take you into a new menu. Press  once or repeatedly to return to the previous menu.

Note If you do not press any key for a minute, the cordless phone automatically reverts to the stand-by display.

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

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Step 1: Attach battery

The cordless phone is powered by a rechargeable battery.

- Attach the battery as shown below.



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Step 2: Charge battery

1. Connect the charger to the phone (see the accompanying information).
2. Leave the cordless phone connected to the charger until the battery is fully charged.
 - When the phone is switched off, the indicator light on the cordless phone turns green if the battery is fully charged.
 - When the phone is switched on, the battery icon is completely filled when the battery is fully charged.
3. Disconnect the charger.

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Step 3: Switch cordless phone on

To switch the cordless phone on

- Press and hold  until you hear a click. The display turns on. The greeting text is displayed for a short while and the cordless phone starts searching for a network.

When a network has been found, the cordless phone beeps three times. The indicator light on the top of the cordless phone flashes green once every second and the network name appears in the display. The cordless phone is now in stand-by mode and ready to make and receive calls.



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Step 4: Set display language

To change the display language

Route: Settings » Language

1. Select **Language** and press .
2. Select the required language and press .
The language has now been changed.

Note To reset the language to English (the default language) you can enter the sequence `*#0000#` at any time.

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Step 5: Check searchmode setting

To check if searchmode setting is (Auto)

Route: Networks » Searchmode

1. Select **Networks** and **Searchmode**.
2. Check the setting between () brackets.
Only if the setting is **Manual**, press  to enter the menu.
3. Use  to select **Auto**.
4. Press  to enable automatic network search.
After subscription the phone will automatically search for an available network and will be ready for use.

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Step 6: Subscribe to a network

Normally your telephone network administrator has subscribed the cordless phone for you. If not, follow the procedure below.

Note To subscribe the cordless phone to a network you need two codes. Contact your network administrator for these two codes:

- The PAK (Portable Access Rights Key) code.
The PAK code identifies the network. Entering the PAK code is not necessary but it can increase the chances of successful subscribing.
- The AC (Authentication Code) code of the network.
The AC code prevents other phones subscribing to the network without approval.

Note You can subscribe a cordless phone to 8 networks. The names of these networks are stored in a list. If you want to subscribe and no free entries are left in the network list, you have to delete an entry first. See [“Erasing a network”](#) on page 129.

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To subscribe the cordless phone to a network

Route: Networks » Edit list

1. Select **Edit list** and press .
The first entry of the network list is displayed.
2. If necessary, press  to find the empty entry (last position in the list).
3. Press  to select the entry.
Add net? is displayed.
4. Press  to confirm.
Enter name is displayed.
5. Enter a name (e.g. Build1) for the network. This name is displayed if the phone (when in stand-by) is connected to that network ( = delete;  = move left or right;  = space;  = change case).
6. Press  to confirm.
Enter PARK is displayed.

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To subscribe the cordless phone to a network (continued)

7. Enter the PARK code of the network. The PARK code is a row of digits which may be separated by hyphens. Do not enter hyphens. If you want to skip the PARK code, enter nothing and proceed with the next step.
8. Press  to confirm.
Enter AC is displayed.
9. Enter the AC code of the network. Each digit is shown as *.
10. Press  to confirm.
Please wait is displayed.
11. Wait until **Add net done** is briefly displayed. The cordless phone is now subscribed to the network. If another message is displayed, see [“Error messages when subscribing”](#) on page 18.

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Error messages when subscribing

In case of one the following messages, try to subscribe again:

- **Add net failed:** the AC number you have entered may be incorrect or the network has no space for an extra subscription. To add the cordless phone, you may have to delete the subscription of another phone.
- **Error No network:** the PARK code you have entered is probably incorrect or you are out of range of the network. Check that the network is on and that you are within range.

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
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Making a call

Dialling while on hook

1. Enter the phone number.
The digits are shown in the display.
2. If necessary, use the **CLEAR** key to correct the number.
3. Press **YES** and wait for an answer.
A call time meter is displayed.
4. Press **NO** to end the call.
The duration of the call is displayed.

- The cordless phone contains a phone book in which names and phone numbers can be stored. See [“About the phone book”](#) on page 63.
 - If nobody answers your call, the number is busy or you cannot get through, you can redial the number. See [“Redialling one of the last dialled numbers”](#) on page 46.



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Basic use

- When dialling on hook, press and hold down  to erase all digits at the same time.
- It is possible to protect the cordless phone against misuse. See “[Phone lock code protection](#)” on page 112.
- On some networks you can only make an external call after waiting for dial tone. See “[Inserting a pause](#)” on page 61 to solve this.

Dialling while off hook

1. Press  in the stand-by mode.
Hook off is displayed.
2. Press  and wait for the dial tone.
3. Dial the number and wait for a connection.
4. Press  to end the call.
The duration of the call is displayed.

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Receiving a call

To receive a call

1. Press  to answer a call.
2. To end the call press .
The duration of the call is displayed.

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Stop ringing when receiving a call

You can stop the phone from ringing when receiving a call. Rejecting a call is not possible.

- If you do not want to answer a call, press  or one of the volume keys twice.
The cordless phone stops ringing. You can still answer the call by pressing .

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
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
Information in the display



After switching on the cordless phone, the display may show several icons and other information. For the icons, see “[Display icons and indicators](#)” on page 29.

Network name

The name of the currently connected network. Only displayed when the cordless phone is in stand-by.



Call information

When receiving a call in the display the caller's number is displayed (if supported by the network). Also you can see if the call is external (**DECT ext**) or internal (**DECT int**).

If the caller's name is in the phone book of the cordless phone, the caller's name is displayed.

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Redirected call information



When someone has redirected his phone to your phone, you can see in the display if an incoming call is from the redirected phone (if supported by the network). The name or number from the redirected phone is displayed between () below the caller's name or number.

Who answers your call

When your call is answered, the called person's number or name if in the phone book of the cordless phone is displayed (if supported by the network).

When the phone you called is redirected to another phone, the number or name of the phone that is actually answering the call, is displayed (if supported by the network).

Call duration

During a call, the cordless phone displays the duration of the call.



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Time and date

The cordless phone displays the current time and, if set, the date when it is in stand-by (if supported by the network). See “[Setting date and time](#)” on page 35 for more details.

Network messages

Network messages can be shown on the cordless phone display.

 - To confirm selections and settings.

Signal strength 	Visible when connected to a network. Four vertical bars means good reception and no bars means no connection.
Ring off 	Ring signal muted.
Key 	Keys locked.
Message 	New message received.
Battery 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• On: indicates battery status (icon completely filled means fully charged).• Flashing: battery is being charged (icon is being filled and emptied).
Call info 	New missed calls.

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Icon or indicator	Meaning
 (in the phone book)	Phone book entry cannot be changed. It is part of the company phone book.
Indicator light on top is green	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• On: charging has been completed (only if the cordless phone is switched off or connected to a charger).• Flashing: connected to a network.• Flashing quickly: incoming call or message.
Indicator light on top is red	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• On: battery is being charged while the cordless phone is switched off.• Flashing: low battery warning.

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
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DT570 menu

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Basic use

The submenus of each menu are described below. Click on a menu item for a more detailed description.

Hook Off

- **Dial off hook.**

Info

- **Last call** Check time of last call.
- **Tot calls** Check total call time.

Divert

- **Divert recall** Activate a call divert.

Networks

- **Select net** Start searching for a specific network.
- **Searchmode** Enable automatic or manual search.
- **Edit list** Subscribe cordless phone to a network.
- **New search** Start a new automatic network search.

Access

- **Phone lock** Activate or cancel phone lock code protection.
- **Phone lock - Change code** Change phone lock code.

Settings

- **Ring level** Set ring signal volume.
- **Ear volume** Change earpiece volume.
- **Ring type** Set ringer tones or melodies.
- **EditMelody** Program a melody.
- **Keylock** Set automatic keylock. If no keys are pressed within 25 seconds, the keys are locked.
- **Key sound** Set key sound (clicks, tones or no signal).

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Settings *(continued)*

- **Light** Set display light (automatic, on (all the time), off)
- **Call info** Set type of call information for retrieving statistics (all calls, outgoing calls).
- **Answering mode** Set answering mode (answering when clicking any key, auto answering), used for example when calling handsfree.
- **Greeting** Enter and turn on/off greeting text on display.
- **Language** Set display language.
- **Own line** Set own line settings. Applicable, for example, when using the phone in different networks.
- **Master reset** Clear all menu settings to its default.

Clock

- **Clock mode** Set time format (24h or AM/PM)
- **Date mode** Enable date to be displayed if phone is in standby mode.

Keylock On?

- Block the keys to avoid accidental dialling.

Mail

- **Page** Read, confirm, dial phone number in page, erase page messages.
- **Voice** Handling of voice messages (if supported by the network).
- **Text** Handling of text messages (if supported by the network).
- **Other** Handling of other message types (if supported by the network).

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Phone book

- **Name recall** Call by name.
- **Position recall** Call by phone book position.
- **Store** Add names and numbers in phone book.
- **Edit** Edit phone book names and numbers.
- **Erase** Erase phone book names and numbers.
- **Answered calls** Return answered calls.
- **Dialled numbers** Redial last dialled numbers.
- **Missed calls** Return missed calls.

Special functions (during a call)

- **Goto DTMF** Switch the phone to tone dialling during a call.
- **Internal call** Only on home cordless system: to make an internal call.

Special functions (during a call) *(continued)*

- **Send pause** Send a pause during a call.
- **Send tones** Switch the phone to long tones during a call.

Special functions (when digit entered)

- **Internal call** Only on home cordless system: to make an internal call.
- **Pause** Insert a pause before dialling.

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Setting date and time

When the cordless phone is in stand-by the current time and date (optional) can be displayed (if supported by the network). Default no date is displayed.

To set the date

Route: Clock » Date mode

1. Select **Date mode** and press .
2. Select one of the following formats:
 - DD-MM-YY
 - MM/DD/YY
 - YYMMDD
 - DD-MMM-YY
 - Off
3. Press  to confirm your choice.
The date is now displayed in stand-by mode.





Setting time format

The time is automatically retrieved from the system (if available). You can set how the time is displayed.

To set the time format

Route: Clock » Clock mode

1. Select **Clock mode** and press .
2. Select **24 hours** or the **AM/PM** format.
3. Press  to confirm your choice.



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Charging the battery

If the battery is nearly flat or if you want to keep the battery fully charged, you can connect the cordless phone to the charger. There is no need to wait until the battery is completely discharged.

You can still use the cordless phone while the battery is being charged. However, it will take more time to charge the battery.

For more information, see the information on the charger.

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Switching the cordless phone off

To switch the cordless phone off

1. Go to the stand-by display, by pressing  repeatedly.
2. Press and hold  until the display turns blank.

Note You cannot turn the cordless phone off during a call.

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Call using the phone book

You can conveniently make calls using the phone book (provided that it contains names and numbers). For the ways you can make calls using the phone book, see:

1. In stand-by, press and hold one of the keys  up to  until the first letter of the key is entered. For other letters: immediately press the key again until the required letter appears. Use the  key to correct.
2. You can enter more letters.
3. Press  to confirm.
The first name in the phone book beginning with the entered letter(s) is displayed. If it does not exist, a name beginning with the next letter is displayed.
4. Scroll by using the  keys.
5. Press  to dial the number.

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Call by name

Route: Phone book » Name recall

1. Select **Name recall** and press .
2. Press the key which has the first letter of the name you are searching for.
 - Press once for the first letter.
 - For other letters: immediately press the key again until the required letter appears. Use the  key to correct.
3. You can enter more letters.
4. Press  to confirm.
The first name in the phone book beginning with the entered letter(s) or, if it does not exist, a name beginning with the next letter is displayed.
5. Scroll by using the  keys.
6. Press  to dial the number.

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Telephoning options

Quick call by position in the company phone book

1. In stand-by, press and hold  until  appears in the display.
2. Enter the position number in the company phone book of the person you wish to call and press .
3. If necessary, scroll by using the  key.
4. Press  to make the call.

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Quick call by position in the user phone book

1. In stand-by, enter the position number in the user phone book of the person you wish to call and press .
2. Press  to make the call.

Phone numbers that are stored in positions 1 – 9 of the user phone book can be called very easily. You can use these positions to store important or frequently used numbers.

To call a phone number in position 1 - 9 of the user phone book

1. In stand-by, press the number key to enter the position number in the user phone book.
2. Press  to select the phone number.
3. Press  to make the call.

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Call by phone book position

Route: Phone book » Position recall

1. Select **Position recall**, press  and then press .
 appears in the display.
2. Enter the phone book position number of the person you wish to call and press .
3. If necessary, scroll by using the  key.
4. Press  to make the call.

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Redialling one of the last dialled numbers

You can redial one of the last dialled numbers by:

- Quick redial.
- Redial using the **Phone Book** (see [page 47](#)).

Quick redial

1. In stand-by, press  and wait until the last dialled number and name (if stored in the phone book) appears.
2. If message **Call?** is displayed, scroll through the last dialled numbers by using the  key. If you press , the time or date of the call is also displayed. Press  to toggle between date and time.
3. Press  to dial the number.

Note If no names or numbers are available for redial the message **Empty list** is displayed.

Route: Phone book » Dialed numbers

1. Select **Dialed numbers** and press . The last dialed number and name (if stored in the phone book) appears.
If you press , the time or date of the call is also displayed. Press  to toggle between date and time.
2. Scroll by using the  key.
3. Press  to dial the number.

Note If no names or numbers are available for redial the message **Empty list** is displayed.

Tip If you press  instead of  to dial the number, you can erase all entries in the last dialed numbers list.

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Returning a call

Both missed and answered calls can be returned. The following options are available:

- Return last missed call.
- Return one of the missed calls (see [page 49](#)).
- Return one of the answered calls (see [page 50](#)).

Return last missed call

If you miss a call, **Calls:1** appears in the display, together with the  symbol. The number indicates the number of missed calls.

If you do not want to return a call at this stage, press . To return the last missed call now press .

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Return one of the missed calls

Route: Phone book » Missed calls

1. Select **Missed calls** and press .
A list of numbers or names (if stored in the phone book) is displayed.
If you press , the time or date of the call is also displayed. Press  to toggle between date and time.
2. Scroll by using the  key.
3. Press  to dial the number.

- Notes**
- If no names or numbers are available for returning a call the message **Empty list** is displayed.
 - The message **Unidentified** is displayed if no information about a caller's number was received.

Tip If you press  instead of  to dial the number, you can erase the selected entry in the missed calls list.

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Return one of the answered calls

Route: Phone book » Answered calls

1. Select **Answered calls** and press .
2. Scroll by using the  key.
3. Press  to dial the number.

Note If no names or numbers are available for calling back the message **Empty list** is displayed.

Tip If you press  instead of  to dial the number, you can erase all entries in the answered calls list.

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Changing the earpiece volume during a call

To change the earpiece volume during a call

- Press the **VOLUME UP/DOWN** keys once or more. If the earpiece is at maximum or minimum volume, you hear a warning tone.



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Turning off the microphone during a call

To turn off the microphone

- Press and hold down the  key. **Mute** is displayed.
- Release the  key to resume the conversation.



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Mute ring signal temporarily

If the cordless phone rings at an inconvenient moment, you can turn off the ring signal temporarily by pressing .

You can also press one of the volume keys twice.

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Using the display as scratch pad

During a phone call you can use the display as a scratch pad by entering a phone number with the number keys.

1. During a call enter a phone number with the number keys.
The digits are shown in the display.
2. When you finish the call, press .
The number remains in the display.
3. Press  to call the number.

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Consulting with another person

The cordless phone allows you to consult with another person, if supported by the network. Please check your network administrator.

To consult another person

1. Press  to put the caller on hold.
2. Dial another number (the first caller is on hold and cannot hear you).
3. Press  to end the second call and continue the first call.

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Transferring a call

The cordless phone allows you to transfer a call, if supported by the network. Please check your network administrator.

To transfer a call

1. Press  to put the caller on hold.
2. Dial another number.
3. If answered: press  to transfer the first call.
If not answered: press  to return to the first call.

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Second call and conference call

During a call you may receive a second call or even a third, depending on the network.

If supported by the network you can have a conference call.

The handling of second calls and conference calls depends on your network. Please check your network administrator.

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Setting the cordless phone to tone dialling

If your cordless phone uses pulse dialling, you can switch to tone dialling if required. For example, to control a teleservice such as voice mail.

To switch the cordless phone to tone dialling during a call

Route: Special functions » Goto DTMF

1. Press  and then  to enter the **Special functions** menu.
2. Select **Goto DTMF** and press .
The cordless phone now uses tone dialling.

When you end the call, the cordless phone goes back to pulse dialling.

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Setting the cordless phone to long tones

The tones transmitted by the cordless phone may be too short for some interactive information services. If you have problems, you can temporarily change the length of the tones.

If the cordless phone is set to long tones, the tones are transmitted for the same length of time as you keep the keys pressed down.

To switch the cordless phone to long tones during a call

Route: Special functions » Send tones

1. Press  and then  to enter the **Special functions** menu.
2. Select **Send tones (Off)** and press .
3. Select **On** and press .
The cordless phone switches to long tones for the duration of the call.

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Inserting a pause

On some networks you can only make an external call if you first wait for the dial tone. You can insert a pause to have the cordless phone waiting for the dial tone.

To insert a pause in a phone number

Route: Special functions » Pause

1. Enter the phone number.
2. Press  and then  to enter the **Special functions** menu.
3. Select **Pause** and press .
A 'p' is displayed and the cordless phone waits at that position in the number.

Tip

When you enter a phone number before dialling, you can also press  for one second to insert a pause.

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About the phone book

Your cordless phone contains a phone book in which you can store the numbers you call frequently. You get to the phone book via the **Phone book** menu.

The phone book menu includes functions for recalling the last dialed numbers. If you have the CLIP (Calling Line Identification Presentation) service you can also recall the last answered numbers and missed numbers.

Company phone book and user phone book

The phone memory can hold max. 1100 telephone numbers.

- The company phone book can have max. 1000 phone numbers. These numbers are programmed with a special accessory. The numbers are marked with an  icon and cannot be edited.
- You can also add phone numbers (max. 100) yourself. These numbers are the user phone book. You can edit these numbers.

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Recall by position number

Phone numbers can be recalled from the phone memory by using its position number in the phone book. See “[Call by phone book position](#)” on page 45.

Speed dialling facility

You can “speed dial” the phone numbers that you store in positions 1 - 9 in the user phone book. You can use these positions to store important or frequently dialled numbers. See “[To call a phone number in position 1 - 9 of the user phone book](#)” on page 44.

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Entering names in the phone book

Use the number keys to enter names in the phone book. Press a key once for the first letter on the key, immediately press twice for the second letter, and so on. See the table on [page 66](#) for more details.

Some special considerations:

- Insert lower case letters** • Press the letter first and then .
- Revert to upper case letters** • Press the letter and then .
- Insert an asterix (*)** • Press  twice.
- Enter a digit** • Press and hold the key until the digit appears.

Example: to insert **C** press **2** three times; to insert **è** press number **3** four times and to enter a space, press **1** once.

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Adding name and phone number

Before you store phone numbers in the phone book, you have to decide how completely you have to store these numbers.

Do you want to make calls using the phone book in only one network?

Then you can store the phone numbers in the phone book just the way you dial them.

Do you want to make calls using the phone book in different networks?

Then you have to store the phone numbers with the phone number elements that differ per network. You have to fill in the **Own line settings** also. For more information on the phone number elements and the own line settings, see “[Own line settings](#)” on page 97.

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To store name and number in the phone book

Route: Phone book » Store

1. Select **Store** and press .
2. Enter the name you want to store ( = delete;  = move left or right;  = space;  = change case) and press .
3. Enter the phone number (press and hold  = pause).
The first free memory position in the phone book is prompted.

International phone numbers can be stored with the + sign in front. Press the  key until the + is displayed. The + sign replaces the international access code from the country you are calling from.

To store name and number in the phone book (continued)

- You now have two options:
 - If you want to store the phone number in this position press .
 - If you want to store the number in another position press . Then enter the number of the required memory position.
- Press  to store the name and number.

Overwrite Protection

If you try to store a phone number in a position which already contains a phone number, the message **Used Overwrite?** appears in the display.

You can then do one of the following:

- Store the number in a different position. Press  and then enter the new position number.
- Overwrite old number. Press .

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Editing phone book names and numbers

Note You cannot edit the entries that are marked with the  icon.

To edit an entry in the phone book using the name

Route: Phone book » Edit » Find name

1. Select **Find name**.
2. Enter the name or the first characters of the name you want to change and press  .
 - You can now change the name (in the middle line), the position number (in the top line) or the phone number (in the bottom line).
 - Press  to move the cursor to the next line.
 - Press  to move back the cursor.

3. Correct the name, the position number or the phone number with the number keys ( = delete character to the left of the cursor;  = move left or right). You can insert a character at the cursor's position.
4. Press  to confirm.

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Four message types

With the DT570 you can receive 4 different message types:

- Page messages
- Voice messages
- Text messages
- Other messages

Page messages

Page messages consist of text. You can read this text in the display. You can reply to a page message by sending a confirmation (Accept or Decline). You can also answer a page message by easily dialling a phone number included in the message.

Voice, Text and Other messages

Voice messages consist of voice or sounds. **Text** messages consist of text. Unlike page messages text messages cannot be confirmed and do

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not have the possibility of dialling an included phone number. **Other** messages are all messages not being page, voice or text messages.

The handling of **Voice**, **Text** and **Other** messages strongly depends on the network and cannot be described in this user's guide. Please contact your network administrator for more information on the availability of these message types on your network.

Storage of up to 10 messages in the cordless phone memory

Up to 10 page messages can be stored in the cordless phone memory. When the cordless phone has received more than 10 page messages, it automatically erases the oldest read one. You can also erase page messages yourself.

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Information that a message has arrived

The cordless phone informs you as follows when a message has arrived:

- A beep sounds.
- The indicator light on the top of the cordless phone flashes green rapidly.
- The message icon is displayed. The message icon is being displayed as long as there are messages that you have not read.
- If the cordless phone is in stand-by, a new page message is displayed automatically. Messages of other types you always have to look up yourself.



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Looking up the messages

To look up messages

Route: Mail

1. Press  to select the message type you want to read: **Page**, **Voice**, **Text** or **Other**.
The number between () brackets indicates the number of new messages. If the number of new messages is not known, a ? is displayed.
2. Press .
A display for the particular message type is shown.
3. The handling of **Page** messages is described in the next paragraphs.

For **Voice**, **Text** and **Other** messages: if the mailbox number is available to the phone, you can call this number to check the messages. Press .



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Own line settings

When are Own line settings required?


You only need to make **Own line settings** if one or more of the following situations are applicable:

- If you want to make calls in different networks using the phone book.
- If you want to store international phone numbers in the phone book with a + for the international access code.
- If internal numbers are stored in the phone book as complete phone numbers with at least the PBX prefix.

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The elements of a phone number

In **Own line settings** you need to fill in the elements of your own phone number. A phone number can be divided into the following elements:



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Settings

International access code

Required digits when you want to make an international call (e.g. 00).
Only in the phone book a + can be used instead.

Country code

A code for the country, one or more digits.

Area code

Countries can have area codes for phone numbers in geographically different areas.

PBX prefix

When connected to a switchboard, all phone numbers of the connected phones start with the same first part. This common part is the **PBX prefix** (for examples, see below).

Extension number Unique part of the phone number, distinguishing the phone number from other phone numbers.

Note When making the own line settings you also need to fill in the external line prefix (**Ext. line**). This prefix (for example: 0) may be required before you can make an external call. This external line prefix is not part of the phone number.

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Examples of PBX prefix and extension number

Example 1: All phones connected to a switchboard in a company start with 123. A complete phone number in this company is 1234567. The PBX prefix is 123 and the extension number is 4567.

Example 2: All phones connected to a switchboard in a company start with 8989. A complete phone number in this company is 8989123. The PBX prefix is 8989 and the extension number is 123.

Own line settings and phone book entries

If you want to make calls using the phone book in different networks and use own line settings, you have to store the phone numbers in the phone book with the phone number elements that differ per network.

For example, you want to make calls using the phone book in networks in different countries. Then you have to store the phone numbers with international access code, country code, area code, etc.

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Settings

If, for another example, you want to make calls using the phone book in networks with different area codes, you have to store the phone numbers with at least the area code.

Tip If you want to make calls using the phone book in different networks but you are not sure how to store the phone numbers, it is advised to store the phone numbers in full, with international access code, country code, etc. The cordless phone will automatically detect which part of the phone book number should be dialled.

Specifying “Own line settings”

The procedure below assumes, as an example, that your own phone number is: 00 31 20-1234567. This number consists of:
00 = international access code; 31= country code; 20 = area code (without first zero); 123 = PBX prefix; 4567 = extension number. The external line prefix is 0.

Tip It is advised to fill in all own line settings, to guarantee that dialling will function properly in all networks.

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To specify own line settings for a network

Route: Settings » Own line

1. Make sure the phone is subscribed to the network you want to specify own line settings for. Only then you can specify own line settings.
2. Select **Own line** and press .
The first entry of the network list is displayed.
3. Press  to select the network for which you want to enter the own line settings.
4. Press  to confirm.
PBX prefix is displayed.
5. If the phone is connected to a switch board and has a PBX prefix common to other phone numbers, proceed with the next step. Otherwise continue with step 9.
6. Press  to enter the **PBX prefix**.
7. Enter the PBX prefix and press .

Call diversion can be made by using divert codes (network dependent). Divert codes are numbers containing a # or *.

The divert codes should be stored in the phone book as normal phone numbers (see “[Adding name and phone number](#)” on page 67).

With the option **Divert** you can easily activate the divert codes.

To activate a call divert

Route: Divert

1. Select **Divert** and press .
The phone book is automatically activated.
2. Select the appropriate divert code according to the procedure “[Call by name](#)” on page 42.

1. Look up the IPEI code of the cordless phone and write it down. See “[Looking up the IPEI code](#)” on page 116. If you happen to forget the phone lock code, you will need the IPEI code to unlock the cordless phone.

3. Select **Full lock** and press  .

The IPEI code is a unique code of the cordless phone. You may need the IPEI code to unblock the phone if you have forgotten the phone lock code.

To display the IPEI code

- In the stand-by display, press: *#06#

Once the cordless phone has been locked with the phone lock code, you have to enter the phone lock code before the IPEI code is displayed. So it is advised to look up the IPEI code before setting the phone lock code.

Note Write down the IPEI code for future use. Keep the IPEI code secret to prevent misuse of your phone.

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Blocking the keys

The keylock feature helps you to avoid accidental dialling, which can happen if you keep your cordless phone in your pocket. You can choose between manual keylock and automatic key lock.

To lock the keys manually

- Select **Keylock On?** in the main menu and press




To set the automatic keylock

Route: Settings » Keylock

1. Select **Keylock** and press 
2. Select **Auto** and press .
If no keys are pressed within 25 seconds, the keys are locked.

A key icon informs you that the keys are locked.



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Extra features

The keys remain locked until you:

- Answer an incoming call.
- Unlock the keys.

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Connecting to networks

Subscribing to a network

You only have to subscribe to a network once. When subscription is completed, you can make and receive calls whenever you are within range of that network. A subscribed network can be selected automatically or manually.

During the subscription process the cordless phone receives an extension number by which it can be called by another phone on the network.

See “[Step 6: Subscribe to a network](#)” on page 15 for the subscription procedure.

Network connection

If your cordless phone is connected to a network, the name of the current telephone network is displayed and a signal strength indicator is shown.

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Using networks

It is possible to connect a cordless phone to 8 networks. If the signal strength indicator is visible, you can make and receive telephone calls.

If the indicator is empty, then the cordless phone is not connected to a network. Causes may be:

- You are out of range of the network.
Check that the network is operating correctly and that you are within range.
- There is no access to the network.
The cordless phone is not able to connect or its access rights may have changed. Try switching the phone off and on again. You can also try selecting the network again (see “[Searching for a specific network](#)” on page 125). If this does not help, contact your network administrator.

Operating range

You can use your cordless phone in the area that is covered by the network. Outside this area, you lose contact with the network, the signal

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strength indicator disappears and the indicator light on the cordless phone does not flash green.

Network list

The cordless phone contains a list with the network names. In case of automatic network selection, the cordless phone tries to connect to the network in the order of the list; first network entry 1, followed by network entry 2 etc. To change the network order, see [“Ordering the network list”](#) on page 126.

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Automatic network search

In automatic search mode the cordless phone first searches for the first network in the network list. If this network is not available, the phone starts searching for another available network. The phone follows the order of the network list that is stored in the phone.

To enable automatic network search

Route: Networks » Searchmode

1. Select **Searchmode** and press .
The next setting is displayed.
2. Use the  key to select **Auto**.
3. Press  to enable automatic network search.

If you are entering another network (to which the cordless phone is subscribed to) the cordless phone automatically searches for right network settings. In some cases, however, it might be useful to start a new search manually. Proceed as follows:

- Select **New search** and press . **Searching** may be displayed for a short while.

- If so, try to search for a network: use either auto search or manual search. See “[Automatic network search](#)” on page 123 or “[Searching for a specific network](#)” on page 125.

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Phone lock code forgotten

You can use the IPEI code to unlock the cordless phone.

If the message **Enter lock code** appears in the display, enter the IPEI code. The phone lock code will be reset to '0000'.

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Cannot understand the language in the display

Reset to English (the default language), enter the sequence *#0000#. For other languages see “[Set display language](#)” on page 13.

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Long beep at regular intervals

A long beep at regular intervals is audible when the battery of the phone is almost flat. For charging the battery see “[Charging the battery](#)” on page 37.

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External call requires wait for dial tone

On some networks you can only make an external call if you first wait for the dial tone. You can insert a pause to have the cordless phone waiting for the dial tone. See [“Inserting a pause”](#) on page 61.

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Unable to make an international call

You can make an international call in two ways:

- Using the phone book.
You can store international phone numbers in the phone book with the international + sign in front. The + replaces the international access code.
To enter the +, press and hold down  until the + appears.
- By dialling the complete international phone number. You have to enter the international access code and the required country code in front of the phone number.

Note The + sign can be used only in the phone book.
You cannot directly enter the + sign and then dial an international number.

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Required service

The cordless phone does not contain user serviceable parts. If your cordless phone requires service you should return it to your dealer or retailer.

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Cleaning

Clean the cordless phone with a soft cloth moistened with water only.

The use of soap and other cleaning products can discolour and damage the cordless phone.

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
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Changing the battery

Rechargeable batteries have a limited lifespan. If the stand-by time for the cordless phone becomes too short, you should replace the battery. Please contact your dealer or retailer for more information.

The battery does not contain cadmium and is therefore more environmentally-friendly than other rechargeable batteries. However, all batteries should be treated as chemical waste.

You can remove the battery as shown. Ensure that the cordless phone is turned off before you remove the battery.



Safety instructions

Intrinsic safety

Do not use the cordless phone and charger in conditions where there is a danger of electrically ignited explosions.

Exposure to sunlight, heat and moisture

Do not expose the cordless phone and charger to direct sunlight for long periods. Keep the cordless phone and charger away from excessive heat and moisture.

Battery disposal

Defective batteries must be returned to a collection point for chemical waste disposal.

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Spare parts and accessories

Use only approved spare parts and accessories. The operation of non-approved parts cannot be guaranteed and may even cause damage. For more information contact your dealer or retailer.

Antenna

Do not use the cordless phone with a damaged antenna. Take your cordless phone to your dealer or retailer for repair. Use only the designated Ericsson antenna.

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Authentication Code (AC)

The authentication code is required when subscribing a phone to a network. It prevents other phones subscribing to the network without your approval. Contact your network administrator for this code.

Call back

Some networks call you back when you for instance transfer an external call to another phone without waiting for an answer but the third party does not respond. The reasons for call back depend on the type of network.

DECT

Digital Enhanced Cordless Telecommunications (DECT) is a digital access technology which ensures a sound quality equal to that of a fixed phone and provides maximum privacy. Eavesdropping or breaking in on the line by strangers is virtually impossible.

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Divert

Call divert enables you to forward calls to another phone number.

DTMF or touch tone

Dual Tone Multi Frequency (DTMF) allows you to send number key presses as tone signals over the telephone line. These tones can be used for interactive telephone services, for accessing an answering machine, etc.

External call

A call is external when a phone connected to the network makes or receives a call via an external line.

External line prefix

The external line prefix (for example a '0') may be required before you can make an external call.

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IPEI

International Portable part Equipment Identity. Unique code assigned to your cordless phone by the manufacturer.

Internal call

A call is internal when a phone connected to the network calls another phone on the network.

International sign (+)

Phone book only: the plus sign automatically adds the correct international access numbers in front of a telephone number of the country you are calling from when you are making an international call.

Menu

The phone's menu helps you to access its functions. The menus are arranged in a hierarchical way and can be accessed when scrolling with the arrow keys.

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Other message

Messages that are not page, voice or text messages (network dependent).

Page message

A page message consists of up to 160 characters. The sender of a page message can require you to confirm the message. An urgent page message can be put on the cordless phone display directly.

PARK

Portable Access Rights Key (PARK) is a network identification for the phone. It is sometimes required to subscribe a phone to a network. Contact your network administrator for this code.

Phone book

The phone book consists of a company phone book and a user phone book.

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Glossary

- The company phone book is programmed with a special accessory. The numbers are marked with an  icon and cannot be edited.
- You can also add telephone numbers yourself. These numbers are the user phone book. You can edit these numbers.

Phone lock code

The phone lock code prevents unauthorized use of the cordless phone. The default code from factory is 0000. The code can be changed to a personal one.

Scroll

To move between the menus using the arrow keys.

Subscription

Subscription is a record with the necessary information to connect the phone to a network. Only with a subscription the phone can use the network.

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Text message

A text message consists of up to 160 characters. A text message cannot be confirmed like a page message.

Voice message

Message consisting of voice or sounds.
